## SO MANY WAYS WORKS

Maggi Moss's unbeaten **So Many Ways** (Sightseeing), winner of last year's GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga Sept. 2, turned in her first published work since that victory yesterday, going three furlongs in :37 3/5 at Palm Meadows Training Center. The work was the fifth fastest of 11 at the distance.

"This was her first workout since the Spinaway, and we're very impressed with her," said trainer Tony Dutrow of the recently turned 3-year-old. "She had a great gallop out and was full of run. We're really over the moon with her."

An eight-length debut winner at Parx in June, **So Many Ways** justified favoritism in Saratoga's GIII Schuylerville S. next out, winning by 1 1/2 lengths. She made the successful jump to the highest level six weeks later, winning the Spinaway ([video](#)) over **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** Teen Pauline (Tapit), who had set a track record when breaking her maiden on debut at Saratoga in July. After that victory, Moss decided to resist the lure of the \$2-million GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, opting instead to rest her filly for a sophomore campaign.

"The Breeders' Cup was on the West Coast and Maggi didn't want to ship her across the country," Dutrow explained. "It may have been different had the Breeders' Cup been on the East Coast, but because it was on the West Coast there was no discussion about it."

**So Many Ways** spent about 75 days turned out at Dutrow's farm adjacent to Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland before shipping to Palm Meadows Dec. 1.

"She's grown a touch, and she's filled out and will continue to fill out, but she does look different than she did in the fall," Dutrow said. "We're as happy as we could be with her right now."

Dutrow said a target race for **So Many Ways** has not been discussed.

"We're watching **So Many Ways**, and when it's time to get that figured out, I'll discuss it with Maggi, but that hasn't entered the conversation at all," he said.

## TOUR GUIDE STILL LECOMTE BOUND

Trainer Bret Calhoun has confirmed that Gary and Mary West'd homebred **Tour Guide** (Broken Vow) will stretch out for Saturday's one-mile-and-70-yard GIII Lecomte S. at Fair Grounds. The Sugar Bowl S. winner has recorded back-to-back one-mile works in an effort to build stamina, most recently being clocked in 1:47 in the slop Saturday. "We're happy with that mile move yesterday, as well as the one the week before (1:44.40 Jan. 5)," Calhoun said Sunday. "The important thing for me was that he finished up strong both times."

Also pointing to the Lecomte is Shadwell Stable's **Hawaakom** (Jazil), who rallied from off the pace to graduate second out over track and trip Dec. 15. He breezed four furlongs in :49 3/5 (23/117) over the sloppy strip Saturday. "We'll be trying to figure out exactly where we are at with him," said trainer Danny Peitz. "We'll be waiting to see if he can take the next step forward by continuing his progress in this race Saturday. Lecomte entries will be drawn Wednesday."

# BREEDING NEWS

## BALANCE TO VISIT FRANKEL

Three-time Grade I winner **Balance** (Thunder Gulch--Vertigineux, by Kris S.) arrived in England Sunday and is scheduled to be bred to undefeated champion Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), according to a tweet by Mill Ridge's Headley Bell yesterday. The half-sister to Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) will be boarded at the National Stud in Newmarket.

Winner of the GI Las Virgenes S., GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. and GI Santa Anita Oaks, Balance has proven a commercial success as a broodmare. Her first foal, the unraced 4-year-old Mr. Besilu (A.P. Indy), topped the 2010 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, bringing a \$4.2-million final bid from Benjamin Leon of Besilu Stables. Her second foal is the unraced Go Nineteen (Street Cry {Ire}), who was hammered down to John McCormack for \$750,000 at Keeneland September in 2011, and was recently exported to Japan. Balance did not produce a live foal in 2011, and she has a newly turned yearling colt by Smart Strike.

Frankel, a two-time Cartier Horse of the Year and 10-time Group 1 winner, will stand his first season at Juddmonte's Banstead Manor Stud in Newmarket for a fee of £125,000.

While television commercials are a necessary evil, occasionally an advertisement comes along which makes an impact either with its camera work or music or--more likely--its humor and wit. The problem with these popular commercials is that the very qualities which make them stand out can sometimes draw attention away from the central message. I don't think I am alone in often finding myself unable to name the product being promoted by my favorite ads.

I don't think there is any danger of the message becoming lost with one of my current favorites among the stallion advertisements in the *TDN*, namely the series promoting Ramsey Farm's Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}). We have had "Here's the DIRT on Kitten's Joy," "More DIRT on Kitten's Joy" and then, in yesterday's issue, we had "Csaba, by Kitten's Joy, hits Pay DIRT in the Grade III Hal's Hope." Looks like the Ramseys are trying to tell us something!

This type of campaign is necessary when everyone nowadays seems so keen to pigeonhole stallions as either dirt or turf. Kitten's Joy, inevitably, is classified primarily as a turf sire. After all, he became a champion turf performer during his racing career, before developing into a leading sire of turf runners in 2011 and 2012.

Unfortunately, this rush to compartmentalize today's stallions ignores the fact that many of the distinguished North American stallions of the past 50 years or so were adept at siring top performers on both surfaces. Take Kitten's Joy's pedigree as an example. He is inbred 3x5 to Northern Dancer (Nearctic), 5x4 to Hail To Reason (Turn-to), 4x5 to Tom Fool (Menow) and 6x5x5 to Turn-to (Royal Charger).

Although Northern Dancer's name became synonymous with exceptional success on European turf, the Windfields star spent most of his 18-race career on the main track and was good enough to win the Flamingo S., Blue Grass S., Florida Derby, Kentucky Derby and Preakness. (Incidentally, Northern Dancer's record acts as a reminder of how sound he was, even though his career was ended by a bowed tendon. Foaled as late as May 27, he raced nine times as a juvenile and packed in a total of 17 starts before his actual third birthday.) **Caulfield cont. p5**

Northern Dancer was celebrated mainly for his feat of becoming champion sire on four occasions in Britain and Ireland, with his record resulting in an exodus of his progeny to Europe's leading trainers. Don't forget, though, that he also became champion sire in North America or that he sired champion stallions in North America. Clearly he was able to sire shining stars both on dirt and turf and Kitten's Joy's inbreeding acts as a reminder of this. One of his lines to Northern Dancer comes via Sadler's Wells, the other via Fanfreluche, winner of the Alabama S. and numerous other good races on dirt.

Hail To Reason's stallion career also showed versatility. This colt, whose trainer Hirsch Jacobs famously said that he "thought it better to let him wear out than rust away," endured a juvenile career of 18 races before the machine wore out. With his dirt background, Hail To Reason went on to take the title of champion sire in North America, as did his son Halo, and he sired winners of all three legs of the Triple Crown.

Hail To Reason's proficiency as a sire of dirt performers didn't stop him making his mark in Europe with the likes of Trillion, Hippodamia and Roberto and this line's descendants have continued to flourish on turf, thanks primarily to the descendants of Roberto and Halo. Kitten's Joy owes one of his lines to Hail To Reason to Roberto and the other to Bold Reason, who won important races on both surfaces.

# Champion Sire in 2009, 2010 & 2012 Off to a great start in 2013

It is worth adding that every one of the 30 horses in the first four generations of Kitten's Joy's pedigree was bred in either the U.S. or Canada. So why wouldn't he be capable of siring a fair proportion of quality dirt runners, especially when he is only half of the equation?

His sire El Prado (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) was a Group 1 turf winner produced by two Irish Classic winners, but that didn't stop him siring dirt performers of the caliber of Medaglia d'Oro and Borrego. Kitten's Joy's 2012 stakes winners on dirt included Politicallycorrect and Empire Builder, both of whom have dams by sons of Storm Cat, and the progressive Csaba.

Politicallycorrect's dam Exceedexpectations did her winning on dirt, while Csaba's dam High Chant gained two of her three wins over the main track. As the broodmare sires of these dirt stakes winners include the top turf winners Giant's Causeway and War Chant, the message seems to be that no one should assume that turf is the automatic route to take with Kitten's Joy's progeny. We already know that they can excel on synthetic tracks, as four of his 15 stakes winners in 2011 won on the all-weather. Three of the four--Stephanie's Kitten, Holiday For Kitten and Derby Kitten--scored at graded level.

Csaba has now won four consecutive stakes races on dirt and we can surely expect to see future crops by Kitten's Joy coming up with high-class winners on all surfaces. As the advertisement which appeared as page 2 of the [January 12 TDN](#) shows, Kitten's Joy has earned the respect of a broad spectrum of breeders, ranging from Claiborne Farm to the Aga Khan. It is going to be fascinating to see what heights his \$50,000 crops manage to scale.

# Writers Up

with Richard Zachariah

**RACING AND BREEDING: FRACTIONS AND FASHION** *By Richard Zachariah*

Half way through the second day of the fevered heat at the Magic Millions sale the veteran bloodstock agent David Lamond leaned towards me and said, "Racing and breeding are games of fractions and fashion."

Lamond's mate and client, the former champion jockey and veteran Sydney trainer Ron Quinton was alongside. He smiled at me from under his hat and nodded. No one would know better than Quinton that Lamond was right.

At that moment I was dealing with the latter point, fashion in breeding. I had taken an Exceed and Excel colt to the sales and just passed him in for A\$65,000, just slightly more than his sire's 2010 service fee of A\$60,000 and a long way short of his 2009 advertised cost of A\$100,000.

I was learning the hard way that the Group 1-winning son of Danehill, second leading sire of winners this season in Australia (82) and an unprecedented fourth on the 2012 English money earning list was momentarily off the boil as far as this market was concerned.

It was a shock for me that my colt was rejected (like having your child criticized), but there was some solace in the fact that others by the sire didn't sell (11 sold and five passed in) and the stallion's average was A\$77,955, about half that of last year's MM sale. Meantime, unproven first-season sires like All American (Red Ransom), Manhattan Rain (Encosta de Largo) and Nicconi (Bianconi) all averaged well above the proven sire that has 59 stakes winners.

I am not demeaning these new season sires, all of them good racehorses getting types, but one would imagine that hard won success of progeny on the track is important at a yearling sale that has at its very heart the speculative nature of chasing a dream. But that is the sale mentality, fashion motivated, driven by whim and perception. No more no less.

Exceed and Excel will return as a market favorite (2012: 29 sold at an average of A\$147,833 and gross of A\$4,287,150), but meantime I philosophize, lick my wounds and prepare to syndicate my unsold colt and race him. It's what breeders do. What is the alternative? There isn't one.

This is running through my brain as I walk disconsolately passed smiling vendors in the milling humidity of Queensland at high noon. I think that being caught up in the all-pervasive bubble that is the deals and stresses of a sale is a bit like being on a cruise ship. For some it is a happy journey. For others like me, it is a trip on the Titanic.

But I can't blame the sale. It is what it is. I had the wrong product in the wrong place at the wrong time. Lesson learned.

The Magic Millions sale is, as its name suggests, different from the norm--a unique franchise that, after 30 years of ups and downs, is now making headway under the steam of its own success. This is Barnum and Bailey, not Kentucky or Newmarket, it is not for the conventional or conservative, it is not about pedigree either, in humans or horses.

It is about big strapping colts and forward fillies that will run as 2-year-olds. There is no thought of the 5-year-old Melbourne Cup stayer here, no eye for the backward horse that may run as a Classic 3-year-old. The yearling must have instant sex appeal and anyway it's too hot to think too far ahead.

Held on Australia's holiday glitter strip at the height of summer in our hottest State, it is where the turf meets the surf. It is run and owned by a married couple who happen to be two of Australia's great retailers, billionaire Gerry Harvey and businesswoman Katie Page.

They could sell ice in Antarctica.

Each year they emerge with another reason to attract the leisure dollar. This year it was a direct appeal to women with bonuses on the sales races for winners owned exclusively by ladies. To market the discretionary spend, they enticed a slice of Royalty, the Queen's granddaughter and Olympic equestrienne Zara Phillips, photogenic and pleasant and with a genuine love of horses.

And so has Gerry. He puts his own money into the game and, as Australia's largest breeder, has 1200 horses. This is not lost on the punters, who pack the impossibly humid and dusty space where the horses are sold out the back of the local racecourse. Gerry is a popular no frills guy with a western style straw hat and, as he works the complex, has a word for everyone. He toils in the broiling sun harder than his most industrious employee. If you want to buy a horse, Gerry's your man.

This knockabout, man in the street image works in the horse game, especially in Australia. The sale figures are up on last year, about 7%, but clearance rate falls 1% to 83% sold.

Gerry caresses the press, but doesn't gild the lily. He reckons the economy generally is sliding along the bottom and marvels at the resilience of the horse market. He notes that his retail shops (selling consumers price sensitive items like computers, furniture and fridges) are up marginally and links the better figures directly to the improved sales on the Gold Coast as a demonstration that 'people are happier.'

I fly out of the Coast thinking about that. I'm not happy, but reckon I have had a good time with old mates and many laughs. That is what marketing this sale is all about--people on holidays having a good time.

And that will never go out of fashion.

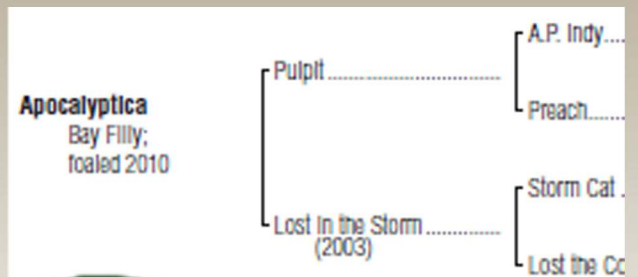

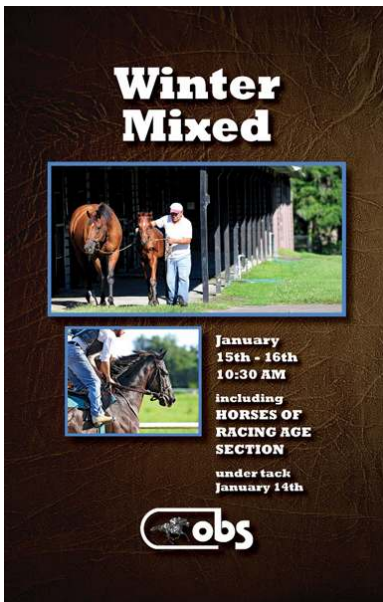

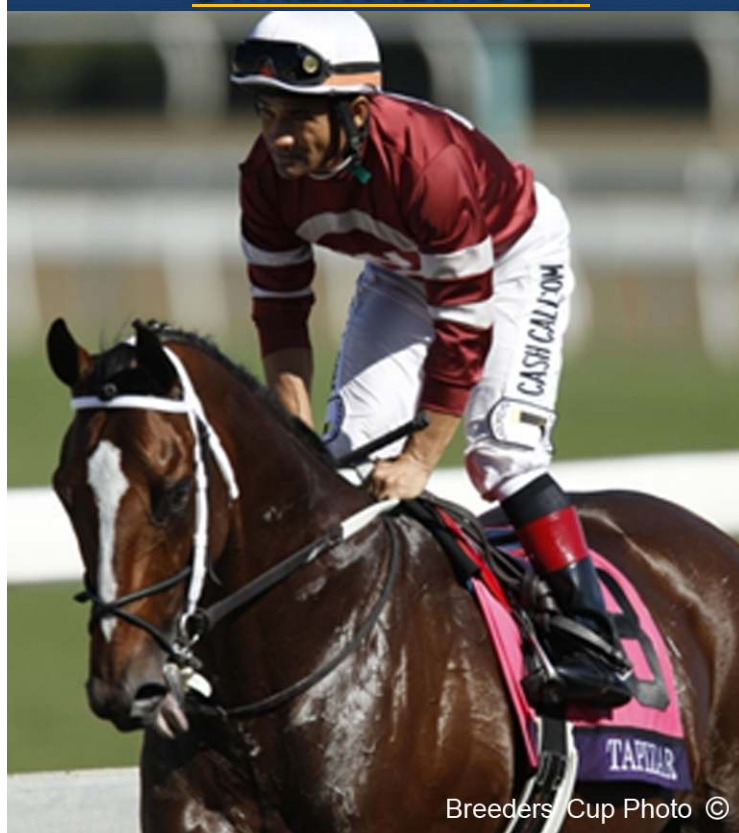
