

NYRWB OFFICIALLY SUSPENDS DUTROW

Rick Dutrow officially began a 10-year suspension Thursday after the New York State Racing and Wagering Board issued an order preventing the 53-year-old from reapplying for a license in the state until January 2023 and fined him \$50,000. Dutrow had exhausted his appeal options at the state level and his legal team failed to seek an injunction at the federal level before his stay expired at midnight Wednesday.

The NYSRWB four-page order cited several of Dutrow's infractions and read in part, "During the period of his revocation, respondent Richard E. Dutrow, Jr. shall not directly or indirectly participate in New York pari-mutuel horse racing, he is denied the privileges and use of the grounds of all racetracks, and he is forbidden to participate in any share of purses or other payment. Every horse is denied the privileges of the grounds and shall not participate in pari-mutuel racing in New York, further that is (a) owned or trained by him, or any individual who serves as his agent or employee, during his revocation; or b) for which he, during his revocation, is involved, directly or indirectly, with its training, including but not limited to any arrangements made to care for, train, enter, race, invoice, collect fees or payments, manage funds, employ or insure workers, provide advice or information, or otherwise assist with any aspect of the training of the horse."

Longtime Dutrow assistant Michelle Nevin has been named the trainer of record on Teaks North (Northern Afleet), who has been entered in the Sunshine Millions Turf at Gulfstream Saturday.

BETFAIR HOLLYWOOD TO HOST FALL MEET

Jack Liebau, president of Betfair Hollywood Park, announced yesterday during a meeting of the California Horse Racing Board that, despite recent doubts, the Inglewood oval would indeed conduct a fall meet in 2013.

The future of Betfair Hollywood Park has been uncertain since 2009, when the property was approved for commercial and residential development. Betfair Hollywood Park had previously committed to run this year's spring/summer meet--scheduled for Apr. 24 to July 14--and, at its August meeting last year, the CHRB approved the track's fall dates, under the agreement that the track commit to racing by Jan. 1.

NYRA TO CONSIDER SYNTHETIC TRACK

In the wake of four catastrophic breakdowns since racing moved to the inner track in mid-December, the New York Racing Association will consider several changes aimed at making racing at Aqueduct safer during its board meeting next Friday. Among the proposals are installing a synthetic surface for the inner track at Aqueduct for the 2013-2014 winter meet, reducing the number of days and number of races run per day during the inner-track season and bolstering security measures related to pre-race security and racing integrity. "The NYRA Board will have serious discussions next week to consider all these important issues that affect the health and safety of our jockeys and horses," NYRA chair David Skorton said in a statement. **Cont. p3**

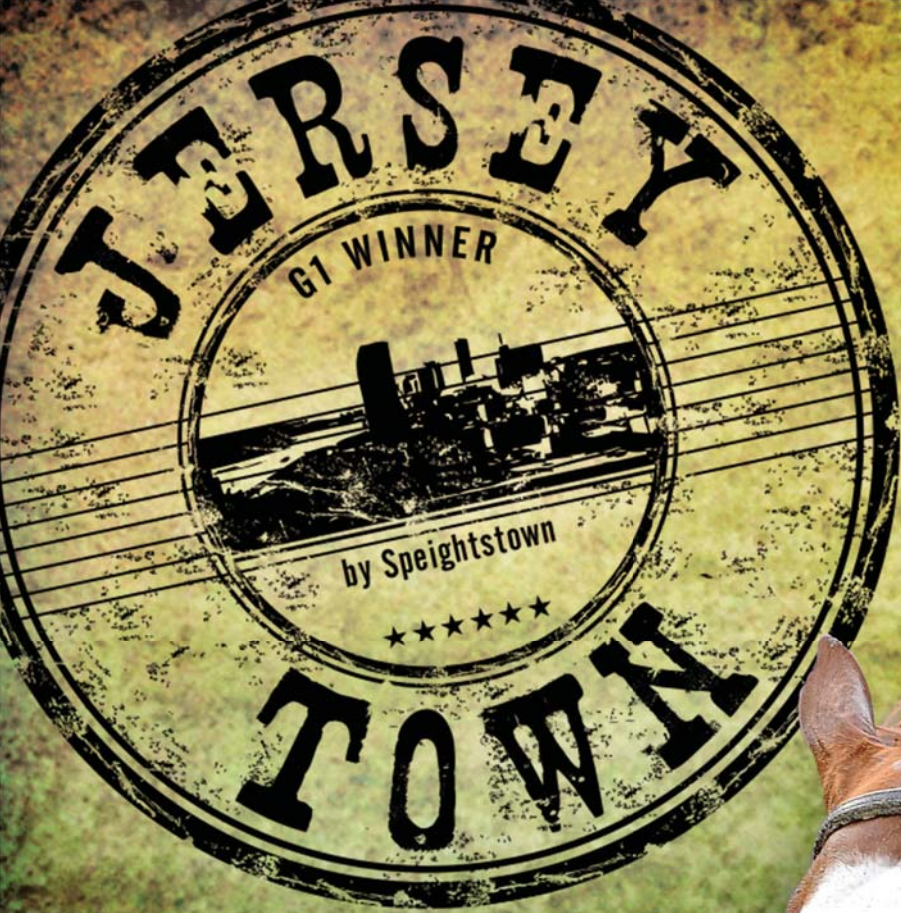

NYRA Considering New Safety Measures (cont. from p1)

In addition, NYRA has established the new position of Equine Veterinary Medical Director. The new director will create a Mortality Review Board, as recommended in the New York Task Force report on Racehorse Health and Safety issued last fall. NYRA has also begun transporting all euthanized horses to the College of Veterinary Medicine at Cornell for complete necropsies.

“NYRA is taking immediate steps to try to prevent more catastrophic injuries from occurring,” said Skorton. “We are establishing a new position, Equine Veterinary Medical Director, to be in charge of the health and safety of horses at all NYRA tracks and direct investigations into these unfortunate events.”

Anthony Bonomo, chair of NYRA’s Equine Health and Safety Committee, added, “Addressing the problem of breakdowns at NYRA is our first priority. We will do everything to protect the jockeys and the horses.”

Betfair Hollywood to Host Fall Meet (cont. from p1)

Lou Raffetto, president of the Thoroughbred Owners of California, applauded Betfair Hollywood Park at the meeting for its decision, but also called for the CHRB and others in the industry to formulate a contingency plan should Betfair Hollywood Park cease operations. Los Alamitos, a Quarter Horse track in Orange County, and Fairplex Park in Los Angeles County are potential alternatives, but neither has the infrastructure to support the additional horses and horse people.



“I want to thank Jack Liebau and the powers that be at Betfair Hollywood Park for deciding to run the fall meet,” said Raffetto. “Quite honestly, we hope they decide to run beyond 2013. We think it’s important at this time for the industry and the CHRB to specifically focus on 2014. We still need to look ahead, and while there are no formal proposals from Los Alamitos or Fairplex, we continue to have ongoing conversations with those entities looking forward to the time if, and when, Betfair Hollywood Park ceases to race.”

The Betfair Hollywood Park fall meet is scheduled for Nov. 6 to Dec. 22.

BEHOLDER RETURNS MONDAY

Beholder (Henny Hughes), expected to be named champion juvenile filly during the Eclipse Awards Ceremony Saturday, will make her sophomore debut in Monday's GI Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita. The filly, second in the GI Del Mar Debutante, was last seen winning the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She had an unrecorded work at Santa Anita Thursday. "I let her breeze a very slow half-mile this morning just to let her do a little something," trainer Richard Mandella reported. "She couldn't be better." Garrett Gomez, who has been aboard for all five of Beholder's races, agrees. "She's progressed all the time," Gomez said. "She's never really done anything wrong, although she might have been a little bit speed-crazy. We've been working with her and Richard's been doing a great job with her. We'll see how she acts when she runs Monday. I worked her twice [six furlongs in 1:13 on Jan. 11 and a bullet 58 4/5 for five furlongs on Jan. 4]. We worked her off horses both times and she handled it well. Hopefully, it carries over to the race and she's able to do certain things we need her to do and she keeps putting up those fast numbers."

SCTOBA Holds Annual Awards Banquet:

The South Carolina Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association held its annual awards banquet Jan. 12 in Camden, with Dogwood Stable President Cot Campbell delivering the keynote speech. During the dinner, SCTOBA President Lee Christian was presented with the Frank Whiteley award recognizing his outstanding service to the organization. Franklin "Goree" Smith was honored with the Othniel Wienges award as the state's top breeder. Smith's homebred filly **Nag Nag Nag** (Just a Miner) was the state's top 3-year-old filly, while Kendrick Wright's **Peter G** (Parker's Storm Cat) was the top older male of 2012. **Cat o'Nine Tails** (Prized), owned by Laurence Stoney, Jr., was the champion older mare for the second year in a row.

NJRC Pushes Development of OTBs:

The New Jersey Racing Commission has taken measures to develop new off-track betting parlors in the state, according to a report on *Daily Racing Form*.

Currently, the rights to operate OTBs are divided amongst the state's racetracks, which have opened just four of a possible 15 OTBs.

"It will no longer be a development right for industry," the Commission's Executive Director Frank Zanzuccki told *DRF*.

In order to kick start the development of the remaining locations, the racing commission will require the tracks to submit plans to open the rest of their respective facilities by June 28. If those facilities are not open and fully licensed by Dec. 31, the rights to run the OTB will be transferred to horsemen's organization at the respective track. Should the horsemen fail to open the OTBs by the end of 2014, the rights will be auctioned to private companies. Monmouth Park, which is currently leased by the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, would receive a six-month extension after the Dec. 31 deadline.
