180 PRE-ENTERED IN BREEDERS' CUP

Pre-entries for the Breeders' Cup World Championships at Santa Anita Nov. 2-3 drew a total of 180 horses. The \$5-million GI Breeders' Cup Classic attracted a maximum field of 14, including four who

were cross entered. Among them are a pair of Grade I winners--Besilu Stables' **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) and Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score), who were also cross-entered in the \$2-million GI BC Ladies' Classic and \$3-million GI BC Turf, respectively. They were among 23 runners cross-entered in various events.

This is the sixth time that Santa Anita will be hosting the championships, although the last two runnings in 2008 and 2009

were conducted on an all-weather surface. The main racing strip has since been overhauled to traditional dirt, and trainer Todd Pletcher, who has 11 individual runners pre-entered, welcomed the switch.

"The East Coast horses had very little success on the synthetic tracks, so I think everyone's looking forward to it being back on the dirt," Pletcher said during a national teleconference Wednesday.

Included in Pletcher's posse for this year's Breeders' Cup is **Love and Pride** (A.P. Indy), who secured her second straight "Win and You're In" victory in the GI Zenyatta S. (nee Lady's Secret) at the Arcadia oval Sept. 29.

"So far I think it's terrific," Pletcher said about the new surface. "It's a little bit slower than the previous Santa Anita dirt track. It seems to be very safe. Our horses seem to be acclimating to it very well, and we [already] had some success shipping out with Love and Pride, so that always makes you feel good. It reminds me a little bit--the consistency--of Gulfstream and Palm Meadows."

Royal Delta leads a cast of eight defending or former Breeders' Cup winners entered for the 2012 event.

Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) is slated to defend his crown in the Turf. Should Royal Delta take her first preference in the Ladies' Classic, she will be opposed by the last two winners of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Stonestreet and George Bolton's **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike) and Stronach Stables' **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course), both of whom still have perfect career records. **Amazombie** (Northern Afleet), the reigning GI BC Sprint hero, will likely face a full field in this year's renewal. His distaff counterpart **Musical Romance** (Concorde's Tune) will attempt to do the same in the GI BC F/M Sprint. **California Flag** (Avenue of Flags) prevailed in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint when the dash was last contested at Santa Anita in 2009, and will bid to recapture the glory over a course where he possesses a 9-6-0-0 mark. The group is rounded out by **Eldaafer** (A.P. Indy), who prevailed in the infamous 2010 renewal of the Breeders' Cup Marathon at Churchill Downs.

Twelve months ago, 29 overseas runners were among the record 193 pre-entries for the Churchill Downs renewal. This time around, there are 26 horses from Europe and two from South America, and an additional hopeful, **Rising Legend (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who was recently purchased privately and will hope to draw into the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

While the Nov. 3 GI Breeders' Cup Classic field drew a maximum of 14 pre-entries Wednesday, the Nov. 2 equivalent for females drew a solid nine for the 1 1/8 test for the nation's top ladies. Royal Delta, who was also pre-entered for the \$5-million Classic, leads the standout group, which includes the 2010 and 2011 champion juvenile fillies Awesome Feather and My Miss Aurelia, respectively. Gatewood validated favoritism in this event won in the last two years by American (Dynaformer) and Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}), each of whom went on to follow up successfully in the G1 Melbourne Cup.

Winner of the prestigious Listed Wolferton H. at Royal Ascot June 22, Gatewood was third as the favorite in the G2 Glorious S. at Goodwood Aug. 3 and a short-neck runner-up behind Masterstroke (Monsun {Ger}) in the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville Aug. 26. The result of that race looked good when the Godolphin runner returned to be a solid third in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 7, but it appeared Gatewood was in need of the run when he was no better than seventh as the 3-1 favorite in the G2 Herbert Power H. at Caulfield Oct. 13. A stalking second off an easy pace up front, the John Gosden trainee came calling for the lead as they stretched four across the track at the 300-meter mark and finished well for the victory. Brigantin sat the box seat throughout, came out for the drive and was just touched off for second. The co-owners OTI Syndicate sent out Bauer (Ire) (Halling) to win the Geelong Cup back in 2008 prior to the narrowest of defeats in the Melbourne Cup. Before Gatewood gains a run in the Cup, he will need to have one kilogram added to his 51.5 (115 pound) handicap, meaning he will likely need to make one more start between now and the "race that stops a nation" Nov. 6.

Potential For Record British Levy in 2013...

British racing received the news it has long awaited yesterday when it was revealed that prize-money for next season will increase by 30%. As the Levy Board finalised the levy scheme for 2013-14, the announcement of a £10-million rise in prize money allied with a forecast of improved racecourse media rights income promised to reverse the well-documented decline of the country's purse levels. "The board is extremely pleased to have reached unanimous agreement," Levy Board chairman Paul Lee said. "This will provide further stability and make possible significant additional expenditure on prize money in 2013. I would like to give recognition to betting and racing for the constructive approach that they have taken in seeking early resolution to the terms of the next levy scheme. Increasing prize money is an objective of the board in 2013 and we are delighted to announce this substantial rise." He continued, "We believe that it will be warmly welcomed. On the basis that racecourses continue to make their own much increased contributions, there is a real prospect of 2013 providing record levels of prize money."

CHINA WATCHING-- RACING'S EL DORADO

Just a few days ago sitting in the US\$100 million grandstand at a purpose-built racetrack at Ordos in Inner Mongolia with 20,000 other fans, Australia's Magic Millions director David Chester indulged himself in a daydream, imagining this was the moment China went racing.

But soon the reverie passed, despite the Government-built state-of-the-art stand, the imported Irish and Japanese Thoroughbreds racing on a 2000-meter dirt track and 5000 other horses of various breeds celebrating a horse festival and opening of the world's newest racecourse, the waking giant continues to tantalize the world of racing.

This race meeting had most things associated with what we know as the track, but no gambling, 'as boring as hell,' said Chester, although fascinated by the infrastructure and the Government intent behind the vast expense. **Cont. p12**

And this is a world frustration, the difficulty of tapping into the mindset of the regime's commitment or not to racing. And of course there is a huge commercial imperative for finding out.

That is what drives the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Mandarin-speaking secretariat that surgically examines every mood swing on the mainland. The space-challenged HKJC is currently trying to convince Beijing to agree to its plans to build a training centre 1 1/2 hours into China, accessed by a corridor road.

The commercial imperative is also why Chester is in Ordos with Magic Million's newly appointed, locally based representative Tommy Xu, hoping to get a break on the others watching the future of racing in China unravel.

But unravel they don't.

Racing supporters in the Chinese power elite get to the starting line as they have in Ordos and elsewhere then lose their way, stumbling at the political hurdle of allowing wagering on racing. Anti gambling is in Mao's red book and no regime, however sympathetic to a market-driven economy, can remove it.

It is seen as a tax on the poor--and although a potential giant revenue earner and maybe the antidote to vast illegal betting, it is the genie in the bottle that they dare not let go. For the moment, at least, and if you listen to most of the serious China watchers, not 'in the next 10 years' until the Government is under financial pressure to pay for social security and health services which will be demanded by then.

Like hundreds of his compatriots around the world, optimists like longtime bloodstock agent David Chester have been trawling through China for years driven by the hope that racing as we know it is only just around the corner.

It is the main game in every racing deal done in China. It was tantamount in Dubai's joint venture with a Malaysian corporation. It was also on everyone's lips in April when the Irish Government and Coolmore announced that together with the Chinese Government they would build a centre of equine excellence outside the port city of Tianjin.

The laudatory aim is to establish a team of between 600 and 800 racehorses, exchange jockeys and skilled horsemen and women and build an equine hub the equal of Kentucky, Deauville or the Hunter Valley. A brave concept that would slip seamlessly into the introduction of racing as a sport.

Chinese tycoon Y.P. Cheng, a pioneer in the breeding of Thoroughbreds outside Beijing and the builder of a racecourse there in 2005, continues to battle on breeding from 400 mares with 15 stallions but has made little impact on the Government that the resultant progeny should be allowed to race in front of money wielding punters.

For a short time Mr. Cheng, who came to Australia and established Domeland racing stables in the 1980s and then disappeared, was permitted to hold races but only 'intellectual' gambling was allowed. Now outside the government-built town of Ordos in the coal-rich prefecture they call 'China's Texas,' a new racecourse with its magnificent stand is the place it could begin. The Chinese government is committed to the area, having built a major city nearby. The city was built on the back of the region's mining boom and the Government's belief that injection of money will be the stimulus for private investment creating employment and tourism in an already wealthy area.

But why include a racetrack in the plan if racing is not on the agenda? Particularly one with a US\$100 million grandstand? Surely not to become another unused facility outside a new city which so far is largely ignored by the people who regard it as too expensive?

The Chinese are cleverer than that, surely.

Well no actually, there are several significant grandstands at racecourses around China that occasionally stage pony and Thoroughbred races. They are momentarily used and then left as silent as a graveyard for the rest of the year.

But that is inscrutable China, and just another of its ambiguities and hypocrisies.

China is now the master of the former Portuguese territory of Macau where the number and size of casinos challenge Las Vegas itself.

The growth in investment putting extravagant roofs over the heads of an ever-growing number of gamblers and fun seekers from the mainland is staggering given the Chinese view of gambling on racing. And racing in Hong Kong continues apace beneath the umbrella of the non-believers in Beijing.

But when Beijing acts on the big question and which country will be anointed as the supplier of the myriad things needed to establish a racing industry is in the lap of the gods.

However that question mark is precisely why all racing nations keep their foot in the door and watch every move from the Chinese with some anxiety that they may miss out on El Dorado. I reckon Australia would swap all its iron ore and coal deposits for a rails run on that!

The Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearlings Sale concluded its three-day run last night in Lexington, and the last major yearling auction of the season gave

breeders reason to be optimistic that the commercial market is looking up, even if the march is incremental. From a catalogue that was 25% bigger than a year ago, Fasig sold 880 of the 1,094 horses that went through the ring, good for an RNA rate of 19.5%. The cumulative average of \$26,127 was up 8.8%, while the median of \$12,750 was up 6.25%.

"It's been a helluva horse sale," said Fasig-Tipton President and CEO Boyd Browning, Jr. as the action was winding down last night. "Two of the first 10 horses through the ring brought over

\$100,000, and we're 1200 horses in and just sold one for \$350,000."

Browning was referring to Wednesday's session topper, a Monticule-bred and -consigned colt who sold to Zayat Stables for \$350,000. The colt, [hip 1186](#), was one of 47 six-figure horses of the auction (include one private sale). Less than half that number, 23 horses, made six figures last year (not including the Flying Zee dispersal).

"We had better quality horses," Browning said simply about that stat. "We had better horses starting off this year, and they sold very well. But we've had a good market, as well; the marketplace really embraced the product."

The sale topper, a colt by Speightstown--Betty's Pet from Taylor Made, sold to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$440,000 during Tuesday's second session.

Asked what trends FTKOCT revealed or solidified, Browning added, "I think we're seeing some overall improvement. But it's the same story: the buyers are selective, and you have to jump through the veterinary hoops."

Browning did say he's seen improvement at the market's lower levels. "We've seen as we've progressed through the yearling season that supply and demand has had an impact, particularly on the, say, under-\$25,000 horses," he said. "The market on those horses has improved this year from 2011 and 2010. I think any consignor would tell you that the horses that brought modest sums last year brought higher prices this year. I'd say there's more depth to the market, but I wouldn't say it's dramatically stronger."

Browning said one of the most encouraging developments of the sale was that horses at different price points were drawing multiple bidders. "People are comfortable spending a pretty significant amount of money for a horse, they just don't want to feel like they have to," he said. "They want to bid against live money; they want to bid against multiple bidders, because it gives them confidence. They feel like they're on the right horse, and it gives them confidence to bid again. If you're bidding against a reserve, people are more reluctant."

If nothing, FTKOCT proved its worth on the auction calendar. Only a few years ago, officials at Fasig considering doing away with the sale. "It's indicative of the shift in the marketplace," Browning said of the sale's recent success. "There seems to be a demand for larger catalogues."

Arch Colt Tops Finale...

The October Sale was about 10 minutes old when Zayat Stables purchased [hip 6](#), a filly by Smart Strike, for \$175,000. Some two days and 1180 hips later, representatives of Ahmed Zayat's operation struck for another six-figure prospect, [hip 1186](#), a colt by Arch out of High Priestess (Mt. Livermore) who went for \$350,000. Bloodstock agent David Ingordo, standing out back and acting on behalf of Zayat, saw off a pair of challengers from inside the pavilion to buy Wednesday's top-priced horse. Zayat purchased a third horse at Fasig, a colt by Pulpit--Great Design who sold as [hip 1160](#) for \$30,000.

Consigned by Monticule Farm, the Apr. 10-foaled Arch colt is the second foal from the 9-year-old High Priestess, a half-sister to this year's Borderland Derby winner Isn't He Clever (Smarty Jones), GSW Dijeerr (Danzig), and SW Sharp Writer (Capote).

It's a family that has been exceptionally good to Monticule head Dr. Gary Knapp, who acquired the colt's second dam, Sharp Minister (Deputy Minister), for \$220,000 while in foal to Joyeux Danseur the Keeneland November Sale in 2000. Dijeerr sold to Shadwell for \$500,000 at the 2005 Keeneland September Sale, and a Fusaichi Pegasus colt out of the mare made \$500,000 two years later. But it was her son Plavius (Danzig) who really brought Sharp Minister acclaim, selling for \$9.2 million at the 2006 September Sale.

Needless to say, Knapp is fond of the family, and wasn't afraid to take this Arch colt home if he didn't bring top dollar. "It was very close to the reserve," smiled Monticule farm manager Dominique Tijou from Tent A on the Fasig grounds. "We broke a sweat, but we got it done. We're happy. The boss liked him very much. He measures horses--he works with Equix--and he measured extremely well. He liked the way he looks, and the way the pedigree comes together. We had great expectations. It's just a family of runners."

Monticule's assistant manager Breena Kaplan was equally enthusiastic. "It's fabulous," she said. "It's a great feeling to get them to this point and see them sell well. Hopefully, they go on to be superstars."

Monticule has already raised a superstar or two, most prominently Big Brown (Boundary), whom Monticule bred and sold to Eddie Woods for \$60,000 at this sale in 2006.

Monticule returned to FTKOCT this year with a good-sized 13-horse consignment, and Tijou explained why. "We didn't want to be in the back part of Keeneland [September]," he said. "We didn't want to be in Book 5, which is where we were going to be [with the Arch colt]. Everybody being tired, it wasn't going to work. We came up with the idea of selecting [certain horses] for Keeneland, and bringing the rest to Fasig-Tipton. People are refreshed [here] and people still need horses. It worked out this time."

Walnut Green's Mark Reid, representing owner Chuck Zacney, outlasted bloodstock agent Hubert Guy to land [hip 991](#), an Indian Charlie colt out of Diamondsare-

foresta (High Yield) for \$250,000. That was the second highest price paid for a horse during session three. Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm consigned. It's the second foal from the dam, a daughter of MGSW Foresta (Alydar) and a half-sister to the dam of the good Grade II winner Victory U.S.A. (Victory Gallop).

"Chuck is looking for big, two-turn Classic horses, and this horse fit the bill," said Reid. "He's a nice horse; we liked everything about him. Chuck said, 'Go get him,' so we did. He's been buying two or

three at every sale to try and replenish his racing stable."

Zacney is best known as the principal owner of champion and dual Classic winner Afleet Alex, and was making his second purchase of the auction. On Monday, he acquired a Ghostzapper son of SW Regal Approval (With Approval) for \$85,000.

Reid said his latest purchases will likely be trained by Tony Dutrow, and echoed the sentiment that it's been a polarized market at October. "There were a few good horses here, and more buyers, so it was what it's been lately: everybody landed on the same horses," said Reid. "The horses were either \$200,000, \$250,000, \$400,000--or they were \$20,000. There's kind of no in between, and if you want a good one, you have to spend some money."

The Indian Charlie colt was being pinhooked by O'Callaghan and his team at Woods Edge. The Irishman purchased him for \$210,000 last fall at Keeneland November. The colt was sent through Keeneland's September Sale a month ago, but was bought back for \$170,000.

Handsome Mike Half Goes for \$190,000...

[Hip 915](#), the Street Sense half-brother to recent GI Pennsylvania Derby hero and GI Breeders' Cup Classic hopeful Handsome Mike (Scat Daddy), brought \$195,000 during yesterday's finale. Pro Flow Equine signed the winning ticket. The colt was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales on behalf of breeder John Liviakis--who bred and raced Handsome Mike before selling him privately to J. Paul Reddam. Liviakis purchased the dam of both horses, the winning Smart Strike mare Classic Strike, for \$70,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November Sale with Handsome Mike in utero. He has since sold the mare privately.

War Front Colt Headed to Ireland...

A colt by phenom sire War Front will be headed overseas shortly after being acquired by BBA Ireland for \$170,000. [Hip 922](#), a half-brother to MSW Casino Evil (Salt Lake) and SP Courier (El Corredor), was produced by Code of Love (Cryptoclearance), herself a half to Grade II winner Lemhi Go (Lemhi Gold). Bluewater Sales consigned the sleek dark bay.

A representative of BBA Ireland signed the winning slip for the BBA's Eamon Reilly. "The colt will ship back to Ireland, and Eamon's happy to have him," said the rep, who asked to not be identified. "He's a big fan of the sire; he thinks he's the best sire in North America. Aidan O'Brien has a nice War Front back at home called Declaration of War, and there's another good one in England called Red Avenger. He seems to work on both sides of the Atlantic. Physically, this was a nice colt."

Claiborne's War Front is having another strong year, with no fewer than 11 black-type winners in 2012, including Grade I winner Data Link and the group/graded winners The Factor and Summer Front, and the aforementioned Declaration of War.

Wounded Warrior Stable Racing for Good Cause...

There are few nobler causes than supporting severely injured service members as they make the transition to civilian life. That's Chip McEwen's view, and the Florida-based owner is hoping to raise awareness through his new Wounded Warrior Stable. The stable is named in honor of the Wounded Warrior Project (WWP), the non-profit organization that assists service members coping with the mental and physical wounds of battle. McEwen currently has a handful of horses in training with trainer Gary Contessa and Monti N. Sims, and has pledged a percentage of his winnings to the WWP. His silks, fittingly, are gold with a purple heart.

McEwen also works with respected Florida horsewoman Danzel Brendemuehl pinhooking yearlings to 2-year-olds. He and Brendemuehl have purchased a handful of prospects this fall, including at least two at FTKOCT, and like with his racing stable, a portion of the proceeds will go to the WWP.

On Monday, Brendemuehl signed for a Malibu Moon--Right Place colt from the family of MGSW Runway Model (Petionville) for \$175,000 ([hip 352](#)); and yesterday added an Empire Maker--Dowell House (Danzig) filly from the family of champion Marchfield (A.P. Indy) and Devil May Care (Malibu Moon) for \$165,000 ([hip 1010](#)). The horses were consigned by Lane's End and Taylor Made, respectively.

"She was such a pretty mover," Brendemuehl said about yesterday's Empire Maker filly. "She was a big-enough filly for an April foal. And she had a beautiful neck on here. We like big, heavy colts, and fillies that look like fillies."

"He's really excited," she said. "He's been a client of mine for a long time. His business is doing great, and he decided he wanted to step it up a little bit. He's a great guy, a real southern gentleman."

Brendemuehl, whose graduates include Grade I winners *Roses in May* (Devil His Due) and *Wonder Lady Anne L* (Real Quiet), is enjoying another strong year. At OBS April, she sold *Rolling Fog* (Posse) to Arnold Zetcher for \$62,000. That colt proved his mettle with a victory in the GI Del Mar Futurity.
