ROYAL DELTA ENTERED IN BOTH CLASSICS

Champion **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) has been cross-entered in both the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, but the 4-year-old filly will most likely defend her title in the Ladies' Classic.

"[Owner Ben Leon] just wants to be in position to have the option if at the last minute we change our mind, if there were a bunch of defections out of the Classic," trainer Bill Mott told *Daily Racing Form*. "I think we should go in the Ladies' Classic," Mott continued. "We talked about it next year trying [the Classic] on the way out if she makes another season. It's not any indication of what she can and can't do. It's more an indication of me than her."

Royal Delta, purchased by Leon for \$8.5 million at Keeneland November just days after her Breeders' Cup victory, is coming off a dominating 9 1/2-length victory in the Sept. 29 GI Beldame Invitational S. at Belmont. She turned in a bullet five-furlong work at Belmont Monday in :59.16 after which Mott told *DRF*, "She couldn't have gone any better."

TWO ADDED TO POST FIELD

Saturday's G1 Racing Post Trophy was swollen by a pair of fascinating supplementary entries at the six-day stage, with **Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Van Der Neer (Ire)** (Dutch Art {GB}) set to test their mettle in Doncaster's mile contest. The former, who was the seven-length winner of a Navan maiden Oct. 10, joins five other Ballydoyle trainees including **Battle of Marengo (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), successful in the G2 Beresford S. at The Curragh last time Sept. 30, and **Eye of the Storm (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who was third in Newmarket's G3 Autumn S. Oct. 13. Richard Hannon paid the additional fee to let Saeed Manana's Van Der Neer take his chance after he went two-for-two in a Leicester conditions event last Tuesday.

Following that latest success, jockey Richard Hughes commented, "I really liked this colt when he won first time out at Yarmouth, and, though we had a tailwind helping us here at Leicester, you have to be impressed with the way he quickened. He found three lengths in five strides." **Cont. p3**

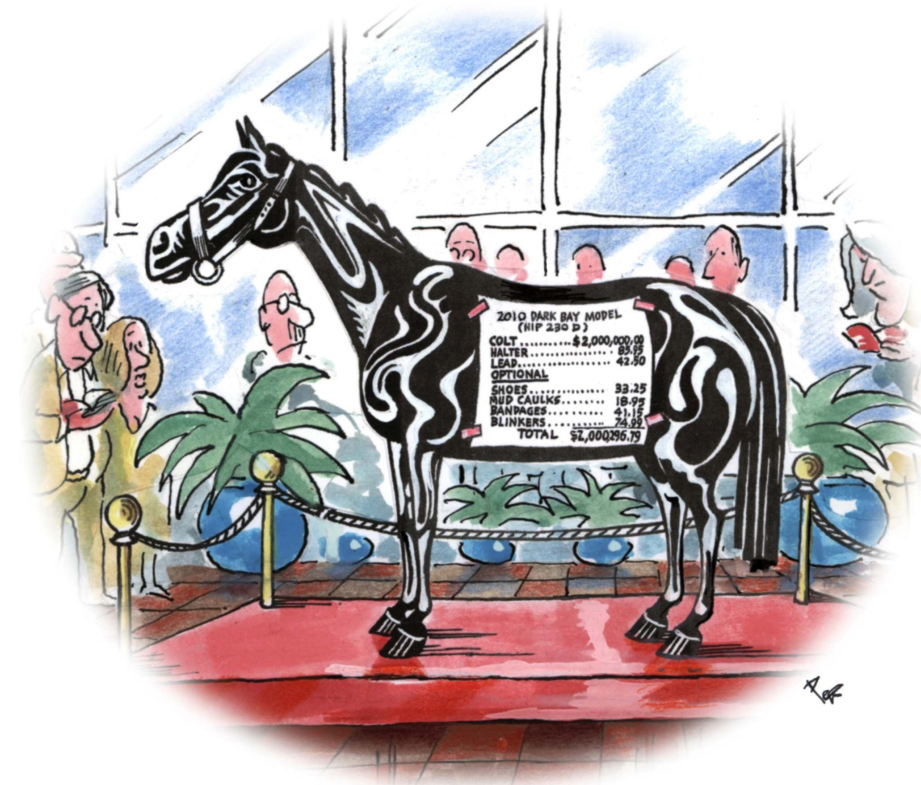

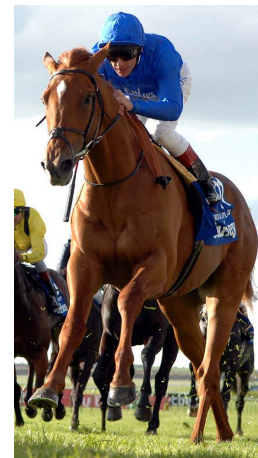
Alongside the Aidan O'Brien-trained contingent, further Irish interest is added by the presence of Jim Bolger's Autumn S. scorer **Trading Leather (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) and Team Valor's Aug. 26 G2 Futurity S. scorer **First Cornerstone (Ire)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}) from the Andrew Oliver stable. Mark Johnston has Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's Sept. 29 G2 Royal Lodge S. winner **Steeler (Ire)** (Raven's Pass) to call on, while Saeed Suhail's Sept. 1 G3 Solario S. scorer **Fantastic Moon (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) will bid to improve on his subsequent fifth in the Royal Lodge for Jeremy Nosedá.

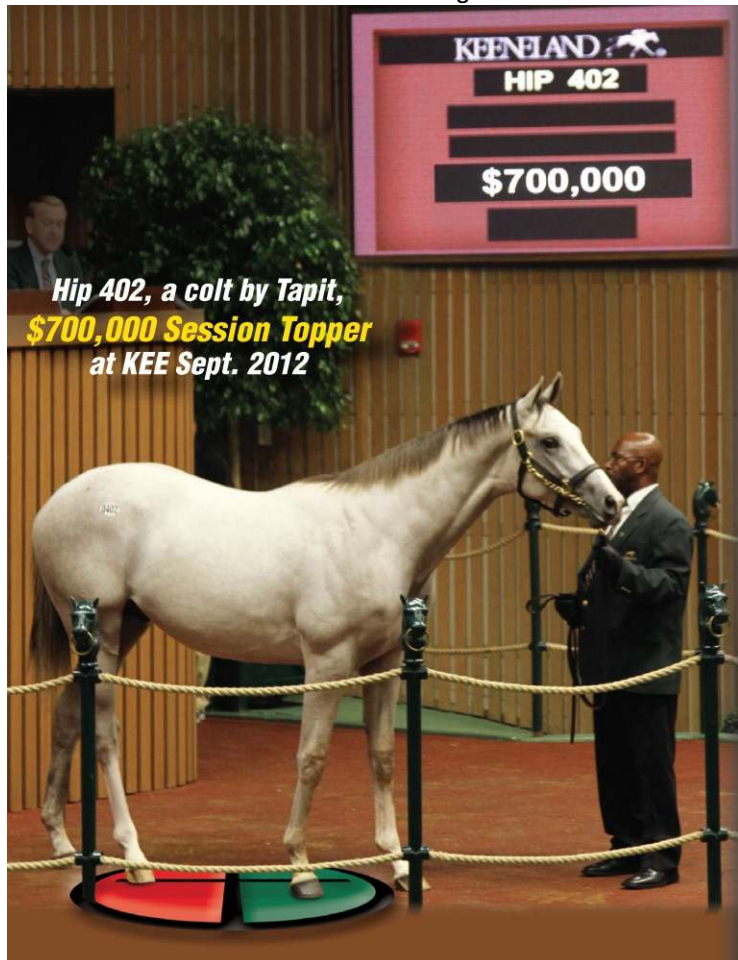
RIO DE LA PLATA RETIRED

Godolphin's **Rio de la Plata** (Rahy--Express Way {Arg}, by Ahmad {Arg}) has been retired and will join Darley's band of stallions at Haras du Logis in Normandy. The chestnut, who earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status with a five-length score at Newmarket in 2007, landed the G2 Vintage S. at Goodwood, and was in the money behind New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in that term's G1 National S. at The Curragh and G1 Dewhurst S. back at Newmarket. He managed a first top-tier success between those efforts when annexing the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp, and was runner-up in the following year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains back at the Bois de Boulogne track.

It took just over three years to register a second Group 1 win in the Oct. 2010 G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua at Milan's San Siro. The Saeed bin Suroor trainee closed a banner 5-year-old campaign--which included a runner-up finish in the G1 Prix du Moulin at Longchamp--with victory in the G1 Premio Roma at the Capanelle the following month. Rio de la Plata also ran third to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in last term's G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood, was runner-up to Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in the G1 Prix du Moulin back at Longchamp once more and finished a short-head adrift of Zazou (Ger) (Shamardal) when defending his crown in last November's G1 Premio Roma. He has failed to fire in four starts this season, including a last-out fifth in the Aug. 25 G3 Winter Hill S. at Windsor, and retires with a career record of 30-8-7-4, and earnings of £976,039. "Rio de la Plata was a very high-class 2-year-old, who proved to be notably durable and talented over a long career at the top," said Darley's Sam Bullard. "With those attributes, his powerful looks and his telling burst of acceleration, plus a pedigree that is an outcross to the major lines of the day, we are sure he will be popular with breeders."

KEENELAND HOSTS FASHIONS ON THE FIELD

Adopting a concept that has proven successful overseas, Keeneland will offer the inaugural "Lexus Fashions on the Field," which will be held at Keeneland Racecourse Oct. 27. Hosted by Fashion at the Races, the event is a fashion competition open to men and women 18 years and older.

"We are trying to hit the fashion industry and involve it with the Thoroughbred industry in order to gain a new fanbase," explained Fashion at the Races CEO Briana Mott. "We are

trying to give Thoroughbred racing a more positive image. One of the ways of doing that is by having Fashion on the Field. It is a concept that has been very successful in Australia, New Zealand, England and Dubai, so we took that concept and brought it here."

Fans can register online at www.fashionattheraces.com as well as in person at Keeneland the day of the event.

"There will be on-the-day registration, but we encourage people to register in advance online, so they don't miss out if we fill to capacity before raceday," said Mott.

Among those enlisted to serve as judges for the event are retired jockey and NBC racing commentator Donna Brothers, Lexington stylist Edwin Rye, Lexington's "Queen of Diamonds," jeweler Shelia Bayes and Chicago-based milliner Jenny Pfanenstiel.

"All you do is dress in your best racewear, walk across a stage to present your outfit to our panel of judges and you can win some top prizes," said Mott, explaining the process.

On raceday, registration will be held at Keeneland's sales pavilion from 11:00 a.m.-12:30 p.m., with the first "heats" of the competition beginning at 1:10 p.m. The divisional leaders will be announced in the winner's circle after the seventh race.

"Even though we are in the sales pavilion, there will be all racing and wagering offered as well, so fans won't miss out on a thing," offered Mott.

According to Mott, there will be a recap of the event the next day at 12:30 p.m. on WLex-TV, Channel 18, an NBC affiliate.

"We're just starting it out with just two divisions--men and women, but we hope to expand to other categories, including 18 and under, couples, 40 and up and children," said Mott. "We're just starting it out with men and women and we are growing it from there."

In addition to Keeneland and Lexus, other participating sponsors include Lexington area ladies boutique Monkee's, local station Lex18 and Tops.

"Keeneland has been very supportive from the beginning and they have been right on top of the event," said Mott. "We have a great partnership with Keeneland and hope to continue to work with them for future events."

Included with the top prize for the winning lady of the Fashions on the Field contest will be a 36-inch lariat necklace from Shelia Bayes, valued at \$1,145; a \$250 gift certificate to Keeneland gift shop; and a Galt House Accommodation package, valued at \$300. Among prizes for the leading man will be two clubhouse tickets to the 2013 Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita, a premier tailgating package and a \$250 gift certificate in the Keeneland gift shop. **Cont. p6**

“We’re planning on making this a national event, including venues like the Breeders’ Cup and Keeneland next spring,” offered Mott. “The benefit of this system is that you don’t have to start out huge. It is something that you can just start and get people to take notice, which can then trickle down to the smaller tracks and hopefully, expand to the bigger ones. It’s everybody’s game and we are just trying to help the industry and bring it to every track around the country and develop a bigger fanbase. New York would be a great venue to go to, since you have Aqueduct and Belmont right there and you could draw from the city.”

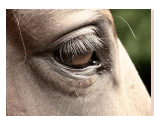

This year has once again reminded the outside world of the excellence of Sunday Silence and his descendants.

In the U.S., Sunday Silence's son Hat Trick attracted 134 mares in his first season at Gainesway and this support has since been well justified. Although his first crop wasn't large by today's standards, it has produced three graded/group winners in Dabirsim (the champion French juvenile of 2011) King David (GI Jamaica H.) and Howe Great.

France also saw some fine Classic performances from Sunday Silence's descendants. Although only sixth as favorite for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, Dabirsim was beaten only around half a length.

Beauty Parlour, a filly by Sunday Silence's sensational son Deep Impact, won the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches before finishing a creditable second in the G1 Prix de Diane. And one of Sunday Silence's broodmare daughters was another to make her mark on the French Classics, through her son Saint Baudolino. This Group 2 winner was a close second in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club.

Other Sunday Silence mares have enjoyed international success with the top Australian winner More Joyous and the American Grade II and Grade III turf miler Quiet Oasis. **Cont. p8**

Inevitably, though, it is Japan which remains very much the stronghold for the Sunday Silence line. The leading sires' list in Japan is currently headed by Deep Impact and there are no fewer than nine other sons of Sunday Silence in the top 15. These are Fuji Kiseki, Daiwa Major (currently leading sire of 2-year-olds), Stay Gold, Gold Allure, Manhattan Cafe, Agnes Tachyon, Neo Universe, Heart's Cry and Zenno Rob Roy.

For the record, the only interlopers are second-placed King Kamehameha (Kingmambo), third-placed Kurofune (by French Deputy), fourth-placed Symboli Kris S (Kris S.), 11th-placed Sakura Bakushin O (Sakura Yutaka O) and 15th-placed Roses In May (Devil His Due).

The Sunday Silence stallion who concerns us here is Stay Gold, a resident at Big Red Farm. This farm is now also home to GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness winner I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) and the stallion roster also features the G1 Dubai World Cup winner Roses In May and the dual GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Conduit.

With a little bit of luck, Stay Gold would now be the sire of at least one G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner. His son Nakayama Festa was the only one to make a race of it with the Derby winner Workforce in 2010, going down by just a head. This year we saw Stay Gold's son Orfevre go down by a neck to Solemia after appearing to have the race at his mercy when he quickened impressively into the lead. Unfortunately he idled and hung right, undoing all the good work he had put in to overcome being drawn 18 of 18.

Although he failed to give Japan that longed-for first victory in the Arc, Orfevre confirmed that he is extremely talented. Of course, we knew that already. In winning the 2011 Triple Crown he had joined a select club of seven, which also features Deep Impact. Orfevre had ended his 3-year-old campaign with a victory over the 2010 Japanese Derby winner Eishin Flash in the prestigious G1 Arima Kinen--a race won in 2009 by his brother Dream Journey. Having won Japan's top juvenile prize, the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity, Dream Journey had also won the G1 Japanese 2,000 Guineas in 2007.

Hopes that another of Stay Gold's sons would emulate Orfevre's Classic treble were raised when Gold Ship also won the G1 2,000 Guineas equivalent, the G1 Satsuki Sho. The task proved beyond Gold Ship in the Derby and the Tokyo Yushun, but he bounced back to land the final leg, the G1 Kikuka Sho, over 1 7/8 miles.

Remarkably, Orfevre, Dream Journey and Gold Ship all share the same broodmare sire, Mejiro McQueen, as does the Japanese Group 2 winner Fateful War. These four apparently come from a sample of only seven foals.

The Japanese like to give their best performers a thorough testing, so are unlikely to rush them off to stud at the end of their 3-year-old season, unless injury intervenes, as it did with King Kamehameha. Of the successful Sunday Silence stallions mentioned earlier, Daiwa Major and Hat Trick raced until they were six, while Heart's Cry and Zenno Rob Roy were in action until they were five. Stay Gold took it one step further.

He was seven years old in 2001, when he defeated the future Breeders' Cup Turf winner Fantastic Light to take the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. He later added the G1 Hong Kong Vase and Timeform rated him 127. Stay Gold also had the unusual record of having contested the Japan Cup at the ages of four, five, six and seven.

Stay Gold covered his first mares aged eight in 2002. He had the pedigree to make a stallion. Besides having the peerless Sunday Silence as his sire, he is out of a sister to the very smart miler Soccer Boy, who sired winners of such important races as the G1 Tenno Sho (Spring), G1 Japanese St Leger and G1 Shuka Sho.

Stay Gold has 579 foals aged three or over. He also has 95 2-year-olds and 130 yearlings. The 2-year-olds include a brother to Orfevre and Dream Journey called Lien de Famille and there is a brother to Gold Ship among the yearlings. There are also brothers to Orfevre and Nakayama Festa among Stay Gold's 2012 foals. With nearly all of his progeny's Group 1 victories having been gained over the last four years, there must be a good chance that the best is yet to come for Stay Gold, even though he is already 18 years old. His fee for 2013 is listed as ¥8,000,000, which roughly equates to US\$100,000 or £62,000. The unproven I'll Have Another starts out at ¥3,200,000, or US\$40,000.

Mejiro McQueen, the stallion whose daughters have enjoyed such spectacular success with Stay Gold, is an unfamiliar name outside Japan. However, he was a top stayer, winning the Japanese St Leger and two editions of the Tenno Sho (Spring) over two miles. He failed to sire a Group 1 winner, but that isn't so surprising in a country where the number of JRA Group 1 races this year stands at only 23.

THE LAW OF UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES

Where one lives can change one's perspective.

Six years ago we moved from Lexington, Kentucky to the Tennessee county with the lowest population density and lowest per capita income of any county in a state where per capita income as a whole is 13.2% lower than the national average, according to 2010 census data. As a direct result of that move, my immediate, gut reaction to last week's brief suspension of exports of horses for slaughter to Canada was different than it might have been had I remained surrounded--insulated, actually--by the wealthier confines of Fayette County, Kentucky.

Although never as whole-hearted in my support as most in the Thoroughbred industry, I approved of the closure of horse slaughtering plants in the United States over the last decade. After our move south, however, I witnessed the iron hand of the law of unintended consequences.

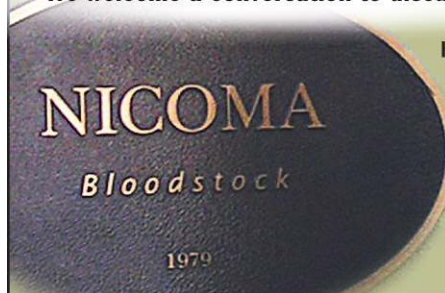

First popularized by sociologist Robert K. Merton in the 1930s, the law of unintended consequences says that intervention in any complex system tends to create unanticipated and often undesirable outcomes. Those consequences can be positive or negative, but the phrase is most often applied to situations where an intended solution makes a problem worse, sometimes even causing actions opposite to the solution's original intent.

Even before our move, my Tennessee friends and relatives who raise Tennessee Walking Horses and Quarter horses were lamenting the demise of slaughterhouses, not because they are heartless souls who want to see horses killed, but because they are horse lovers who cannot bear to see horses starve. They knew that many horse owners in our area do not have the means to keep horses they do not need. Three winters ago I witnessed direct evidence of their worst fears coming true.

Along the two-mile road from the major four-lane highway to our house we watched three horses in a 10-acre field next to the road grow steadily thinner as autumn darkened into winter. There were none of the big round bales of hay that we use here to feed livestock and no feed troughs or buckets visible in the pasture.

My cousin and her husband own the 300-acre farm across the road from the starving horses, a farm that produces around 600 bales of hay a year. They placed a bale of hay over the fence of their neighbor for the horses. **Cont. p10**



The next day a crude, hand-lettered cardboard sign appeared attached to the bale of hay: "Please do not feed our horses."

Report the offenders to the authorities you say? Only at the risk of having your hay barn or other buildings burned down. People do not take kindly to what they see as snitches in this area. It has happened.

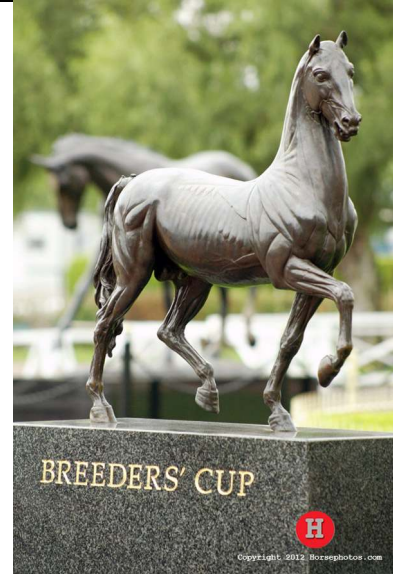
Thus my reaction to the brief closure of the Canadian border to slaughter transport was decidedly more ambivalent than it would have been a few years earlier. The overwhelming majority of the more than 130,000 horses shipped to Canada or Mexico for slaughter each year are not Thoroughbreds. Many of them are horses like those in my unconscionably recalcitrant neighbor's field, horses that no one wants, have no useful purpose, and no one to feed and care for them properly.

The Thoroughbred industry and the people who own and breed Thoroughbreds can afford to arrange for the care of retired racehorses. Indeed it is imperative that we do so if we want to survive the scrutiny of a public that is already doubtful of our humanitarian impulses. The numerous retirement farms that have cropped up around the country and organizations like the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, CANTER, ReRun, and the Thoroughbred Adoption Network are necessary, highly admirable, and deserving of the monetary support of everyone in the industry. *Cont. p11*

We simply must support our retired racehorses to survive in the court of public opinion, regardless of any moral or ethical considerations, although those should be powerful enough incentives.

We can afford to do that. Many of the backyard breeders who produce warm-blooded and cold-blooded pleasure horses or utility horses all over the United States, however, cannot.

No matter how much we try, no matter how much money we spend on Thoroughbreds, horse slaughter is not going to go away. And the law of unintended consequences, along with the Great Recession, has inevitably produced more starving horses, not less.

You may not see them near Thoroughbred farms in Kentucky, Florida, New York, California, Maryland, Virginia, or any of the other major breeding states. But I see them.

Those three horses disappeared from the field a few weeks after the hay incident. More have come and gone since. Attempts to reason with the owner have met with hostility, but thankfully, other animal abusers in the area have been arrested recently.

The arc of history bends toward justice.

SOLID OPENING TO FTKOCT

It was a productive first day of selling at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Fall Yearlings Sale, with gains in gross, average and median from a year ago. At the close of a marathon 11 hours of selling, 293 horses exchanged hands for a total of \$7,230,200. The average of \$24,676 was up 13.3%, while the median of \$13,000 enjoyed a 8.3% bump. Fourteen horses brought \$100,000 or more, compared to only six last term, and the RNA dipped to 20.6% from 2011's 25.1%

"All in all, it was a very solid start," said Fasig-Tipton's President and CEO Boyd Browning, Jr. "There was a lot of activity, and it was a very consistent sale from start to finish. It's too early to claim victory,

but hopefully we'll have two more good days."

Just like a year ago, the Day 1 topper made \$200,000. It was [hip 64](#), a colt by Giant's Causeway out of the winning Lerici (Woodman), who led the way Monday on the strength of Florida horseman Nick de Meric's successful offer. The chestnut colt hails from the family of GSW and GI Travers S. runner-up Grasshopper (Dixie Union), as well as the Grade I winners Mashaallah (Nijinsky II) and Folk Art (Nijinsky II). Gainesway consigned hip 64.

"He was a horse who was actually entered in Keeneland September, but he came up with a little blemish, so we scratched him, gave him some time, and brought him here," explained Gainesway's Michael Herson. "The rest is history."

Herson wasn't surprised by the attention the colt received. "He is by a superior sire, he's got a good pedigree, and he made it onto all the lists of the leading buyers," he said. "He stood out in the crowd here."

Whereas the session topper was scratched out of September, [hip 321](#), a colt by Smart Strike out of SP Rap and Dance (Pleasant Tap), was led out of the ring unsold at the auction a month ago. But he attracted plenty of suitors at October, and yesterday was hammered down to Kirkwood Stable's Kip Elser, who outlasted a party out back to land the handsome chestnut for \$190,000. Consigned by Warrendale Sales, the Ned Evans-bred colt is a half to SW Rap Tale (Tale of the Cat) and to SP Cherokee Rap (Cherokee Run). His dam is a half to the Grade I winners Another Review (Buckaroo) and No Review (Nodouble). It was actually the colt's third time through the ring--he sold to Whitechurch Bloodstock for \$220,000 as KEENOV weanling--and Elser thought the price was a fair one.

"I think good horses bring full value no matter where you are," said Elser. "And he was a nice horse. You never buy a horse you like for less than you expect to give."

Elser said he's pleased with the horses he's seen thus far at October. "It's good," he said. "This has always been a productive sale for a lot of reasons."

Zayat Stable struck early for the top-priced filly on Monday, paying \$170,000 for [hip 6](#), a Smart Strike daughter of the Deputy Minister mare Kelly Pond. The filly is a half-sister to the graded performer Clear Pond (Dynaformer), and hails from a deep international family. Her second dam Water Lily (Fr) (Riverman) was a dual Group 3 winner in France and, in addition to hip 6's dam, produced Grade I winner Talinum (Alydar). G. Watts Humphrey purchased Kelly Pond as a yearling for \$250,000 at the 1998 Keeneland September Sale and campaigned her to two wins in nine starts. This filly was bred by the G. Watts Jr. and Louise Ireland Humphrey Revocable Trust. The Wattses parted ways with Kelly Pond last November, selling her, in foal to Mineshaft, to Tony Holmes and Dr. Walter Zent for \$32,000.

The sale continues today and concludes tomorrow. Both sessions begin at 10 a.m. For catalogue, results and outs, or to watch the sale live, visit fasigtipton.com.

A 'Samurai' Times 10...

Kentucky horseman Chris Baccari rang up a nice transaction yesterday after selling [hip 101](#), a filly by First Samurai, to Texas-based horseman Al Pike for \$120,000. That was exactly 10 times the \$12,000 it cost Baccari to acquire the filly at Fasig Tipton's July Sale three months ago.

"I had seen some First Samurais selling really well at the 2-year-old sales, and I'm always talking to people all over the country and asking how their babies are doing, and I just had many good reports on First Samurai," Baccari explained of why he targeted the filly. "Plus, I had another First Samurai filly that I'd raised, and that kind of kept me in the loop."

One of the First Samurai juveniles Baccari had in the back of his mind was Executiveprivilege, who brought a sale-topping \$650,000 at OBS April. A few weeks before the July Sale she debuted a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ at Betfair Hollywood Park, and four days after captured her first stakes in the \$150,000 Landaluce S. on July 14. From the third crop of her Grade I-winning sire, Executiveprivilege added the GIII Sorrento S., GI Del Mar Debutante and GI Chandelier S. in consecutive starts and is still undefeated heading into the GI Breeders Cup Juvenile Fillies.

Baccari's First Samurai filly is the first foal from the tough racemare Magnetic Miss (Artax), a six-time black-type winner and a half to two other stakes winners.

"When I saw her in July, she was just too heavy, but she had a really good walk, and she was the first foal out of a mare who made over \$400,000," Baccari explained. "I thought if she brought nothing, that it'd be worth speculating. She grew up well, got in shape and turned into a nice filly."

Baccari said he has two other yearlings to keep an eye out for at FTKOCT, both of whom sell tomorrow. First up is [hip 881](#), a Ned Evans-bred daughter of Not For Love who Baccari purchased out of the Evans dispersal last November for \$12,000. The filly is a half to SW Storm Play (Smart Strike) and is a daughter of Cat Play (Storm Cat), a half to GISW Hedonist (Alydeed) and GSW Seeking Daylight (Seeking the Gold).

"She's got a big pedigree," said Baccari.

Baccari also said to watch for [hip 985](#), a gray colt from the first crop of Old Fashioned (Unbridled's Song) who was produced by the winning Destiny's Yield (High Yield).

"I hate to sound arrogant, but think he must be one of the better physicals here," said Baccari. "He's just a man."

Ghost in the Machine...

It may not go down as the biggest pinhook ever, but any time you can turn \$3,000 into \$85,000 legally, you're doing something right. Gainesway's Michael Hernon and an unnamed partner paid the former amount for a gray colt by Ghostzapper--Regal Approval (With Approval) last year at Keeneland November, and yesterday resold him to Charles Zacney for over 20 times the initial outlay. Zacney was the principal owner of dual Classic winner Afleet Alex.

Gainesway consigned the Ghostzapper colt, whose stakes-winning dam is a full-sister to the dam of graded winners The Daddy (Valid Expectations), With a City (City Zip) and Blue Laser (Bluegrass Cat), as [hip 330](#). **Cont. p3**

"The horse was well bought as a weanling; he just slipped between the cracks," Hernon said of the gray, who was bred by Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, Liberation Farm, et al. "He grew up into a fine horse, vetted, and sold well. He is a big strong horse who is a good mover. Ghostzapper is having a great year, with 18 stakes winners and 11 graded winners, and we think this colt's a good prospect. We certainly hope to hear from him next year at the race track."

Gainesway, which also sold yesterday's session topper, hopes to keep the momentum going through the rest of the sale. Hernon thinks an Artie Schiller colt who sells Wednesday as [hip 1111](#) will help the cause. Acquired as a short yearling for \$60,000 at Keeneland January, the colt was produced by Friend of a Friend (Crafty Friend), a half to the solid European performer Annie Skates (Mr. Greeley) from the family of Vicar, Astronomer Royal, et al.

"Artie Schiller gets a good racehorse--he's emerged as a very useful sire--and this is a big, rangy, correct colt," said Hernon. "We think he's a good prospect. He's got a nice family, and he looks like a smart individual."

KENTUCKY COURT UPHOLDS 'RACHEL'

RULING Friday, the Commonwealth of Kentucky Court of Appeals upheld the circuit court's decision to award Thoro-Graph and its founder, Jerry Brown, a \$25,000 quantum meruit judgment in their favor for advice and information provided to James Lauffer in connection with the purchase of Rachel Alexandra in 2008. Brown had disputed the circuit court's finding, arguing that the amount should have been \$271,423, saying, "Quantum meruit is an equitable doctrine granting one 'who has rendered services in a quasi-contractual relationship the reasonable value of services rendered.'" Lauffer had also filed an appeal, arguing that he should not have to pay Brown any commission.

Yesterday, Brown issued a statement regarding the finding, which read: "Though I completely disagree with the Court's ruling as to how much I should be paid for my work, I am glad there is finally a clear record of what transpired. As the Court said, in the summer of 2008 I was approached by a joint venture consisting of three people, one of them [James] Lauffer, asking me to recommend a filly to purchase and to race. The joint venture asked me to send my commission rates in writing that August, which I did. Three months later I sent an email containing my data and a recommendation they purchase Rachel Alexandra, who at that point had run five times and never won a stake. [James] Lauffer then called me to discuss my reasoning. I said based on my data and analysis she was already comparable to top 2-year-old filly Stardom Bound, and had a brighter future. At the end of that conversation we discussed my rates, the same ones I had sent, and Lauffer indicated they would be an issue. After that conversation, as the court said, Lauffer twice called the bloodstock agent in the deal, Don Brauer, to see whether he could avoid paying my commissions. Brauer told him that would not be ethical.

"Then Lauffer called me again to try to get me to reduce my rates, which I refused to do," the statement continued. "He then called Brauer and told him the joint venture was no longer interested in purchasing Rachel. Four days later Lauffer, acting on his own, bought a half interest in her for \$500,000.

Six months later, after she won the Oaks, he sold his interest, netting a profit of \$4.5 million. He paid me nothing. We believe there are clear errors in the ruling and plan to contest it, but I will leave the legal analysis to the lawyers."

Lauffer's lawyer Tom Miller was satisfied with the ruling.

"I certainly anticipated the judge's ruling awarding a \$25,000 commission would be upheld because that is exactly what Mr. Lauffer offered Jerry Brown in their first conversation," Miller explained. "All the testimony, as the opinion says, confirms that a standard bloodstock commission is 5%. So it was a \$500,000 purchase and Mr. Lauffer agreed to pay 5% to Mr. Brown, plus he paid another 3% to another agent. So he has offered to pay 8% and the judge did a good job of understanding that."

Miller did admit that he was disappointed that his countersuit had been rejected.

"We filed a countersuit because we believe the law in Kentucky requires that any commission arrangement to be in writing," Miller said. "This one was not, so we didn't think it could be enforced. In other words, we think the \$25,000 commission was reasonable and that is what Mr. Lauffer offered. But since Jerry Brown rejected that, I didn't think that the law would permit him to recover any amount of money because it wasn't in writing."

Still Miller said his client will not appeal the decision.

"We have already sent him a check for \$25,000 once and Mr. Lauffer is going to do the same thing again. The other side has the opportunity to appeal, but as far as we're concerned, we would like to settle it for exactly what we originally offered."

GALILEO DUO DOMINATE OCTOBER OPENER

The annus mirabilis of Galileo (Ire) continued apace to Deauville yesterday, where a son and daughter of his led the way, selling for €210,000 and €200,000, respectively, during Part 1 of Arqana's October Yearling Sale. Late in the session, his sole colt representative consigned by Haras d'Étreham as hip [155](#) created the inevitable excitement his pedigree suggested and it was Hautieres Bloodstock who prevailed. Among the half-siblings of the late-May-foaled bay are Sardaukar (GB) (Royal Academy), who was third in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris before going to make his mark Stateside; Kindjhal (Fr) (Ashkalani {Ire}), who was runner-up in the 2004 G3 Prix d'Hedouville and later fourth in the G1 Metropolitan S. in Australia; Rostrum (Fr) (Shamardal), second in last year's G3 Prix Edmond Blanc; and Kreem (GB) (Hurricane Run {Ire}), who captured the 2011 G3 Prix du Lys. Galileo's filly topper was the only offering in the book from Jose Hormaeche's Chevington Stud. Hip [78](#) is an April-foaled daughter of the 2002 G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner Spinola (Fr) (Spinning World), therefore a half to the 2007 Listed Criterium de l'Ouest scorer Kirkinola (GB) (Selkirk) and this season's G2 Prix Greffulhe third Eldandy (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). She was knocked down to David Redvers acting on behalf of Qatar Racing. "She's a lovely filly, who was great value," Redvers told *Racing Post*. "Compared to Newmarket, this was a very good price. She is by the best stallion in the world and will make a nice broodmare prospect in time." Earlier, Redvers had made sure that he took home the full-brother to Saturday's G1 Caulfield Cup victor Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}) from Haras des Loges. Hip [11](#), already named Nico de Borepair (Fr), had special resonance for Sheikh Fahad as his sibling was the one to put his Pearl Bloodstock on the world map when annexing last year's G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Hong Kong Vase. Bought for €130,000, the colt could join Dunaden at Mikel Delzangles' barn according to Redvers. "Sheikh Fahad has a huge emotional attachment to Dunaden and he really wanted this colt," the buyer told the *Racing Post*. "He will probably go back to England first, but at the moment it looks likely he will join Mikel Delzangles. We are just investing a little bit back into the game following this weekend and are delighted to have a brother to such a great horse."

The Sage Holds Court...

Leading the early trade was Haras des Capucines' hip [40](#), a filly from the second crop of Sageburg (Ire) who was purchased for €170,000 by Gerard Larrieu's Chantilly Bloodstock. From the family of the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud hero Pistolet Bleu (Ire), the March-foaled bay is a full-sister to this term's G3 Prix d'Aumale victress Peace Burg (Fr) and was bought for Jean-Louis Bouchard. Freddie Head, who has also enjoyed another banner season with the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest and G1 Prix du Moulin winner Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), snapped up another offspring of that Irish National Stud resident.


From Ecurie des Monceaux, hip [12](#) is a February-foaled colt from the family of the 2003

G1 Grosser Dallmayr Preis victor Ransom O'War (Red Ransom) and he cost €140,000. Head later paid €150,000 for a son of Montjeu (Ire) from the same draft. Hip [145](#) is out of a half to the Pattern-race performers Duellant (Ire) (Dashing Blade {GB}), Denaro (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}) and Davidoff (Ger) (Montjeu {Ire}). Also on the shopping list of Goldikova's trainer was hip [46](#), an April-foaled son of another of his stable's past stars in Naaqoos (GB). Hailing from the La Motteraye Consignment as well, he is a half-brother to the recent G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange runner-up Prince Mag (Ire) (Zamindar) and listed-placed Naadrah (GB) (Muhtathir {GB}) and he fetched €120,000. At the end of the premier section of the sale, the average of €49,180 jumped by 19% from 2011, while the median of €38,000 fared even better, rising by 27%.

Willie the Whipper, who was the eight-length winner of a Hamilton maiden over six furlongs on his only previous start Aug. 30, was a little keen at the tail of the field initially. Brought wide to challenge off the home bend as Oasis Cannes struck for home, the bay stayed on under driving to collar that rival with 75 yards to race and provide his trainer with a second win in this race following Zenella (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) in 2010. "We've always liked this horse, but he was very hard to assess after Hamilton because nothing had run from the race, so the handicapper couldn't assess him properly and neither could we," trainer Ann's husband, the famed ex-jockey George Duffield, commented. "He loves this ground. We bought him from Willie Browne's daughter, who prepared him for the breeze-up. She said that she cantered him up a ploughed field and he absolutely loved it--he might not have won if it had been a normal summer. We heard that the second at Hamilton was a good horse and we beat him eight lengths, but the rest were very moderate. I said to switch him off and produce him late and [jockey] Graham Lee is the perfect man for the job. He's bred to get a mile and a quarter on the dam's side, but his daddy was a sprinter.
