KING FOR A DAY?

Just like Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) last year, **Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) arrives on Doncaster's Town Moor with a buzz surrounding him as he bids to provide Ballydoyle with back-to-back renewals of the G1 Racing Post Trophy today. Impressive on testing

ground when recording a seven-length debut success over a mile at Navan Oct. 10, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's colt was a rare supplement for connections and has usurped all the stable's other entries to be the sole flag-bearer for Rosegreen. Jockey Joseph O'Brien is not expecting

major fireworks. "This is a massive step up from a maiden at Navan to a Group 1," he told *PA Sport*. "If he was just to run a very nice race, we'd be pleased. He was quite green on his debut at Navan, but he still won very easily in the end. It usually takes a nice horse to win this race. He's coming back quite quick from just having his first run, so if he was to run well we'd be happy." Some might be surprised to see Kingsbarns head Jim Bolger's G3 Autumn S. scorer **Trading Leather (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) in the betting, especially as the latter's trainer made public his high regard for his homebred at Newmarket a fortnight ago. That defeat of the much-vaunted Richard Hannon trainee Montiridge (Ire) (Ramonti {Fr}) and another promising Ballydoyle colt in Eye of the Storm (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was another step up from a highly promising debut second in the Listed Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Trial S. at Leopardstown Sept. 8 and seven-length maiden win at Gowran Park Sept. 23. Saeed Manana's unbeaten **Van Der Neer (Ire)** (Dutch Art [GB]) was also supplemented alongside Kingsbarns this week, and trainer Richard Hannon has several smart yardsticks to measure his ability against at home. Brought out quickly after his success in a seven-furlong Leicester conditions event last Tuesday, his conditioner's faith speaks volumes.

Animal Kingdom Gets Final Work at Keeneland...

Team Valor International's **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) registered his final serious work for next Saturday's G1 Breeders' Cup Mile, breezing five furlongs around the turf dogs in 1:02.40 Friday morning ([video](#)). With exercise rider David Nava in the irons, Animal Kingdom broke off about three lengths behind his workmate Badleroibrown (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) and steadily drew on even terms at the quarter pole before finishing a length in front while never asked for a serious effort. Fractions were :12, :25.20, :38.60, :50.80 and out six furlongs in 1:16.20. "I thought it was a sensible work and he galloped out strong," trainer Graham Motion said. "I did not want a hard work today, as he had his serious work last week [six furlongs in 1:13 on October 18 at Fair Hill]." Rafael Bejarano has accepted the call for the first time. John Velazquez, who guided Animal Kingdom to his Kentucky Derby victory, rides potential favorite **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry).

INDY MOOD FOR A COMEBACK

Chuck and Maribeth Sanford's **Take Charge Indy** (A.P. Indy) makes his much-anticipated return to the races in today's GII Fayette S. at Keeneland, a prep for the Nov. 23 GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs. Though best known for his front-running upset in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 31, the son of MGISW Take Charge Lady (Dehere) was effective in three starts on Polytrack to begin his career, including a maiden win and runner-up effort in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity and a decent fourth to Dullahan (Even the Score) in this track's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity last October. The dark bay is unraced since undergoing surgery after finishing well down the field in the GI Kentucky Derby May 5. **Middie** (Officer) is something of a wild card here and brings a record of three wins from four tries over synthetics. An allowance winner at this meet 366 days back, he has since added a 14-1 upset in the GIII Washington Park H. Sept. 1 and an allowance score here Oct. 6. When last **Newsdad** (Arch) tried this Poly, he set a track record for a mile and a quarter (2:00 3/5) in winning an allowance last October. The Karp homebred has been off the board in four starts since annexing the grassy GII Pan American S. Mar. 24 and was last seen finishing fifth in the GII Bowling Green S. at Belmont Sept. 8.

Just a week after his full-brother Frankel (GB) entered folklore, **Noble Mission (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) has a chance to round off a year to remember for the family in today's G3 St Simon S. at Newbury. Off the mark in pattern company when edging out the subsequent G1 St Leger winner Encke (Kingmambo) in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 31, Khalid Abdullah's colt was only fourth in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. when last seen at York Aug. 22. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Hawaafez (GB)** (Nayef) had **Camborne (GB)** (Doyen {Ire}), **Willing Foe** (Dynaformer) and **Songcraft (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}) behind when winning Ascot's G3 Cumberland Lodge S. over 12 furlongs last time Oct. 6, and trainer Marcus Tregoning is hoping she can measure up here. "This is a better race than the Cumberland Lodge," he told *PA Sport*. "She's in very good form, she's a lightly raced mare and there's no telling where they will stop improving once they start. I'm really happy with her at home, I really couldn't get her any better. It would be useful to have her around next year, but that's to be discussed another day. We know she'll handle the ground, that will be crucial, but she's got a penalty now. Even so, she must have a good chance."

He disposed of maiden opposition by upwards of six lengths on heavy ground over a mile at The Curragh Oct. 14 and is likely to be ridden for stamina here as he bids to provide his stable with a fifth edition in nine years.

Trainer Kieran McLaughlin announced Friday that GI Forego S. hero **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song), who had a first preference for the GI Sprint, will instead opt for his second preference in the GI Dirt Mile. "We were talking about it back and forth and we decided that the [Dirt] Mile looked like a shorter field, maybe an easier spot, less trouble, no bad post position; lot of plusses," McLaughlin told *Daily Racing Form*. "We're almost the favorite, I would think." Emcee went a half-mile in :47.40 over the synthetic track at Greentree in Saratoga. The other three Godolphin runners bound for California worked solo Friday morning. GI Ladies' Classic contender **Questing** (GB) (Hard Spun) went an easy half-mile in :49.80, GI Travers S. dead-heater **Alpha** (Bernardini) got the same distance in :49 flat ahead of his start in the GI Classic and **"TDN Rising Star"** **Fortify** (Distorted Humor) stopped the clock in :48.60 in preparation for the GI Juvenile.

Casse Posse Dot Churchill Tab...

With rain in the Louisville forecast Friday and Saturday, trainer Mark Casse called an audible and sent out his Breeders' Cup prospects for breezes beneath the Twin Spires.

Bill Farish's **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy), winner of his only two appearances on dirt in his career, worked five furlongs in 1:02.80 in the company of stablemate Stealcase (Lawyer Ron), who is pointing for the GIII Ack Ack H. Nov. 2. Upset winner of the 2011 GI Stephen Foster H., Pool Play exits another boilover success in the GIII Hawthorne Gold Cup Oct. 6.

Spring in the Air (Spring at Last), impressive winner of the GI Darley Alcibiades S. Oct. 5, will be trying the dirt for the first time in her career in next Friday's GI Juvenile Fillies and recorded her second consecutive main-track work Friday morning, stopping the clock in 1:03. "I thought she handled the dirt quite nicely," Casse said. "She was our first one to work. They went away a little slow and she finished just in a gallop. She looked good."

Casse's other graded-stakes winning daughter of Spring at Last, GII Natalma S. and GIII Mazarine S. victress **Spring Venture**, will return to the infield for the GI Juvenile Fillies Turf and was clocked in 1:01.20 for her five-furlong move. "Spring Venture got away from the pole a little quick," Casse said. "She just wants to go. That will be [jockey] Patrick [Husbands'] biggest challenge: getting her to relax. She worked the fastest, but that's just her. She doesn't really know what slow is, but she looked great." A \$320,000 OBS June 2-year-old, Spring Venture is owned by Gary Barber and Stoneway Farm LLC.

Amazombie Set for Title Defense in Sprint...

Amazombie (Northern Afleet), the defending champion in the GI Sprint, turned in his final pre-race workout by drilling five furlongs in 1:00.60 Friday morning. "He went good," trainer Bill Spawr said of the California-bred gelding he co-owns with partner Tom Sanford. "He went in a minute and two-fifths, the last quarter in :23 [and] three [fifths], he galloped out [six furlongs] in [one] 13 and two or three." Amazombie is looking to become the second back-to-back winner of the Sprint (Midnight Lute, 2007-2008) and exits a fourth behind **Coil** (Point Given) in the GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship Oct. 6.

Merit Man (With Distinction), perfect in his two career starts including the Oct. 6 Tim Conway S., worked five-eighths of a mile in 1:04.20 for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint, some two seconds slower than his previous breeze, but trainer Bob Hess Jr. was not the least bit concerned. "The horse is incredibly lazy," the trainer said. "I worked him in the dark [Oct. 19] and he galloped around there like a clown in 1:02 and two [fifths]. Today, it looked slow, but he followed a slow horse, and my rider was told to stay in behind throughout until the end, and then blow by, which is what he did. I loved the fact that he was aggressive throughout, pulling throughout and blew right by, so that's all positive. I'm just trying to get him to show a little more enthusiasm [by working in company]. He never has, but today he did."

“A number of the chefs are coming back from last year and we were also able draw from the L.A. area to get some really great additions,” Weisbord confirmed.

After getting their pictures taken, winning Breeders’ Cup connections will be invited to celebrate in the Champion’s Terrace for the second straight year. The private party will include champagne toasts and desserts.

“The genesis of this is that, when the Breeders’ Cup began 25-plus years ago, a lot of these competitive international events didn’t exist,” Weisbord explained of the Committee’s efforts. “There wasn’t a Dubai World Cup Carnival at Meydan, there was no Hong Kong International raceday or Champions’ Day in England. The Japan Cup wasn’t that well-known yet and the Arc weekend and Melbourne Cup weren’t what they are today.”

He continued, “The worldwide landscape has become crowded with racetracks trying to put their best foot forward and we were a little stale with our presentation. We thought that we really needed to inject some other life around the event.”

Horsemen aren’t the only ones that will appreciate the initiative. Unlike the aforementioned trio, you won’t need to be connected to a Breeders’ Cup contender to attend the inaugural Breeders’ Cup VIP Fan Party. To help kick off the Championship weekend, nearly 400 fans who have either bought Breeders’ Cup tickets three out of the last four years, or who are participating in the \$10,000 Breeders’ Cup Betting Challenge, have been invited to attend the event that will be held in the Santa Anita paddock following Thursday’s finale.

Designed along the same lines as popular All-Star weekend events, the Fan Party will give racegoers a chance to mingle with standout trainers and jockeys from the past and present and also give them an opportunity to obtain autographs, take photos, etc.

“Along with some great food that’s being organized by Jeffrey Strauss from the Pamplemousse in Del Mar, who are also racing people that really love the game, we wanted to give fans access to the personalities of the sport and also be able to say thanks at the same time,” Weisbord offered. “These are the kinds of things that other sports do very well.”

The paddock experience will also be enhanced in 2012 with the creation of the Enclosure at the Breeders’ Cup. An area extending from the walking ring back toward the saddling area has been cornered off and will be restricted to the connections of Breeders’ Cup runners as well as their guests for the weekend and some VIPs.

“The walking ring experience is one of the most defining reasons for people to have a piece of a racehorse,” Weisbord said. “Borrowing a term from Royal Ascot, the Enclosure will not only have a fantastic view of both the walking ring and saddling area, but will also have a cash bar/champagne and also offer some luxury seating. It’s going to be a great place to spend the day if you enjoy seeing these horses close up and mingling with other people in our world. It will inject more of the elegance that we’re borrowing from other parts of the world.”

The recently launched Ambassador Program, which honors eight celebrity racing fans, including Flay, Bo Derek, Jim Rome, Joe Torre, Rick Pitino and Toby Keith, is also the brainchild of the Enhanced Experience Committee. Ambassadors will enjoy concierge service and more for their service. Pitino, Rome and Torre will be represented by runners at the upcoming Breeders’ Cup.

“In today’s world with the power of social media, when you tweet that you’re going to the Breeders’ Cup, Derby or Travers, it’s a big deal,” Weisbord explained. “We decided to try and harness some of that potential positive energy by honoring a group of people who really are knowledgeable about our game. Whenever they might be queried about something that goes on in Thoroughbred racing, not just the Breeders’ Cup, they’d be able to give an intelligent response.”

Weisbord concluded, “This is an honor that we’re bestowing on them and we’re very excited about this program and the great first group of Ambassadors that we’ve assembled.”

FAIR HILL GOES FROM FURLONGS TO FENCES

Fair Hill Training Center in Elktion, Maryland, has become known as a reliable source of Classic winners, thanks to the exploits of GI Kentucky Derby winners Barbaro (Dynaformer) and Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), and this year's GI Belmont S. winner Union Rags (Dixie Union). This weekend, however, Fair Hill will transition for the first time from a racehorse training center to a showhorse hub when it hosts the Furlongs to Fences off-the-track Thoroughbred show Oct. 26 and 27.

Coordinated by a small group of Fair Hill locals, Furlongs to Fences aims to showcase off-the-track Thoroughbreds in their new careers, as well as educate attendees and participants on the process of re-training racehorses. The two-day event will commence today with a series of activities for off-the-track Thoroughbred owners and spectators, headed by a clinic from Steuart Pittman from the Retired Racehorse Training Project at 1 p.m. Participants will also have the opportunity to go on a trail ride around Fair Hill and tour the training facilities. Today's events will conclude with a seminar on common racehorse injuries and ailments and how to treat them, presented by the New Bolton Center and Equine Veterinary Care, Fair Hill's on-track veterinary clinic.

"We have a whole day where people can come watch training in the morning and go on barn tours, with the idea being to show them the life of the Thoroughbred as a racehorse, because they haven't all seen that part of it" explained Alex Brown, a Fair Hill exercise rider and racehorse retraining advocate, and author of *Greatness and Goodness: Barbaro and his Legacy*. "We're just trying to make everything a lot more accessible so people on the off track side can see what these horses were doing as racehorses."

Paget Bennett, the director of sales for Fasig Tipton's Midlantic division and a coordinator of Furlongs to Fences, says the interest from show riders in Pittman's seminar has been high, an indication that interest in Thoroughbreds as show horse prospects is strong.

"Most of the entries have been through [Pittman's] website, but I believe we have about 20 horses coming for the clinic," Bennett said. "I think Thoroughbreds are coming back. People have realized how special they are, and I think more people are getting on board with [retraining them]."

Brown noted that Sunday's show, which kicks off at 9 a.m. and includes hunter, jumper and lead line classes, has also drawn strong interest, with around 130 entrants expected. Some classes are already full to capacity, with entrants from New York, New Jersey, and Virginia expected to ship to Fair Hill. "We had no idea what to expect, and I would say the number is spectacular," Brown said. "I think there's a little bit of a draw, people wanted to come to Fair Hill, and the fact that we put on this whole set of events might have attracted a few more people."

There are a few horses lined up that might also help draw spectators. One such entrants is Dry Martini (Slew Gin Fizz), a now 9-year-old gelding. An earner of more than \$1.3 million, Dry Martini won the GII Suburban H. in 2009 and placed second to Quality Road (Elusive Quality) in the 2010 GI Donn H while campaigned by owner Carol Nyren. Dry Martini made his final start in last year's Sunshine Millions Classic, finishing fifth.



“He was a very good racehorse, and then he started to tail off a little bit,” Brown explained. “[Nyren] didn’t want to run him in claimers and lose him, so she gave him to a friend. Some people would have just kept running him until they lost him and squeezed another 30, 40, or \$50,000 out of him, but she retired him and the people that have him love him.”

One of the most intriguing competitors, however, will be Betsy Barr’s gelding Torbay. Not only is the blaze-faced chestnut 25-years old and competing in his first show, but he is a son of Secretariat, and an older full brother to multiple Grade I winner Tinnars Way.

“The owner got him out of Delaware Park in the middle of the 1990s,” Brown explained. “He wasn’t a great racehorse, but the fact that he’s a Secretariat gets a lot of people interested. [Barr] has hunted him, used him as an outriding horse, he babysat their weanlings, and all sorts of stuff, but she has never competed him.”

Torbay will participate in the lead line class under Barr’s daughter, Elizabeth.

“He’s competing for the first time at 25-years old,” Brown said. “I think that’s just brilliant.”

Brown and Bennett both emphasized that the purpose of Furlongs to Fences is to promote off-track Thoroughbreds and to educate the horse community about the intricacies and benefits of retraining racehorses.

“We want to educate the public on what to know about [off track Thoroughbreds], and that it’s not all about racing and that they can be retrained,” Bennett explained. “We want everybody to have a great day with their horse.”

Strong support from the racing industry and local community has helped the Furlongs to Fences board generate about \$6,000 to distribute in prize money, with any leftover proceeds from the event going to various Thoroughbred retirement charities.

“A lot of people have reached out to help us put on the show,” Brown noted. “With the sponsorship funds, we decided to go two routes: the first was to create some prize money and reward the people that are buying these off-track Thoroughbreds. On the other side, any money we raise over covering the costs will go to [Thoroughbred charities].”

Brown noted that, between industry sponsorship and board volunteers, coordinating Furlongs to Fences has been a strong group effort.

“Lots of people have helped, because people fundamentally think this is the right thing to do,” Brown said. “I believe that most horsemen would like to do the right thing by their horses. We’ve had a lot of support.”

Brown added that, while putting on a horse show is a first for the Furlongs to Fences board, they are following a trend in the racing industry towards advocating racehorse aftercare. “This is just a small part of a big shift in the industry, of doing things like this,” Brown continued. “We’re no heroes, we’re just doing what a lot of people are now starting to do. It’s fun for us, and we’re excited.”

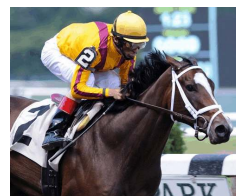

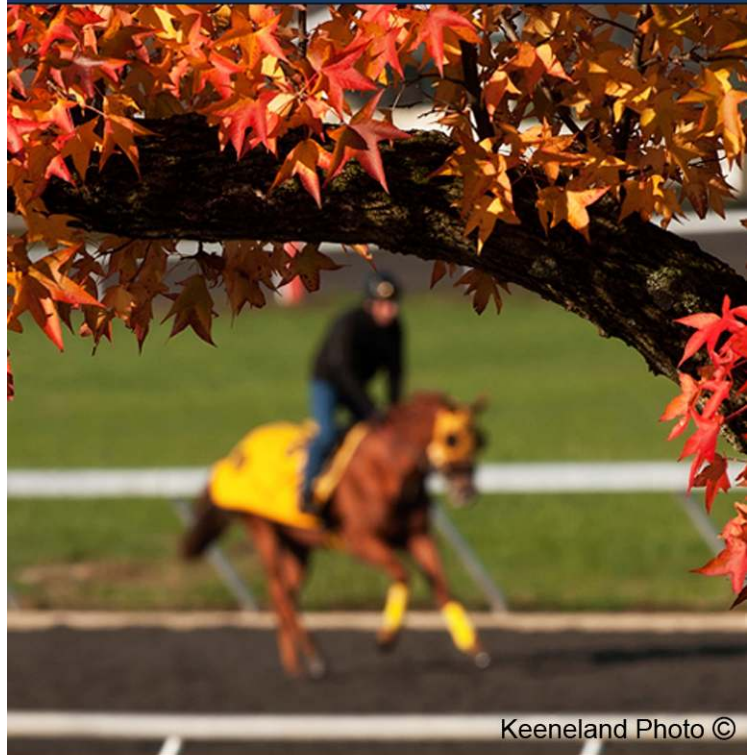
