RECORD TURNOVER AT ARQANA DECEMBER

Tuesday's fourth day of Arqana's Breeding Stock Sale was a dedicated national hunt affair, with the top lot of the day realising a modest €60,000, but the final session at the Elie de Brignac complex did ensure that turnover broke through the €20-million barrier, establishing a new record for the sale. The auction houses's €20,642,000 take, including private sales, benefitted from an improved clearance rate and surged forward over 18% compared to last year's corresponding figure. The benchmarks all posted advances as well, with the sale average and median jumping up over 9% each.

"The overall results of the four days are extremely pleasing, especially as we have achieved a new record," commented Arqana's Eric Hoyeau at the close of trade. "The aggregate of €20,642,000, as well as the 79.21% clearance rate, is very positive, underlining the satisfaction of everybody concerned. The activity was constant throughout the sale, and the new format worked extremely well." **Cont. p3**

Watson, Pegram, et al's **Really Mr Greely** (Horse Greeley), looking to follow up on his half-length victory in the Nov. 22 Gill Hollywood Prevue S., and stablemate **Title Contender** (Pulpit), eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, worked four furlongs at Hollywood Sunday in :47.20. Jill Baffert and Bode Miller's **Carving** (Any Given Saturday), winner of the Nov. 10 Real Quiet S. over the Futurity's track and 1 1/16-mile distance, tuned up with a five-furlong work in 1:00.80 Monday. Also working that distance Monday was Westrock Stable's **Den's Legacy** (Medaglia d'Oro), who moves back to the main track after winning the Nov. 24 Gill Generous S. over the Hollywood lawn.

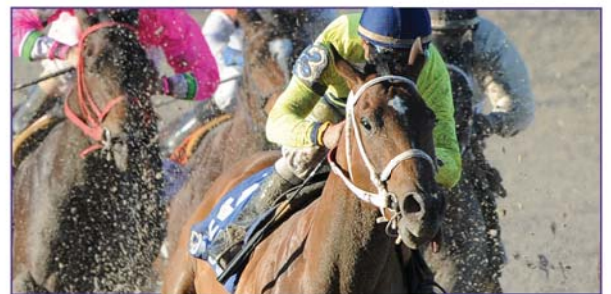

JOHA TO BE SOLD AT KEENELAND

Joha (Johar), winner of the GI Dixiana Breeders’ Futurity at Keeneland in October, will be offered as a racing or stallion prospect at Keeneland January. The soon-to-be 3-year-old, catalogued as [hip 381](#), will be consigned by Hill ‘n’ Dale Sales Agency, agent. In addition to the Futurity, Joha won the Colin S. at Woodbine in July and was second in the GII With Anticipation S. at Saratoga in August. He was most recently ninth in the Nov. 24 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill. Joha was bred and raced by Bluegrass Equine Bloodstock, a group which also operates Bluegrass Equine Center in Salvisa, Kentucky. “This is an excellent opportunity for someone to buy a Grade I winner who is sound and ready to race,” said Allen Kershaw, general manager of the center. “Joha showed us his ability early on, and he has certainly proven it on the racetrack. I believe he will continue to progress in 2013.” Kershaw added that Joha, currently stabled at Bluegrass Equine Center, is from the first group of horses bred by the partnership to have been developed at the center.

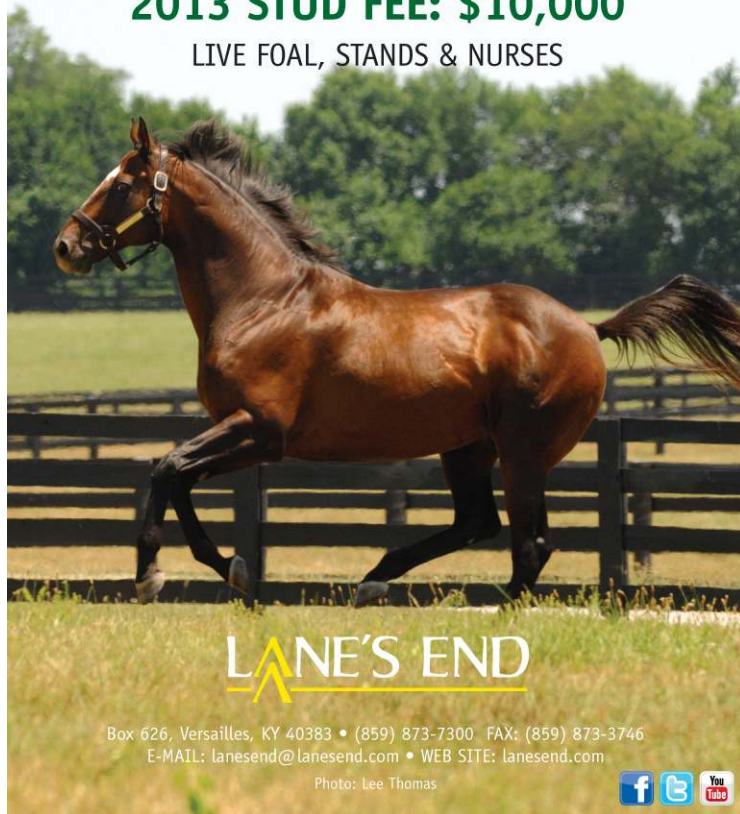

LINDSAY PARK LOST TO RACING AFTER 50 YEARS OF INFLUENCE

The Hayes family ownership of world-renowned Lindsay Park is over. The show-place horse stud and training property in the beautiful wine growing district of the Barossa Valley in South Australia nurtured the careers of leading Australian mentors Colin, Peter and David Hayes for 47 years.

The 1550 acres of rolling pastoral country dotted with soaring, statuesque red gums and a specific infrastructure to house, train and breed racehorses has been sold to an unnamed family uninterested in the horse business for a reported A\$10 million plus.

The sold sign was erected last Saturday, a week before the planned auction of the picture-book property. The new buyers will breed cattle, a further blow to the local SA Thoroughbred industry which flourished in the booming Hayes heyday of the 1970s, 80s and 90s.

The weekend sale was orchestrated by sole owner David Hayes, who inherited the property from his late father Colin in 1990 and bought out his siblings after a decade of training successfully in Hong Kong from 1995.

David first attempted to to sell the property in June 2010, when he surprisingly relocated to Victoria where he has established a new A\$20 million Lindsay Park at rural Euroa, an hour and a half north of Melbourne.

The aim was to train using the same methods as Lindsay Park, SA, but be better placed geographically--roughly half way between major racing centers of Melbourne and Sydney.

Yet from the SA base, the Hayes father and son, both Australian Hall of Famers, won a Japan Cup and three Melbourne Cups plus every other Australian Classic with horses trained on the gallops of Lindsay Park, inspired by the English tradition of training on private tracks on private estates.

Despite its English heritage, Lindsay Park's breeding and training operation under the same roof was revolutionary in Australia when established in 1965 and has led to many others being established similar to Lloyd Williams Macedon property outside Melbourne, that this year gave us Cup hero Green Moon.

Apart from the privacy and non-rushed atmosphere of the place, Hayes always mentioned to visitors to Lindsay Park (as he did to me on a tour in the late 80s) that horses liked being horses, spending time in open paddocks and sleeping under the stars. **Cont. p5**

He also repeated his mantra that the future belonged to those who planned for it.

Colin Hayes was a character with a work ethic that knew no bounds, and not only did he win continuous Melbourne and Adelaide training premierships, he also set new standards with his sire Without Fear, who broke the world record for 2-year-old winners in 1975/76. In that year the stallion sired 30 individual winners of 48 races.

The Hayes dynasty not only unearthed turf stars like Japan Cup winner Better Loosen Up (Loosen Up), the ill-fated champion Dulcify, two-time Cox Pate winner Fields of Omagh (Rubiton), the future champion sire Zabeel (Octagonal) and the only filly ever to win a Golden Slipper and Victorian Oaks, Miss Finland (Redoute's Choice). Equally importantly, they introduced the likes of Robert Sangster and Sheikh Hamdan to Australian racing.

The trio masterminded the shuttle of international stallions into Australia, now a dominant part of Australian genetics and, of course, reached a pinnacle in the imported Danehill (Danzig) emerging as a breed-changing international super-success.

Sheikh Hamdan, Sangster and Hayes also pioneered travelling international horses to race in the Melbourne Cup and showed the way with celebrated Cup winners, Sangster's U.S.-bred Belldale Ball and the Sheikh Hamdan-owned and UK-born and -raised Jeune (Kalaglow).

While David Hayes has expressed sadness about selling the family seat, he is realistic that the racing caravan has moved on from SA and that prizemoney in the major capitals is three times that available in his home state.

The impact this has on finding new owners and developing the business is enormous and fully recognized by the financial brain of David Hayes, who nevertheless is finding it difficult to re-create the success at Euroa that he had at Lindsay Park, SA.

However he believes that is all about to change, having just posted his 50th winner for the year at not even the half-way mark.

The historic sale includes a 19th century, 38-room three-level homestead and comes only months after the death of Hayes matriarch and mother of David, Betty Hayes, who lived in a house on part of the property now leased by her grandson Sam Hayes for his Cornerstone Stud.

Sam Hayes, a son of the late Peter Hayes, is a trainer in his own right and older brother of David, and will continue to operate Cornerstone with the permission of the new owners, who will honor his lease signed with cousin David until 2016.

Said Sam Hayes, "I only heard about it on Friday night. It came out of the blue, but it's good news for David and Prue (David's wife), and we can continue, so that's good too. I will be fascinated to meet the new owners and see what they plan to do with the farm. At this stage its only a guessing game as to who it is," he added.

NYSRWB APPROVES MEDICATION CHANGES

Acting on the request of the Task Force on Racehorse Health and Safety, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board approved changes Tuesday on two of its tough new emergency rules on medication use and also delayed the start date by two weeks until Dec. 26.

Dr. Scott Palmer, chair of the task force, notified the board of the proposed modifications to match recently adopted national standards by phone on Monday and followed with a letter later in the day. The task force asked the board to shorten the new withdrawal time for clenbuterol from 21 to 14 days prior to a race and reduce the restriction for joint injections of methylprednisolone (DepoMedrol) from 15 to seven days. Previously, clenbuterol was allowed up to four days before a race and methylprednisolone injections had to be stopped five days out.

The task force was formed in March by Governor Andrew Cuomo to investigate why an unusually high number of horses died from injuries suffered at Aqueduct Racetrack. In a comprehensive report issued Sept. 28, the task force recommended that state regulators and the New York Racing Association make a number of policy and procedural changes. Several emergency rules, including the clenbuterol and methylprednisolone standards, were approved during a special meeting Oct. 11.

Those changes were scheduled to take effect Dec. 12, the first day of the inner track season at Aqueduct.

The start was pushed back by 14 days, when racing resumes at Aqueduct after the holiday break, to give horsemen time to adjust to the new standards. Also, the board expects to have its online data entry system up and running by that date.

“New York continues to lead the nation in innovative and impactful racing regulation and implementation,” RWB Chairman John D. Sabini said in a statement. “In recommending these changes, the Task Force on Racehorse Health and Safety demonstrated an admirable and continued dedication to improving equine safety and the functionality of the industry as a whole. We are hopeful that with these changes, other jurisdictions will follow suit and bring much-needed consistency to drug rules across the country.”

In his letter to Sabini, Dr. Palmer noted that the Association of Racing Commissioners International at its December meeting had adopted the 14-day withdrawal time for clenbuterol and seven days for methylprednisolone as national rules recommendations.

The Racing and Wagering Board issued a timeline Tuesday to clarify what changes had been made in New York since the task force's report was released. October 19, 2012 (in effect):

- Voiding a claim for a horse that is vanned off the track, within one hour of the race, at the discretion of the claimant. The existing rule where a claim is voided if a claimed horse dies on the track remains in place. (Rule 4038.5)

- Providing that the claimant of a horse shall be notified, within 48 hours after the claim is finalized, of any intra-articular corticosteroid administrations to the horse within 30 days of the race. (Rule 4038.5)

- Out of competition sampling of Thoroughbred racehorses for corticosteroids, methylprednisolone and clenbuterol. (Rule 4012.5)

December 26, 2012:

- Providing that the trainer shall maintain accurate records of all corticosteroid joint injections to horses trained by them. The record of every corticosteroid joint injection shall be submitted, in a form and manner approved by the board, by the trainer or treating veterinarian to the board within 48 hours of treatment. (Rule 4043.4(b))-

- Rule prohibiting: (Rule 4043.2)

(a) the intra-articular administration of methylprednisolone (DepoMedrol) within seven days of the date of a race

(b) the administration of all other intra-articular corticosteroids within seven days of the date of a race

(c) the administration of all systemic corticosteroids within five days of the date of a race

(d) administration of clenbuterol to a horse within 14 days of the date of a race.

- Removing clenbuterol from the 96-hour permissible drug schedule to be in compliance with the above. (Rule 4043.2)

- Removing steroids from permissible 48-hour drug schedule to be in compliance with the above. (Rule 4043.2)

The board has developed a data entry system--The Equine Steroid Administration Log (ESAL)--that is expected to be in operation on Dec. 26. It will allow trainers and veterinarians to easily record the administration of corticosteroid steroids to Thoroughbred racehorses.

The database will automatically generate a list of horses that have been administered substances, accessible by examining veterinarians, RWB personnel, track veterinarians conducting pre-race inspections, stewards and claimants. Each entry will list the name of the corticosteroid administered, the location of the administration and the date the horse would be cleared to race in accordance with RWB Rule 4043.2(i).

Connecticut has given approval to Sportech Venues, Inc., a division of Sportech PLC and operator of Winners off-track-betting and telephone account wagering services, to accept pari-mutuel wagering on horse racing over the Internet. Connecticut's Department of Consumer Protection granted the company approval under its current license to handle pari-mutuel wagering on horse and greyhound racing and jai alai. Sportech operates 15 off-track betting venues in the state.

"Sportech is committed to the continual improvement of our facilities and services, and to enhancing the overall experience of our many customers," David Schreff, Sportech's Chief Operating Officer of the Americas, said. "We are confident that our customers will appreciate the convenience and additional services that will be made available to them online. More importantly, they can be confident and assured that the service is secure and fully licensed, and that a portion of every dollar they wager goes back to Connecticut in the form of contributions to the general fund and to responsible gaming funds."

The online account wagering platform is expected to launch by next April and will offer race information, streaming race video, race results and account services.

The U.S. Department of Justice is still considering the legal issues involved in internet gambling, but Stephen Dargan, co-chairman of the Connecticut legislature's public safety committee, told *Hartford Courant* the state is free to award the license to Sportech because the federal gaming law has an exemption which allows on-line and in-person pari-mutuel betting on horse racing. "It's nothing to do with the bigger issue of online gaming via poker or whatever," Dargan, a Democrat from West Haven, explained of the Sportech license. "This is just another vehicle for horse bettors to engage or wager."

Frost Giant Sets Freshman Progeny Earnings Mark:

Frost Giant (Giant's Causeway--Takesmybreathaway, by Gone West)'s first crop of runners have established a progeny earnings record for New York-based freshman sires, according to a release from Keane Stud, which stands the 9-year-old stallion. Winner of the 2008 GI Suburban H., Frost Giant is the sire of stakes winners West Hills Giant and Kelli Got Frosty, as well as stakes-placed Zekes Surprise and Nonnie Connie. Kelli Got Frosty's win in Sunday's East View S. pushed her sire's progeny earnings to \$752,543. The previous record was held by Precise End, whose first-crop progeny earned \$709,293 in 2004.

"We're pleasantly surprised at how well Frost Giant's first offspring are doing as 2-year-olds because they are big horses who we expect will get better as they mature and go longer distances," said Andrew Cohen, who manages the stallion under his Sunset Stables LLC banner. "When I'm watching these races in which his babies are running, it's like I'm watching him again. You see these white faces charging around the far turn and taking off." Cohen bred and co-owns Kelli Got Frosty and co-owned Frost Giant during his racing career.

Frost Giant, who previously stood at Vinery at Sugar Maple, will stand his first season at Keane Stud in Amenia for \$7,500.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

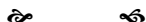

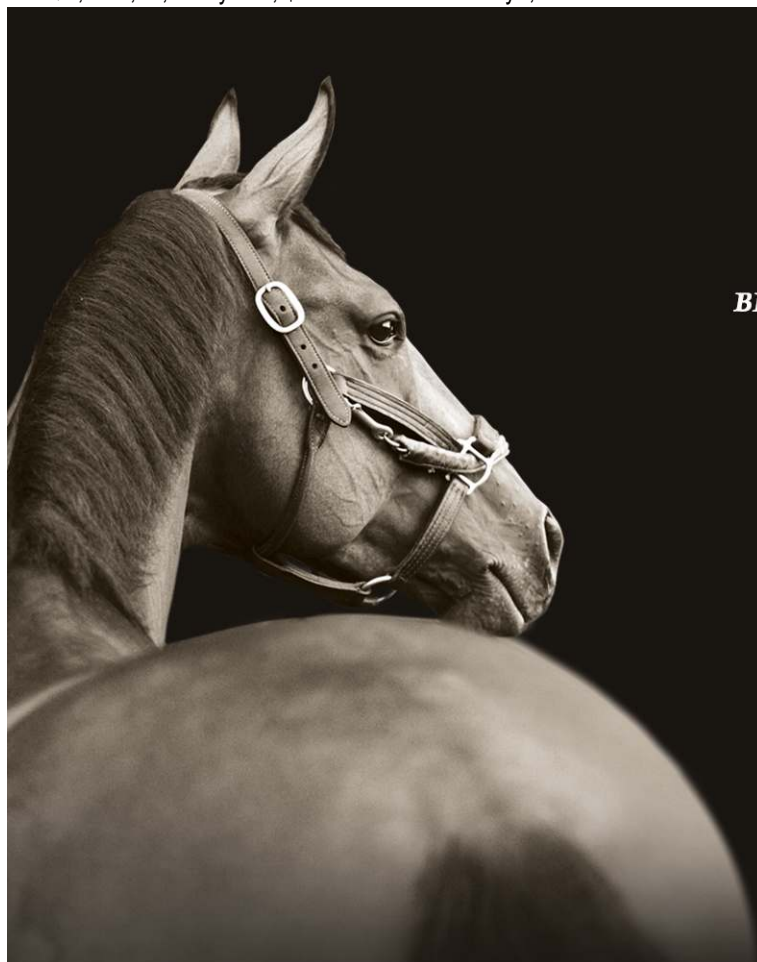

THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

December 12, 1942...1941 Triple Crown winner **Whirlaway** wins the first Louisiana H. His appearance at Fair Grounds was part of a war relief effort developed by the newly formed Thoroughbred Racing Associations.

December 13, 1986...Jockey **Kent Desormeaux** picked up his first stakes win, riding Godbey to victory in the Maryland City H. at Laurel.

December 15, 1973...**Sandy Hawley** became the first jockey in history to win 500 races in a single year when he rode Charlie Jr. to victory in the third race at Laurel Racecourse.

December 17, 1936...Crooner **Bing Crosby** announced plans to construct a new racetrack, to be called the Del Mar Turf Club.

December 17, 1970...**Canonero II**, winless in a pair of starts at Del Mar in the summer, returned to Venezuela to earn a one-length decision in a H. at Rinconada. The colt returned to the United States the following spring to win the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S., en route to being named that year's champion three-year-old colt.
