

DOWNTON ABBEY STAR JOINS HIGHCLERE

Actor Hugh Bonneville, who plays Lord Grantham on the popular television show *Downton Abbey*, has joined leading European syndicate Highclere Thoroughbred

Racing. Bonneville, who is also known for his roles in *Notting Hill* and *Twenty Twelve*, will be co-owner on two Highclere runners next year. One will be trained by Richard Hannon and the other will be trained by Sir Michael Stoute. "I am thrilled to become an owner with Highclere," said Bonneville. "I thought it was about time I became properly educated in the 'Sport of Kings.' It's a terrific opportunity, and to be

able to attend the races as an owner really is very exciting. I can't wait." Bonneville will be part of Highclere's "Petrushka Syndicate," which owns two soon-to-be 2-year-olds. Hannon will train a filly by Fastnet Rock (Aus), while Stoute will condition a colt by Danehill Dancer (Ire).

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing was founded in 1992 by the Hon. Harry Herbert, son of the late seventh Earl of Carnarvon. The Herbert family home, Highclere Castle, is where *Downton Abbey* is filmed. Highclere has campaigned seven champions to date, including Harbinger

(GB) (Dansili {GB}), a smashing winner of the 2010 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. "It is great to have Hugh on board as one of our owners at Highclere and we wish him

all possible luck with these two lovely yearlings," said Herbert. "Both have fabulous pedigrees and have once again been bought by my brother-in-law, John Warren, whose record is second to none."

Bonneville joins the likes of fellow celebrities Elizabeth Hurley, Lawrence Dallaglio, Denise Lewis, Sir Alex Ferguson and Ben Fogle in becoming a Highclere syndicate partner.

WHO'LL RULE IN THE ARIMA KINEN?

Sunday's G1 Arima Kinen, with purse money of ¥416 million (\$4,927,693), is to Japan what the Kentucky Derby is to the U.S., what the Melbourne Cup is to Australia. And though the season-ending feature--for which fan voting determines the composition of the field--will be missing its top two draws, it is a race which attracts the biggest single-race turnover of any race in the entire world and has been won in the past several years by the likes of Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), subsequent G1 Dubai World Cup hero Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}) and Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}). The latter is the defending race

champion, but is passing the 2500-meter test following a long and sometimes frustrating season. So too is Gentildonna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), the reigning Japanese Filly Triple Crown hero, who decisively Orfevre by a nose in a controversial renewal of the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 25. Just behind that duo in Tokyo was **Rulership (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), who has held his form beautifully this season. Winner of the G1 QE II Cup in Hong Kong this spring, he was runner-up to Orfevre in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen in June and a good third to **Eishin Flash (Jpn)** (King's Best) in the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) Oct. 28 ahead of his Japan Cup effort. **Cont. p3**

RMTC ANNOUNCES CORTICOSTEROID WITHDRAWAL RECOMMENDATION

The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium has announced its recently approved minimum withdrawal time for corticosteroids. The new recommendations are based on work partly funded by the RMTC and conducted at the University of Pennsylvania, University of California-Davis Kenneth L. Maddy Laboratory and HFL Laboratory-Kentucky, as well as other institutions in the U.S. and abroad. The recommendations were further developed during the Corticosteroid Experts Conference in Anaheim, California, Nov. 30, an event which brought together analytical chemists, veterinary pharmacologists, veterinary surgeons, racing regulatory veterinarians and practicing racetrack veterinarians to develop a comprehensive plan for regulating corticosteroid use in racing. The group concluded that corticosteroids should be prohibited with seven days of racing, and that a 72-hour withdrawal time should be instituted for dexamethasone, a short-acting corticosteroid.

"These recommendations represent the work of a number of a laboratories and veterinarians both here in the U.S. and overseas," said RMTC Executive Director Dr. Dionne Benson. "This work was supported across the industry through funds contributed to the RMTC for research as well as experts' time. Without the industry's commitment, these recommendations would not be possible."

The group acknowledged that these changes should be accompanied by a grace period to allow veterinarians and horsemen time to adjust their practices. "The goal in bringing these experts together was to develop scientifically-based and enforceable recommendations for the regulation of corticosteroids," said RMTC Chairman Dr. Robert Lewis. "The group's recommendations allow for practitioners to use corticosteroids where medically indicated for treatment of the horse, and remove the pressure of treatment based upon whether a horse is entered to race."

My Miss Aurelia Preps for La Brea...

Stonestreet Stables and George Bolton's **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike) worked four furlongs in :48.60 at Santa Anita yesterday as she prepares for the Arcadia oval's seven-furlong GI La Brea S. Nov. 26. The drill was the 19th-fastest of 51 at the distance. "She's doing great," said Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen, of last year's champion 2-year-old filly and GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic runner-up. "She's a good-feeling filly. She's not mean, very manageable and self-reliant." Blasi also stated the case for My Miss Aurelia being named champion 3-year-old filly off a campaign that included victories in the Mandys Gold S. at Saratoga in August and Parx's GI Cotillion S. Sept. 22. "She should get it," he said. "She beat [GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Alabama S. winner] Questing (Hard Spun) twice [in the Cotillion and the Ladies' Classic]."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Kenneally Runners Eye Sophomore Debuts...

Trainer Eddie Kenneally is looking forward to the 2013 debuts of some of his soon-to-be 3-year-olds. Joseph Sutton's **Bradester** (Lion Heart), last seen breaking his maiden second out by 3 1/4 lengths going 1 1/16 miles at Churchill Downs in faster time than the same card's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 24, is expected to run on the day he becomes a sophomore. "Bradester has been nominated for the [one-mile] Gulfstream Park Derby on Jan. 1," revealed Kenneally. "He may run in that race, but there's also an allowance race at a mile and a sixteenth on the same day. He'll run in one of those two races." He explained, "The horse ran a good race going over a route of ground at Churchill around Thanksgiving, so, ideally, I'd like to keep him at two turns."

Joseph Witek's **Majestic Hussar** (Majestic Warrior), seventh in the GII Hopeful S. Sept. 3, could return to stakes competition following a second-place run in a 6 1/2-furlong Gulfstream optional claimer Dec. 15. "Majestic Hussar ran well and came out of the race really well," Kenneally offered. "He hadn't run since the Hopeful and that was a tough little spot he ran in and he ran well and got beat by a length. We got what we wanted out of the race." The conditioner continued, "Perhaps, he could be a horse for the [Feb. 2 GII] Hutcheson. We'll just see and play it by ear. We'll see how he does the next few weeks. We'll breeze him back at Palm Meadows and decide."

Kenneally also has **Honorable Dillon** (Tapit), unseen since breaking his maiden in his second try at Saratoga Aug. 25, in his arsenal. "He's working really well," said Kenneally of the Joseph Bucci colorbearer, who fired a four-furlong bullet in :47.31 at Palm Meadows Dec. 15. "He had a real nice work the other day, so he's nearing a comeback also. He's got a future."

Mudflats Purchased, Transferred to O'Neill...

Little Red Feather Racing has purchased a majority interest in two-year-old **Mudflats** (Tapit), a 3 1/4-length third-out graduate at Aqueduct Dec. 8. The \$150,000 OBSMAR buy will be transferred from Eddie Kenneally to Doug O'Neill, but will remain in the barn of New York-based trainer Nick Canani ahead of a start in the Big A's Jan. 5 GII Jerome S. "We are always on the look out for hot prospects for our partners," said LRF Managing Partner Billy Koch. "Dennis [O'Neill, bloodstock agent and Doug's] approached us after the maiden win and we fell instantly in love with him." LRF Managing Partner Gary Fenton added, "We've been trying to find a horse to give to Doug. Keep your fingers crossed. We hope this is a great start to an exciting 2013 for our partners."

Letters TO THE EDITOR

Live Oak Plantation owner Charlotte Weber sent the following open letter to Calder Race Course President Austin Miller.

Dear Mr. Miller,

I have written before to express my concern for the environment and condition of the back side as well as the grandstand areas at Calder Race Course. It appears nothing (not a penny) has been done or is being done to maintain the facility in the most basic/minimal manner. It is the opinion of many that Churchill Downs is intentionally trying to drive horsemen and racing in general away from Calder. The casino/slots are doing well and are available to Churchill Downs/Calder as the result of horse racing. It seems that there must be some balance to the bottom line, running a casino and addressing the needs of horse racing and horsemen.

Examples of things that concern me are:

- Failure to return calls to an owner (Horse owner).
- Escalator not functioning for months.
- Elevator not functioning for months.
- Roof leaks.
- Charging trainers \$10/day for stalls.
- Charging grooms \$5/day for deplorable living conditions.
- Management stating to an owner, "the business model for racing is broke and racing has no future".

I have stabled and run horses at Calder for many years and Calder has played an important role for me in running my racing stable. I am also a board member and active in running a major company and understand there are difficult decisions that have to be made from time to time. However, the apparent approach being taken by management at Churchill Downs and/or Calder is not in keeping with conducting business in a fair, honest and principled manner.

My trainer and I can make adjustments if your intentions are to eliminate racing from Calder. We would appreciate the respect and courtesy of knowing this to be the case. If these are not the intentions of Churchill/Calder, you need to be aware it is the message that is being received. If your intentions are to continue racing at Calder, you must earmark resources and energy to honest communication with horsemen, improving the conditions of the back side as well as the front side and in general, taking an interest in being fair to horse racing and those involved.

It is my hope you have an interest in Thoroughbred racing at Calder and the other tracks owned by Churchill Downs. For me, that interest will be reflected by actions taken or not taken by management in the near future.

NJ SENATE APPROVES INTERNET GAMBLING

The New Jersey Senate yesterday passed a bill that would allow internet gambling in the state, according to published reports. The bill, which passed the Senate 33-3, was approved by the Assembly in a 48-25 vote earlier this week. An earlier version of the bill contained a clause that would have seen as much as \$30 million to go towards horseracing purses in the state, but the clause was removed before the bill reached the Assembly. The bill will now be sent to Governor Chris Christie, who has 45 days to decide whether to pass or veto it. He vetoed a similar bill nearly two years ago, citing concerns that the bill may not have been in line with state law allowing gambling--with the exception of horseracing and the lottery--only in Atlantic City. The bill that passed the Senate yesterday states that equipment used for internet gambling would reside in Atlantic City, with the potential for backup equipment to be located elsewhere. Woodbine Announces Strong 2012 Handle Increases:

Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) announced yesterday strong wagering growth on Thoroughbred racing in 2012 following the conclusion of its Woodbine meet last Sunday. All sources handle on the 156-day meet was \$453,865,564, up 7.2% from 2011's figure of \$423,209,365. Woodbine held 165 racecards last year. Per-card handle increased 13.4% year-over-year from \$2,564,905 to \$2,909,394. This was the fourth-consecutive year of handle increases at Woodbine. The Etobicoke oval has seen handle rise by 34% since 2008. WEG's home market business showed a slight decline of 1.6% per card. International sources, namely the U.S., were a major source of growth. "We're seeing legitimate interest in our racing programs in Toronto, across the country and internationally," said Nick Eaves, WEG's President and Chief Executive Officer. "We're proud of the quality of our racing product and the positive momentum that we are experiencing with it. We are very thankful for the support and loyalty from our horsepeople and our increasing fan base, particularly in these challenging times." Horse racing in Ontario is currently at a crossroads following the cancellation of the Slots-at-Racetracks program in February. "While we are pleased with the results of our 2012 Thoroughbred racing season, we are extremely concerned about the lack of certainty which exists for 2013," said Eaves. "The continued success of Woodbine's live racing program and the significant employment and economic impacts which come with it are dependent on a new partnership between the industry and the Province of Ontario. We remain optimistic that such a new arrangement can be achieved. We continue to work with the Government toward this end, and hope to be able to provide the necessary certainty soon for all stakeholders in the province."

SCALO RETIRED, TO STAND IN FRANCE

Gestut Hof Ittlingen's 2010 G1 Preis von Europa hero **Scalo (GB)** (Lando {Ger}--Sky Dancing {Ire}), by Exit to Nowhere) has suffered a career-ending injury to the proximal sesamoid bone, and has been retired to stand at Haras du Logis Saint-Germain in France. Germany's champion 3-year-old colt and Horse of the Year in 2010, he also bagged the G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville during a banner sophomore campaign for trainer Andreas Wohler. His dam is 2001 Listed Premio Buontalenta winner Sky Dancing, who has also produced two other black-type performers including the 2006 G3 Prix Chloe victress Sexy Lady (Ger) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Scalo, whose last run was a seventh in the Oct. 14 G1 Canadian International at Woodbine, was runner-up in two further top-level events and retires with a career record of 14-6-2-1, and earnings of €423,678. His fee has been set at €3,500 special live foal.

PIETSCH BANNED FOR THREE MONTHS

Leading German rider Alexander Pietsch faces a lengthy spell on the sidelines after being found guilty of reckless riding at the Nov. 24 Halle meet. Pietsch, riding **Etali (Ger)** (Muhtathir {GB}), was charged with deliberately elbowing jockey Jose Luis Silverio, aboard **Saco (Ger)** (Pentire {GB}), during a driving finish to a 1750-meter handicap at the Saxony-Anhalt track. Silverio's mount was ultimately beaten by a head into second, with Etali running fourth. Pietsch initially denied the charge, but eyewitnesses--including fellow jockey Filip Minarik, who also rode in the race--confirmed Silverio's allegations. Pietsch was given a five-month punishment, but, with two months set as a probationary period, he will serve a three-month ban.

David Fish's dual G2 International Bosphorus Cup winner **Indian Days (GB)** (Daylami {Ire}--Cap Coz {Ire}, by Indian Ridge {Ire}) has been retired to take up stud duties in Turkey, according to *Racing Post*. He will be managed by Cem Ozyigit on behalf of the Turkish Jockey Club. The 7-year-old chestnut, who also garnered last term's G3 John Porter S. at Newbury, was unable to return to racecourse action after running off the board in the Mar. 10 G2 Dubai City of Gold at Meydan. He retires with a career record of 41-7-3-5, and earnings of £523,855. "Indian Days was a sound, hard-working and hard-trying horse, and a real gentleman in his later years even though he was an entire," trainer James Given told the trade daily. "It took him a while to mature, and the fact that we were allowed to give him time, when he was an attractive jumps prospect, is a reflection of the patience of his owner. He traveled well in his races and was able to quicken off a fast pace. The last time he won the Bosphorus Cup he beat a multiple Group 1 winner in Campanologist, and did it in the fastest time for that race in the last 11 years. He was with us for six years so it will be sad not have him around the yard."

GUINEAS WINNER TO WAIKATO STUD **Rock 'n' Pop (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}--Popsy {NZ}, by Sir Tristram {Ire}), who won the G1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas in just his fourth career start, will enter stud at Waikato Stud upon completion of his racing career. A NZ\$1-million purchase at the New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale, the son of 1993 G1 New Zealand

Derby heroine Popsy graduated in his first career start for the Te Akau Syndicate and was narrowly defeated in his next two appearances before his half-length victory in the Guineas. "It's a rare quality in a racehorse to be able to quicken off a Group 1 field, but he was just devastating

that day," said trainer Jason Bridgman of the Guineas success. Rock 'n' Pop added a listed stakes victory in January before finishing third against weight-for-age company in the G1 Waikato International S. Feb. 11 and runner-up in the G1 New Zealand Derby Mar. 3. "In the 27 years that we've been running Te Akau, we haven't had a better miler. His win in the 2000 Guineas was the easiest Gr.1 win, I have ever seen" said Te Akau Syndicate Manager David Ellis.
