VINERY KENTUCKY STALLIONS TO WINSTAR

Vinery Kentucky's **More Than Ready** (Southern Halo) and **Congrats** (A.P. Indy) headline a group of five stallions who have been relocated to WinStar Farm in Versailles. **Kodiak Kowboy** (Posse), **Pure Prize** (Storm Cat) and **Street Hero** (Street Cry {Ire}) are also headed to Kenny Troutt's operation for the 2013 breeding season. It was announced in December that fellow Vinery stallions **Pioneer of the Nile** (Empire Maker) and **Maimonides** (Vindication) were also headed to WinStar.

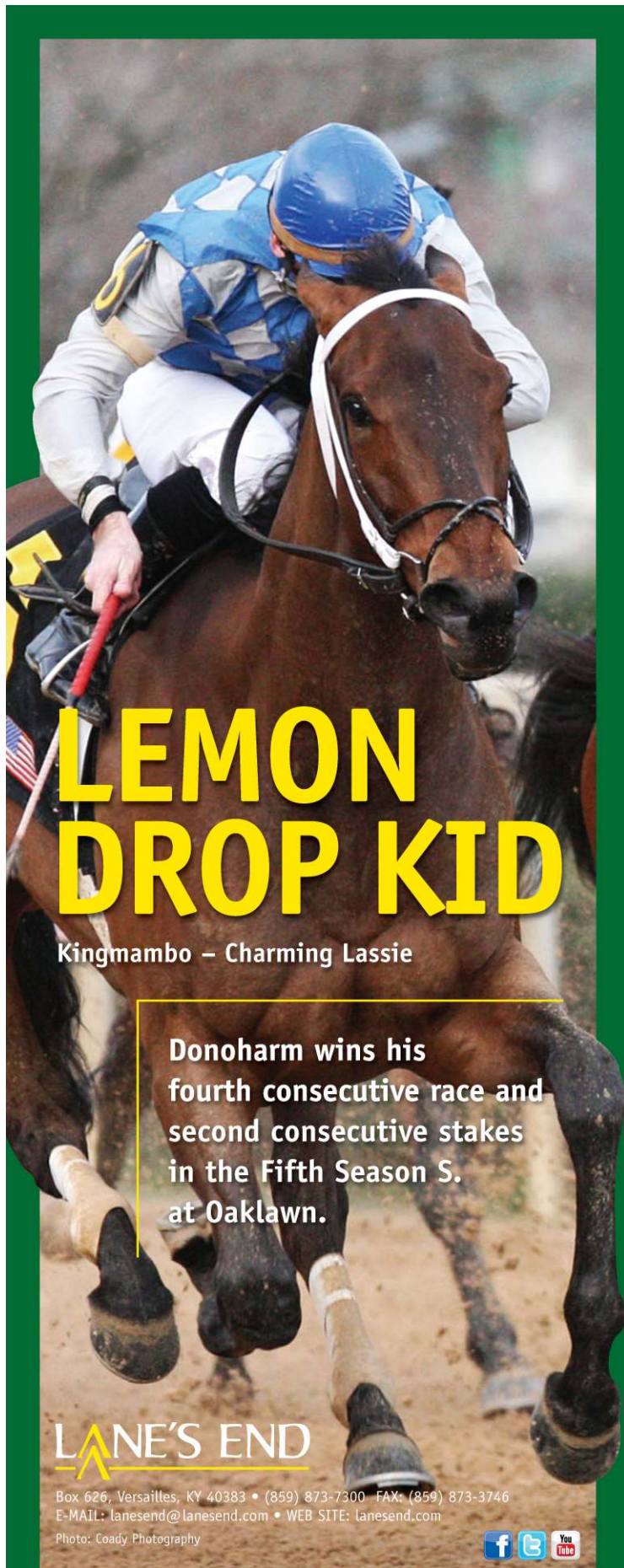

Despite the presence of a pair of Grade I winners in this restricted affair, trainer Nick Zito doesn't mind taking a chance in stretching out Jacks or Better Farm's **Fort Loudon** in the Classic. The homebred bay hasn't raced around two turns since finishing sixth in the GI Florida Derby last March, but became a reliable sprinter thereafter, with a marquee victory over Trinniberg (Teuflesberg) in the GIII Carry Back S. at Calder last summer. In five appearances for Zito, the bay posted a trio of runner-up efforts, most notably when he was beaten just a half-length in the GI King's Bishop S. at Saratoga Aug. 25. "I've always wanted to stretch him out," the conditioner commented. "I talked to [Fred] Brei about stretching him out again, and we'll give it a whirl." Fort Loudon showed plenty of ability going long as a 2-year-old, winning the In Reality S. en route to a sweep of the Florida Stallion Stakes series.

Majestic Racing Stable and RAP Racing's **Avare** (Johannesburg) took a circuitous route to Oaklawn Park, but has arrived and is bedded down in the barn of Grant Forster ahead of a start in Monday's Smarty Jones S. The ridgling arrived in Hot Springs Tuesday, but the trip was not an easy one, as he was re-routed to Dallas due to icy and wintry weather in Arkansas. The bay, a \$130,000 purchase out of last year's OBS June sale, has two wins from his four career starts and is exiting a front-running victory in the Dec. 26 Eddie Logan S. rained off the turf. He is one of several Doug O'Neill trainees looking to earn his way into Triple Crown consideration. "He's got the right pedigree and the right stride," O'Neill commented. "It's time to see now how well he can handle himself on the road. At this point he's already mentally mature and his two wins show he's very sure-footed."

Hong Kong Mile Rematch in Stewards' Cup...

Archrivals **Ambitious Dragon (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}) and **Glorious Days (Aus)** (Hussonet) are set to square off for the fourth consecutive time this season in Sunday's HK\$8-million (*\$1,031,940*) Stewards' Cup at Sha Tin Racecourse. Ambitious Dragon, the two-time reigning Horse of the Year in Hong Kong and winner of this

event in 2012, holds a 2-1 advantage in their three previous meetings, including a smashing last-out victory in the G1 Hong Kong Mile Dec. 9. Glorious Days added blinkers and was in receipt of five pounds from the champion when he beat the Dragon in the G2 Jockey Club Mile

Nov. 18, and Ambitious Dragon's trainer Tony Millard is convinced there is still better to come from Glorious Days. "We always respect Glorious Days, we cannot afford to let our guard down," the South African told South China *Morning Post*. "You need plenty of luck in this game, and maybe we got our fill when we beat him last time." Glorious Days is one of three from the stable of John Size, who will be looking for his fifth victory in the event. The Stewards' Cup is also expected to attract dual G1 Champions Mile hero **Xtension (Ire)** (Xaar {GB}) and **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}), cutting back to the mile off his popular success in the G1 Hong Kong Cup over 2000 meters.

FAIR GROUNDS MOVES BRADLEY

Facing the likelihood of no turf racing this weekend, Fair Grounds has moved the GIII Col. E.R. Bradley H. back a week to Jan. 26. The New Orleans track is also switching the Marie G. Krantz Memorial S. to next Saturday. "Everyone agreed this was the right decision," said Fair Grounds Vice President and General Manager for Racing Eric Halstrom. "These are important races on our stakes schedule and our horsemen deserve every chance to run their horses on their preferred surface. While it doesn't always work out that way, we think that moving these turf stakes back a week will help accomplish that goal." New Orleans has been hit with nearly 5.5 inches of rain in the last two weeks and, while no rain is forecast for the weekend, the turf course is too saturated to support racing.

DUTROW SUSPENSION TO BEGIN

With one more winner on his resume, embattled trainer Richard Dutrow Jr. will begin serving the first day of a 10-year license revocation on Thursday, Jan. 17. The New York Racing and Wagering Board is prepared to issue an order that will prevent Dutrow, 53, from reapplying for a license in the state until Oct. 2021 and fine him \$50,000.

After exhausting his appeals options in state court on Jan. 8 and with a stay set to expire at midnight, Dutrow's legal team was expected to try to move the matter to federal court and seek an injunction or stay on Wednesday. By early evening there was no indication that it had found a way to prevent the suspension from starting. Attorney Michael Koenig, who has represented Dutrow for nearly two years, did not provide any updates on the status of the case in a text message, but said that he was sickened by what has happened to his client.

Racing and Wagering Board spokesman Lee Park said Wednesday evening that the agency had not received any notice that Dutrow had obtained another stay.

"The board expects to issue a suspension notice," Park said. "If a federal court reaches out to us and says we can't go forward until it has a chance to review it, then we'll act on it. But that's the only thing that will stop this from happening."

Colossal Gift sent Dutrow out a winner with a victory by a head in Aqueduct's finale Wednesday afternoon.

Through 7,203 career starts, Dutrow has 1,810 wins and over \$87.4 million in purse earnings. Equibase stats show has won a total of 25 Grade 1 races with 14 different horses. Breeders' Cup Classic winner Saint Liam was the 2005 Horse of the Year and Big Brown won the Kentucky Derby and Preakness in 2008.

The suspension begins some 16 months after Dutrow was handed the stiff penalties by New York regulators, who considered the controversial trainer's long record of infractions during his successful career. According to the Association of Racing Commissioners International, Dutrow has had 86 rulings against him since 1976. A stay from the federal court would have allowed him to continue to operate his 60-horse stable, based at Aqueduct, while his attorneys pursue the appeal. The license revocation will prevent him from entering the track and play any role in the management of the animals, who will be moved to other horsemen. Dutrow's lone Jan. 17 entry at Aqueduct, Reaching Out, a 3-year-old son of Big Brown, will be scratched from the eighth race.

The three-man Racing and Wagering Board voted in October 2011 to punish Dutrow for his long history of rules violations with the stiff fine and lengthy loss of his license. The board's ruling came after Dutrow appealed a 90-day suspension for separate incidents in November 2010 at Aqueduct Racetrack: discovery of hypodermic syringes in the desk in his office at his barn at the track on November 3 and a post-race positive for the horse Fastus Cactus, who competed later in the month. **Cont. p9**

The syringes were found by Racing and Waging Board investigator Joel Leveson, during a training session for New York Racing Association investigators. New York rules limit on-track possession of syringes to licensed veterinarians. The unmarked syringes contained the drug xyzaline.

Fastus Cactus tested positive for butrophanol after winning the third race on November 20. The horse, was claimed out of that race for \$14,000.

On Feb. 16, 2011, Dutrow was notified by the Racing and Wagering Board that he was being suspended 60 days for the Fastus Cactus positive and 30 days for possession of the syringes. He appealed the suspensions and was able to continue training. That week, Ed Martin president of the Association of Racing Commissioners International, sent a letter to the board asking the board to require Dutrow "to show why his license should not be revoked given what appears to a lifetime pattern of disregard for the rules of racing." John Sabini, who retired as the Racing and Wagering Board chairman on Jan. 11, was a member of the ARCI board at the time.

On March 2, 2011, the board followed through on Martin's proposal and issued a ruling that Dutrow had to show cause why he should not lose the license. The memo that New York regulators would decide whether Dutrow should be banned for conduct "improper, obnoxious, unbecoming and detrimental to the best interests of racing."

Clem Parente presided over the three-day hearing at the end of May in Schenectady. Dutrow testified that he did not know why the syringes were in his office, and had never heard of butorphanol until the test came back positive. While he said he understood that mistakes in withdrawal times for medications could lead to positives, said he does not drug horses.

Parente found him guilty of the infractions at Aqueduct and recommended a lifetime ban. The board decided that 10 years was appropriate.

Koenig obtained a stay and filed a total of three appeals in state court, all of which were rejected. Dutrow is one of the most-penalized trainers in the country. In addition to many fines for small infractions that led to late scratches, he has been suspended several times. The longest was 60 days--lowered from 120--in 2005 for two post-race positives and violating claiming rules.

With WinStar's Elliott Walden (cont. from p1)

TDN: What was most appealing about this group of five stallions that helped make this deal happen?

EW: We've been trying to acquire proven stallions, and it's worked very well for us so far with Harlan's Holiday, Bellamy Road and Artie Schiller. The main attraction here for us was to try and put something together that could continue to grow our already solid proven stallion market. Congrats and More Than Ready do that, as does **Pure Prize**, who is solid at his level. You throw in **Kodiak Kowboy** and **Street Hero**, and you have a chance to have one of the young horses step up, too.

TDN: Did WinStar's existing relationship with Vinery standing Bluegrass Cat and Rule in New York help facilitate this deal at all? Explain how it all came together.

EW: It did. I've been in communication with Tom Ludt for a while now with Bluegrass Cat and Rule standing at Vinery in New York. When they announced that the farm was going to be sold, we looked at adding some of their stallions as a possibility. I reached out to Tom and said that if there was any way possible that we could help them in this transition period that we would be more than willing to listen. We then remained quiet until Tom reached out to us and said that they were ready to have some discussions about it. We sat down and got serious about a month ago, and it really didn't materialize at that time, but Mr. Zayat decided to go ahead and move **Pioneer of the Nile** and **Maimonides** to WinStar. Tom Simon and Tom Ludt were gracious enough to allow that happen and things heated up in the past week or so on the others. **Cont. pxx**

TDN: *Does any of these new stallions help fill a void on the WinStar roster for any specific sire-line/crosses that you were looking to add?*

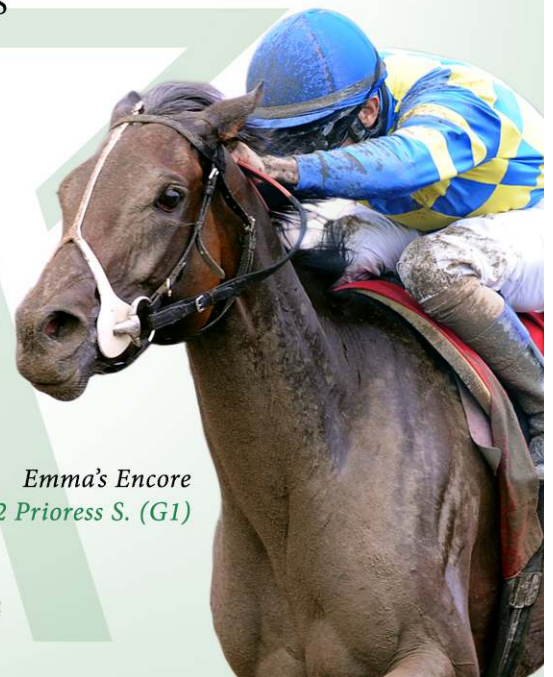

Oaklawn Continues to Restrict Hawthorne Horses:

Oaklawn Park will continue to ban horses from Hawthorne Race Course in suburban Chicago due to an outbreak of equine herpesvirus (EHV-1), despite the fact that the Illinois Department of Agriculture has lifted a quarantine. According to a memo issued to Arkansas horsemen and state racing officials by Arkansas Racing Commission State Veterinarian Joseph Lokanc, the state has set its own quarantine clock based on the last positive test at Hawthorne in late December. "Our ban on horses from Hawthorne is still in effect," Lokanc said. "The length of the ban is based on the last positive test of any horse at Hawthorne. Based on what we know now, the earliest that horses from Hawthorne could be allowed at Oaklawn is after Feb. 3. And that date is subject to change pending further developments." The existing policy that horses that have been at Hawthorne in the last 28 days are not allowed on the grounds remains in effect. Once the ban is lifted, horses will require specific approval and permission from the Arkansas Racing Commission veterinarian.

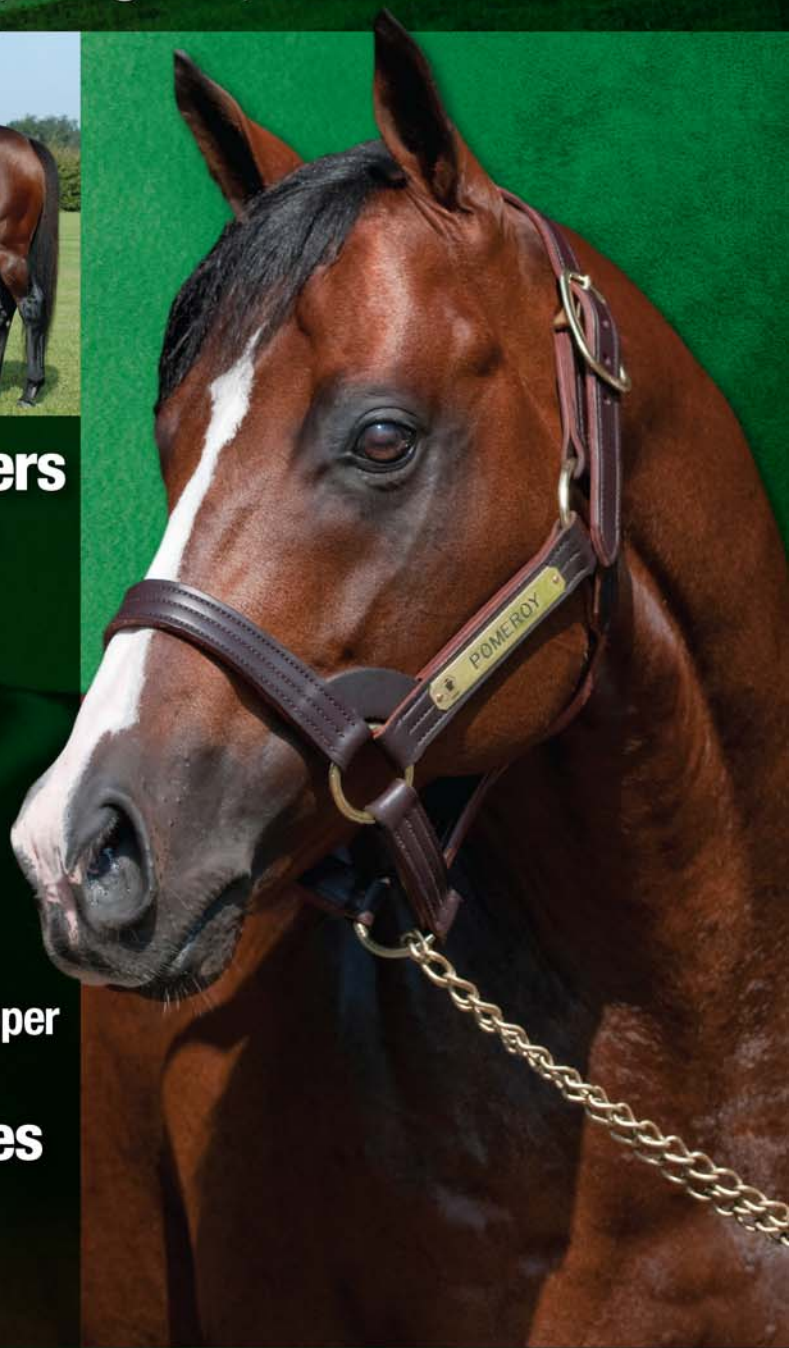
