The 2011 Horse of the Year **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam--Easter Bunnette, by Carson City), purchased by Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$10-million at the Fasig-Tipton November sale, will be bred to **Tapit** in 2013, while 2011 GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro--Liszy, by A.P. Indy), purchased by Pope for \$4.2 million at Keeneland November, will visit **Distorted Humor** next spring. Both mares are currently boarded at Wayne and Cathy Swezey's Timber Town Stable in Lexington and Wayne Swezey confirmed breeding plans for the paddockmates yesterday. **Cont. p6**

Book Review raced at the tail of the leading group with just one rival behind her in the early stages, and connections would have been licking their chops when Reneesgotzip, **Nechez Dawn** (Indian Charlie) and odds-on My Miss Aurelia set an opening half-mile in a blistering :44.17 seconds. Book Review began to find her best stride midway on the turn and wanted to lug in past midstretch, but was

re-balanced by Rafael Bejarano and was up in the nick of time for a narrow victory from a game Reneesgotzip.

"If you look at her form, she either shows up or she doesn't, and today was a day to show up," Baffert continued. "I'm happy. She ran great. It's great to be here opening day. I love opening day and to win a Grade I, that's like a Christmas gift to myself."

Bejarano added, "I saw there was a lot of speed in the race, and that was very good for me. I let her do whatever she felt comfortable with. I knew she was going to come running at the end, so I just waited for the right time, and it worked."

Book Review, a runaway maiden winner over subsequent Grade I heroine Dance Card (Tapit) at Belmont in May, looked primed for the big leagues after delivering a visually impressive allowance win at Saratoga July 20, but failed to repeat that performance when seventh in the prestigious GI Test S. Aug. 25. She got back on track with a win in the \$400,000 Charles Town Oaks going seven furlongs Sept. 22, then stretched to 1 1/16 miles with a dominating tally in Belmont's Imperial Gesture S. Oct. 24. Book Review was shipped to California following a disappointing fifth in the GI Gazelle S. at Aqueduct Nov. 24.

Jimmy Creed reeled off two straight wins in July before finishing a game second, beaten a neck, to Fed Biz (Giant's Causeway) in the El Cajon S. Aug. 31. A close third to his elders in the GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship S. Oct. 6, the chestnut never showed up when ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint most recently Nov. 3. Placed in a perfect spot along the inside behind the pacesetting duo of Private Zone (Macho Uno) and 4-5 favorite The Lumber Guy (Grand Slam) through an opening quarter in :22.74, he was allowed a two-path run when

The Lumber Guy couldn't match strides with Private Zone in upper stretch and charged by for a career high. "The horse doesn't like dirt in his face and that's basically what bothered him in the Breeders' Cup," Mandella continued. "We trained him behind horses and schooled him as much as we could, so I just told Garrett it was up to him to do what he thinks best. He got him out of the two hole and just close enough to where he didn't get that big stream of mud in his face."

Silentio, a promising juvenile debut winner over Battle Force in a grassy Santa Anita maiden last October, resurfaced nearly a year later to remain perfect in a

\$40,000 optional tagger at Del Mar Sept. 5. Third as the 5-2 favorite in a \$62,500 optional claimer at Santa Anita Oct. 12, the Wertheimer and Frere homebred took plenty of tote action in his stakes debut here. The long-striding bay sat within striking range in fourth, hit the gas with a three-wide move as they straightened for home, and held off a late charge from his old rival to collect the trophy. "There's no secret--he's a good horse," trainer Gary Mandella commented. "The secret is to have a good horse and that's what

this is. The only thing I'll take credit for is that we gave him a lot of time for his injury as a 2-year-old. He won last year here and came out of a race with activity in his tibia that would have turned into fractures. But the bigger thing was he had some cysts in his hocks. (They were) dug out surgically and we gave him a lot of time to get over it. The time allowed him to grow into himself and become a good horse and I hope for even better things to come if I get lucky."

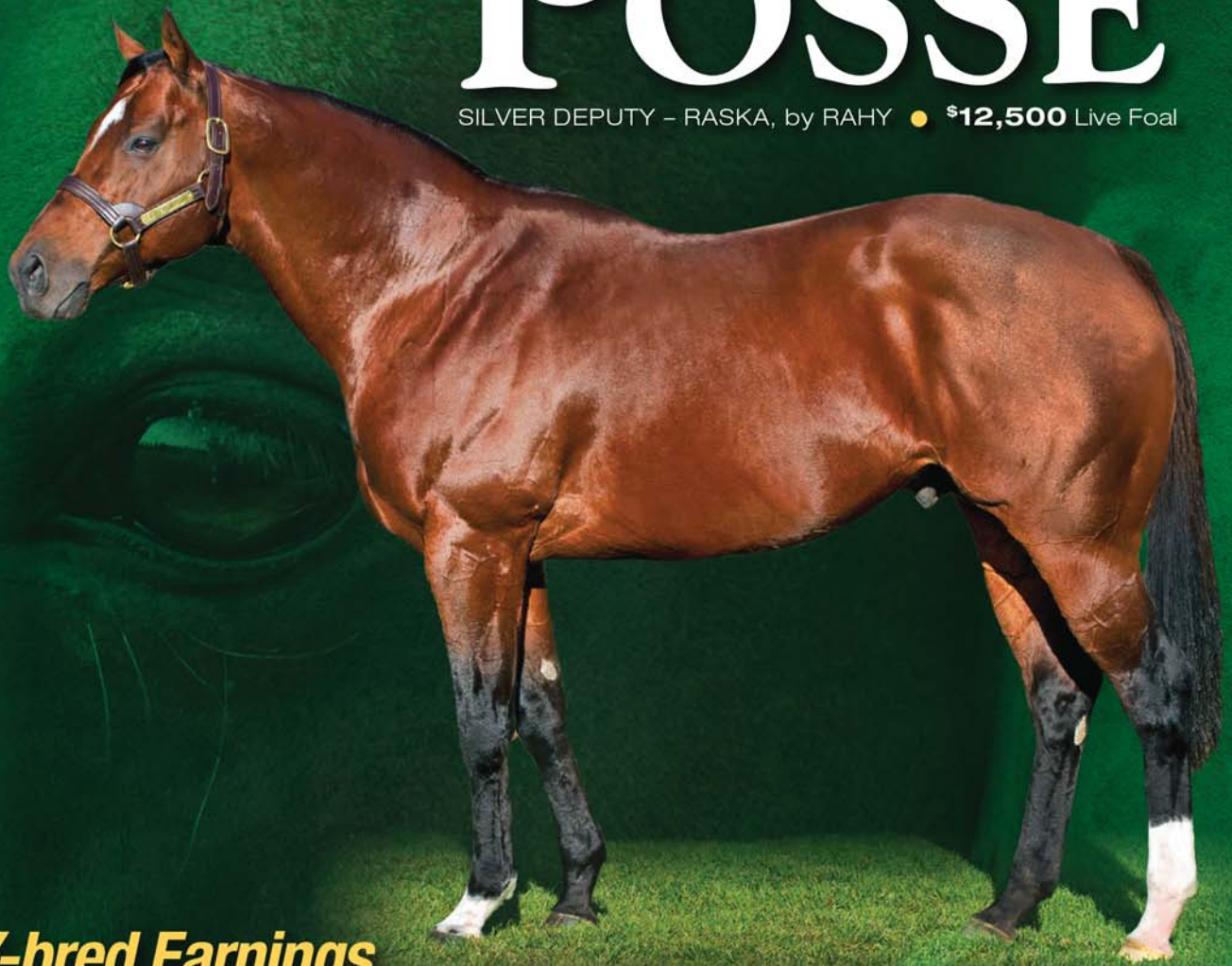

Of the decision to send Havre de Grace to Tapit, Sweezy explained, “We had tossed around several different stallions, obviously all the high-end stallions that Havre de Grace could go to, horses like Bernardini, Galileo (Ire) and Tapit. We did a lot of research and used pedigree analyst John Prather, who was a big help. We studied all the options.”

Ultimately, it was decided to focus on American stallions.

“Mandy loves her horses and she wants to be able to see them and handle them,” Sweezy said. “She could have gone to Galileo, but she made the decision to stay in the States because she wanted to see her. And then, with Bernardini, we were concerned because she has Quiet American with Saint Liam and, if we had gone to Bernardini, we would have doubled up on the Fappiano-line, so that kind of pushed us away from Bernardini, although he would make a lovely cross for her. So we went with Tapit because we felt we had the best opportunity for a good return on the product if we went with him.”

Havre de Grace will be the second Horse of the Year to visit Tapit, who stands at Gainesway, following Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in 2012. Racing for Rick Porter’s Fox Hill Farm, Havre de Grace was a three-time Grade I winner and earned over \$2.5 million.

Two-time Grade I winner Plum Pretty, who earned over \$1.6 million on the racetrack for Peachtree Stables, will be bred to WinStar’s Distorted Humor.

“It may not be 100% true, but it is fairly true, if you don’t have La Troienne on the bottom side of the pedigree with Distorted Humor, he has had a very low percentage of stakes horses,” Sweezy explained. “Plum Pretty has many doses of La Troienne, so when you put her with Distorted Humor, there has historically been a lot of success with those crosses. That was the main reason we went there. And WinStar is awesome to work with.”

Sweezy gave Pope all the credit for picking matings for the two mares.

“All these decisions were made 100% by Mandy,” he said. “We provided her with the information and she labored at it and she came back and told us where she wanted to go. She is an excellent horseperson and she is an excellent judge of a horse, so her decision does not come from out of the blue. It is well thought-out.”

Asked how the two mares are adjusting to life at Timber Town, Sweezy commented, “They are both under lights obviously, because they are both maiden mares. They live together in the same paddock and they will continue to do so until after they are bred and in foal. Havre de Grace has a very strong personality, whereas Plum Pretty is a little more docile and more loving, but they love one another and it will be difficult to separate them.”

Of having two multi-million dollar mares in the same paddock, Sweezy added, “When you get right down to it, horses are horses. So you may look out your window five more times a day at that barn, but at the end of the day they go in the same stalls and they live the same lives and get the same feed and behave just like the rest of them.”

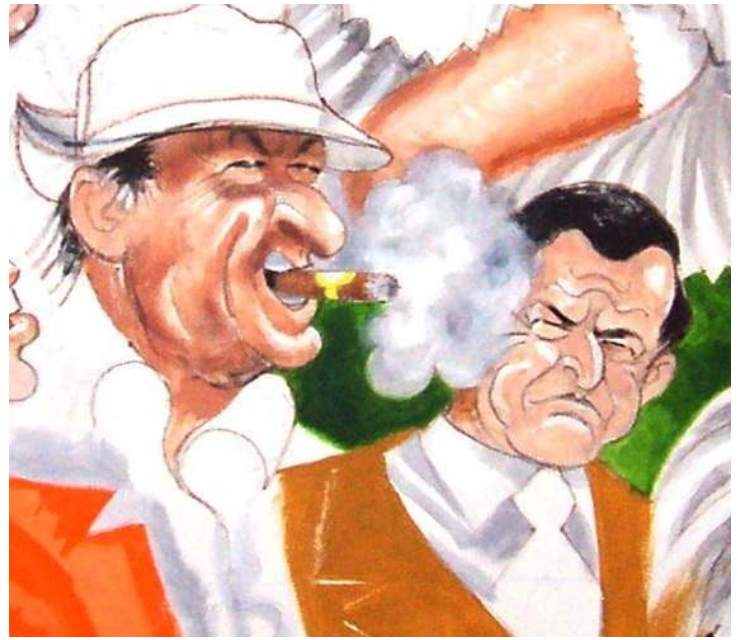

JACK KLUGMAN DEAD AT 90

Popular actor and horse owner Jack Klugman passed away at the age of 90 at his Los Angeles, California, home Monday. Best known for his roles as the sloppy sportswriter Oscar Madison on the hit television show "The Odd Couple" and as a crime-solving coroner in "Quincy, M.E.," Klugman also achieved his share of success in Thoroughbred racing. A mainstay at the Southern California racetracks, the Philadelphia native enjoyed his best run as an owner with Jaklin Klugman, third behind Genuine Risk in the 1980 GI Kentucky Derby and fourth in the GI Preakness S. More recently, Klugman also owned GII El Encinco S. heroine Pretty Unusual (Unusual Heat) in partnership with Madeline Auerbach and Marie Goda. "I always loved to gamble," Klugman once told the *Associated Press*. "I never got close to a horse. Fate dealt me a terrible blow when it gave me a good horse the first time out. I thought 'How easy this is?' Now I love being around them." Klugman is survived by his wife Peggy, two sons and two grandchildren. Funeral arrangements haven't been announced. 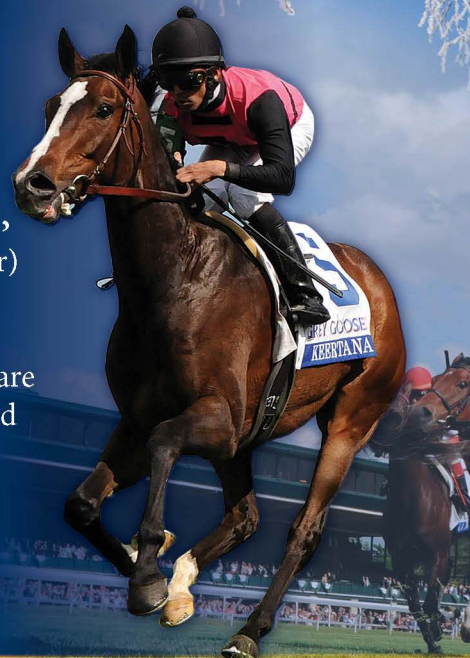

COMING OF AGE

With just one week left in the season, the title of leading sire in North America (by progeny earnings) involves three horses: WinStar's **Speightstown**, a son of Gone West out of a Storm Cat mare who never won a black-type race until he was a 6-year-old (in 2004, when he went 5-for-6, including the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, and won the Eclipse Award as champion sprinter), is the narrow leader both on the *TDN* Year-to-Date General Sire List (North American sires) ([click here](#)) and *The Blood-Horse's* General Sire List. As we've noted before, the two lists do not necessarily agree, primarily, we believe, because *The Blood-Horse* counts jumps race earnings in North America, whereas we do not.

So *The Blood-Horse*, as of Monday (Christmas Eve), had Speightstown less than \$100,000 in front of Ashford's two-time leading sire **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat) and former Juddmonte stallion (now Japan) **Empire Maker** (Unbridled), whereas the *TDN* list had Empire Maker in second, some \$65,000 behind Speightstown, but almost \$400,000 in front of Giant's Causeway. All three were between \$9.5-\$10 million on both lists.


Tapit (Pulpit), like Speightstown a sire whose first foals were born in 2006 (F2006) and raced in 2008, was in fourth on both lists, with 2012 progeny earnings around \$9.1 million.

We can all think what we like about a stallion's prospects of making a sire; it's all speculation until they start to have runners. Commercial pressures force us to jump on to the latest freshman sire sensation's bandwagon, but the fact is the first time we have a really reliable pointer to eventual sire success is the end of the year the sire's first 3-year-olds have run. Over the past 25 years, I've been surprised over and over again at how frequently sires' APEX figures at that stage pinpoint future greats. Usually the APEX figures are a year or even two ahead of the markets--though in the case of Smart Strike, we were calling him a top sire in 2002, whereas it was four or five years later that the markets caught up with him.

By the beginning of 2010, we could already see from the year-end 2009 APEX figures that the group of North American sires with first foals 2006 (3-year-olds of 2009) was a very serious bunch. On Jan. 14, 2010--after their first 3-year-olds had run--we printed a list of sires with first foals 2006 (abridged top five below) which showed four sires, already with 150+ year-starters in 2008-09, with A Runner Indexes above 3.00: **Speightstown** (4.49), **Candy Ride** (3.97), **Medaglia d'Oro** (3.05), and **Tapit** (3.03).

Though their raw indexes normally drop as they have more crops--and we'll see in a couple of weeks, when we get the new APEX data through the end of 2012 from TJCIS, just where they all stand by that criterion--all four sires have continued to ascend the sire rating ladders, and are now well established among the top sires. Obviously, with Speightstown as the 2012 North America number one by progeny earnings, and with Tapit among the top four for the second straight year, that has proven true.

It is interesting to note, when we look at some of the key statistics for this sire group, that their current stud fees really don't correlate to their positions on the current General Sire List: Medaglia d'Oro, for example, ranks 19th on the current *TDN* General Sire List, yet his \$100,000 fee is higher than Speightstown's, who is \$60,000, though ranked number one. 'Medaglia,' of course, jumped straight to the top with 2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra in his first crop. His stud fee went from \$40,000 right to \$100,000 for 2010, the year he moved from Stonewall to Darley. He actually ranked eighth on the General Sire List in 2009--almost unprecedented for a sire with just 3-year-olds--and ranked ninth in 2011, and has been in the top 20 in 2010 and 2012, with, as the Darley ads remind us, his first crop from his \$100,000 stud fee 2-year-olds of 2013. He now has nine Grade I/Group 1 winners, so we could argue there is more of a correlation with that statistic than anything else.

Tapit, who has worked his way up the stud fee ladder (2010-\$50,000; 2011-\$80,000; 2012-\$125,000), now has 10 Grade I/Group 1 winners, and of course now stands for even more than 'Medaglia.' Speightstown, who now has six winners at the highest level, is probably impossible to get to now at \$60,000, while Candy Ride, with seven Grade I/Group 1 winners, has always been in the top 50 on the General Sire List, but has never cracked the top 20, so his stud fee is now \$40,000, actually down, from \$50,000 last year. By comparison, **Lion Heart**, who reached the top 10 in 2010, when Dangerous Midge won the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, and is again in the top 10 this year, has only sired two Grade I/Group 1 winners, which is maybe why he is now standing in Turkey.

It's striking how some sire 'crops,' if you will, seem to include a disproportionate share of future top sires, and others don't. The sires with first foals 1998 (Smart Strike, Unbridled's Song, Pivotal), 2000 (Distorted Humor, Awesome Again, Elusive Quality, Arch), and 2002 seemed to have been 'vintage' crops, all right, while other years they come and go without leaving such strong impressions. Aussie import Exceed and Excel, for example, is arguably the only Top 50 sire of the European F2006 sires, whereas, besides the 'fearsome foursome' highlighted above, American F2006 sires also included Lion Heart, as mentioned; **Birdstone** (two Classic winners in his first crop, in 2009, and possibly about to enjoy a renaissance, as his 2011 crop was sired at a \$30,000 fee); **Pleasantly Perfect**; and **Bowman's Band**, the short-lived son of Dixieland Band who was going to be a very good sire, including the pro-tem 2012 Female Sprint Champion, Groupie Doll.

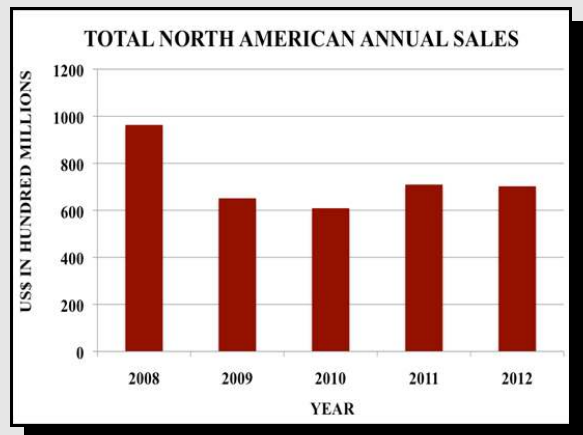

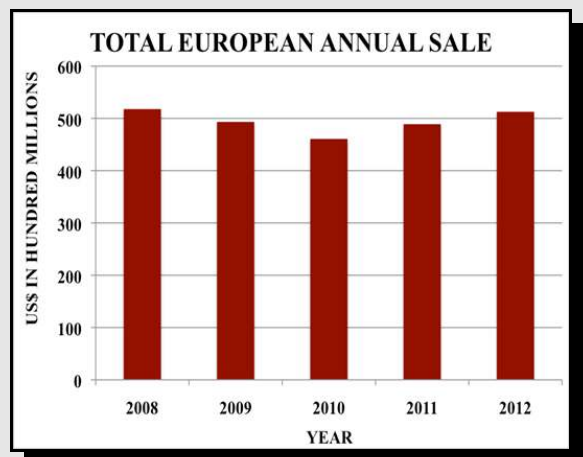

Eclipse Awards

Speaking of Groupie Doll, you have to bear in mind that there are really no definitive guidelines for Eclipse voters. Do you vote for the 'best' horse, the 'fastest' horse, or the horse who had the highest visibility and/or did the most for racing? It's kind of up to the individual voter, and, as a voter, I tend to invoke different criteria in different years, in different categories. For example: the '4-year-old & Up Male' category. Should that include any 4-year-old and up, or just dirt horses, since there is also a '3-year-old & Up Male Turf' category? The horses affected this year are GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) (5-for-6 this year: 4-for-4 on the turf, including three Grade I's; a 10-length winner of a Grade III on the AW at Keeneland, running a Beyer 117; and beaten a head in a Grade I in his only start on the dirt) and GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Little Mike (Spanish Steps), winner of three Grade I's on the lawn in 2012.

Some voters are likely to split the two, maybe vote for Wise Dan as best Older Male and Little Mike as best Turf Male, but I have chosen to consider them both in the Turf category, which means my vote for Older Male goes to Fort Larned (E. Dubai), who scored his second Grade I win of the year in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, running a Beyer 117 to defeat the ultra-game Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno). Wise Dan is Turf Male, which leaves Little Mike without a title, on my ticket.

The other comment I'll make, relevant to some of my other votes, is that I'm 100% convinced I'll Have Another would have won the GI Belmont by five lengths plus and won the Triple Crown in a cakewalk had he not come up with a career-ending injury two days before the race. Doug O'Neill gets my vote for leading trainer, first for getting him into that position; second, for bringing racing into better repute with his positive and inspiring conduct throughout the Triple Crown; and third, for not pressing owner Paul Reddam (or Reddam Racing LLC, to be precise) into running the horse when the injury was discovered.

Leading Breeder: Brereton C Jones. Though Darley and Adena Springs had more money this year, 'Brere' has been among the top 10 countless times, and deserves this recognition for his career achievements.

Leading Jockey: Ramon Dominguez

Leading Apprentice Jockey: Eliska Kubinova, from the Czech Republic via Emerald Downs, and now trying to break into Southern California. She was fourth in races won as an apprentice, but is a great story.

The Equine ‘Razzies’

Two ideas which should be ‘eclipsed,’ so a dead heat for the worst ideas of the year, one in America, one in Europe. In America: Churchill Downs’ new points system for determining GI Kentucky Derby starters. Churchill Downs’ arrogance reached a new peak with this idea. It’s not that it’s a terrible idea to weight a system to guarantee slots to the winners of the last Derby preps, it’s that they just dismissed the graded race system. They could easily have achieved their objective through using the graded race system, so why didn’t they? Oh, unless you race in Europe--then you can’t get in at all. The only race outside the U.S. which qualifies is the G2 UAE Derby. Dreadful idea. Worst idea of the year in Europe: something called BOBIS, proposed by the British Thoroughbred Breeders, approved by the BHA, and funded by the British Levy Board. I couldn’t even tell you what it stands for, except that it’s something British, which I think requires registration by the breeder AND nomination by the owner, and which results in something like £3,600 going to the winner of selected races. Since they already have the EBF (funded by the stallion owners) and the Yearling Bonus Scheme (funded by the consignors), why on earth do they need a third, even more confusing scheme, restricted to the British? Answer: They don’t. What the European authorities, whoever they may be in this case, need to do is get all schemes under one roof, and pay the owners more prize money.

Nominations from the Floor

Four more nominations from Florida: Journeyman Stud’s **Wildcat Heir** (Forest Wildcat) was the overall North American second-crop sire leader in progeny earnings in 2010, as well as topping the lists as Florida’s leading sire (with just 3-year-olds, quite a feat) in 2010. He repeated in 2011, and is running a close second this year to another nominee, Bridlewood’s **Put It Back** (Honour and Glory), a horse we have often mentioned in the past, especially after he made a very good start, not just in America, but in Brazil, too. Wildcat Heir is \$8,000 for 2013, Put It Back stands for \$6,000.

Also nominated: Northwest Farm’s **Gone Astray**, by Dixie Union (sire of High Cotton and Union Rags) from a great Phipps family. He won the GII Pennsylvania Derby and GII Ohio Derby as a 3-year-old in 2009, covered 110 mares in his first season, and will stand, as he did in 2012, for \$4,500 in 2013. Finally, Woodford Thoroughbreds’ **Biondetti**, a 2-year-old Group 1 winner in Italy for Godolphin from Bernardini’s first crop. He’s a 3/4-brother to Grade I winner Indy Five Hundred, but also to Delta Princess, dam of none other than Royal Delta; a very serious pedigree, and goes to stud in 2013 for an eminently reasonable \$4,000 fee.

A LOOK BACK...

OPPENHEIM ON SPEIGHTSTOWN

January 14, 2010:

The group of F2006 North American sires with their first 3-year-olds has looked like it includes some good prospects, and the year-end APEX numbers, covering these sires’ progeny in 2008-2009, confirm this. Though their A Runner Indexes are not in the same order as their progeny earnings, the top five are very definitely the top five. **Speightstown (4.49)** has the highest A Runner Index, the highest number of A Runners (15) and the highest ABC Runner Index (2.77), too. This says he is throwing consistently very useful, pay-their-way horses.

January 13, 2011:

The four North American F2006 sires (first 4-year-olds 2010) who virtually all observers agree are headed straight to the top include three in the top 10. It is perhaps surprising to see **Speightstown** rated highest of these, and in fact second behind A.P. Indy among the 701 sires with 200+ year-starters since 2004, with a scintillating 4.34 A Runner Index.

January 26, 2011:

FIRST FOALS 2006 (First 4-year-olds 2010)

Among the 678 sires with 200+ year-starters 2004-2010 that were assigned APEX ratings through the end of last year's racing, four of the top 15 by A Runner Index are a fearsome foursome of North American F2006 sires: **Speightstown** (4.34) ranked second among all sires, behind only A.P. Indy; **Candy Ride** (3.69) ranks sixth, **Medaglia d'Oro** (3.65) eighth, and **Tapit** (3.09) 15th.

January 12, 2012:

... only 11 active sires (with 200+ year-starters) have A Runner Indexes above 3.00. Four of them are North American sires whose first foals were born in 2006, started racing in 2008, and had their first 5-year-olds in 2011. Ranked by the frequency with which they sire top-2% earners from runners, **Speightstown** (3.68) tops the group, ranking second overall, and therefore first among all active sires. He is marginally ahead of Galileo (3.62), universally acknowledged as the Northern Hemisphere's leading sire, and Japan's Deep Impact (3.61).

January 18, 2012:

LEADING APEX SIRES

Last week, we looked at the leading Northern Hemisphere sires by 2005-2011 APEX A Runner Index. **A.P. Indy** (4.36) topped the list for the eighth time; **Speightstown** (3.68) led a quartet of F2006 Kentucky sires that figured among the top 15, also including **Medaglia d'Oro** (3.56), **Candy Ride** (3.52), and **Tapit** (3.09).

August 15, 2012:

Taylor Made and WinStar's **Speightstown** ranks sixth among the 630 sires with 200+ year-starters on the A Runner Index list, with a 3.41 rating. The fact that he's one of the most consistent young sires around is reinforced by his number three ranking by ABC Runner Index (2.59) ... in the cutthroat world of how few sires really get very many good horses, Speightstown truly qualifies as a really useful sire, and is the very model of consistency.
