Challenge Cup S. today at Keeneland. Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) took last year's G1 Darley Alcibiades S. over the main track here in October before annexing the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf a month later with two of

today's foes behind her. She comes off a close score in Saratoga's GII Lake Placid S. Aug. 19, with **Centre Court** (Smart Strike) second, **Somali Lemonade** (Lemon Drop Kid) third and **Better Lucky** (Ghostzapper) fifth. "We've been looking forward to this race for quite a while," the always entertaining Ken Ramsey told *Daily Racing Form*. "If we win, I'm going to send the Queen a win picture, along with an old photo of her that I've been trying to get ahold of from when she was here for the first running in 1984." Trainer Wayne Catalano added, "The filly has been doing just great, and I think she'll run like we all think she's supposed to Saturday."

G. Watts Humphrey, Jr.'s homebred Centre Court was the neck victoress of a rough running of the GII Lake George S. at the Spa July 25, besting four of these familiar fillies. Better Lucky was second, while **Samitar (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) was third, Stephanie's Kitten was a troubled-trip fourth and Somali Lemonade was sixth. The bay took Churchill's GIII Regret S. three back in June with **Treasured Up** (Medaglia d'Oro) third. Her layoff since the Lake Placid was by design, and this has been her long-term goal for a while. "After she won the Regret we knew she would get invited to the Queen Elizabeth," trainer Rusty Arnold explained. "We were going to Saratoga and knew she would have two races before this one. It would either be one at Saratoga and one at Belmont or two at Saratoga. When she won the [Lake George], it made sense to stay there." **Cont. p4**

NEW DAWN, SAME ERA

Like Sir Henry Cecil, Jim Bolger has undergone a sharp revival of fortunes in recent years and no other race typifies his resurgence greater than Newmarket's G1 Dubai Dewhurst S., which ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Dawn Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) tackles today in a bid to provide his Coolcullen stable with a fifth renewal in seven years. Unbeaten in five starts so far, Godolphin's purchase is more in the mold of Teofilo (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and his own sire--who provided back-to-back successes for their trainer in 2006 and 2007--than the surprise 2008 and 2011 winners Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway) and Parish Hall (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}). Race-hardened in his native Ireland, the chestnut put that experience to use when winning a talent-stacked edition of the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 19 and looked as if the subsequent break had only strengthened him in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. on his first try at this trip at The Curragh Sept. 15. "Dawn Approach has a great temperament and showed us almost from the word go," Bolger said. "His five races don't seem to have taken anything out of him and we've had absolutely no problems with him. Just watching him, you could see this fellow had something--he has a terrific action. He is able to quicken up when the need arises in his races and loves his racing. He's right up there, ability-wise, with New Approach but he may not stay as well as he did." **Cont. p5**

Penny's Picnic won his first two starts at Saint-Cloud and here by a cumulative margin of 18 lengths before having to battle in contrasting style when extending his unbeaten tally in the five-furlong Listed Prix la Fleche at Maisons-Laffitte June 8. Fourth in the latter venue's G2 Prix Robert Papin over 1100 meters July 22, he beat only one home on his first attempt at this trip in Deauville's G1 Prix Morny when last seen Aug. 19. Settled just behind the early pace on this comeback, the bay was committed before the furlong pole, and quickly opened up for a convincing success.

Trainer Chad Brown has been dominating the 2-year-old turf ranks lately, and his 3-year-olds aren't too shabby, either. Martin Schwartz's Samitar took the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas in May for Mick Channon, and comes off a tight tally over Somali Lemonade and **Tannery (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) in Belmont's GI Garden City S. Sept. 15.

Brown also has Jerry and Ronald Frankel, Steve Laymon and Bradley Thoroughbreds's **Dayatthespa** (City Zip), who puts her four-race win streak on the line in this toughest test of her career. The chestnut took the GIII Appalachian S. here in April and annexed Saratoga's Riskaverse S. last time Aug. 31.

Another ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ is the similarly unbeaten, but far less-accomplished Juddmonte representative **Ashdan (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), who went two-for-two in the "Frankel" conditions event over this distance at Doncaster Sept. 14. While that form is removed from the Dawn Approach standard, the homebred had the smart No Jet Lag (Johar) back in second, and the fourth Ninjago (GB) (Mount Nelson {GB}) has since boosted the form with an easy win. Rider William Buick is hopeful of a bold show despite his mount's lack of seasoning.

"He's a nice horse who will improve and be better next year," he said. "Dawn Approach is a tough nut to crack, but we'll try, and Ashdan will go there in good form and we'll see what we can do."

Aidan O'Brien has a duo that should not be underestimated in **George Vancouver** (Henrythenavigator) and **The Ferryman (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). The former was a strong-finishing runner-up to today's Middle Park protagonist Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) in the G1 Prix Morny over six furlongs at Deauville Aug. 19 before flopping when only sixth behind **Leitir Mor (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) in the G3 Round Tower S. over that trip at The Curragh last time Sept. 9.

"George Vancouver ran a bit keen the last day in quite soft ground--they went very slow on the day and it didn't suit him," jockey Joseph O'Brien told *PA Sport*. "He ran well in France the time before, so hopefully he can put that last run behind him and run a nice race on Saturday."

RECKLESS BY NAME, NOT BY NATURE

He may be named **Reckless Abandon (GB)** (Exchange Rate), but his chart through the various early-season 2-year-old tests has been relatively straightforward so far, and he defends an enviable record in today's G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket. Slightly errant but highly effective on his first three starts that included the June 21 G2 Norfolk S. over five furlongs at Royal Ascot and Maisons-Laffitte's G2 Prix Robert Papin over an extra 100 meters July 22, he was a much more straightforward conveyance for Gerald Mosse when wiring the G1 Prix Morny over this trip at Deauville last time Aug. 19.

Trainer Clive Cox commented, "I have been very happy with Reckless Abandon since he won the Morny at Deauville. He has had a nice healthy gap between then and now, and I'm happy that he is in really good order. It has been a fantastic season so far and I am very pleased with the progress he has made, but I just hope we don't get too much rain at Newmarket--that's my only concern. He has continued to strengthen and develop as you would expect from any 2-year-old, but very clearly in the right direction. I hope The 'dip' won't be a problem to him, as he is very well-balanced. It is the first time he will encounter anything like that on the track, so we don't honestly know, but he handles and manages himself very well." **Cont. p6**

He was runner-up in the G2 Railway S. at The Curragh 11 days after that Royal Ascot test before clipping heels and coming down in the G1 Phoenix S. back in Kildare last time Aug. 12. Reportedly injured in transit ahead of his scheduled next start in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. at The Curragh Sept. 15, he could benefit from an upturn in fortunes here. Also from Ballydoyle is the Morny third **Parliament Square (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}), who was a latest fifth in Doncaster's Weatherbys Insurance £300,000 2-Y-O S. over 6 1/2 furlongs when last seen Sept. 13.

LEADING THEM A MERRY DANCE

Despite the withdrawal of leading English challenger Ollie Olga (Stormy Atlantic), today's G1 Gran Criterium could be difficult for the Italian hopes to keep at home with Pearl Bloodstock's **Pearl Flute (Ire)** (Piccolo {GB}) turning up at the San Siro. Since his seventh in the G1 Prix Morny over six furlongs at Deauville Aug. 19, the colt from the little-known Francis-Henri Graffard stable finished third behind What a Name (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) in the G3 Prix de la Rochette at Longchamp Sept. 9 before taking the G3 Prix des Chenes over this trip back there 13 days later. The third home on that occasion, Us Law (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}), took Thursday's G3 Prix Thomas Bryon and he was just a head in front of the re-opposing **Deauville Prince (Fr)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who had previously beaten the subsequent Group 3 scorer Melody of Love (GB) (Haafhd {GB}) in the Aug. 27 Listed Ripon Champion Two Yrs Old Trophy. Of the home team, Raffaele Biondi's July 22 Listed Criterium Partenopeo scorer **Castello Aragonese (GB)** (Authorized {Ire}) figures prominently, while Germany fields an unbeaten raider in Gestut Graditz's **Nabucco (Ger)** (Areion {Ger}), who put the highly regarded Best Tango (Ity) (Mujahid) firmly in his place in the Listed Premio Vittorio Riva over this track and trip last time Sept. 23.

FACING UP TO THE CHALLENGE

Seven furlongs remains a specialist trip in Europe and today's G2 Dubai Challenge S. at Newmarket features some proven types at that trip headed by Oliver McDowell's admirable **Libranno (GB)** (Librettist). Four of his six pattern-race successes have come at this distance and his latest, in the G2 Park S. at Doncaster Sept. 15, was a career-best from the hardy 4-year-old. "He has been a star for us, but we pulled him out of Ascot last week when it came up very soft, so it was good to hear that they had only 3mm of rain at Newmarket last night and the ground should be okay," trainer Richard Hannon said. Of the more unexposed types, George Strawbridge's **Fencing** (Street Cry {Ire}) remains of interest, having shown smart form at two when third in the G1 Racing Post Trophy over a mile at Doncaster, and he was badly hampered when off the board in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot last time June 19. Another is Pearl Bloodstock's **Pearl Mix (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}), who returned from a lengthy absence to win a decent mile conditions event on Kempton's Polytrack Sept. 20.

Jim Bolger could be in for another afternoon to remember at HQ today, with **Scintillula (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) backing up stable companion Dawn Approach's Dewhurst challenge with her own assault on the G2 Rockfel S. Runner-up to Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}) in The Curragh's G1 Moyglare Stud S. over this trip last time Sept. 9, the filly her trainer owns in partnership with Kirsten Rausing had modest form going into that race, but had proven group performers Harasiya (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) and Magical Dream (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) behind, and normal improvement should see her break her maiden here. Stepping up in trip is Poilin Good's homebred **Melody of Love (GB)** (Haafhd {GB}), who looked to need an extra panel when annexing the six-furlong G3 Firth of Clyde S. at Ayr last time Sept. 22, and she carries the hopes of the small stable of Ann Duffield. Unbeaten in two starts, Qatar Racing Limited and the Sangster Family's **Just the Judge (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}) is up in class after her smooth performance in Newbury's Listed Washington Singer S. on her latest outing Aug. 18.

Trainer Charlie Hills said, "We have been pleased with her recently and she has done nothing wrong in two starts. Her listed win at Newbury wasn't too surprising, because she has always shown that she is a nice filly. She won her maiden on good-to-soft and she will have no problem with cut in the ground." David Wachman sends across Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's impressive Fairyhouse maiden winner **Gift From Heaven (Ire)** (Excellent Art {GB}), and she could be anything after overcoming extremely testing ground in that Sept. 24 six-furlong event.

TRADING STANDARD

Future Champions' Day could turn into a Jim Bolger benefit if all goes to plan, and his homebred colt **Trading Leather (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) can live up to his initial promise in the G3 Autumn S. this afternoon. Runner-up to the subsequent G2 Beresford S. hero **Battle of Marengo (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in Leopardstown's Listed Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Trial S. over a mile on his racecourse bow Sept. 8, he made all to score by an authoritative seven-length margin just 15 days later at Gowran Park, and his conditioner sees him as a live Classic prospect for 2013. "His last run was very good and he came out of the race well," Bolger said. "I'd be hoping he will give a good account and maybe fit himself up for the G1 Racing Post Trophy. I'm viewing him at the moment as a Derby horse, so, hopefully, things will work out, and my assessment of him is correct. He has more furnishing to do and it's only in the last couple of weeks that he has stepped up to where he is now, so I'd imagine there is a good bit of improvement to come." Another fascinating Irish challenger is Michael O'Flynn's **Galileo Rock (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who also scored by seven lengths on his sole outing over this trip at Leopardstown Aug. 16. "Hopefully, they don't get too much rain as a bit of reasonable ground is important to a horse like him," trainer David Wachman told *PA Sport*. "He's going to be quite raw and green going there off the back of just one run, but we'll see what happens." Another debut maiden winner thrown in at the deep end is John Grant's **Glenard (GB)** (Arch), who looked highly promising when scoring over this distance at Doncaster Sept. 13 and has been part-purchased by Highclere Thoroughbred Racing in the interim. Trainer Charles Hills commented, "He has come out of his race at Doncaster well and did a nice piece of work the other morning. The plan was always to go for this race after Doncaster--he's a big horse and we have been going steady with him as a 2-year-old. He should stay well and next season will really be his year." Richard Hannon puts forward the unbeaten **Montiridge (Ire)** (Ramonti {Fr}), who kept his perfect record intact despite needing the run over seven furlongs at Sandown last time Sept. 19. "Montiridge runs in what looks a hot renewal for the Autumn Stakes," Hannon said. "He is two from two and, though he only won narrowly at Sandown last time, he had only just returned after being on the sick list, and was probably a couple of gallops short so he can be expected to improve."

NEW NUMBER ONE

Tattersalls' three-day October Book 1 Yearling Sale this week figured to set the bar as far as the top of the world's Thoroughbred auction marketplace is concerned, and the figures were impressive. Of 577 yearlings catalogued over the three days, 418 (72.4% of those catalogued) were sold. Converted to U.S. dollars for comparison with the U.S. marketplace (1 guinea = \$1.68 for simplicity), the 418 yearlings sold for a total of \$114,412,200, and an average of \$273,313. With 14% more yearlings catalogued, and 15% more sold than last year, the gross was up by 32% (from \$86,743,120), and the average was up by 15% (from \$238,310).

This is pretty impressive all by itself--over 400 yearlings averaged nearly \$275,000--but here are a couple of statistics that I think are even more impressive. First, 28 yearlings (that is one out of every 15 sold) sold for 450,000gns (\$756,000) or more. In fact, the average price for the 28 translates to \$1,227,600. Second, the other 390 yearlings--the other 14 of every 15 yearlings sold--still averaged the equivalent of \$205,230.

That figure of \$205,230 rang a little bell, and sure enough, it is awfully close to the \$202,829 average for 655 yearlings sold during Keeneland September Week 1, which actually included the 12 yearlings sold for \$750,000+ during Keeneland Books 1-2 this year. That's right, 12. Look at the little table with the heading '3 Elite Sales' this year: Saratoga (107 yearlings averaged \$299,065); Keeneland September Week 1 (Books 1-2, 655 yearlings averaged \$202,829); and Tattersalls' October Book 1 (418 yearlings averaged \$273,713). I've been speculating, ever since I saw that Keeneland Week 1 average, about that "\$200,000 yearling"--how many are there, and where are they selling?

In that respect--the \$200,000 yearling--yes, there is a measurable shift from North America to Europe. In 2011, just at 70% (856) of the 1,220 yearlings sold in those three sales combined, sold at the two North American sales; this year, the number was 65%, so there was a 5% shift in the number sold toward Europe. In 2011, October 1 constituted exactly 33% of the three-sale gross (\$86.7 million of a total \$264.8-million gross); in 2012, the October 1 percentage is 41% (\$114.4 million of a total \$279.2-million gross)--an 8% shift in money to Europe.

But this, surely, is the most staggering statistic: there have been a total of 44 yearlings sold, among the three sales, for the equivalent of \$750,000 or more. October 1 had 35% of the yearlings sold, and 41% of the money spent, among the three sales; it also had 63.6% (28) of the 44 yearlings sold for \$750,000 or more--that's seven of every eleven. To have 35% of the yearlings sold, but 64% of the top 4%--the \$750,000-plus yearlings--there can only be one explanation for that: sire power. And by 'sire power' we mean this: Galileo was responsible for 11 of the 44 yearlings which brought \$750k+: 25% (his average, for 29 sold in October 1: \$831,020). Of the 33 other \$750k+ yearlings, 17 were sired by 10 other European sires, and 16 were sired by 12 other American (Kentucky) sires. Conclusion: the top sires are now 50-50, plus Europe gets world number one Galileo, which tilts the ratio of the most valuable yearlings to 7-4 in favor of Europe.

Of the 23 stallions that sired these 44 yearlings, 15 of the sires--seven in Europe, eight in America--sired one \$750,000-plus yearling each. Eight stallions--four each in Europe and America--sired two or more. In Europe, as you know, Galileo sired 11; his half-brother Sea the Stars sired four, in his first crop of yearlings; Montjeu and Oasis Dream sired three each. Four American sires--Street Cry, Empire Maker, Distorted Humor, and Smart Strike--sired two each. Total sires represented: 11 Europe, 12 America.

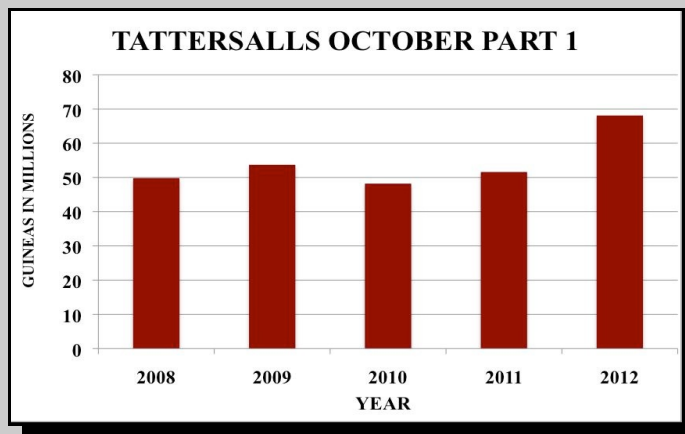
Interestingly, there were also a total of 23 buyers who accounted for the 44 yearlings that brought \$750k+. Only four buyers signed for \$750k+ yearlings in both North America and Europe, and they were the top four buyers at this level: Demi O' Byrne (eight total, two at Keeneland and six at October 1); Shadwell (5); Australian Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds (4); and John Ferguson, for Sheikh Mohammed (3). David Redvers and Mandore International, who both buy for Qatari interests, bought two each at Tatts, as did English agent Hugo Lascelles. In the States, Stonestreet (plus George Bolton, in one case) and Todd Pletcher, as agent, each signed for one at Saratoga and one at Keeneland. **Cont. p12**

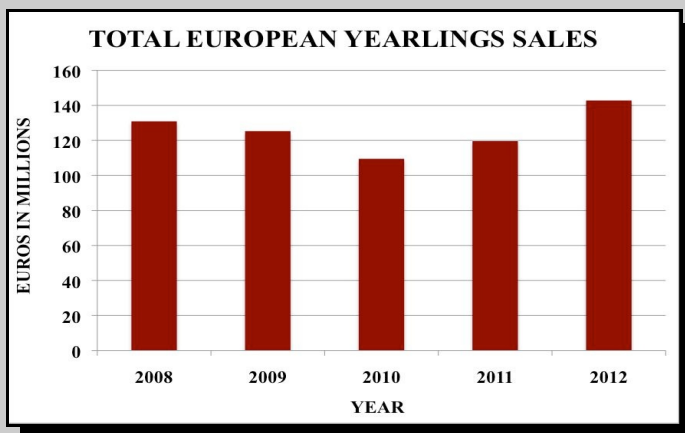

The overall conclusions make stark reading for Kentucky breeders, because this quantifies the loss of market share to Europe, at the top of the market: 5% in numbers, 8% in money in the last 12 months; and now European sires are virtually 50-50 with Kentucky in the number of stallions siring \$750k+ yearlings; and, because the world number one, Galileo, stands in Europe, it swings the ratio of top-level yearlings sold to 63.6%--seven out of every 11--to Europe. And, really, it does just about mean that Tattersalls October 1 has now displaced Keeneland September Week 1 as the world's most important yearling sale.

BRADLEY TO TAKE BREEDERS' CUP CHANCE

With the costs of keeping a Thoroughbred racehorse too high for most individuals to burden, many of those wishing to get involved in racing in recent years have opted to invest in partnerships. Syndicates like Team Valor International, West Point Thoroughbreds and Dogwood Stable have done their parts to prove how successful these ventures can be in both producing top- class racehorses and in introducing new owners to the game. This year, however, has seen the rise of another racing partnership group. When **Watsdachances (Ire)** (Diamond Green {Fr}) stormed to victory in Monday's Miss Grillo S. on the Belmont turf, she made it clear that the Bradley Thoroughbreds racing ventures mean business.

Pete Bradley, a bloodstock agent based in Lexington, Kentucky, has been trading horses for almost 20 years, and has been involved in the sales of horses such as multiple Grade I winner and champion broodmare Windsharp; Dream Rush, a multiple Grade I winner and dam of standout juvenile Dreaming of Julia (A.P. Indy); and Easter Bunnette, dam of Horse of the Year Havre de Grace. In the last few years, Bradley has increased his involvement in setting up racing partnerships and, in 2012, Bradley Thoroughbreds and its co-owners have experienced a banner year, campaigning the likes of GI Manhattan S. winner Desert Blanc (GB) (Desert Style {Ire}); Dayatthespa (City Zip), who is unbeaten this year and will contest today's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland, and now Watsdachances, who is two-for-two in America for trainer Chad Brown since being imported from Ireland, where she broke her maiden for trainer Ger Lyons in April. Bradley explained it was that six-length victory, combined with the form from her debut effort, that persuaded him to roll the dice with the Irish-bred.

"Watsdachances was a good third first out in Ireland, and the first four horses from that race all came back and won, so right there it looked like it was a decent group," Bradley explained. "Her second race was a maiden race, which she won at a relatively small track called Navan, but she won by six lengths and she showed a very good turn of foot. The going was soft that day, and I usually don't buy horses out of races with soft going, but in this case with her turn of foot I thought she was worth taking a punt on. The price was right, so it made sense to take a shot with her."

Bradley explained that, while buying horses from Europe is nothing new for him, he has had to change the way he does business in recent years. **Cont. p13**

"I've been buying horses out of Europe for almost 20 years, and doing little racing partnerships here and there," Bradley said. "As a rule I bought horses for [individuals], and then over the last five or six years it became more difficult to buy horses out of Europe. More of them were getting sucked into the racing carnival in Dubai, and the Euro went up against the dollar. So I really didn't [buy many horses out of Europe] except for maybe a horse or two here or there. Then I decided that we needed to get more people into racing, and the partnerships such as Dogwood and West Point seem to be doing really well promoting our sport. So I decided to do something similar, with a bit of a twist on it."

The focus of Bradley's partnerships is primarily on buying fillies, although he notes that his co-owners scored a home run with Desert Blanc, a colt that Bradley picked out of France. Although the 4-year-old's career was cut short by a tendon injury this summer, the Chad Brown charge flashed talent in two American outings, finishing second by a length in his stateside debut in the Gill Fort Marcy S. at Belmont May 5, then taking the Manhattan on that strip a month later.

Bradley explained that by campaigning mostly fillies, the co-owners in his partnerships have an easier exit strategy at the end of the horse's career.

"They have greater residual value," he noted. "Watsdachances is now a Grade III winner. Let's hope she wins a lot more races, but if she doesn't, we've established a nice value on her as a broodmare. On the other side of the coin, a colt that wins a Grade III on the turf doesn't have much residual value from a stallion standpoint."

Bradley noted that there are some key factors that set his ownership ventures apart from other larger syndicates. He prefers to keep his groups small, with under 10 people involved in each horse, and no more than 15-20 horses in partnerships at any one time. To keep the costs at a minimum for his co-owners, Bradley doesn't mark up the prices of the horses when selling shares; rather, his company takes a 5% commission of the cost of each share, in addition to 5% of profits from each horse. Each share sold is worked out on an individual basis, with some owners involved in multiple horses.

"The units in the ventures are anywhere from as low as \$15,000 to as high as \$100,000 per unit, depending on the horses we have," Bradley said. "Sometimes the ventures are one single horse, sometimes we have multiple horses. For instance, Dayatthespa was in a venture that had three 2-year-olds in it. It was our New York-bred venture; we were trying to find New York-breds two years ago. The other two horses in that venture, one is at Keeneland and is trained by Tom Bush, and the other filly was claimed and is no longer in the venture."

While most syndicates campaign their horses under the name of the syndicate manager, the horses in Bradley's racing ventures run in the silks and the names of the majority owner in the partnership.

"We give recognition to the co-owners, and if they own a larger part of the horse, they get their names on the ownership label," Bradley explained.

While Bradley has a core group of clients that are involved in most of the partnerships, he noted that over the last year, some new owners have become involved.

"Because we're a small operation we can't spend a lot on print advertising, but word of mouth is a big part of it," Bradley said. "Contacts through other co-owners have probably been as big a way of getting clients as any."

Bradley Thoroughbreds currently campaigns 11 horses in partnership, employing trainers Chad Brown, Tom Bush, and Michelle Nihei. Seven of those horses are 2-year-olds, and have chiefly been selected from 2-year-old sales or imported from Europe. **Cont. p14**

"I do a lot of reading of form out of Europe and in the U.S., too," Bradley explained. "You just have to constantly keep looking. There's certain traits I look for in horses. For turf horses, they have to have a turn of foot, and I try to find horses that are possibly just a touch under top class in Europe, or horses that are just on the way up, and make a decision as to whether they'd fit racing in the U.S."

Bradley noted that he is constantly sourcing horses to put into partnership.

"I'm always looking," he said. "There's a chance we're going to start another venture here within the next week with a couple horses I've found. It really comes down to two things: finding the right horses, and having the people who want to join you in the next venture. Like I said, there's a core group, but it's not like you snap your fingers with every horse and put together a new venture immediately. I don't like to buy the horses before I know I have enough people to put the co-ownership together."

While the future for the Bradley partnerships could be bright with so many unexposed juveniles in their arsenal, the partners are still focused on 2012, and more specifically a trip to the Breeders' Cup with Watsdachances.

"The [Miss Grillo] was a 'Win and You're In' [for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf], and when the Breeders' Cup pays for your entry, it's hard not to go when you've got a filly that looks like she deserves it," said Bradley.

And if Dayatthespa runs to her abilities in today's QEII at Keeneland, the Bradley Thoroughbred partners could have even more to look forward to next month.

"With a small number of horses, we've been very lucky this year," said Bradley. "As much as I'd like to take more credit for it, it really comes down to the horses. When you have good horses, it makes it very fun to go to the races." --by *Kelsey Riley*
