TORREALBA FAMILY, THREE CHIMNEYS JOIN FORCES

The Borges Torrealba family has become a partner in Three Chimneys, according to Case Clay, president and CEO of the Midway, Kentucky operation.

“Three Chimneys’ mission is and always has been to attract the best horses and customers in the world,” said Clay. “Strategically, we think in order to execute our long-term strategy and continue this mission with strength, we are happy to align ourselves with a well-capitalized, long-term partner, which is a family who share our ideas, vision and values.”

The Brazil-based Goncalo Torrealba, representing his family’s Borges Torrealba Holdings, was an active buyer last week in Lexington, securing seven mares, which include Pure Clan (Pure Prize), the \$4.5-million topper at Keeneland November; as well as Pilfer (Deputy Minister), a \$1.95-million purchase at Fasig-Tipton. Both mares are in foal to Bernardini. All mares will reside at Three Chimneys, and will be owned in a partnership between the Clay and

Torrealba families. Breeding plans for the 2013 season have not yet been finalized.

“We are building on our 40-year foundation for the next 40 years by taking our long-term relationship with the Torrealba family to new heights,” Clay added.

The Borges Torrealba family owns and operates Grupo Libra, a group of diversified companies in Brazil, including Brazil’s largest container shipping terminal. Grupo Libra is a third-generation family business that was founded by Goncalo’s grandfather, Wilfred Borges.

In years past, and separate from this partnership, Torrealba operated Stud TNT in Brazil. That farm currently stands 14 stallions, including notable shuttlers Leroidesanimaux (Brz) (Candy Stripes) and Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor). Stud TNT campaigned Leroidesanimaux to Eclipse Award honors in 2005, and also bred this year’s dual Grade I winner Love and Pride (A.P. Indy).

In 2011, Three Chimneys announced that Everett Dobson would be a minority partner in its stallions. Caleb’s Posse (Posse), a multiple Grade I winner campaigned by Dobson’s Cheyenne Stables, will be entering stud at Three Chimneys in 2013.

FRANKEL FEE SET

Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}--Kind {Ire}, by Danehill) will stand his first season at a fee of £125,000, it was announced yesterday. Following the great colt’s crowning at Tuesday’s Cartier Horse of the Year for the second time, Juddmonte Farms’ General Manager Philip Mitchell said, “The fee for Frankel reflects his merits as being perhaps the greatest racehorse we have ever witnessed. He is by Galileo, who is now recognised as the best sire in the world; and out of Kind, a winner of six races [from five to seven furlongs] and herself a daughter of one of the most influential stallions in the history of Thoroughbred breeding, Danehill.”

TDN *Q&A*

Recently, Goncalo Torrealba, representing his family's Borges Torrealba Holdings, LLC, purchased over \$8 million worth of mares at the Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton Sales. We sat down with Goncalo, a shareholder and board member of Grupo Libra, to hear about his family's new investments in North America racing.

TDN: Why did your family decide to make an investment in the U.S. Thoroughbred market at this time?

GT: I was the first one in my family to get interested in horse racing. Over the years my family has also developed a taste for it. We believe in horse racing in America, we believe in the horsemanship in America, and we think that it is still the best place in the world to raise and race horses. The quality is second to none. Look at the sales. Everyone is complaining that the Japanese, the Europeans, and basically people from all over the world are coming here, buying the best mares and taking them elsewhere. If we didn't have the best mares, they wouldn't be coming. I think we should keep them, and we are doing our share trying to keep them here.

TDN: Today we are reporting that you are partnering with Three Chimneys. How did this come about?

GT: Robert [Clay] and I have been talking for several months about the current market cycle. We realized that we share a common vision. Not only have I known Robert for over 25 years, I have observed the development of Three Chimneys as a customer and as a friend. Our families share the same core values. As our family considered investment alternatives, it made sense to us to partner with a world-class brand. Together, we bought some very high-class mares at the Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland sales, and we plan to add to that inventory in years to come. We also plan to invest in top-class stallions. **Cont. p4**

TDN: How does this investment affect Three Chimneys customers, or other partners?

GT: Our partnership does not affect them in any way. Three Chimneys will simply be positioned as a strong player for the future, which will include strong mare support for the stallions. I have been impressed by Case and his young team. I expect them to bring some exciting opportunities to the table, and I look forward to benefitting from some of their long-standing relationships, loyal customers, and great strategic partners, like Everett Dobson. They have an exciting young stallion in Big Brown, and a solid group of proven young stallions, including Exchange Rate and Flower Alley.

TDN: There are many Thoroughbred operations in the U.S. Why specifically Three Chimneys?

GT: Partnering with Three Chimneys assures our family participation in American breeding and racing at the highest level. If it wasn't one of the prime operations in the world, we would not have considered it. We thought it was appropriate to join families. We are a family-owned and -run business, also. Robert and I find so many things in common, it is scary. The pursuit of excellence is something very important to us. We trust the Clay family, their business model, their vision, and the way they run their business.

TDN: Will this affect your Southern Hemisphere operations?

GT: Not at all. I will operate Stud TNT in the same manner as before. My Southern Hemisphere operation is a personal thing. It is mine only, and it is my hobby. This new venture is something completely different. It is two families making a lifelong commitment to the horse industry in America.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Hold All Tickets: ‘Doll’ May Hit Big Apple

Groupie Doll (Bowman’s Band) was thought to have capped an Eclipse Award-winning campaign following her emphatic win in the GI Breeders’ Cup F/M Sprint at Santa Anita Nov. 3, but her connections are considering a tilt at the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 24. The 4-year-old was part of the parade of Breeders’ Cup champions at Churchill Downs last Saturday.

“When we took her over for the parade she was dragging them around,” trainer Buff Bradley said. “She’s so good right now. It wouldn’t be an easy race, but with as good as she is right now, we’re thinking about it.”

The trainer, who co-owns the chestnut along with his father Fred, as well as Carl Hurst and Brent Burns, will make the final decision after imposters are revealed for the one-turn mile handicap.

“We’ll check the weights and see,” Bradley confirmed. “I want to make sure the weights are fair and, if they look all right, we’ll probably go.”

Other candidates for the Cigar include **Jersey Town** (Speightstown), who captured the race in 2010; and possibly **Shackleford** (Forestry), this year’s GI Met Mile hero.

Path Laid Out for ‘Animal’

The early season 2013 campaign has been set out for Team Valor International’s **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), who nearly defied a 259-day hiatus in running second to Wise Dan (Wiseman’s Ferry) in the GI Breeders’ Cup Mile at Santa Anita Nov. 3. The 2011 GI Kentucky Derby hero had not faced the starter since capturing an allowance on the Gulfstream grass Feb. 18. Animal Kingdom is expected to target the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 9 before going to Meydan for the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 30.

“I like the timing, the spacing and the surface,” said trainer Graham Motion. “I like racing him on grass again, because it is kinder on horses, and he won over the Gulfstream Park course this year and showed a liking for it.”

The Kentucky Derby was Animal Kingdom’s first start on conventional dirt; he tuned up for that Classic with a victory on Turfway’s Polytrack in the GIII Vinery Racing Spiral S. Meydan’s main track is surfaced with Tapeta.

“As for getting used to the track in Dubai, it is made of Tapeta and, while it may not be exactly the same as our course at home [Fair Hill] or the one at Presque Isle, it should be close enough, so that I am not worried about how he will handle it,” Motion added.

Repole Stable's **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union), who had been under consideration for Saturday's \$1-million GIII Delta Downs Jackpot S., will instead remain at Churchill Downs for the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 24. Winner of the GII Futurity S. at Belmont Sept. 30, the bay colt is coming off a third to Uncaptured (Lion Heart) in the GIII Iroquois S. under the Twin Spires

Oct. 28, and is expected to clash with that juvenile again in Churchill's "Stars of Tomorrow II" program.

"We decided to stay at Churchill since he was already there and felt the extra week would be beneficial," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "I also wanted to get a two-turn race at Churchill into him and see how he handled it."

Pletcher previously saddled Kentucky Jockey Club winners Super Saver (Maria's Mon) and Gemologist (Tiznow). Super Saver famously captured the "Run for the Roses" the following spring in 2010, while Gemologist secured this year's GI Wood Memorial S.

"It's been a good race for us in the past," Pletcher said. "Those two horses went on to win significant races afterward and we also had Any Given Saturday run second in it, so it's been a good prep for us. We feel like it's important to get a good two-turn race into the 2-year-olds before you winter and prepare for the spring."

WinStar and Twin Creeks' **Delhomme** (Dixie Union), who graduated in his second start at Belmont Oct. 13, is also under consideration for the 8 1/2-furlong contest, as well as the nine-panel GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct.

"We'll see how he breezes this weekend and assess the fields at Aqueduct for the Remsen and the Jockey Club at Churchill Downs and then make a decision," Pletcher added.

DETTORI: NOT PERFORMANCE-ENHANCING

Frankie Dettori yesterday moved to defend his reputation following his positive test for a prohibited substance in France, declaring that it was not for a performance-enhancing drug. Issuing the following statement through his solicitor Christopher Stewart-Moore, the Italian, who failed the test at Longchamp Sept. 16 stated, "There are a large variety of substances which are banned by France Galop. We are not going to say which substance he has tested positive for, as that would be in breach of their rules, but it's not a performance-enhancing drug."

SANTA ANITA ANNOUNCES STAKES SCHEDULE

Santa Anita will conduct 41 graded races during its upcoming winter/spring meeting. The meet will kick off Dec. 26 with the GI La Brea S. and GI Malibu S., a pair of \$300,000 events restricted to 3-year-olds. The \$750,000 GI Santa Anita H. will be run on its traditional first Saturday in March, while the \$750,000 GI Santa Anita Derby has its usual spot on the calendar four weeks later, Apr. 6.

"We're excited about our opener on Dec. 26 and we intend to build upon the momentum we experienced with the two-day Breeders' Cup here on Nov. 2 and 3," said Santa Anita Vice President of Racing, Rick Hammerle. "We decided to move the La Brea from Dec. 31 back to opening day, which is where it was slotted for many years. By doing this, we now have two prestigious Grade I stakes on opening day and this should help us get off to a good start. Both our turf course and main track are in great condition, and we're looking forward to welcoming all of our horsemen and fans back the day after Christmas for some world class racing."

The Arcadia oval will also host a number of races that will allow 3-year-olds to accrue points for the GI Kentucky Derby. The series begins with the \$100,000 GIII Sham S. Jan. 5 (10 points to the winner), followed by the \$200,000 GII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 2 (10 points) and the \$300,000 GII San Felipe S. Mar. 9 (50 points). The sequence culminates with the Santa Anita Derby, the winner of which earns 100 points.

"We feel the new Derby points system instituted by Churchill Downs reconfirms the significance of our traditional 3-year-old program and provides our horsemen added incentive to compete here," Hammerle added.

FIRST BLUSH

There's been a predictable and understandable backlash by a few of our Kentucky-based friends to the rash of articles, including mine, referring to the decline in Kentucky sire power relative to other major Northern Hemisphere stallion bases in Europe and Japan. Look, they say, Kentucky still has half of the Northern Hemisphere's top sires; the North American yearling sales grossed over \$300 million; and the November sales (*see the accompanying Weekly Sales Ticker*) have by now passed the \$200-million mark. So it's not as though North America has disappeared off the map.

Fair enough, though 2013 will mark the fourth straight year (since Curlin and Big Brown retired for \$75,000 and \$65,000, respectively, in 2009) that no stallion in North America has retired for a fee higher than \$35,000. Retirements in 2010 (foals of 2011, yearlings of 2012) marked what turned out to be the low ebb: **Zensational** (Unbridled's Song) was the highest-priced retirement in 2010, at just \$25,000. Of the sires to retire in North America in 2012 (covering sires at the November and December Mixed sales for the first time, first foals to arrive 2013), **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie) was the highest, at \$35,000. Of the sires due to retire in 2013, the highest fee in North America will be Lane's End's **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) at \$35,000. Next will be WinStar's **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) and Gainesway's **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini), at \$30,000 each.

So the Kentucky sire crop that retired in 2011, and which has its first weanlings selling in the soon-to-be-concluded Kentucky November sales, was the exception rather than the rule, in having four stallions that retired in 2011 at \$30,000-\$35,000 fees. None of them will be standing for \$35,000 in 2013, of course; that's the way of all things. But three of them stood for \$35,000 in 2010: Claiborne's **Blame** (Arch) will be \$30,000 next year; Lane's End's **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality) and Ashford's **Lookin At Lucky** (Smart Strike) will be \$25,000. Taylor Made's **Eskendereya** (Giant's Causeway), who started out at \$30,000, will be down to \$17,500 for 2013.

In the meantime, defenders of America can be relatively cheered up by the fact that, though Europe has had two six-figure stud fee stallions retire there in the four-year timespan 2010-2013--Sea The Stars at €85,000 in 2010 (first yearlings 2012 averaged the equivalent of \$414,893; has his first 2-year-olds 2013), and Frankel at £125,000 (right at \$200,000) in 2013--there have only been two other \$30,000-plus retirements in Europe between 2010-2013, Tweenhills' **Makfi** (by Dubawi; £25,000, first foals about to sell) and Newsells Park's **Nathaniel** (Galileo), who will debut at £20,000 in 2013.

Then there are three top Australian sires, two sons of Danehill in Europe (Coolmore's **Fastnet Rock**, F2011 up north, €50,000 for 2013; and the Haras de Bonneval's **Redoute's Choice**, debuting in Europe at €70,000 in 2013), and **Lonhro** (Octagonal), who will be standing his second season at Darley in Kentucky, at \$30,000 in 2013.

So at least in terms of \$30,000+ stallion retirements 2010-2013, Kentucky does lead Europe 8-6 (KY - four in 2011, two [one a proven Australian] in 2012, two in 2013; EU - two at six-figure stud fees (about \$110,000 and \$200,000), two proven Australians, plus Makfi and Nathaniel.

A total of 16 F2012 sires that retired in 2011 and had their first foals 2012, had two or more weanlings sell and average over \$25,000, through Fasig and Keeneland's first four books, ending Tuesday ([click here to see figures for F2012 first-crop weanling sires through yesterday](#)). There were a total of 234 offered and 163 sold among these 16 sires, which is 70% sold/ring. Blame's conquest of the previously undefeated Horse of the Year Zenyatta in the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Classic clearly has not left him 'liable' (that's a pun; his dam's name is Liable) to blame in buyers' eyes: there were 13 weanlings offered by Blame in the November sales, and all 13 sold. Moreover, his average of \$136,154 topped all F2012 sires; AND his median was \$150,000, even higher than his average, indicating high uniformity among his individuals. So, just as with Colonel John's first foals last year, just the statistics on Blame tell you all the indicators are pointing in the right direction (if I ever use the phrase 'ticks all the boxes'--or, for that matter, if you ever see me use the term 'buying bench'--just put me out to pasture there and then).

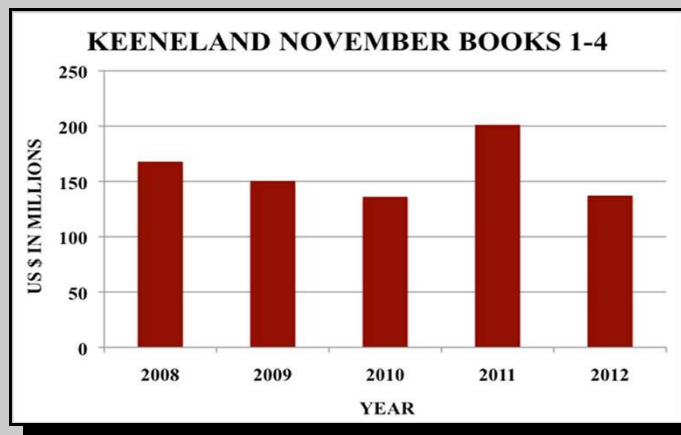

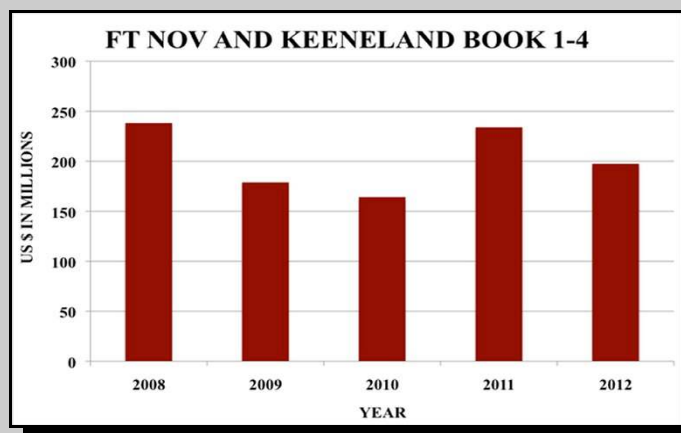

Quality Road had 14 average \$122,857 and Lookin At Lucky had 10 average \$114,000, though at 58% and 67% sold of those through the ring, neither had the universal acceptance of Blame. Eskendereya (54%) had seven average \$71,286, ahead of Airdrie's **Majesticperfection** (\$61,692, 68% sold) and WinStar's 2010 GI Kentucky Derby winner, Super Saver (\$61,000, with an impressive 22 of 28--79% sold). There are quite a few to like among this group of F2012 sires, so it will be interesting to see how they fare next year at the yearling sales. In the meantime, if Bernie Sams isn't having a big run on Blame at \$30,000 after selling 13 of 13, this corner would be pretty surprised.

Not surprisingly, Ashford's Uncle Mo--the second of four successive North American 2-year-old champions Coolmore has secured for their American arm for stud duty (Lookin At Lucky, Uncle Mo, Hansen, Shanghai Bobby)--is miles ahead by covering average for sires with their first foals arriving 2013, having had 16 mares in foal sell for an average of \$137,813. However, per yesterday's Instatistics, that is just over 40% of the 39 mares offered in foal to him. Whatever the explanation for that low clearance rate, he was still the only North American F2013 sire whose first mares in foal averaged over \$100,000.

TIZNOW FILLY TOPS KEENOV WEDNESDAY

Storm Crossing (Tiznow--Storm Alert, by Storm Cat), an unraced 2-year-old filly, brought a bid of \$75,000 from Mr. and Mrs. Wayne G. Lyster III's Ashview Farm to top Wednesday's ninth session of the Keeneland November Sale. She was one of 254 horses sold yesterday for a total of \$2,872,300. The average was \$11,308 and the median was \$7,000. Last year, 260 horses sold for \$4,391,700, for an average of \$16,891 and a median of \$10,000.

Consigned by Lane's End as [hip 3094](#), Storm Crossing is a half-sister to GIII Inglewood H. hero Utopian (Rock Hard Ten). Her third dam is the prolific producer Battle Creek Girl (His Majesty).

Lane's End also provided the second-highest price on Wednesday, with J. Michael Baird paying \$70,000 for **Machen** (Distorted Humor--Ready's Gal, by More Than Ready). Winner of last year's GIII Derby Trial S., the 4-year-old was offered as a stallion prospect as [hip 3257](#).

The session's leading weanling was [hip 3149](#), a son of Awesome Again--Zaraffa (Mizzen Mast) prepared by Terrazas Thoroughbreds. Baccarri Bloodstock bought him for \$62,000.

When dispersals are excluded from the 2011 cumulative numbers, 2,006 horses have been sold this year for \$140,061,100, an increase of 5.38% from 2011 when 1,965 horses brought \$132,915,600. Average price of \$69,821 rose 3.22% from \$67,642 last year, while the median of \$30,000 was up 11.11% from \$27,000.

The auction runs through Friday. It is streamed live daily on www.keeneland.com.

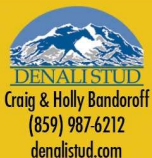

HORSING AROUND THE MASAI MARA

Richard Powell joins Offbeat Safaris, a gonzo riding outfit, to trek across Kenya's epic game reserve, camping beneath the stars and hanging onto his horses...





The group gallops, hell-for-leather across the plains, trying to keep up with a tower of giraffe

"It's like the Garden of Eden," our guide says, "just beautiful..." and we draw up our reins to marvel in silent reverence at the vast landscape, dotted with every wild animal we could have hoped to see.

Across this lush, buzzing vista, buffalo herd around impala, eagles soar above wildebeest and elephants charge fruit trees while lions wait patiently in the tall savannah grass, deciding which to eat for dinner.

Getting here is not easy... it takes days of hard riding to earn a seat at this show.

Our journey begins in the capital, Nairobi, where we transfer through gridlock traffic to a domestic airport and board a 12-seat Cessna, heading southwest over the Loita Plains, above the Kikuyu Highlands and past the volcano-studded Great Rift Valley.

An hour later we're bumping down on a dirt-strip that doubles as a gateway to the reserve and a social hotspot for colourfully-dressed Masai warriors. With no phone signal and no electricity from here on in, it also represents the eye of a needle through which few First-World foibles may pass.

From here, a Land Rover bumps us along remote red dirt roads to a campsite set in a grove of acacia trees. This would be the first of three such sites, and traversing between them for up to six hours a day on horseback will require every inch of riding skill I have.

There's barely time for a cold Kenyan Tusker beer before we're heading out on our first ride when the sun hangs low enough to bring the wildlife out to feed. Here the guides quietly make their assessments about our riding abilities and how closely they need to stick to us, and whether we've been paired with the right horse.

They're an international bunch; a half-Argentinian, half-Austrian lifer (he started working with Offbeat at 18, and he's still there aged 33), an Australian polo player from Dubai, a British safari guide from Botswana, and a student volunteer and hunter from England. The guests were from the UK, US, Germany, Italy and Australia.

The horses are Abyssinian, thoroughbred and cross-thoroughbreds, reared on the owner's farm, and brought into the reserve via a seven-hour horsebox slog. Mine was a pristinely-turned-out,

polo-playing gelding named Blondie, looking decidedly bling with his dash of gold flecks and bright yellow mane. After half an hour of sizing each other up at the beginning, we knew we'd get on fine.

Being confident on your horse could be the most important part of this adventure. Over the next week, we would inch – day-by-day – ever closer to prides of snarling lions, square up to scrappy elephants and push back short-tempered bison... any of which could outrun us, if they wanted to.

Being comfortable riding in English tack is important too, as I

noticed the countryside Californians in our group had a hard time adjusting to the bolt-upright British saddles at odds with the Western-style 'armchairs' they use back home.



The most accomplished riders tail the lead guide as he opts to take the most daring routes, jumping over felled trees left by head-charging pachyderm and playing chicken with lions which may or may not have eaten that day.

Every two to three days, camp packs up and shifts by truck; with its canvas dining tent,

shower, sleeping and toilet tents resembling a well-appointed commune when pitched at each of the three stunning oases.



On every 'moving' day, there is an epic ride to reach the next site, which can be up to 50 kilometres away. That's a lot of riding - at high altitude - across challenging terrain, galloping across plains pockmarked with aardvark holes and rocks, and cantering through stone-bed rivers with vertigo-inducing banks...



Along the way, animal burrows are a constant

hazard. But if you're lucky enough for the person in front of you to spot one through the dust clouds, avoid it and shout "HOLE!" in time, you might not fall down it.

Organisers encourage guests to take out medical insurance prior to arrival, but they also have their own public liability insurance and membership to the Flying Doctors organisation, in case of serious injury requiring evacuation.

Nevertheless, there's a lot that can go wrong in the middle of nowhere. The riding sections will undoubtedly push you

to your limits of self-preservation, whether you opt to take the easy option and stay back, or throw caution to the wind and try to keep up with the lead guide.

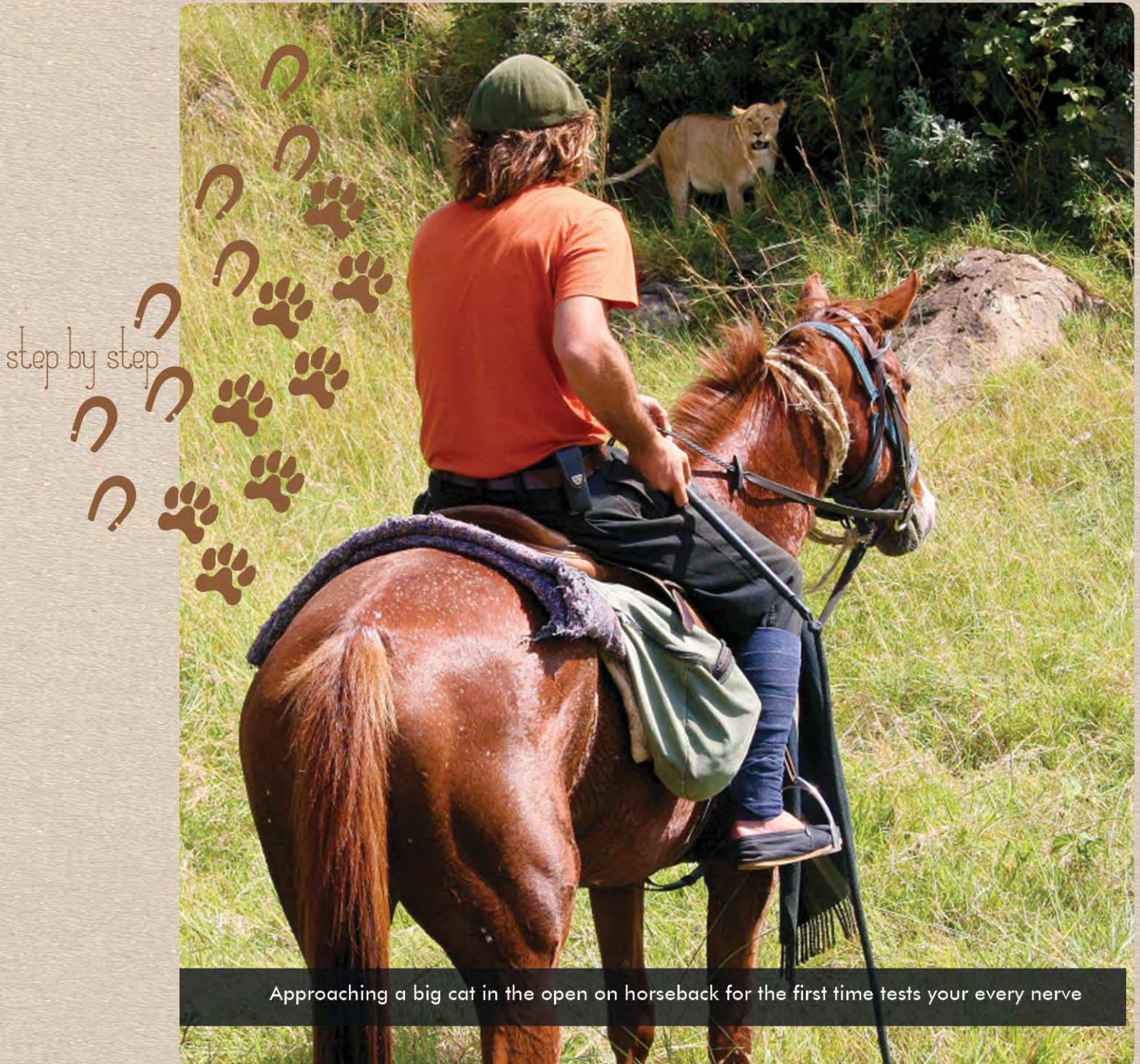
Bullwhips protect guests from animal attacks, with guides normally carrying little else. The Land Rover variant of the trip, for non-riders, encourages guests to get out and walk on the reserve, and here, they are accompanied by a guard carrying a rifle.



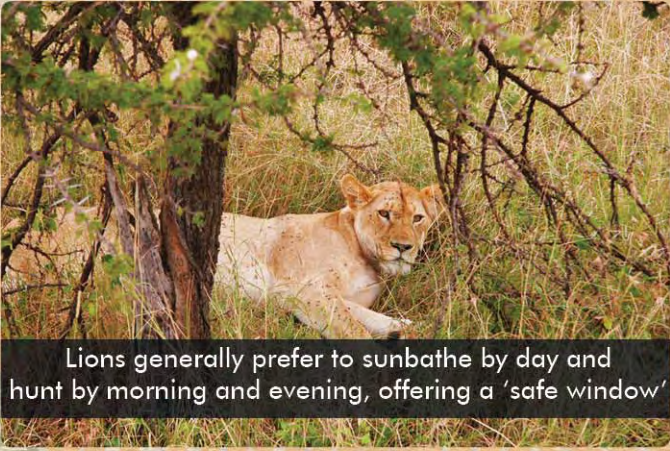
The one occasion we went out armed was to a mountain we climbed first by car, then by foot to reach its spectacular peak. Its nooks host several families of cheetah and leopard, which we were warned to be on our guard against, although we didn't see any as we clambered about on its slopes.

We did not have to wait much longer before we did, though...

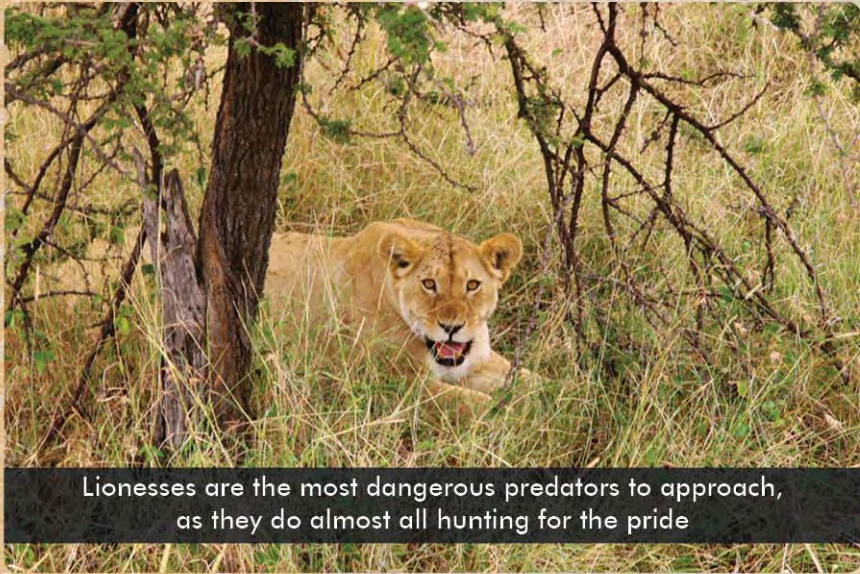
On our first night at the third campsite, while drinking beers around the fire on the banks of the Mara River, our lead Masai guard, Nati, came over saying he'd spotted a cheetah and asking if we wanted to see it. Several seconds later we were careering around the site in the Land Rover, shining a spotlight until suddenly we caught a flash of markings bolting into a bush.

Nati picked out an impala with the light, leading the cheetah out into the open to its quarry. The kill was artistic and eloquent in its execution and despite the graphic scene; we drove over, clutching our beers on the roof of the car, and sat transfixed to watch it feed.

Other night-time highlights included Masai warriors demonstrating their mating dance around the fire (a hit with the ladies); driving out to party on the plains after dark with James Brown booming from the stereo, and running semi-clothed out of my tent at 4am as an elephant pushed down a nearby tree.

The camp's 15-strong domestic staff of men from various local tribes went above and beyond

to give the safari an extravagant feel...

Returning to my tent after dinner each evening, I would without fail find my riding boots cleaned and polished to perfection and my laundry scrubbed, pressed and folded as if at a top-notch hotel.

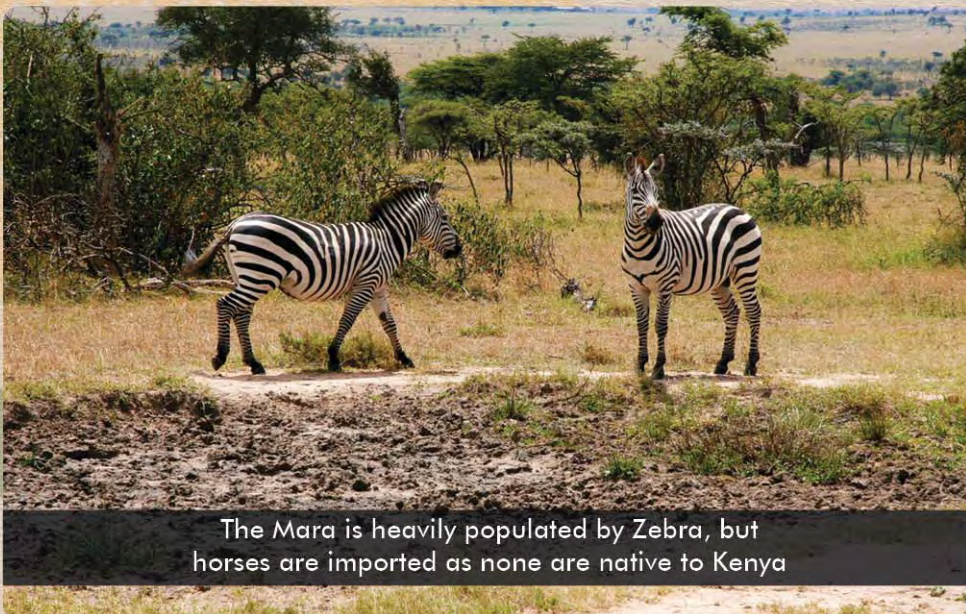


The food and drink was impressive too, an array of cuisine cooked up from fresh, imported and locally-produced ingredients... 'Would you like your steak rare or well-done... with a nice Malbec or a Bloody Mary?' and 'Breakfast eggs fried, scrambled or poached?'

Riding for hours from the crack of dawn to emerge over a hill and find the camp's chef

cooking breakfast for you, and baking fresh bread – in the middle of the plains – also ranks, for me, as a new definition of decadence.



And our midday siestas in shady glades after picnic lunches were something to savour too... like falling asleep on the classroom rug after having your fill of milk and biscuits at kindergarten.

At the end of the week, it was with some sadness that I watched my fellow guests leave; while I moved on to see the company's guest lodge, another hour's flight west.

The lodge at Sosian, the Samburu word for 'Wild Date Palm', combines the tame with the wild. It's certainly a stark contrast to Masai camping; with its solid stone guest houses, swimming pool and main house

that harks back to colonial days with a snooker table, grand piano and library.

Where the riding trip guests were in their 20s and 30s, the game lodge guests were mainly parents in their 40s and 50s with young children.

'Would you like your steak rare or well-done... with a nice Malbec or a Bloody Mary?' and 'Breakfast eggs fried, scrambled or poached?'

I immediately missed the unashamedly gonzo set-up of the anarchic riding outfit, with its unpredictable, scruffy lead guide riding in flip-flops, nights spent dancing around the camp fire

and rock-hunting by moonlight on the plains to shore up the Land Rover's wheels after we'd hit a hole... (Cue the Australian guide: "Let's have a party, then fix the car!")

For many visitors, Sosian will perhaps be the better-fitting choice; offering a quieter, safer and more luxurious bush experience on its 24,000-acre private working ranch, set on the Laikipia plateau.

It's a beautiful area that offers more than 250 species of birdlife and an abundance of game species with four of the big five species being found there, plus other rarities such as wild dogs, Jackson's hartebeest and Grevy's zebra.

Nonetheless, I'd be back on the mad travelling horseback safari circus any day... at least for another few years.

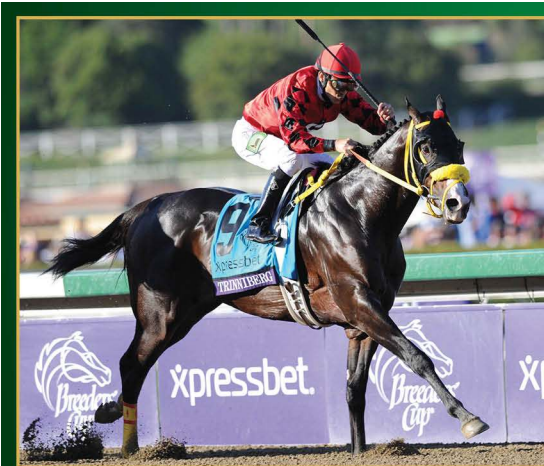

"They are the ones caring for the horses before and after the races, and, when they are running horses at Aqueduct over the winter, they are braving the cold to get the job done. We truly appreciate their hard work under often difficult conditions, and we wanted to do a little something to say thank you." The grooms and hotwalkers shipping from Belmont Park will receive their vouchers when they check in with security at the receiving barn; backstretch workers running horses stabled at Aqueduct will also be eligible for the program. NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



FULL AGENDA FOR LAME DUCK SESSION

Congress returned to Capitol Hill earlier this week to begin the six week "lame duck" session which follows Election Day and precedes the start of the new Congress in January. Federal lawmakers face a crowded agenda in this short session which concludes the 112th Congress. Among the most pressing issues that Congress needs to address prior to adjournment are:

- The Bush-era tax cuts from 2001 and 2003 that are set to expire on December 31, 2012;
- the sustainable growth rate "Doc Fix" to help pay Medicare doctors;
- the current alternative minimum tax patch set to expire on December 31, 2012; and
- commencement of the "sequestration" deal that requires \$1.1 trillion in spending cuts over the next 10 years (\$109 billion in 2013).

Expiration of the Bush-era tax cuts and the start of sequestration will be the primary focus of the lame duck session. The combination of the two has been labeled as the "fiscal cliff" for the potential negative impacts on the economy should they both proceed as scheduled.
