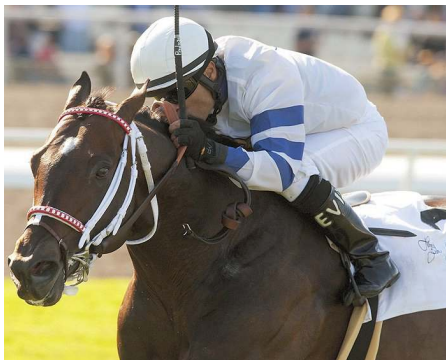

WILKINSON RESURFACES IN DAYTONA

Wilkinson (Lemon Drop Kid) makes his first start in more than seven months in today's GIII Daytona S. down the hill at Santa Anita. Last year's GIII Lecomte S. winner and GI Jamaica H. third-place finisher was purchased privately by E. K. Gaylord from breeder Gaillardia LLC, and he immediately rewarded that investment when transferred to Jeff Mullins from Neil Howard. Let go at 44-1 in the

GII American H. at Betfair Hollywood Park in May, the dark bay blew up the tote with a 1 1/4-length score from Mr. Commons (Artie Schiller). He has been sidelined since due to a bout with colic that required surgery, but Wilkinson has been firing bullets over the main track for what will be the shortest race of his career. Thoroughbred Legends Racing's **Capital Account** (Closing Argument) will also be trying something new as he makes his first turf try. The lightly raced 5-year-old took the GII Pat O'Brien S. over stablemate Coil (Point Given) at Del Mar in August before that runner reversed the order by a head in the Oct. 6 GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship S. A dull 12th in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 3, the Bob Baffert trainee was third last time in the GIII Vernon O. Underwood S. in Inglewood Dec. 2. Grade I winner **Comma to the Top** (Bwana Charlie) could be poised to surpass the \$1-million mark with current career earnings of \$967,696. The bay took the one-mile Big Bear H. going a mile on the main track here Oct. 21 before finishing a nose behind Capital Account when fourth last time in the Underwood. **Field p3**

READY FOR RE-ENTRY

Heading into the Breeders' Cup, the Phipps Stable's homebred **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer) loomed as the leading candidate for turf male honors, and had an outside shot at Horse of the Year. Though the 4-year-old ran gamely when second to Little Mike (Spanish Steps) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, he will likely end up without a trophy when the Eclipse Awards are presented next month. "There'll always be disappointment," admitted trainer Shug McGaughey. "It's just the way it is. That's why they line them up. He ran a strong race." Point of Entry is currently on track to return to action in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 9, and McGaughey may end up making his first voyage to the Middle East for the \$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 30. "It's penciled in," the Hall of Fame conditioner added. "It's something I'm thinking about." Point of Entry, who won the GI Man o' War S., GI Sword Dancer S. and GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic in 2012, has another tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita as his main 2013 objective. "Our goal is for the Breeders' Cup next year, so we'll have plenty of time if he does make it to Dubai," McGaughey added.

Attention Eclipse Voters: Important Clarification

I was about to send in my Eclipse votes yesterday when it was pointed out to me why I've been so confused about certain statistics supplied to voters by the Eclipse Awards-sponsoring organizations (*Daily Racing Form*, NTRA, and National Turf Writers and Broadcasters [NTWAB]); these are the Leaders' Lists, particularly for Leading Owner and Leading Breeder, both in the printed version, sent out to voters; and on line. If you read the fine print, it does say that these lists include racing from Dubai World Cup night. As it happens, on that night Godolphin sent out 19 starters and won three races and \$9.7 million in prize money. If you look on the www.equibase.com website, and go to Stats for Owners (there are top-left buttons for earnings in graded stakes and all stakes also), you can see that Godolphin, in North American races, earned \$3,749,075, which ranks them eighth on the owners' list by purse money. On the material sent out to voters, as well as on the website set up for Eclipse voters, Godolphin is the wide-margin leading owner, with stable earnings of \$13,449,075. Again, though, \$9,700,000 of that was earned in Dubai; they won three group races that night, including a 1-2 in the G1 Dubai World Cup, worth \$8 million. All three winners were bred by Darley, which shows \$16.7-million in earnings in the Eclipse information on breeders. I'm not trying to argue for or against anybody here, but I did just want to point out to any of my fellow voters who have not yet voted, what are the consequences to the tables we are studying when those races are included, and to what extent they may look quite different if those Dubai races are not included.

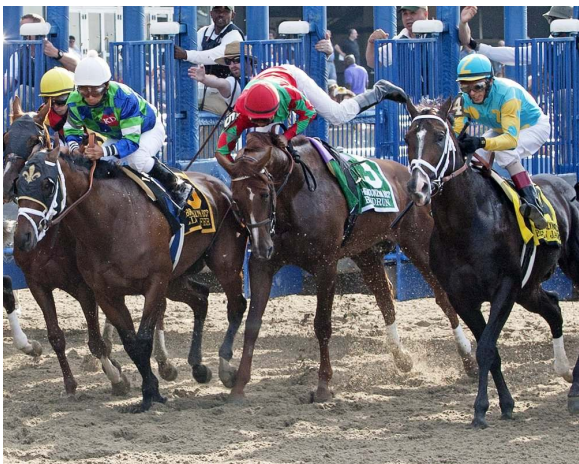
TOM KEYSER, RYAN GOLDBERG, MARY SIMON WIN MEDIA ECLIPSE AWARDS

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association, *Daily Racing Form* and National Turf Writers And Broadcasters announced the winners of additional Media Eclipse Awards yesterday. Ryan Goldberg, a freelance contributor to *Daily Racing Form*, won the award for Feature/Commentary for his piece “Keiber Coa Presses on a Year After Father’s Fateful Spill” which ran in ‘*DRF Weekend*’ July 7.

“I feel incredibly proud of the work and grateful to receive this honor,” stated Goldberg. “I grew up reading all of the racing greats who influenced my work, like Bill Nack and Joe Hirsch. “To see my name next to theirs on this award is overwhelming.” Honorable mention went to Barbara Livingston for her story on trainer Danny Perlsweig which was in the May 26 edition of the *DRF*.

The Media Eclipse Award for News/Enterprise Writing went to Mary Simon for “Added Obstacle,” which looked at the past and current use of Lasix and was published in the June 9 edition of *Thoroughbred Times*. “This was a soul-searching piece for me because I have such mixed feelings about this sport that I love,” said Simon. “I had great fun going back in time and researching the history of medication, legal or otherwise, and how it relates it to modern day.” Stan Grossfeld was given the honorable mention for his piece “Photo Finish,” which ran in the *Boston Globe* Sept. 25.

Tom Keyser won the Media Eclipse Award for Photography for shot of the start of the GIII Brooklyn H. at Belmont Park that ran on the *Daily Racing Form* website on July 12. This is Keyser’s fourth Eclipse Award, having previously won in 1996 and 1998 for outstanding newspaper writing while at the *Baltimore Sun*, and in 1999 for outstanding magazine writing for the Breeders’ Cup Souvenir Magazine. “I’m sort of dumbfounded,” said Keyser. “I certainly never aspired to be a photographer, and if I wasn’t helping Barbara [Livingston], I wouldn’t be doing this. All I can say is: It’s funny how the world turns.”

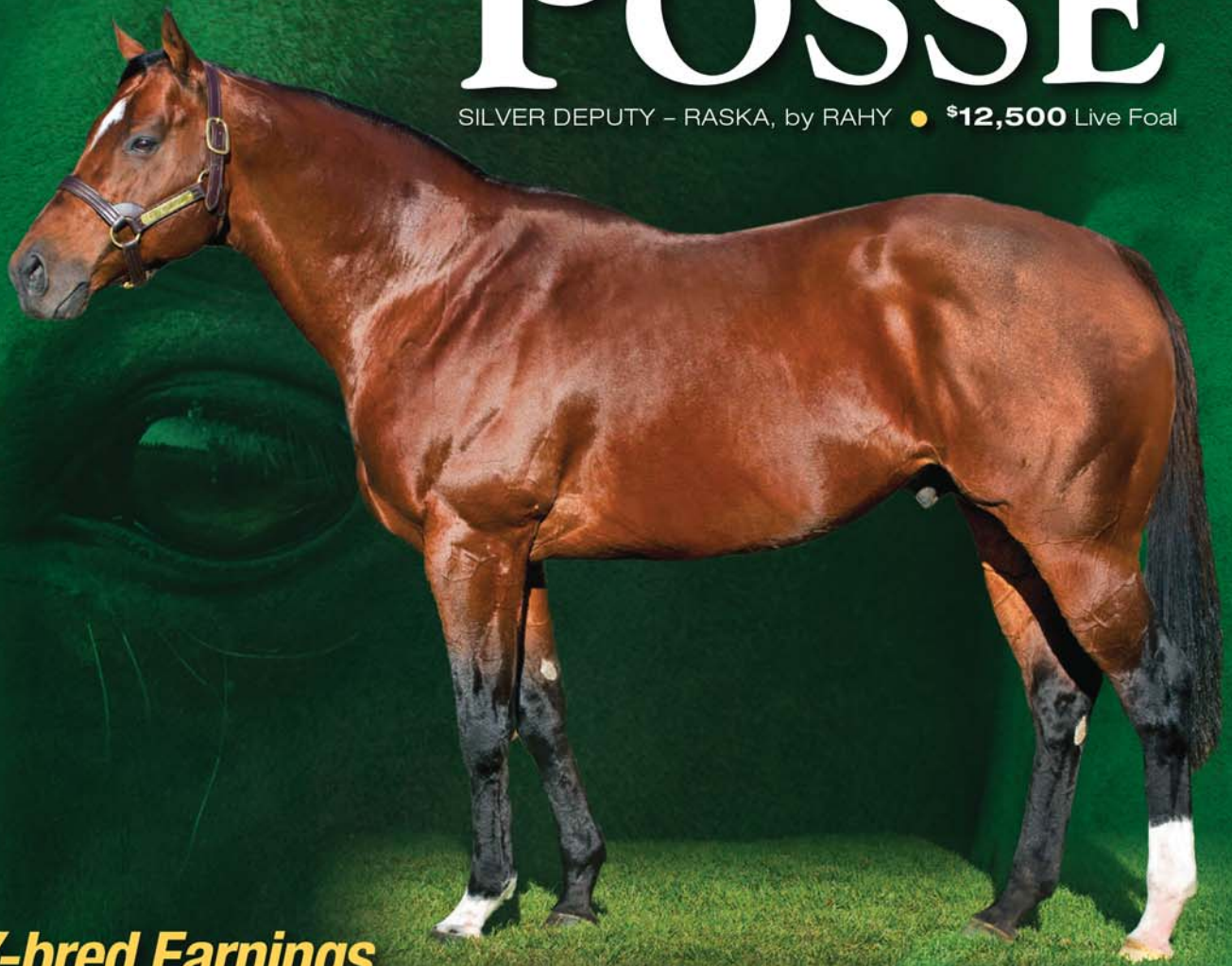

CIBELLI OUT TO CONQUER NEW TERRITORY

Trainer Jane Cibelli, who has clinched the Monmouth Park training title for two consecutive years, has taken her talent to Tampa Bay Downs and, for the second season, Gulfstream Park this winter. So far, she's tallied two wins at Gulfstream and five at Tampa, where she finished fourth in the trainer standings last year.

The British-born Cibelli got her start with show horses as a child, moving to Florida to work as an exercise rider when she was in her early twenties. She now boasts a stable of about 50 horses, with 35 currently housed at Tampa Bay Downs and the remainder residing at Gulfstream Park.

"I've been at Tampa for a number of years. It's a great training surface, but the racing is not that great, unfortunately," Cibelli said of her reason for splitting her barn between the two Florida tracks. "The racing is better at Gulfstream and it's a lot more competitive, of course. It makes it challenging because you have to have assistants in both places. Luckily, I have two very, very good assistants [Nicole Romans at Gulfstream and Robbie Holman at Tampa], so it works well, but it's challenging."

Since becoming the first woman to take Monmouth Park's training title in the track's 66-year history, Cibelli has set her sights on higher goals.

"Obviously, the Breeders' Cup or Kentucky Derby," Cibelli named as future aspirations. "That's your dream, anyway. That's how you know you've succeeded in this business."

A key to Cibelli achieving her lofty ambitions is the quality of stock in her barn, which has steadily improved in recent years.

"I've got a great group of clients right now," she said. "They buy good horses and you're only as good as your clients." **Cont. p6**

Goodwood Racing, a syndicate started by Cibelli, is now one of her major patrons.

"I started it a couple years ago," the conditioner noted. "It is a syndicate comprised of mostly existing owners that have gotten in the business as claiming owners. We go to sales and we buy yearlings and develop them."

Goodwood Racing's 2-year-old gelding **Purple Egg** (Lion Heart) is one of the most exciting prospects Goodwood racing has in training.

"The first time I saw this horse gallop, I said 'What a stride!' He did things so

easily," Cibelli remembered. Purchased for \$22,000 at Keeneland September last year, the dark bay gelding has a perfect record, having scored first out at the Oceanport oval Aug. 8, a Parx allowance contest Sept. 15 and in Tampa's Inaugural S. Dec. 1.

Cibelli is hoping for a positive beginning to the New Year, with Purple Egg set to make his next start in the one mile \$100,000 Gulfstream Park Derby Jan. 1.

"His last race was his toughest after the first two came to him rather easily. I've always thought he wanted to go long," Cibelli said of the added distance. "We'll see where we go from there."

HOF INTRODUCES 'PILLARS OF THE TURF'

Nearly six decades after it was established, racing's Hall of Fame has made an historic departure from policy by adding a new category of inductees--Pillars of the Turf--beginning in 2013.

Trustees of the National Museum of Racing in Saratoga Springs, New York approved expanding the scope of the Hall of Fame during its summer meeting. Since it welcomed its first class in 1955, the Hall of Fame has been limited to outstanding horses, trainers and jockeys. The Pillars of the Turf, the equivalent of "builders" or "contributors" to divisions in many sporting halls of fame, is open to other distinguished racing people.

Unlike the journalists selected for the museum's Joe Hirsch Media Roll of Honor and the five people the museum has named Exemplars of Racing since 1971, individuals chosen as Pillars of the Turf will be members of the Hall of Fame.

"It's safe to say it is the biggest change we've had in 60 years," said Christopher Dragone, director of the National Museum of Racing. "I think it's long overdue, and I'm very pleased that the board made the move in this direction." **Cont. p7**

A committee of journalists, historians and trustees will select one person from the pre-1950 era and another from the more recent post-1950 years. Edward L. Bowen, the Hall of Fame chairman, will oversee the 12-person committee. Each inductee must receive 75% of the committee's votes.

With two Pillars of the Turf, the 2013 Hall of Fame class could have as many as nine members, the largest group since nine were inducted in 1978. The contemporary Hall of Fame voters may elect a maximum of four inductees per year. The Steeplechase Committee, which meets every four years, could elect three individuals: a jockey, a trainer and a horse.

For years, Bowen has had to defend the Museum's policy of maintaining the original approach to the Hall of Fame, which excluded significant owners, breeders and racing and track officials. When an ad hoc committee of trustees appointed by Museum president Stella Thayer began considering a proposed fourth division, Bowen was surprised to find who supported the idea.

"I had always taken great pleasure in feeling that I had a small role in shepherding the vision of the great people who had created the museum, George Widener, C. V. Whitney and Walter Jeffords," Bowen said. "When we got into discussing it, Lev Miller, who is the nephew of C.V. Whitney, said he didn't feel that way. He didn't feel that there was anything sacred about doing it the way his uncle had envisioned it.

"I thought, gosh, if a guy in that position doesn't feel that way, that took the sword out of my hand because why fight to preserve something that other people don't feel needs to be preserved?

"It was fairly quick that the executive committee went from having never done it, to recognizing the advantage of it. It's probably hard to use the phrase, 'a breath of fresh air' about something that is a half-century old, but it will be a pleasure to be reaching back and not only honoring people but helping to educate people today about the great leaders of the past."

The core of the Pillars of the Turf committee is comprised of members of the Historic Review Committee: Bowen, Miller, Jane Goldstein, Ken Grayson, Jay Hovdey, Bill Mooney, Mary Simon, Michael Veitch and Gary West. Historian and journalist Bill Marshall and trustees G. Watts Humphrey and D. G. Van Clief complete the lineup.

Candidates for consideration are expected to have at least 25 years of participation in the industry, but the committee has the authority to waive that requirement. It also can decide where to place an individual whose career straddles 1950.

While adding a more general Hall of Fame category has been talked about informally, Dragone said that Thayer moved it to the front burner.

"I think it was more of a general feeling that it was time to make a change and start thinking about honoring people," Dragone said. "Over the years there has been discussions about it. This time it got traction."

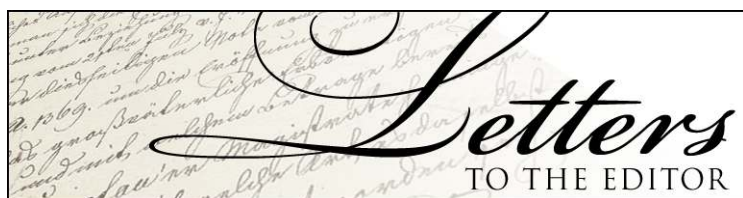
As it does with its other categories, the Hall of Fame will accept suggestions on who to consider for Pillars of the Turf from the public. The deadline is Apr. 1.

The challenge facing Bowen and his committee is who to choose for the inaugural selections. Who is the most important person in each era?

"When they started the Hall of Fame, they did a little catch-up," he said. "They put in six or seven in each division in the beginning. We felt that it would be a more distinguished award if we do it one at a time."

Bowen, president of the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, is a veteran journalist and has written nearly 20 books on racing and its history. He said he is looking forward to the task of bringing the Pillars of the Turf category to life with a deliberate process.

"Dell Hancock was on the ad hoc committee to examine the the idea, and she made the greatest comment of all: 'We've got to make sure this is very lofty,'" Bowen said. "That was her word, and I said, 'That's exactly right.'"

I felt compelled to write after reading Brian DiDonato's 10 best performances in [Friday's TDN](#). For me, Little Mike's Breeders' Cup Turf should not only have made the list, but should be near the top. Although the Turf lacked, for some, the depth of some of its best renewals, the six Group 1/Grade I winners in a 12-horse field certainly represented more than ample quality. Admittedly, he was 17-1, but that was less an indicator of his ability than the fact that the race figured to go against his running style. That he was able to adjust his style by coming from slightly off the pace and win at a distance at which he had never won--1 1/2 miles--certainly underscores that this was one of the best performances of the year, and a track-record setting performance at that.
