Honestly, I don't think she really handled the track that day, because as fast as she is, she was never pulling herself along." performances. Bruce Chandler, Robert McKee and James Glavin's **Merit Man** (With Distinction) put the memories of a nose defeat in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint behind him with a game effort in the Spectacular Bid S. "We love Santa Anita, but for him the series of races for 3-year-olds is

better here," said winning trainer Bob Hess Jr. "We'll look to run him again in about a month. The [GII] Hutcheson [S. Feb. 2] looks like the logical spot. Everything about him says sprinting, and that's what we'll concentrate on for now." Later in the afternoon, Trilogy Stable and Laurie Plesa's **Itsmyluckyday** (Lawyer Ron) got back on track with an impressive win in the Gulfstream Park Derby. "We'll evaluate what our options are," said winning trainer Eddie Plesa Jr. "You've got the next race here [GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 26] and you've got another one at Tampa [GIII Sam F. Davis S. 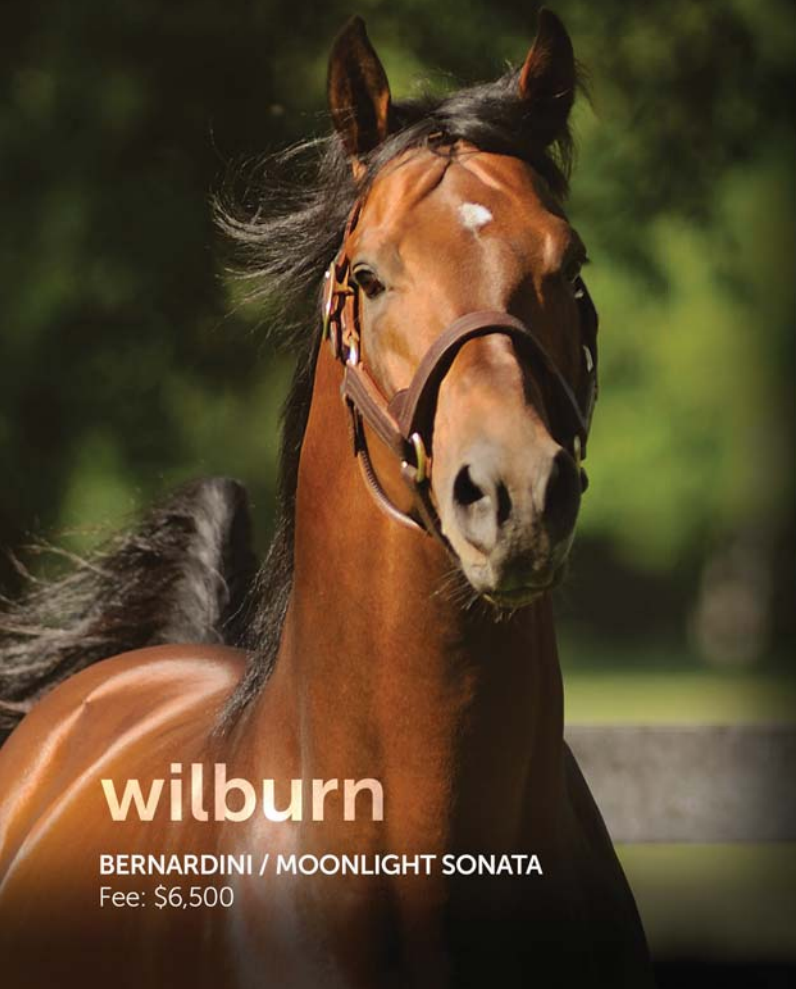

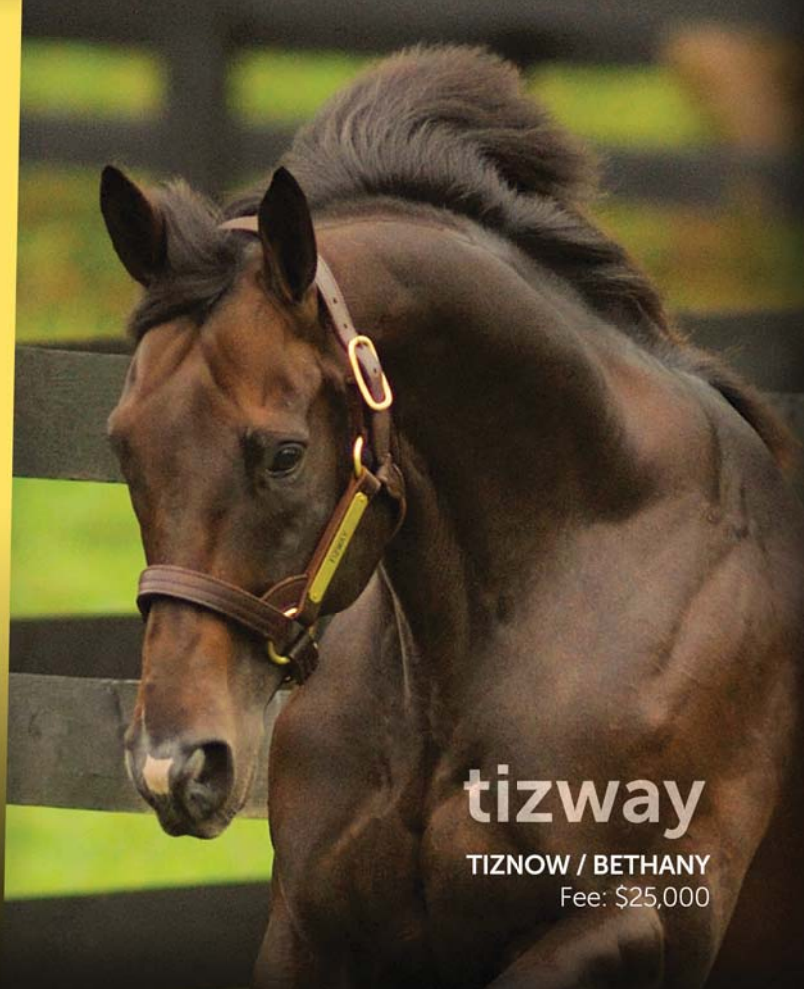

Kauai Katie followed her brilliant July 20 debut with short-priced victories in the GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga Aug. 12 and GII Matron S. at Belmont Sept. 30. Stretched out to two turns for the Breeders' Cup, the swift miss conceded the early lead to Beholder (Henny Hughes) en route to a fourth-place finish, but put matters to right yesterday at Gulfstream.

Hammered down to 1-10, Kauai Katie broke alertly from the rail, but settled while racing in second, as previously unbeaten Cor Cor put up fractions of :22.22 and :44.99. The crowd's choice moved by the pacesetter entering the stretch and opened up readily before being geared down late by jockey John Velazquez.

"The three [Cor Cor] out-broke us, put us on the outside and it was really a two-horse race," Velazquez offered. "I wasn't going to let Cor Cor get away too easily, so I put some pressure on her. When I got to her, Katie pulled away from them and she made it easy for me."

Kauai Katie and her speedy full-sister Winding Way were both bred by Spendthrift. According to Ned Toffey, Spendthrift's general manager, their dam More Than Pretty was covered by Malibu Moon on Southern Hemisphere time and sent to Australia. (Click [here](#) for a TDN feature with Toffey).

Itsmyluckyday paired up victories in the off-turf Fasig Tipton Dash and Foolish Pleasure S. at Calder Aug. 25 and Sept. 15, respectively. Shipped to Louisiana for the \$1-million GIII Delta Jackpot S. Nov. 17, the dark bay never really threatened and wound up sixth. He tried grass in Gulfstream's Dania Beach S. Dec. 15, but ran into traffic and finished fourth, beaten 2 1/4 lengths. Itsmyluckyday sat a dream trip on the outside just off the pace established by Undrafted. Cruising into contention despite a :44.93 opening half, the sophomore took command and quickly opened daylight on his rivals. "When I looked up at the fractions, I was somewhat concerned, but he just kept on going," said trainer Eddie Plesa Jr. "I'm very pleased with his effort." Rider Paco Lopez was also enthusiastic. "I waited and waited, looked back a few times, but I knew I had a lot of horse left," he said.

Unbeaten Purple Egg (Lion Heart) was scratched after coming down with a viral infection. "He spiked a temperature two days ago," trainer Jane Cibelli explained. "It was not anything serious, but to stretch him out and ship...it probably wasn't the right way to go. Sunday morning he hadn't eaten, so when we pulled blood it seemed like he had a little viral infection." Cibelli was unsure of when the Goodwood Racing colorbearer would be back in action. "He got over it quickly so, hopefully, he'll be back to normal soon and we'll go from there," she said.

His 5 1/2-length score in the Tim Conway S. at Santa Anita Oct. 6 saw him bet down to 1-2 for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint Nov. 3, but Hightail (Mineshaft) snuck up on the rail to edge him by a nose. The California-based colt, sent off as the slight second choice to Little Distorted, battled for the early advantage with Rockyshomerun (Mass Media). The latter packed it in after a :44.93 opening half, while Merit Man braced himself for additional challenges. City of Weston took a game run at him, but Merit Man dug in gamely and hit the wire first. Little Distorted rallied belatedly to round out the trifecta. "He waited a little bit turning for home, but that's how he is," said winning rider Joel Rosario. "I think he's a nice horse. I'm very glad I had the opportunity to ride him."

**Chachamaidee (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}-- Canterbury Lace, by Danehill) has been retired and will be covered by Galileo (Ire), *Racing Post* reported yesterday. A 130,000gns Tattersalls December weanling purchase, the bay had a breakthrough season

at age four, winning the G3 Oak Tree S. at Goodwood before posting a runner-up effort to Sahpresa (Sahm) when that one was winning her third consecutive G1 Sun Chariot S. in September 2011. She was named the highweight older mare in England at five to

seven furlongs. Chachamaidee showed further improvement at five, returning from a spell to land the G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. over the Lingfield all-weather and adding the G2 Lennox S. last July before being promoted from second to first in the G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown in September. The 6-year-old, who carried the silks of Tony Evans and raced for the Sir Henry Cecil stable, was produced by a half-sister to G1 1000 Guineas winner Virginia Waters (Kingmambo) and a full-sister to G1 Irish Derby runner-up Alexander of Hales (Ire). Her resulting Galileo foal will be inbred 2x4 to Sadler's Wells. She retires with seven wins from 21 trips to the post and earnings of \$650,575.

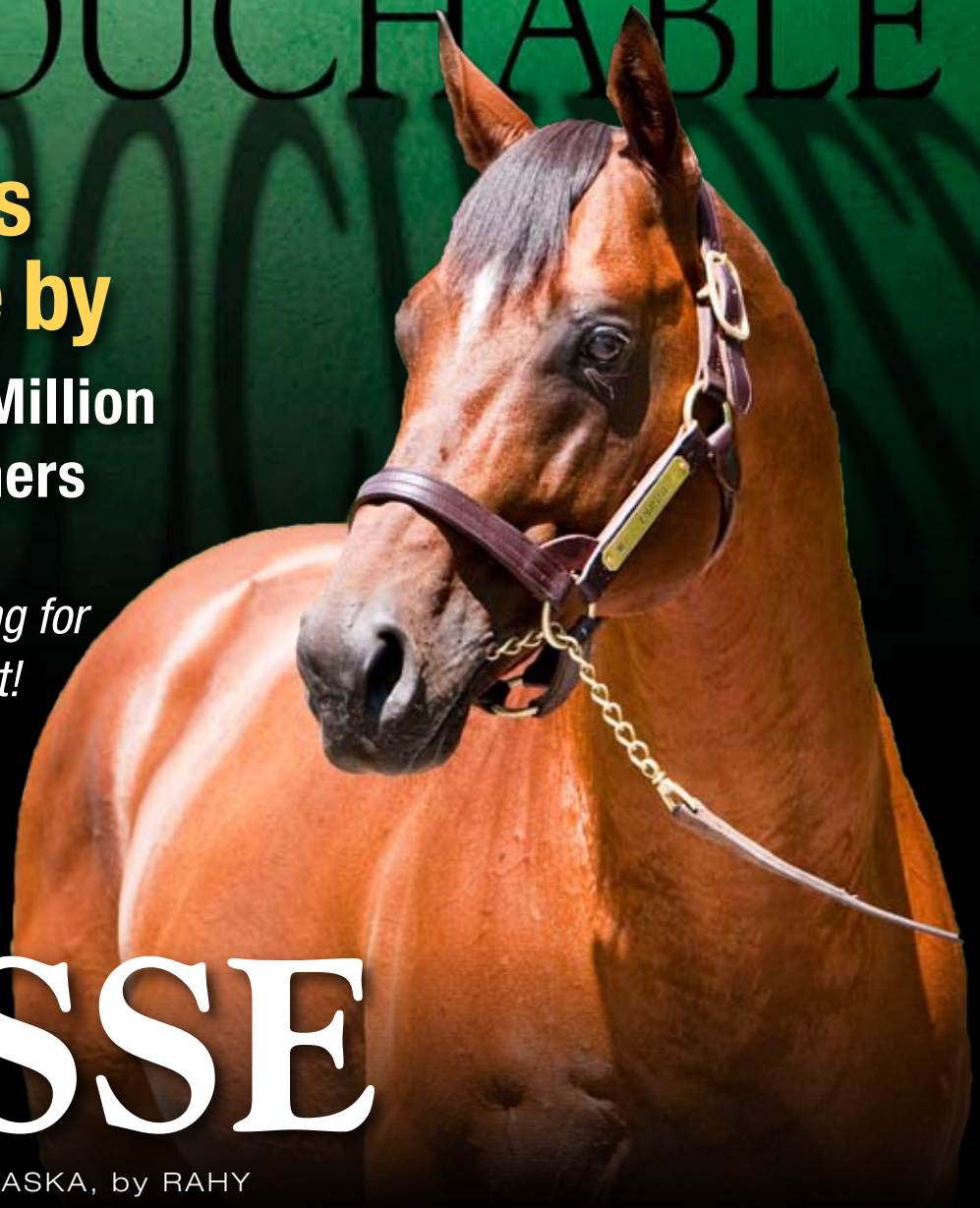

### O'NEILL HOPING FOR ANOTHER CROWN RUN

Doug O'Neill, who trained I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) to win two-thirds of last year's Triple Crown, is hoping to be on the Triple Crown trail once again in 2013. O'Neill will saddle GI Champagne S. runner-up and GIII Delta Downs Jackpot S. winner **Goldencents** (Into Mischief) in Saturday's GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita and maiden winner **Mudflats** (Tapit) in the GII Jerome S. at Aqueduct.

"He worked in 1:10.20 last Thursday and, if you didn't have a stop watch, you'd have thought he went [in] 1:14 or 1:15, just cruising," O'Neill said of Goldencents. "I did have a stop watch on him, and as I looked down and saw one-ten and change, it was just, wow! It was really amazing. He came out of it in great shape, full of energy, and it's just one day at a time. He's got to stay injury-free, but he's a real, real exciting prospect."

**O'Neill Hopeful for Another Classic Run cont.**

O'Neill was in New York last week to watch the newly acquired Mudflats tune up for the Jerome with a six-furlong work in 1:15.35 Friday. The gelding, a maiden winner at Aqueduct Dec. 8, will make his first start for O'Neill and Little Red Feather Racing Saturday.

"He looked really good," O'Neill reported. "You can tell he's a real feisty guy, but at the same time, real chilled out in the stall. He's got the right demeanor and the right pedigree to be a good horse, so hopefully he can move forward off his big maiden win."

O'Neill was at a loss to explain **Know More** (Lion Heart)'s dull sixth-place effort in a Santa Anita allowance last Friday. The colt won the GII Best Pal S. as a maiden last August before runner-up efforts in the GI Del Mar Futurity and GI FrontRunner S. He was off the board in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf and GIII Delta Downs Jackpot.

"That's a head-scratcher," O'Neill admitted. "I put blinkers on thinking it would add something to him. Obviously, that didn't do it, but he came out of it in great shape. We're going to regroup. Like Trevor [Denman] says, 'They're not machines,' so he just needs to be recalibrated and we'll get him figured out."

## COMPROMISES

As you may have read, voting on the 2012 Eclipse Awards is underway, and in fact closes tomorrow. I have to admit to stirring up a little controversy in this process by pointing out, both in this paper last Saturday ([click here](#)) and in the Twittersphere, that the runaway leadership positions in money earned by both Godolphin (owner) and Darley (breeder), were generated by earnings for both entities of \$9.7 million on Dubai World Cup night last Mar. 31. No other events or races outside North America were included in the materials circulated by the sponsoring organizations through the *Daily Racing Form*.

My comments about this matter were not anti-Godolphin, anti-Darley, or in any other way anti-Sheikh Mohammed--far from it. In fact, I am a great admirer of Sheikh Mohammed and his global vision. Including Dubai World Cup night in the material provided to Eclipse voters isn't a bad idea; in fact, if Animal Kingdom, Royal Delta, Dullahan, or another North America-trained horse were to win the G1 Dubai World Cup, the statistics for the horses and their connections should definitely be counted in Leading Sire lists, etc.

But in 2012, for example, the G1 Dubai World Cup one-two were both trained by Mahmood al-Zarooni in Newmarket and were by British-based sires Dubawi and Medicean. Yes, *TDN* did and should include the sire earnings in our overall sire table, which is intended to include both North American and European sires, but no, it does not make sense for Godolphin, as owners, and Darley, as breeders, to be credited with \$8 million each when it comes time to consider which entities deserve Eclipse Awards in North America.

It couldn't be fixed for 2012, but it can be reviewed for 2013, and one of my safest predictions for the New Year is that it will be. Jim Gluckson, of the Breeders' Cup, and Keith Chamblin, of NTRA, are aware of the issue and have participated in the discussion already. There seems a pretty simple solution, which has already been discussed in the Twittersphere by myself, Ed DeRosa of BRIS, journalist Greg Hall, and Team Valor's Jeff Lowe: if the horse is trained in North America (and probably has to start at least once in North America during the year, referencing Animal Kingdom 2013, Jeff), its earnings should be credited to all connections for any race outside North America: Dubai, Hong Kong, Japan, Australia, Europe, wherever. If the horse is not trained in North America, not credited, even if the entity (i.e. Godolphin, Darley) is active within North America.

Then, any horse which starts in North America during the year is eligible, though only North American earnings should be eligible for statistical inclusion for horses trained outside North America (the one start in North America is one of those 'unwritten rules' referred to). The point is that, whatever has been the case in the past (including 2012), we have the opportunity now to review and improve the process of Eclipse voting (including what statistics get distributed to voters). That should, and, I believe, will happen.

**Leading Sire: Empire Maker or Giant's Causeway?**

Well, not Speightstown, I'm a little sorry to say, having crowned him champion last week. Jumping the gun is never a good idea. So apologies to Speightstown, who can still claim to be the Leading Sire standing in North America--if earnings in jump races are not included. Uh oh. It's not going to cost Giant's Causeway his third title as Leading Sire in North America because, rightly or wrongly, *The Blood-Horse's* General Sire List is still recognized (for the moment) as the industry standard for determining which farm can advertise their stallion as Leading Sire. But here are two reasons why jump race earnings should not be included in sires' progeny earnings.

First, both in the British/Irish Sire lists and the French leading sire lists, earnings in jumps races are calculated entirely separately from earnings in flat races. Only flat race earnings should be included in leading sires' lists. It shouldn't be that hard a sell, except, apparently, to a small cadre of American jumps race enthusiasts. Jump racing is much smaller in America than in Britain, Ireland, and France, but that's no excuse for pretending that jumps race earnings should be included in America when they are not included elsewhere. No way. If you want to argue for jumps racing, you'd better go out and find the earnings for all those Thoroughbreds retrained in other disciplines, too, like showjumping and eventing.

Second, jumps race 'stakes' are not awarded black-type in any flat-oriented catalogue. Usually they are in italics whenever they are included. That's because the whole discipline is rightly considered as distinct from flat racing. I promise you, if you suggested to the British or Irish that jumps earnings should be blended in with flat sire statistics, they'd look at you like you were crazy.

Giant's Causeway's jumps race earnings (nearly \$350,000) may be included in the *Blood-Horse's* North American Sire List, but I guarantee you 100% his jumps earnings in Britain and Ireland are NOT included in the British/Irish General Sire List. And don't tell me for one second that America knows better in this case. The American jumps 'industry' would be lucky to be 10% of the size of Britain and Ireland's. No compromise from this corner on that point: jumps earnings should not be included.

But, no, our intention is not to take Giant's Causeway's third title as Leading Sire away from him. However, we would point out that on the *TDN* version of the 2012 General Sire List, which includes NO jumps earnings, Giant's Causeway is only third, behind our winner Empire Maker and Speightstown.

Our lists do count Southern Hemisphere earnings from Northern Hemisphere-sired crops, which we think the *Blood-Horse* does not, but otherwise the difference in the two lists is completely down to jumps earnings. It's unfair, and just because it's always been this way, but nobody noticed up 'til now, doesn't mean it needs to be this way in the future.

*Blood-Horse* Editor Eric Mitchell is a very reasonable and fair guy who I've always had a lot of respect for, so, how about it, Eric? Can we engage in this conversation? Wouldn't it be better, anyway, for the industry if we could all agree on the same set of rules and present the outside world with one list which, if not official, is agreed upon by the major publications?

**Galileo: The Real Winner**

*TDN* also runs a General Sire List which is not restricted to North American sires, but also includes European sires as well, and counts earnings from everywhere (for Northern Hemisphere-sired crops) but Japan and Hong Kong (*The Blood-Horse* also does not count earnings from Japan and Hong Kong, but for North American sires only). When we look at this list, we see that three European sires actually top the combined list ([click here](#)).

Galileo is the real overall leading sire, with 2012 progeny earnings over \$13.4 million, including-- incredibly--36 black-type winners; 61 black-type horses (won or placed in the first three); 24 group/graded stakes winners; 44 group/graded-placed horses; and seven Group 1/Grade I winners, including the incomparable, unbeaten Frankel. He's the 2012 European/North American Leading Sire, all right.

Number two was Montjeu (\$12.9 million), only a little over \$500,000 behind Galileo, by virtue of Camelot having been the best 3-year-old in Europe, and Green Moon collecting A\$3.6 million by winning the G1 Melbourne Cup; and number three was Dubawi (\$11.3 million). Over half his 2012 earnings came via Monterosso's \$6-million win in the G1 Dubai World Cup. They all ranked above Empire Maker and Giant's Causeway, whichever you choose as North America's leading sire.

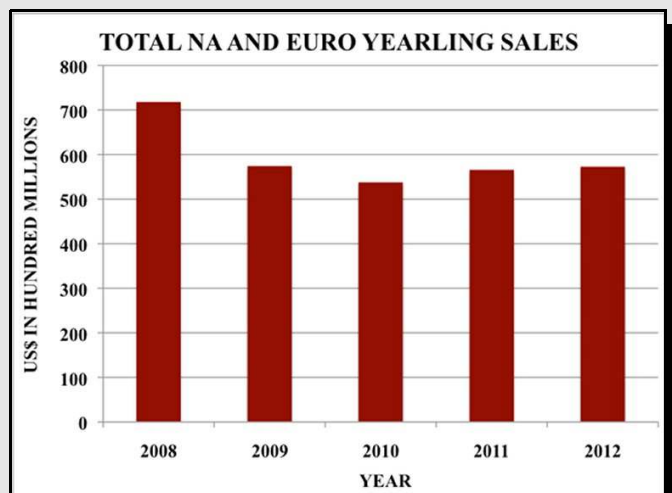
So it wasn't just Frankel, arguably the best horse any of us have ever seen. No, Galileo had 60 other black-type horses in 2012. It does make you ask, just how good is this sire? So I had a look at another very interesting *TDN* Sire List: the Lifetime Cumulative Earnings General Sire List, only I clicked on, and looked at it organized by, group/graded stakes winners (denoted 'GS Wnrs' [click here](#)). This list includes number of crops (though the program automatically added in a putative 2011 crop yesterday, so I did adjust for that), so I did a calculation of the average number of group/graded stakes winner per crop, and found 15 sires that have averaged four or more graded stakes winners per crop. **Cont. p12**

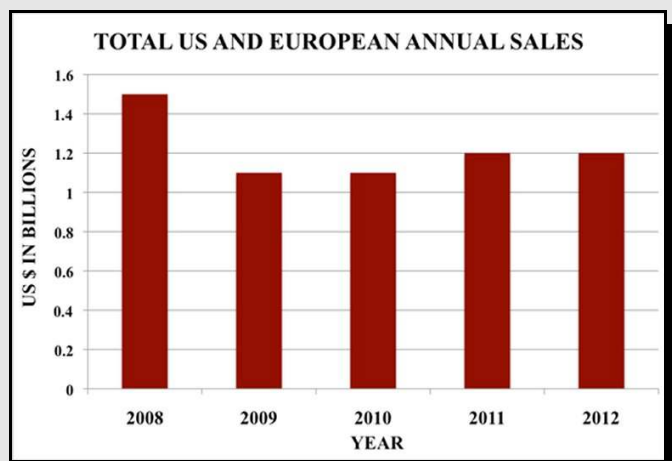
"The yearling sales are about half the overall NA/EU auction market and is the most consistent sector from the standpoint of what is catalogued each year. With the average now only 1.5% below that of 2008, it is significant that 28% fewer were catalogued, 21% fewer (almost exactly 2,000) sold, but the clearance rate from the catalogues improved by 8%, from 62% in 2008 to 70% in 2012 (less 'dead wood'). Overall gross for the yearling sales was down almost exactly 20% from 2008-2012."

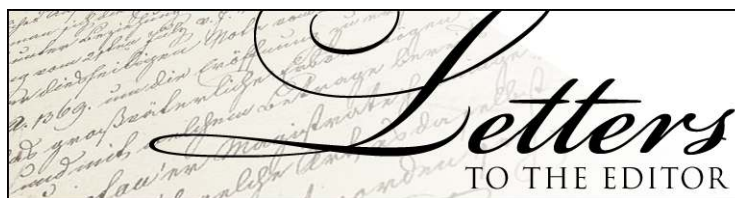
It may be a little quick and dirty, but the results are stunning: Galileo (8.13 GSW/crop) is actually siring graded stakes winners at a better rate than his own sire, Sadler's Wells (7.26), 14 times Champion Sire in Britain and Ireland--albeit with just over a third the number of crops so far. Still, it does show us that when people say Galileo might be an even better sire than Sadler's Wells, it's not just publicists talking through their hats. Danehill (Northern Hemisphere crops) ranks third (7.07), with North America's three-time Leading Sire (there, I said it) Giant's Causeway (6.56) fourth.

It's probably not a coincidence that the top four are or were all Coolmore sires. Also notable: 10 of the 15 stand or stood in Europe, just five in North America; and of the nine sires ranked which have had fewer than 15 crops, eight stand or stood in Europe; only Giant's Causeway stands in North America. That is definitely food for thought.

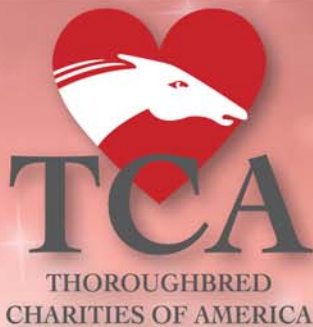

**Tuttipaesi Scores First Win for Valor Ladies**

When Tuttipaesi sailed home first in Tuesday's Ginger Brew S., it marked the maiden victory for the fledgling Valor Ladies syndicate. The syndicate, made up entirely

of female partners, was the brainchild of Team Valor's Director of Client Relations Megan Jones.

"I just thought, whether it was women partners or the wives and daughters or partners, the girls were having a lot of fun racing," explained Jones yesterday. "I just thought it was something different that would be fun and would bring positive publicity to the sport and would bring new people in. And we could always use that."

The syndicate got started last summer when Team Valor

CEO Barry Irwin purchased Tuttipaesi privately and the new initiative proved instantly popular.

"She sold out in the first week and the partners have been really great and really supportive," Jones said. "She has 26 partners and 10 are totally new partners to us. Of the other 16, probably 10 are women partners that were with Team Valor and then maybe six that are daughters or wives of partners."

As an added bonus, 25% of Tuttipaesi's net profits during her racing career will be donated by the partnership to the Susan G. Komen For the Cure breast cancer research foundation.

"I think breast cancer is something that affects all women, in fact a lot of times it transcends gender, because everyone knows someone who has fought breast cancer," Jones said. "That meant a lot to me and I thought it was certainly something that would mean a lot to all women. I thought it was the right call."

Tuttipaesi was purchased in Italy and shipped to England, but things didn't immediately go to plan.

"She was in Italy and she went to England first to Marco Botti and he was preparing her to run at Keeneland," Jones said. "But she didn't handle the ship very well, so we decided to just take our time and be patient with her. The partners were all so supportive and so wonderful and so on board with everything we were doing and [trainer] Graham [Motion] did an amazing job with her. He has done a great job teaching her to relax and building her confidence."

The results proved worth the wait as the filly drew away to an impressive win Tuesday, setting off a major celebration.

"She had four partners there today, plus myself," Jones commented. "They were screaming and jumping up and down. They were so excited. They were really great."

As for what is next for Tuttipaesi, Jones said, "We will see how she comes out of this race and talk to Graham, but I would say a logical step could be something like looking at Tampa and the [Feb. 2 GIII] Florida Oaks."

Tuttipaesi is the only horse in the Valor Ladies partnership at the moment, but Jones expects additional horses to be available in the future.

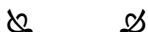
