LATE ADDITIONS CREATE CIGAR INTRIGUE

Trainer Buff Bradley has been the architect of a masterful 4-year-old season for **Groupie Doll** (Bowman's Band), whose campaign was thought to have ended with her thoroughly dominating performance against her peers in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint Nov. 2. But, after giving her connections all the right

signals and after turning in a smooth half-mile workout last Saturday, all systems are 'go' for the champion-elect to face six male rivals in the GI Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct. "I wasn't looking for another race for her; I wasn't looking for a race against boys," said Bradley. "I thought that trip [to and from California] might knock her back a little, but they had the

parade of Breeders' Cup champions at Churchill last weekend and she was just feeling so good. I never even thought about the Cigar Mile until that weekend." As if she needs more to recommend her, Groupie Doll is two-for-three at the distance, including an allowance win at Gulfstream last Dec. 22 ahead of a runner-up effort to GISW Boys at Tosconova (Officer) the following month. Though she was good then, she has taken her game to a new level since, and with the addition of blinkers earlier this season, has won five straight, including her 4 1/2-length romp at Santa Anita three weeks back. **Coil** (Point Given) will carry top weight of 120 pounds as he tries a trip this far for the first time since finishing third to barnmate Game On Dude (Awesome Again) in the GI Goodwood S. last October.

CHILUKKI REMATCH IN THE FALLS CITY

Brushed by a Star (Eddington), racing for the first time since being purchased for \$400,000 at Fasig-Tipton November, and **Joyful Victory** (Tapit) were separated by just a head when they squared off in the GII Chilukki S. going Churchill's one-turn mile Nov. 3, and the duo faces a rematch around two turns in today's featured GII Falls City H. beneath the Twin Spires. Brushed by a Star aired in the Iowa Distaff in June before wiring the field in the GII Molly Pitcher S. for her first graded-stakes success July 29. She was over her head when fifth in the GI Personal Ensign H. at Saratoga Aug. 26 and disappointed slightly when runner-up in the Mari Hulman George S. at Hoosier Park Oct. 6, but atoned with a late lunge to deny Joyful Victory in the Chilukki. That was a microcosm of the season for Joyful Victory, who has but one win from six tries this season, an easy score in the Tiffany Lass S. at Fair Grounds in February. But she hasn't been worse than third this season and is reliable at this level. **Afleeting Lady** (Afleet Alex), a half-sister to Shackelford (Forestry), et al, is another to be expertly managed by Dale Romans this season. A neck second to **Arena Elvira** (Ghostzapper) in this event last year, she has seen her residual value increase this term by virtue of wins in the Lady's Secret S. at Monmouth Sept. 3 and in the GIII Turnback the Alarm H. at Belmont Oct. 27.

WHICH ONE OF THESE IS NOT LIKE THE OTHER?

So goes the old Sesame Street jingle, and the answer is **Heir Kitty** (Wildcat Heir). Number one, it's a filly. Number two, she's the only member of the field who doesn't sleep in the Bob Baffert barn. And she's the outsider in the field of five assembled for today's GIII Hollywood Prevue S. at Betfair Hollywood Park. The first race of the Thanksgiving Day card is led by **Super Ninety Nine** (Pulpit), who posted a 1 1/4-length victory in his Oct. 7 debut at Santa Anita and would have been difficult to beat with any improvement in the Nov. 2 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint, but was withdrawn from the event at the 11th hour. **Shakin It Up** (Midnight Lute) was a hard-trying runner-up to the favorite in his debut and took a step forward second time out, drilling a field of maidens by 4 1/2 lengths Oct. 27 with blinkers added. **Z Big Apple** (Malibu Moon) won his maiden at first asking by 3/4 of a length Oct. 20, but really only got going the final 100 yards and was accorded **☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆** for the effort. The \$250,000 OBS April graduate will need to reproduce that form trying a synthetic track for the first time this morning. **Really Mr Greely** (Horse Greeley) was fourth to Z Big Apple on debut, but returned to dismantle a field of \$100,000 maiden taggers by better than seven lengths Nov. 4.

The Stars Align for the HKIR...

Cirrus des Aigles will have the chance to even the score with local star California Memory, who last Sunday took down the G2 Jockey Club Cup over the course and distance. This year's Cup, featuring increased prize money of HK\$22 million (\$2.8 million), has also attracted The Queen's **Carlton House** (Street Cry {Ire}); **Irian (Ger)** (Tertullian), last year's runner-up; and Australia's **Alcopop (Aus)** (Jeune {GB}), last-out winner of the G1 Mackinnon S.

The G1 Hong Kong Mile looms a battle between the host and a pair of top-class rivals from Japan. **Ambitious Dragon (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}) enters the HK\$20 million (\$2.6 million) event as the marquee horse, but will have to reverse form with **Glorious Days (Aus)** (Hussonet), who added blinkers and beat the heavy chalk on the square in the G2 Jockey Club Mile last weekend. Eishin Preston (Green Dancer) and Hat Trick (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) struck for Japan in 2001 and 2005, respectively, but the locals have annexed the last six runnings.

Sadamu Patek (Jpn) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}), runner-up to Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) in the G1 Japanese 2000 Guineas last season over 2000 meters, has proved at least as effective at the mile, and comes in off a neck success from **Grand Prix Boss (Jpn)** (Sakura Bakushin O {Jpn}) in last Sunday's G1 Mile Championship

Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}) is expected back for a title defense in the HK\$15 million (\$1.9 million) G1 Hong Kong Vase, but looks to face a stiffer challenge than he did 12 months ago. The 6-year-old, 14th in defense of his G1 Melbourne Cup victory last time out, could rematch in Hong Kong with **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), eighth at Flemington Nov. 6, and third at Sha Tin last December. **Mount Athos**

DETTORI LICENCE SUSPENDED IN FRANCE

Frankie Dettori's licence has been temporarily suspended in France by the medical commission that convened on Tuesday and now awaits a summons to a France Galop disciplinary hearing, it was announced yesterday. Having tested positive for a prohibited substance at Longchamp Sept. 16, the world-renowned jockey will learn of his fate in the upcoming weeks. "Following yesterday's examination of the file and after having duly notified the jockey Lanfranco Dettori of its decision, the Medical Committee has temporarily suspended the said jockey from riding in races in France, based on medical grounds," a France Galop statement read. "According to article 143 of the Rules of Racing, the Medical Committee's report has been passed on to the France Galop stewards. The France Galop stewards will be studying the file within the next fortnight before deciding what action will be taken in accordance with the Rules of Racing." After Dettori relayed through his legal team that he accepts the decision of the medical committee, the British Horseracing Authority revealed that he would be required to undertake a medical examination before returning to race riding in Britain.

"I wanted to personally thank many of the world's leading breeders who shared our vision by supporting Kitten's Joy in 2012 with truly World Class mares," said Ken Ramsey, owner of Ramsey Farm. "We are particularly pleased to see some high-class dirt runners this year headed by Politicallycorrect who won on Breeders' Cup day at Santa Anita and will likely be sent off the favorite in the GI Malibu S."

RETURN OF THE EMPIRE?

"Is there any way we can get Empire Maker back?" That was the question most asked of me during my trip to Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland recently. Unfortunately for Kentucky breeders, the answer for a number of reasons is no; at least no time in the near future.

While Royal Delta, Bodemeister and Grace Hall et al. have been flying the flag with distinction in the U.S., the small number of Empire Maker progeny that have made their way to the 'Land of the Rising Sun' have also been doing remarkably well. Just last weekend, Ijigen, a three-year-old colt, justified favouritism to win a Group 3 16-runner dirt contest and bank the lion's share of the \$850,000 purse. Earlier this year Federalist (a 5-year-old Empire Maker colt out of the Japanese Group 1 winner Dance Partner) scored at both Group 2 Group 3 levels. In fact, from only 11 Empire Maker offspring to race in Japan, all bar one have won. And incredibly, collectively they have already amassed more than \$7 million in prize money.

Empire Maker's success did not go unnoticed by Japanese breeders. Based at the Japan Bloodstock Breeders Association's (JBBA) headquarters in Shizunai in Japan's northern island of Hokkaido, he covered 236 mares this year. As a consequence, his fee for 2013 has been increased to ¥3,500,000 (\$43,000). Trainers and owners have also been keen to get in on the act. At the JRHA Select Sale in July this year, an Empire Maker filly foal, not yet even 90 days old, sold for \$750,000. Another filly foal, a half-sister to Group 2 winner Arena Elvira, sold for \$475,000. And a further two foals broke \$300,000. At the recently concluded HBA Foal Sale, the top three lots were all sired by the Belmont S.-winning son of Unbridled.

Not content to wait for Empire Maker's first Japanese crop, now foals, to mature, prominent Japanese breeder and owner Shigeyuki Okada travelled to Keeneland in September where he paid \$1.1 million for an Empire Maker out of Lu Ravi that was consigned by Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm.


Okada hopes that he will do well enough on the track to justify standing him beside his recently acquired I'll Have Another and Roses In May at his Big Red Farm.

While Empire Maker's progeny's performance on the racetrack and in the sales ring alone is enough to justify him staying in the orient, it is the fact that he is owned by the JBBA that completely frustrates any chance of his repatriation. Also standing at the JBBA are a number of other U.S.-imports such as Johannesburg, Aldebaran, Came Home, Boston Harbor, Charismatic, Captain Steve, Silver Charm and Squirtle Squirt. However none of the aforementioned is inspiring the kind of excitement seen for Empire Maker and none covered more than 50 mares this year. Empire Maker is the jewel in the JBBA's crown. And as the JBBA is effectively a semi-state body, it would take a king's ransom to extricate him. Hence, a \$20 million offer a few months ago was promptly but politely declined. The JBBA have subsequently purchased Summer Bird. The only chink in Empire Maker's armor from a Japanese perspective is the propensity of his stock to run on dirt. While approximately half of Japan's races are held on dirt, the vast majority of the graded races, including all the classics, are run on turf. If Empire Maker's progeny fail to prove themselves on turf, the lustre will rapidly diminish.

It is still too early to make a judgment on this but Empire Maker's 10 winners in Japan to date have won a total of 38 races of which only eight have been on turf.


The door is not yet completely closed on his return to the U.S. Nevertheless, it is a long shot.

First-crop sire Zebedee (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) maintained his popularity rating on day three of Goffs November Foal Sale yesterday, with a March-born daughter of the Tally-Ho Stud resident assuming top spot on the sheets when selling for €82,000 (US\$105,195). [Hip 513](#), offered by Collegelands Stud on behalf of Paraic Lyons, is out of a half-sister to 2007 G3 Brownstown S. and G3 Minstrel S. victress Redstone Dancer (Ire) (Namid {GB}) from the family of Rainbow Quest. Julie Wood, whose colors were carried by Zebedee in all seven career starts, signed for the bay, having earlier picked up a son of the G2 Flying Childers S. winner for €55,000. Ardrums House Stud's [hip 477](#) is out of a half-sister to the 2001 Listed Waterford Testimonial S. victor Spencers Wood (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}).

Late in the session, an April-foaled son of Dark Angel (Ire) was purchased by Yeomanstown Stud for €80,000. [Hip 673](#) from Jockey Hall Stud hails from a family of smart Italian black-type performers, including Distinctly Dancer (Ire) (Distinctly North), Titus Shadow (Ire) (Titus Livius {Fr}) and Orpen Shadow (Ire) (Orpen).

Six lots later, a colt from the first crop of Ballylinch Stud's dual Classic-winning incumbent Lope de Vega (Ire) (Shamardal) from Castletown Stud sold to Mattock Equine for €68,000. He hails from the family of pattern-race performers Ho Choi (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), Drumfire (Ire) (Danhill Dancer {Ire}) and Cabaret (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Another Lope de Vega to share the limelight was Pipe View Stud's April-foaled colt consigned as [hip 516](#), a half-brother to General Direction (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) That colt provided a timely update when graduating at Catterick last month, and the weanling was acquired by Peter Vaughan's Moanmore Stables for €62,000.

Two other colts sold for €66,000 apiece. They were Barrettstown Farm House's [hip 599](#), a son of Bahamian Bounty (GB) who was knocked down to Redpender Stud; and [hip 615](#), Swordlestown Stud's Royal Applause (GB) whose dam is a half to the multiple group scorer Arabian Gleam (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) purchased by Baroda and Colbinstown Stud.

Viztoria (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) has emerged as one of Ireland's leading juvenile distaffers this term, and her close relative by Verglas (Ire), breeder Airlie Stud's [hip 572](#), was knocked down to Skymarc Farm for €63,000. The grey is the first foal from a half-sister to that Listed Blenheim S. heroine, and also hails from the family of champion miler Zilzal.

Moments earlier, Tim Hyde Jr. was on the mark at €58,000 for Awbeg Stud's [hip 510](#), a son of Acclamation (GB). The April-foaled bay is out of a full-sister to 2004 GII San Juan Capistrano H. runner-up Exterior (Distant View).

Another first-crop sire to make his mark was Derrinstown Stud's G1 Prix Morny winner Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), whose [hip 546](#) went the way of Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud for €56,000. Presented by Leaf Stud on behalf of Agricola Ficomontanino, the March-foaled bay is out of 1999 G2 Lowther S. runner-up Seraphina (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}) from the family of the 2001 G1 Prix de la Foret hero Mount Abu (Ire) (Foxhound).

Coolmore's Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) also made an instant impression when his well-connected daughter consigned by Barnane Stud as [hip 634](#) sold to Epona Bloodstock for €60,000. She is out of a sister to Doctor Dino (Fr) (Muhtathir {GB}) and a half to the dam of recent G1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas runner-up Oasis Rose (Aus) (Oasis Dream {GB}).

Kildangan Stud resident Vale of York (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) was another who caused a splash with his first offerings as [hip 654](#), Tinnakill House's February-foaled colt from the Juddmonte dynasty of Trade Fair (GB), was snapped up by Wicklow Bloodstock for €60,000.

FASTNET ROCK COLT TOPS NZB SALE

A colt by Fastnet Rock (Aus) was purchased on behalf of Edmund and Belinda Bateman for NZ\$480,000 (US\$390,641) to top Wednesday's buoyant session of the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale. It was the second-highest price in the history of the auction, following the NZ\$500,000 achieved in 2007. Agent James Harron signed the ticket for the Batemans, who campaigned Group 1 winner Foxwedge (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), and confirmed that the juvenile would be trained by Gai Waterhouse. The colt is out of Oraia (Stravinsky), a half-sister to Group 1 winner Golden Opinion (Slew O'Gold) and from the immediate family of this year's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Samitar (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). The bay was offered by Mana Park

"I came here looking for a couple of horses and missed out on a few on day one, but I had my sights firmly set on this Fastnet Rock colt, as I thought he was the pick of the sale," Harron said. "It has been a very successful bloodline cross, which I liked, but primarily he is a fantastic type and has a pedigree littered with speed.

"NZB does a great job in getting a lovely bunch of horses here every year and the results that have been coming out of this sale give you confidence to be stronger in the ring," Harron added.

The Fastnet Rock colt was one of 245 horses to sell from 407 catalogued. The aggregate of NZ\$17,852,000 was a new record for the auction, while both the average of NZ\$72,865 and median of NZ\$48,000 were up from last year.


"Day 2 always seems to step up another gear and we saw that again today," said Petrea Vela, co-managing director of the auction house. "The clearance, average and median all increased on yesterday, and to have posted new records certainly exceeds our expectations.

"The buying bench was no doubt the highlight--the consistent success from the sale throughout Australasia and Asia is proving such a good advertisement for the merits of buying here, and we're thrilled with the support the sale has received. We hope that buyers are very well-rewarded by their purchases.

"Everything to do with this year's sale has gone as well as we could have hoped. The breeze-ups went as smoothly and professionally as ever before, and there has been a broad selection of well-selected and well-prepared young horses for buyers to choose from, which is a credit to vendors.

"These results should give pinhookers a lot of confidence heading into the yearling sales," Vela summed up. "This has developed into a very robust market for New Zealand and, as the quality of the offering continues to improve, it can only be positive for the future of the sale."

The second-highest price during Wednesday's session was NZ\$360,000 for a son of Encosta de Lago (Aus) who was purchased by John Foote Bloodstock on behalf of Hong Kong-based trainer David Hall. Out of Note of Desire (Woodman), he was consigned by Anzac Lodge.

"This sale is very popular in Hong Kong due to the results it has been getting up there," Hall noted. "Asian owners like to buy these horses that are more advanced than yearlings, as it fast tracks the whole process to get them up to Hong Kong sooner."

Hong Kong buyers purchased eight of the top 20 youngsters over the course of the two-day auction.

Another colt heading to Hong Kong was a NZ\$350,000 son of Exceed and Excel (Aus)--Pas de Deux (Sadler's Wells). Hailing from leading consignor Lyndhurst Farm, he was secured for Me Tsui.

Mark and Shelley Treweek operate Lyndhurst, which led all vendors for the sixth straight year. The NZ\$350,000 colt was one of 19 Lyndhurst youngsters that sold for a total of NZ\$3,309,000 and an average of NZ\$174,000.

"It was a huge result, we are thrilled," said Mark Treweek. "We had a lovely draft and it paid off. We broke the \$3-million mark for the first time last year and we were hoping we could do it again this year and we have.

"The sale was very much in last year's mould," he continued. "The first day was a bit tough as some buyers sat on their hands to see how the market would go, but today was definitely a lot stronger and buyers were very active, especially on the right horses. I think overall it was a fantastic sale."
