SWEET VICTORY FOR MORE CHOCOLATE

Michael Talla's **More Chocolate** (Malibu Moon), making her first start on dirt in Sunday's GII La Canada S. at Santa Anita, came away with an emphatic 1 3/4-length victory. The 4-year-old filly chased pacesetter **Willa B Awesome** (Awesome Gambler) through an opening half in :48.03. She took over as that 11-1 outsider began to falter midway on the turn and quickly opened a clear lead. The 5-1 shot was challenged by **Book Review** (Giant's Causeway) at midstretch, but drew off again late for her first graded stakes tally.

BEHOLDER RETURNS

Newly crowned champion **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) will kick off her sophomore campaign in Monday's GII Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita. The Spendthrift Farm colorbearer, the only stakes winner in the field, has been off since cementing her championship title with a front-running victory in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Looking to upset the 3-5 favorite is Michael House's **Dawn's Charm** (Hard Spun). The gray filly is coming off a 10 3/4-length maiden-breaking romp at today's 6 1/2-furlong distance at Betfair Hollywood Park Dec. 14. "She's working good and she really improved a lot in her last race," said jockey Edwin Maldonado.

Dawn's Charm graduated in front-running fashion in her third start. "The key with her is to be in front," Maldonado continued. "She never was in front before." Asked how his mount was coming into her graded stakes debut, Maldonado said, "I was on for a couple of her works here and she went well. They were maintenance works, but she's ready for the race." Cicero Farms' **Blushing Angel** (Macho Uno) closed to just get her head in front for a maiden victory at Santa Anita last time out Dec. 30. **Renee's Titan** (Bernstein), second in Hollywood's Sharp Cat S. and sixth in the Dec. 8 GI Hollywood Starlet, and **Switch to the Lead** (Songandaprayer), third in the GIII Sorrento S. and second in the Nov. 3 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Filly Sprint Preview S., are the only other stakes performers in the eight-horse field. **Full field p4**





Sweet Victory for More Chocolate (cont. from p1)

More Chocolate graduated in her second trip to the post over the Betfair Hollywood Park turf course last July. She added a Nov. 1 Santa Anita allowance two starts later and briefly led in the stretch of the Dec. 30 GIII Robert J Frankel S. before finishing third behind Qaraaba (GB) (Shamardal).

"We wanted to try her on the dirt," winning trainer John Sadler said of the surface change. "It's the last chance to run her with her own age group, that was the nice thing about it, the 4-year-old series. This race looked like it was coming up a good spot with a small field." As for what is next for More Chocolate, Sadler added, "We're going to look at the [Mar. 16 GI] Santa Margarita, that's for sure."

Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer was mystified by the dull fourth-place effort of favored **Lady of Fifty** (After Market). "I was very surprised at how she ran," Hollendorfer said.

Michael Talla, a native of Arizona who used to ride rodeo races, was a founder of the high-end fitness club The Sports Club Company. He has owned racehorses since 2005 and campaigned 2010 GI Santa Anita Oaks winner Crisp (El Corredor).

Up Hill Stable's **Clearly Now** (Horse Greeley) has joined the list of contenders for the Jan. 26 GIII Holy Bull S. after working four furlongs in :48.11 at Palm Meadows Saturday. The dark bay colt opened his career with back-to-back wins sprinting six furlongs at Woodbine last fall and was a well-beaten third when stretching out to 1 1/16 miles for the Dec. 1 Display S. "He showed ability from the start with his first two wins," trainer Brian Lynch reported Sunday morning. "I might have had him a little too fresh for his first start going a distance in the Display, but I think I learned a little bit about him that will help this time. This is the time of year [for a 3-year-old], you want to see what you have."

Shanghai Bobby Tunes Up

The morning after officially being named 2012 Eclipse Champion juvenile, Starlight Racing, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday) tuned up for the Holy Bull with a five-furlong drill at Palm Meadows Sunday in 1:00.88. "It went great," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "It looks like everything's on schedule." Shanghai Bobby worked in company with Verrazano (More Than Ready), tabbed a **"TDN Rising Star"** after his 7 3/4-length debut victory at Gulfstream Jan. 1. "They went head and head and finished evenly," Pletcher added. "It was a nice work for both of them."

Also working for the Holy Bull yesterday at Palm Meadows, GII Sanford S. winner **Bern Identity** (Bernstein) turned in a bullet five-furlong drill in :59.33 for George and Lori Hall and trainer Kelly Breen.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Good Ba Ba Fourth As Comeback Continues...

Former Hong Kong Horse of the Year and three-time G1 Hong Kong Mile hero **Good Ba Ba** (Lear Fan) continued his comeback Saturday at Flemington, finishing a solid fourth in the Listed Kensington S. up the 1000-meter straight course. A bit rank early, he was switched outside approaching the final quarter mile and came home in a race-best :11.19 seconds for the final 200 meters at a trip well short of his best. Plans call for the 11-year-old to make his next start in the G3 Carlyon Cup over the metric mile at Caulfield Feb. 9 with his main objective, and possibly his final career start, in the G1 Doncaster Mile Apr. 20. Good Ba Ba originally came out of retirement and was sent to Gary Moore in Macau before being turned over to trainer Rick Hore-Lacy. He made his return to action in the G3 Standish H. Jan. 1, running on well to finish fourth.

Hay List Could Return in Newmarket...

Hay List (Aus) (Statue of Liberty), the world's second-highest rated sprinter of 2012 behind Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), could make his first start since March in the G1 Newmarket H. at Flemington in Melbourne Mar. 9, trainer John McNair told Racing Victoria.

"I had originally only been thinking about the [G1] Lightning S. [at Flemington Feb. 16], but with that three-week gap between the Lightning and the Newmarket, although it doesn't sound like much, it really gives us that extra time to get him fit," McNair told Racing Victoria. "He's on schedule. He will have at least one, if not two, trials before he runs and we'll just see how the next five or six weeks go and what the field is like, and then we'll work it out from there."

Hay List won last year's Newmarket while carrying 128 pounds, the highest weight carried to victory in the race for more than 50 years. The 7-year-old gelding, who has been plagued with injuries and misfortunes throughout his career, has not raced since finishing second in the G1 William Reid S. at Moonee Valley Mar. 23. He suffered a knee injury while coming out of anaesthesia from emergency colic surgery in April.

Majestic Hussar Eyes Graded Stakes Start...

Joseph Witek's homebred **Majestic Hussar** (Majestic Warrior), who was a 2 1/4-length allowance winner over seven furlongs at Gulfstream Park Saturday [\(video\)](#), will likely make his next start in a graded stakes event, according to trainer Eddie Kenneally. "He'll run in a graded stakes somewhere," Kenneally said. "We're not sure which one yet. We'd like to stretch him out." Majestic Hussar, a first-out winner at Saratoga in August, was seventh behind Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) in the GII Three Chimneys Hopeful S. and was coming off a runner-up effort in a Dec. 15 6 1/2-furlong optional claimer at Gulfstream. Of his three-month freshening after the Hopeful, Kenneally added, "He was immature. We wanted to give him a break. He ran poorly in the Hopeful. I don't think he was ready for that caliber of horse, and he was going through a growing stage. Doc agreed that it was a good idea to back off and give him the fall off and have a fresh horse for the winter/spring campaign."

Dominguez Improving...

Jockey Ramon Dominguez, honored with his third straight Eclipse Award Saturday night, is improving, but remained hospitalized Sunday in the intensive care unit at Jamaica Hospital Medical Center after suffering a skull fracture in a spill at Aqueduct Friday. "He's slowly progressing each day," his agent Steve Rushing said via text. "He's talking a little bit more today."

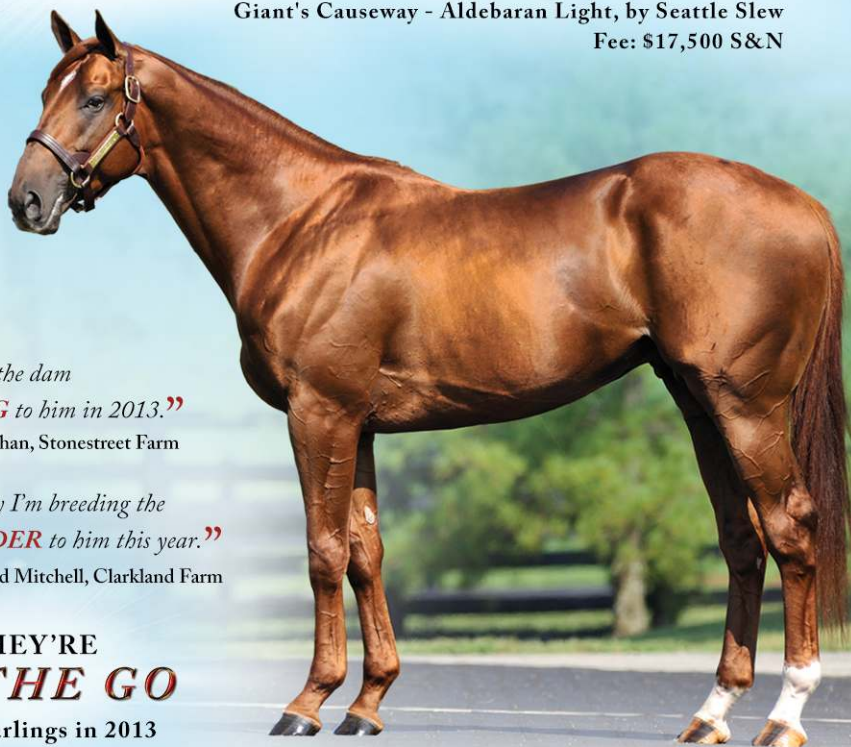

He proved 1 1/2 lengths too good for the Horse of the Year on that occasion, but the **Dragon** returned the

favor in the G1 Hong Kong Mile Dec. 9, displaying his trademark devastating turn of speed to score by 3/4 of a length.

Drawn inside for this rematch, **Glorious Days** landed in fifth as a quick tempo materialized up front, while **Ambitious Dragon** drifted back past mid-field under a patient **Zac Purton**. **Douglas Whyte** steered the second favorite off the inside and off heels to the five path at the 400-meter pole and came after the leader.

Ambitious Dragon was in a bit tight at the head of the lane, and followed the move of the eventual winner in upper stretch, but failed to finish with his typical vigor, and Glorious Days proved easily best. Dan Excel, handy throughout the run, held for second ahead of California Memory, the G1 Hong Kong Cup hero who raced wide and charged home to set him up for his next. Glorious Days could go next in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup over 1400 meters Mar. 17 and could return to Japan for the G1 Yasuda Kinen in June. He was 14th in that event last season.

"I think the Yasuda Kinen's an ideal race for him," said trainer John Size, winning this for the fifth time. "He's had the experience, he travelled beautifully, so I think he'll go back a different horse this year and he'll probably perform a lot better."

Purton said it wasn't the Dragon's day.

"Prior to straightening out, it was a little bit tight and I had to hold my ground a bit, but he was able to go through there and I thought coming into the straight I was still going to win the race," said the jockey, "but when I let him go, he just never let down like he has been."

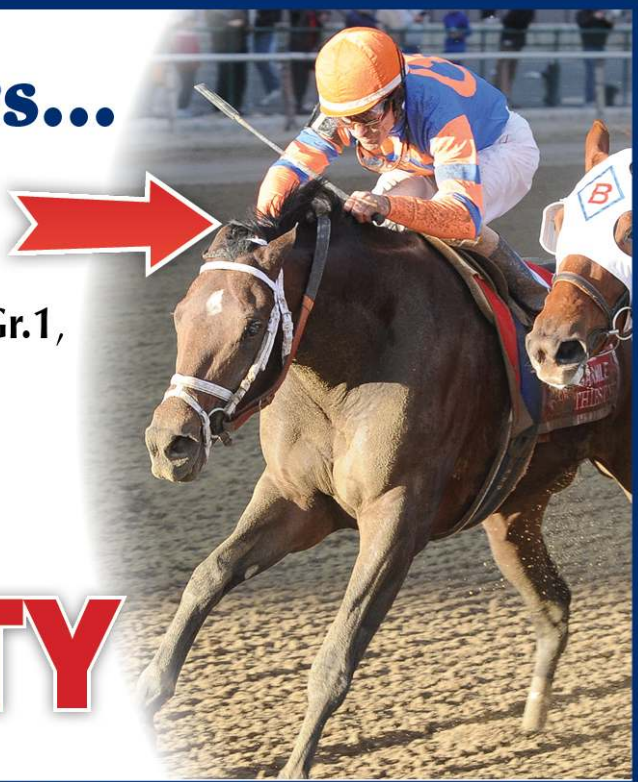

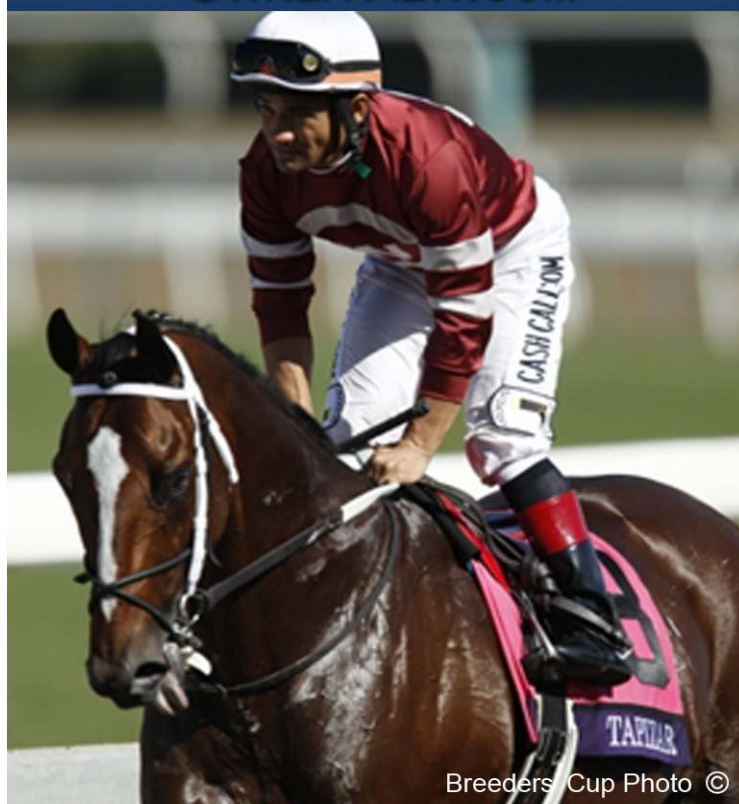
