

## KNOCKOUT BLOW

A Galileo (Ire) 3/4-brother to G1 Epsom Derby winner Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) became the most expensive yearling sold anywhere in the world in 2012 at 2,500,000gns (*US\$4,212,393*) when propelling an already record-breaking edition of Tattersalls' October Book 1 into orbit on its final day. The auction achieved the highest turnover ever recorded by a European yearling sale, 68,102,500gns, compared to 51,634,000gns 12 months ago.

Sheikh Fahad Al-Thani held his nerve when taking on the might of the Coolmore operation and instructed his advisor David Redvers to make the winning bid on the handsome dark bay colt (lot 557) out of Funsie (Fr) (Saumurez {GB}). The young member of Qatar's royal family has invested heavily in bloodstock in recent years and, equally importantly, has given racing in Britain a shot in the arm with his backing, along with his brothers, of the QIPCO British Champions' Series. "Tell them why you like him," Sheikh Fahad said to Redvers while facing the press after being congratulated by the colt's breeder Paul Makin. "Because you like him,"

answered the agent wisely, but with a broad grin. Sheikh Fahad, who divulged that he has not yet made a decision as to who will train the colt, declared, "We came to buy the best and we bought the best. He's a stallion in the making and we expected him to be the top lot without a doubt." Appearing visibly shaken after his epic bidding battle with Magnier, Redvers added,

"It's an age-old cliché, but he's the complete package and all the best judges were after him. I'm just incredibly lucky to have the best, most enthusiastic but measured client in the business. I'm pinching myself really, but I truly believe that in the next five years we can go to some

## COLIC SURGERY FOR CAMELOT

Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) has undergone surgery for colic, it was announced yesterday evening. The G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Derby hero, who was seventh in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, was the subject of a tweet from Coolmore which read, "Triple Classic winner Camelot was admitted to Fethard Veterinary Hospital this evening and underwent exploratory colic surgery. Obviously, it's still very early days, but a further bulletin will be released in the morning."

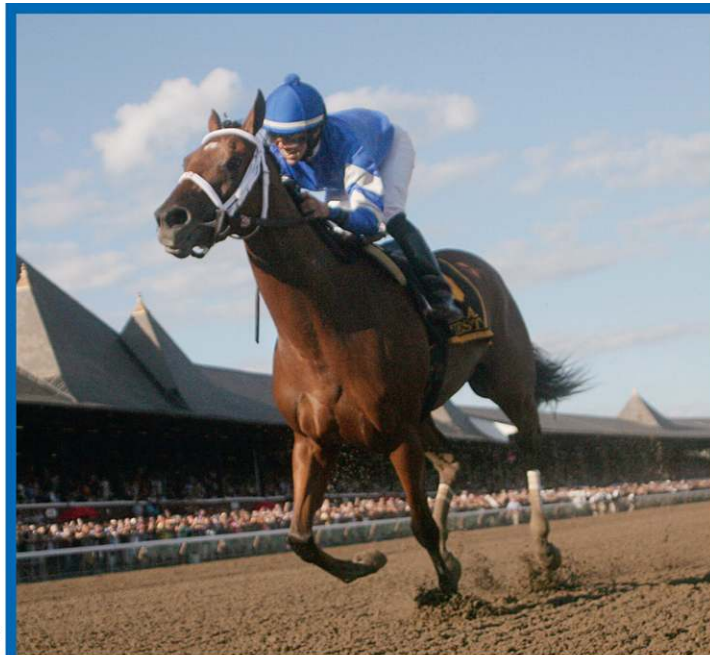

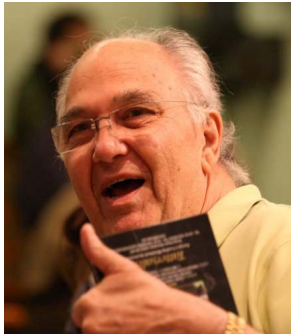

**Makin Waves as a Breeder...**

Paul Makin is more used to being on the bidding end of business, but yesterday saw him experience the bloodstock industry from the other side of the fence as breeder of the sale-topping Galileo (Ire) yearling.

The March colt is out of the unraced Saumarez mare Funsie (Fr), whom Makin purchased from a partnership that included jockey Mick Kinane in a private deal. Since then Funsie has repaid her owner by producing colts by Montjeu (Ire) and Galileo (Ire) and, although the family is already brimming with black type, the colt's page received a significant boost at the weekend with the victory of Solemia (Ire) (Poliglote {GB}), who is out of a

half to Funsie, in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. "I have three brothers at home and you can't keep them all," Makin said of his decision to sell the colt. "Well, you can, but I wanted to try the discipline of selling something I really want! Usually I'm a bit of a hedonist, but I haven't bought anything this time, which is a first, so now that I have sold one, I am the complete package!" When asked if he had expected such a

staggering sum for the good-looking colt, Makin explained, "I didn't really give it a thought, as I don't try to predict the result. I'm happy with

the result though and I just hope the horse can excel for his new owners. They are so good for racing in this country, and are very positive people--I like that." Makin also revealed that Funsie is once again in foal to the champion sire Galileo, and is believed to be carrying a filly.

**Cheerful Chairman...**

With 22 lots making 500,000gns or more in Book 1 compared to nine in 2011, Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony was quick to praise the vendors who sent the company "the cream of the European yearling crop."

"Book 1 of last year's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale produced a remarkable set of results with huge rises in average, median and turnover and, even though we knew this was an exceptional catalogue, it seems extraordinary that we have bettered those figures this week," Mahony commented.

With the second smallest catalogue assembled for Book 1 having produced the highest aggregate since the new-look October Sale, he added, "Vendors have been rewarded by a truly

cosmopolitan cast of buyers attracted to Park Paddocks by world-class yearlings and a sale with a reputation second to none for producing European Classic and Group 1 winners. The 2,500,000 guineas sale-topping Galileo (Ire) colt was the obvious highlight of the sale, but the real feature has been the fierce and diverse competition at the top of the market.

"We have had a record number of yearlings sell for 400,000gns or more--12 of them by the phenomenal Galileo--and there have been no fewer than 16 different buyers at this level. Our long-standing clients, both domestic and overseas, have been as active, if not more so, than ever, and buyers from established markets such as Australia, Hong Kong, Japan, and the U.S. have been more prolific than in recent years.

"In addition, the contribution from new or relatively new participants has been a real source of encouragement for all involved in the industry. The Qatari influence, in particular, has been immense and buyers from Malaysia, Russia, South Africa and Turkey have all made a significant impact demonstrating the enduring global appeal of European bloodstock and the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale."

On Monday, five consecutive days of selling will begin at Park Paddocks, with Book 2 of the October Sale running until Thursday and Book 3 taking place on Friday.

### *Late Lift on Quieter Day...*

The autumn sunshine had disappeared in Newmarket and with it had gone some of the buzz that surrounded the first two days of Book 1. That was until the sale-topping colt strolled into the ring late in the day. Even without his whopping price tag, however, the aggregate for the sale was still cruising steadily towards a level unseen since the crash of 2008. The final day started in much the same way as the second session ended with Mandore International prevailing in a contest for a well-bred Galileo (Ire) filly. Nicolas de Watrigant was made to go to 700,000gns for lot 403, a daughter of the winning and group-placed Danehill mare Arkadina (Ire) from The Castlebridge Consignment. Foaled in March, her third dam Floripedes (Fr) is an enduring presence in modern-day pedigrees through her son Montjeu (Ire). De Watrigant also ensured that the sale held a captive audience through to the last when bidding 400,000gns for lot 577, the first foal out of the listed-placed Fasliyev mare Greenisland (Ire). The son of Invincible Spirit (Ire) was consigned by Lord and Lady Lloyd-Webber's Watership Down Stud, which ended the sale as sixth leading vendor with 12 yearlings sold for a total of 2,353,000gns.

### *Dream Run...*

Breaking the Galileo (Ire) stranglehold on the final day, however, was Oasis Dream (GB), who was responsible for five of the 10 most expensive yearlings through the ring on Thursday. His stud fee of £65,000 when these yearlings were conceived in 2010 rose to £85,000 the following year and remained at that level this season, but that compares well to his Book 1 average of 289,143gns for 14 sold. Top of his offspring was lot 560, a grandson of Meon Valley's great matriarch Colorpsin (Fr) (High Top {GB}), the dam of Group 1 winners Kayf Tara (GB) and Opera House (GB), who gave some consolation to the Coolmore team when knocked down to John Magnier for 675,000gns three lots after the sale-topper. A colt out of Barronstown Stud's young homebred mare Arosa (Ire) (lot 404), a dual-winning daughter of the great broodmare sire Sadler's Wells, was another to find favour and was bought by Paul Fudge in the name of Waratah Thoroughbreds for 525,000gns. Fudge also added Hascombe & Valiant Stud's New Approach (Ire) colt (lot 487) out of a full-sister to G2 Hardwicke S. winner Bronze Cannon (Lemon Drop Kiid) to his string. Already a patron of John Gosden, Fudge could do worse than to send this colt to his Clarehaven Stables too, as Gosden not only trained his dam, Crimson Ribbon, and Bronze Cannon, but he has also had notable success with the first crop of New Approach via G3 Albany S. winner Newfangled.

### *Looking forward to Nathaniel...*

With the sale of the Galileo (Ire) colt for 2,500,000gns securing top billing for The Castlebridge Consignment, the perennial leading consignor Highclere Stud finished in second place, while in hot pursuit in third was Dr. Andreas Jacobs' Newsells Park Stud. The Hertfordshire-based stud, also home to the young stallions Mount Nelson (GB) and Equiano (Fr), sold 14 lots for a grand total of 3,980,000gns. That tally was boosted by the sales of three lots for over half a million guineas apiece.

"It's just been a great week," said the stud's general manager Julian Dollar. "We had 11 of our own and I thought every one of them was very nice, with four or five real standouts. Before the sale I said I would have been happy to have any of them at home. It's so nice to be at a sale with such a nice bunch of horses that all vet clean and are racy types."

The Newsells draft was headed by a homebred son from the first crop of the champion Sea the Stars (Ire), who became the most expensive of his sire's yearlings when hammered down to David Redvers for 575,000gns on Wednesday. Out of a full-sister to the top-class performer Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), who numbers the G1 Irish Derby and G1 Ascot Gold Cup among his top-level victories, the March-born colt attracted plenty of admirers.

"He was an absolutely sensational horse," Dollar said. "Lots of people had been to see him at the farm since January and they all said he was the nicest by his sire that they had seen. You never know how true that is, but it was great to see so many turn up and try to get him."

Another standout of the draft was the Dalakhani (Ire) filly out of Distinctive Look (Ire) (lot 508), who yesterday sold to Shadwell Estates Ltd for 550,000gns. The filly is out of a daughter of Magnificent Style, whose own exploits as a broodmare in producing eight black-type winners to date has made her daughters hot property as well. Newsells Park is also home to another member of the family in the Grade II winner Giant's Play (Giant's Causeway), a daughter of Playful Act (Ire).

"We're very fortunate to have them, and it is a family that is close to our hearts of course, with Nathaniel standing at Newsells next year," Dollar explained. "We're really excited about him, he's a top-class performer who has done everything right this year. Mount Nelson is going very well and his daughter Purr Along looks a great filly, a real Classic prospect, and Equiano is going well too."

Rounding out the trio to breach the half-million mark was a Dansili (GB) filly from the family of Goldikova (Ire). "It's so hard to put a value on them before the sale as you never know who is going to turn up and bid," Dollar said. "There were several who I thought should bring at least 300-400,000gns; when it happens it is a bonus!"



**Amazed and Pleased...**

The name of Juddmonte Farms last appeared on the buyers' sheet at Book 1 in 2008, but it reappeared today alongside a Shamardal colt sold by Whitsbury Manor Stud for 220,000gns. Out of the Clantime (GB) mare Amazed (GB), the colt is a half-brother to the smart sprinter Dazed and Amazed (GB), from the family of high-class speedsters Bishops Court (GB) and Astonished (GB). "I was hoping he would make 150,000gns, so I am delighted with that," said stud director Ed Harper. "I couldn't be happier with who has bought him; I can't quite get my head around the fact that he will be running in the green and pink colours next year!" The sale was another great result for Amazed, who was purchased at the Tattersalls December Mares sale in 2002 for just 20,000gns. She is owned by the stud in partnership with long-time client Tim Chick. "Tim has been a client for 20 years, and he takes the rough with the smooth. I couldn't be more pleased to land a bit of a result for him," Harper said. Amazed's covering by Shamardal was a rare foray outside of the Whitsbury Manor stallions. "She's a star mare all round, and has really helped us with our stallions as well. Her family is pure speed and she produces good-looking foals. She has a very nice colt foal by Paco Boy and is in foal to [Whitsbury Manor resident] Sakhee's Secret." A new consort could perhaps be on the horizon for Amazed next year in the latest addition to Whitsbury's roster, the Group 1-winning Australian sprinter Foxwedge (Aus), who will take up stallion duties at the Hampshire stud in the new year. A son of Fastnet Rock (Aus), Foxwedge was bought for A\$925,000 as a yearling and was a top performer in Australia over five and six furlongs. He will become the first son of his sire to stand in the Northern Hemisphere. More immediately, Whitsbury Manor Stud will offer 14 yearlings at Tattersalls next week, including a 3/4-brother to the Group 3 winner Pastoral Player (GB) (lot 1454). Juddmonte Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe selected two yearlings from Book 1. A grey colt by the stud's homebred sire Oasis Dream (GB) (lot 479) and consigned by Chris Wright's Stratford Place Stud was bought for 130,000gns, and his purchase followed that of another colt, by Shamardal (lot 390), for 220,000gns from the Whitsbury Manor Stud draft.

**Busy Botti...**

More trainers found themselves on the buying bench on Thursday, including Marco Botti, who, with wife Lucie, is juggling yearling viewing, a major yard move to their new Prestige Place in Newmarket and overseeing runners in Canada and Australia. Botti signed for lot 419, a compact son of Oasis Dream (GB) out of the listed-winning High Chaparral (Ire) mare Beach Bunny (Ire) at 425,000gns. "He's quite flashy but I like him as an individual," Botti said. "He looks like a 2-year-old and his dam was Group 1-placed." On Sunday, Lucie Botti will be at Woodbine to saddle Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G1 Canadian International, in which he was runner-up to Sarah Lynx (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) last year, while the following weekend will see Marco in Melbourne with his G1 Caulfield Cup contender Jakkalberry (Ire) (Storming Home {GB}).

**Attractive Acquisition...**

Also among the best-selling Oasis Dream (GB) yearlings was a son of champion racemare Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}), who sold to Coolmore for 420,000gns. "We are delighted, this is easily the best yearling I have produced in the last 15 years," said the Duke of Roxburghe, whose Floors Stud consigned the homebred April colt. "He is a serious cracking colt, and has gone to a great home. We've only sold two yearlings out of Attraction, and sadly [her daughters] Devastation (GB) and Elation (Ire), whom we retained, both died." Attraction, who is back in foal to Oasis Dream, was also renowned for her crooked front legs, which didn't prevent her from winning five Group 1 races, including both the English and Irish 1,000 Guineas, but did mean that she never made it to a sale herself. The Duke added, "All her progeny have been very correct and her family is too, which makes me think that perhaps she lay in the womb strangely causing her to be so incorrect."

**One Word: Pedigree...**

With such a consistently strong Book 1, an argument could be made for most of the yearlings on paper, and it was certainly the case for lot 508, an attractive grey filly by Dalakhani (Ire) out of Distinctive Look (Ire) (Danehill), who made it onto Shadwell's list of purchases at 550,000gns. "Pedigree. Need I say any more?" That was the verdict of Angus Gold after signing for the filly from the immediate family of this season's Group 1 winners Nathaniel (Ire) and Great Heavens (GB). The full siblings are but two reminders of

the extreme desirability of their sire Galileo (Ire), whose name appears seven times in the top 10 lots sold in Newmarket this week. In total, 29 of his yearling changed hands through the three days, reaching an aggregate of 14,345,000gns.

With the name **Centre Court** (Smart Strike), a daughter of the A.P. Indy mare Let, grass figured to be the course of choice for the filly.

In this case, the name fits perfectly.

Owned by G. Watts Humphrey Jr., Centre Court brings a grass record of 6-3-3-0 into Saturday's 29th running of the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup for 3-year-old fillies going 1 1/8 miles on the turf.

"The first time she ran, it was on the dirt at Churchill Downs going 4 1/2 furlongs when she was two," said trainer Rusty Arnold. "She came out of it with a little chip that was taken out and she has had no problems since."

Eight months later, Centre Court returned to the races at Gulfstream Park, this time on the grass.

"She worked much better on the turf than she did on dirt," Arnold said. "She'd work OK on dirt, but it was not like she did on the grass and she's much happier on the grass."

In her two-turn grass debut, Centre Court finished second to Kitty Wine and here this spring finished second to future graded stakes winner Colonial Flag (Pleasant Tap). In her third grass start, Centre Court romped by 4 3/4 lengths at Churchill Downs, a victory that propelled her into the GIII Regret S.

In the Regret, Centre Court turned the tables on Colonial Flag and set the course to the QEII.

"After she won the Regret, we knew she would get invited to the Queen Elizabeth," Arnold said. "We were going to Saratoga and knew she would have two races before this one. It would either be one at Saratoga and one at Belmont or two at Saratoga."

"When she won the first one [the GII Lake George July 25], it made sense to stay there."

Centre Court ran second to QEII rival Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy) in the Lake Placid Aug. 19. On Sept. 15, when three other QE II foes were battling in the GI Garden City at Belmont, Centre Court had the first of her three Keeneland works for Saturday's race.

Julien Lejaroux, who has been aboard Centre Court in her past two starts, has the call Saturday.

"I would imagine we likely would be just behind Dayatthespa [City Zip]," Arnold said of a possible QE II scenario. "She has won four straight and I doubt they will change her style. She is a good filly in her own right. I know a lot of people are talking about Chad Brown's other filly (Samitar {GB}), but she is tough."

**PIERRO GOES FOR GUINEAS GLORY**

Australia's undefeated 2-year-old Triple Crown champion **Pierro (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}) will likely be made the overwhelming favorite to record his ninth career victory in tomorrow's G1 Caulfield Guineas at Caulfield Racecourse in Melbourne, Australia. The Gai Waterhouse charge swept three Group 1 races in three weeks last season--the G1 Golden Slipper S., G1 Sires Produce S. and G1 Champagne S.--to become just the seventh horse in history to capture Australia's 2-year-old Triple Crown. The G & D Kolivos colorbearer kicked off his 3-year-old campaign with a workmanlike victory in the G3 Run to the Rose S. at Rosehill Sept. 1, and followed up with a resounding success in his first start on a left-handed course in the G2 Bill Stutt S. at Moonee Valley Sept. 28. Pierro came closest to defeat when Darley's **Epaulette (Aus)** (Commands {Aus}) ran him to a head in last year's G2 Todman S., and the full-brother to last year's Caulfield Guineas winner **Helmet (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) is expected to have the greatest chance to dethrone Pierro here. Since finishing third to Pierro in the Run to the Rose, Epaulette has strung together two straight victories, taking the G1 Golden Rose S. at Rosehill Sept. 15, and the G3 Guineas Prelude over this strip last out Sept. 30. Patinack Farm's **All Too Hard (Aus)** (Casino Prince {Aus}), the half-brother to **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) that has thus far disappointed this season, will use a barrier blanket for the first time in tomorrow's race, and co-trainer Wayne Hawkes has expressed enthusiasm that his charge's fortunes could turn.

**RACETRACK ROUND-UP**

**ARUNA RETIRED** Flaxman Holdings' Grade I winner **Aruna** (Mr. Greeley--Surya, by Unbridled) has been retired from racing. A Niarchos family homebred, the 5-year-old began her career in France for Jonathan Pease before moving to Graham Motion's shedrow midway through her sophomore season. The dark bay captured her first three starts on these shores, including the 2010 GII Mrs. Revere S. After winning the 2011 GI Juddmonte Spinster S. on Polytrack, she ran fifth, beaten just a length, in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf at Churchill. Aruna's shining moment this year was her 1 1/4-length victory in the GII Sheepshead Bay H. at Belmont May 26. A daughter of multiple graded winner Surya, she will join the Niarchos broodmare band at Lane's End's Oak Tree division. Her career mark stands at 18-7-4-1 with a bankroll of \$994,924.

**JACKSON BEND RETIRED** Robert LaPenta and Fred Brei's multiple Grade I winner **Jackson Bend** (Hear No Evil--Sexy Stockings, by Tabasco Cat) has been retired from racing and will enter stud next season alongside his sire at Journeyman Stud in Ocala, Florida. Third in the GI Preakness S. in 2010, the liver chestnut captured the GI Forego S. at Saratoga in 2011, and capped that season with a second in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill. He began this year with a win in the GIII Hal's Hope H. at Gulfstream and added a thrilling score in the GI Carter H. at Aqueduct in April. Jackson Bend collided with another horse during training hours in late summer at Saratoga and, though he recovered physically to attempt his Forego defense, he has been turned out at Brei's Florida farm since Labor Day. "When he came here we thought it would just be a rest before [the meet at] Gulfstream Park," said Brei. "But it was obvious it would be an extended turn-out, and combined with trying to bring him back at age six, it was the right decision to retire him and give him three months off before the breeding season." Jackson Bend swept the Florida Stallion Series as a juvenile. He also hit the board in the GI Wood Memorial S., GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. and GIII Holy Bull S. in 2010. He retires with a record of 28-9-6-4 and earnings of \$1,613,450.



**NEW YORK REACTS TO TASK FORCE RECS**

New York State reacted quickly to recommendations in the report issued by the Task Force on Racehorse Health and Safety issued Sept. 28 and passed emergency rules Thursday dramatically changing withdrawal times for medications prior to competition and adding a provision for voiding a claim.

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board approved the measures during a special meeting at its offices in Schenectady. The task force was formed by Governor Andrew Cuomo after an unusually high number of horses died from injuries suffered during the winter meet at Aqueduct Racetrack.

"The drug administration policy changes will be the toughest in the country to ensure that horses aren't given drugs to mask injuries," Racing and Wagering Board Chairman John Sabini said.

The comprehensive recommendations, Sabini said, "signify a new era for the horse racing industry," and will make the sport safer for horses and jockeys.

The new medication rules will take effect Dec. 12 and cover all four of the state's Thoroughbred tracks: Aqueduct, Belmont Park, Saratoga and Finger Lakes. The lag time for implementation is to allow for the development of policies and procedures.

- Corticosteroids were legal up to 48 hours prior to a race. Under the new rules, systemic administration must be stopped five days before a race and injections into joints are not permitted within seven days.
- Injections into joints of methylprednisolone were moved from five to 15 days before a race.
- Use of Clenbuterol, developed primarily to treat breathing issues, but which has been found to have some anabolic benefits, was moved from 96 hours prior to a race to 21 days.
- Corticosteroids, methylprednisolone and Clenbuterol were added to the list of medications for out-of-competition testing.

Also, the three-member board approved a rule requiring trainers to maintain records of all joint injections of corticosteroids and to submit records of injections to the board within 48 hours.

The emergency rules affecting claiming races, which take effect Oct. 19, had two elements:

- The addition of a one-hour period for the voiding of a claim made on a horse that was vanned off the track. Earlier this year, the board changed the rules to void claims made on horses that died or were euthanized on the track.
- A requirement that the new owner be notified within 48 hours of the claim of any joint injections of corticosteroids within the previous 30 days.

The New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and The Jockey Club endorsed the new rules.

"As an organization--and we have had meetings with our trainers--we are in full support of the changes," NYTHA president Rick Violette said. "We are working hand in hand to help the Racing and Wagering Board structure the changes so they are easily implemented and have the desired effect.

"These measures mirror those proposed by NYTHA in a five-point plan unveiled back in April, and it is encouraging to see The Jockey Club following NYTHA's lead."

In a statement, James Gagliano, the president and CEO of The Jockey Club said his organization applauded the switch action.

"We have been advocating for reforms through similar recommendations," Gagliano said, "and Governor Cuomo and members of the Board are to be commended for taking these steps to enhance the safety and integrity of Thoroughbred racing in New York."

According to board spokesman Lee Park, members of the task force contacted regulators after the report was issued and withdrew a recommendation for an emergency rule to reduce purses in claiming races to a maximum of 1.6 times the claiming price. The recommendation will be considered in standard rule-making discussions, with a public comment period. An emergency rule enacted earlier this year put the purse-to-claim ratio limit at 2.0.

During the meeting, Sabini said that the board is working on other recommendations that do not involve rules, such as the hiring of an equine medical director to oversee veterinarians.

Sabini said that other changes proposed by the task force, including the policy of track veterinarians reporting to the racing office, will be implemented by procedures implemented by the New York Racing Association. Cuomo recently signed legislation allowing for a three-year state takeover of NYRA. The state has yet to announce its 12 appointees to the 17-member board.

"As the new NYRA board takes over, we assume those changes will be made," he said. "Other changes that are going to be made are systematic ones that will be implemented both by us and NYRA."

The Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance announced today that several industry groups have developed plans to provide funds beginning in 2013 to support the TAA's mission to accredit and raise funds for Thoroughbred aftercare facilities. "This is an important first step, and we are grateful to these organizations for their commitments," said Jack Wolf, president of the alliance. "We are hopeful other industry stakeholders will follow their lead in this important endeavor."

"Our objective is to develop sustainable funding from all points on the life cycle of the Thoroughbred from breeding and registration to sales, racing and all points in between, including veterinary care and transportation," said TAA Executive Director Mike Ziegler. "Thanks to the seed capital generously provided by Breeders' Cup, The Jockey Club and Keeneland Association, and ongoing administrative and technical support from the National Thoroughbred Racing Association and The Jockey Club, virtually all of our 2013 contributions will be directed straight to the horses--which is as it should be."

The details of the funding are as follows:

- Prominent Kentucky breeding farms Adena Springs, Airdrie Stud, Castleton Lyons, Darby Dan Farm, Darley, Gainesway, Hill 'n' Dale, Millennium Farms, Pin Oak Stud, Taylor Made, Vinery, Walmac Farm, WinStar Farm have pledged to the TAA a payment in the amount of 25% of each of their stallions' advertised stud fee, effective with the 2013 breeding season. Breeders' Cup Ltd has agreed to facilitate the collection of fees contributed by all stallion owners. The Breeders' Cup will also implement a fan contribution initiative surrounding this year's championships at Santa Anita.
- Beginning in 2013, The Jockey Club will increase fees by \$25 for nearly all registry related transactions including foal registration, naming and import and export applications. In coordination with The Jockey Club of Canada, funds raised from Canadian customers of The Jockey Club will be directed to Canadian Thoroughbred aftercare organizations. The Jockey Club will also contribute \$300,000 in 2013 to the TAA from its commercial companies. Click [here](#) to see the complete fee schedule for 2013.
- CARMA (California Retirement Management Account), founded in 2007 to raise money for retired California racehorses, confirmed that it is directing funds earmarked for California-based organizations and facilities that meet the TAA's accreditation guidelines. In 2013, CARMA expects to grant in excess of \$400,000.
- The Stronach Group and its tracks, Santa Anita and Gulfstream Park have confirmed that they are earmarking funds for organizations in California and Florida that meet the TAA's accreditation standards. In 2013, it is expected that in excess of \$200,000 will be granted.

- Beginning with the 2013 auction calendar, Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton, Barretts and OBS, will enable buyers and consignors to automatically contribute .05% of their respective purchases or gross sales directly to TAA. The sales companies will contribute an additional .05% from their gross sales receipts as well. For those who do not wish to participate in the program, there will be a voluntary opt-out provision.

"Everything we do in this industry begins and ends with the horse," said Jimmy Bell, President of Darley America. "It's time for the industry to make a tangible, long-term commitment to Thoroughbred aftercare, and I am proud of these 13 stallion farms in central Kentucky that have done just that."

"We are proud to support the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance and feel strongly about its mission," said James L. Gagliano, President and Chief Operating Officer of The Jockey Club. "These very modest financial commitments at various checkpoints in a Thoroughbred's career will make a significant difference in giving our equine athletes the lives and second careers they deserve after their racing days are over."

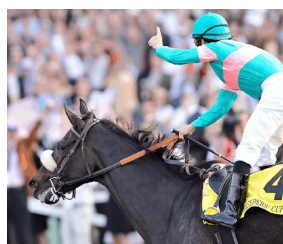
