A 'WISE' CHOICE FOR HORSE OF THE YEAR

Following a wildly successful 2012 campaign which saw him set two track records, win three Grade I races and record six consecutive triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures, Morton Fink's homebred gelding **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry--Lisa Danielle, by Wolf Power {SAF}) was named America's Horse of the Year for 2012 at Saturday night's Eclipse Awards ceremony at

Gulfstream Park. "It's a good thing I have something to hold on to. What can I say?" deadpanned Fink, as he took the stage for the third time, having previously accepted the Eclipse for older male and champion turf male. "When you get to be my age, you need something

to get up in the morning for and look forward to. This horse has made me so happy I can't even express it in words." Brilliantly managed and brought along by trainer Charles Lopresti, Wise Dan posted a Beyer Speed Figure of 117 in winning the GIII Ben Ali S. over the Keeneland Polytrack in April and won the GI Woodbine Mile and GI Shadwell Turf Mile ahead of his sensational score in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita. Wise Dan is back at work at Keeneland and is being readied for a 6-year-old campaign in 2013. Wise Dan also took down top honors as champion older male and champion turf horse, the first to sweep all three categories since John Henry in 1981. He is the first homebred horse of the year since Ghostzapper in 2004. *The TDN's Special Eclipse Edition appears after Headline News*

It has been 13 years since trainer D. Wayne Lukas won the most recent of his four Kentucky Derbies with Charismatic (Summer Squall). Owner Brad Kelley has invested hard in several facets of the Thoroughbred business and has entrusted the bulk of his holdings with the Hall of Fame trainer. Just two months ago, Kelley, who races as Bluegrass Hall, and Lukas landed the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint with Hightail (Mineshaft), but in the form of **Oxbow** (Awesome Again), the duo could possess a legitimate threat for the 2013 Triple Crown following a thoroughly dominating victory in the GIII Lecomte S. at the Fair Grounds. *Cont. p5*

Palos Verdes S. cont.

Acquired privately out of a victory for maiden \$20,000 claiming at Delta Downs in late 2010, Sahara Sky won just once from six starts at age three, but kicked off 2012 with a 4 1/4-length allowance victory at this venue last January. The dark bay proceeded to round out the exacta in allowance heats Feb. 26 and Mar. 22 in Arcadia, then returned from a two-month freshening to annex a Cushion Track heat going seven furlongs at Hollywood Park May 19. He had just one appearance since, a fourth--placed third--behind Capital Account (Closing Argument) at Hollypark June 22 where he clipped heels early and found himself a distant last before making some late headway.

Comma to the Top (Bwana Charlie) won the break here and showed the way from the fleet GI Malibu S. runner-up Private Zone through an opening quarter mile in :21.50 as Sahara Sky and Joe Talamo drifted back to near the tail of the field. The eventual winner caught the eye and had improved to midpack around the turn, while the two front-runners were still doing their thing on the engine and had posted a half-mile split in a wicked :43.61. Sahara Sky was now just finding his best stride and was steered to the outside of Justin Phillip in upper stretch as he took aim on the leaders. Private Zone put Comma to the Top away, but was showing some signs of distress, and though he put up a gallant fight down on the inside, was forced to settle for the place spot yet again and watched Sahara Sky fly by.

"A fresh horse will break a lot better and maybe lay a lot closer," said winning trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, who owns the 5-year-old in partnership with Barretts' Kim Lloyd's Sweetwater Stable. "In the past when you have to move this horse, you have to make him move. But he kind of halfway moved himself today and [jockey] Joe [Talamo] didn't have to prompt him too much.

"We both thought that the two speed horses would hook up and maybe make a good pace for us. That's the key to winning a race like this. We had to have a little pace in front of us for that particular kind of horse, so we got lucky today and he came through for us."

Lecomte S. cont.

By a Breeders' Cup Classic winner and out of a full-sister to dual Breeders' Cup Classic hero Tiznow, Oxbow was purchased for \$250,000 as a Keeneland September yearling, but didn't have the most auspicious debut when he was pulled up and vanned off at Saratoga Aug. 3. A distant fourth in a seven-furlong Keeneland maiden Oct. 18, he returned on 13 days' rest to finish third to Gulfport (Unbridled's Song) in a Churchill test, then put it all together next time out, scoring by 4 3/4-front-running lengths Nov. 25 beneath the Twin Spires. Ambitiously spotted in the GI CashCall Futurity for his two-turn debut, Oxbow raced wide on both turns but finished a creditable fourth. He did his training for this at his Oaklawn base and could well have remained there for Monday's Smarty Jones S., but shipped to the Big Easy for this richer purse and walked away a winner.

Soon in front for Jon Court, Oxbow set an even pace while under moderate pressure from his outside. He cruised along going well on the turn and responded when set down for the drive. He immediately had several lengths on his rivals and showed a solid turn of foot to win by an imposing margin.

"I actually thought I'd be one-two-three, but Wayne said don't be surprised if you find yourself on the lead," said Court. "He said to be relaxed and he wanted to see him happy with a smile on in the bit and he can win this race, and that's exactly how it turned out."

Florida Sunshine Millions Classic cont.

What was supposed to be a two-horse race and a rematch of this event in 2012 turned into a one-horse affair, as Ron the Greek stormed home an easy winner, while Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) stopped abruptly after six furlongs and was eased home.

Victorious in the GI Santa Anita H. last March, Ron the Greek was runner-up in the GI Oaklawn H. Apr. 14, then handed HOY Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) a head defeat in the GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill June 16. Second to subsequent GI BC Classic hero Fort Larned (E Dubai) in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 4, the towering bay was an even sixth behind stablemate Flat Out (Flatter) in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 29 and was most recently fourth, with Mucho Macho Man second, in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 3.

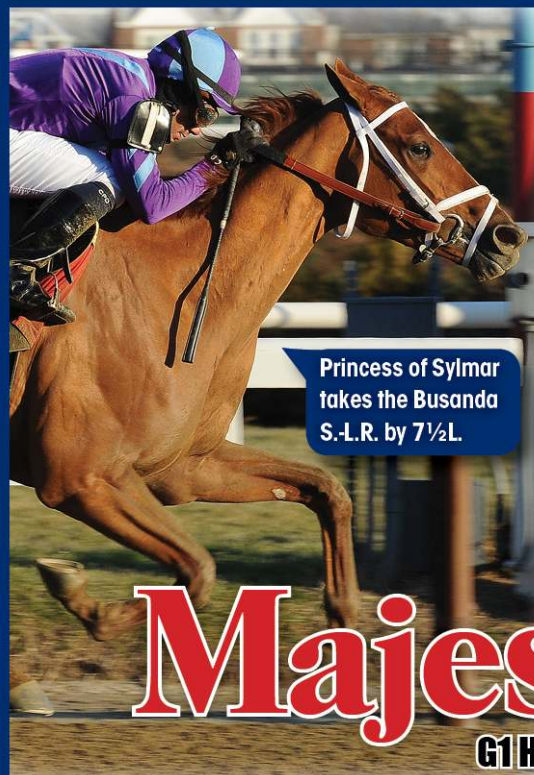
Ron the Greek was ridden more positively here and hugged the fence, while Mucho Macho Man was floated wide into the first turn and stalked three wide, but apparently comfortably, down the backstretch. Mucho Macho Man made his move on the turn and looked on his way, but called it a day soon after. Meanwhile, Ron the Greek was gobbling up the ground with a vengeance, took command and won off.

"It was a good set-up," said winning trainer Bill Mott. "He was a little closer than he normally is. We had asked [jockey Jose Lezcano], if he could, to try to be a little closer. I didn't expect him to be that close."

As for the beaten favorite, trainer Kathy Ritvo said, "I can't find anything wrong with him. I think he didn't like the track."

Successful Song has compiled a productive resume racing between Florida and New Jersey the past four years, capturing four stakes and placing in an additional eight. She won the Lighthouse S. at Monmouth June 30 before finishing second in the GII Molly Pitcher S. over that strip July 29. She strung together two subsequent third place efforts--the Lady's Secret S. at Monmouth Sept. 3, and the Elmer Heubeck Distaff H. at Calder Nov. 10. She returned to the winner's circle in her most recent effort, the Ocala S., over this strip Dec. 30, and the form of that race was franked earlier on the card when its second place finisher, Golden Mystery (Awesome Again) ran away with the Sunshine Millions Filly & Mare Sprint S. by 5 1/4 lengths. Golden Mystery, a stalwart in South Florida stakes company throughout her career, had not won for 15 months heading into today's event. She finished seventh, beaten 5 1/4 lengths, behind Musical Romance (Concorde's Tune) in the GI Princess Rooney H. at Calder July 7, and nearly upended the champion sprinter next out in the Mike Sherman Memorial S. over that strip Oct. 6, missing by three-quarters of a length after setting the pace. After a fourth-place effort in the Jack Dudley Sprint H. Nov. 10, Golden Mystery finished second to Dust and Diamonds (Vindication) in Gulfstream's GIII Sugar Swirl S. Dec. 8, and was most recently second, beaten a half-length, when stretched out to a mile for the Ocala S. Dec. 30. Sitting just off a hot early pace here, Golden Mystery moved up the rail to take the lead at the quarter pole. She lengthened her advantage under moderate urging in the lane. Trainer Marty Wolfson noted that this was the last race for Golden Mystery. "She's retiring and will be sold [at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Mixed Sale Feb. 11]," he said. "I thought coming off that mile [in the Ocala S.], I knew she'd have the stamina. When they were going head-and-head, I knew she'd finish strong. I didn't know she'd win off by six, but I knew she'd finish strong."

Regalo Mia kicked off her sophomore campaign last year with a third place effort in the Florida Oaks at Tampa Bay Downs, where she was beaten just a neck by Dixie Strike (Dixie Union). She was beaten the same margin next out when second to Dayatthespa (City Zip) in the GIII Herecomesthebride S. at Gulfstream Mar. 11, and she went on to hit the board in graded stakes in her two subsequent starts, finishing third to Dayatthespa in the GIII Appalachian S. at Keeneland, and second by a nose to Better Lucky (Ghostzapper) in the GII Sands Point S. at Belmont. Third when dropped back in class in the Banner Gala S. at Belmont Oct. 27, Regalo Mia wrapped up the year when the only off-the-board finish of her career, finishing ninth in the GII Mrs. Revere S. at Churchill Nov. 17. Dropping out to travel near the back of the pack for her seasonal debut here, Regalo Mia chased soft early fractions before circling her rivals rounding the turn. Four-wide and fourth at the top of the stretch, she ran down the leaders inside the final furlong to win going away. "There was never any questions that we had a good filly since she came to us as a 2-year-old," said trainer Michelle Nihei. "Her only bad race was the Mrs. Revere at Churchill. It just wasn't her day. It was at night in the freezing cold, raining, and the ground was slippery on top. Other than that she has run her race every time. I've always thought she would like a distance, and a three-turn race is the obvious next step."

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

FIFTY WAYS TO WIN THE LA CANADA

Jerry Hollendorfer and George Todaro's **Lady of Fifty** (After Market) looms as strictly the one to beat in today's GII La Canada S., the lone graded-stakes race in the country restricted to 4-year-old fillies. A two-time black-type winner at two, the grey filly romped in the California Oaks in early 2012, but went on a four-race skid thereafter. She snapped the streak with a half-length upset trying a dirt route for the first time in the Nov. 1 Palm Springs H. and validated that effort with a 3 1/4-length success over **Open Water** (Include) last time out in the GII Bayakoa S. at Hollywood Park Dec. 8. **Book Review** (Giant's Causeway) figures the chief market rival exiting her victory--albeit a moderately rated one--in the GI La Brea S. Dec. 26. However, despite some success at sprint distances, her form going long is more spotty. She was able to record a big figure in winning Belmont's restricted Imperial Gesture S. by 4 1/2 lengths Oct. 24, but she was free of excuses when fifth to Dance Card (Tapit) at 9-5 in the GI Gazelle S. at Aqueduct Nov. 24. **More Chocolate** (Malibu Moon) switches to the dirt for the first time in her career. Though her female family screams turf--she is a daughter of MGSW Little Treasure (Fr) (Night Shift)--and a last-out third in the grassy GIII Bobby Frankel S. Dec. 30, she is a candidate to take to dirt racing, and if her recent six-furlong bullet over this main track is any indication, an upset could be in the making.

ROUND FOUR IN STEWARDS' CUP

Ambitious Dragon (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) and **Glorious Days (Aus)** (Hussonet) meet for the fourth consecutive time this racing season in today's HK\$8-million (\$1,031,972) Stewards' Cup at Sha Tin. The reigning Horse of the Year in Hong Kong, Ambitious Dragon currently holds a 2-1 advantage in their head-to-head battles, including a turn-the-tables victory over Glorious Days in the G1 Hong Kong Mile Dec. 9. Since then, trainer Tony Millard has kept the 6-year-old in steady training with an eye on a title defense in this event and is pleased with the gelding's condition coming into the race. "We've kept him in steady work, as we've always had an eye on this race and I'm happy with him," the South African stated. "With the focus being on the International Races in December, you tend to think this race is further away than it is but it's here very quickly-- but it's the same for all of them." Glorious Days added blinkers and, though getting weight from his archrival, beat him on the square in the G2 Jockey Club Mile Nov. 18, but couldn't outquick the Dragon on International Day. **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}) cuts back to the mile after registering a second consecutive victory in the G1 Hong Kong Cup and, while good enough on his day to beat top milers, will be using this as a springboard to next month's Hong Kong Gold Cup at his preferred 2000-meter distance.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Pender Thinking Big Cap for Jeranimo...

Jeranimo (Congaree), winner of the GII San Gabriel S. at Santa Anita Jan. 13, has experienced his share of success in graded stakes in Southern California over the past three years. According to trainer Mike Pender, however, there is one thing missing from the 7-year-old's resume: a graded stakes victory on the dirt. The B.J. Wright colorbearer has never run on that surface, but he could get his chance in the Mar. 2 GI Santa Anita H.

"We'd like to support the Santa Anita program and keep Jeranimo here at all costs," Pender said. "The only thing not on Jeranimo's resume is a start on dirt, so he has yet to win there. He has won on synthetic and turf. He could wind up in the Big Cap. If he wins a race of that magnitude, what else would he have to prove?"

Jeranimo is a graded stakes winner on both turf and synthetic surfaces, and he recorded a career best in last year's GI Shoemaker Mile on the Betfair Hollywood Park lawn. He contested the Santa Anita H. on the all-weather surface in 2010, finishing fourth.

The 42nd Annual Eclipse Awards

TOTAL ECLIPSE AT GULFSTREAM

Gulfstream Park pulled out all the stops Saturday night as it played host to the Eclipse Awards for the first time in the event's 42nd renewal. Traditionally held on a Monday, this year's ceremony was moved to Saturday and followed Gulfstream's popular Florida Sunshine Millions raceday, resulting in a sold out show.

HRTV's Christina Olivares manned this year's red carpet show conducted prior to the ceremony and the event itself was staged in the oval's Sport of Kings dining room, which was replete with flowing draperies and colorful lighting, offering an ethereal effect.

Among the winning connections spotted at the event last night were Darley America's Jimmy Bell, who, representing Sheikh Mohammed, was kept busy picking up trophies for champion breeder, champion owner and and champion 3-year-old filly for **Questing (GB)** (Hard Spun). Also on hand were Starlight Racing's Jack and Laurie Wolf and Coolmore's Charlie O'Connor and Dermot Ryan, who were seated at adjacent tables, and teamed up with champion juvenile **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday); while George Bolton and John Moynihan, were there representing 3-year-old filly finalist **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike). Gulfstream head Frank Stronach, among the nominees for outstanding breeder, was sitting front and center, while Ben Leon was able to garner his first statuette with \$8.5-million acquisition **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker).

Among early highlights of the evening, and a continuing theme throughout the ceremony, was a tribute by jockey Jerry Bailey to Eclipse champion jockey Ramon Dominguez, who was seriously injured in New York Friday. Zayat Stable's **Paynter** (Awesome Again), who faced a life-and-death battle with colitis and laminitis in 2012, was honored with the "Moment of the Year" award after overcoming illness and appearing poised to return to training.

On hand to accept an Award of Merit, was Nick Nicholson, who has served in the horse industry over the past 30 years, including his tenure as Keeneland president, a post from which he retired last fall.

Martin Schwartz, the owner of female turf champion **Zagora (Fr)** (Green Tune), provided perhaps one of the most entertaining moments of the evening. In an homage to the poet E.E. Cummings, the New Yorker delivered a clipped, yet comedic acceptance speech which received the biggest laughs of the night.

Generally a segment with little fanfare, the speech offered by *DRF* handicapping champ Michael Beychock struck a chord with the crowd, after it was learned that he used his winnings to claim and retire the horse that saw him eke out a \$1 score in the 2012 renewal of the event. Additionally, he announced that he will donate 10% of all subsequent winnings to Thoroughbred

aftercare and urged others to make the same commitment.

The early favorite to garner the Horse of the Year title for the 2012 racing season, Mort Fink's **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) swept the evening by also bagging divisional titles as champion older horse and turf horse. By the time the winning connections made their final trek to the stage to receive racing's highest honors, they were visibly moved and seemingly a little surprised to land three of the night's biggest prizes.

Earning the most exuberant crowd response of the evening was the announcement of Dale Romans as outstanding trainer. Facing training titans Todd Pletcher and Bob Baffert for year-end bragging rights, and after having been shut out of divisional titles with **Shackleford** (Forestry) (Sprinter) and **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) (Turf), Romans proved to be the crowd choice and was greeted by enthusiastic applause and cheers following the announcement. Visibly moved during his acceptance speech, Romans opened up his speech underscoring a quote from Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens. "Good horses and good owners make good trainers," he said. And after thanking all of those who were instrumental in helping him earn his first training title, he signed off to even greater applause, "No matter what the *New York Times* says, this is still the greatest sport in America."

Morton Fink's homebred Wise Dan put together a season for the ages and became the first turf horse to be named Horse of the Year since Kotashaan (Fr) in 1993. The chestnut outpointed would-be Triple Crown winner I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) and GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Fort Larned (E Dubai) to land the golden statuette for the night's top award and was also voted champion turf male over a gallant Little Mike (Spanish Steps) and Phipps Stable's consistent Point of Entry (Dynaformer).

Carefully managed through his 5-year-old campaign by Charlie Lopresti, Wise Dan suffered just one defeat during the season, coming up a nose short to GI Santa Anita H. hero Ron the Greek in the GI Stephen Foster H., his lone appearance on the main track in 2012. Phenomenal as he was in winning arguably the three best mile races on turf in North America, Wise Dan was at his brilliant best when setting a Keeneland track record for nine furlongs of 1:46.63 when winning the GIII Ben Ali S. by 10 1/2 lengths in his first start of the year. He bookended his championship run with another course-record setting performance in the Breeders' Cup Mile, covering the distance in 1:31.78.

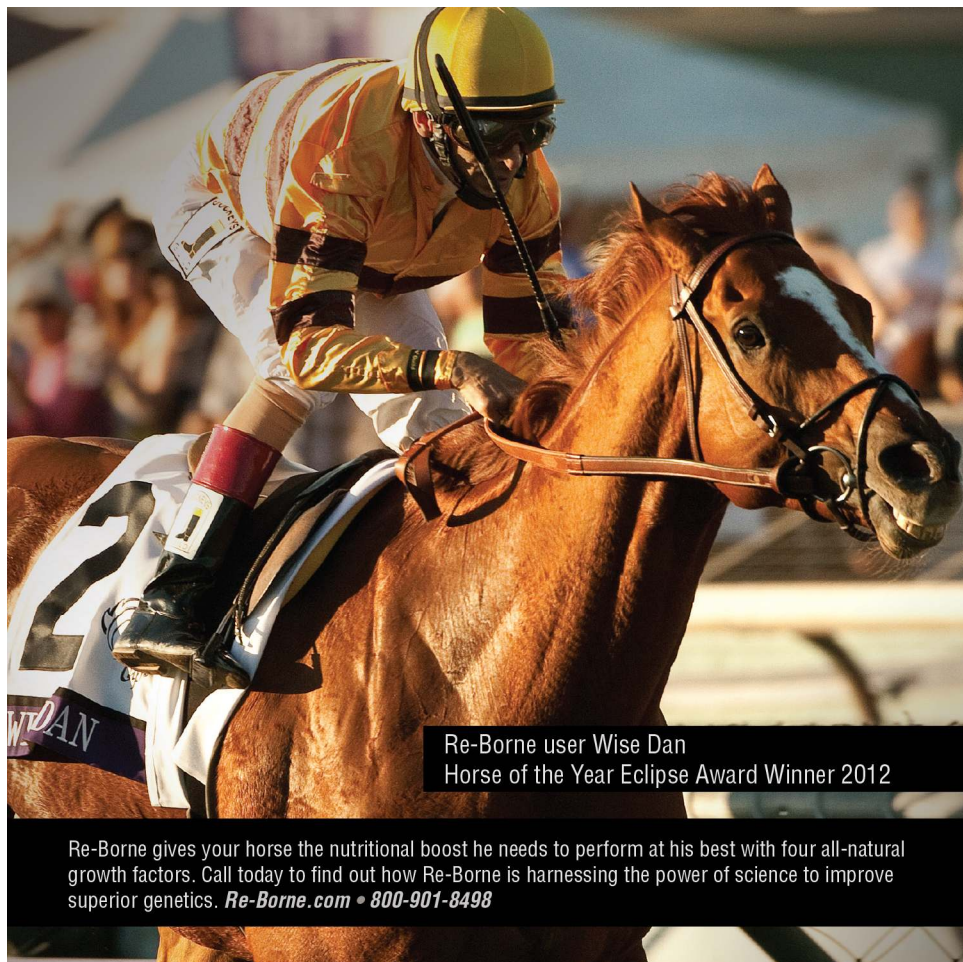

Shanghai Bobby's gritty victory over He's Had Enough (Tapit) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile capped an unbeaten campaign and solidified the dark bay colt's position at the top of the 2-year-old division.

The champion runs in the colors of Starlight Racing, which also campaigned his sire, Harlan's Holiday. Team Coolmore got on board for the championship run when it purchased a half-interest in the youngster in October. By then, Shanghai Bobby already had wins in the GII Three Chimneys Hopeful S. and GI Champagne S. to his credit.

Shanghai Bobby is the first champion bred by the relatively new Stonehaven Steadings of Jeff and Chiquita Reddoch. He is the first foal out of Steelin' (Orientate) and was purchased by the Reddochs in utero for \$155,000 out of the 2009 Keeneland November sale.

The newly crowned champion is expected to make his sophomore debut in the Jan. 26 Gill Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Park.

Beholder came up a nose short of one-time divisional leader Executiveprivilege (First Samurai) in the GI Del Mar Debutante in September, but cemented herself firmly at the top of the juvenile filly ranks with a smashing front-running tally over that foe in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies. The bay’s most impressive performance probably came in between the Debutante and Breeders’ Cup, however, when she annexed a Santa Anita allowance by 11 lengths, earning a gaudy 108 Beyer Speed Figure.

Beholder becomes the second champion campaigned by B. Wayne Hughes, whose colors were carried by 2003 champion 2-year-old colt Action This Day (Kris S.). She is a half-sister to Hughes’s Into Mischief (Harlan’s Holiday), hero of the 2007 GI CashCall Futurity and sire of current standouts Vyjack and Goldencents.

Both Action This Day and Into Mischief were conditioned by Hall of Famer Richard Mandella, who also trained champion 2-year-old fillies Halfbridled (2003) and Phone Chatter (1993).

Beholder is the first Eclipse champion bred by Nancy and Fred Mitchell and Marty Buckner’s Clarkland Farm. Clarkland purchased stakes winner Leslie’s Lady for \$100,000 in foal to Orientate at the 2006 Keeneland November Sale. Beholder has a 2-year-old half-sister by Curlin that Juddmonte Farms purchased for \$300,000 at the 2012 Keeneland September sale.

I'll Have Another kicked off his sophomore campaign with a victory in the GI Robert B. Lewis S., and stamped himself as a serious Triple Crown contender with a gritty nose victory over favored Creative Cause in the GI Santa Anita Derby. Largely dismissed at 15-1 against a solid field of sophomores on the first Saturday in May, I'll Have Another chased the blitzing Bodemeister through rapid early fractions, moved three wide at the top of the stretch and wore down Bodemeister inside the final furlong for a 1 1/2-length victory under relatively unknown jockey Mario Gutierrez.

I'll Have Another provided the first Derby victory for his connections, but many believed Bodemeister--the victim of a torrid pace in the Derby--was still the superior horse, and I'll Have Another was sent off the 3-1 second choice behind that rival in the Preakness.

However, the scrappy chestnut would not be denied, once again sweeping past Bodemeister in the closing stages of the race. So it was on to the GI Belmont S. for Team I'll Have Another, which would look to complete the first Triple Crown sweep in 34 years. The dream was dashed, however, as the colt was found to have tendonitis in his left foreleg the day before the race. I'll Have Another was scratched from the Belmont and retired. He is set to take up stud duties this year at Big Red Farm in Japan, where he will stand for ¥3,200,000 (US\$38,900).

I'll Have Another's dam Arch's Gal Edith, in foal to Gio Ponti, RNA'd for \$950,000 at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton November sale.

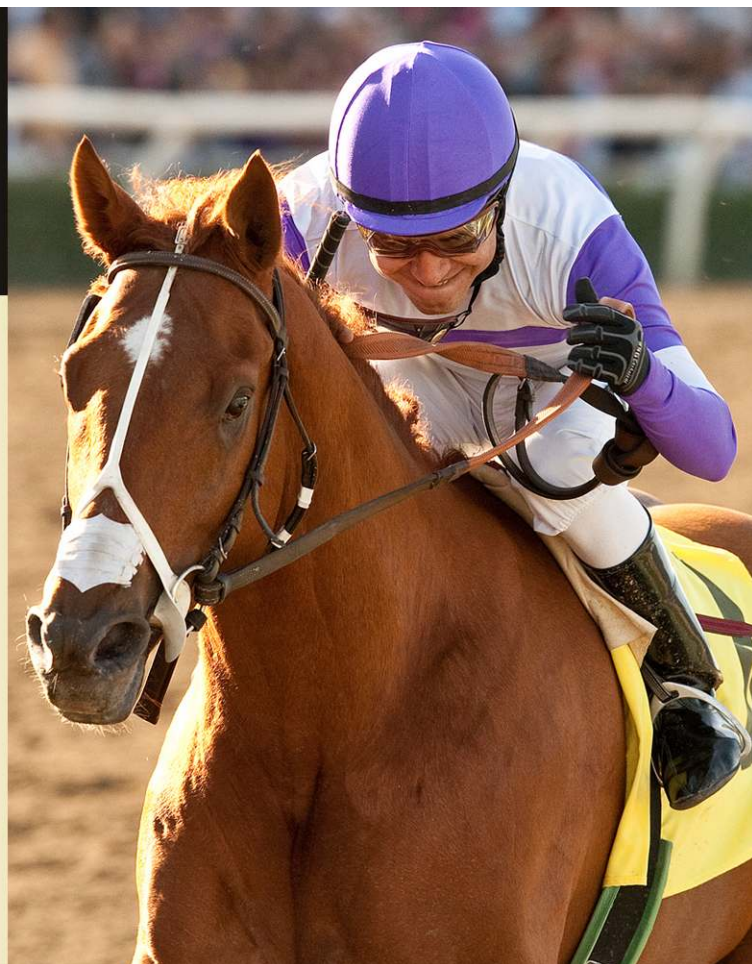

Twice Group 3-placed for trainer John Gosden in England in 2011, Questing stepped up her game to another level on the dirt in 2012. After two off-the-board tries on the sod for new trainer Kiaran McLaughlin to begin her sophomore season, the British-bred tried dirt for the first time since a fifth-place run in the previous season's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, promptly scoring by 3 3/4 lengths from eventual GI La Brea S. winner Book Review (Giant's Causeway) in a one-mile Belmont allowance June 24.

She proved that effort was no fluke when taking the GI Coaching Club American Oaks at the Spa by 4 1/4 lengths despite drifting out badly in the lane, and put on a head-turning display of speed and stamina the following month when she blew open the GI Alabama by nine lengths.

The bay earned a gaudy 109 Beyer Speed Figure for that effort despite more antics in the stretch. Beaten a head by fellow Eclipse finalist My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike) over a quirky surface in Parx's GI Cotillion S. Sept. 22, Questing never factored in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, and was discovered to have a contusion to her left eye. She later underwent surgery to have a chip removed from a hind ankle, and is expected to remain in training in 2013.

Questing becomes the eighth Eclipse Award winner campaigned by one of Sheikh Mohammed's operations. Godolphin and Darley prevailed in Saturday night's awards as leading owner and breeder, respectively. Sheikh Mohammed also received a Special Eclipse Award in 2002. Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin has conditioned two previous Eclipse winners: Invador (Arg), Horse of the Year and champion older male in 2006; and Lahudood (GB), champion turf mare in 2007. Both carried the colors of Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Stable.

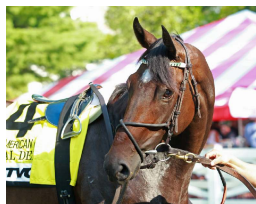

In earning her second Eclipse Award, Royal Delta becomes just the fifth filly in history to sweep year-end honors for champion 3-year-old filly and champion older mare the following season. The strapping bay, purchased by Ben Leon's Besilu Stables for \$8.5 million at the 2011 Keeneland November sale, opened her 2012 account with a second-place effort in the GII Sabin S. prior to an unplaced effort in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March. She returned to the U.S. with flair in June, taking the GII Fleur de Lis H. by a sparkling eight lengths, and doubled up in the GII Delaware H. five weeks later.

After missing by a nose in the GI Personal Ensign H. at Saratoga, Royal Delta came roaring back in the GI Beldame, winning by 9 1/2 lengths under wraps. That effort sent the reigning champion to Santa Anita as the favorite for the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic for the second year running, and, once again, Royal Delta would not be denied. Leading every step of the way, she set swift fractions before digging in deep to turn back the previously undefeated champion My Miss Aurelia, winner of the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

The elegant filly became the 11th horse in history to win two Breeders' Cup race, and the first to do so in the Ladies' Classic (nee Distaff) since Bayakoa paired up wins in 1989-90.

Royal Delta is wintering with Mott at Payson Park in Florida. She has turned in two published works since the start of the year. Like last year, the 5-year-old is targeting the Sabin and the Dubai World Cup to begin her year.

The ever-consistent Zagora showed no signs of slowing down as a 5-year-old in 2012--in fact, she recorded a career-best season, winning five graded stakes from eight starts and capping the year with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf.

Zagora kicked off the year with a pair of Grade III victories at Tampa Bay Downs--the Endeavor S. and Hillsborough S. She suffered her only off-the-board finish of the year in the GI Jenny Wiley S. at Keeneland in April, before bouncing back to take the GIII Gallorette H. on the Preakness undercard.

Third in Saratoga's GI Diana--a race she won last year--the gutsy chestnut returned to the winner's circle in the Ballston Spa H. a month later.

Sent off at 9-1 in the Breeders' Cup after losing the GI Flower Bowl Invitational by just a nose, Zagora saved ground on the fence early before charging past Grade I winner Marketing Mix (Medaglia d'Oro) to win by 3/4 of a length.

Three days later Zagora was across the country at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale in Kentucky, where she fetched a final bid of \$2.5 million from the French-based Mandore International Agency. She has been retired from racing and is expected to be shipped to Europe to begin her broodmare career.

Groupie Doll took a lead in this division in the spring and continued to build on her advantage en route to an emphatic win. After a promising sophomore season, the chestnut began 2012 against the boys with a narrow second to Boys at Tosconova (Officer) in a one-mile optional claimer at Gulfstream Jan. 27. She incurred two more defeats at the Hallandale Beach oval--finishing third in the GIII Sabin S. and GII Inside Information S.--but went on a roll upon her return to northern climes. Following her victory in the GI Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland Apr. 12, Groupie Doll ran off and hid in the GI Humana Distaff S. at Churchill on the Kentucky Derby undercard. Her 7 1/4-length victory that day resulted in a new track record of 1:20.44 for seven furlongs, and her connections gave her a vacation.

The 4-year-old resumed with a win under the lights in the GII Presque Isle Masters S. Sept. 8 and thumped her rivals in the GII Thoroughbred Club of America on Keeneland's Polytrack Oct. 6. Sent off at 3-5 in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint at Santa Anita Nov. 3, Groupie Doll defied the speed-biased surface to rally on the outside on her way to a brilliant 4 1/2-length victory.

That was slated to be her seasonal finale, but her connections opted to take on the boys in the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 24. A win would have given her an outside chance for Horse of the Year, but just one Eclipse Award statue would have to do following her nose loss to Stay Thirsty (Bernardini).

After front-running wins in the Gill Swale S. and Gill Bay Shore S., Trinniberg was expected to set the pace in the GI Kentucky Derby, but the speedy sophomore ended up chasing Bodemeister (Empire Maker) through heady fractions before fading to 17th. He regained the winning thread when turned back to seven furlongs for the Gill Woody Stephens S., only to lose his way slightly over the summer. Let go at 13-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, Trinniberg proved a determined winner over fellow 3-year-old The Lumber Guy (Grand Slam).

Trinniberg races in the name of Sherry Parbhoo, the daughter of trainer Shivananda Parbhoo and granddaughter of assistant trainer Bisnath Parboo.

The dark bay was the ultimate impulse buy for Shivananda, who stumbled upon the future champion while dropping off supplies at the OBS sales grounds during the 2011 April sales. The Parbhooos have roughly 20 horses in training, eight of whom were transferred to Sherry's ownership last August. The family also campaigned 2011 GI Vosburgh S. winner Giant Ryan (Freud).

Trinniberg's full-sister Ostourah sold for \$450,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale and won her only start to date at Belmont in September. John and Joe Marino's J M Stables, which bred Trinniberg, sold the colt's dam Bella Dorato for \$460,000 to Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton November sale.

Sheikh Mohammed captured his third Eclipse Award as leading owner, following wins with Darley in 2006 and with Godolphin in 2009. The international stable was represented by eight top-level winners in 2012 and the earners of over \$13.4 million, counting earnings from Dubai and from North America. Godolphin won three races on Dubai World Cup night, including the main event with Monterosso (Fr) (Dubawi {Ire}). In the U.S., the stable was led by GI Travers S. winner Alpha (Bernardini), GI Ogden Phipps H. winner It's Tricky (Mineshaft), and GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Alabama S. heroine Questing (GB) (Hard Spun). Questing was also named champion 3-year-old filly during the Eclipse Award ceremonies.

CHAMPION BREEDER DARLEY

Darley, which shared Eclipse Award honors as the nation's leading owner for 2006, took home its first statue as top breeder last night. Sheikh Mohammed's global operation bred nine graded stakes winners of 15 graded races in 2012, led by newly crowned champion 3-year-old filly **Questing (GB)** (Hard Spun). Other Grade I winners last season bred by Darley included Alpha (Bernardini), who dead-heated for the win in the GI Travers S.; **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song), hero of the GI Forego S.; and **Better Lucky** (Ghostzapper), who capped her season with a GI Matriarch S. success.

Darley-bred runners earned \$8,460,884 in 2012 while winning 130 races. Both Questing and Alpha were sired by young Darley stallions. This was the first year since 1999 that saw a different champion breeder other than Adena Springs or Juddmonte Farms.

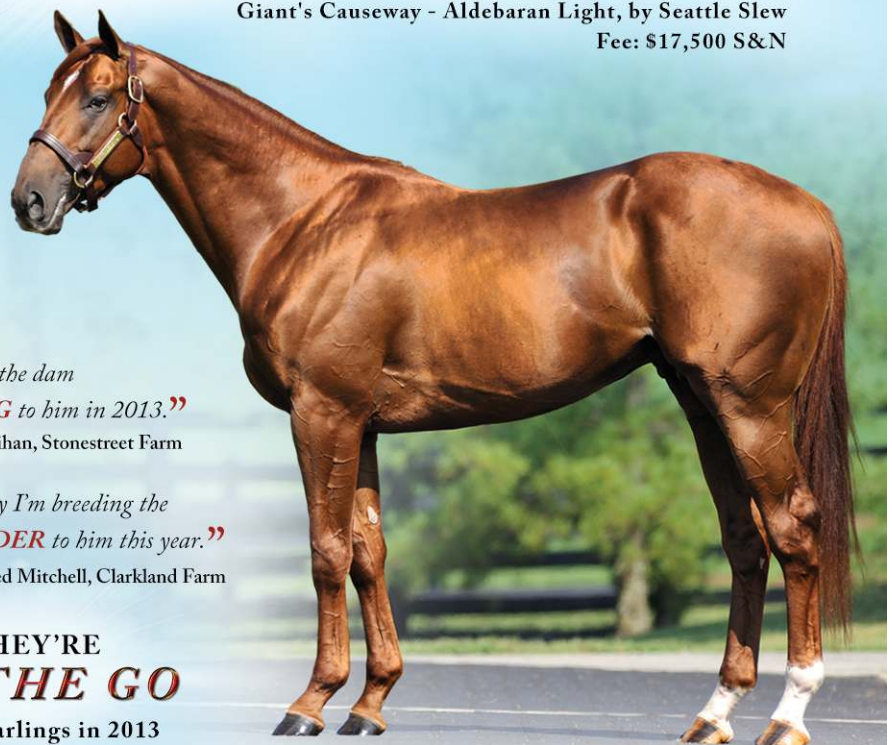

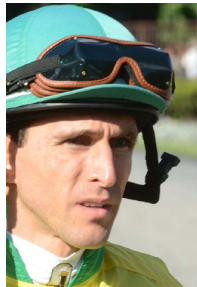

RAMON DOMINGUEZ

Ramon Dominguez collected his third straight Eclipse Award as the nation's leading jockey, but was unable to accept his award in person. The 36-year-old reinsman was hospitalized after sustaining a fractured skull in a spill at Aqueduct Friday, though he is expected to make a full recovery. He was the top earner of 2012, riding the winners of over \$25 million. The Venezuela native won a record 68 races during the Saratoga meet last summer, besting the previous mark of 64 set by John Velazquez in 2004. He also became the first rider to win six races twice on a single card at the prestigious meeting.



Dominguez rode the popular **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) to victories in the GI Arlington Million and GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Also among his 10 Grade I wins last year; **Alpha** (Bernardini) (GI Travers S.); **Dance Card** (Tapit) (GI Gazelle S.); **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini) (GI Cigar Mile H.); **Next Question** (Stormy Atlantic) (GI Nearctic); **Desert Blanc (GB)** (Desert Style {Ire}) (GI Manhattan H.); **Get Stormy** (Stormy Atlantic) (GI Gulfstream Park Turf H.); **Samitar (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) (GI Garden City S.); and **Tapitsfly** (Tapit) (GI Just a Game S.).

ECLIPSE AWARD OF MERIT



NICK NICHOLSON

Nick Nicholson was presented the Eclipse Award of Merit for distinguished leadership and outstanding achievements on behalf of the Thoroughbred industry. The Lexington native served 12 years as president and chief executive officer of Keeneland Association. During his tenure as Keeneland's sixth president, the organization enjoyed record growth as both an auction sales company and as a racetrack. Nicholson also oversaw a series of renovations and innovations.

Prior to his time at Keeneland, Nicholson was executive vice president and executive director of The Jockey Club. He was also the first chief operating officer of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association and served as executive vice president of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association/Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders.

Nicholson has also served on numerous boards and racing organizations, including periods as chairman of both Equibase and the American Horse Council. Nicholson has also been a director of the Kentucky Horse Park, director of the University of Kentucky Equine Research Center, past president of the Thoroughbred Club of America and vice chairman of the International Catalog Standards Committee. He received The Jockey Club Gold Medal in 2004.

Prior to his career in racing, Nicholson was a staff member of the Democratic National Committee from 1975 to 1977, and he served as executive assistant to Kentucky Senator Wendell Ford from 1977 to 1981.

Presenting the Award...

"He is determined to solve the problem: How do we wake up the rest of the world to how wonderful this sport truly is? I've watched him handle the most complex issues that this sport has and he is able to come to an informed decision, basically, just by asking the question, 'What is best for the horses? 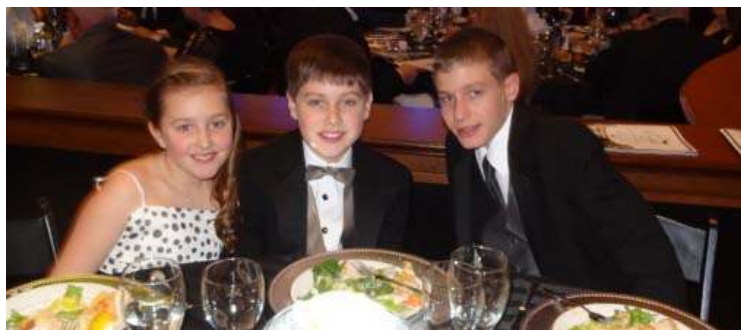

DOMINGUEZ SUFFERS SKULL FRACTURE

Jockey Ramon Dominguez, who yesterday was crowned Eclipse champion jockey of 2012, was diagnosed with a skull fracture following a spill in the seventh race at Aqueduct Friday. The 36-year-old rider was transported to Jamaica Hospital Medical Center after his mount, 4-5 favorite Convocation (Pulpit), fell after clipping heels with eventual winner Sovereign Default (Northern Afleet).

"I just got off the phone with [Ramon's wife] Sharon Dominguez, and he's doing better this morning," said Steve Rushing, Dominguez's agent, Saturday.

"It's a slightly displaced skull fracture, and he's going to have more tests today, but the doctors are optimistic he'll make a full recovery."

Convocation, trained by Todd Pletcher for Repole Stables, did not appear to be seriously injured and was walked off the track. The 7-year-old gelding was claimed from the race by trainer David Jacobson.

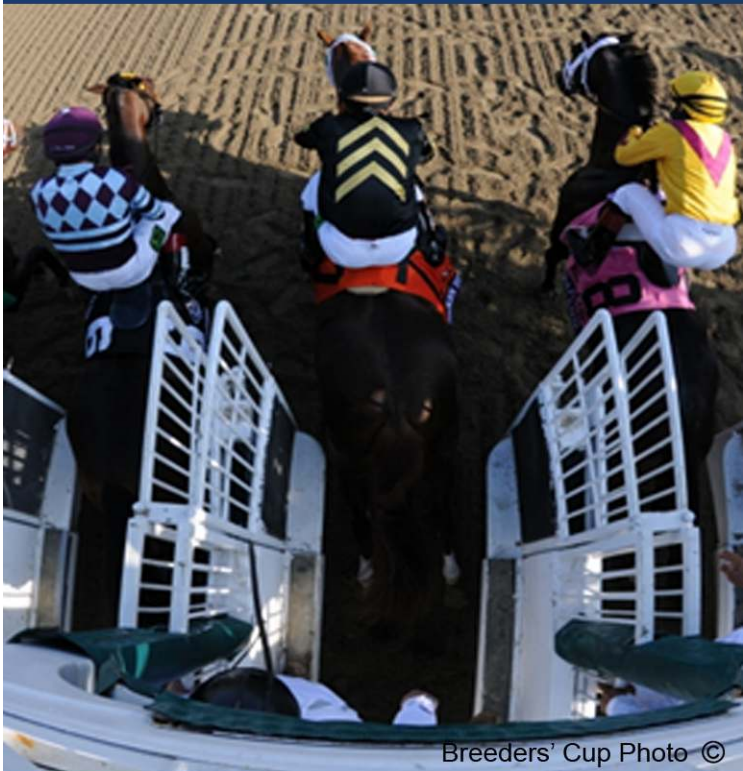
