



AMAZING GRACE

The 2011 Horse of the Year **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) always figured to be the star of the show at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton November Sale. But even veterans of the scene weren't quite prepared for what transpired Monday night when the 5-year-old mare entered the ring as [hip 76](#). In a bidding war as exciting to watch as any championship race, Whisper Hill Farm's Mandy Pope, sitting alongside her bloodstock advisor Chris Brothers, saw off all challengers to land the strapping mare for \$10 million.

It was the highest price ever paid for a broodmare prospect at public auction, eclipsing the \$9 million Ashado (Saint Ballado) brought in 2005 at the sale industry's height. At least two broodmares have brought more, however. Broodmare of the Year Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister) made \$14 million at Fasig's 2008 November Sale--bought by Southern Equine to dissolve a partnership between with Hill 'n' Dale Farms--and Playful Act (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who sold to John Ferguson for \$10.5 million at the 2007 Keeneland November Sale. **Cont. p4**

AVERAGE UP 67%, GROSS NEARLY DOUBLES

Showing strength at the top of the market not seen at this auction in several years, last night's November Sale was big success on most levels. With 25 horses more horses on offer than a year ago, the gross nearly doubled, from \$32,745,000 to \$60,220,000. The \$10 million Havre de Grace sent the average on a stratospheric rise, too, with a final figure of \$692,184 up 67% from last year's corresponding figure.

"Obviously, it was a remarkable evening," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "It exceeded our most optimistic expectations. The thing that was most encouraging was the breadth of bidders at very high levels. This was not a sale that was dominated by one or two buyers that bid on all the big lots. There was a broad, broad cross section from literally all over the world." **Cont. p7**

"I don't know what to say," laughed a flustered Mandy Pope as she was swarmed in the hallway of the pavilion by the press and well wishers soon after signing the \$10-million ticket. "She's beautiful. You look at her, and she's everything a racehorse should be, she did everything a racehorse could do, and she has a wonderful attitude. She's very sweet; she would just about put her head in my lap when I went up to see her. She's the epitome of what we're all trying to breed, as far as conformation and racing ability goes. Hopefully, she'll pass that on to her foals."

Havre de Grace was consigned by Taylor Made Sales on behalf of the man who raced her to three Grade I wins and that Horse of the Year title, Fox Hill Farm's Rick Porter. Porter patiently waited to offer Pope his thanks, and offered afterwards, "It was exciting. [Havre de Grace] is the whole package. I'm really glad she's going to Mandy and is going to stay in this country. I hope she loves the horse as much as we did."

Asked if he expected anything in the \$10 million range, Porter said, "No. We set a very reasonable reserve, and I'm very surprised she brought this kind of money. But I think she's worth it. They said it before: she has amazing talent, amazing beauty, an amazing pedigree, and amazing grace."

Porter was referencing the Taylor Made-produced video that Fasig played to a dimmed house just prior to Havre de Grace entering the ring. Following the video, Fasig's Terence Collier offered his own tribute, quoting Shakespeare, "Some are born great, some have greatness thrust upon them, and some achieve greatness." Havre de Grace achieved greatness," said Collier.

How the War Was Won...

A standing room-only crowd stood quietly appreciative as bidding got going, but the din began to rise as action, in half-million increments, sped to the \$5-million mark. At around \$6 million, things slowed a bit, and bidding fell into \$200,000 and \$300,000 salvos that pushed the price on the board to \$7 million. Pope had the money at that point.

"I thought we had her there," Pope later admitted. "We had her value at between \$6 and \$8 million, and that was right in the middle where I was comfortable."

But Collier got on the mic and reminded the crowd of the unique offering at hand, and the action rebroke in earnest, with at least two other groups getting back in. Pope and Brothers kept at it, though, and came away with the big prize.

"This was more than I thought she'd bring," admitted Pope. "But it is a once-in-a-lifetime shot, and I'm taking a shot at it. We'll see what happens. I hope she knows what she's worth and has nice babies!" **Cont. p5**

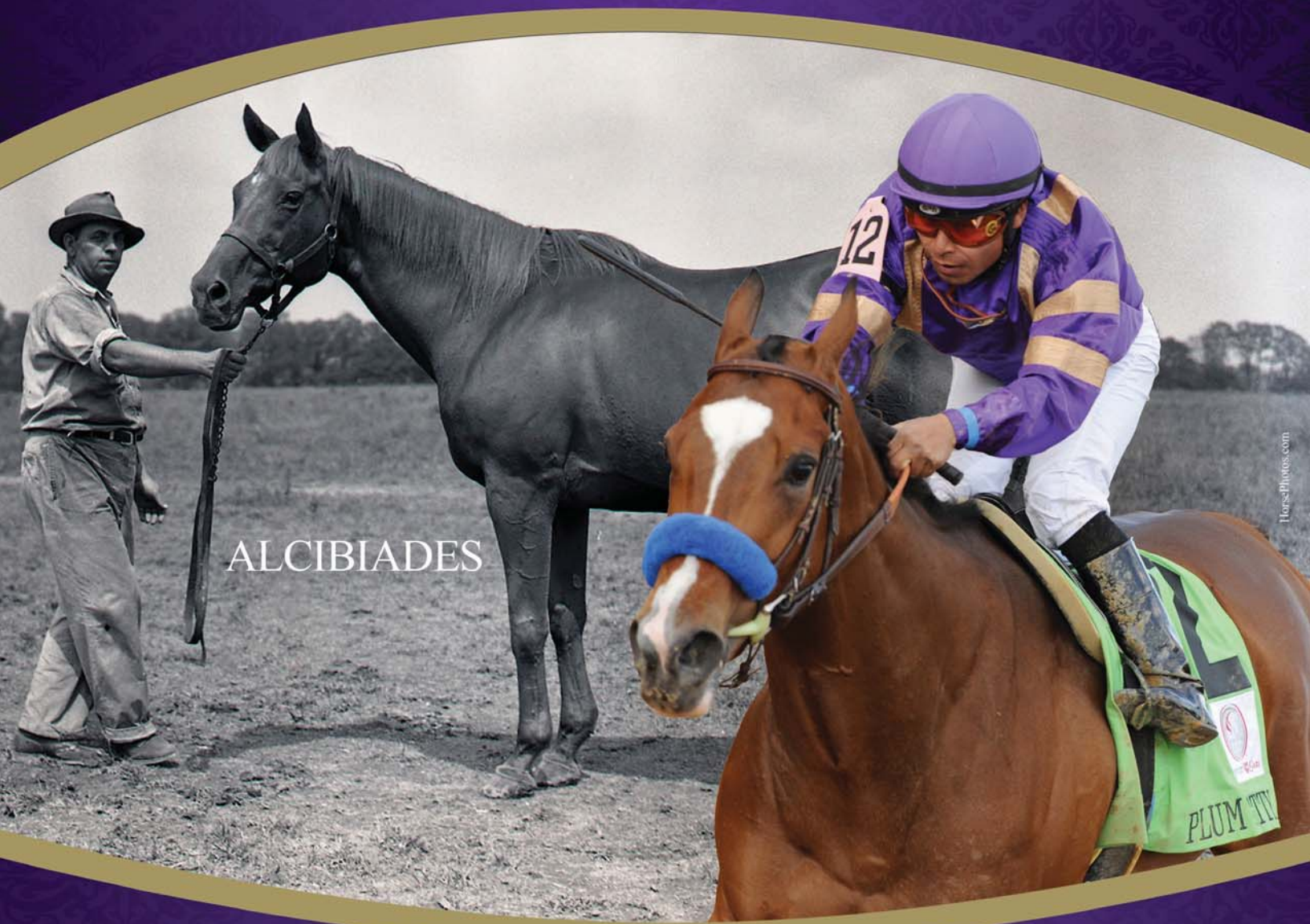

Pope, who both races and breeds for the market, said she's taking a commercial view with the mare. "We'll breed her with the preference of selling to begin with," she said. "It will take a bit for her to pay for herself through her foals, but if her foals look anything like she does, they should be in here bringing a lot of money in two years. And of course, if she has a filly along the way, will probably keep that. But to begin with, we have to get her to help pay for herself." She said no decisions have been made as to which stallion Havre de Grace will visit in 2013. "She'll be easy to mate; she's an outcross for a lot of stallions," said Pope.

Others reportedly bidding on the champion included Frank Stronach, Ben Leon and Coolmore.

Behind Every Good Lady...

Several other members of the Fox Hill team joined Porter to watch Havre de Grace sell, including Larry Jones, who trained her for much of her career after taking over from Tony Dutrow. Jones said she was the classiest mare he has ever seen.

"They just bought the best mare that's ever been sold at auction, no doubt about it," Jones said. "She was the total package. There was not a weakness in her. She was the nearest thing to a perfect racehorse, and I've had some good ones. She absolutely handled every situation that was presented to her. A race with a lot of speed, a race without speed, different post positions...you could ship her, you could have her at the track, nothing bothered her."

Jones said he was impressed with this year's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic winner Royal Delta, but he recalled the result of last year's GI Beldame S., when 4-year-old Havre de Grace beat 3-year-old Royal Delta by 8 1/4 lengths.

"Believe me, Royal Delta is really awesome and Billy Mott has done a great job with her, but these two met one time," Jones said. After the 2011 Beldame, Royal Delta won the Ladies' Classic and was named

champion 3-year-old filly. Havre de Grace finished fourth, beaten three lengths in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and was voted champion older mare, in addition to Horse of the Year.

Also on hand was the man who selected Havre de Grace as a yearling and purchased her on Porter's behalf for \$380,000 at the 2008 Keeneland September Sale. Tom McGreevy said, despite some obvious maturing, Havre de Grace is essentially the same horse he found at the Mill Ridge consignment some four years ago.

"She had that presence all the time, even as a yearling," said McGreevy. "Horses like that just have it figured out early. She was the first one I took Rick to go see [at KEESEP]. We were going to take her home."

When asked about the price, McGreevy said, "In this economy, I was surprised. But when you're playing at that level, no one can predict what's going to happen. It's just different. But she is the perfect animal. When you look at her, you just have to be in awe--there's nothing you could say you didn't like. I talked to some people here that have been looking at horses for a long time, and they said they'd never seen one like this. I'm sure I'll never find another one like that. But don't get me wrong, I'm not going to stop trying!" McGreevy concluded, "Mandy will give her a great home, and it's going to be great to follow her and see how her babies do."

Fitting Tribute to Late Sire...

As the winner of the most prized Eclipse Award in racing, Havre de Grace was simply following in the steps of her sire, the 2005 Horse of the Year Saint Liam (Saint Ballado). Winner of that year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic for owner William K. Warren, Jr., Saint Liam was retired to Lane's End for the 2006 season at a fee of \$50,000. He sired 90 named foals in that first year, including Havre de Grace. Sadly, he fractured a hind leg in a freak accident while being led to his paddock and had to be euthanized. The loss was amplified when runners from his first crop came out running, led by the GI Nashua S. and GI Remsen S. winner Buddy's Saint.

With those runners from his first crop now five, Saint Liam has been represented by nine black-type winners, a strong 10% clip, including the Grade III winner Liam's Dream and this year's GIII Jaipur H. hero Upgrade. - Lucas Marquardt

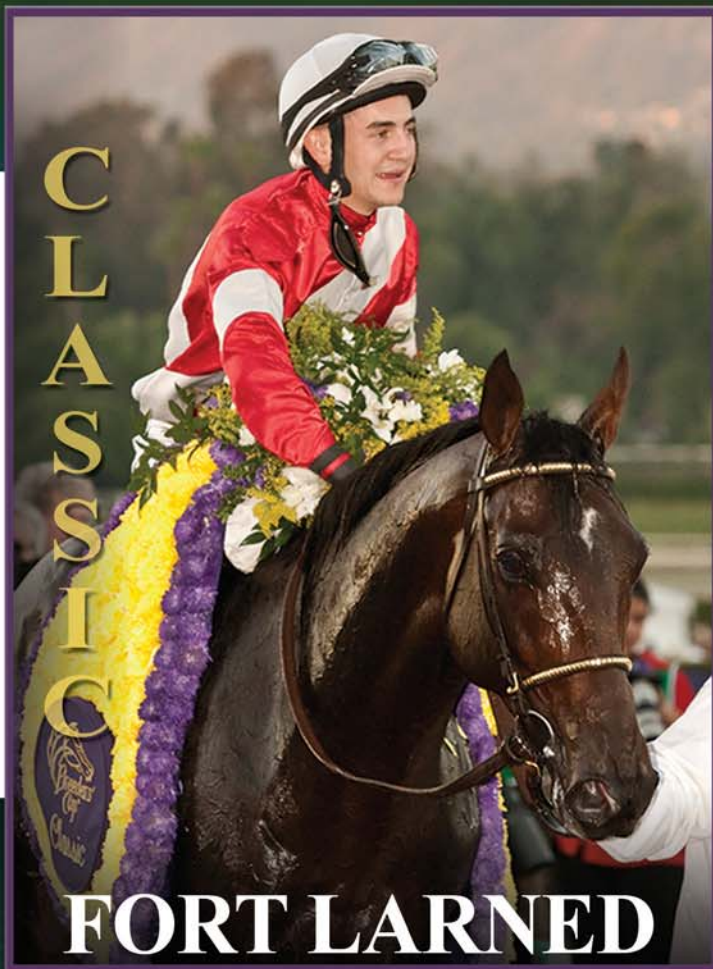

“The only way you’re able to have a sale like this is to have consignors and owners that bring you the product,” Browning said. “It gets old saying it, but it begins and ends with the horse, but that’s the reality. We were able to have a sale like this tonight because people entrusted us with their very, very best. When they do that, hopefully it raises your game, and hopefully our game was raised. It was a tremendous sale, and we couldn’t be happier.”

Interestingly, there was evidence that, despite the big increases at the top, that the market was largely stable from a year ago. The median actually showed a modest decline, dipping 5% to \$190,000, and the number of horses that brought \$500,000 or more were roughly the same: 25 this year compared to 22 last term. The RNA rate was also up considerably, from 27.5% in 2011 to 35.1% this term. But there’s little doubt last night’s auction will put a little spring into the step of many breeders.

“Three years ago, you couldn’t have really blamed a lot of people if they said they didn’t want to be involved in Thoroughbred racing or breeding,” said Browning. “But there are still a lot of people who want to win the Kentucky Derby, want to win a Breeders’ Cup race, and want to breed the winners of those races. We’re always struck by the resiliency of the American Thoroughbred market.”

Coolmore Buys Bodemeister's Dam for \$5 million

Count the Coolmore partners among those who were extremely impressed with Bodemeister's runner-up finishes in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. earlier this year.

M.V. Magnier, son of Coolmore principle John Magnier, went to \$5 million to buy Bodemeister's dam Untouched Talent (Storm Cat), in foal to Unbridled's Song.

Magnier, bidding from the back walking ring, outlasted Mike Moreno, who was standing to his left, and direct underbidder Mandy Pope, who was bidding from the balcony inside and was flanked by her bloodstock agent Chris Brothers.

Coolmore's Director of Bloodstock Aisling Duignan said Untouched Talent's Smart Strike yearling filly, who sold for \$1.3 million at Keeneland September, contributed to the team's high opinion of Untouched Talent.

"She's a very, very good-looking mare, and her yearling was very good looking at the sales in September," Duignan said. "Obviously Bodemeister was a factor in the decision. A young mare like that is able to produce a horse like Bodemeister, and then produce a yearling like she did... She's young, she's well achieved, she's a great looker. She suits the program."

Duignan said the 8-year-old Untouched Talent, out of the multiple Grade III winner Parade Queen (A.P. Indy), will be sent to Ireland and be bred to Coolmore stallion Galileo (Ire) in 2013.

Cataloged as [hip 176](#), Untouched Talent was consigned by Brookdale Sales, agent for Audley Farm Equine.

"There were some amazing prices and some amazing horses here tonight," said Brookdale's Joe Seitz. "It's becoming such a global industry. We're seeing players from all over the world coming to Lexington."

Switching it Up at Fasig-Tipton


Despite a healthy cash flow observed earlier in the evening, there appeared to be plenty left on the floor when **Switch** (Quiet American--Antoinette, by Nicholas) strode into the ring as [hip 165](#). With the bidding moving along at a spirited pace and with several bidding interests present both in the pavilion and out back, the multiple Grade I winner reeled in a final bid of \$4.3 million from Moyglare Stud's Eva Haefner, seated alongside Fiona Craig.

"She is a fast mare, just a lovely mare," said Craig, who signed for the bay who brought \$150,000 as a Keeneland September yearling. "She'll probably go back to Ireland." *Cont. p9*

A winner in her sole start at two for CRK Stable and trainer John Sadler, the Calumet Farm-bred recorded wins in the GI La Brea S., GII Hollywood Oaks and Torrey Pines S. and was runner-up in the GI Lady's Secret and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint the following season. Last season, the bay took the GI Santa Monica and was second in the GI Santa Margarita, GI Apple Blossom H. and once again on Breeders' Cup day in the Filly & Mare Sprint. In six starts this term, she hit the board in a pair of starts, including a win in the July 14 GII A Gleam H. and a third in her most recent outing in the Filly & Mare Sprint.

"She sold pretty well," said Lanes' End's Bill Farish. "Heading into the sale, we couldn't decide whether Grace Hall or Switch would bring more, but when you get a couple of people hooked up and they go, it's hard to predict who will bring more. She sold very well."

In 2008, Haefner purchased Moyglare Stud from her late father Walter Haefner. Walter Haefner amassed his fortune in the computer software industry. His family also owns Switzerland's biggest importer of Volkswagen, Seat, Skoda, and Audi automobiles.

"It was a tough sale, we came in planning to pay less, but unfortunately, somebody out back wanted to pay more," dead panned Craig. "The market is surprisingly hard and surprisingly strong. But they are gorgeous horses and you have to pay for what you want. We might just have to go home and run a few of our own horse through the ring now."

From the perspective of the seller's bench, Farish added, "We've seen it very strong and very selective, but it's gotten that way. When you have one like her, she is absolutely beautiful and who is by Quiet American, whom people love as broodmare sire. She had the physical qualities people look for and she will make a great broodmare. -C Bossinakis

For Live Oak, Cry and Cry Again

Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation made a play for the top-priced weanling on the night, a sleek dark bay filly by Medaglia d'Oro from Hill 'n' Dale's consignment who went for \$620,000 ([hip 110](#)), but ultimately lost out to Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds. The operation's farm manager Bruce Hill came back a little while later, however, to secure the filly's dam, Grade I winner **Cry and Catch Me** (Street Cry {Ire}), for \$3.5 million. That was the fourth-highest price paid for a horse last night.

Also consigned by Hill 'n' Dale, the 7-year-old Cry and Catch Me ([hip 133](#)) sold carrying her second foal, by Bernardini, and Hill said she could return to the Darley stallion next spring. "We'll regroup and figure that out, but Bernardini's not a bad route to go," he said.

Winner of the GI Oak Leaf S. as a juvenile for Stetson Land and Cattle and trainer Bob Baffert, Cry and Catch Me enjoyed a nice update following the catalogue's printing, as her half-sister Certify (Elusive Quality) won the G1 Shadwell Fillies' Mile S. in England.

"She's a young mare, a nice first foal on the ground, all the Grade I's on the page? She just ticked off every box," added Hill. "The proof's in the pudding with the foal. The foal was very good."

Stetson Land and Cattle, owned by Nita and Christopher Connelly and Sasha Borland, bred the Medaglia d'Oro filly.

The Power of Grace

It might not have been at the scale at which the 'other' grace rocked Fasig-Tipton to its rafters last night, but Grace Hall (Empire Maker)'s final price tag of \$3.2 million was good enough to secure the fifth spot among the evening's offerings. Bloodstock agent Reynolds Bell Jr., who did his bidding from the upper tier viewing balcony secured the Lane's End-consigned 3-year-old.

"The price was a little more than I thought we'd have to pay," admitted Bell. "When it gets this selective, the market's going to be what it's going to be. If you want to buy something, you just have to be prepared to go with the market, and that's what we did."

Offered by Lane's End as [Hip 71](#), the 3-year-old was sold on behalf of a partnership, including majority partners Mike Caruso's Bethlehem Stables, Michael Dubb and The Elkstone's Stewart Grant.

"I have mixed emotions," said Caruso, who held a 25% stake in the mare prior to yesterday's sale. "We put a pretty substantial reserve on her, and if she didn't sell, we were going to race her next year. It doesn't matter who gets her, I'll cheer for her as much as I did before."

Bell said his client, who asked not to be identified, intended to continue to race Grace Hall.

"We watched her run last year, and we watched her run this year, and she's just a class act," said Bell. "Good Lord willing, she's got at least another year of racing, maybe two."

Out of the multiple group-placed mare Season's Greetings (Ire) (Ezzoud), the bay won the GI Spinaway S. in only her second career start and later rounded out her juvenile campaign with a runner-up finish behind subsequent champion My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs. Earlier this year, she won the Mar. 31 GII Gulfstream Park Oaks before finishing third in the May 4 GI Kentucky Oaks. Back later in the summer to score in the GII Delaware Oaks, she added a victory in the GII Indiana Oaks. In her latest start, she finished fourth in last Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic at Santa Anita.

"I thought her performance in the Breeders' Cup was really good," said Bell. "It might not have been the best performance of her career, but I thought it was good. The filly that won it [Royal Delta], she's one of a kind. It was probably the toughest race top to bottom of the two days, quality-wise."

According to Caruso, who is based in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, he eventually made it out to California for the Breeders' Cup despite having his plans delayed because of Hurricane Sandy. However, he was unable to attend last night's sale, because of other commitments, and watched via internet.

Principally a racing outfit, Bethlehem Stables, which owns many of its horses in partnership with Dubb and Grant, has its racing team spread along the East coast between several trainers, including Chad Brown, Rudy Rodriguez, Tony Dutrow and Bill Mott. **Cont. p11**

"There's a good chance she'll go back to Tony Dutrow, who was her trainer before," offered Bell. "He knows her. Why start over?"

And deservedly so, according to Caruso. The New York trainer was instrumental in finding Grace Hall, having secured her as a yearling for \$95,000 at Keeneland September.

"Tony put together a group of people and he bought five yearlings," recalled Caruso. "Tony's budget for her at the time was \$100,000. He said he absolutely loved her, but he doubted he would get her for that price, but when the bidding stuck at \$95,000, he said he was the happiest guy in the world."

A native of Newark, New Jersey, the founder of Caruso Benefits Group began wrestling during his school days, honed skills early in North Jersey before later heading to Pennsylvania. Caruso, a three-time NCAA wrestling champion at Lehigh University, named Grace Hall after the arena he used to compete in. A year ago, Caruso learned that Lehigh University was going to honor Caruso by naming its new wrestling complex within Grace Hall after him, Dutrow insisted the partners name the highly regarded filly after Caruso's former stomping ground.

"We knew from the beginning that she was a special horse," he said. "She just did everything right. She's never had a scratch on her, she never missed a day of training. She was just one of those special horses that does everything right. We've been blessed. When you have a horse like that, it changes your life. I'm really going to miss her."

After a whirlwind year, Caruso was philosophical about parting with his prized filly.

"In 32 years, she is the first Grade I winner I had and the best racehorse I've ever had, but she has a special place in my heart because of the significance of her name," said Caruso. "It had to be fate. It's been an amazing ride. The two most exciting things in my life in this past year are both named Grace Hall."—C Bossinakis

Mandore Lands Zagora, Eden's Moon

Frenchman Nicolas de Watrigant's Mandore International Agency was involved in last night's Fasig-Tipton November sale in a big way. Buying on behalf of unnamed overseas interests, Mandore signed for last Friday's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf winner **Zagora (Fr)** (Green Tune) for \$2.5 million, and also landed the Grade I-winning filly **Eden's Moon** (Malibu Moon) for \$1,525,000.

De Watrigant confirmed that both mares would be retired. "They're for Europe," the 31-year-old said. "They may be bred here, we don't know yet, but they'll eventually go to Europe."

Zagora, offered by Oceanic Bloodstock as [hip 153](#), will be returning home after a hugely successful run in America that began when Martin Schwartz, who had bought her privately in France, shipped her over in the fall of 2010. By July of 2011, Zagora had won her first Grade I for Schwartz, taking Saratoga's Diana S. by daylight, and this year she added wins in three more graded stakes, including the GII Ballston Spa in August, prior to the Breeders' Cup.

Off at odds of 9-1 in the F/M Turf, Zagora enjoyed a dream trip under Javier Castellano and asserted over Marketing Mix (Medaglia d'Oro) by 3/4 lengths.

Eden's Moon, consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales as [hip 55](#), took a much different route to Grade I glory. Hailing from the family of Theatrical (Ire), she was produced by a half to the Grade I winners Paradise Creek (Irish River {Fr}), Wild Event (Wild Again) and Forbidden Creek (Pleasant Colony). Purchased from breeder Bridlewood Farm by Kaleem Shah for \$390,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale, Eden's Moon won this season's GI Las Virgenes S. and also won the GII San Clemente S. She banked nearly \$390,000 in total, nearly matching her purchase price, and added to Shah's coffers significantly last night.

Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura was on the phone with Shah while Eden's Moon was in the ring.

"He was pleased with the sale," said Sikura. "We thought she was worth \$1.5 million plus, so we were right there. I was hoping she'd make a little more. Maybe if she was in foal, she would have brought a little more. It was a good, fair price, a good profit for him. He enjoyed her as a race filly. She won a Grade I and successfully sold, so it's great."

Sikura said Shah prefers to stay out of the breeding side of the business. "It was time to either retire her to the broodmare band or sell her, and he likes to race," said Sikura. "He keeps the odd mare, but his passion is racing, and he wants to concentrate his resources on racehorses." -L Marquardt & P Denk



Hotly Contested at Fasig-Tipton

Gradually gathering momentum in the early part of Monday's auction, Fasig-Tipton's November sale saw its first seven-figure sale shortly after [Hip 41](#), ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Contested** (Ghostzapper--Gold Vault, by Arch), strode into the ring. The appropriately named filly triggered a lively bidding duel between several operations, including agent Steve Young, bidding alongside Ramona Bass from the upper balcony, and Dr. Mitsuru Ikeda stationed near the back walking ring. The bidding quickly escalated past the \$2-million mark for this season's GI Acorn S. and GI Test S. heroine before closing out at \$2.3 million.

"I saw the Acorn on TV and she was very impressive, winning wire to wire," explained Ikeda, veterinarian for Teruya Yoshida's Shadai Farm. "We are very excited to get her."

Trained by Bob Baffert for his wife Jill, Contested graduated at Santa Anita last October in her second start by 6 1/2 lengths. The \$110,000 Keeneland September purchase won the May 4 GIII Eight Belles S. followed by the Acorn. Asked to go beyond a mile for the first time in the 8 1/2-furlong GI Mother Goose S., she tired late to be fifth. Dropped back to her favored trip for the seven-furlong Aug. 23 Test, she came home a two-length winner over Gypsy Robin (Daaher).

"She was the highest-rated sprinting filly in the country," said John Sikura, whose Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned the filly. "She won two major Grade I New York races and she's a filly with a great future."

Contested's 12-year-old dam Gold Vault is a half-sister to top sprinter and dual Grade I winner Pomeroy (Boundary). Bred by Cherry Valley Farm, the Kentucky-bred has five wins and a second from seven starts, with \$633,754 in earnings to date.


Asked about his desire to add the Grade I winner to an operation that is well-reputed for churning out Classic horses, Ikeda added, "I wanted a speedy filly for a broodmare in Japan. We will bring her back to Japan some time next month and breed her to a Sunday Silence stallion."

It wasn't long before team Shadai was back in action, going to \$1.45 million for [Hip 45](#), Grade I winner **C.S. Silk** (Medaglia d'Oro). Out of Remember the Day (Settlement Day), the 6-year-old mare is a half-sister to GIII El Camino Real Derby winner Remember Sheikh (Sheikh Albadou {GB}). Bred by Hermitage Farm, the Kentucky-bred sold to trainer Dale Romans for \$120,000 at Keeneland September in 2007 before reeling in a cool \$1 million from Town & Country Farms at this sale last year. The mare sold Monday in foal to Distorted Humor. She was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

Victorious in the GIII Arlington Washington Lassie S. at two, C.S. Silk failed to win at the graded level at three, but finished a narrow second in the 2010 GI First Lady S. Last season, she got her Grade I when taking Belmont's Just A Game S. before retiring with seven wins and \$780,396 in earnings while racing for William Pacella, George Bonomo and Fred Barbara. **Cont. p13**

Northern Farm Still Targeting American Champs

Since the recession hit America in 2008, there has been a steady stream of high-quality mares leaving the country.

The flow of bloodstock overseas is nothing new, but the reasons for the recent exodus include the weak dollar, which created exchange rates favorable to some overseas buyers, particularly against the Japanese Yen.

Katsumi Yoshida, of Northern Farm in Japan, has been a willing buyer, and he continued to add to his collection of American champion mares Monday night at Fasig-Tipton's November sale with five purchases for \$5.77-million. Yoshida's acquisitions included Grade I winner Tapitsfly (Tapit) for \$1.85 million and 2011 champion female sprinter Musical Romance (Concorde's Tune) for \$1.6 million.

Musical Romance was at least the fourth U.S. champion Yoshida purchased at auction in Lexington over the last four years. He bought America's three-time champion mare and Horse of the Year Azeri for \$2.25 million at the 2009 Keeneland November sale.

Yoshida also bought 2010 champion female sprinter Dubai Majesty for \$1.1 million at Fasig-Tipton November the year of her championship. The previous year he purchased champion older mare Ginger Punch for \$1.6 million, again at Fasig-Tipton.

Yoshida's son Shunsuke represented his father at the sale on Monday. He talked about what Northern Farm looks for at the American breeding stock sales, and why they have been able to buy so many champions here recently.

"Of course we want a good individual, but sometimes we want a good pedigree, and sometimes we want good performance. We have many good stallions in Japan and we want to match up good mares with them," Shunsuke Yoshida said. "We value European mares also very good, but it is very difficult to buy good European bloodstock. I think here it is a little bit easier for us to buy good broodmares."


Musical Romance finished sixth in the the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint, a race she won during her championship season last year. Catalogued as hip 118, the 5-year-old Concorde's Tune mare was consigned by Three Chimney Sales, agent.

"We thought Musical Romance was a good-looking mare, and of course she was a champion mare sprinter last year, and those things attract us," Yoshida said.

Frank L. Jones Jr.'s Tapitsfly was a multiple Grade I winner in 2012. She sold as hip 166 and was consigned by her trainer Dale Romans' Romans Racing & Sales.

Yoshida also went to \$1 million for hip 84, Grade I winner Hot Cha Cha (Cactus Ridge), consigned by Dapple Stud, agent. Although 6-year-old Hot Cha Cha was not a champion, Yoshida pointed out she defeated a champion when winning the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. in 2009.

"She doesn't have so much pedigree, but she is a very attractive looking filly," Yoshida said. "She won a Grade I stake impressively, and she beat Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf winner [Shared Account] by five lengths, which attracted us." -Pete Denk

KEENELAND NOVEMBER FIRES UP TODAY

Following a successful night of trading across town, Keeneland begins its marathon November Breeding Stock Sale today at 10 a.m. The 11-day auction has a lot to live up to, given a 2011 renewal bolstered by the record-breaking \$55.8-million dispersal of Ned Evans's Spring Hill Farm, as well as a Chanteclair Farm dispersal topped by the \$8.5 million, and recent GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic heroine, Royal Delta (Empire Maker). That spurred big gains in the final figures. The average of \$81,641 was up 62.2%, while the median of \$24,000 was up 41.4%. The RNA rate was 19.9%.

The uniqueness of the 2011 auction will undoubtedly mean year-over-year figures will be tough to compare, but Keeneland's 2012 November line-up is hardly second-rate. During today's opening session, the 2011 GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro) goes through the ring as [hip 96](#). Raced by John Fort's Peachtree Stable, she sells as a racing or broodmare prospect. Other stars include **Zazu** (Tapit), Jerry and Ann Moss's dual Grade I winner who sells today from Lane's End's draft as [hip 149](#).

Also selling are a pair of daughters of the sensational broodmare Magnificent Style (Silver Hawk): the 9-year-old **Distinctive Look (Ire)** (Danehill) is offered by Lane's End today as [hip 184](#); the 7-year-old **Changing Skies (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) is offered by Hill 'n' Dale Sales tomorrow as [hip 374](#).

"Last year, having the Spring Hill Farm dispersal and the Chanteclair dispersal, was a once-in-a-lifetime experience," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "We wish we had dispersals like that every year. But the November sale changes from year to year. This year's November Sale is a more traditional November Sale compared to last year, but I think it's a good, solid catalogue, and I think it's going to be a strong sale. We have some very nice, quality offerings here, both racemares off the track, mares in foal, and foals themselves. I think everything looks pretty decent."

In all, 3,958 lots are catalogued, including 1,890 broodmares and broodmare prospects, 1,691 weanlings, 363 horses of racing age, four yearlings, nine stallions and one share in Macho Uno.

If, scanning the catalogue, it seemed there were more weanlings than usual, you're not mistaken. Of the 400 horses in Book 1, 209 are unnamed (and thus presumed to be weanlings). That's a total of 52.2% of the book. By comparison, 167 of the 429 horses in the 2011 Book 1 were unnamed, or 38.9%. Russell said Keeneland made no effort to include more weanlings in the book. **Cont. p18**

"It's just how it shook out," said Russell. "The mix for November sales change from year to year, and this is how it came out this year. But I do think the weanling market has been very good the last few years, and I think breeders are taking advantage of that."

Russell said that action has been good on the Keeneland sales grounds the last few days. "The consignors I've spoken to have been busy; a lot of them were surprised at how busy they were over the weekend, particularly on Saturday," he said. "The right people are here looking, and we look forward to a successful sale."

PLANS FOR DANEDREAM

Connections of **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) have announced that they hope the star German filly will contest the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in March before being covered by Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Forced to miss her defence of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe due to quarantine restrictions imposed on Cologne as a result of a case of EIA (equine infectious anaemia), Teruya Yoshida and Gestut Berg Eberstein's 4-year-old will be geared towards a Meydan finale if the lockdown is lifted in two months' time. Patrick Barbe, European representative for Yoshida, told *Racing Post*, "All plans depend on the German Ministry of Agriculture. They will retest all horses at Cologne in the first week of January and, all being well, the transport ban will be lifted. If Danedream is in good condition then, she'll go to Dubai for the Sheema Classic before visiting Frankel. If not, she'll go straight to Frankel."

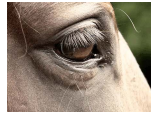

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

BY ANDREW CAULFIELD

The whole concept of the Breeders' Cup is to attract the crème de la crème of the Thoroughbred world. So, for investors in bloodstock, it is reassuring when Breeders' Cup winner after Breeders' Cup winner is sired by one or other of the elite stallions.

The Breeders' Cup website unfortunately no longer seems to include its very useful statistical section, but the stallions with the most winners include such standouts as Sadler's Wells, Danzig, Kris S., Storm Cat, Nureyev, Gone West and Awesome Again, all of whom commanded substantial six-figure fees at some point in their careers.

Most of the contestants at the latest Breeders' Cup were conceived before prices started to slump, and even the 2-year-olds are the result of coverings in 2009, when fees were only just beginning to slide. So you would expect the Breeders' Cup's 14 graded winners to include several by the stallions which commanded the highest prices in the U.S. Ireland and England. However, the likes of A.P. Indy, Dansili, Dynaformer, Montjeu, Smart Strike and Unbridled's Song all had to be content with honorable near-misses (some of them after serious trouble in running). Others, such as Distorted Humor, Galileo, Giant's Causeway and Street Cry, failed to factor this time.

In their absence, the focus turned to a bunch of largely less aristocratic stallions. Only one of the 13 stallions involved--Royal Delta's sire Empire Maker--scraped into the six-figure bracket. Of course Tapit now ranks among the elite, with a fee of \$125,000 earlier this year, but his fee was only a tenth of that amount when he sired Tapizar, winner of the Dirt Mile. His fee was still no higher than \$35,000 when he sired He's Had Enough, the narrow loser of the Juvenile.

The next-highest-priced stallion after Empire Maker was Henrythenavigator, who notched up his second Grade/Group 1 winner from his first crop with the Juvenile Turf victory of George Vancouver (whose dam Versailles Treaty twice finished runner-up in the Distaff). Henrythenavigator started out at \$65,000 in 2009, but his fee promptly fell to \$40,000, \$35,000 and \$25,000 over the next three years. He will no doubt be treated with much more respect when he stands his first season in Ireland next year.

The upwardly mobile Harlan's Holiday looks due a rise in fee now that he holds an advantage of more than \$500,000 in the race to become champion sire of 2-year-olds. His Juvenile hero Shanghai Bobby is one of five 2-year-old stakes winners by him this year. It's worth reminding everyone that he was still based at Airdrie when he sired this crop at a fee of \$30,000.

Another who stood the 2009 season at \$30,000 was Henny Hughes, sire of Juvenile Fillies winner Beholder. Unfortunately, he struggled afterwards, to the extent that he was sold this year to stand in Western Australia.

Mizzen Mast had the distinction of being the only stallion to strike twice, thanks to the 4-year-old Mizdirection and the 2-year-old French raider Flotilla. He is following in the footsteps of his sire Cozzene, a winner of the Breeders' Cup Mile who sired the Classic winner Alphabet Soup and the Turf winner Tikkanen.

Mizzen Mast wasn't finding it easy going when he covered his fifth book of mares in 2007, at a fee of \$15,000, and this fifth crop numbers only 61 named foals. However, those 61 include Mizdirection and Ultimate Eagle, who also shines at Santa Anita, where he has won the Gil Oak Tree Derby and Gil Strub S.

Fortunately, Mizzen Mast's success with the likes of Mast Track, Madeo, Jibboom and Midships ensured he had plenty of support in 2009, giving Mizzen Mast a current crop of 96 2-year-olds. They were sired at a fee of \$17,500. With Flotilla giving this crop its first Grade I winner, Mizzen Mast now has five Grade I winners from seven crops of racing age, which is a pretty good record for a stallion who has never stood for more than \$20,000, and mainly for \$15,000.

The other stallions responsible for graded winners at the Breeders' Cup were Green Tune, who stood at €15,000 when he sired Zagora; Fort Larned's sire E Dubai, who stood at \$15,000 in 2007; and Teufflesberg, who sired Trinniberg in his first season at a fee of \$10,000.

Even cheaper were Wiseman's Ferry, who sired Wise Dan in New York when his fee was \$7,500; Bowman's Band, who sired Groupie Doll at a fee of \$6,000; and Little Mike's sire Spanish Steps, who was available for \$5,000. That leaves Luhuk, who sired Calidoscopio in Argentina, having stood the 2002 American season at \$10,000.

It will surely surprise no one that the Storm Cat male line was one of the most successful over the two days.

Although Storm Cat sired winners of the Classic, Sprint and two of the Juvenile Fillies, he had narrowly failed to get his own name on the Breeders' Cup Roll of Honor, going down by a mere nose in the 1985 Juvenile. His son Hennessy suffered a similar fate 10 years later, when he failed by a neck to hold off Unbridled's Song, but Hennessy's son Johannesburg avenged those defeats by winning stylishly in 2001.

Hennessy, of course, was the stallion responsible for Henny Hughes and Wiseman's Ferry, and it was Johannesburg who sired Teuflesberg.

Storm Cat's son Harlan finished a creditable fourth to Cherokee Run in the 1994 Sprint, but his son Harlan's Holiday came home only ninth in the 2002 Classic. As mentioned earlier, Harlan's Holiday sired the Juvenile winner Shanghai Bobby, meaning the Storm Cat branch landed the Juvenile, the Juvenile Fillies, the Mile and the Sprint, so this line is losing none of its ability to sire fast or precocious performers.

Wise Dan must now have claims to the Horse of the Year title, which would be an enormous achievement

for Wiseman's Ferry, who covered a book of 32 mares at a fee of only \$3,500 in Pennsylvania earlier this year.

Wiseman's Ferry first caught my attention as a sire in the fall of 2009, when his son Swilly Ferry landed the £183,000 jackpot carried by the Weatherbys Insurance £300,000 2-Y-O S. at Doncaster.

My research at the time revealed that the son of Hennessy and the Silver Deputy mare Emmaus had ranked among the top half-dozen weanling colts sold in the U.S. in 1999, when he drew a bid of \$775,000.

His price reflected the fact that Storm Cat had sired three group/graded winners from the colt's second dam, La Affirmed. One of these three was Bernstein, who had briefly looked a star in the making in the months preceding the sale of the Hennessy foal.

When the Bernstein bubble burst, the Emmaus colt struggled when re-offered at the yearling sales. RNA'd at \$625,000 at Keeneland's July Sale, he then sold for \$300,000 two months later. Sent to Ireland to join Bernstein's trainer Aidan O'Brien, Wiseman's Ferry proved useful, but distinctly inferior to Johannesburg, another of O'Brien's Hennessy colts.

With his limitations exposed in Europe, Wiseman's Ferry returned to his birthplace, where he became a dual Derby winner. That description flatters him somewhat, as his Derby successes came in a pair of Grade III events--the Lone Star Derby and the West Virginia Derby. Those efforts earned him an International Classification rating of 112, but his son looks set to better that figure by a substantial margin.

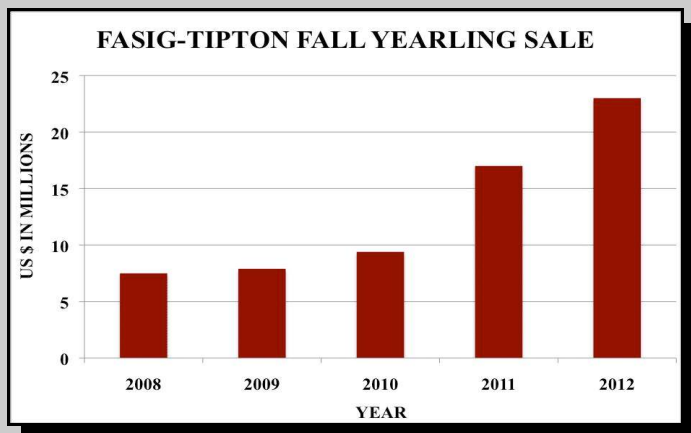

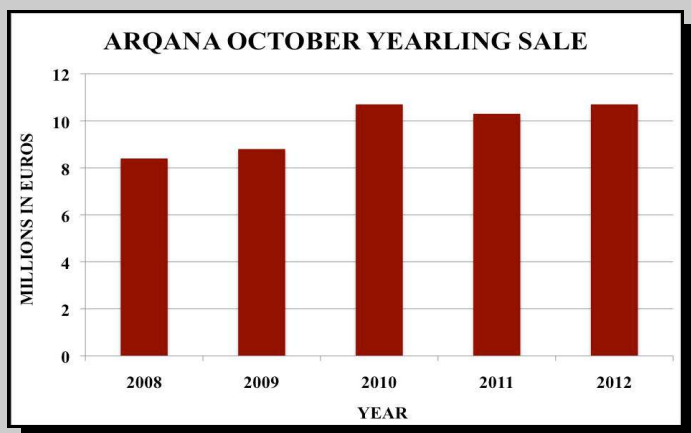
