GULFSTREAM PARK SIGNS PURSE CONTRACT, FILES FOR YEAR-ROUND RACING

As its current meet prepares to kick into high gear, officials at Gulfstream Park have been busy. On Dec. 31 the Hallandale Beach racetrack filed for year-round racing dates beginning July 1, and Tuesday, along with the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, it signed new purse and slots contracts that will support year-round racing and the track's plans for expanded casinos and entertainment facilities.

"The purse contract is a two-year deal, and the slots contract is in perpetuity," explained Gulfstream Park's Tim Ritvo. "It's a favorable contract for the horsemen and for ourselves to build out and expand the rest of the casino."

Ritvo noted that plans call for a new casino at Gulfstream, as well as additional hotels, and that the track's long-term goal is to host the Breeders' Cup, which has not been held at Gulfstream since 1999. Ritvo said construction is slated to begin at the end of the current meet, which concludes Apr. 5.

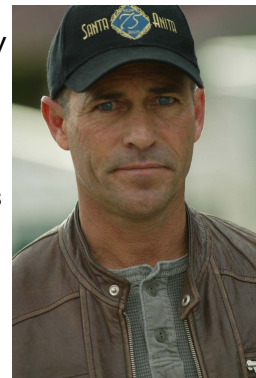
"A lot of the work is in progress as far as the planning stages and licensing," he explained. "We're very thankful to the horsemen for looking at this contract as a long-term investment."

As part of these agreements, Gulfstream will continue paying stall rent for Calder-based horses that compete at Gulfstream. In October, Calder officials announced that, for the first time, horsemen would be charged \$10 per horse, per day for stabling at the Miami Gardens track beyond the conclusion of the 2012 meet, which ended Dec. 2.

The battle over live racing dates between Gulfstream and Calder Race Course has been an ongoing, contentious issue in recent years, and it reached a plateau on the final day of 2012 when Gulfstream filed for 153 racing days with the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering for the year beginning July 1. Thirty-five of those dates conflict with dates filed by Calder, which traditionally races April through November and filed for those same dates for next year, requesting 150 days. Gulfstream has filed to race on Saturdays and Sundays from July through November, and five days a week December through April. In Florida, tracks pick their own dates and file them with the DPMW, which generally approves all requests. Gulfstream's current meet, which runs December through April, will consist of 90 live racing days. Gulfstream officials had previously announced intentions to hold year-round racing in 2014, but the plan has been moved forward to coincide with the track's expansion plans. *Cont. p3*

STEVENS ANNOUNCES RETURN TO SADDLE

Hall of Fame jockey Gary Stevens, who retired from competitive riding in November 2005, announced Thursday that he will return to race riding Sunday at Santa Anita. Stevens made the official announcement, speculated at for weeks, on HRTV. "I haven't felt like this since probably five years before I quit riding, body wise, mental wise and everything and I want to give it a go again," Stevens admitted. The 49-year-old has been working horses at Pegasus Training Center in Washington and at Santa Anita and was named to ride **Jebrica** (Liberty Gold) for trainer Jim Penney in Sunday's sixth race.

Stevens pinpointed one particular work as providing impetus for the comeback. "There was one particular horse that I breezed for Simon Callaghan the other morning, a horse named **Strong Suit** (Rahy)," Stevens explained. "This is what I missed, not so much the afternoon stuff, the feeling that the Rock Hard Tens, the Point Givens, the Silver Charms give you. Leaving the pole, the hair literally stood up on the back of my neck and I said, 'Man I miss this.' Just the feeling of that power and the speed underneath you and I thought, 'You are fit, you feel great, why not do this?' That was what the deciding point for me was, working this particular horse and getting that feeling inside me and I want that feeling again." *Cont. p3*

“We just felt the time was right,” Ritvo explained. “A lot of horsemen have expressed interest in sticking around [year-round]. People have been telling us that business is on the upward trend, and it was just the right time to get ready and get started.”

“This place has become a destination, and the year-round racing just helps promote the entire project,” Ritvo continued. “The chairman [Frank Stronach] didn’t buy a facility to run for four months; he bought a place that could be utilized year-round with The Village and the restaurants and all the other components that go with it.” --by Kelsey Riley

Stevens Returns to Saddle (cont. from p1)

Strong Suit was a multiple group winner in Europe for Qatar Racing and trainer Richard Hannon. He is expected to make his U.S. debut during the current Santa Anita meeting.

Since retiring from the saddle six years ago, Stevens has done broadcast work with Television Games Network (TVG) and HRTV and he serves as lead analyst on NBC’s coverage of the Triple Crown races. Stevens retired with 4,888 wins and earnings of \$221,212,704. He rode the winners of three Kentucky Derbys: Winning Colors in 1988, Thunder Gulch in 1995 and Silver Charm in 1997, as well as eight Breeders’ Cup races. Stevens, who played George Woolf in the 2003 motion picture 'Seabiscuit, was also featured in the HBO series Luck in 2011.

LEGISLATION PROVIDES INCENTIVES FOR OWNERS

Legislation past this week by the U.S. Congress and signed by President Obama contains provisions for investment incentives that should benefit horse owners, according to the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. The legislation reinstates bonus depreciation, applied to new property whose original use begins with the taxpayer, at 50%. Also, the expense allowance will be increased to \$500,000 in 2013 and retroactively increased from \$125,000 to \$500,000 for property purchased in 2012. The expense allowance, applied to new or used property purchased in 2012 or 2013, can be used to reduce taxable income derived from the horse business.

In addition, accelerated depreciation for young racehorses continues in 2013, meaning that taxpayers can depreciate racehorses that are 24 months and younger when purchased and placed in service using a 3-year schedule rather than the previous 7-year schedule.

“The reinstatement of bonus depreciation and the increase in the expense allowance are good news for horse owners and breeders,” said Alex Waldrop, President and CEO of the NTRA. “2013 will be a great year to purchase a Thoroughbred or farm equipment from a tax perspective. The NTRA legislative team will continue its efforts to extend these and other benefits even further to stimulate investment in the Thoroughbred industry.”

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

MACHO MACHO SOLD TO SAUDI INTERESTS

Macho Macho (Macho Uno--Dazzling Contrast, by General Meeting), winner of last year's GII West Virginia Derby, has been sold to Prince Faisal Bin Khalid Bin Abdulaziz of Saudi Arabia, and will remain in training in the U.S. with trainer Steve Asmussen. The deal was brokered by Dubai-based bloodstock agent Ajay Anne of New Approach Bloodstock, who said the 4-year-old will target a Southern California campaign early this year.

"Macho Macho is due to run in the [GII] Strub S. [at Santa Anita Feb. 2], then the [GI] Santa Anita H. [at Santa Anita Mar. 2]," Anne said. "That's the immediate plan. We might even look at the Dubai World Cup if things go according to plan."

Prince Faisal Bin Khalid is one of the leading owners in Saudi Arabia, with over 150 horses in training. He also has a large breeding establishment in that country.

"He has been an owner for more than 30 years, and is the leading owner at the moment in Saudi," Anne noted. "His international involvement has been limited so far but, if things go according to plan, he could be a force to reckon with."

In addition to his West Virginia Derby win, Macho Macho finished second in the GII Pennsylvania Derby and third in the GIII Matt Winn S. He was previously owned by Jerry Durant.

FORT LOUDON TO MILLIONS CLASSIC

Fort Loudon (Awesome of Course) will make his next start in the Jan. 19 Florida Sunshine Millions Classic, trainer Nick Zito revealed. The 4-year-old, winner of last year's GIII Carry Back S., had originally been considered for the Sunshine Millions Sprint. "I think he can go long, obviously," Zito said. "It's a good time to try him going long." Fort Loudon will likely have to match up with **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) and **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), first and second in last year's Classic. "I know he's up against those two," Zito said. "It's a restricted race, so sometimes you don't look at who you're in against. Maybe, if those two have off days or whatever, maybe it'll be Loudon's day." Fort Loudon was also second in last year's GI King's Bishop S. and GIII Ack Ack H. He is coming off a runner-up effort in the Dec. 2 Sunshine State S. at seven furlongs.

EL PADRINO TO HAL'S HOPE

El Padrino (Pulpit), winner of last year's GII Risen Star S., will prep for the Feb. 9 GI Donn H. with a start in the Jan. 13 GIII Hal's Hope S. The 4-year-old was sidelined after a 13th-place finish in the GI Kentucky Derby and returned with a runner-up effort in a Dec. 19 allowance at Gulfstream Park. "I thought he ran really well," trainer Todd Pletcher said of El Padrino's return. "He's a big horse that carries a lot of weight. I felt like if we were on a program to make the Donn, he'd need two starts to get enough conditioning to hopefully have his 'A' Game for that race. We'll hope that the Hal's Hope is an improved race and

that it sets him up for the big one."

Pletcher had also considered running the lightly raced **Graydar** (Unbridled's Song) in the Hal's Hope, but will instead shoot the 4-year-old towards an allowance race. "We'll point for something in early February for him," Pletcher said. "We thought about the Hal's Hope, but he's a very talented horse that lacks race experience and seasoning. I want to get a two-race into him." Graydar, who has raced only three times to date, returned from three months on the sidelines with a 4 1/4-length Gulfstream allowance tally Dec. 6.

Pletcher added that GII Bernard Baruch H. winner **Dominus** (Smart Strike) will make his next start in the Jan. 12 GII Fort Lauderdale S.

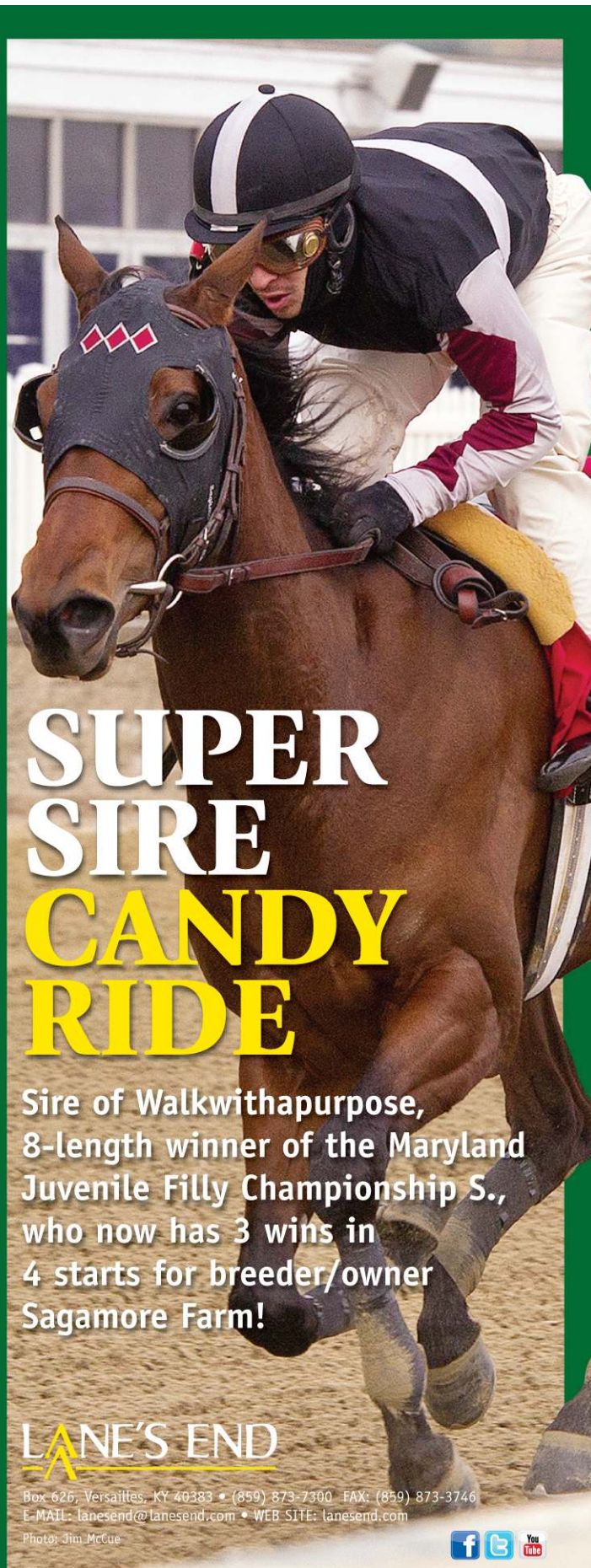

Jockey Paco Lopez completed a remarkable double Thursday at Gulfstream Park, guiding home 35-1 shots in consecutive races. The Eclipse Award-winning apprentice jockey of 2008, Lopez was in the irons aboard first-time starter Northwest's Hope (Flatter) in the fifth race, and the duo went gate to wire, returning \$73.20. Less than 30 minutes later, it was Lopez atop Whisper Hill homebred Forest Station (Forest Wildcat) in a restricted \$50,000 claimer. The 5-year-old argued the pace inside and found the wire a length to the good at \$73.60 for his backers. The Paco-Paco daily double returned \$1,606.

DETERMINATO (h, 5, Closing Argument--Twilight Mirage {SP, \$159,829}, by Jebblar), upset winner of the Spectacular Bid S. over this main track two years ago, was runner-up in the Champali S. sprinting over yielding Calder turf May 12, but was fourth back on the dirt in the Ponche S. June 12. Third in the Bob Umphrey Turf Sprint July 7, he faltered to fourth as the even-money chalk going seven panels over the Calder main July 21, his final appearance for trainer Larry Pilotti. Resuming here as a 3-1 chance, Determinato was quickest away for Luis Saez and set a pressured pace on the inside. He opened a bit of daylight turning for home and kept on well to best Saint Pete (Put It Back) by a length. Lifetime Record: SW, 12-3-3-1, \$164,835. OHRIA Asks Candidates to Commit to Horse Racing:

The Ontario Horse Racing Industry Association (OHRIA) has petitioned Ontario Liberal Leadership Party candidates in the province's upcoming election to support measures it feels will protect the horse racing and breeding industry in Ontario. Ontario's Slots at Racetracks Program is scheduled to end in three months. OHRIA President Sue Leslie sent letters to each candidate asking them to commit to extending the slots program, currently set to expire Mar. 31, and to defer the implementation of the OLG Modernization Strategy. "The Ontario Liberal leadership race needs to be about the renewal of our province, not just their party," Leslie said. "55,000 men and women in all corners of Ontario stand to lose their jobs if the Slots at Racetracks Program ends and horse racing isn't an integrated part of the OLG modernization strategy. We need action from everyone serious about being Premier now."

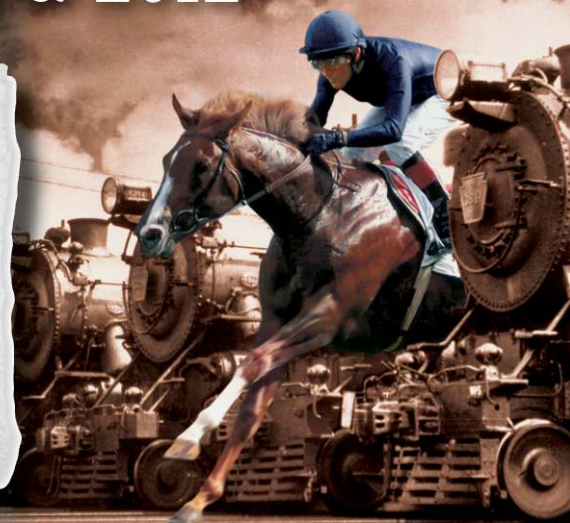
