'DUDE' HEADS CLASSIC DOZEN

Game On Dude (Awesome Again), undefeated in five career outings at Santa Anita, will put that perfect record on the line Saturday in the \$5-million GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The 5-year-old gelding was installed as the 9-5 choice on the morning line, and will break from post five with Rafael



Bejarano in the irons.

Royal Delta (Empire Maker) had been pre-entered in the Classic, but, as expected, her connections opted to have her defend her title in Friday's \$2-million GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic. Though the 4-year-old was one of the lucky group of New York-based horses that made it out before the onslaught of Hurricane Sandy, she reportedly suffered some minor scrapes during her journey to Santa Anita yesterday. Royal Delta drew the six hole, and is listed at 9-5 in a field that includes the past two winners of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course) and **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike).

Dullahan (Even the Score) was the other defection from the Classic; he will instead join his Dale Romans-trained stablemate **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) in the \$3-million GI Breeders' Cup Turf.

In the \$2-million GI Breeders' Cup Mile, **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) was tabbed as the 9-5 morning-line favorite over Irish raider **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) at 2-1. Wise Dan will break from the two hole with jockey John Velazquez, while Excelebration drew post six and will be piloted by Joseph O'Brien.

Defending GI Breeders' Cup Sprint champion **Amazombie** (Northern Afleet) is the tepid 4-1 choice in a deep field for Saturday's renewal. The 6-year-old will break from the 11 hole with regular rider Mike Smith.

East Coast Horses Beat the Storm

A contingent of 17 Breeders' Cup contenders beat out Hurricane Sandy, leaving the New York area early Monday morning before the worst of the storm that pummeled the east coast. Originally scheduled to leave from McArthur Airport in Islip, Long Island at 9 a.m., the flight was switched to Newburgh, which is located north of New York City, and pushed its departure ahead by eight hours to 1 a.m. Trainer Bill's Mott's three GI Breeders' Cup Classic candidates--Flat Out (Flatter), Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) and To Honor and Serve (Bernardini)--and the likely GI Ladies' Classic favorite **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) were on the flight. The other New York-based trainers with horses on the flight were Chad Brown, Shug McGaughey, Michael Hushion, Michael Trombetta and Diane Alvarado.

A final Tex Sutton Forwarding charter flight is tentatively scheduled for some time Tuesday. Expected on that flight are Todd Pletcher trainees Dreaming of Julia (A.P. Indy), Kauai Katie (Malibu Moon), Turbulent Descent (Congrats) and Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday); Tom Albertrani runners Brilliant Speed (Dynaformer) and Belle of the Hall (Graeme Hall); Kathy Ritvo's Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno); Tony Dutrow's Grace Hall (Empire Maker); and Barclay Tagg's Jersey Town (Speightstown). That flight will then stop in Louisville to pick up Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) for trainer Charles Lopresti and Fort Larned (E Dubai) for trainer Ian Wilkes before proceeding on to Los Angeles.

Romans Runners Go Turf

Dale Romans cross-entered GI Pacific Classic winner **Dullahan** (Even the Score) in the GI Turf and in the GI Classic, while the trainer cross-entered GI Arlington Million winner **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) in the Turf and the GI Mile. Both runners, however, will go postward in the Turf. "With Dullahan, it was just a surface decision," Romans revealed. "He seemed to work a little better on the turf. His gallop out was stronger on the turf." As for Little Mike, Romans said, "With Mike it came down to the pace scenario. The Mile looks like the toughest race on the card and there is plenty of speed in there already. We felt like the downhill slope of this course would help him stretch out in the Turf."

Owners that have pledged include Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, Donegal Racing, Padua Stables and Richard Santulli, Off the Hook, Starlight Racing, Zayat Stables, Sisters in Racing, James Covello, West Point Thoroughbreds and Bradley Thoroughbreds.

"It's the responsibility of everyone who has a stake in the game to support the organizations that take care of the horses in their years beyond racing," said Jack Wolf, managing partner of Starlight Racing. "New Vocations' program to rehab, retrain and re-home former race horses is one of the best in the industry and we are happy to support them at this year's Breeders' Cup."

In its three years working with the Breeders' Cup, over \$150,000 has been raised for the program.

"We feel very blessed to receive so much support from the owners and trainers participating in this year's campaign," said New Vocations Program Director Anna Ford. "Like last year, we are on track to adopt over 400 retired racehorses into homes by the end of December. The number of horses needing our services is huge and the funds raised from the pledges will help us continue to grow. It is fairly simple, the more money we raise the more horses we can take."

NATHANIEL TO BE SYNDICATED

Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}--Magnificent Style, by Silver Hawk), winner of last season's G1 King George & Queen Elizabeth S. and this year's G1 Eclipse S., has been retired to Newsells Park Stud and is to be syndicated. The 4-year-old bay finished runner-up to Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) in this year's renewal of the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot July 21, and occupied the same position behind Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab) in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown in his penultimate start Sept. 8. He also hit the board behind Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), who he famously met on debut at Newmarket in 2010, in Ascot's G1 Champions S. Oct. 20, having been forced to sidestep the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe two weeks earlier. Nathaniel retires with a career record of 11-4-5-1 and earnings of £1,464,688.

"Nathaniel has been a star over the past two years and his racing CV is extremely impressive," commented London Thoroughbred Services' James Wigan. "He is by the best sire in the world and is one of three Group 1 winners and eight stakes winners produced by his dam. Add in to the mix that he is a beautiful-looking individual with superb conformation and you have an incredibly attractive stallion prospect."

Nathaniel's owners believe that the horse represents a rare and exciting opportunity for breeders to come together and share in an exceptional stallion prospect, the type of stallion that has been almost exclusively in the hands of Coolmore, Darley or Juddmonte in recent years. The considerable interest we have already had in Nathaniel from Europe's leading breeders has only confirmed that others share their enthusiasm to participate in this project." Newsells Park Stud's Julian Dollar added, "We feel very privileged to stand a horse like Nathaniel at Newsells Park and, as you would expect, he will receive very significant support both from ourselves and the Rothschilds. The idea of attracting other like-minded breeders into a powerful syndicate is a very exciting one and gives Nathaniel an outstanding chance to succeed as a stallion."

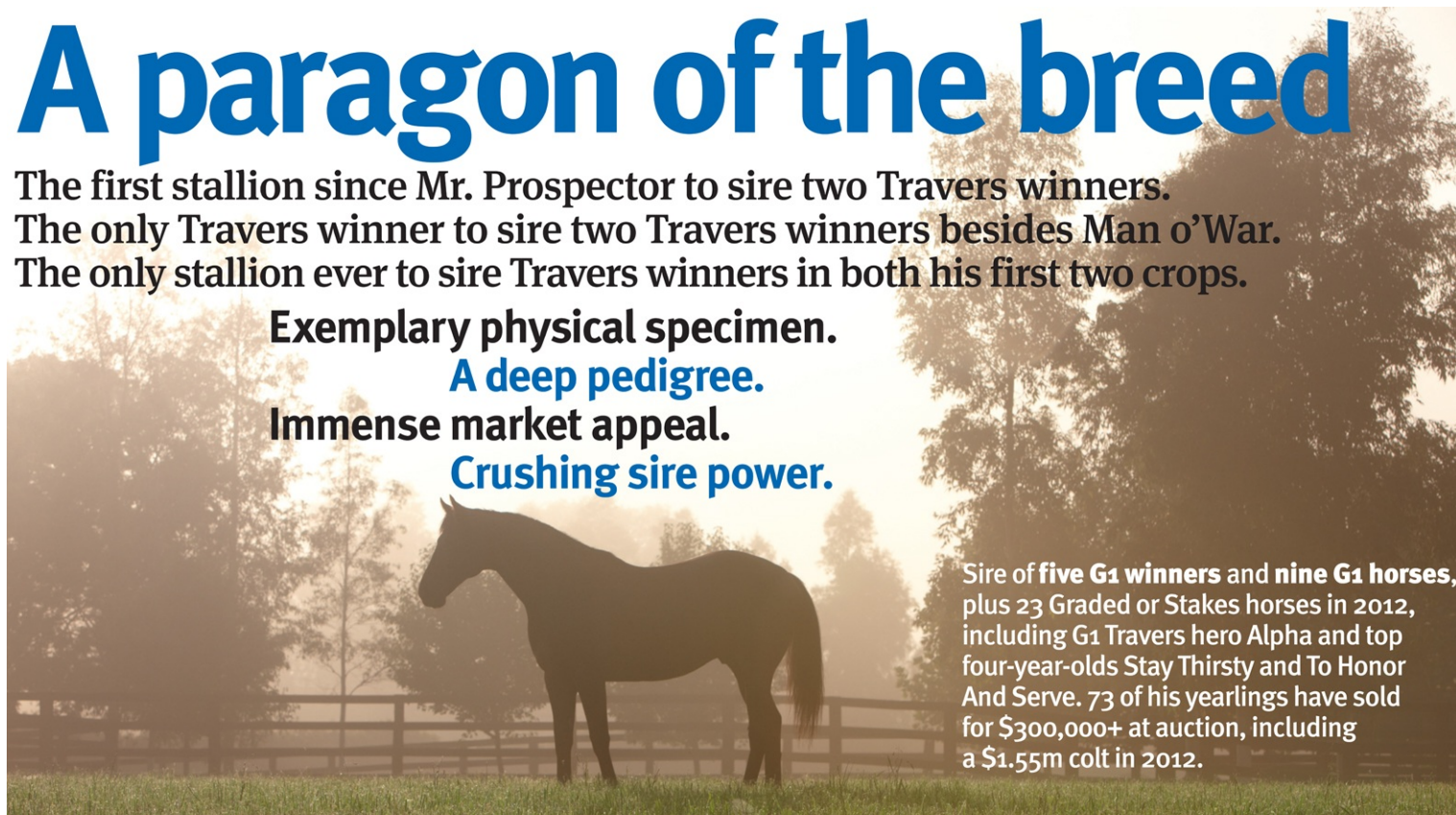

LIFELINE PROVIDED FOR ITALIAN RACING

Italy's racing program for 2013 is set to receive a near-€250 million budget after some of the leading players put their heads together in Rome last week. Tuesday's meeting of Dr. Stefano Vaccari, who is the executive of MIPAAF (Italy's Department of Agriculture), Mario Masini, a long-time owner-breeder under the Scuderia Colle Papa banner and now President of the Italian Owners' Association representing 20 racing groups including owners, breeders, trainers, jockeys and racecourses and Attilio d'Alesio, who was acting on behalf of a handful of independent tracks, unveiled the new measure which will help to alleviate the current industry crisis. In addition, Vaccari also confirmed that the MIPAAF is working towards the creation of a business plan by the end of the year to revamp Italian racing and generate a €3million budget to advertise the sport on national television. The budget is made up of €108 million from the government, €122 million from estimated gambling revenues and, €18 million from other elsewhere. Another move by the MIPAAF will see the bureaucracy of the previous UNIRE/ASSI office cut extensively for further savings.

The show was to preview the farm's horses in training who will be sold at the upcoming Keeneland November sale. Unraced as a juvenile, Lil'wing opened up with an impressive seven-length debut score at Chateaubriant Sept. 10, and remained unbeaten despite exaggerated waiting tactics in conditions heat over course and distance last time Sept. 28. She reverted to more orthodox tactics here and was rewarded with a career highlight on black-type bow. Lil'wing settled fourth for most of the contest. Traveling sweetly until stoked up in early stretch, the homebred bay seized control entering the final quarter mile and was ridden out to maintain her unblemished tally from stablemate La Peinture. Lil'wing's dam Louve won the 1999 renewal of this contest. "She has a very good temperament, a beautiful action and does everything well," commented winning rider Christophe Lemaire. "She was relaxed throughout and won readily. She'll certainly progress next season and a longer trip would pose no problems." Trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre, who also saddled the runner-up, added. "La Peinture was out for two months with a niggler after the [May 27 G1 Prix] Saint-Alary [at Longchamp]. She had worked well with Lil'wing and the result confirms they are not too far apart. It will be very interesting to follow them both next year."

TATTS AUTUMN KICKS OFF *by Emma Berry*

The leading players may have had a largely different look to those who contributed to the most successful Tattersalls October Sale on record, but the cast assembled at Park Paddocks just over a week later for the opening of the Horses-in-Training Sale was every bit as international. It is, therefore, no surprise that some of the most expensive horses sold during the first of four daily sessions in Newmarket on Monday are heading as far afield as Australia, Dubai, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and California.

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's Group 3-placed **Firebeam (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) was the subject of intense interest from a number of parties with trainer Robert Cowell and Australian agent Craig Rounsefell both engaged in the bidding, but ultimately having to give way to Anthony Stroud, who signed for Monday's top lot at 280,000gns.

"He's been bought for the Dubai Carnival," said Stroud, standing with David Loder, a regular member of Sheikh Mohammed's team of buyers, who added: "There are slim pickings at this sale when it comes to selecting horses for the Carnival. They need to have an official rating of at least 100 and why would people sell them when they can race them there themselves?"

Four-year-old Firebeam, whose rating is 108, has won three of his 12 starts and was the highlight of the draft from William Haggas's Somerville Lodge Stables, which included Saturday's listed-placed juvenile **Momalorka (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}), who sold for 55,000gns to Qatari owner Khalifa Bin Shael Al Kuwari.

The 3-year-old Montjeu (Ire) colt **Offer (Ire)** ([lot 236](#)) wasn't in the ring for long, but he became second-highest price of the day after shooting up from 50,000gns to 200,000gns with just one bold bid from agent Johnny McKeever.

The dual winner, who was third in the G3 Curragh Cup in June, will switch from one top stable to another, albeit 10,000 miles apart, after being consigned by Aidan O'Brien's Ballydoyle powerhouse and being bought on behalf of Australia's Gai Waterhouse.

This sale has become a popular shopping expedition for Australian trainers in search of European-bred stayers, but Waterhouse only joined the throng last year when buying five horses for a total of 525,000gns. One of those, Glencadam Gold (Ire) (Refuse To Bend {Ire}), went on to win the G1 Metropolitan S. at Randwick Oct. 6 and is set to line up for the G1 Melbourne Cup a week today, while Julienas (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) won the Listed Wyong Gold Cup in September.

"It's a tactic they use quite a bit in Australia," said McKeever, explaining his show-stopping manner of bidding. "This horse looks the part, he has plenty of scope and he's by Montjeu."

Waterhouse's assistant Bruce Slade added: "It was aggressive, but we really didn't want to go back to Australia without this horse."

Montjeu, who died from septicaemia at Coolmore Stud in Ireland in March, shuttled to Windsor Park Stud in New Zealand for four seasons and, despite being initially dismissed in some Southern Hemisphere quarters as a sire of 'wet-trackers,' ended up with an impressive record in Australia and New Zealand. His New Zealand-conceived Group 1 winners include the AJC Australian Derby-winning duo of Roman Emperor (NZ) and Nom Du Jeu (NZ), Waikato Sprint winner Tavistock (NZ) (who raced in Australia as Lord Tavistock) and Emirates Stakes winner Wall Street (NZ), while recent successful 'imports' from Britain include the Group 1 winners Green Moon (Ire) and Speed Gifted (GB).

North-eastern trainer Brian Ellison has built a great reputation for getting the very best out of second-hand horses, both on the Flat and over jumps, and he looks to have another exciting dual-purpose prospect on his hands following the purchase of [lot 319](#), **Mashaari (Ire)**, a gelded 3-year-old son of the late German supersire Monsun, for 160,000gns.

"He's been bought for Phil Martin to go jumping-- hopefully he'll be a Cheltenham horse, but he'd also be a good sort for the [Northumberland] Plate next year," said Ellison, who had to fend off rival bidders Candida Baker and Tom Malone, standing with National Hunt trainer Tum Vaughan.

Plucked from the 58-strong Shadwell draft, the lightly raced Mashaari was previously in training in Newmarket with John Gosden, for whom he won over two and a quarter miles at York Oct. 13 and earned a rating of 88.

His new trainer added: "He's a lovely strong 3-year-old and he loves soft ground. He's got everything going for him--I just hope I can do a good job training him."

Need Succeeds

Need You Now (Ire) (Kheleyf {Ire}) ([lot 387](#)), a 10,000gns breeze-up purchase in the same ring in May, posted a dramatic increase in value when selling for 160,000gns late on Monday following her Listed Radley S. victory at Newbury on Saturday. The 2-year-old filly is another who is California-bound after being bought by Craig Rounsefell of Boomer Bloodstock for Joe Scardino and Tony Fanticola, who have last year's Tattersalls purchase Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) racing for them in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

"This filly really produced the goods on Saturday," said Rounsefell, who confirmed she will join Obviously in Mike Mitchell's stable. "She looks like she'll be a good two-turn filly for America."

In her four British starts, Need You Now bore the familiar orange-and-white colours of Franconson Partners, the racing name of Dave and Deb Curran of Gazeley Stud just outside Newmarket. The Currans have also enjoyed success with dual Group 3 winner African Dream (GB) (Mark Of Esteem {Ire}), who, like Need You Now, was trained by Peter Chapple-Hyam.

Krypton Factor Team Strikes Again

Krypton Factor (GB) was a 100,000gns purchase at this sale two years ago and the son of Kyllachy (GB) went on to win the G1 Golden Shaheen on Dubai World Cup night this March. His Bahrain-born owner/trainer Fawzi Nass was back for more on Monday when, buying through Oliver St Lawrence, he went to 120,000gns for 2-year-old **Hototo (GB)** (Sleeping Indian {GB}) ([lot 148](#)), winner of the Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot.

"He'll go to Dubai," confirmed St Lawrence. "It's not impossible that he'll be back here to race next year and hopefully we can 'do a Krypton Factor' with him."

Hototo was bred by Devon-based Brian Hammond of Ashley House Stud, who, from a band of broodmares which numbers less than five, also bred last year's G1 Secretariat S. and G1 Irish Derby winner Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}).

He was one of two sons of Sleeping Indian with good juvenile stakes form to have been offered on Monday. Three lots earlier the G2 July S. runner-up **Lewisham (GB)** ([lot 145](#)) was sold to Kuwaiti buyer Magbel Safar Alotabi for 50,000gns.

Middle East-Bound

Dynaformer's 3-year-old son **Maori Dancer** is on his way to Saudi Arabia after being bought by Saad bin Mishraf on behalf of Prince Faisal for 170,000gns. The colt was also on the list of agent Guy Mulcaster, who buys for Australian trainer Chris Waller, but Mulcaster same off second best after a protracted bidding duel.

"Dynaformer has had lots of success in Saudi Arabia," said Mishraf. "I like his breeding--he's out of a Mr. Prospector mare--and he's a big horse with plenty of room for improvement. The Claiborne-bred Maori Dancer, who was bought for \$100,000 as a yearling at Keeneland, has raced only three times for Jeremy Nosedo and won his most recent start over a mile and a half at Wolverhampton.

Borug, a Kingmambo half-brother to the 2002 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Marienbard (Ire), will join him on his trip to the Middle East, having been another of Mishraf's 13 purchases during the first session. He was bought for 110,000gns.

Listed-placed in Dubai last year, the 4-year-old started his training career with Godolphin but spent this season in the stable of new Rabbah trainer James Tate, for whom he recently won a decent 10-furlong handicap at Epsom and was only narrowly beaten when second at Newbury on Saturday.

Another on his travels is the 100-rated **Right to Dream (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who has December's Qatar Derby as his aim after being knocked down to trainer Ibrahim Saeed Al-Malki for 85,000gns. Trained in England by Brian Meehan, the 3-year-old gelding is a dual winner and had been spotted by the Qatari while racing in Dubai earlier this year.

"He was a bit weak then but he has been castrated and he seems to have done well," said Newmarket trainer Conrad Allen, who was assisting Al-Malki with his purchases, which included another son of Oasis Dream, the six-year-old three-time winner **Jonny Mudball (GB)**.

Get 'Em While They're Fresh

Updates don't come much fresher than that boasted by **Disko Dasko (Fr)**, a 2-year-old daughter of French-based Danzig sire Country Reel, who travelled from her home in Yorkshire to race in the Listed Criterium de Vitesse in Paris on Sunday, before arriving victorious in Newmarket. Such eye-catching recent form was enough to convince Californian trainer Jim Cassidy to urge his agent Gordian Troeller to see off advances from underbidder Marc-Antoine Berghgracht and buy her for 75,000gns.

"She was on the short list, but her listed win proved that she has above average ability," Cassidy said. "We watched her race on video and she looked good. She is a lovely filly and she'll travel to the U.S., where I'll give her a couple of easy weeks. She should be ready to race in February."

Later in the day, Cassidy also secured another filly with a good recent update in **Lilbourne Eliza (Ire)** (Elusive City), who was third in the Listed Radley S. at Newbury on Saturday. Again acting through Troeller, the trainer went to 100,000gns for the 2-year-old filly, bought for owner Deron Pearson, who was also present at the sale.

Need You Now (Ire) (Kheleyf) and **Momalorka (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}), who were first and second ahead of Lilbourne Eliza in the Radley S. were scheduled to sell late in Monday's session as lot 387 and 342, respectively.

At the close of business on Monday, Tattersalls had sold 249 lots for a gross of 5,873,6000. The average was 23,589gns and the median was 12,500gns. The day's aggregate was up 52% on the corresponding session last year, while the average was up 37% and the median was up 35%. The clearance rate was 89%, up from 79% a year ago.

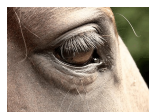

The masters of Coolmore must gleefully rub their hands as the Racing Post Trophy rolls around each year. Kingsbarns' success three days ago means that ten of the last 20 winners of the end-of-season test were sired by one or other of the Coolmore stallions, with the Ashford-based El Gran Senor boosting the total to 11.

Considering that he has sired three winners of the Dewhurst S., Britain's other most important contest for juvenile colts, it has taken Galileo a surprisingly long time to add his name to the Racing Post Trophy's roll of honor, with Kingsbarns being a member of his eighth crop.

But then Galileo's sons have been facing extremely strong competition from Montjeu, another brilliant son of Sadler's Wells. This much-missed stallion sired four winners in the space of eight years, but even his total falls one short of Sadler's Wells's tally of five.

Kingsbarns' decisive victory on only his second start saw him installed as second favorite behind Galileo's unbeaten grandson Dawn Approach in the ante-post betting for next year's 2000 Guineas and favorite for the Derby. This is hardly surprising when one remembers that the Sadler's Wells line's Racing Post winners included four future winners of the Derby, plus winners of three editions of the Breeders' Cup Turf and two of the Irish Derby, together with single winners of the 2000 Guineas, St Leger and the King George.

Kingsbarns provided Aidan O'Brien with his seventh--and I suspect most pleasurable--victory in the Doncaster Group 1. This was a real family affair, as the Galileo colt was bred by the trainer's wife Anne-Marie and ridden by their son Joseph. Of course this isn't the first time that O'Brien has enjoyed major success with a horse bred by a relative, as his seven-time Group 1 winner Rock of Gibraltar was bred by the partnership of Aidan, Anne-Marie and Anne-Marie's father Joe Crowley.

It is understandable that Kingsbarns is considered a stronger contender for the Derby than the 2000 Guineas, as both his sire Galileo and broodmare sire Belmez were winners of the King George over a mile and a half.

Belmez is pretty much a forgotten name nowadays, but he was a formidable performer in Sheikh Mohammed's colors in 1990. Although he defeated the future Derby winner Quest For Fame in the Chester Vase, Belmez came out of that race with a tendon injury which was initially thought to be career ending. Fortunately--as with Mark Twain--reports of his "demise" proved to have been greatly exaggerated and he was back in action in the Irish Derby.

The son of the brilliant El Gran Senor suffered his first defeat in that race, but the outing put him spot on for the King George, in which he narrowly defeated his year-older stable-mate Old Vic. Belmez improved his record to five wins from six starts when he gave weight and a beating to the future St Leger winner Snurge in the Great Voltigeur S., but his career ended anticlimactically with a fifth in the Arc and a seventh in the Japan Cup.

Belmez was recruited to stand at the Royal Studs, starting at a fee of £18,000 in 1991. Unfortunately he proved to have little of the talent that saw El Gran Senor sire the likes of Rodrigo de Triano, Lit de Justice and Toussaud--plus the Racing Post Trophy winners Al Hareb and Saratoga Springs.

Belmez ultimately died at the age of 12 in France, living long enough for his failings as a stallion to become apparent. His legacy of 191 foals featured only two group winners in Group 2 winner Caramba and Group 3 scorer Spanish Falls (the latter, coincidentally, being a half-sister to Sadler's Wells's Racing Post Trophy winner Aristotle). Kingsbarns' dam Beltisaal was a disappointing maiden who never finished closer than fourth in a seven-race career in the French Provinces. She tackled distances at up to a mile and a half.

Belmez hasn't set the world on fire as a broodmare sire, either. Sixty-four of his daughters have produced more than 300 foals, but Kingsbarns is their first Group 1 winner. Until he came along their best effort was the Group 2 winner Nicobar, now best known as the sire of the Melbourne Cup winner Dunaden.

While Belmez's broodmare daughters in general have proved ordinary, there has been nothing ordinary about Beltisaal's record as a producer. She is singlehandedly responsible for three of the five Group winners out of Belmez mares, having previously produced the seven-furlong Group 3 winner Belle Artiste to the sprinter Namid and the talented American turf miler Sweeter Still to Rock of Gibraltar. She has a 2011 colt by Fastnet Rock, which is a 3/4-brother to Sweeter Still.

Kingsbarns comes from a family which Aidan O'Brien knows well. His third dam House Tie also ranks as the fourth dam of Rip Van Winkle, another top-class son of Galileo. With a dam by the champion sprinter Stravinsky, Rip Van Winkle proved at his most effective from a mile to a mile and a quarter, but he was beaten only two lengths when fourth in Sea The Star's Derby. Kingsbarns potentially has substantially more stamina in his make up as his sire and the sires of his first two dams--Belmez and Caerleon--were all top-class winners over a mile and a half.

O'Brien also did well with Ace, a Danehill colt whose second dam was House Tie. Although he lacked a major win, Ace was good enough to finish second in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Breeders' Cup Turf. The House Tie branch of this family also produced Alderbrook, a very smart flat performer who also won the Champion Hurdle.

Kingsbarns' fourth dam is the celebrated Mesopotamia, a leading juvenile filly who has endless good performers descending from her, including top-class Halling and Japan Cup winner Alkaased. There may be another Group 1 winner in the pipeline for the family, as the unbeaten British juvenile filly Just The Judge has Mesopotamia as her fifth dam. Could this family end up with more than one British classic winner in 2013?

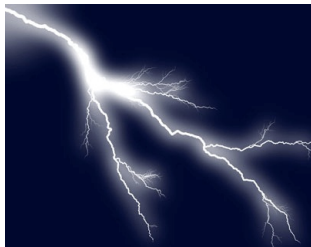

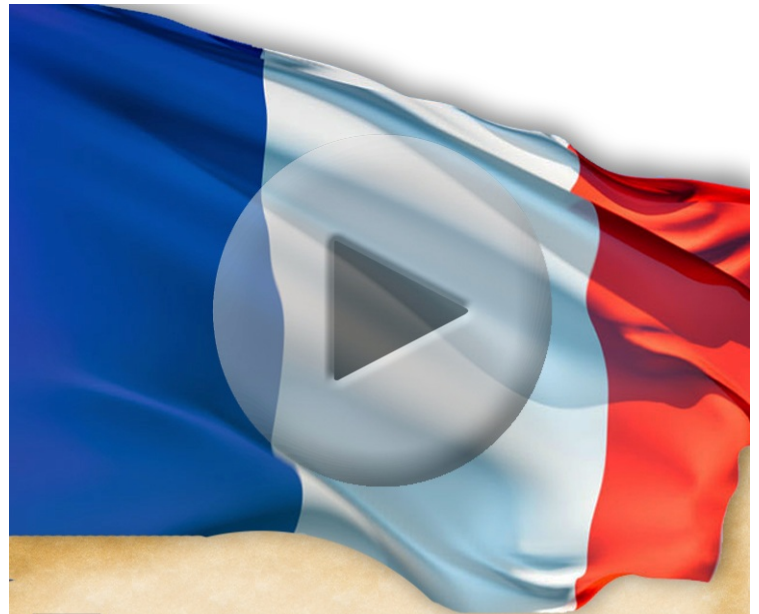
