### FORT LARNED WINS CLASSIC SLUGFEST

For Janis Whitham, **Fort Larned** (E Dubai)'s thrilling victory over **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) in Saturday's G1 Breeders' Cup Classic was all in the family. The 4-year-old is a grandson of Bayakoa (Arg) (Consultant's Bid), who carried the Whitham silks to scores in the G1 Breeders' Cup Distaff in 1989 and 1990. "When you have a horse that's getting better and better every time you take him over there, it makes my job easier," said trainer Ian Wilkes, the former assistant to Carl Nafzger, who was saddling his first Breeders' Cup winner. **Who'd Have Thunk It...**

A three-time winner of less than \$80,000 during his 3-year-old season, no one would have expected Fort Larned to become a major player in the older male division when he ran fourth in an overnight handicap at Tampa Bay Downs Feb. 4. He atoned for that defeat with a win in the Challenger S. in Oldsmar Mar. 3, then caught the attention of the racing public with a 12-1 upset in the Gill Skip Away S. at Gulfstream Park Mar. 31. He returned to his Churchill base and ran a cracker when runner-up to Successful Dan (Successful Appeal) while some six lengths clear of Mucho Macho Man in the Gill Alysheba S. May 4, but the wheels came off in the June 16 GI Stephen Foster H. and he finished eighth to Ron the Greek and Wise Dan.

Wilkes wisely went in search of a recovery mission for Fort Larned in the Gill Cornhusker H. at Prairie Meadows just two weeks later, and the colt exorcized whatever demons existed on Foster day, as he romped to a front-running three-length victory over the Charlie Lopresti-trained Successful Dan. From there it was back to the deeper waters of the GI Whitney H. and a rematch with Ron the Greek, Flat Out (Flatter) and company. Dismissed at 7-1 that afternoon, Fort Larned was always prominent, blew the doors off his rivals in the stretch and held off the GI Big 'Cap and Foster winner by 1 1/4 lengths. Then came a crossroads.

"From the Whitney, I had to make a decision how to get him to the Breeders' Cup," Wilkes explained. "I had to make a decision whether to run him in the [GI] Woodward S. or wait eight weeks and freshen him, then go to the [GI] Jockey Club [Gold Cup Sept. 29] and bring him to the Breeders' Cup."

In the end, it was plan 'B,' but Fort Larned caught a wet Belmont main track that was holding speed and he could do no better than third to Flat Out, beaten 5 1/2 lengths. But, cut from the same patient cloth as his mentor Nafzger, Wilkes didn't panic, knowing that his colt would have gotten plenty out of the effort on Long Island without squeezing the lemon dry. It was a plan that would ultimately lead to Classic perfection.

### Them's the Breaks...

Trainer Bob Baffert stressed to NBC's Kenny Rice how important the break was to the chances of favored **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again), looking to give the conditioner his first Classic success. The last-out winner of the GI Awesome Again S., a gut-wrenching runner-up in the 2011 Classic, was a touch slow to start and was taken hold of by Rafael Bejarano. Fort Larned, on the other hand, departed without incident and was able to assume command readily, as Mucho Macho Man and **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) pressed from the outside. Game On Dude was much further back than is his custom and out on the track, one which played kindly to speed types and those that raced nearer the inside.

Positions were largely unchanged as they passed the six-furlong pole in :46.50, but sensing that the race might be getting away from him, Bejarano asked Game On Dude for a bit of run leaving the 7/16ths marker. The response was instantaneous, and it looked for a few strides like the 5-year-old would loop Fort Larned and Mucho Macho Man and make it a three-way battle for supremacy. But the burst of energy lasted only about a sixteenth of a mile, and the two at the head of affairs separated themselves and would decide the outcome. Fort Larned and birthday boy Brian Hernandez Jr. remained glued to the golden rail, repelled one final bid from Mucho Macho Man in the final 70 yards and prevailed in a driving finish.

"We had to be there near the front and he was ready today," Wilkes commented. "He had galloped great over the track. I knew we were good when he broke sharp. That's where Brian [Hernandez] won the race. We broke sharp and Game On Dude broke bad. I trust Brian because the horse trusts Brian."

Kathy Ritvo, trainer of the runner-up, was gracious in defeat.

"What can you do? He ran a winning race," she said. "The other horse [Fort

Larned] was a great horse today. He ran a great race. Congratulations to Mr. Wilkes and his whole team. I'm so proud of my horse. He gave 100 percent today."

There was disappointment for Baffert, now winless in 10 tries in the Classic.

"I think the first eighth of a mile cost him the race," he offered. "He wants to be right up there near the front and when he wasn't, that was it for him. It was unfortunate. It was a tough day for me, but I've had tougher. A few minutes ago Joe Torre [part owner of Game On Dude] told me that you've got to forget it. Things that happened five seconds ago, you've got to let them go and move on. That's what will happen."

## DAN IS THE MAN

Morton Fink's homebred **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) completed a fairy-tale season that could well end in a Horse of the Year award, coming from just off the pace to set a new course record in winning the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), making his first start since winning a Gulfstream

allowance in February, overcame trouble at the head of the stretch and flew home for second, just ahead of **Obviously (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}). **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), the much-ballyhooed raider

who played second fiddle to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) for much of this season, had a clean trip, but couldn't kick late and settled for fourth. "He proved he was the best horse today," trainer Charlie Lopresti said of the winner. "I never had any doubts. I was just a little concerned about how the race would shape up. He's just a special horse. We'll probably take him back to our farm in Kentucky and give him some time. We'll make a plan for him at the first of the year."

## If At First You Don't Succeed...

Saturday marked Wise Dan's second trip to the Breeders' Cup, having finished sixth, beaten just 2 1/2 lengths, in the 2010 GI Sprint at Churchill won by Big Drama (Montbrook). Victorious in the GI Clark H. last November, the athletic chestnut returned to set a Keeneland track record in winning the GIII Ben Ali S. Apr. 22, then just failed to catch Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) in the GI Stephen Foster H. on dirt June 16. He returned to the grass for his three most recent starts, overcoming ease in the ground for a five-length tally in the GII Fourstardave H. at Saratoga Aug. 11 ahead of a 3 1/4-length score in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 16. Lopresti opted for one more run ahead of the Cup, and targeted the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland Oct. 6. With Joze Lezcano subbing for John Velazquez, he was forced to go overland, but came home 2 1/4 lengths better than **Willcox Inn** (Harlan's Holiday).

Obviously, last-out winner of the GII Arroyo Seco Mile here Sept. 29, was fast away and was allowed a fairly easy time of it up front, getting his opening quarter in :23.34 and a half in :46.16. Wise Dan was tucked in neatly in third, with Excelebration in touch from fourth. John Velazquez began to ask Wise Dan to lengthen his stride and he took closer order entering the stretch, collared Obviously leaving the eighth pole and edged away late. Animal Kingdom had just one behind at the quarter pole and closed well to be second best.

The Vaccarezza family's **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps), a Grade I winner this year at nine and 10 furlongs, presented trainer Dale Romans with a Breeders' Cup conundrum. Enter the Mile as one of the likely pacesetters or go for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, only a handful of weeks after the gelding flopped in deep ground behind **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer) in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Sept. 29. **Mike'd Up...**

A dual Grade III winner at four, Little Mike resumed from an eight-month absence to take consecutive starts at Gulfstream, including the Sunshine Millions Turf Jan. 28, but faltered in fourth in defense of his title in the GIII Canadian Turf S. Mar. 3. In a season full of surprises, Little Mike wired the field at 12-1 in the GI Turf Classic on the Derby undercard May 5 before finishing a pacesetter third in the GI Shoemaker Mile S. at Hollywood Park June 30. The pundits said 'no' when Romans put the 5-year-old in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 18, but they let him steal away on a soft pace and, with Ramon Dominguez piloting for the first time, he outsprinted the field to score by 1 1/2 lengths. With his Breeders' Cup future in the balance, he attempted 12 panels for the first time in the Hirsch, but the bog-like conditions didn't suit and he'd run his race by the six-furlong pole.

**The Right Choice...**

Most thought Little Mike would not be able to see out the Turf trip, but Romans dropped his name in the entry box nevertheless. Gifted a perfect sit from third as

**Turbo Compressor** (Halo's Image) and **Optimizer** (English Channel) showed the way through solid fractions up front, Little Mike galloped along comfortably, conserving energy every way while covered up behind those two front runners. Japanese raider **Trailblazer** (Jpn) (Zenno Rob Roy {Jpn}), who was able to work out a good trip from the 12 hole, launched his bid going reasonably well approaching the head of the stretch, but Little Mike was traveling equally sweetly just underneath that one. He was

able to pinch a break, disposed of Trailblazer and held favored Point of Entry in the run to the judge. Defending champion **St Nicholas Abbey** (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) ran on well for third.

"Our first reaction after the race in New York [Turf Classic] was to shorten him up, but he had been trying to stretch him out all year so we decided to stick to our plan," Romans acknowledged. "We talked over the race last night and thought those two horses [Turbo Compressor and Optimizer] would be gunning for the lead. We were going to try to sit right off of them. He showed he could rate."

**SHANGHAI WINS JUVENILE BOB-BY**

It would be an interesting study to see what Betfair odds-in-running were as **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday) reached the quarter pole of Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He looked every bit a spent animal as they came at him from all directions, but, roused sharply by Rosie Napravnik, the Starlight runner re-broke and held off a luckless **He's Had Enough** (Tapit) to score by a head. **Capo Bastone** (Street Boss) rallied from the tail to be third. **Cont. p8**

Shanghai Bobby did what few, if any to win this race have done previously—debut as early as Apr. 19 with a four-length victory over 4 1/2 panels at Aqueduct. With few opportunities in the interim, the dark bay validated 1-2 favoritism with a one-length success in Belmont's Track Barron S. June 27, but was the 2-1 second choice behind ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Fortify (Distorted Humor) in the GII Hopeful S. at Saratoga Sept. 3. He defeated that Godolphin runner by 3 3/4 lengths and turned in the best performance of his career to this point last time out, taking the GI Champagne S. by five lengths at Belmont Park Oct. 6. In the last 3 1/2 Breeders' Cups at Santa Anita, the Todd Pletcher barn had gone winless from 24 runners, but Shanghai Bobby was the 7-5 chalk to snap that dubious streak.

**Fast and Furious...**

Perhaps a half-step slow at the break, Shanghai Bobby was actually first under the wire the first time, but was in a line of three into the first turn, as **Title Contender** (Pulpit) pushed through at the fence to lead

following an opening quarter mile in a punishing :22.28. Still a stalking second as they passed the 4 1/2-furlong marker in a swift :45.55, the Pletcher runner was given his head by Napravnik and went for home fully three furlongs from the wire. By the time he reached the head of the stretch, he was two lengths clear of a

developing traffic jam behind him, but was sending out serious signs of distress. He's Had Enough, stymied in behind a weakening Title Contender exiting the turn, took dead aim on Shanghai Bobby and may even have gotten narrowly in front around the eighth pole, but the favorite took hold of the bit and battled bravely to the line.

"He outran the one horse [Title Contender] way too early, because once he gets to the lead, he gets a little bit lost," commented Napravnik, the first female to win the Juvenile. "I was worried at that point, because he just came to a walk. I was hoping those horses would come up to him sooner than later. They did, and he kicked on again. He's a terrific horse."

Trinniberg was coming off a narrow defeat in the \$300,000 Gallant Bob S. at Parx Sept. 22. Shivananda Parbhoo had just taken over training duties from his father Bisnath, and opted to put blinkers on the speedy colt. The powerfully built colt came away strongly and settled into a good rhythm while pressing Sum of the Parts (Speightstown) through a :21.41 opening quarter. The Lumber Guy sat just off that pair, and defending champion Amazombie (Northern Afleet) was also up close while four wide. Trinniberg forged ahead despite a demanding :43.73 half, and The Lumber Guy loomed the biggest danger as a phalanx of challengers fanned wide off the turn. But Trinniberg kept on strongly to stop the clock in a sizzling 1:07.98, with The Lumber Guy staying on to be a clear second.

"I added blinkers today because I thought in his last few races he had lost confidence, but we never lost our confidence in him," Parbhoo said immediately after the race. "I knew he would be in front at the eighth pole, and that's why I added the blinkers. This is awesome."

Trinniberg, runner-up in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. and GII Nashua S., finished seventh in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint. He kicked off 2012 with a pair of sharp one-turn wins in the GIII Swale S. and GIII Bay Shore S., but the Parbhoo's chose to follow the GI Kentucky Derby dream. After chasing Bodemeister (Empire Maker) to no avail, Trinniberg resurfaced by capturing the GII Woody Stephens S. at Belmont June 9, but he was caught near the wire and settled for second at 1-5 in Calder's GII Carry Back S. July 7. He lost a shoe behind during his GI King's Bishop S. loss Aug. 25, and his losing streak continued at Parx.

"After the race in Saratoga, a lot of people come to me and they tell me, 'Hey, you running this horse too much. He needs time off,'" Parbhoo recalled. "I told them, 'Listen, there is no problem with this horse. He doesn't have a problem, and there is no way for me to give up.' Last year when we came to the Breeders' Cup it was all to sightsee. This year I came to the Breeders' Cup, I told everybody it's all business. Dream come true."

Trinniberg, a \$1,500 FTKOCT yearling before selling to the Parbhoo's for \$21,000 at OBSAPR, has boosted the value of his younger sisters. Full-sibling Ostourah was an \$80,000 yearling at FTKOCT before blossoming into a \$450,000 FTMMAY juvenile; she recently broke her maiden at Belmont. ## Flawless in Last Five...

Third behind an in-form Awesome Maria (Maria's Mon) and now two-time GI Ladies' Classic winner Royal Delta (Empire Maker) in the GIII Sabin S. going two turns Feb. 25 and behind reigning Filly/Mare Sprint victress and champion **Musical Romance** (Concorde's Tune) in the seven-furlong GII Inside Information S. at Gulfstream Park, Groupie Doll added blinkers for Keeneland's GI Vinery Madison S. Apr. 12. The result: a three-length romp, and the rest, they say, is history. The chestnut returned to dirt for the GI Humana Distaff S.

at Churchill May 5 and was arguably the most impressive horse on Derby Day, besting Musical Romance by better than seven lengths with a 112 Beyer. Given the summer off with an eye on the tail end of the season, she was an easy winner of the GII Presque Isle Downs Masters S. Sept. 8 and prepped for this with a 6 1/2-length score over **Strike the Moon** (Malibu Moon) in the GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. at Keeneland.



**At Her Dominant Best...**

Musical Romance was actually one of the first away, but was soon displaced by Dust and Diamonds and ultimately **Teddy's Promise** (Salt Lake), a Grade I winner over this track and distance, who covered the opening quarter mile in :22.23. Groupie Doll, busily ridden by design was trapped out six off the fence at one point, but was able to drop down a couple of paths as they raced into the turn. Still four deep on the turn, she went past **Turbulent Descent** (Congrats) and had the dueling pacesetters in the cross-hairs. Teddy's Promise dropped away relatively tamely once the real running started and Dust and Diamonds offered some resistance, but Groupie Doll proved far too classy and won it by a widening margin. Switch, runner-up in 2010 and 2011, rallied from last to round out a chalky trifecta.

"There were several scenarios that could have unfolded," said winning jockey Rajiv Maragh. "One that I didn't want to see was Dust and Diamonds on an easy lead. When I saw that she wasn't, it let us sit back and be more patient. She's done that all year and now done that on the biggest stage."

Musical Romance was able to get down onto the fence by the time they reached the bend, but was one-paced late and sixth in her title defense. "She broke good and she was able to save some ground," said her trainer and co-owner Bill Kaplan. "She made a move on the inside, but she didn't have it today."

**'ZAR OF CALIFORNIA**

**Tapizar** (Tapit) was always regarded as a colt with a lot of potential, but for injuries and inconsistency, had never broken into racing's upper echelon. That all changed yesterday, as the Winchell Thoroughbreds homebred put up a sensational effort to account for a first top-level success in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. "It feels great," said the stable head Ron Winchell. "Especially with a homebred, and a homebred by Tapit, who is horse we raced and currently own. He did Tapit proud. We've been in many Breeders' Cup races, and our best finish was a second. So it felt nice to better that today."

## Early Promise

Tapizar, a tired fifth in last year's Dirt Mile, looked sharp winning the GII San Fernando S. over this strip in January, but faltered in fourth as the heavy choice in the GII Strub S., and could do no better than second to Alternation (Distorted Humor) in the GIII Razorback H. at Oaklawn in March. That prompted another absence, but in his return in the 1 1/16-mile West Virginia Governors S. at Mountaineer Aug. 4, he earned a big figure winning by 4 1/2 lengths. The rollercoaster ride continued in his final prep for this--he tired to last in the GII Kelso H. at Belmont Sept. 29--but his connections kept the faith. It was a bad start for one of the expected pacesetters as **Shackleford** (Forestry) bobbed, but not so for Tapizar, who was hustled out and soon put on the hip of the pacesetting favorite **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song). They tore through an opening quarter in :22.77 before settling it down a bit for a half in :46.58. **Mizdirection** (Mizzen Mast) became the 15th filly in Breeders' Cup history, and first since Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) won the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, to beat the boys with her late-running victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. The gray filly, co-owned by sports talk show host Jim Rome, also overcame the longest layoff in the championship's history. The Turf Sprint was Mizdirection's first start since running second in the Great Lady M. S. at Hollywood Park May 27. "It was absolutely awesome," Rome said in the winner's circle while accepting the trophy.

## Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint cont.

Mizdirection had connections thinking Breeders' Cup when she started 2012 with a pair of victories over Santa Anita's quirky downhill turf course, first taking the Jan. 2 GIII Monrovia S. before adding the Feb. 25 Clockers' Corner H. She added the Apr. 14 off-the-turf Las Cienegas H. before going to the sidelines after her runner-up finish in the Great Lady M.

Mizdirection, 20-1 on the morning line, was bet down to 6-1. She settled in mid-pack as European invader Starspangledbanner (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}) sprinted out to the early lead. The pacesetter set fractions of :21.11 and :42.39, but began to tire in upper stretch and was overtaken first by Reneesgotzip and then by favored Unbridled's Note. Meanwhile, Mike Smith tipped Mizdirection to the outside and the filly closed relentlessly down the center of the course and forged past Unbridled's Note in the final strides.

Smith, who on Friday became the winningest jockey in Breeders' Cup history, said trainer Mike Puype's confidence in Mizdirection gave him plenty of confidence in the filly. "When we came across the dirt, I had a lot of ground to make up, but I was really confident I could," Smith commented.

Puype added, "She ran like a true champion, to lose that much ground and still beat a field as talented as this."

Mizdirection was purchased by Litt Bloodstock for \$85,000 at Keeneland September in 2009. She was bought back by Alex Solis, Jr. for \$50,000 out of the following year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale.

Explaining how Mizdirection's ownership group came together, Solis said, "The first time I saw her was in Keeneland in September and I liked her, but my partner Jason Litt deserves the credit. I thought she was heavy in the shoulder, and I said let's buy her for someone else. Jason said, 'I'm going to go ahead and buy her,' and it worked out. The ownership that had her were getting a horse, they put her through a sale and I told Jason, I'm going to buy her back. She had no reason to go to the 2-year-old sale, so she wasn't prepped. I bought her from Justin Casse and we sent her to California the next day, and she broke her maiden the second time out impressively. Mike [Puype] called Jim and said you need to buy a piece of this filly and the rest is history."

"I talked to Bobby Flay on my show earlier in the week and I said, 'You've been there before, you know what it's like,'" Rome recalled Saturday. "And he said, 'Outside of the birth of my daughter, it was the most exhilarating feeling in my life.' I would say the same, but I'm too numb to know how it feels. If you would ask me tomorrow I would have a better idea. I've got a feeling my answer might be close to his."

As for what is next for Mizdirection, co-owner Bill Strauss said, "She's coming back. I want this feeling again and again and again. It's just an amazing feeling. My voice is gone, I was tired, sweating, I felt like I rode the horse and won the race myself. It's an exhausting feeling, but there is no feeling like it for that exact second."



## 'GEORGE' NAVIGATES SANTA ANITA TURF

His sire came up one slot short here in the 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but **George Vancouver** (Henrythenavigator) made daddy proud to break through at the highest level and give his connections back-to-back victories in this event. A third-out winner over the Dundalk polytrack in July, the bay came up just 3/4 of a length short of undefeated Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) in Deauville's G1 Prix Morny Aug. 19. A disappointing sixth with some trouble in The Curragh's G3 Round Tower S. Sept. 9, George Vancouver was stretching out off a third in Newmarket's G1 Dewhurst S. three weeks ago.

Ryan Moore shifted his mount into neutral as he waited for a seam, and as soon as he saw daylight past the eighth pole, he exploded to a convincing success. Chad Brown trainees Noble Tune and Balance the Books filled out the trifecta; while shortest-priced European Dundonnell (First Defence), who appeared to make things tight on Brown

Almighty (Big Brown) when he came in and the winner came out in the lane.

"This is great," said winning conditioner Aidan O'Brien, who upset this race last year with Wrote (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in a similar-looking performance. "Ryan gave him an absolutely brilliant ride." Moore offered, We were in a nice position the entire way. He traveled very well and quickened when he needed to. Everything worked out." European-trained runners have now won four of the six renewals of this race.

Chad Brown said of his runners, "They ran great. They ran into a really good horse today. These horses, I would say, tied for second-best. One beat the other for second. They trained close. Everyone has watched them breeze in New York, and they all know they are noses apart and they ran that way. I'm thrilled for both clients that they ran well." Noble Tune was coming off a victory in Belmont's Gill Pilgrim S. Oct. 8, while Balance the Books took the Gill Bourbon S. a day earlier.

George Vancouver is the last foal from MGISW Versailles Treaty, who finished runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff in both 1991 and 1992. She was purchased by Gaines-Gentry, agent for \$475,000 in foal to Unbridled's Song at the 2008 Keeneland January Sale as part of the dispersal of the late Cynthia Phipps's bloodstock.

**Friday Figures Down**

Figures from Friday's first day of the 2012 Breeders' Cup championships were down from 2011. Attendance at Santa Anita Friday was 34,619--down from the 40,677 who attended the Friday card at Churchill Downs a year ago. The attendance figure was also down slightly from the 37,651 who attended the Friday card the last time the championships were held at Santa Anita in 2009.

The total common-pool handle for Friday's 10-race card was \$47,586,765, down 5% from the \$50,053,505 bet last year on Championship Friday at Churchill Downs. A total of \$48,439,438 was bet on the 2009 Friday card at Santa Anita. The on-track handle at Santa Anita Friday was \$7,298,174, compared to \$7,097,789 at Santa Anita in 2009.

"Considering the effects of Hurricane Sandy and the difficult circumstances for much of the East Coast, to be within 5% of last year's total handle is a success," said Ken Kirchner, Breeders' Cup Senior Wagering Consultant.

**Saturday Stats Also Decline**

Preliminary numbers released by the Breeders' Cup Saturday show that the total two-day common-pool handle for the event was \$144,272,332, a decline of 10.7% over the corresponding figure from 2011. Handle totals were in line with expectations based on interruptions in service at many East Coast pari-mutuel outlets due to Hurricane Sandy. Attendance for Saturday's nine-race program was 55,123, bringing the two-day attendance total to 89,742, a decrease of 15.2% from last year. "We were witness to two days of amazing athletic performances by the world's best Thoroughbreds with winners from the east, midwest, South America, Europe and California and seven winners this weekend from our Breeders' Cup Challenge series," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Craig Fravel. "We are gratified by the continued strong interest of racing fans in Southern California and around the world in the Breeders' Cup," Fravel added. "We want to thank our guests, all of the breeders, owners, trainers and jockeys who competed, our hosts at Santa Anita Park, and the entire greater Los Angeles community for another excellent edition of the World Championships."

## Royal Delta 'Great' After Ladies' Classic

Trainer Bill Mott confirmed Saturday **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) was doing "G-R-E-A-T with an exclamation point," a day after her emphatic victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic. The 4-year-old was unexpectedly on the lead Friday. "That certainly wasn't the plan, but it was part of the plan," Mott said. "The plan was to let her run where she's comfortable, and she was comfortable in that spot. We didn't know exactly what position she was going to be in, but we thought that there would perhaps be a horse or two there. And certainly we thought that **Questing (GB)** (Hard Spun) would go for the lead, but she didn't show up on the day."

Questing, who had been expected to be on the lead in the Ladies' Classic, suffered a contusion near her left eye before being pulled up in the race, according to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, but otherwise appears fine.

Trainer Richard Mandella was happy with how GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) exited her Friday victory. "It's all good today," Mandella said. "I spoke to [jockey] Garrett [Gomez] by phone prior to the races yesterday and told him I thought she'd make the lead pretty handily and that I didn't think any of them would want to run with her. The issue was getting her to settle and, the way it worked out, Garrett sure got her to do that."

**Zagora (Fr)** (Green Tune) was also doing well after her victory in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. "For her to be my first Grade I winner last year [in the Diana H.] and to win a race of this magnitude, she'll always have a special place in our barn," admitted trainer Chad Brown. "My entire staff just loves the filly and we're proud of her."

Defending champion Boisterous was odds-on here following his success at even-money in the GIII Knickerbocker H. at Belmont Oct. 13, and confirmed his status as the second-best turf horse in Shug McGaughey's barn here. He was content to settle in third as Bombaguaia (Borrego) set a tepid pace over the Sandy-softened Aqueduct course. After a mile in 1:43.23, Boisterous was guided to the clear by jockey Edgar Prado and put the race to bed in a matter of strides. "He had a great trip," said assistant trainer Buzz Tenney. "Edgar had him in a perfect spot and when it was time, he kicked in. He's a nice horse." Prior to his second straight win in the Knickerbocker, Boisterous was an uncharacteristic ninth in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 18. "He wasn't beaten that badly, but I think he's the kind of horse who appreciates the fall weather more than the summer heat," Tenney offered. "I believe this will be the last race of the year for him. We'll take him down to Florida and bring him back in the spring, just like last year."

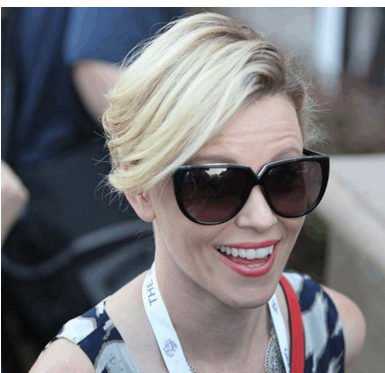



**FORMER CUP WINNERS CLASH IN MELBOURNE**

Last year's Melbourne Cup hero **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}), fresh off a victory in the G1 Caulfield Cup three weeks ago, drew barrier 16 when the field was drawn yesterday for this year's edition of Australia's richest race. Dunaden is undefeated in Australia, and also added the G1 Hong Kong Vase to his resume after last year's win. "I'm happy, the horse looks well," trainer Mikel Delzangles told Racenet.com.au. "He can't be better. I think the Caulfield Cup has been good for him, I think he might have improved on that. I think he's better than last year, definitely, but he has to be 4kg better. It will make it much harder for us." Dunaden will once again meet the second and fourth-place finishers in last year's Melbourne Cup, **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) and **Americain** (Dynaformer), who was the winner in 2010 but faltered last year under high weight. Red Cadeaux missed victory in the A\$6-million race last year by the shortest of margins, finishing second to Dunaden by a nostril while carrying two fewer pounds. Red Cadeaux could benefit from a greater break in the weights this year, and exits from barrier 18. Americain will shoulder the same 128 pounds he did last year, and will attempt to reverse the result of the Caulfield Cup, where he was a fast-finishing fourth behind Dunaden off a two month layoff. Americain will exit from barrier 12, and secures the services of two-time Melbourne Cup-winning jockey Damien Oliver.

Brookdale Farm has had a year to remember with a pair of alums stealing the show through the springtime Classics, and the hope is the dream season will

culminate with fireworks at the Fasig-Tipton November sale in Lexington. The Versailles, Kentucky farm, acting as agent, presents only two during Monday's single-session sale, but what it lacks in numbers, the operation more than makes up for

in quality. Scheduled to enter the ring early will be [Hip 15](#), Arch's Gal Edith (Arch--Force Five Gal, by Pleasant Tap), offered on behalf of Harvey Clark. Clark, who has boarded the mare at Brookdale since 2005, is the breeder of her most famous offspring, two-time Classic winner I'll Have Another (Flower Alley).

"We've had Arch's Gal Edith at the farm since she was three," confirmed Brookdale's Joe Seitz. "She raced once and she got hurt after kicking the wall in the stall, so she was retired."

A minor winner on the track, the \$80,000 OBS March purchase more than made up for it in the breeding shed, having already produced I'll Have Another, victorious in the first two legs of this season's Triple Crown--the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. The chestnut also took the GII Robert B. Lewis S. and GI Santa Anita Derby.

Trying to become the first Triple Crown winner since Affirmed in 1978, the colt was forced into retirement after showing early signs of injury on the eve of the GI Belmont S.

The 10-year-old mare is offered in foal to first season sire, champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat).

"If his offspring can run like he did, it would be wonderful," said Seitz of the Castleton Lyons stallion, who also shuttles to Arrowfield Stud in Australia. "He is unproven, this is his first year, so we'll have to wait and see, but he is a definitely a quality horse."

Arch's Gal Edith's first two foals are Those Wer the Days, a colt by Thunder Gulch, who accounted for five of seven career starts, while the second is When Will When, a colt by Soto, winner of half of his four starts.

"The two foals before I'll Have Another were both useful horses," said Seitz. "[Arch's Gal Edith] has been really good to her owner, Harvey Clark and to us, too. We also raised and sold I'll Have Another at Keeneland September two years ago [\$11,000 KEESEP]."

The mare's most recent foal is an unraced 2-year-old daughter of Tapit.

"They don't really look alike, it's apples to oranges, but they both have a lot of quality to them," said Seitz.

Almost book ending the sale for the Brookdale team will be [Hip 176, Untouched Talent](#) (Storm Cat--Parade Queen, by A.P. Indy), winner of the GIII Sorrento S. and runner-up in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. and the GI Darley Alcibiades S. The 8-year-old mare is offered on behalf of the Virginia-based Audley Farm. With only a single horse to race thus far, the mare is nonetheless well represented, having produced GISW and the Classic-placed Bodemeister (Empire Maker).

"They realized that it would be a good business decision to sell her now, so she's in the sale for all the right reasons," said Seitz, explaining the decision to sell. "Everything she touches turns to gold."

A \$310,000 KEESEP yearling in 2005, Untouched Talent blossomed into a \$500,000 Barretts March juvenile. Offered as a breeding/racing prospect at this venue in 2006, she realized a final bid of \$850,000. Like fine wine, she continued to improve with age, and Audley Farm stepped in to secure the mare--who was in foal to Unbridled's Song--for \$1.3-million at Keeneland November in 2007. The mare sells in foal to Unbridled's Song.

"She looks a lot like her father Storm Cat," said Seitz. "She's wide through the chest, her markings are similar and she's very attractive. She is a graded stakes winner and Grade I placed and she is carrying a 3/4-brother to Bodemeister, so everything on her page just shouts appeal."

Her first foal, an Unbridled's Song colt, died before having the chance to show his ability, however, her next foal showed some promise early. Sold to Zayat Stables for \$260,000 at the 2006 Keeneland September, Bodemeister went on to finish runner-up in the GI San Felipe S. before taking the GI Arkansas Derby in April. Heavily supported in the spring Classics, the powerful dark bay ironically gained much of his fame for his brilliant runner-up finishes behind I'll Have Another in the Derby and Preakness.

Not likely to give away any more bargains after Bodemeister's Triple Crown run, Audley offered a yearling filly by Smart Strike at this year's Keeneland September sale and the breeder was amply rewarded with a \$1.3-million final bid from Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura and Bruce Lunsford, making her the highest priced filly at this year's sale.

"It was good timing and it is just about the best advertising you could ever have in the commercial arena when the offspring of a mare sells at the highest level of the market," said Seitz of the yearling's sale. "It's a great advertisement. Untouched Talent was entered before the filly sold in September, so we might not have known that [the Smart Strike yearling] would have turned out as nice as she did, so I can't really say we predicted that."

However, it appears unlikely that Untouched Talent's progeny will come in under the radar in the future.

"They all have a huge walk to them," said Seitz of the mare's progeny. "If you line them all up side-by-side, you would say they all resemble their sires. But they all have a very athletic walk to them, so I think that what she adds to the equation."

Seitz points out the most ringing endorsement for the prized mare is her millionaire son, who was retired to stud over the summer.

"Bodemeister's year has been great," added Seitz. "He got a lot of exposure this year and there has been quite a bit of promotion around him going to WinStar to stand stud, so that's helped keep him fresh in everyone's mind. There has been quite a bit of fanfare around Bodemeister, so that has obviously helped this mare. That bodes well for next week."

# From the Publisher

In the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy, the New York Stock Exchange shut down for two days for the first time since 1888. The New York Subway system completely stopped running. Buses and trains sat idle in the station. The federal government shut down. AT&T provided no cell phone service to my area, my kids' schools will be closed for at least two weeks, and I got my first mail in five days yesterday. (Whatever happened to 'neither rain, nor sleet nor dark of night?')

Really, there was only one thing produced in New York or New Jersey that didn't shut down during Hurricane Sandy: the TDN. And that is thanks to some truly heroic efforts from our truly amazing staff.

For those of you who didn't realize it, the TDN is produced on the Jersey Shore, a stone's throw from Monmouth Park. We're in the small city of Red Bank, just about three miles from all of the horrific pictures you're seeing on TV right now, near towns like Sea Bright, which have been completely devastated. In the days leading up to the storm, weathermen kept zeroing in on just where the swells would be highest and winds would be hardest, and it made us all a little nervous when they would draw an arrow right at the little peninsula between the Navesink and Shrewsbury Rivers, just inland from Sandy Hook and South of New York Harbor...right where our homes and office sit.

It was Breeders' Cup week, with Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland November just around the corner, and not publishing this week would have been economically catastrophic, nothing anyone wants to think about during our already economically catastrophic times.

Monday morning, hurricane day, only those of us closest to the office came in, with others working from home. The hurricane wasn't expected to hit until later in the day, and we wanted to get as much done as possible before we lost power. Advertising director Alycia Borer, Editor-In Chief Jessica Martini, Director of Distribution Sarah Andrew and I worked until about 3, and I almost had to drag every one of them out the door. The trees were bent almost to the ground under the hurricane-force winds, and all three of them asked me why they couldn't work right up until the power went out.

When the power finally did go out that night, Lucas Marquardt, who lives in Lexington, took over, finishing that day's edition and the next virtually single-handedly. It's a lot for the daily staff of 18 or so people to get out a paper, and Lucas did it alone.

When there was no power by Tuesday, IT director Robert Williams reconnected with an old friend on Facebook who had bought a B & B about an hour and a half away from the office in New Egypt, New Jersey. He snagged all of the remaining rooms for the staff, set up some office space and relocated our office there, managing to put out the next couple of editions from the B&B. A true stroke of genius, and innovation above and beyond what anyone could ever expect from any staffer.

Alycia, Jessica, Lia Kusch, Alan Carasso, Kelsey Riley, Christina Bossinakis and Amanda Crelin all left their homes and families at the height of the crisis to go work at the temporary center, putting out two of the biggest editions of the year in less-than-ideal circumstances. They're unbelievably dedicated. Robert left his wife, children, and brand-new baby boy to do so. I think Alycia and her advertising staff have worked about 12 days in a row. In fact, I think the whole staff has.

Marie Kizenko, powerless in downtown New York City, moved in with friends uptown so she could keep working, and turned out a beautiful Breeders' Cup preview section, along with her usual impeccable work. Brian DiDonato, with no power in flooded Jersey City, drove up to Connecticut to his family's home, and not only kept on working, but handicapped well enough to turn a big profit for his followers over the two Breeders' Cup days.

Steve Sherack, slated to fly out to cover the Breeders' Cup for us, endured flight cancellation after flight cancellation and braved horrific crowds at the airport, but finally made it to L.A., where his words and pictures have beautifully brought the event home to us.

Sarah Andrew, who lives a couple of blocks from the office, kept everyone informed of the situation in Red Bank, and got the doors unlocked when the power finally came back on Friday. Gary King sweet-talked the Red Bank police into letting TDN staffers work past the 7:00 curfew as only an Irishman can do. Justina Severni drove home to Connecticut to work remotely, and when power came back on in the office, drove back home to New Jersey, even though it meant returning to a cold and dark house, just so she could be there to work on Breeders' Cup weekend.

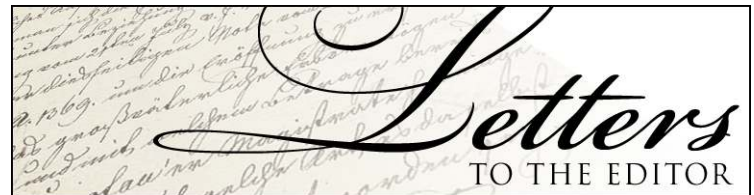
All in all, there wasn't anyone who didn't go to heroic measures to bring our customers the TDN every day, going so far above and beyond what others would consider a normal effort that it's hard to properly convey it. One of the only texts my phone regurgitated the morning after the hurricane, with trees and wires down everywhere, roads flooded and a state of emergency declared, was from Vicki Forbes, who wrote at 7:34 a.m., "I'm on my way in!"

Half the staff still doesn't have power in their homes. Gary and Christina each sat in line for three hours to get gas to make sure they could get back and forth to work. The subway still isn't running in all parts of Manhattan. The Holland Tunnel is closed.

All of us in the New York/New Jersey area are enduring lines for food and basic services. It's 48 degrees out, and after six days without power, it's about 48 inside our houses as well.


But the TDN--produced from the hardest-hit area of a truly epic storm--continues to arrive, every single day.

And that's because we have the best team in the world. Thanks, guys. You're 20 in a million.

Gabriel Charles got off the mark on debut on the Del Mar Polytrack July 21, and was given an ambitious task for his next two starts when stepped up to Grade I company. He finished sixth, beaten 4 1/2 lengths, in the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 5, and was most recently a well-beaten seventh in his dirt debut in the GI FrontRunner S. at Santa Anita Sept. 29.

Bet down to 9-2 from a 20-1 morning line for his turf debut here, Gabriel Charles established a stalking position along the rail through quick early fractions.
