LADIES FIRST

For the third time in the last five years and the sixth time overall, Santa Anita Park in Arcadia, California, plays host to the Breeders' Cup meeting, and as has become its custom, the first of the two-day stand is dominated by races restricted to the fairer sex. In the

day's centerpiece event, the \$2-million GI Ladies' Classic, **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) will go favored to join Bayakoa (Arg) as the only back-to-back winner of the race and will attempt to give trainer Bill Mott his third consecutive win in the race and fifth overall (Ajina, 1997, Escena, 1998

and Unrivaled Belle, 2010). Still, with the likes of the undefeated **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike), also a winner on Breeders' Cup day at Churchill last year, 2010 GI Juvenile Fillies' heroine and also undefeated **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course) and the free-wheeling **Questing (GB)** (Hard Spun), the Hall of Famer is taking absolutely nothing for granted. "I think it's very competitive," Mott said. "You have to respect a lot of the horses in there. It looks like a good, fast pace. And it looks like some horses have speed and good quality. There is no shortage of talent."

This year's running of the Juvenile Fillies may be short on numbers, but is also long on talent, and features an interesting clash between **"TDN Rising Stars"** **Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai), **Dreaming of Julia** (A.P. Indy) and **Kauai Katie** (Malibu Moon). As talented as that trio is, none has registered a speed figure as lofty as the 108 Beyer turned in by **Beholder** (Henny Hughes), who lands in this two-turn heat instead of the Juvenile Sprint. The Spendthrift runner, conditioned by Richard "Man-O" Mandella--he of four Cup wins at Santa Anita in 2003--has drawn the fence, for better or for worse, and will have to go early for Garrett Gomez.

In the afternoon's other events, **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) will look to take the GI Filly/Mare Turf back to Europe, while the Richard Hannon-trained **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {GB}) will be a strong choice in the GI Juvenile Fillies Turf. The GI Marathon, which has been moved to this program, is a wide-open affair with the 3-year-old **Atigun** (Istan) the lukewarm favorite. The Juvenile Sprint will kick off the Breeders' Cup portion of the program.

Awesome Return to the Breeders' Cup...

It's been a tumultuous two years for **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course) since she stood in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner's circle after her victory at Churchill Downs in 2010. She wore the silks of her breeder, the Florida-based Jacks Or Better Farm, for that victory, which earned her Eclipse honors as champion 2-year-old filly, but was offered for sale just days later at Fasig-Tipton November, where she was

scooped up by Stronach Stables for \$2.3 million and turned over to trainer Chad Brown. With an undefeated juvenile campaign to her credit, including four stakes victories in Florida before her Breeders' Cup romp, Awesome Feather appeared to be on the path to stardom. Hopes of a classic campaign, however,

were derailed when she sustained a tendon injury in January 2011, but not all was lost for the year: although she made a belated sophomore debut, Awesome Feather managed to add three more victories, including the GI Gazelle S. at Aqueduct in November, and the Sunshine Millions Distaff at Gulfstream in January, before injury sidelined her again. She made her second major comeback Sept. 20, winning the Nasty Storm S. at Belmont. She is now on track for a second Breeders' Cup title, and Brown is optimistic about her chances. "I feel very good," he said. "My filly has been training very well back home. She's come to Santa Anita, been on the track three days in a row, and every day she's looked dynamite out there. I'm optimistic that she's going to come with a big race." Brown added that Awesome Feather is in "the best shape of her career," and will be versatile in running. "The great thing about her is that she has speed, she can carry it a long way, and she can adapt to any situation," Brown said. "If there is no speed in the race, she's the kind of horse that can go to the lead. She has no problem with that. If there is a quick pace, she can stalk and rate kindly. I think she is posted well [post 5]. She should be able to work out a fair trip from there. We'll see how she goes from there."

Richard Mandella, who took the 2003 running of the Juvenile Fillies with subsequent champion Halfbridled and the 1993 renewal at Santa Anita with Phone Chatter, feels the rest of the field will have a decision to make as he sends out the fleet **Beholder**. "I know there is a lot of speed in the race, especially that Malibu Moon filly [Kauai Katie] of Todd Pletcher's," Mandella commented. "But I think they'll have to respect my filly's speed and I'm hoping nobody will think it is worth their while to try to take her on. I've got [Garrett] Gomez riding and he's a pro. You always like to turn it over to a pro. He'll know what to do."

Pletcher, in search of a first win in the Juvenile Fillies, comes loaded for bear this year with GI Frizette S. heroine **Dreaming of Julia** and dual Grade II winner **Kauai Katie**. "Dreaming of Julia is very straightforward, what I would consider the perfect blend of her sire and dam," Pletcher said. "She's by A.P. Indy out of a dam [Dream Rush, by Wild Rush] that was very good at sprints and middle distances, so she's got a combination of speed and stamina. I would anticipate two turns would be even better for her." Pletcher has sent out the Juvenile Fillies runner-up on three occasions.

It's safe to say Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, Debmar Stables and Gary Barber's **In Lingerie** is taking the road less traveled to tonight's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. Not only did the 3-year-old filly make her final prep in the GI Spinster S., a race that has never produced a winner of this event, but she will also be making her turf debut in tonight's championship race.

While In Lingerie's road to the Breeders' Cup is certainly unconventional, her trainer Todd Pletcher knows a thing or two about training champions. "We have always been leaning toward this since the Spinster," Pletcher said. "We needed everything to go right once she got here and it has. She's settled in here real well and she's had those two good breezes over the turf." In Lingerie will face a slew of talented elders who have won Grade I turf races both in America and Europe, but she packs solid credentials herself. Unraced as a 2-year-old, she won the GIII Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway Park by six lengths in just her third start Mar. 24, and added the GII Black Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico May 18. After consecutive placings behind Questing (GB) (Hard Spun) in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks S. July 21 and the GI Alabama S. Aug. 18 on the Saratoga dirt, she landed back in the winner's circle with her Spinster victory Oct. 7. "You usually don't go to the Breeders' Cup trying a new surface for the first time, but she's a filly that's undefeated on the synthetic [3-for-3]," said Pletcher, who oversaw a maintenance gallop Thursday morning at Santa Anita. "So, we thought it made some sense to at least try [turf], especially since she worked very well over the surface twice."

With the presence of G1 Moyglare Stud S. victress Sky Lantern (Ire) and Watsdachances (Ire), who represents America's best hopes, **Spring Venture** could offer some value and register a mild surprise in the Juvenile Fillies turf. One of two outstanding fillies for

her very successful first-crop stallion [GI Darley Alcibiades S. winner Spring in the Air goes in the GI Juvenile Fillies], the \$320,000 OBS June purchase is perfect in her three career starts, having annexed the GII Natalma S. over this distance Sept. 15 before switching to the Polytrack for a comfortable, if not highly rated, score in the GIII Mazarine S. Oct. 6. Trainer Mark Casse is excited about the chance to register a breakthrough win on Breeders' Cup day. "Of all the things I do, the number one thing is going out and finding the horses," said Casse, currently fifth by earnings in North America. "Because it doesn't matter if you're Todd Pletcher or Bob Baffert, you're only as good as your players. We're fortunate that we have some wonderful owners now who have faith in us and are letting us go out and spend the money."

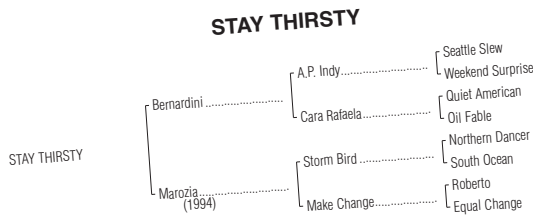

An Argentinian import, Calidoscopio has been in California preparing for the Breeders' Cup for two months, and has been easily spotable while being galloped bareback each morning while sporting a white bonnet on his head. In Argentina, all racehorses are trained bareback, and Frenkel claims that his 9-year-old charge is now "too old to change his routine." The white bonnet is intended to help prevent head colds. The only times Calidoscopio has worn a saddle since arriving in America has been for three timed works under jockey Aaron Gryder, who has the mount today. "He's an old, smart horse," Gryder commented. "He's has a great kick for a distance horse." Calidoscopio, who has won six group races in his native country including the G2 General Belgrano S. June 23, most recently worked five-furlongs in 1:01 over the Santa Anita dirt Oct. 29.

JUVENILE SPRINT - Just not sold on the two likely favorites in the opener. **Sweet Shirley Mae** has every right to stick it to the boys after a big second to the talented So Many Ways in the Spinaway after checking out of the race in the early going. Training like a monster since gate scratch in the Frizette. **Play: \$75.**

MARATHON - Why is this a Breeders' Cup race again? The versatile **Juniper Pass** sports a graded win going 1 1/2m in the Santa Anita slop, and has also delivered in a grassy graded stakes at this distance last April. Two decent performances since a freshening and lures Frankie to take the mount. Bombs away. **Play: \$15.**

JUVENILE FILLIES TURF - Like the majority of Friday's Breeders' Cup program, I'm just not in love with anything in this spot. Will swing for the fences with European invader **The Gold Cheongsam**, who is listed at 20-1 on the morning-line. Reeled off three straight in Britan before a luckless 11th in the prestigious Cheveley Park. Has a seasoning advantage over her rivals making her eighth start here, and stretches to a route for the first time off a decent third in the Tattersalls Millions Trophy. Far from impossible. **Play: \$25.**

JUVENILE FILLIES - Prefer Dreaming of Julia over Executiveprivilege in this East vs. West showdown, but what fun would that be touting a 5-2 shot in this thing? **Spring in the Air** has been visually impressive in her two wins over the synthetic, ran a bang-up second to her stablemate in her lone grass try in the Natalma, and can make some noise at a price if able to handle the transition to dirt. **Play: \$50.**

F/M TURF - I've been on the **Marketing Mix** train since day one, and I'm not getting off now. Another performance like her dominating win over the course-and-distance Rodeo Drive gets the money here. **Play: \$100.**

LADIES CLASSIC - In what may go down as one of the greatest Breeders' Cup fields ever assembled, I'm shooting for an upset. What's wrong with **Include Me Out** at 15-1? The two-time Grade I winner absolutely loves Santa Anita (6-3-1-1), and had no chance of catching Love and Pride after those glacial early fractions over a speed-favoring surface in the Zenyatta. Will have more than enough pace to run at here and is classy enough to hang with the big girls, especially on her home court. **Play: \$50.**

JUVENILE SPRINT - I'm kind of amazed this race didn't draw more horses--think about all the maiden winners out there who would look interesting in this spot. **Super Ninety Nine** might appreciate the one-furlong cutback and his stablemate who was behind him in their respective debuts was impressive last Saturday. **Play: \$20.**

MARATHON - There seems to be a direct inverse between talent and ability to win a marathon race, so I'm not sure how useful traditional handicapping techniques are. I think I watched a replay of **Almudena's** last dirt race, I think I was looking at the right horse and I think she had a little bit of trouble. **Play: \$10.**

JUVENILE FILLIES TURF - **Flotilla** is my type of European import--a late runner who figures to take to a firmer U.S. style course. I love that both her dam and half-sister came here and won stakes races in their first stateside starts--her dam did it as a 2-year-old in the Gill Miesque S. at Hollywood. Nancy O's sneaky and I can't toss my old pal Summer of Fun for sanity's sake, but Flotilla offers the best value considering how likely a winner I think she is. **Play: \$200.**

JUVENILE FILLIES - Isn't this race destined to completely collapse? Not crazy about the favorites here either, though wish there were more options to oppose them with. Dirt's a bit of a question for **Spring in the Air**, but it looks like she worked in company with Uncaptured at Churchill Oct. 20, and that colt romped in last Sunday's Gill Iroquois under the Twin Spires. She won't be 15-1, but she'll still offer some value. **Play: \$100.**

F/M TURF - I had a hard time separating the European-trained runners, but landed on **Nahrain**. Her best Euro form from last year matches up with The Fugue's, and I'm inclined to expect some regression for Ridasiyna off her Prix de l'Opera romp. In my mind I seemed to remember that I'm a Dreamer had a tougher trip than Nahrain in the Flower Bowl, but upon further inspection, I think the ground loss Nahrain suffered was far more significant than the minimal traffic trouble I'm a Dreamer had. I'll spread pretty deeply here in the pick four, but Nahrain's my value play. **Play: \$100.**

LADIES CLASSIC - Royal Delta is deserving chalk and one of my favorite horses ever, but she does occasionally run clunkers. **Questing** should be a clear second choice, but won't be. Her speed is super deadly and her narrow loss to My Miss Aurelia in the Cotillion was due to one of the most anti-speed biases I've ever seen. **Play: \$300.**

Making His Point...

Point of Entry (Dynaformer), Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Turf morning-line favorite, galloped 1 1/2 miles Thursday morning at Santa Anita Park. The Phipps Stable colorbearer enters on a five-race roll and looks to get his fourth consecutive graded score. The colt's success has put Hall-of-Fame trainer Shug McGaughey in uncharted territory. "He's new to me, because I never had a horse as good as him that wants to run long on the grass," McGaughey said. "I never won the Man o'War, I never won the Sword Dancer, I never won the Turf Classic, so he opened up a lot of doors for me that's been fun to participate in. He's been fun."

Baffert Brigade Formidable in Sprint...

Trainer Bob Baffert knows how to win the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, having sent out three winners of the short-track event. Baffert's trio of Sprint starters this weekend, **Coil** (Point Given), **Fast Bullet** (Speightstown) and **Capital Account** (Closing

Argument) galloped Thursday morning at Santa Anita. Baffert stated that each of his starters have the necessary speed, but the six furlong distance will determine the winner. "Fast Bullet, he's just a fast horse," said Baffert. "He's appropriately named. No telling how quick he might run. Capital Account is all racehorse. I think the six furlongs may be too short for him, but he's going to run big anyway. I wish I had the guts to put him

in the [Dirt] Mile. He'll run a mile and he'd be a good miler. But he's sprinting Saturday and we'll hope for some good luck. Coil could be a good miler, too. The horse won a grade I sprint [Santa Anita Sprint Championship Oct. 6], so we know he's a good sprinter. That's not bad. He might have the edge at six furlongs."

It's all about the Breeders' Cup right now. What have been some of your favorite moments?

Wow, obviously Zenyatta at Santa Anita in 2009--not only the best Breeders' Cup moment, I would also think the best *moment* in horse racing history, in my career at least. That was great, but there have been a lot of them. The one at Monmouth Park with

Midnight Lute's win and Curlin winning the Classic, and also Goldikova's (back-to-back) wins (in the Mile). I know I'll be driving down the freeway in a few hours and I'll think, 'Wow, why didn't I mention that.' There are so many of them, but those are the ones that jump out at me. **Cont. p9**

Is there a race or horse that you're looking forward to seeing the most at this year's Championships?

To me, the horse of the two days is going to be Game on Dude. If you had to have a star billing, I'd say it would be him and probably Royal Delta second. We don't have a Zenyatta this year, but at least we've got evenly-matched fields.

In addition to Game on Dude, are there any other Southern California-based horses that stand out to you after watching them first-hand throughout the year?

Gervinho is going to be very interesting (Juvenile Turf). He's a very nice-looking horse with a long stride. Beholder (Juvenile Fillies) has been very impressive, too. It'll be very interesting to see how they do. Of course, Baffert's got his usual plethora out there. Executiveprivilege

(Juvenile Fillies) is unbeaten, but isn't a superstar quite yet. Those are the ones that I'm looking forward to seeing the most.

In terms of the biggest racing days--the Triple Crown, Dubai World Cup, Royal Ascot, etc.-- where do you think the Breeders' Cup ranks among the best?

The Saturday card is very good. To be perfectly honest, it's being diluted now that we have 15 races instead of seven. When they had the seven, I would've put it just a nose behind Kentucky Derby day. When you go from seven races to 15, you're going to dilute the quality--it's common sense. It's obviously still up there though. In America, I think it's a way bigger day than the Dubai World Cup. I think maybe places like England, France, and South Africa, Dubai World Cup day is bigger than Breeders' Cup day. But for us, this is still definitely the second best day of the year.

You've obviously been doing this for a long time, but do you still get any nerves when calling the BC races?

Oh yeah, you do [laughs]. The only way I could relate it to the American public by would be American football. You could go out there and call the games every Sunday afternoon--yeah it's a big day, but when it's Super Bowl Sunday, it's human nature (to get nervous). If the adrenaline doesn't kick in, there's something wrong with you.

In terms of preparation, not only for the Breeders' Cup races, but on a day-to-day basis, how much work goes in behind-the-scenes being a track announcer?

On the average day, I'd say between two and three hours depending on the size of the fields and number of races. But for the Breeders' Cup, it goes up tenfold. My big disadvantage is that so few of the horses are from California. I actually got pretty lucky this year--I did a rough calculation and about 30% of them are locals. But normally, when we go to Kentucky or somewhere else, it's closer to 15%. You've never seen, let's say 70% of the horses before, so you need to go to those sites that show you replays and at least take a look at the horses so you can get a vague idea of their running style, what they look like, what their colors are, etc. And obviously that takes a long time. Breeders' Cup is like no other day. If you're doing the Kentucky Derby, basically that's one race. This is 15 races and you have to treat each one as though it is the Classic. You can't treat any race any lesser.

How were introduced to the sport growing up in South Africa?

South Africa was huge in racing when I was growing up. I was born in '52 and got involved in '57. Horse racing was massive during the '50s-'70s in South Africa. I would compare it to the old days in America when Man O'War would make the front page of the newspaper--not the front page of the sports section.

You couldn't go in a restaurant or a bar without people talking horseracing. Horse racing back in South Africa in the '60s would be like American football and baseball today in America.

I wanted to be a jockey when I was little, but they had an academy that you had to go to and they decided whether you could become a jockey or not. You had absolutely no say in the matter. You went before a panel and they said yes or no. If they said no, that was it, you were done. And they said no to me because I was going to grow and I'm 5' 7" now. Not tall, but tall for a jockey. But anyway, they were right.

I just got extremely lucky. I pursued announcing and I got a job when I was 18 and everything just went from there.

What do you love most about the sport that keeps you coming back for more?

The majesty of the horse. Take the gambling part out of it, etc. I have a little saying that I think that a cheetah and a Thoroughbred racehorse are the two most magnificent-looking animals in the world. When you look at a racehorse in the paddock and he's chomping away at the bit, pulling the groom around, and kicking and bucking, man what a magnificent specimen!

Is there a specific type of race that you enjoy calling more than others?

Long distance is my forte. There's so much more happening. As American racing would have it, the majority of long-distance races are on the turf. There's just so much more tactics involved. A jockey can't just jump out of the gate and send like they do over six furlongs. There's much more skill involved. Without a shadow of a doubt, long-distance turf races are my favorite.

What's your favorite part about being a track announcer/what do you enjoy most about your job?

I try to be an artist rather than just joining the dots. Each race represents a new challenge. Every race is different and you've got to try and paint a picture. That's the challenge to me. If you just had to name it like they did it in the old days--so and so is first, second, third, etc., oh my goodness, I'd be bored stiff. you've got to paint the picture.

If you weren't announcing, are there any other jobs in the industry that interest you?

I'm knocking off the no's. No to a jockey, too dangerous. No to a trainer, too tough to make a living. I would've said a steward a few years ago, but I don't think so anymore. Probably when the day comes, it will be time to call it quits. If I could buy a nice horse and have a Grade I winner, that would be great. I'd be an owner tomorrow, but you can't guarantee that.

Loch Garman carries an important title for his owner-breeder and trainer, representing the Irish name for Wexford, Jim Bolger's county of birth. Despite being the least experienced in this line-up and racing overseas just eight days after his battling debut success in testing ground over this trip at Navan, his abundant class made all the difference. At Navan, the imposing bay had looked set to be swamped by Ballydoyle's smooth-traveling odds-on favorite Indian Chief (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), but showed resilience to go away from that rival and score by 2 1/4 lengths. Back in 2009, Ballydoyle's Mount Nelson (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) had broken his maiden a week prior to winning this, and Loch Garman followed suit with a relatively impressive change of gear in near-unraceable conditions. Breaking well before being shuffled back to race with only one behind by halfway as Anna's Pearl cut out an honest tempo, the homebred was niggled at by Kevin Manning on the home turn and appeared to have too much to do in early stretch. At the 300-meter marker, the leader looked like a sitting duck for US Law who was traveling best in a stalking second, with Loch Garman apparently floundering when switched wide. Soon after, Christophe Soumillon was starting to send out distress signals on the eventual third as Anna's Pearl kept up a relentless gallop ahead and Loch Garman was beginning his challenge. Finding a surge that none of his rivals could match to make up four lengths, he overhauled the long-time leader in the final yards of a race where none of the patiently ridden rivals managed to make up ground.

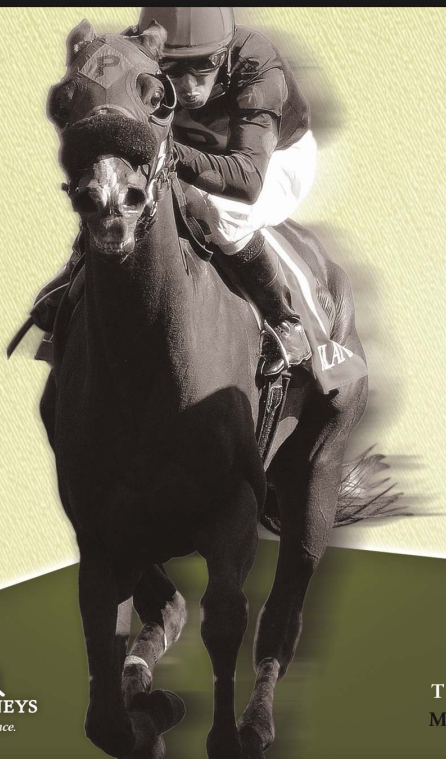

Unlike his cool celebrity owner Omar Sharif, Don Bosco wears his heart on his sleeve and his customary front-running tactics finally paid dividends when recording a first Pattern-race success in Deauville's G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron over 10 furlongs Aug. 11. His stamina ran out when sixth in the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville over an excessive 1 9/16-mile trip 15 days later and he was no more than a sitting duck for his high-class peer Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) when fifth in the G2 Prix Dollar dropped back to an extended nine furlongs at Longchamp last time Oct. 6. Despite his inflated odds, the chestnut benefitted from the enterprise of jockey Flavien Prat to return to winning ways after leading his sole pursuer Evaporation across to the stand's side hedge and refusing to give up his advantage when push came to shove. "He ran a good race in the Prix Dollar and I knew that reverting to a mile would not be a problem, especially in this testing ground," trainer David Smaga explained. "The jockey rode a beautiful race and made the right decision to come wide. He's had a very good season and there is nothing left now, so you will see him again next year."

Lightly raced to this point, the Moyglare homebred has never missed the top three in any of his four starts, following a Cork maiden victory in April with a nine-length demolition of the field in the G3 Gallinule S. going 10 furlongs at The Curragh May 27. He may have been in need of the run when third as the 4-5 chalk in the G3 Kiltiernan S. at Leopardstown Sept. 8, and while today's nine-furlong trip looms as something of a question, he stands out on class. **My Best Brother** (Stormy Atlantic) carries the hopes of America this afternoon. The full brother to GISW Stormello wired one of the divisions of the opening-day Oceanside S. at Del Mar July 18, but couldn't quite repeat that effort in the GII La Jolla H. Aug. 11, missing by a nose to **Old Time Hockey** (Smarty Jones). Dismissed at 6-1 for the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 2 off that near-miss, the bay set a searching pace in that nine-furlong test and held sway by 3/4 of a length.

"He has nice conformation and looks as though he will progress as a 3-year-old," said Brill, who also trains Moustache, a 9,000gns purchase from last year's sale who won the listed Premio Criterium di Pisa just over a month after he was exported to Italy.

A winner over seven furlongs since the catalogue was published, The Obvious Choice was trained by Stuart Williams for Qatar Bloodstock, who bought him at the Craven Breeze-up Sale in April for 65,000gns. Williams regained a horse later in the day when going to 21,000gns for Doctor Parkes (GB), a 6-year-old gelding by Diktat (GB) who has won six sprints.

"A syndicate of my owners wanted a horse to run round on the all-weather this winter. I've paid more than I wanted to for him, but that's been the story of the sale--it's been strong all week," explained Williams. "He's a nice little horse and he's proven on the sand, so hopefully, we can have a bit of fun with him."

Form Bloodstock signed for what may well turn out to be the bargain of the sale. It's little surprise the South African agency was keen to secure the half-sister to the outstanding champion racemare Dancer's Daughter (GB). Named White Flight (GB), the 3-year-old Doyen filly (lot 1388) was sold for 18,000gns and will be exported to South Africa where her sibling won five Group 1 races and a coveted Equus Award in 2009. Out of the Damister mare Reason To Dance (GB), White Flight has yet to register a win, but has finished runner-up in a Lingfield maiden in April. Among her other winning half-siblings is the G3 Somerville Tattersall S. winner Diktatorial (GB). **Cont. p16**

Offered as [lot 1333](#), the 70-rated colt has won four of his 15 starts--

two in Britain for Butler and a pair when trained in Bahrain by Nass, who also bred the bay.

Royal Applause was represented by Wednesday's top lot, Saigon (GB), and he featured among the top lots again Thursday courtesy of [lot 1299](#). Named The Obvious Choice (GB), the juvenile colt will be trained in Italy having been bought by trainer Devis Grilli through Derby Bloodstock for 22,000gns.

With plenty of local trainers getting into the fray on the final day, the international flavour of the sale also continued. Hungarian buyer Torokszentmiklosi Mezogazoasagi signed for Mutamaiz (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}) (lot 1203) for 18,000gns. The half-brother to G3 Chester Vase winner Hattan was runner-up in a Pontefract maiden in early October. Qatari trainer Ibrahim Saeed Al-Malki added two final purchases to his total haul of eight through the week, including the dual-winning 3-year-old Iffraam (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) (lot 1254), sold by Andrew Tinkler for 18,000gns. Over the four days, buyers from more than 30 countries helped to produce a record clearance rate for the sale of 90%. Among the biggest spenders of the week were teams from Dubai, Saudi Arabia, America, Australia and Hong Kong.

While the low-key final day posted a median of just 4,000gns for 137 lots sold for a total of 851,900gns, overall the marathon auction can be regarded as a resounding success. The average and median both rose to 22,839gns (from 19,557gns) and 11,000gns (from 9,000gns), and 38 horses left the ring having achieved a six-figure price, compared to 29 in 2011. "The momentum which began with the October Yearling Sale earlier this month has been well and truly sustained this week and if any further proof were needed as to how highly British and Irish bloodstock is regarded throughout the world, we have witnessed it at Tattersalls this week. The key to the universal appeal of the Autumn Horses in Training Sale is its ability to satisfy so many different requirements. Sprinters, milers, middle distance performers, stayers and potential National Hunt horses - they can all be found here."

After a frenetic month of trading at Tattersalls, calm will descend on Park Paddocks until the two-week December Sale begins Monday, Nov. 26.

DOUBLE-BARRELED BOUNTY

Taylor Made Sales has offered some of the choicest broodmares and broodmare prospects in Kentucky over the past 20 years. In fact, the Taylor brothers can boast of having sold no fewer than five sale toppers at either Keeneland November or Fasig-Tipton November in the last decade. Two were world records at the time, the \$7.1 million Cash Run (Seeking the Gold) at KEENOV 2003, and the \$9 million Ashado (Saint Ballado) at KEENOV 2005, while the others included the \$3.4 million Sharp Lisa (Dixieland Band) at FTKNOV 2006; the \$5.75 million Round Pond (Awesome Again) at FTKNOV 2007; and the \$3 million Hystericalady (Distored Humor) at KEENOV 2008. Going back further, Taylor Made topped KEENOV four times in the 1990s: with the \$2.3 million Tiffany Lass in 1990; the \$1.4 million Cheval Volant in 1991; the \$2.5 million User Friendly (GB) in 1995; and with the \$2.6 million Mariah's Storm--Giant's Causeway was in utero--in 1996.

Taylor Made is now preparing for another vintage year at the bloodstock sales, and comes brandishing a pair of rare jewels--a Horse of the Year in **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam), and a GI Kentucky Oaks heroine in **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro). Havre de Grace sells at Fasig-Tipton's November Sale on Monday as [Hip 76](#), while Plum Pretty will be offered a day later at Keeneland November as [Hip 96](#).

"We've never sold a Horse of the Year, so having Havre de Grace alone would be a first for Taylor Made, but adding an Oaks winner like Plum Pretty is like having a two-headed monster," the consignment's Mark Taylor said yesterday.

Buyers are sure to flock to both mares, as both, in addition to sterling race records, sport very strong pedigrees. Havre de Grace is out of the Carson City mare Easter Bunnette and counts as her second dam Broodmare of the Year Toll Booth. Plum Pretty is out of the A.P. Indy mare Liszy and is a granddaughter of Grade II winner Silent Account.

But it's those race records that attract the most attention.

Havre de Grace garnered Horse of the Year honors in 2011 after winning five of seven starts, including tallies in the GI Apple Blossom, GI Beldame Invitational S. and GI Woodward S. over males. Owned by Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm, she was trained by Larry Jones (at four and five) and Tony Dutrow (at three), and banked over \$2.5 million before being retired earlier this past April with an ankle injury. Also named the 2011 Champion Older Female, Havre de Grace sells as a broodmare prospect.

Taylor said it's been fun marketing the champ, a process that has included the commission of a [video tribute](#) narrated by another Eclipse Award winner in Bill Nack. **Cont. p17**

"I had never met Bill Nack, but I'd seen the pieces he did leading up to the Breeders' Cup, which were great, and we thought Havre de Grace deserved that treatment," said Taylor. "I thought he did an outstanding job. And a lot of credit goes to Patrick Mahan, our marketing director. He's a really talented guy, and the video was kind of his signature marketing job."

Havre de Grace arrived on the Fasig sales grounds yesterday, and Taylor says its evident why she was a star on the track.

"We just got done looking at every horse in the consignment, and it's loaded with graded stakes winners who are all very nice," Taylor said. "She was the last horse we looked at, and when you look at her, you think, 'That's why she can beat the colts. That's why she should do things other horses couldn't do.' She is just in a different league. She's bigger than the other mares, she's stronger than the other mares. And then she's got this eye on her that makes it feel like she's staring right through you. She's so smart; if we could come with an equine IQ test, she'd be Einstein."

Plum Pretty also offers serious credentials. Owned by John Fort's Peachtree Racing Stable and trained by Bob Baffert, she came to Churchill Downs as a 3-year-old last season and won the GI Kentucky Oaks. Later in the year, she dominated the classy It's Tricky (Mineshaft) by 7 1/2 lengths in the GII Cotillion H at Parx. Kept in training at four, she added a second Grade I to her resume this spring by following in Havre de Grace's footsteps with a win in Oaklawn's Apple Blossom. In all, Plum Pretty has earned over \$1.6 million for Fort and company, and Taylor said the filly is a tribute to her owner.

"John Fort buys a beautiful horse," said Taylor. "They all have beautiful, long necks on them--that's kind of his trademark. She's got that, and she's got a beautiful head. She's got great balance for a mare with her length and scope, and she's just very correct. Baffert always said she had bloomed after he'd had her for a while. As she matured, she got better looking, and that's continued even since we got her. We've had her a few months, and every day she's here, she gets better looking. She's a really special mare."

Plum Pretty was given some time after running third in the GII La Troienne S. at Churchill in May, and sells as a racing or broodmare prospect.

"I'm curious to see how people will look at that option and who might elect to return her to the track next season," said Taylor. "She needed a break and she's had that, and the future owners should be able to go to the track, if that's what they want to do."

Not to be outdone, Plum Pretty received her own [video tribute](#) from Taylor Made.

A consignment with such firepower doesn't happen without a strong relationship between buyer and seller, and Taylor he's happy to be selling for two long-time Taylor Made clients.

"We've known Rick Porter for a long time; back since [Grade I winner] Jostle, whom he bought off of us [as a yearling in 1998]," said Taylor. "He and his trainer John Servis bought Rockport Harbor off of us, and we got a lot closer through that experience. Then Rick bought Old Fashioned from us, and we wound up standing him as a sire. We've had a longstanding relationship and we've just gotten closer over the years."

It's a similar story with Fort, who sold the \$625,000 Chimichurri (Elusive Quality) through Taylor Made in 2003. "We got to know John through Chimichurri, and he also bought a nice filly from us named India, who went on to become a graded winner," said Taylor. "We noticed John because of the horses he was buying, and for what they were doing on the race track compared to what he spent on them. He buys gorgeous horses year in and year out, and is a great horseman. It's been a lot of fun."

Over the next few days, expect the good times to continue. -Lucas Marquardt

PAULS MILL ACQUIRES HALF INTEREST IN MINING MY OWN Pauls Mill has acquired a half interest in broodmare **Mining My Own** (Smart Strike), dam of GI Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird (Birdstone) and multiple GI winner Dullahan (Even the Score). Phil and Judy Needham and Bena Halecky retained half ownership of the mare. "It's a privilege to be able to buy into a mare like Mining My Own, and partnering with such great people," said Ben Walden, Jr., owner of Pauls Mill. Mining My Own and her Giant's Causeway colt relocated to Pauls Mill earlier this week. She will be bred to Winstar stallion Bodemeister (Empire Maker) in 2013. "It is remarkable to think that two of her first three foals have either won or run second in the Kentucky Derby," continued Ben Walden, Jr. "She's a special mare. We feel it is a beautiful mating when you consider that both Mine That Bird and Dullahan hail from the Fappiano sireline, as well as Bodemeister who I feel has a real chance to be a breed-shaping sire."

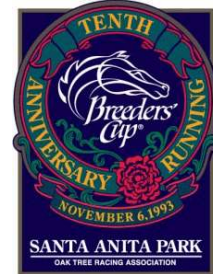
I admit it. I was a little late to the party with my love affair with the great Goldikova, but the diminutive bay filly finally won my heart with her determined victory in the **2009 Mile** (video). Then four, she certainly wasn't the biggest or the flashiest Mile contender parading in the walking ring on that gloriously perfect Southern California day, but she had attitude in abundance as she strode purposefully around the paddock. Goldikova left all that quiet self-assurance stuff in the paddock, though. Out on the track, her rivals heard her loud and clear as she pinned her ears back and unleashed a brilliant near-last-to-first

turn of foot run from the center of the course. She surged past a determined Courageous Cat and on to a half-length victory, earning her second straight Mile title. Goldikova came back a year later at Churchill Downs for a record third Mile triumph. "It's unreal," trainer Freddie Head said at Churchill. "We don't know how good this filly is--she's extraordinary. She's amazing. She can do anything." At both championships, she was upstaged by another superstar mare, but Goldikova's presence and determination, as well as her record-setting three-peat, have made her unforgettable to any true racing fan.

Dead-Heat: The **2003 Juvenile** was one of my best betting coups with minimal handicapping. Not liking either of the New York shippers--Cuvee and Chapel Royal--I settled on a son of Kris S. who had just broken his maiden over track and trip four weeks' prior. Thinking that trainer Richard Mandella was not running him in the Breeders' Cup without a reason, I dropped \$10 across the board on the 26-1 shot and cheered Action This Day home to a total payout of \$429 ([video](#)). He bought a few six packs for the TDN crew.

Having dubbed Zenyatta a "**TDN Rising Star**" following her debut on Thanksgiving 2007, I was thrilled to get a chance to see her in person during the 2008 Breeders' Cup, but few racing moments have given me a bigger thrill than watching the big mare weave her way to **2009**

Classic glory ([video](#)). I screamed myself hoarse, and shed a few tears along the way.

I don't have as many Santa Anita Breeders' Cup memories as my more veteran colleagues, and the ones I do have lean more towards the traumatic than the positive. All I can remember from the 2008 and 2009 Breeders' Cups are bad wagering beats or missteps that cost me dearly. The pain began in the '08 Juvenile Fillies Turf when Heart Shaped lost by a nose to Maram. If the stretch was only a half-stride longer...

Things got a lot worse the following year. Cloudy's Knight was my Marathon horse, and he was beaten a nose at 7-1 after making a crazy premature move. I liked Informed Decision and loved Tapitsfly, but my big play was a pick three connecting those two races with the Juvenile Fillies. I had about half the field to close things out, but, for some reason, didn't like She Be Wild. The nightmare trip that Biofuel had in that race still haunts me to this day. I was torn between Eskendereya and Vale of York as my key horse in the Juvenile and, of course, guessed wrong... The former turned out to be better, though. My friend wanted to kill me after talking him off Dancing in Silks (\$53.60) in the Sprint, and I might not have stopped him at the conclusion of the day. I started the Pick 4 off with Furthest Land (\$44.60) and had Conduit and Goldikova (who didn't?), and was alive to Gio Ponti, Twice Over and Einstein in the Classic. Gio Ponti split horses in midstretch and for a brief second I started to count my money, but then I caught a glimpse of the Moss silks streaking down the outside and knew it was all over ([video](#)). Here's to hoping for a better (personal) ending this year...

I was 15 and watching my first Breeders' Cup when it was held at Santa Anita in 2003. That year's renewal at "The Great Race Place" provided a number of milestone results, with trainer Richard Mandella winning a record four races, two great European fillies (Six Perfections and Islington) stealing their respective grass races, and undefeated 2-year-old champion filly Halfbridled sewing up the Eclipse championship under Julie Krone. For this young race fan, however, the highlight of the day was the thrilling dead heat win of Johar and High Chaparral in the **2003 Turf** ([video](#)). Despite being well-accomplished, the Richard Mandella-trained Johar was largely dismissed at 14-1 with the great depth of European runners lining up against him, including dual-Derby winner and defending champion High Chaparral, and the French-based eight-time Group 1 winner Falbrav. At the wire, it was those three runners in a photo finish, with only a heartbreaking head between Falbrav and a three-way dead heat. This result became all the more impressive to me as I learned more about racing in ensuing years, and came to appreciate the depth of the field lined up for the Turf that year. I hope to soon see another renewal of this great race that truly pits Europe's stars against America's best.

advantage and looks a deserving favorite. The Bob Baffert trainee is five-for-five over the Santa Anita oval and is coming off an easy 3 1/4-length victory in the track's Sept. 29 GI Awesome Again S.

(previously known as the Goodwood). He has hit the board in five of seven starts at the 1 1/4-mile distance, including his runner-up effort behind Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor) after setting the pace in last year's Classic.

Flat Out (Flatter), fifth as the favorite in last year's Classic, just wore down Stay Thirsty (Bernardini) to earn his second GI Jockey Club Gold Cup victory last out at Belmont Sept. 29, and could be rounding back into form after going winless since his 2011 score. The veteran runner has a decided affinity for Belmont, but if the Southern California air agrees with him, his late-running style could make him dangerous in a race filled with horses who like to lie close. The 6-year-old is part of a three-pronged Classic attack for trainer Bill Mott, who upset last year's race with Drosselmeyer. Mott also saddles the up-and-down **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) and **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), who won the track-and-trip GI Santa Anita H. in April but was a dull sixth in the Gold Cup last time out.

Trainer Kathy Ritvo has followed a carefully mapped out campaign leading **Mucho Macho Man** (Mucho Uno) specifically to this race. The 4-year-old millionaire was caught wide before missing by just a neck to To Honor and Serve in the Sept. 1 GI Woodward S. and should be fresh and ready for a big effort at Santa Anita.

The classy **Richard's Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid) has found renewed life since being repatriated to the U.S. this spring. The 7-year-old makes his second start for the Doug O'Neill barn after running into a speed bias when a late-running third in the Awesome Again.

So appealing is this year's running of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile that it has been repositioned to be the penultimate race on championship Saturday, with only the Classic to follow.

And a 'Wise' choice that appears in an 'us-versus-them' sort of match-up. Morton Fink's homebred **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) flies the flag for the United States and looms the first American-based favorite in this event since Leroidesanimaux (Brz), who was second in the 2005 running at Belmont Park won by Artie Schiller. Trained by Charlie

Lopresti, who sent out Turallure (Wando) to a gut-wrenching runner-up finish last year at Churchill, Wise Dan has been virtually unstoppable this season, and would be undefeated but for a tough loss at the hands of Classic hopeful Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) in the GI Stephen Foster H. in June. In addition to his track record-setting performance in the GIII Ben Ali S. on Polytrack in April, he has won each of his three turf starts--a five-length romp over a squishy Saratoga turf in the GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 11, an equally flawless performance in the Sept. 16 GI Woodbine Mile and a dominant score in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 6.

Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) will play Joe Frazier to Wise Dan's Muhammad Ali as he tries to become the fourth straight European-based horse to win the Mile at Santa Anita (2003-Six Perfections, 2008-2009-Goldikova). The best overseas miler not named Frankel, the 4-year-old has put together an outstanding season of his own for owners Tabor, Magnier and Smith, with Group 1 wins in the Prix Jacques le Marois in August and the Queen Elizabeth II S., accounting for G1 Dubai Duty Free S. hero Cityscape (GB) (Selkirk) on both occasions. He was no match for Frankel when runner-up in the G1 Lockinge S. and G1 Queen Anne S., and will make some noise here, provided he sits the right trip.

Freddie Head knows his way around the Breeders' Cup Mile, having guided Miesque to her two wins before orchestrating the Goldikova three-peat from 2008-2010. The Frenchman saddles George Strawbridge's **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), winner of the G1 Maurice de Gheest and G1 Prix du Moulin and narrowly second to Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot. She was no better than fourth to Excelebration in the Marois, but endured a tough passage that afternoon and was beaten just 1 1/2 lengths.

The decision to add 2011 GI Kentucky Derby hero **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) to the Mile adds further intrigue to an already very interesting race. The homebred chestnut was prepping for a run in the G1 Dubai World Cup when he won a Gulfstream turf allowance in his first start off an injury-enforced eight-month absence Feb. 18, but is unraced since. Bringing horses back off this sort of layoff, especially in the Mile, is not unprecedented (see Badge of Silver and Da Hoss), but this is the toughest of asks and he figures to take a disproportionate amount of pari-mutuel action.

BREEDERS' CUP TURF

Phipps Stable homebred **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer) heads into the GI Breeders' Cup Turf as the biggest homegrown hope since English Channel (Smart Strike) captured the \$3-million event in 2007. The progressive 4-year-old has won his last five starts, including a trio of Grade I events in New York. He outfinished a rejuvenated **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) in his latest, the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic over a soggy Belmont course Sept. 29, but prefers to hear his feet rattle, according to trainer Shug McGaughey.

"I've been looking forward to getting him on a good, firm turf course," said the Hall of Famer.

The foreign contingent may not be big in numbers, but it's high in quality. Defending Turf champ **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) is in the fray along with Ballydoyle stablemate Treasure Beach, while His Highness the Aga Khan fields **Shareta (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}) also looms a threat. Second in last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, she paired up wins in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix Vermeille Aug. 23 and Sept. 16, but was undone by the boggy ground at Longchamp for the Oct. 7 Arc and wound up ninth, two spots and three lengths in front of St Nicholas Abbey. "She loves the fast ground and she needs a good pace to show her true worth," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre told *Racing Post* after the Vermeille.

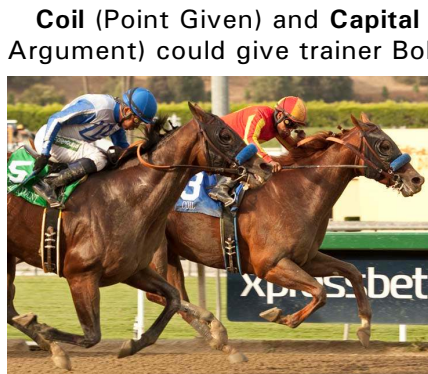

The Bradley homebred has reeled off four straight victories since adding blinkers this term, including a track-record-setting performance in Churchill's GI Humana Distaff S. May 5, defeating defending champion **Musical**

Romance (Concorde's Tune) by 7 1/4 lengths. She earned a gaudy 112 Beyer Speed Figure for the effort while stopping the clock for seven furlongs in a sparkling 1:20.44. Subsequently freshened, Groupie Doll continued her domination with a 3 3/4-length decision in the GII Presque Isle Downs Masters S. Sept. 8, which has produced the last three winners of this contest. Groupie Doll punched her ticket to Southern California with a dazzling 6 1/2-length tally in Keeneland's GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. Oct. 6.

With another step forward, **Dust and Diamonds** (Vindication) could give Groupie Doll a good run for her money here. The lightly campaigned Padua homebred enters riding a three-race winning streak, most recently showing a new dimension when stalking and pouncing in Belmont's 6 1/2-furlong GII Gallant Bloom H. Sept. 22.

Switch (Quiet American), runner-up in the F/M Sprint the past two seasons at Churchill Downs, delivered in Betfair Hollywood's GII A Gleam H. at this distance July 14, but failed to land a blow in a pair of subsequent starts around two turns, including a lackluster seventh in Santa Anita's GI Zenyatta S. Sept. 29.

Shackleford (Forestry), runner-up behind Caleb's Posse (Posse) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, ran a career top in Belmont's GI Metropolitan H. in May, followed by a non-factor eighth in the GI Vanderbilt H. Scratched from the GI Forego with a cough, the Dale Romans trainee came back with a game second behind **Jersey Town** (Speightstown) in the GII Kelso at Belmont Sept. 29. Although the accomplished chestnut appears to be in top form entering the contest, front-running contestants **Fed Biz** (Giant's Causeway) and **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song) will set a difficult pace scenario, and the one-turn specialist will have to overcome the two-turn configuration.

Kaleem Shah's Fed Biz has improved throughout his sophomore season, grinding out a win in Del Mar's El Cajon S. Aug. 31 and, most recently, finished a game third in the 1 1/16-mile GII Indiana Derby at Hoosier Oct. 6. If the Bob Baffert trainee runs a new best, he could top the tote board.

Veteran millionaire **Rail Trip** (Jump Start) will turn back in distance after consecutive fourth-place finishes in the 1 1/4-mile GI Pacific Classic Aug. 26 and the 1 1/8-mile GI Awesome Again S. at Saratoga Sept. 29 and could run considerably better at the mile distance. Jersey Town enters off a career best in the Kelso, and could best the field if he's able to duplicate the effort.

Wild Card...

The speedy **Emcee** could drastically change the shape of the contest depending upon his ability to handle the mile distance. The GI Forego victor has never run over seven panels, and will be faced with the challenge of two turns for the first time.

Juddmonte Farms' Dundonnell (First Defence)

romped and set a Lingfield track record in graduating by a dozen lengths Aug. 4 and proved that effort was no fluke by besting Steeler (Raven's Pass) by 3/4 of a length when going left-handed for the first time in the G3 Acomb S. at York 18 days later. The form of that event was validated when Steeler returned to defeat Godolphin's Artigiano (Distorted Humor) in the G2 Royal Lodge S. at Newmarket Sept. 29, but Dundonnell enters this off a runner-up effort as the odds-on choice in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster Sept. 15. As if he required further endorsement, Dundonnell is out of Family (Danzig), an unraced full-sister to the sensational sire Danehill. Artigiano is one of the more experienced of this bunch and will be making his seventh career appearance. Despite just a maiden win to his credit, he has run well in top company, with a near-miss second to Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in the Aug. 1 G2 Vintage S. prior to his Royal Lodge effort. **George Vancouver** (Henrythenavigator) was runner-up to top European juvenile Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville Aug. 19, but has been slightly disappointing since, with a sixth in the G3 Round Tower S. at The Curragh Sept. 9 and a third to Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. Oct. 13.

Offered from the draft of Think Big Stud, the colt attracted a final bid of \$240,000 from Les Tinkler from Serene Lodge. The well presented youngster is the fourth foal of the Australian and South African Group 1-winning mare Perfect Promise (SAf) (Caesour {Aus}). "He's a lovely big horse," said Les Tinkler. "He is along the same lines as some Fastnet Rock's we've had success with. When you consider the prices that the Fastnet Rock colts were making a few months ago - he looks very good value. He is from a Group 1-winning mare and is broken in and ready to go. He looks a great prospect."

Another colt to sell well later in the session was a colt by Exceed and Excel (Aus) out of Undercover (Aus) (Covetous {Aus}), who realized A\$180,000 from Magic Millions, acting as agent. Expected to head to New South Wales, the chestnut, consigned by Rothwell Park, is from the family of G1 Golden Slipper winner Polar Success (Aus) (Success Express).

Singapore led the way in a strong international market with 46 lots purchased for gross expenditures of over A\$2.7 million. Figures remained relatively on par with last year's figures through the two-day sale and registered a record sales gross of A\$8,795,250 and average price of A\$40,719. The clearance rate for the sale rounded out at over 69%.

“Overall the figures are well in line with last year's record breaking National Horses in Training Sale,” said Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox. “The average is basically the same as last year, down just A\$500 on last year's record, while the clearance is down slightly. Over the two day sale we sold 20 horses for \$100,000 or more--up from 10 last year and that was encouraging.”
