GISW JERSEY TOWN TO DARBY DAN

GISW Jersey Town (Speightstown--Jersey Girl, by Belong to Me) will be retired to Darby Dan Farm after making his final career start in the Nov. 24 GI Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct. Out of multiple Grade I winner Jersey Girl, the chestnut will stand the 2013 season for a fee of \$10,000, stands and nurses. Jersey Town will participate in Darby Dan's "Share The Upside" program for breeders.

"Jersey Town is an extremely fast and high-class miler by one of the hottest stallions around in Speightstown," said John Phillips, owner of Darby Dan. "It's pretty incredible how he's been able to maintain his soundness and form at the highest level of racing, which is a tribute to [Charles] Fipke's program. We've been proud to stand Grade I colts Perfect Soul and Tale of Ekati for Chuck, and we're excited about the opportunity to stand Jersey Town in 2013." Campaigned by Fipke and trainer Barclay Tagg, the homebred recorded his biggest win in the 2010 GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile, where he defeated Grade I winners Haynesfield (Speightstown), Vineyard Haven (Lido Palace {Chi}), Bribron (Fr) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) and Girolamo (A.P. Indy) with a 111 Beyer speed figure. This season, he won the Sept. 29 GI Kelso H. over a field that included Grade I winners Shackelford (Forestry), To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) and subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Tapizar (Tapit). He retires with a record of six wins and eight seconds from 21 starts and earnings of \$819,668.

PULPIT FILLY TOPS DAY 7 AT KEENELAND

Pastilla, a 3-year-old filly by Pulpit, was secured by James Ryan for the top price of \$190,000 at Keeneland's seventh session of the November sale in Lexington. Consigned by Hagyard Farm, agent, [Hip 2221](#) is out of stakes winner Paiota Falls (Kris S.), who is a half-sister to stakes winner and graded stakes placed West Coast Swing (Gone West). The 11-year-old mare is out of Dance Swiftly (Danzig), a full-sister to Canadian Horse of the Year and Broodmare of the Year Dance Smartly and graded stakes winner and leading sire Smart Strike. This is the family of champions Classy 'n Smart (Smarten), Sky Classic (Nijinsky II) and Regal Classic (Vice Regent). Heading the weanling class Monday was [Hip 2425](#), a colt by freshman sire Tiz Wonderful (Tiznow) who was purchased by WEF Stable for \$70,000. Offered by Threave Main Stud LLC, the Apr. 9 foal is out of Coffee (El Corredor), a half-sister to MGSP Here I Go (Mr. Prospector), the dam of GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Summerly (Summer Squall). At the conclusion of yesterday's seventh session, a cumulative total of 1473 head sold for \$130,171,600, while averaging \$88,372. The median was \$40,000. Cumulative totals in 2011 included the dispersals of the Estate of Edward Evan's Spring Hill Farm in addition to that of Saud bin Khaled's Palides Investments N.V. The sale continues through Friday, with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m. The session can be streamed at www.keeneland.com.

SIR PRANCEALOT TO TALLY-HO

Andrew Tinkler's G2 Flying Childers S. victor **Sir Prancealot (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}--Mona Em {Ire}, by Catrail) has met with a career-ending injury and will undertake stallion duties at Tony and Roger O'Callaghan's Tally-Ho Stud in Co. Westmeath for next year. Stepping up from a Bath maiden score to easily win the May 31 Listed National S. at Sandown, the Richard Hannon trainee ran fourth to unbeaten ♂ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♂ Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. June 19. He then finished runner-up to Reckless Abandon (GB)

(Exchange Rate) in the July 22 G2 Prix Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte, and was behind that unbeaten rival once more when fourth in the Aug. 19 G1 Prix Morny at Deauville. The bay claimed his career high in the G2 Flying Childers S. at Doncaster last time Sept. 14. "Sir Prancealot has a great attitude, an awful lot of ability and is a gentleman to deal with," assistant trainer Richard Hannon, Jr. told *Racing Post*. "It's a great pity that his racing career has ended with a training injury, as his performance in the Flying Childers over five furlongs was a really stunning performance. He was brilliant at five furlongs and was undefeated at that trip. He's a very good-looking, athletic individual with a high cruising speed." Sir Prancealot retires with a career record of 6-3-1-0, and earnings of £101,124.

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

November 13, 1988...Sunday Silence graduated by 10 lengths at Hollywood Park in his second start.

November 15, 1990...Alydar, runner-up to Affirmed in all three 1978 Triple Crown races, died at Calumet Farm in Kentucky.

November 15, 1995...Jockey **Julie Krone** rode her 3,000th career winner, taking the fourth race at Aqueduct with Dustin's Dreamer.

November 16, 1951...The **Pimlico Special**, then a winner-take-all \$15,000 contest, became the first race scheduled to be televised nationally. The winner was C.T. Chenery's Bryan G.

November 18, 1961...Pimlico...Jockey **Eddie Arcaro** rode his last Northern American race of his career, finishing third aboard Endymion in the Pimlico Futurity. He retired with a then-record \$30,039,543 in purses.

November 18, 1972...Two-year-old **Secretariat** capped his Horse of the Year season with a 3 ½-length in the Garden State S. The winner's share of the purse \$179,199, the most Secretariat ever won in a single race.

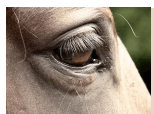

The description unsung hero could almost have been coined with Caro in mind. When breeders eulogize about the European turf performers who exerted such a powerful influence on American breeding during the 1970s and '80s, Caro tends to be overlooked in favor of the likes of Blushing Groom, Nijinsky, Nureyev, Roberto, Lyphard, Riverman or even Storm Bird. Fortunately, the big gray horse keeps on reminding us of his many talents by cropping up in the pedigrees of numerous big winners.

Mizzen Mast, the only stallion to score a Grade I double at the Breeders' Cup, is a grandson of Caro. Caro also sired Trolley Song, the mare best known as the dam of Unbridled's Song. While Unbridled's Song had to be content with a couple of near misses in the Santa Anita

championships, his brother Spanish Steps hit the target with Little Mike in the Turf. Since then we've seen daughters of Unbridled's Song represented by Group winners in Australia and Japan.

Caro's name also appears in the pedigree of Morandi. This rapidly improving gray colt last week added a seven-length romp in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud to his recent 12-length victory in the G3 Prix de Conde. This late-season double hasn't been achieved by many horses, but they include The Wonder, who went on to win the Prix d'Ispehan, Prix Jacques le Marois and a pair of Grade Is in California; Pistolet Bleu, who took third in the Arc at three and impressively won the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud at four; and Poliglote, a Prix du Jockey-Club runner-up who sired the latest Arc winner, Solemia.

Caro ranks alongside Lyphard, Riverman and Arctic Tern as one of the champion French stallions in the late 1970s and 1980s who spent the latter part of their stallion careers in Kentucky. He arrived at Spendthrift in 1977, in the rush to beat the ban on imports caused by an outbreak of contagious equine metritis. Caro had become a target for American breeders in the summer of 1977 following Madelia's successes in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and Prix de Diane and Crystal Palace's triumph in the Prix du Jockey-Club--a sequence of Classic victories which brought him the sires' championship. He was re-syndicated in Kentucky for \$4.6 million.

I still look back at Caro's racing career with admiration. He was sired by Fortino, a precocious Grey Sovereign colt who gained two of his juvenile successes in France over the now redundant distant of four furlongs. Fortino maintained his speed at three, when he won the Prix de l'Abbaye.

Caro's dam Chambord could hardly have been more different. A daughter of a St Leger winner, she had ranked among the best staying fillies of 1958, when she showed she relished 1 3/4 miles or more.

Rather unusually, Caro showed that the mating between his starkly different parents had succeeded in imparting some of Fortino's speed, together with a degree of Chambord's stamina.

Although he stood 16.3 hands, he made a winning debut over 4 1/2 furlongs early in his 2-year-old season and trained on to become a Classic-winning miler at three. Then, at four, he confirmed his standing as a top-class middle-distance performer. His final appearance saw him finish a creditable fourth to the great Mill Reef in the Arc. He retired sound after 19 starts, several of which were contested on very firm or hard tracks in those long-distant days before watering of courses became widespread.

With Caro in Kentucky, where he was to sire Cozzene, Dr. Carter, Siberian Express, Tejano, Winning Colors, Turgeon, With Approval and Golden Pheasant, European breeders turned to his sons, such as Crystal Palace.

Homebred by Baron Guy de Rothschild, Crystal Palace retired to the family's Haras de Meautry after confirming his status with a fourth in The Minstrel's King George and a third in Alleged's first Arc. He looked well qualified for stallion success, as his dam Hermieres won the Prix de Diane and his second dam Vieille Pierre was a half-sister to the champion French stallion Vieux Manoir.

Crystal Palace fulfilled his potential to the extent that he became champion sire in 1985, but by that time he too had joined the exodus of highly qualified French stallions. This time, though, the destination was Japan. His greatest achievements came in the role of broodmare sire, with one of his daughters producing the Japanese Derby winner Tanino Gimlet (sire of the outstanding Vodka). Another daughter, Alruccaba, founded one of Europe's most successful families.

Another of Crystal Palace's successful broodmare daughters, Marie de Vez, is the second dam of Morandi. Marie de Vez is also the second dam of the classic-placed Ana Marie, who defeated the males in the G2 Prix d'Harcourt over a mile and a quarter, and Charmo, who developed into a smart turf miler in California.

As Morandi's broodmare sire Bering won the Prix du Jockey-Club and his third dam Ordenstreue won the German Oaks, there is no shortage of stamina in the bottom half of Morandi's pedigree. Indeed he has already won over a mile and a quarter in very testing conditions, so the distance of the Prix du Jockey-Club should present no problems for him, even though he is by Holy Roman Emperor.

The main unknown about Morandi is whether he will be as effective on much faster ground next summer. There is little in his pedigree to suggest he needs very soft ground, as Holy Roman Emperor acted on fast ground and Morandi's broodmare sire Bering handled a wide variety of conditions. Perhaps it is worth mentioning, though, that Holy Roman Emperor's daughter Homecoming Queen relished the soft ground when she won this year's 1000 Guineas.

Incidentally, when I reviewed Homecoming Queen's pedigree back in May, I said that I would have liked Holy Roman Emperor to have achieved more with his first two crops. I'm pleased to say that he has since added a pleasing number of group winners to his total, with Morandi and Homecoming Queen leading a team which also includes Ishvana, Leitir Mor, Maureen and Sunday Times.

THE MELBOURNE CUP CARNIVAL

The beginning of November marked the week we had all been waiting for since our arrival in Australia in August--the Melbourne Cup Carnival. With several days of top-quality racing ahead of us combined with a range of visits to trainers and other local racing organisations, it promised to be a concentrated exposure to the industry in Victoria--the home of Australia's three top races (the Caulfield Cup, the Cox Plate and the Melbourne Cup).

Our first port of call was the city's Flemington racecourse for the opening day of the Carnival. While Melbourne Cup day itself forms the centrepiece, Derby Day is considered by some racing purists to be the best single day of Thoroughbred racing in Australia, with nine Group races and more than A\$4.5 million prize money on offer.

With resident Australian trainee Jim Clarke on hand to dispense some valuable pre-race form analysis, our preparation was as thorough as it possibly could have been. However, even the most attentive members of the group were left double-checking the form book as the 40-1 chance Fiveandahalfstar took the headline G1 Victoria Derby. As a result, a few trainees' pockets were a little lighter by the end of the afternoon, but our first taster of the Carnival didn't fail to disappoint; the consensus amongst us was that Australia is in a league of its own when it comes to big race days, with exceptionally efficient organisation, fantastic facilities and an atmosphere that really celebrates and embraces racing as a sport.

As Melbourne revelled in the heady build up to 'Cup Day,' we were kept busy with a range of visits to several local trainers' yards, including Peter Moody, Robbie Griffiths and Robert Smerdon. For the budding trainers in the group it was a fantastic opportunity to pick the brains of some of the leading racing industry figures in Australia on topics ranging from feeding to treadmill exercise protocols.

I found it interesting to note that virtually every trainer that we met with spoke of the benefits of incorporating training aids into their horses' regimes, from GPS monitors to water walkers and even a salt room to help keep horses' airways clear. From our experiences in Australia so far it seems that when it comes to the use of such aids, Australian trainers tend towards the more liberal end of the spectrum, embracing them as a valuable addition to traditional training protocols. But many of us agreed that with this plethora of new (and often expensive) equipment, the conundrum is to decide which of the tools are the most useful--particularly when examining them in the context of a budget. It's difficult to tell, but for now it seems to be a case of 'all training aids are equal, but some are more equal than others'; hopefully the remainder of the Darley Flying Start program will help us to arrive at a more firm conclusion.

Our final visit before the Melbourne Cup itself gave us an exciting behind the scenes look at the NASA-like hub of raceday operations at Victoria Racing Club. Just 24 hours away from the big race, club CEO Dale Monteith explained some of the meticulous planning that had gone into running the day, from coordinating helicopter landings to arranging security, transport and the huge number of facilities required to keep a crowd of 120,000 fed, watered and happy. It was clear that absolutely nothing had been left to chance, confirmed by a pile of contingency plans on the table for any conceivable problem that might possibly arise on the day.

The 'first Tuesday in November' finally arrived, and the atmosphere at Flemington was as electric as we'd anticipated. Designated as a public holiday in Victoria, the Melbourne Cup is firmly embedded within the social and sporting fabric of Australia, and with an estimated 70% of Australians betting on the race it has a cultural significance that is probably unmatched anywhere else in the world.

Even against darkened skies and rumbles of thunder, the Melbourne Cup was the spectacle that it always promised to be; a three-minute blur of colour, excitement, noise and adrenaline that all of us will savour for a long time, especially the two Irish trainees in the group following the result that the first seven horses home were bred in their native country.

With the Carnival over and our time at Darley's farms in the Hunter Valley complete, all that is left for us is to complete our November work placements. With trainees heading off to work with a range of trainers and organisations including Gai Waterhouse, Peter Moody, New Zealand Thoroughbred Marketing, Inglis Bloodstock and Hong Kong Jockey Club, the placements promise a fantastic conclusion to our time 'down under' before we head on to our penultimate destination, Dubai. As always, exciting times are very much on the horizon.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

SPORT READY TO TURN CALENDAR PAGE

There may be 57 days left on the 2012 calendar, but thoroughbred racing is done for the year. The Breeders' Cup is in the books and what's left in November and December is inconsequential, just anonymous horses running somewhere so people will have something to bet on. That's OK. No one will miss 2012.

Sure, there were some good moments. Jockey Mario Gutierrez came straight out of the minor leagues to win the Kentucky Derby and Preakness aboard I'll Have Another. The Travers produced the first dead-heat in the long history of the signature race at Saratoga, where business was robust. The Breeders' Cup was run amid splendid weather at beautiful and classy Santa Anita and the races produced a plethora of memorable moments and championship performances.

But as 2013 approaches, this handful of positive moments seems lost among an avalanche of bad.

This was the year where the sport's uglier aspects exploded out from the rug where they had been buried. The media, and in particular the New York Times, spent much of the year punishing the sport, focusing on drugs, breakdowns and death.

The racing industry had to cringe every time it picked up the morning paper, hoping today wasn't the day there would be another damaging story.

There was never a lack of ammunition for horse racing's critics.

Rick Dutrow, a Kentucky Derby winner and one of the most prominent trainers in the sport, was caught up in still another drug scandal and spent much of his year finding legal loopholes to keep his career alive after he was handed a 10-year suspension. He appears to be running out of tricks, but he is still actively training.

A drug called Demorphin, which is said to be 30 to 40 times more powerful than morphine, found its way to backstretches across North America. By the time regulators caught up to the cheaters, there were dozens of trainers in the Southwest facing serious suspensions for the drug they also call frog juice.

At Aqueduct, where purses soared to once inconceivable levels after slot machines were installed at the track, 21 horses died while vying for those fat pots at the Big A. That got attention and drew the wrath of New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo, who didn't need any more excuses to come down hard on the New York Racing Association. Whether intentional or not, NYRA failed to adjust the takeout rate on certain bets, which meant that gamblers were cheated out of \$8.5 million in winnings. That cost two key NYRA executives their jobs and ignited Cuomo's coup.

He directed a state takeover of the organization, installing a new board of directors and handpicked its new chairman.

A Triple Crown rivalry between Shanghai Bobby (right) and He's Had Enough would add a spark to the 2013 season. On the racetrack, what could have been the best racing story of the decade fizzled when I'll Have Another was injured prior to the Belmont Stakes. For the 34th straight year, there would be no Triple Crown winner.

Even some of the good guys had a rough year. Charismatic trainer Bob Baffert suffered a heart attack while in Dubai preparing for the Dubai World Cup. Thankfully, he survived and returned to Southern California and had another strong year, at least on the track.

It looks like 2013 will go down under the well-at-least-it-can't-get-any-worse category. And it won't.

The sport is taking its problems seriously and is starting to make changes that were long overdue. In the aftermath of the Aqueduct breakdowns, a task force and the New York State Racing and Wagering Board worked together to enact tougher drug rules and put other changes in place that should make New York racing safer. The Jockey Club has stepped up to offer the sport the sort of institutional leadership it had been lacking for so long and is working hard to make the game safer, cleaner and better.

The hope is that the focus can return to what happens on the racetrack and that 2013 can shine in that area. Most of the top horses from 2012 that remained healthy through the year will be back and the results of the Breeders' Cup indicate that the 2013 Triple Crown campaign could be a good one.

The Breeders' Cup Juvenile was won by a determined colt named Shanghai Bobby, who will go into his 3-year-old season undefeated. The best part of this is that he is ridden by a female, Rosie Napravnik. She is articulate, marketable and, best of all, a helluva race rider. Can a female jockey win the Kentucky Derby? That could be the type of feel-good story the sport so desperately needs.

Finishing right behind him was He's Had Enough. A horse that had shown nothing prior to the Juvenile, he ran a terrific race and might have won if not having a lot of traffic problems. He's ridden by Gutierrez, trained by Doug O'Neill and owned by Paul Reddam, the exact same team that brought you I'll Have Another. One year later, could they possibly take another crack at the Triple Crown that slipped out of their hands?

They, like all other 3-year-olds, will have to qualify for the Derby under a new system put in place by Churchill Downs that favors horses who run in Grade 1 races as 3-year-olds and de-emphasizes important 2-year-old races like the Juvenile. So they may have to prove themselves all over again next year.

January is typically a sleepy month in horse racing, but horses such as Shanghai Bobby and He's Had Enough may resurface as soon as February in important Kentucky Derby preps. A new year will soon be here. Thank goodness.

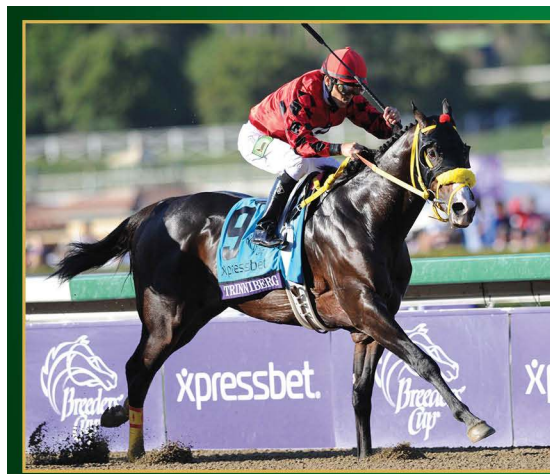

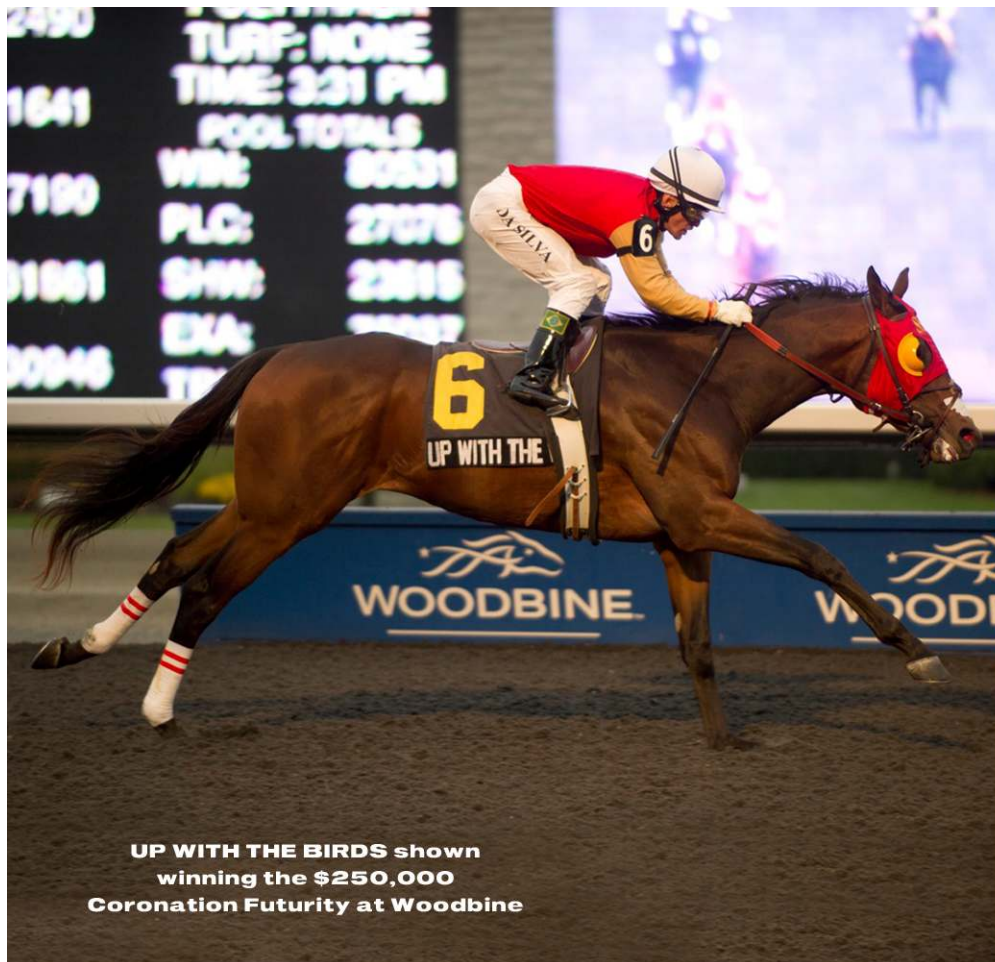

Best Trip: Hightail

By getting back in the Breeders' Cup winner's circle for the first time since 2005, trainer Wayne Lukas was a big story in the Juvenile Sprint. But Lukas couldn't have gotten it done without a perfect ride from Rajiv Maragh. The horse, a maiden coming, never left the fence, closing up a hole on the rail to kick off Breeders' Cup 29.

He rode Royal Delta like he knew she was tons the best, even in this loaded field, and he was right. Rather than letting someone else take charge, he took her right to the front and dared anyone to catch him.

Worst Ride: Pat Valenzuela on Merit Man

In the Juvenile Sprint, P-Val broke like a rocket and could have immediately opened up on the field. Instead, he gathered his horse up and let just about everyone catch up to him, throwing away what was a big advantage. Then he opened the rail for Hightail, gift-wrapping the victory for him.

Best Race: The Ladies' Classic

Three Breeders' Cup winners, three champions, two undefeated horses, serious Grade I types who went off at double-digit odds and a great performance from Royal Delta.

Worst Race: The Juvenile Sprint

Five horses, one of whom was a \$20,000 claimer. The winner was a maiden. They can't pull the plug on this fiasco soon enough.

Best Training Job: Richard Mandella

The crafty Hall of Famer made a risky decision, opting for the Juvenile Fillies for Beholder, when she would have been 1-99 in the Juvenile Sprint. Obviously, he knew what he was doing when he went for the prestige and the big bucks. And he got a fast horse who had never gone a distance to handle the move to a mile and a sixteenth with ease.

Worst Training Job: Bob Baffert

It just goes to show you that even the great ones can have a bad few days. Baffert sent out eight horses, all of them very live on paper. Only one (Executiveprivilege) hit the board.

Best Handicapping Job: Pick Six Players

The people who came up with Tapizar, Little Mike and Trinniberg to nail the Pick Six deserve every penny of the \$419,254 they won.

Worst Handicapping Job: Amazombie Fans

Last year, Amazombie won the Ancient Title and was sent off at 7-1 before winning the Sprint. This year, he was a dud in the same race but was bet down to 7-2 favoritism in the Sprint. He finished eighth.

Best Touch: Tony Bennett

Having Bennett serenade the crowd as the field was coming on the track for the Classic. Very nice.

Worst Touch: Nothing

Santa Anita is a great place to host the Breeders' Cup, and it was two days of great racing amid perfect weather.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY...

November 18, 1979...Jockey **Laffit Pincay Jr.** picked up his 4,000th career victory aboard **Gladiolus** in the eighth race at Aqueduct.

November 19, 1995...Jockey **Russell Baze** became the first rider to win at least 400 races a year for four consecutive years, riding **Royal Boutique** to victory at Golden Gate Fields.


November 21, 1998...**Charismatic** broke his maiden by five lengths in a \$62,500 claimer for two-year-olds at Hollywood Park. Dangled for a tag once more as a three-year-old, the Robert B. and Beverly J. Lewis colorbearer would go on to win the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S.

November 22, 1990...Jockey **Pat Day** rode his 5,000th winner, guiding **Screen Prospect** to victory in the Falls City H. at Churchill Downs. Day became the 12th rider in history to reach that milestone.

November 26, 1946...American Air Lines, transporting six horses, flew from Shannon Airport in Ireland to Newark Airport in New Jersey to complete the first trans-Atlantic flight ever for Thoroughbreds. The plane arrived November 27.

November 26, 1994...**Cigar** earned his first stakes success when he drew off to win the NYRA Mile by seven lengths. The race would be named the Cigar Mile three years later in his honor.

November 26, 1992...**Sandy Hawley** became the ninth North American rider to win 6,000 races, guiding **Summer Commander** to victory in the second race at Greenwood Racecourse.
