HOY, BC BOOSTS FOR FASIG NOVEMBER

The racing world caught its breath Sunday following a brilliant two days of world-class competition at the Breeders' Cup, and after more than a few transcontinental flights, gets back to business this afternoon at Fasig-Tipton's November Sale in Lexington. Each year, the November Sale packs as much excitement into four or five hours of selling as any auction in the world thanks to compact but star-packed catalogues, but 2012 could indeed be something special. That's in large part due to the inclusion of the 2011 Horse of the Year

Havre de Grace (Saint Liam), who put together a brilliant five-for-seven campaign a year ago for Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm, including a win over males in the GI Woodward S. Taylor Made Sales consigns Havre de Grace as [hip 76](#).

It's the first time a Horse of the Year has been sold at auction since Azeri (Jade Hunter), then 11, sold at the 2009 Keeneland November Sale for \$2.25 million, and the first Fasig has offered since Lady's Secret (Secretariat) in 1987.

"It's really a once-in-a-generation opportunity for us as a sales company, and for a potential buyer," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "Mares like these don't come often, and to be entrusted with a mare of her caliber is an honor. Rick Porter has been a longtime customer and friend, and we're honored he's given us an opportunity to sell a mare who truly accomplished remarkable things on the racetrack. It's exciting for a breeder to be able to buy a mare who will possibly reshape their whole program and become something spectacular for generations to come."

Fasig wasn't hurt at all by the results of the Breeders' Cup World Championships, either. "We were certainly fortunate to have some timely updates," said an understated Browning.

Among the offerings is Friday's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf winner **Zagora** (Fr) (Green Tune), who sells through Oceanic Bloodstock as [hip 153](#) on the account of owner Martin Schwartz. The dam of the GI Sprint winner **Trinniberg** (Teufflesberg), the 9-year-old **Bella Dorato** (Goldminers Gold), sells from Romans Racing and Sales as [hip 22](#), while the dam of GI Classic runner-up **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno), **Ponche de Leona** (Ponche), will be sent through the ring by Blake-Albina Thoroughbreds as [hip 131](#). **Cont. p9**

PAST WINNERS CLASH IN MELBOURNE CUP

Tonight's G1 Melbourne Cup at Flemington Racecourse in Australia features an intriguing line-up of past winners and runners up, with plenty of new shooters set to take a shot at Australia's A\$6-million race. Last year's winner **Dunaden** (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}) is assigned top weight of 130 pounds, and the 7-year-old French-based gelding appears dangerous coming off a win in the Oct. 20 G1 Caulfield Cup, an effort that left him unbeaten in three starts in Australia. Top weight is tough to shoulder in this two-mile

contest, however, and the Pearl Bloodstock colorbearer will have to contend with **Americain** (Dynaformer), winner of the 2010 Melbourne Cup and fourth last year as the highweight. The Alain de Royer Dupre charge, who will carry 128 pounds tonight, was an encouraging fourth in the Caulfield Cup off a two-month layoff, and is the early market leader over Dunaden among most Australian bookmakers. The British-based **Red Cadeaux** (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) missed by the shortest of nostrils to Dunaden last year while carrying two fewer pounds, and this year he carries 122 pounds. The Ronald Arculli colorbearer, conditioned by Ed Dunlop, has not started since July 12, when he finished third in the G2 Goldsmith's S. at Newmarket, and prior to that was third in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Ascot June 23. **Cont. p16**

Hunter's Light was not far short of the top level at three and registered three listed wins in Hamilton's Glasgow S. in July, Goodwood's Tanqueray S. in September and Lingfield's Churchill S. in November as well as a third placing in the G3 Gordon S. also at Goodwood in July. Again third behind Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown May 31, the chestnut was seventh in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot June 23 before taking the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. back at 10 furlongs at Haydock Aug. 11. Following up in authoritative fashion in the G2 Anatolia Trophy on Veliefendi's Polytrack Sept. 1, he was no match for Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) when nine-lengths second in the G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp last time Oct. 6, but was much the best here despite almost throwing certain victory away with a marked drift in the closing stages. Settled in the slipstream of the early leader Branderburgo (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) by Silvestre de Sousa, the homebred took over traveling easily passing the three-furlong marker.

Starting his veer left a furlong later, he was eventually straightened by the stand's-side rail and still had too many guns for the far-side leader Feuerblitz. Diana Cooper, representing Godolphin, commented, "He just idled a bit out in front, but has still won convincingly. The horse has improved throughout the season and this was a deserved Group 1 success for him. It was also marvelous to see Silvestre record a first European Group 1 victory in the Godolphin colours. There is a possibility Hunter's Light could go to Hong Kong next month for the international meeting at Sha Tin, and he will remain in training next year."

This race was billed as a virtual walkover for Coolmore's impressive debut winner and \$1.3-million Fasig-Tipton Florida purchase Darwin (Big Brown), but fellow Pletcher trainee Violence--a \$600,000 KEESEP buy in his own right--picked up the pieces when his stablemate faltered. Violence was one of 16 juvenile debut winners for his powerful outfit at the Saratoga stand, besting Titledown Five (Tiznow) by a neck going seven panels Aug. 18.

His form was flattered a week ago when that runner aired by nine lengths with a 97 Beyer Speed Figure at Churchill Downs. Kept out wide in fourth as Darwin knocked heads with Really Sharp (Sharp Humor), Violence inched up closer on the turn. He spun four wide into the lane, and appeared to duck in slightly on Vegas No Show at the top of the stretch while switching leads. After righting the ship, Violence was angled towards the rail to confront Real Sharp, who in turn made things tight for Darwin on the rail.

The eventual winner pulled clear inside the final sixteenth, and survived an inquiry to give Pletcher his eighth graded victory with a 2-year-old in 2012. "We kind of anticipated that's how the race would unfold," Pletcher said. "We anticipated Darwin and Really Sharp would show some speed, and we talked about stalking those. It worked out pretty well. It was a big effort from seven-furlong maiden at Saratoga to a November Grade II." He added, "Everybody was a little green down the stretch; horses were kind of running all over the place. He wanted to lean in a little, but once Javier [Castellano] got him corrected he finished well. He's still a young colt, a colt I anticipate will continue to improve physically and mentally." Pletcher said Violence would most likely resurface over the winter at Gulfstream.

The well-traveled Rhythm of Light was making her first U.S. appearance off a half-length score in the Sept. 1 International Istanbul Trophy. Away slowly, the favorite settled near the back of the pack behind fractions of :23.14, :47.23 and 1:10.42. She reached contention with a powerful four-wide move into the stretch and surged past A Jealous Woman for an authoritative victory. "She did everything like a class filly should, and she proved she was today," said winner rider Garrett Gomez. "She was absolutely perfect about everything and traveled the last six furlongs exactly the way I wanted her to. She was never too keen or too much off the bridle and raced beautiful the whole time. When I asked her to pick it up, she picked up great and came home nice. I didn't have to ask her for too much." Winning trainer Thomas Dascombe added, "I told the [Gomez] she's going to be slowly away from the American horses, so don't ask her after the jump. She's got one run, and he got a nice, clean run at them, and she won well." Dascombe added that Rhythm of Light will remain in the U.S. with trainer Simon Callaghan. "And I wish her all the best of luck," the Englishman added.

Restricted to handicaps and conditions events for his formative career in his native France, King Air ran third on his first try at Pattern company in Deauville's G3 Prix Quincey over this trip Aug. 26. Subsequently fifth in the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua at the San Siro Sept. 30, the bay stepped up a notch to register an initial black-type win under Stephane Pasquier on a day when the domestic contenders once again had to surrender the main spoils to overseas raiders. Settled in sixth early against the fence, he moved through to strike passing the quarter pole and quickly opened up an unassailable advantage with a telling turn of acceleration in the testing conditions.

"It's seems to have been one thing after another this year with her," trainer Stuart Simon said. "We were hoping to get things ironed out for today's effort. [Jockey] Luis [Contreras] did everything perfectly. It was a really good trip."

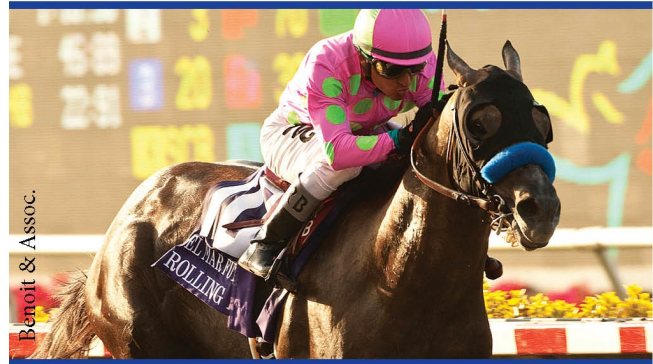
My Happy Face came out on the losing end of a hard-fought duel last time, but she dug deep here to reverse fortunes and cap a **"TDN Rising Star"** exacta. Second, beaten 4 3/4 lengths behind the well-meant Teen Pauline (Tapit) on debut at Saratoga July 25, the grey was as dominant as could be when she glided home a 21 1/4-length graduate back at the Spa Aug. 31. My Happy Face dropped a head decision to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies third-place finisher Dreaming of Julia (A.P. Indy) when stretched out for Belmont's GI Frizette S. Oct. 6. This race lost a bit of its luster with the scratch of well-regarded Bill Mott trainee Emollient (Empire Maker), but the top two provided plenty of fireworks on their own. My Happy Face took a narrow early lead from Cue the Moon through splits of :22.48, :44.87 and 1:09.78, with the latter ranging up to even terms with the heavy favorite on the turn. My Happy Face braced for her much-larger foe's advances at the top of the lane, and she got the bob after a scintillating stretch drive. My Happy Face became the first black-type winner for her freshman sire (by Tiznow), who stands at B. Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift Farm, the owner of the runner-up. "Our filly is very, very game, and we were very lucky," said winning trainer Rudy Rodriguez.

Padua's **Dust and Diamonds** (Vindication) has emerged as one of the top female sprinters in the country, thanks to a recent win in the GII Gallant Bloom H. and a second to Groupie Doll (Bowman's Band) in the GI F/M Sprint, and is offered here by Three Chimneys as [hip 53](#). The classy MGISW **Switch** (Quiet American), third in the F/M Sprint, sells as [hip 165](#) through Lane's End.

Others with big Breeders' Cup updates include the Unaccounted For mare **Refugee**, dam of GI Juvenile Fillies runner-up and MGISW **Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai), who goes through the Hill 'n' Dale consignment as [hip 138](#); [hip 180](#), the Bedouin Bloodstock-consigned **Versailles Song** (Unbridled's Song), a half-sister to Saturday's GI Juvenile Turf hero **George Vancouver** (Henrythenavigator); and [hip 43](#), the mare **Courting Elaine** (Doneraile Court), whose brother **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) stamped himself as the favorite for Horse of the Year honors with a record-setting win in the GI Mile.

Tonight's auction has 180 catalogued head, up from 155 in 2011.

Mile Winner Wise Dan Returns to Kentucky

Mort Fink's **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) added the GI Breeders' Cup Mile to his already lofty resume yesterday evening, and the 5-year-old gelding was back in his stall at Keeneland Sunday afternoon after departing Southern California on an early morning flight. "He's back in his stall now," said Amy Lopresti, wife of trainer Charles Lopresti. "He was eager to get off the van and be back home." Amy Lopresti noted that Wise Dan will spend the winter at the Lopresti's farm before targeting a 2013 debut at Keeneland, as he has done the last two seasons. "He will probably get 45 to 60 days at the farm, but it is up to him," Lopresti explained. "Charlie won't get in a big hurry with him because the goal is to have the horse at his best toward the mid-to late summer and the fall for the big races."

To Honor and Serve Retired, Royal Delta to Race On

Rodolphe Brisset, assistant trainer to Bill Mott, noted that the stable's four Breeders' Cup starters, including GI Ladies' Classic repeat winner **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), exited their races in good shape. With the exception of Grade I winner **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini), who finished 10th in the GI Classic and has been retired as expected to Gainesway Farm in Kentucky, Mott's charges will winter at Payson Park in Florida. "Everybody looks okay this morning," Brisset noted. "To Honor and Serve is retired and has left already. He is flying to Kentucky and going to Gainesway to begin his new career. The other three are flying to Payson Park in Florida on Monday afternoon. The three that are still here walked this morning and everybody ate good." Mott has noted that Besilu Stables' Royal Delta, last year's Eclipse champion 3-year-old filly, is scheduled to remain in training next year, with targets including the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup in March and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Trinniberg May Return to Santa Anita for Malibu

According to trainer Shivananda Parbhoo, GI Xpressbet Breeders' Cup Sprint winner **Trinniberg** (Teufflesberg) is scheduled to return to his home base in Florida tomorrow, but a return trip to Santa Anita for next month could be in order. "He is leaving Tuesday to go back to Calder, but there is a good chance he could come back here for the [GI] Malibu S. [Dec. 26]," Parbhoo said. "It all depends on how he's doing. He has had a tough year with eight races at eight different tracks, but we accomplished what we wanted to." Parbhoo noted that the 3-year-old, a four-time graded stakes winner this year, exited his victory against older horses in good shape. "He's a tough horse, a fighter," the conditioner said. **BC Wrap cont. p14**

All Good For Brown's Breeders' Cup Starters

Before departing Southern California for the East Coast yesterday morning, trainer Chad Brown noted that all six of his Breeders' Cup starters, including GI Filly & Mare Turf winner **Zagora (Fr)** (Green Tune) exited their races in good shape. Martin Schwartz's Zagora, who is entered in tonight's Fasig-Tipton November sale in Lexington, Kentucky, left Sunday for the Bluegrass State. Brown noted that **Watsdachances (Ire)** (Diamond Green {Ire}) exited her second-place performance in the GI Juvenile Fillies Turf with a grabbed quarter and some superficial cuts. "Watsdachances lost the right hind shoe in her race, grabbed a quarter and has cuts and abrasions on all four legs," Brown said. "No excuses, though. I thought she ran great to be second considering how cut up she got in the race. She's a very brave horse. It doesn't surprise me, that's the way she's trained and raced in all three starts with me, with tremendous courage and determination. I think she's got a bright future ahead of her." Brown also said that **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course), who suffered her first career defeat when finishing sixth in the GI Ladies' Classic, didn't handle the track. "She appeared to come out of the race in good shape," he said. "Looking at the race again and talking with [jockey Jeffrey Sanchez], we just don't feel that she handled the track well at all. Not taking anything away from the winner; she was fabulous. Even if we handled the track, it's hard to imagine anyone beating Royal Delta the way she ran." Brown noted that no future plans are in place for Awesome Feather.

Sadler Juveniles Bled

Trainer John Sadler noted that his two GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runners, **Capo Bastone** (Street Boss) and **Monument** (Cindago), both bled during the 1 1/16-mile race. Capo Bastone finished third, while Monument was ninth. "Capo Bastone ran a real good third, but he bled a little," Sadler explained. "I'm not sure what's next, but he will probably wait until the winter meet [at Santa Anita]. Monument will go back to state-bred races." Sadler also noted that **Switch** (Quiet American), third in the GI Filly & Mare Sprint on Friday, left early yesterday for Kentucky. She is entered in tonight's Fasig-Tipton November Sale. "It's sad to see her leave," Sadler added. "I'll just remember what a good, honest horse she was. She was a multiple Grade I winner and took us to Kentucky and Oaklawn Park."

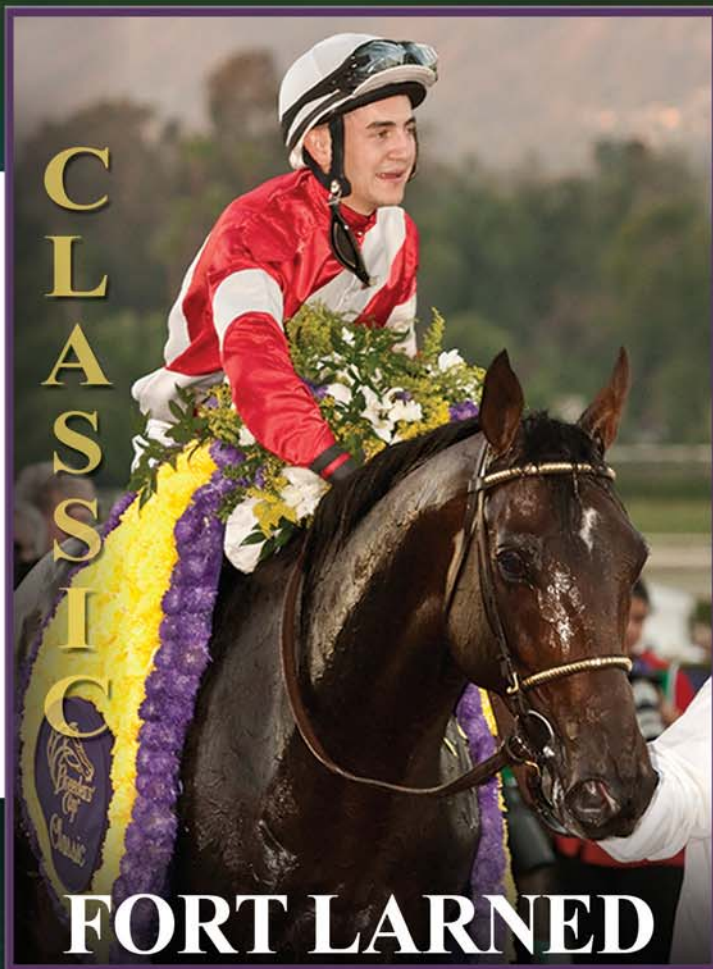

Baffert Reflects on Breeders' Cup Performances

With 10 horses entered over the two-day Breeders' Cup--including GI Classic favorite **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again) and GI Juvenile Fillies favorite **Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai)--trainer Bob Baffert was expected to celebrate a memorable weekend. Instead, the trainer walked away empty handed, his best finish coming from Executiveprivilege, who finished second to Beholder (Henny Hughes). Game on Dude was never a factor in the Classic after missing the break and failing to take up his customary position on the lead, finishing seventh. Baffert reflected on his weekend at Santa Anita yesterday morning. "When expectations are high--really high like they were for us--the dropoff is hard," he said. "But what are you going to do? You forget, you learn as much as you can from it all, and then you go on." Baffert noted that position was key on the Santa Anita dirt, and that's where his races were lost. "They all got beat in the first quarter-mile," he explained. "It was all about position. If you don't get position, you are in trouble. And none of my horses seemed to get that." Baffert noted that while he had expected Executiveprivilege to win, he may have been most disappointed in **Power Broker** (Pulpit), fifth in the GI Juvenile. "He was outside to start, but I thought he'd be up close," Baffert explained. "He was eight wide all the way, and he never switched leads. He's still green. But we learned a lot from the race and it will help us down the line. His race was just like Point Given's [GI Kentucky Derby, fifth as the favorite in 2001]. He'll be fine, though. He's a good horse, he's just got to be ridden differently." Baffert noted that none of his horses bled, and no future plans have been made. "I need some time to let this all settle," he said. "It takes a while to take it all in. It's been a big weekend and there are lots of things to think about. They'll all have other days and we'll figure out what they are in the future."

Calidoscopio Could Remain in U.S.

Argentinian invader **Calidoscopio (Arg)** (Luhuk) could be set for a U.S. campaign after taking Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Marathon at Santa Anita. The 9-year-old, who became the oldest horse to win a Breeders' Cup race, has been transferred from Argentinian trainer Guillermo Frankel to Mike Puype. Calidoscopio has been stabled in Puype's Betfair Hollywood Park barn since arriving from Argentina six weeks ago. "They're thinking of leaving him here to race, but I'm not sure in what races," Puype explained. "I should know more in a week from John Fulton [advisor to owners Stud Dona Pancha]." Puype earned a Breeders' Cup victory of his own with the 4-year-old filly **Mizdirection** (Mizzen Mast), who took the GI Turf Sprint off a five-month layoff. "She seemed to come out of it good, and I couldn't be more pleased," Puype said. "I thought her win was one of the best performances in the Breeders' Cup races." Puype noted that no plans have been made for Mizdirection, who remained perfect in four starts over Santa Anita's hillside turf course with Saturday's victory.

Mike Smith Wins Bill Shoemaker Award

Mike Smith was awarded with the Bill Shoemaker Award as the most outstanding jockey at the 2012 Breeders' Cup. The 47-year-old, who guided Royal Delta (Empire Maker) to victory in the GI Ladies' Classic on Breeders' Cup Friday and Mizdirection (Mizzen Mast) to her win in the GI Turf Sprint on Saturday, also became the all-time leading jockey by number of wins at the world championships. He registered his 16th Breeders' Cup win with Royal Delta, breaking the tie he previously held with the now-retired Hall of Famer Jerry Bailey, and edged yet clearer when winning on Mizdirection. "I've been trying to win this award since it was first started [in 2003]," Smith said. "Bill Shoemaker was to our sport what Babe Ruth was to baseball." Smith clinched the award with 28 points, two more than Garrett Gomez, already a four-time winner. The award is decided on a first through fourth points system. Smith also finished second in the GI Classic on Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) and third in Friday's GI Marathon on Atigun (Istan).

Mount Athos (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), one of two Luca Cumani-trained runners, looks for his fourth straight victory in his Australian debut. He kicked off his 2012 campaign with a victory in a 2816-metre Newmarket handicap May 19 off an 11-month layoff, and added the Listed John Smith's Silver Cup over the same trip at York July 14. The 6-year-old gelding continued to move forward off those efforts, recording his most recent win in the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury Aug. 18. He shoulders 119 pounds here. A few runners that could offer value are **Fiorente (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), **Galileo's Choice (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **My Quest For Peace (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Fiorente recently joined the Gai Waterhouse stable after finishing fourth behind beaten G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe favorite Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) in the G2 Prix Foy at Longchamp June 16. Prior to that effort he defeated two-time GI Canadian International hero Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Red Cadeaux in the Goldsmith's S. Galileo's Choice has proven he can handle the distance, winning a 3219-metre hurdle earlier this year, and he revived his flat form recently with back-to-back victories at Leopardstown, in the Listed Challenge S. July 19 and the G3 Ballyroan S. over Group 1 winner Treasure Beach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) Aug. 9. Trainer Dermot Weld knows how to navigate this race, having conditioned Vintage Crop to victory in 1993, and Media Puzzle in 2002. The Luca Cumani-trained My Quest For Peace, highly touted before traveling down under, finished fifth, beaten less than two lengths, in his Australian debut in the Caulfield Cup.

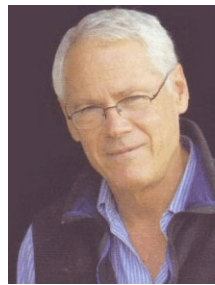

This Swahili phrase means, "The journey, it has blown apart." I write these words because my own journey in the horse business has come to an end.

After the 2011 Keeneland September and November sales, the appraised value of my remaining horse collateral dropped below the 2:1 asset to debt ratio required by my lending bank. Thus, they stopped advancing money and did not renew my financing. I have since gone through all of my personal monies and, as required by the bank, I am liquidating all of my foals and mares without reserve in the Keeneland November sale.

Unfortunately, breeding, co-breeding, or mating over 200 stakes horses (including 17 Grade I stakes winners) has not been enough to sustain me in an industry where a couple of consecutive bad years can sink someone who does not have wealth outside the horse business. **Cont. p19**

It's not all bad, however. There's an old joke that says, "If you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans." Somehow, I managed to keep God laughing for 40 years.

The facts are what they are. As I have documented in other Op/Eds, life in the trenches as a breeder is tough for anyone, especially for those who do commercial breeding as a livelihood. I exit knowing that, while being fully invested, I have at least treated others fairly and have not been an exploiter who takes little risk and feeds off others. Along the way, I have come to know the inside of Teddy Roosevelt's "Arena." I may be a poor example of one "whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; ...who does actually strive to do the deed; who knows great enthusiasms...and who at the worst, fails while daring greatly." But I depart knowing that against long odds I tried my best to make it work.

In my 40 years around horses, I have observed that there are two basic types of people in the business: stakeholders and those who make a living off stakeholders. And within each group, there are two more groups: those who actively work to improve the industry and those who operate from narrowly focused selfish interests without regard for the long-term welfare of the business or our sport. Sadly, the latter group right now is adding a very heavy weight to the industry saddle. Too few participants understand the necessity of working cooperatively, pro-actively, and with a shared vision to help grow the business for everyone. Even sadder, too few people care.

To that extent, my departure is just one more industry failure. When I am gone, who will be next?

For some time I have known that any positive changes in how we conduct business will be too late for me. I have written the last few Op/Eds solely to help create awareness and discussion that might benefit my friends I leave behind.

Thus, for those good people who are able to keep on keeping on, and for the incredible animals who race for our enjoyment, I submit this final Op/Ed. My purpose is simply to present one man's picture of important things the industry needs to do to make things better for the future of our sport and the people who live it every day.

Unfinished Business: Dr. Rob's Top 10 Industry To Do List for 2013:

#10. Stop whipping horses in front of the American public. This one is a no-brainer at a time when we urgently need to attract new fans and keep the ones we have. Many people see whipping as disgusting, abusive, and immoral. It is a major turn-off to a lot of people.

The reality of actual pain and punishment is meaningless compared to the visual reality. Only the perception matters. By projecting a kinder image we increase the appeal of horseracing and grow our fan base. If we grow our fan base, we grow our sport.

Placing a ban on whipping is not just the right thing to do. Given the status of modern racing, banning whipping is also the smart and practical thing to do. Those who support whipping have weak arguments like "some horses need it," or "it's racing as it's meant to be." Jockeys whip because jockeys (except for the great Isaac Murphy) have always whipped. They whip because it is what they learn, because every other jockey is doing it and they are afraid of possibly losing an edge, and because it actually can motivate some less genuine horses.

The argument for whipping is especially weakened, however, when we observe that *whipping often creates safety problems* and frequently *interferes with performance* and the outcome of a race. Whipped horses often sulk or stop trying, shy, veer, swerve, duck in, duck out, lose smooth forward rhythm, or are injured when pushed to overextend themselves while fatigued.

A lot can be gained by banning whipping and little is given up. If jockeys only carry and use *whips for personal safety*, we will still have a winner in every race and jockeys will be judged by their ability to communicate with their mount and by their hands and true horsemanship and riding skill.

Without whipping, the most genuine racehorses will prevail and we will always have a winner whose true heart and competitive nature will be clearly defined along with the skill of the rider. We will also have more people watching.

#9. Stop timing the 2-year-old sale horses. When I came into the business, we let our 2-year-olds gallop down the lane under a strong hold. Every horse is an individual and we brought them along according to their own maturation time-table and "within themselves." Knowledgeable horsemen knew what they were looking at and could tell a good horse without causing still developing babies to tear through an eighth or even three eighths faster than they would ever run again.

Many pinhooked yearlings are carefully selected and are among the industry's most promising youngsters. Yet we risk and waste too many with the survival of the fittest process that we put them through in order to identify a few standouts. Little attention is given to the significant number of potential stars who are unnecessarily chewed up and spit out by the stress of being unnaturally pushed, or who are compromised post-sale by physical and mental issues that we create.

#8. Fix the Repository and increase veterinary accountability at sales. Sales companies are the stewards of the auction scene. As such, they have fiduciary responsibility for providing a level playing field for all participants. One area of responsibility that urgently needs fixing involves the operation of the Repository and how veterinary input is documented and utilized.

Before the creation of a repository, the playing field favored the breeder and consignor. Buyers paid for their own x-rays or took their chances under “buyer beware.” The smartest buyers bought from sellers who stood behind their horses. Buyers could attempt to return a horse with a significant problem through a sales company sponsored arbitration panel.

The repository was established as a good idea to create a better process for buyers and to give them increased confidence. Unfortunately, as it currently functions, the repository unfairly affects sellers and creates confusion for buyers that often causes them to unnecessarily miss out on horses they have selected for purchase.

Today, the playing field is once again *not level*. Breeders pay for a full set of repository x-rays and often pay for an additional set of “guidance” x-rays in early spring, adding about \$1,000 to production costs. Cost is a problem, but not the main problem. The main problem is the punitive disservice to sellers when veterinarians detail every finding, significant or insignificant, on their written reports. Written in “vet-

speak” jargon, buyers frequently do not understand the vets’ language or the significance of the written findings and often just move on to a “cleaner” sheet and horse.

Veterinarians provide findings, interpretations, and predictions, and their input is often a key factor in whether a breeder gets his horse sold after two and a half years of production and expense. If we truly believe in a level playing field, vet opinions should be documented and retained as part of a public record when buyers use sellers’ x-rays in the Repository. Buyers’ vets should sign off on their interpretations and should be required to make “pass-fail” opinions that are also documented and signed in writing. In addition, when a vet scopes a seller’s horse, they should submit a signed statement of their findings and opinion to the sale company for documentation. In other words, veterinarians should be held accountable in a similar way to doctors in medical practice.

In addition, sale companies and veterinarians should develop an educational program to help horsemen understand the meaning of terms and importance of findings so that buyers have confidence in separating the significant from the insignificant. This is especially important for two reasons. (1) Veterinarians have no crystal ball and are often wrong about future implications. In part, this is because they have little research evidence to guide predictions that link most findings to specific racing performance. (2) Most items on a sheet are insignificant. **Cont. p22**

Based on my experience, an overwhelming preponderance of veterinary findings have little or no impact on a horse's future racing performance. Although it is important to identify major problems or issues, many perceived irregularities are developmental and are outgrown or are of no consequence. Most that persist are typically overcome by a horse's talent, toughness, or in-bred competitive nature. Those of us who are veterans have many anecdotes which contradict statements like, "he'll never train or race." (For example, I had one yearling with crushed hocks and a veterinary opinion that he would never take training, let alone race. He won 7 races and nearly \$150K. I had another with a wry nose who had one nostril totally closed. I gave him away to someone who decided to put him in training and give him a try. He won 22 races.) Thus, vet opinions need to be considered with perspective and for what they are, and buyers need to be informed and knowledgeable enough to evaluate the risk for themselves and make their own decisions when they really like a horse.

Veterinarians should also be held accountable by sales companies in one other especially important way. A number of sales veterinarians have ownership interests in sale horses. This of course creates an obvious and unaddressed conflict of interest. Sales companies need to provide more leadership in their stewardship and should require veterinarians to provide sworn disclosure of all percentage interests in sale horses at a particular sale, or disqualify them from working a sale where they have an ownership interest in any horse.

#7. Limit the size of stallion books and import foreign bloodlines.

When stallion books go past 100, many negative things happen.

Although a few elite exceptions could be mentioned, gains in short-term revenue for stallion owners who breed very large books can be off-set over time when excessive breeding turns their stallion into a commodity. Many quality stallions can be listed who dropped out of commercial favor simply because the marketplace got tired of them or trainers "already had a bunch."

Breeders are greatly damaged when book size soars. A very large number of sales horses by the same sire typically causes depressed prices at auction for all but the primo individuals. The loss of money by breeders who are not lucky enough to produce the top 10-20% is only part of the picture, however. Breeders also lose money when breeding sheds are backed up and they cannot get to a stallion when the mare is ready. If they miss a cover or have an unsuccessful cover because of bad timing or having to accept lesser semen quality from too many covers on the same day or season, they have more late foals. Or they have no foal and lose an entire year's expense of carrying and breeding the mare.

In addition, when breeders are allowed to flock to the current "flavors of the month" in unrestrained numbers, the industry is weakened because the quantity of mares going to other quality stallions drops. When a stallion's number of foals drops below a critical number, they typically do not have enough runners on the track to maintain commercial favor, shrinking the pool of commercial stallions and perpetuating excessively large books.

For the good of the industry, The Jockey Club should simply not accept more than 100 or 120 stallion service certificates for any stallion in a given season. End of problem.

#6. Publish leading sire and stallion statistics in relation to foals, not runners. A legion of myths and falsehoods influence the many aspects of the marketplace. With regard to stallions, the stature of a sire is typically measured by numbers of graded stakes winners, stakes winners, progeny earnings, percentage of stakes winners from runners, and average earnings per *runner*. All of these measures, however, frequently give a false picture of comparative performance as they unduly favor stallions that have very large books and many runners. Evaluating performance on a stallion's number of runners is a statistical manipulation that creates a skewed or deceptive picture of who are really the best sires. Cont. p23

When numbers of *foals* are used to calculate relative performance, some sires with less opportunity regularly outperform stallions that are incorrectly viewed as superior. Using runners creates a misperception that contributes to excessive popularity among the stallion group cited in #7. It also causes shrinkage in the number of stallions perceived to be commercial and the number of stallion farms that can stay in business. This reduction in competition is not good for the viability of the Bluegrass or the broader industry.

Fixing this major problem would require media to publish stats based on percentages using *foals* as the reference group, *not runners*. It is the only way to provide an accurate (and fair) picture of stallion performance.

#5. Lobby Congress to alter the Interstate Horseracing Act and lower take-out. We need to collectively persuade Congress to revise the Interstate Horseracing Act (IHA) of 1978 in order to give host tracks the lion's share of simulcast revenue from racing at their facility.

As Fred Pope has pointed out on numerous occasions, off-track bet takers and advanced deposit wagering (ADW) companies take most of the revenue from a host track's signal. As Fred indicates, this upside down revenue model "cannibalizes" the host tracks and siphons a huge amount of money away from them that could be used for purses.

Crafting a revision of the IHA in order to provide host tracks with more than 50% of the takeout would not only allow a surge in purses, but would also make it possible for tracks to lower the takeout on each wager. The latter point is equally important, as bettors support the entire industry. We need to cut the takeout in half or more for bettors in order to compete effectively with other forms of gambling going forward, or our sport will continue to decline.

Like it or not, only the Federal government can fix this.

#4. Bring our drug use standards in line with the rest of the world. At a time of rapid globalization of racing, we need to do all we can to stimulate international interest in horses bred in America and to encourage the racing of foreign horses at America's tracks. If we continue with current protocols and enforcement, we will be left behind and eventually slip into a second tier status. In short, we need to adapt to standards in force in the rest of the world, plain and simple.

Domestically, we also need to put a system in place that creates a level playing field and that establishes and enforces major penalties for violations. Even in the best case scenarios where the drug culture surrounding many training barns is only an effort to stay competitive, the price we pay is great. Our image to the American public is negatively affected and international horsemen are suspicious of what rampant drug use is doing to our horses and subsequently their progeny.

The most effective way to fix this crucial problem would be to have all vet work performed by vets employed by each track, with detailed documentation and rationales for therapy posted as part of the public record. Owners could still be billed for services, but a systematic oversight would be established requiring medical justification or necessity, thereby addressing the welfare of the horse. Everyone would be playing by the same set of rules and procedures, and the size of the vet bills that discourages many owners and spits too many out would drop significantly.

#3. Provide proper aftercare for our equine athletes.

How can we pretend to have a great sport when we often show disregard for our equine athletes after we use them for our enjoyment? This emotionally laden topic is not going to go away anytime soon. And it won't go away until we address it effectively.

Whether we have slaughterhouses or not, the core issue as I see it is *humane treatment* and the importance of stopping cruelty wherever and however it may surface. We need more retirement facilities and we need properly run and sufficiently funded euthanasia programs throughout the country. If we have slaughterhouses, we need to have an oversight process in place that assures humane treatment during transport and in the facilities.

The price tag for proper aftercare is very high and requires a total industry effort to be successful. The Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance deserves everyone's support. It is just getting off the ground and needs to become 1000 times better funded if we are to do right by our athletes and gain the respect of the American public.

As I wrote four years ago, every group that makes money on the backs of Thoroughbreds shares a moral responsibility to protect our horses as they go through their life cycle. At each stage in a horse's career, every time it is sold and every time it races, a contribution should be made by all participants. Breeders, sales companies, stallion owners, consignors, agents buying and selling, vets, blacksmiths, race tracks, ADWs, owners, trainers, jockeys, transporters, feed companies, and other service suppliers should make a contribution to a "super fund" each time they are part of a monetary transaction.

#2. Provide proper aftercare for our injured human athletes.

There is only one group of athletes more precious than our cherished horses: our jockeys who risk themselves daily to put on the show. We need to do much more to raise funds and assist injured and disabled jockeys and their families (as well as exercise riders and grooms and hot-walkers who are disabled while working around our horses).


Sure, these professional athletes choose to do what they do while knowing the risks. But we would not have horse racing without them, and we cannot morally abandon them and their loved ones when catastrophe strikes.

The Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund (PDIF) is governed by an industry-based board, but needs a much larger endowment to properly assist with on-going support for injured riders. Several industry groups, individuals, and charity events have generously provided funds, but a systematic and broad based funding system needs to be established similar to the one needed for our equine athletes.

#1. Establish a national governing body with standardized rules and regulations. It's pretty obvious that our industry has turned from a dysfunctional family to a group of competitive tribes that have trouble finding common ground. If we have one consensus, it seems to be the recognition that we cannot work together to fix our problems. Unlike other major sports that annually take market share from us, we have no centralized authority, no league office, no national governing body that can standardize rules and regulations, enforce compliance, and unite all groups in a powerful and effective marketing initiative to compete with other forms of gambling and sports entertainment.

As with our need to correct the business model governing host tracks' simulcast revenue (#5 above), whether we want it or not, only the Federal government can help us establish such an office and create uniformity across state jurisdictions. We therefore need to develop key Congressional alliances and actively participate in the careful crafting of legislation that can transform our industry into a thriving sport.

Final comment. As for me, I deeply regret that I am leaving at a time when so much needs fixing. When I came into the business knowing no one, it was for me all about my love of young horses. I will miss them very much.
