While Tuesday's session of Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale was led by a Shamardal colt, it was the turn of fellow Darley sire Exceed And Excel



Session-topping lot 1305 tattersalls.com

(Aus) to top the billing when his son out of the Superlative mare Arian Da (GB) (lot 1305) was sold to the Hong Kong Jockey Club for 200,000gns. With another strong clutch of six-figure yearlings, the median for the third session was again better than the corresponding day in 2011, up 24% to 33,500gns, but the aggregate dipped

slightly, by 3% to 7,625,500gns. The clearance rate held steady at a respectable 83%.

Just like Tuesday's topper, the half-brother to the late Group 2-winning sprinter Prime Defender, a 62,000gns TATDEC graduate, was consigned by Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud.

"It's always good when you're ringing bells," said O'Callaghan. "They were two very good horses and I always felt they would do well. The good ones will always sell well and the day they don't, we're all in trouble."

John Ferguson was underbidder on the colt, whose dual-hemisphere sire has enjoyed yet another good year on the track courtesy of horses such as G1 Prix Jacques le Marois winner Excelebration (Ire), the smart juvenile Bungle Inthejungle (GB) and Saturday's G2 Challenge S. winner Fulbright (GB).

Exceed and Excel has two new sons retiring to stud in Ireland for the 2013 season, with Excelebration heading to Coolmore and Helmet (Aus) set to stand at Darley's Kildangan Stud.

"Exceed and Excel works well in Hong Kong, as he does around the world," said the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Mark Richards. "I liked this horse's deep girth, and his good front. He'll need time, but he'll get it. The family is all about speed, and that's what we are after."

Herbertstown, based in Kildare, Ireland, was bought by Ronan Burns last June. His father Seamus Burns owns the successful Lodge

Park Stud, birthplace of the great New Approach (Ire).

"It's been a great sale," said Burns. "I bred all the horses I sold this week and last."

The Irishman bought the Clodovil filly's dam Bintalreef (Diesis {GB}) when carrying a Dynaformer foal who would go on to be named Buxted. He won his first three starts, including the Listed Dragonfly S. and has subsequently been sold to race in Australia. Bintalreef is not in foal this year, but has a colt foal by Duke of Marmalade (Ire).

Burns added, "That was a good result, but you soon come back to earth pretty quickly. I can't wait to get home to see my kids. I've been away long enough."

Corduff's Good Run Continues...

Corduff Stud's great week continued with the sale of a 170,000gns Dubawi colt (lot 1142) to John Ferguson. Bought for 47,000gns as a foal last December through Richard Brown of Blandford

Bloodstock, the colt out of the unraced Trans Island mare Tango Tonic (Ire) also caught the interest of Tom Goff and John Warren, but it was Ferguson who prevailed, taking his tally of Book 2 purchases to 11 for just short of a million guineas.

Myboycharlie, whose first crop were conceived at the National Stud for a

fee of £5,500, has a Book 2 average of just over 100,000gns for four sold following the sale of Manister House Stud's colt out of Time Will Show (Fr) (Exit to Nowhere) (lot 1166) to Coolmore for 160,000gns.

Another to have delivered a great mark-up on his foal price of 43,000gns, he has been a "stunning horse all year," according to vendor Luke Barry.

Manister House Stud's yearlings to offer on the final day include a sister to Saturday's G1 Gran Criterium winner Law Enforcement (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}), who sells as lot 1380.

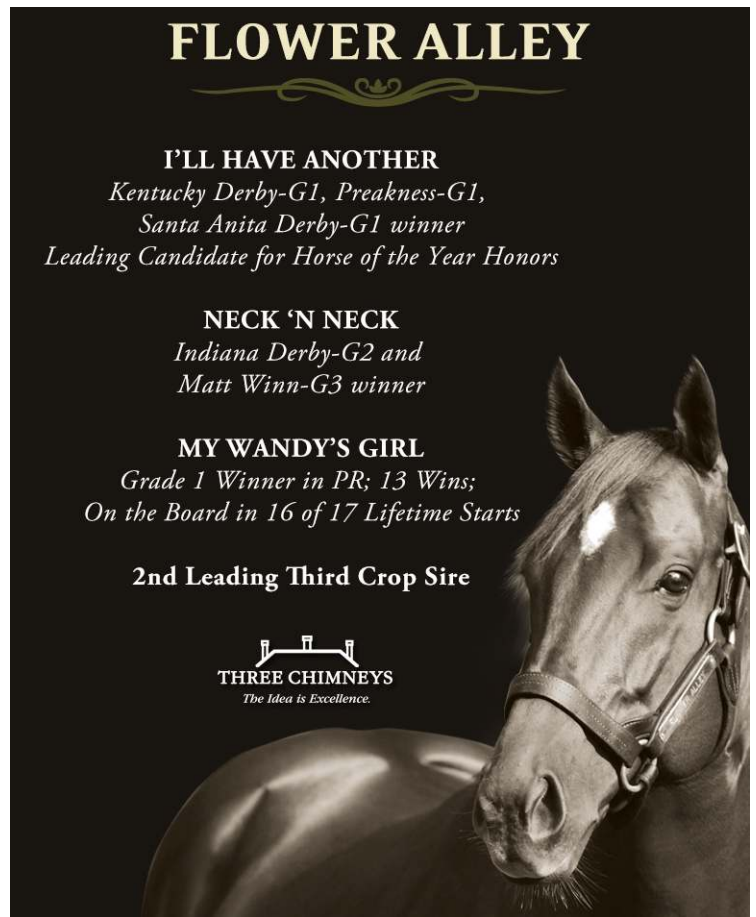

DARBY DAN'S FRESHMAN SIRES...WOW!

Both Magna Graduate and Run Away And Hide have been a big hit on the Freshman Sire List in 2012. Magna Graduate started strong and topped the charts early.

The beautifully bred grandson of Danzig produced the first graded stakes winner of any freshman sire when Blueeyesintherein won the Grade III Debutante S. at Churchill Downs. Despite comparatively modest foal crops, Magna Graduate remains impressive with four other winners to date. Ryan Norton, stallion manager at Darby Dan, notes "the superb conformation of his foals was not a

surprise but their precocity.....well, let's just say, we are very happy!"

Stablemate Run Away And Hide was not to be outdone and, as of October 12th, Run Away And Hide has risen to third on the Freshman Sire's list. Represented by stakes winner, Heaven's Runway and Grade II placed, Are You Kidding Me, Run Away And Hide already has 8 winners from 20 runners for a percentage of 40%. Robert Hammond observes, "He has made a great start with top class runners. The exciting part is there are more in the pipeline. Run Away And Hide is a serious sire."



Treat for Onslow...

G2 Mill Reef S. winner Moohaajim (Ire) narrowly missed out on Group 1 glory in last weekend's Middle Park S., and another colt by his sire Cape Cross will be joining Marco Botti's string for 2013 after the trainer gave 100,000gns for lot 1178, who is out of G3 Cornwallis S. winner Trick Or Treat (GB) (Lomitas {GB}). The colt's 2-year-old half-sister Hollowina (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) won at Haydock on debut Sept. 29 for her owner/breeder Peter Onslow, who also raced Trick Or Treat.

"Hollowina's going for the Montrose S. at Newmarket Nov. 3, so we've just cancelled our holiday so we can be here to watch her," said a delighted Onslow, who has nine mares with partner Ann Harrison at their Sanfield Stud in Lancashire. The Cape Cross colt was consigned by Tom Whelan's Church View Stables in Ireland.

"I'm so glad he is going to Marco Botti," he added. "He says he loves the sire and, if he's anywhere near as good as Moohaajim, that would be wonderful. This is the first time Tom has consigned a horse for me, but I always send my mares to him if they are going to Irish stallions, and he does a great job."

As well as enjoying group-class success with the homebred Trick Or Treat, Onslow also bred the dual Group 3-winning sprinter Moorhouse Lad (GB) (Bertolini) and co-owned another fast Group 3 winner, Jessica's Dream (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}), who was sold to Sir Eric Parker's Crimbourne Stud for 115,000gns and is now the dam of this season's dual stakes winner Havana Gold (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}).

Trick Or Treat has an Archipenko colt foal at foot, but, as he was born in late April, the mare wasn't covered this year.

Successful Debut for Hursley...

Pleased to have bought a Royal Applause (GB) colt for 100,000gns on the first day of Book 2, the team of Sarah Lakin and Geoffrey Howson struck again on Wednesday to secure another colt, this time by Holy Roman Emperor (lot 1321), to race in Hong Kong.

"Holy Roman Emperor is popular as a sire in Hong Kong," said Lakin. "He won't be moved there until at least February though as there's no rush." Her buying partner Howson added, "He has great scope and walked really well, plus he was a decent size for a Holy Roman Emperor. My assistant Sam Hoskins found him and we really liked him."

The colt was consigned by Hursley Bloodstock, a fledgling venture by the team at Jeff Smith's Littleton Stud, headed by David Bowe.

"Hursley is a subsidiary of Littleton Stud," explained Bowe. "We decided to dip a toe in the water and buy and sell a few and see how we got on. This is our first year doing this, and we're really pleased so far."

Hursley Bloodstock sells a Bushranger colt today (lot 1470) and last week did well with another son of Holy Roman Emperor in Book 1 (lot 1293), who sold for 170,000gns.

Carmel Delight...

The good week for Bahamian Bounty (GB) continued to the benefit of Somerset-based Carmel Stud, which sold a homebred colt (lot 1332) to Ross Doyle for 105,000gns.

"He's been really popular over the last three days, but we didn't like to get our hopes up too much. He came good just at the right time," said stud owner Michelle Morgan, who bought his dam Ballymore Celebre (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) for 290,000gns at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale in 2004. She has since produced three winners, including the multiple scorer Pintrada (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}).

Highclere Heads Down Under...

John Warren has signed for four sons of High Chaparral (Ire) during Book 2, two of which will form a new Anglo-Australian syndicate for the successful Highclere Thoroughbred Racing.

"We already have two or three Australian owners in Highclere and, with more Aussies coming over each year to support their horses at Royal Ascot, we thought a dual-hemisphere syndicate might work," said Warren's brother-in-law and partner in Highclere, Harry Herbert, who added that the intention is to race the horses in England at two and three before shipping them to Australia to continue their careers under the management of Mark Player.

"William Haggas and Sir Michael Stoute will train the horses initially, and Gai Waterhouse and Peter Moody are our trainers in Australia. We may also buy a proven horse or two and hopefully build up a good string." He added, "High Chaparral has done really well in Australia and we like to buy middle-distance horses, but we can't get near a Galileo."

The horses for the nine Highclere Thoroughbred Racing syndicates for next year will be shown at the yearling parades, which start on Sunday.

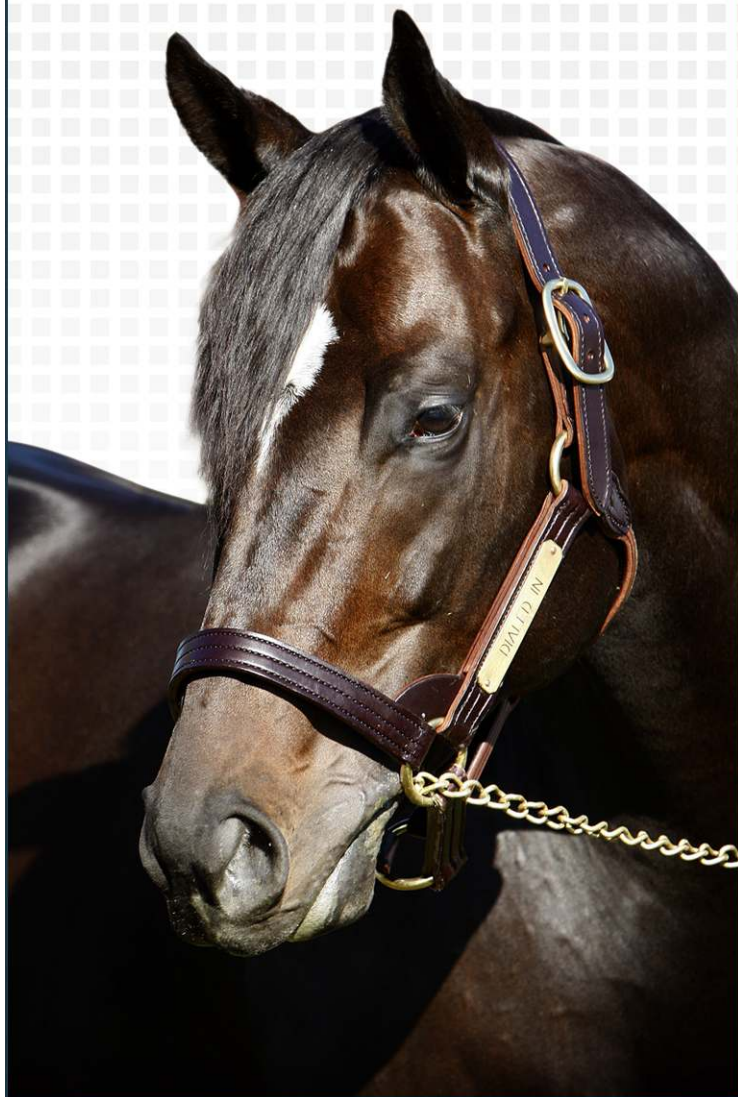

Ascot was hit by substantial rain on Tuesday night, but the possibility that Saturday's feature card could be run on extremely testing ground appeared unlikely as officials took stock of the situation yesterday. Following 12 millimeters of rain, Wednesday's official description was "soft" and, despite further wet weather forecast this week, Clerk of the Course Chris Stickels remains hopeful that the going will remain that way on Saturday. "It's a breezy day today, with the occasional blustery shower," he explained. "There's more of a rain band due in overnight and tomorrow morning, which could deliver a reasonable amount of rain again. If it materialises, there's a chance we could be going heavy in places on the round course tomorrow morning if that wet weather does deliver a similar amount to last night. After that though, it does look to be an improving picture for Friday and Saturday. There is still a threat of showers on Friday and maybe on Saturday. The weather on Saturday is looking quite nice at present, but the situation keeps changing. Once the rain soaks through, there's a chance it will go back to soft even if it does go heavy in places tomorrow. There is fresh ground we've been saving since July. It's taken the rain."

"He's very well, he's been working very nicely, but we have decided to put him away. Looking at him physically now, he's got a lot of size about him and there's plenty still to come. He's a very, very nice horse, and we will look forward to his return next year, when hopefully he will be a Derby contender."

"She's been invited to Japan for the [Mile Championship S.] and she qualifies for a bonus if she can win that, having already won the Sun Chariot," her conditioner told the *Racing Post*. "The race is in a month, but I think she won quite easily on Sunday and didn't have a hard race physically or mentally, so we'll work towards that. At the beginning of the year, she was a little immature, so I preferred to see her run over a mile, but she's strengthened up and she proved Sunday that a mile and a quarter suits her as well."

Peslier Lands Wizz Kid Ride...

Olivier Peslier has been called up for the ride on **Wizz Kid (Ire)** (Whipper) in Saturday's G1 Qipco British Champions Sprint S. at Ascot. With regular rider Gerald Mosse unable to partner Maeve Mahony's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner due to commitments in Australia, trainer Robert Collet has snapped up Peslier and the jockey told the *Racing Post*, "I rode her work this morning to get to know her and everything went well. She won the Abbaye when she was the only French filly against all the English, now she must try and do the same on their turf. The ground will be fine for her, but it will be very competitive."

Welfare & Safety of the Racehorse Summit

WELFARE SUMMIT WRAPS UP

The fourth Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit concluded yesterday in Lexington, Kentucky, with a pair of panel discussions.

John Sabini, chairman of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board and chairman of the Association of Racing Commissions International; Kelli Talbot, deputy attorney general for the West Virginia Racing Commission; Hugh Gallagher, executive director of the Delaware Harness Racing Commission; and

Joe Gorajec, executive director of the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, joined for a racing commissioners' panel titled "Implementing Initiatives."

The group spoke about the difficulties in agreeing to and passing uniform rules among states, especially given the legislative hurdles in each jurisdiction.

"I think true uniformity, the kind of uniformity that the public wants and most of the industry wants, can only be achieved through some kind of federal assistance," opined Gallagher. "It would be great if there were a column of uniform rules in every jurisdiction, along with the penalties, but in the meantime we have reality. We have 38 jurisdictions in North America, and pretty much 38 sets of rules."

The group also talked about ways in which racing commissions are protecting horses, including enacting regulations that void claims if the claimed horse suffers a catastrophic injury in the race. For Joe Gorajec, however, it's something else the Indiana Racing Commission has done that's helped keep horses safe: keeping a keen eye on the purse-to-claim price ratio. Gorajec said when the state first got slot machines several years ago, commissioners made the conscious decision to boost the purses of races for high-priced claiming, allowance and stakes races, rather than low-priced claimers.

"We heard [Tuesday] about the purse-to-claiming price ratio," said Gorajec, who was referencing Tim Parkin's presentation of figures that showed horses were 2.4 times more likely to suffer a fatal breakdown if the purse was 1.8 times the size of the claiming price. "We wanted more money to go to the better horses, rather than a lot of money going to the cheapest horses," added Gorajec.

But Gorajec acknowledged that racing secretaries face a tough predicament, as there are many more lower-priced claimers than top horses, and filling races becomes an issue.

"And it's only going to get worse," he said. "You have a horse population that's dwindling, and you're going to have race secretaries more reaching out and more aggressively try to fill their races. Some racetracks are going after the cheapest horses, and they're going after them in the most competitive way: with money. I don't think it's a good thing to have a \$5,000 claimer going for \$20,000. It doesn't promote quality. We have horsemen [in Indiana] who want to raise the purses for \$5,000 claimers--we just say no."

The Summit ended with a focus on Thoroughbred aftercare. Mike Ziegler of the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance; Anna Ford from New Vocations; Steuart Pittman from Retired Racehorse Training Project; and the Kristin Werner Leshney from the Thoroughbred Incentive Program and Thoroughbred Connect each spoke.

Like the three previous Summits, held in October 2006, March 2008 and June 2010, the Summit was underwritten and coordinated by The Jockey Club and Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation and hosted by Keeneland Association. For the first time, all sessions were open to the public and the entire Summit was available on a live video stream.

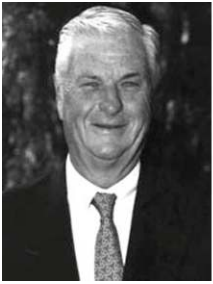

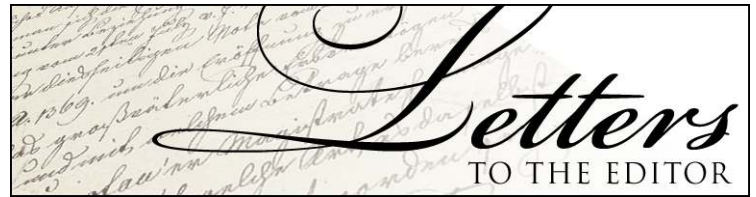
Arthur Hancock summed it up quite well when he said, "We can't expect to be a major-league product and gain the respect of the fans if we slaughter the athlete we come to cheer."

There will always be some casualties and euthanasia when appropriate, but the majority of retired Thoroughbreds deserve a second chance if they can be repaired and regain soundness.

Thirteen years ago I purchased a farm in California and named it Tranquility Farm. With the help of John Amerman, the late Bob Lewis, Marsha Naify, Madeline Auerbach, CARMA, and a few other donors, Priscilla Clark the farm manager has cared for over 1,000 horses with a good percentage of adoptions and many success stories. Rehabilitation can work if funding is available. I urge the stallion owners who did not participate to reconsider a one-time financial contribution each year. Contributing to the Aftercare Alliance is in the best interest of everyone who enjoys our great sport. I'm hopeful both the sales companies and the tracks can see the light and consider both a percentage of sales and small percentage of handle.

Again, thank you Jack, Jimmy and Jim, and all the others who together put the Alliance on the map. All the devoted fans and employees who have and care for these retired Thoroughbreds appreciate what you have done for them and the horses.

In a story by Tom Precious posted on Bloodhorse.com Oct. 10, he asserts that New York is "set to act on Task Force findings because deficiencies in State rules and practices at the NYRA helped contribute to last winter's high number of equine deaths at Aqueduct." In fact, the Task Force could find no explanation for the "high" number of deaths last winter. The "recommendations" they (the Task Force) made were at best a cover for the undeniable truth that racing horses is hard (sometimes fatally so) on them (horses). Banning clenbuterol 21 days out and requiring more transparency on the use of corticosteroids will not mitigate that harsh reality. If one is inclined to think that horses are cruelly weakened by greedy trainers contemplate the recent "end" of three promising and already accomplished young horses: Potesta, career-ending fracture after training at Betfair Hollywood (all weather); death of Spurious Precision after a catastrophic injury following training at Aqueduct (dirt); and finally, death of Newfangled the day after she sustained a serious pelvic fracture during a race on the turf at York.
