BETTER LUCKY BEST IN MATRIARCH

Longshot **Better Lucky** (Ghostzapper) took advantage of a miscue by favored **Dayatthespa** (City Zip) and charged home to a one-length victory at 35-1 in Sunday's GI Matriarch S. at Betfair Hollywood Park. The Godolphin colorbearer angled to the inside soon after the break and was tucked in at the rail racing in mid-pack around the first turn as **Summer Soiree** (War Front) set the pace with Dayatthespa in close attendance. Entering the backstretch, Dayatthespa jumped a shadow and nearly unseated jockey Javier Castellano, leaving Summer Soiree alone on the lead after a quarter in :23.35. Summer Soiree was five lengths in front after a half in :46.09 and still maintained a clear lead after three-quarters in 1:09.76. But Better Lucky loomed a menacing presence once tipped to the outside for the stretch run, and the bay filly stormed to the lead in the final furlong to win going away by one length. After her adventurous trip, Dayatthespa was fifth.

"This is certainly a great way to cap off the year," said Godolphin's Jimmy Bell. Of Better Lucky, who was winning her second graded event, Bell added, "She's very game, tries and is dead honest. She's really blossomed, which gives us something to look forward to." **Cont. p4**

COMMAND PERFORMANCE IN HOL DERBY

Lewis Lakin's **Unbridled Command** (Master Command) brought the curtain down on a busy weekend of holiday racing across the country with a powerful 1 1/2-length victory in the GI Hollywood Derby.

The gray colt, sent off at 7-1, found running room along the rail and was unrushed while racing near the back of the pack into the first turn. He improved his position down the backstretch and pulled his way to challenge pacesetter **My Best Brother** (Stormy Atlantic) for the lead into the stretch before

exploding clear off the turn, opening up four lengths before holding sway over the late-closing **Grandeur** (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}) in second and **Lucky Chappy** (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in third. "He just matures from race to race," winning trainer Tom Bush said of Unbridled Command. "I couldn't dream of a horse developing any nicer than this horse. He's really gotten special." **Cont. p5**

A SUNDAY UPSET, A SUNDAY SWEEP IN CUP

Sunday Racing's 2011 Japanese Triple Crown winner **Orfevre** (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) suffered a heartbreaking loss in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at the hands of a determined filly early last month. Yesterday, he again fell prey to another gutsy lass in the form of Japan's 2012 Filly Triple Crown heroine **Gentildonna** (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn})--also owned by Sunday Racing--in one of their home country's premier events, the G1 Japan Cup at Tokyo.

"Although the Japan Cup was a big challenge for a 3-year-old filly, I was confident that she was up to the competition and she proved that today," said winning trainer Sei Ishizaka. "She had maintained her form and I knew, being a fighter in a duel, that she would pull through and claim her victory." The win, the first by a sophomore filly in the Cup, came after a lengthy stewards inquiry, as Gentildonna had muscled her way out in the stretch and bumped with Orfevre before finishing a nose in front on the line. Sunday Racing also campaigns the third-placed finisher **Rulership** (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), while the operation's fourth Cup horse, **Fenomeno** (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}), ran fifth. Led by Sunday Racing's unprecedented Cup trifecta, the home team dominated. **Cont. p3**

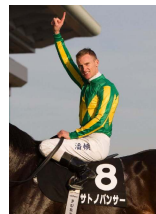

A year after winning Japan's Triple Crown with Orfevre, Sunday Racing was poised to sweep the filly version of the series after Gentildonna won the 1600-meter G1 Oka Sho (Japan 1000 Guineas) at Hanshin in April and the 2400-meter G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) at Tokyo in May. The Northern Racing-bred filly was rested over the summer, and after prepping with a victory in the 1800-meter G2 Kansai Tele Corp Sho Rose S. at Hanshin Sept. 16, completed the Triple Crown with a nose tally over longtime rival Verxina (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the 2000-meter G1 Shuka Sho at Kyoto Oct. 14.

Making her first start since and sent off the 5-1 third choice, Gentildonna was away alertly from post 15 and raced up to a prominent early position. She secured an ideal tracking position in third as Beat Black (Jpn) (Miscast {Jpn}) took up the running in earnest.

Arc heroine Solemia, at 21-1, raced along in fourth, with the even-money Orfevre back another four or five lengths while in the clear on the outside. Beat Black began to extend his advantage on the backstretch, and led by as much as 10 lengths heading into the far turn. He still had a four-length cushion with 400 meters remaining, but the field, fanned out six abreast, was closing in fast. Gentildonna and Orfevre, swarming past on either side of a tiring rival, soon reeled in Beat Black, with the former pushing out Orfevre a bit to avoid running up on heels of the sputtering pacesetter. From there, she gamely asserted to get her nose down as they flashed under the wire.

Stewards let the result stand, but announced that winning jockey Yasunari Iwata, collecting his third Cup victory, would serve a two-day suspension for his ride on Gentildonna. Iwata, hardly in a down mood afterward, accepted some blame and talked about how the race unfolded.

"I had studied the track condition and thought that the inside would be a good choice," he explained. "Although the draw was way out, I was able to position nicely, and we had a perfect trip up to the [stretch]--I am afraid the blame is on me for causing some trouble to [Orfevre]. But the filly is nonetheless a great filly for out-dueling a monster like Orfevre. I was conscious of facing a very tough field compared to her past races, but decided to just concentrate on bringing out her best performance, which she did. I would certainly love to accompany her in her overseas endeavor for the coming 4-year-old season, and I am confident that she has the potential to win against the best. But she is a very delicate filly, and her chance to mature both physically and mentally comes first. I am just looking forward to feel her progress and grow up in her future races."

Trainer Sei Ishizaka confirmed there is a lot of racing left in Gentildonna. "I am thinking long term--not just next year, but even the year after that," he said. "She still has room for improvement, and I am confident that she will have a bright future ahead. After her battle against tough competition in the Japan Cup, she will be turned out until her 4-year-old season, during which, depending on her condition, I will go on with my plan for overseas challenges, which had been my consideration ever since Gentildonna won the third leg of the Fillies Triple Crown, perhaps in Dubai, France or the U.S."

The best placing a foreigner could muster was **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB})'s eighth. Orfevre's conqueror in the Arc, the 4-year-old filly **Solemia (Ire)** (Poliglote {GB}), sat an ideal trip in fourth early, but faded to 13th.

Her trainer, Carlos Laffon-Parias, wasn't too dismayed by his charge's effort, and said the Arc winner will now join Wertheimer and Frere's broodmare band. "It was a very good race," said Laffon-Parias. "I think she did very well in regard to that she is coming off of a hard race in the Arc and her first overseas travel. It might have been different if she had had experience racing abroad and had more time to adapt to the fast track here. She will retire now."

Other foreign notables in the race included the Group 1 winner **Jakkalberry (Ire)** (Storming Home {GB}), third in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in March and shipping in off a good third in the G1 Melbourne Cup. Toward the back of the pack early, he finished a one-paced 11th. "His preparations all went as planned, [but] he probably had a hard race in the Melbourne Cup and we're happy with how he raced today," said assistant trainer Lucie Botti. "We have no excuses with the outcome but there were very good horses in front of us today. He will get a break now and then we head for Dubai in February."

Better Lucky Best in Matriarch (cont. from p1)

Better Lucky had hit the board in three of four starts since moving to the lawn this spring. The Godolphin colorbearer captured the May 28 GII Sands Point S. over the Belmont turf course before a runner-up effort in the July 25 GII Lake George S. Fifth, beaten 2 1/2 lengths, in the Aug. 19 GII Lake Placid S., she was coming off a third-place effort behind Dayatthespa in the Oct. 13 GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup. As for what is next for the Matriarch winner, Bell commented, "She'll probably get a little vacation in Florida. There are some good spots to pick, but right now we're just going to enjoy what she's accomplished and how she's kept going."

Better Lucky is out of Sahara Gold (Seeking the Gold), a graded stakes winner for Stonerside Stable. Acquired by Godolphin with the purchase of all the Stonerside horses in 2008, Sahara Gold has a Medaglia d'Oro yearling filly and a Bernardini weanling colt. She is also the dam of graded stakes winner Sahara Heat (A.P. Indy). The 15-year-old mare RNA'd for \$1.45 million as a Keeneland July yearling of 1998.

No Day at the Spa

Dayatthespa entered the Matriarch with a five-race win streak, but jockey Javier Castellano acknowledged she lost all chance with her antics turning into the backstretch. "My filly was scared a little bit running inside horses," Castellano explained. "She got shy of that other horse and jumped out around the first turn. She wasn't the same after that." The behavior surprised co-owner Steve Laymon, who said, "She's a high-energy filly, but she's never done anything like this."

Dayatthespa's foibles also affected **Tiz Flirtatious** (Tizbud), who finished powerfully to be second. "I had a good trip, but it cost me the race when [Dayatthespa] hit the rail and it forced me to come out," said jockey Rafael Bejarano. "I was in great position, but when she came out, I had to hold my horse. I had a good trip after that, she came running; but I think my horse would have won the race if not for that incident."

"I had a beautiful trip this time and everything worked out perfect," said jockey Javier Castellano, who was riding Unbridled Command for the first time. "I saw the horses start backing out and I chose to go around and it worked out perfect. I knew the closers would show up down the lane, but I was able to get the jump on them."

Unbridled Command opened his career with seven straight starts against fellow New York-breds, coming away with a maiden win and a pair of allowance victories. He had a successful first foray out of state-bred company with a half-length victory in the Sept. 2 GIII Saranac S. at Saratoga before beating up on state-bred competition with a 6 3/4-length victory in the Oct. 20 Mohawk S. for his fourth straight win.

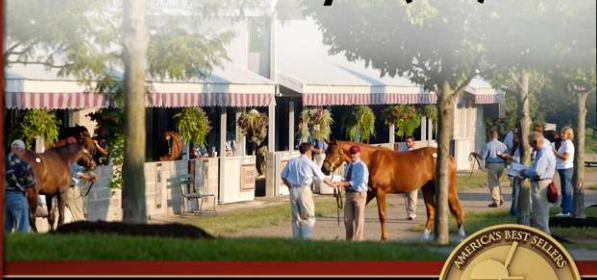

The heavily favored New York invader Boisterous had no answer to the strong late run of the 30-1 Keep Up as jockey Miguel Mena continued his red-hot ways at Churchill. Mena, aboard Saturday's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. winner Uncaptured (Lion Heart) and GII Golden Rod S. upsetter Seaneen Girl (Spring at Last), was looking for his second \$60-plus mutuel in as many days on Keep Up, who was previously trained by Boisterous's conditioner Shug McGaughey. Alex Clarkson took over from the Hall of Famer for the 2012 season, and had sent out the smartly bred Keep Up to three wins in his last five starts, including a NW2X score going a mile over Keeneland's turf course Oct. 26 and a last-to-first win in a one-mile optional claimer at Churchill Nov. 16. Wheeling back off nine days' rest here, Keep Up, a son of GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Keeper Hill, was angled in to save ground near the back of the pack as Global Power (Pulpit) led and Boisterous sat a mid-pack trip. The longtime leader was still hanging tough in upper stretch before Boisterous, angled into the two path for room, put a nose in front at the furlong grounds. But it was Keep Up who was going best of all late, sweeping past on the outside for an initial stakes win. "He was far back, but it was a pretty solid pace and he was traveling nice," explained Mena. "When I rode him in the mile race [Nov. 16], he was pretty far back, too, and I didn't want to rush him off his feet. I rode him with patience and from the quarter pole he flew home." Mena admitted it was a special couple days in Louisville. "It was an awesome weekend, especially to do it here," he said. "A few years ago, I had some issues and I appreciate the horsemen giving me great support. I'm just trying to do the right thing now and keep my family going."

Bear Tough Tiger, who began his career in the claiming ranks, was off the board in the May 6 GIII Vigil S. and June 24 GII Highlander S. earlier in the year, and was returning to the Polytrack after a solid third-place effort over the Woodbine lawn in the Oct. 14 GI Nearctic S. The chestnut gelding chased the pace early, but fell back into midpack as favored Essence Hit Man (Speightstown) and Something Extra battled through fractions of :21.84 and :44.18. Swept out five wide into the lane, Bear Tough Tiger was finding his best stride as the pacesetters began to falter to his inside and he outbattled stablemate Bear No Joke in the final strides for his first stakes victory. "They ran away from everyone pretty quickly and opened up a good lengthy lead," said winning rider Justin Stein. "My horse was settled into stride down on the inside, and I was all by myself sitting there waiting for the race to develop as we came around the turn." Winning trainer Reade Baker thinks Bear Tough Tiger is a horse on the upswing. "He's doing better all the time," Baker said. "He'll go a little farther. We might try the [Dec. 29 GIII] Mr. Prospector S. at Gulfstream before the year's over and see if we can get a Sovereign Award or two."

On the eve of its 10-day December Sale, which begins today with a yearling session, Tattersalls received a timely boost with the victory in the G1 Japan Cup of Gentildonna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), the first 3-year-old filly to land the prestigious race, having also won the Fillies' Triple Crown. Her dam Donna Blini (GB) sold to Katsumi Yoshida of Northern Farm for 500,000gns in Newmarket in 2006 and her first two foals are both now stakes winners.

Two consignors in particular will have been thrilled with that result as a brace of half-sisters to Donna Blini are offered during the week of the mares' sale, which starts Dec. 3. **Little Book (GB)** (Librettist) is offered by The Castlebridge Consignment as [lot 1516](#). The 4-year-old is in foal to Invincible Spirit (Ire), while her Averti (Ire) half-sibling **Sister Moonshine (GB)** ([lot 1946](#)) forms part of the Heatherwold Stud draft and will be sold carrying to leading first-season sire Sakhee's Secret.

"Gentildonna's Japan Cup win was an unbelievable advertisement for the sale," said Tattersalls' marketing director Jimmy George. "Donna Blini has been a spectacular success story and she underlines why people come from all corners of the world to Tattersalls for the December Sale.

"It's the number one breeding stock sale in Europe and there's not a hotel room to be had in Newmarket during the mares' week."

Also in the Japan Cup field was the recent G1 Melbourne Cup third Jakkalberry, whose dam **Claba di San Jore (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}) is offered by Wattlefield Stud ([lot 1745](#)) on behalf of her Italian owners. Jakkalberry, winner of the G1 Gran Premio di Milano, is just one of the 13-year-old's five black-type performers, along with Derby Italiano winners Awelmarduk (Ire) (Almutawakel {GB}) and Crackerjack King (Ire) (Shamardal). Having foaled a Shamardal filly this year, Claba di San Jore is offered in foal to Dubawi (Ire), meaning her resultant foal will be bred on the same cross as Dubawi's two Group 1 winners in 2012, Monterosso (Fr) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and Hunter's Light (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}). **More from Tattersalls p8**

National Stud Set to Shine

A Classic-producing mare who is likely to find her name on the list of many of the sale's potential big spenders is **Secret Garden (Ire)** ([lot 1807](#)), a daughter of Danehill whose fourth foal is Galileo (Ire)'s Irish 2000 Guineas winner Roderic O'Connor (Ire). Secret Garden has returned to Galileo in every subsequent year and is carrying to the champion sire. The 13-year-old raced for her breeder, the late Robert Sangster, and is now owned by Robert's son Ben, the chairman of the National Stud, which consigns the mare.

"She's a collector's item," said the National Stud's managing director Brian O'Rourke. "She has already produced a Classic winner and is now carrying a full-sibling to him, by arguably the world's greatest sire. We're very privileged to be able to sell a mare of this calibre and that's all thanks to our chairman Ben Sangster."

While Secret Garden is a stand-out lot, she is by no means the only exciting offering from the National Stud, which has enjoyed a period of rejuvenation under O'Rourke's direction. Just before she enters the ring, the stud also consigns **Kushnarenkovo (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) ([lot 1805](#)), a full-sister to St Leger winner Brian Boru (GB) in foal to Fastnet Rock (Aus), and **Altesse Imperiale (Ire)** ([lot 1806](#)), a daughter of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) from the Wildenstein family of Arcangues and Aquarelliste (Fr). She is to be sold having been covered by Sea The Stars (Ire) in April, and her current filly foal, which sells as [lot 1032](#) on Friday, is one of three Galileo (Ire) weanlings to be offered this week (her Galileo yearling colt is offered as [lot 212](#) today from the Glenvale Stud draft).

Among other foals of note from the National Stud draft is a New Approach (Ire) colt ([lot 999](#)) out of Peter and Jan Hopper's Firenze (GB) (Efisio {GB}), a sister to G1 July Cup winner Frizzante (GB), and an Oasis Dream (GB) half-brother to the multiple group winner Lolly For Dolly (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) ([lot 1000](#)), who was herself sold for 500,000gns at this sale last year.

"I'm very excited about our foal and mare drafts this year, in the respect that they are not just nice horses on paper, but also very nice individuals to back it up," added O'Rourke. "This is the level we've been aiming for since the Jockey Club took over the National Stud four years ago, and hopefully it will all come to fruition this fortnight."

Having been withdrawn from Fasig-Tipton's November Sale, **Rosie's Posy (Ire)** (Suave Dancer) ([lot 1800](#)) looks set to be one of the highlights at Park Paddocks when she sells a week on Tuesday. The dam of dual Grade 1 winner Dubawi Heights (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) is offered carrying to Oasis Dream (GB), while her weanling colt ([lot 953](#)) sells on Friday and is a three-quarter-brother to Dubawi Heights, by Dubawi's Classic-winning son Makfi (GB).

Sheik Fahad Al-Thani's young stallion, who stands at Tweenhills Stud, where he will be joined in 2013 by Harbour Watch (Ire), is one of the best represented of the freshmen with 26 first-crop foals on offer this week.

Vying for top honours on the first day of the mares' sale is likely to be **Twyla Tharp (Ire)** ([lot 1511](#)), a Sadler's Wells half-sister to Group 1 winners Summoner (GB) (Inchinar {GB}) and Compton Admiral (GB) (Suave Dancer), whose daughter The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}) won this season's G1 Nassau S. and was recently voted Cartier 3-year-old filly of the year. Consigned by Lord and Lady Lloyd Webber's Kiltinan Castle Stud, the 10-year-old mare is in foal to another Juddmonte sire, Oasis Dream (GB).

Four-year-old **Banimpire (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) has already set a sales record when bought by Michel Zerolo of Oceanic Bloodstock for €2.3 million at Goffs last November and she returns to the ring having spent her 4-year-old season racing in America. The G2 Ribblesdale S. winner is offered by European Sales Management, a partnership between Zerolo and his compatriots Eric Puerari of Haras des Capucines and Marc de Chambure of Haras d'Etreham. She sells as [lot 1804](#) next Tuesday during what is likely to be a frenetic evening session.

Game on Dude (Awesome Again) will look to put a disappointing seventh-place effort in the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic behind him in Saturday's GIII Native Diver S. The 5-year-old gelding, ridden in his two most recent starts by Rafael Bejarano, will be ridden Saturday by Mike Smith. Game on Dude will be facing former stablemate **Richard's Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid) in the nine-furlong race. The 7-year-old was fifth in the Classic. "He's definitely running," trainer Doug O'Neill said of the three-time Grade I winner. "He's doing super. I can't wait for Saturday." Also expected in the Native Diver: **Nonios** (Pleasantly Perfect), **Kettle Corn** (Candy Ride {Arg}), **Make Music For Me** (Bernstein), **Fly Lexis Fly** (Badge of Silver) and **Groovin' Solo** (Bob and John).



RACETRACK ROUND-UP

PLETCHER WINNERS IN GOOD SHAPE

Trainer Todd Pletcher reported that all three of his graded stakes winners at Aqueduct Saturday came back in fine fettle. Pletcher and owner Mike Repole enjoyed a historic afternoon on the featured day of the Big A's Heineken Holidayfest, with **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini) defeating Groupie Doll (Bowman's Band) in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile and the juveniles **Unlimited Budget** (Street Sense) and **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union) winning the GII Demoiselle S. for fillies and the GII Remsen S. for 2-year-olds, respectively.

"Everyone came back from their efforts in good shape," said Pletcher. In all, Repole went five-for-six in stakes action during the three-day Holidayfest. **Caixa Electronica** (Arromanches) won Thursday's GIII Fall Highweight H. and **Notacatbutallama** (Harlan's Holiday) taking the Super Mario S. Friday.

Pletcher now gets ready to say goodbye to Stay Thirsty, who heads to Ashford Stud in Kentucky with a second Grade I on his resume, following a win in the 2011 GI Travers S. "That was very gratifying for a number of reasons," said Pletcher, who also won the Cigar Mile with Left Bank (French Deputy) (2001), Lion Tamer (Will's Way) (2004) and Purge (Pulpit) (2005). "It's big for his future career to go out on a big note like that."

Pletcher said Unlimited Budget and Overanalyze, as well as Remsen third **Delhomme** (Dixie Union), will soon ship to his winter training base at Palm Meadows. "We'll take them to Florida and sort it out from there," Pletcher said of future plans.

DANCE CARD A WORK IN PROGRESS

Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin faces the best kind of challenge: trying to redress the antics of horse who, despite her occasional greenness, is still winning Grade I races by daylight. That's what McLaughlin has on his hands in the form of the progressive 3-year-old filly **Dance Card** (Tapit), who in her graded debut captured Saturday's GI Gazelle S. at Aqueduct by four lengths despite drifting out noticeably in the lane. It was the third straight race where Dance Card has wandered in the lane, and while McLaughlin isn't overly concerned, he'd rather see some more professionalism from his budding star.

"If someone acts up in the gate, you take them to the gate in the morning and school them, and watch them get better," McLaughlin said yesterday. "When they don't do anything wrong in training, and they do it the afternoon of the race, it can be very frustrating...but not so bad if they're five in front. Now that she's won a Grade I, we may tinker a bit with her equipment."

A \$750,000 FTFEB purchase, Dance Card was winning her fourth straight race and her second in stakes company, following a 7 1/2-length tally in the Belle Cherie S. at Belmont Sept. 23.

It was a record-equaling fourth Gazelle win for her owner, Godolphin Racing, who also won with Flashing (A.P. Indy) (2009), Music Note (A.P. Indy) (2008) and Imperial Gesture (Langfuhr) (2002). She also became Goldolphin's fifth Grade I winner race in 2012, joining her McLaughlin-trained stablemates **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song) (Forego), **Alpha** (Bernardini) (Travers), **Questing (GB)** (Hard Spun) (Alabama, Coaching Club American Oaks) and **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) (Ogden Phipps H.).

Through Saturday, Godolphin runners were 14-6-9 from 49 starts and earned nearly \$3.6 million, with 11 of those wins coming in graded stakes. The stable added a Grade I to its 2012 haul Sunday when Better Lucky (Ghostzapper) won the GI Matriarch S. "If you put Darley and Godolphin together, it would be \$7 million, almost," added McLaughlin. "It was a pretty good year from only 40-odd starts."

KYJC RUNNERS LOOK AHEAD

The first three finishers of Saturday's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs exited the race in fine shape and connections are already looking ahead. "He came out great, thank goodness, other than a few cuts on his legs that I think he got at the start, where he got banged around pretty good," trainer Mark Casse said of the winner **Uncaptured** (Lion Heart). "He's going to go to Palm Meadows and get a little bit of a break there. I'll sit down with [owner] Mr. [John] Oxley and we'll map out probably three races to get him to the GI Kentucky Derby. I just don't know which three they'll be." Uncaptured defeated Magic City Thoroughbred Partners' **Frac Daddy** (Scat Daddy) by a neck Saturday, with Siena Farm's **Dewey Square** (Bernardini) in third. All three are expected to winter in Florida.

FLINT HOPING HE HAS OAKS FILLY

Seaneen Girl (Spring at Last)'s upset victory in Saturday's GI Golden Rod S. at Churchill Downs already has trainer Bernie Flint circling next year's GI Kentucky Oaks on the calendar. "They're going to run the Oaks here and she loves the place," Flint said. "She's second in [Road to the Kentucky Oaks] points and she's just coming around." The 72-year-old trainer added, "[Her win] meant a lot to me at this stage of the game. I've always been a filly specialist and it'd be great if I could win the Oaks." Seaneen Girl, owned by Naveed Chowhan, was a 31-1 longshot in the Golden Rod. She was the highest-priced winner since Sequent won the race in 1962 at 96-1. "No one told her that she's not supposed to run with those kinds of horses and I sure didn't tell her," Flint concluded. 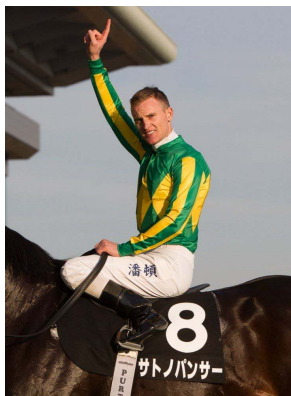

Purton added 10 more points to his tally when he guided the longshot Galileo Barows (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}) to a fifth placing in the Marvelous Jockeys Trophy S. yesterday, then sealed the deal by booting home sixth choice Satono Panther (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) to victory in the Prominent Jockeys Trophy. Purton garnered a total of 52 points, 12 points more

Watchdog Report: Deaths at New York Racetracks Spark Changes

"New York saw a 30 percent increase in horse deaths on its tracks between 2009 and 2011. The number of deaths grew from 127 in 2009 to 165 in 2011; it spiked in 2010 at 209 deaths. Local track officials and horsemen say there was not one definitive reason for the increase, but that it was likely a combination of factors including, but limited to, racing surface, weather, horses with pre-existing problems and bad luck."
