It took him four starts to realize and validate his high expectations, but WinStar Farm's **Revolutionary** (War Pass) looks set to join the Derby mix in today's GIII Withers S. at Aqueduct. The \$235,000 OBSMAR juvenile rallied stoutly from an impossible position to be third in his Sept. 3 bow at Saratoga, then had the misfortune of running into Little Distorted (Distorted Humor) in an Oct. 28 Belmont maiden and settled for second, despite a 95 Beyer. A disappointing and green third behind next-out winner Orb (Malibu Moon) when 3-10 in a one-mile Aqueduct maiden Nov. 24, he put it together last time to thrash next-out graduate Transparent (Bernardini) by 8

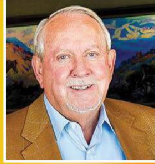

## WHO'LL SIT THE RIGHT 'TRIP' IN STRUB

Gary and Mary West's **Guilt Trip** (Pulpit), a charging third to **Fed Biz** (Giant's Causeway) and **Tritap** (Tapit) in a thrilling renewal of the GII San Fernando S. Jan. 12, looks to turn the tables on those foes in today's GII Strub S. at Santa Anita and has every right to do so. Fifth in the GIII Discovery S. in his final run for the Chad Brown barn at Aqueduct Nov. 17, the bay was an even fifth in the GI Malibu S. going seven furlongs over

this surface Dec. 26. A solid late run carried Guilt Trip from seventh into third in the San Fernando and the flow of this race may just work into his favor. Fed Biz appears to be the controlling speed and has worked well since besting Tritap by a head three weeks back, but the extra sixteenth of

a mile looms a concern here. Tritap had proven himself a useful allowance horse prior to the San Fernando, having narrowly taken a 9 1/2-furlong event at Churchill Nov. 17. The figure he earned last time out was significantly better than anything he'd achieved before, and he'll need another top effort here to figure in the finish. **Stephanoatsee** (A.P. Indy) ships in for trainer Graham Motion. The ridgling, a half-brother to MGISW Shackleford (Forestry), was a good third to the progressive Called to Serve (Afleet Alex) in the Discovery and earned a career-best figure in that event. He won't pay a bundle, but figures as the value play against the locals. "This horse needs a mile and an eighth and it seemed like a good spot for him," commented assistant trainer Alice Clapham. "There really wasn't much around and he was ready to run."

**BAFFERT GOES FOR FOURTH LEWIS WIN**

**He's Had Enough** (Tapit) will carry the same Reddam blue-and-white as I'll Have Another (Flower Alley), who won the 2012 GII Robert B. Lewis S. en route to victories in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. But the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up is only the third choice in a field of four in this year's renewal, one which looks to be heading back to the Bob Baffert barn. The Hall of Fame trainer has won this event three times in the past (General Challenge, 1999; Domestic Dispute, 2003; Pioneer of the Nile, 2009) and sends out a strong uncoupled entry this afternoon. **Flashback** (Tapit) is the 3-5 chalk on the morning line on the strengths of a superlative 3 1/2-length victory debuting over the Hollywood Cushion Track Dec. 8. A full-brother to MGISW Zazu, the \$260,000 Keeneland November weanling acquisition has worked like a freight train since, including a best-of-20 five furlongs in :59 2/5 Jan. 28. "Hopefully we can control the race and win it," said jockey Julien Leparoux. "It's tough when it's a four-horse field. Even the two horses that don't show speed, in a small field, they might show a little bit more." **Den's Legacy** (Medaglia d'Oro) won the GIII Generous S. over the Hollywood turf course Nov. 24 ahead of a solid third-place effort to Violence (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI CashCall Futurity Dec. 15. He is exiting a decent second-place finish behind Goldencents (Into Mischief) in the GIII Sham S. Jan. 5, but he seems to have better acceleration on the grass and will need to improve off his last. He's Had Enough certainly had enough traffic in the Juvenile, just failing to catch Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday). He is liable to improve with a return to conventional dirt, but hasn't run a race to date that is fast enough to contend here.

**HESS HAVING MERITORIOUS MEETING**

Trainer Bob Hess Jr. is having an outstanding winter meeting at Gulfstream, having sent out five winners for a 33% strike rate. One of those victories came courtesy of **Merit Man** (With Distinction), last out hero of the Spectacular Bid S. Jan. 1 who goes in search of his first graded-stakes success in today's GII Hutcheson S. The Florida-bred took his first two starts in California last year, including a 5 1/2-length romp in the Tim Conway S. at Santa Anita Oct. 6, but missed by a nose behind Hightail (Mineshaft) in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint Nov. 2. He proved 3/4 of a length best in his local debut on New Year's Day and will take plenty of beating this afternoon. Third to Merit Man last time was Silverton Hill Farm's **Little Distorted** (Distorted Humor), who was favored at 6-5, but struggled home third, beaten 5 1/4 lengths. He has a Payson bullet in the holster since that effort, suggesting a bounceback could be in the offing, but don't expect to see anything close to his morning line of 10-1. Cont. p5

**LOGISTICALLY SPEAKING...**

The 3-year-old series at Tampa Bay Downs has been an increasingly important pointer to the Triple Crown, and the sequence begins with today's GIII Sam F. Davis S. Trainer Eddie Plesa Jr. trains one of the country's leading sophomores in the form of **Itsmyluckyday** (Lawyer Ron), winner of last week's GIII Holy Bull S., and could have another player with **Speak Logistics** (High Cotton). The Florida-bred won his maiden in his initial two-turn voyage at Monmouth Park Aug. 12 and powered to a front-running 2 3/4-length score in the In Reality S. at Calder Oct. 13. Connections deemed that effort promising enough to send him on a trans-continental flight to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 3, where he finished seventh, but beaten 5 3/4 lengths. His morning work at home has been nothing short of phenomenal and prepped for this with a six-furlong move in a race-like 1:12 1/5 at Calder last Saturday. He will have to deal with some stretch-out speed that could come from **Divine Ambition** (Divine Park), who exits a third to **Dynamic Sky** (Sky Mesa) in this track's seven-furlong Pasco S. Jan. 12. Divine Ambition was making his first start for trainer Darrin Miller in the Pasco and first since graduating by eight lengths over the Turfway Poly Sept. 21. **Northern Lion** (Lion Heart) successfully stretched out to two turns when wiring an 8 1/2-furlong Gulfstream maiden Dec. 22, but he's likely to be beaten for speed here and will likely need to do his work from off the pace. **Sam F. Davis field p6**

**STRONG ENOUGH?**

Today's GII Arcadia H. has drawn a wide-open field of turf milers, with 4-1 morning line favoritism settling on Qatar Racing's **Strong Suit** (Rahy). The 5-year-old spent last year competing against the best sprinters Europe has to offer, and while he went winless in 2012, he garnered a second place finish in the G2 Betfred Hungerford S. over a good to firm course, and finished a credible seventh, beaten 4 3/4 lengths, in the G1 Betfred Sprint Cup. The Simon Callaghan charge was a well-beaten 10th in his lone stateside effort in the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Unraced since last September, he has turned in a steady series of works, and gets British-based jockey Jamie Spencer over for the ride. Strong Suit will have to contend with the widest draw here. The Wertheimer brothers' homebred **Silentio** (Silent Name {Jpn}) was a flashy winner of the GII Sir Beaufort S. over this track and trip Dec. 26, and he makes his 4-year-old debut here. The big bay has done nothing but improve in four career starts, but will have to shoulder top weight of 123 pounds. **Vagabond Shoes (Ire)** (Beat Hollow {GB}) could be considered something of a world traveller. The 6-year-old gelding got his start in Spain back in 2009, and has since traveled to France, Turkey, Dubai, and Germany to compete in graded stakes. He showed he is no worse for the wear last summer, lifting the G3 Prix du Chemin de Fer du Nord S. at Chantilly. He has been competing respectably against some of the world's top-rated milers, and makes his stateside debut for trainer John Sadler here. Marczak and Saccone's **Klisz** (Smarty Jones) warrants a look at long odds here. The 4-year-old gelding, unbeaten in three career starts, most recently posted a 93 Beyer when winning an allowance over this track and trip Jan. 5. He prepared for today's task with a bullet four-furlong work in :46 1/5 at Betfair Hollywood Park Jan. 28.

**ANOTHER BESILU STAR IN THE MAKING?**

Benjamin Leon's Besilu Stables is best known for the exploits of its dual champion and Breeders' Cup winner Royal Delta, but the Florida-based operation may have another big-day filly on its hands in ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Tapicat** (Tapit), the 3-1 morning line favorite for today's GIII Florida Oaks. The 3-year-old chestnut finished fourth on debut going six furlongs at Belmont Oct. 28, but the switch to turf and step up to today's distance next out saw her go wire-to-wire to graduate at Gulfstream Dec. 2. She justified favoritism again next out over that strip Jan. 9, taking a one mile optional claimer by 5 1/4 lengths. The Bill Mott charge prepped for this with a four-furlong work in :48 2/5 at Payson Park Jan. 22. There is little other clear-cut speed on paper to challenge her early on here. Trainer Chad Brown can never be ignored in this type of turf race, and he saddles Martin Schwartz's promising **Wave Theory** (Smart Strike). She opposed a pair of subsequent Gradel-placed fillies in her first two outings--second to Summer of Fun (Include) at Saratoga and fifth behind Watsdachances (Ire) (Diamond Green {Fr})--and broke her maiden in her third start going this distance on the Aqueduct turf Nov. 18. She was most recently second in the Ginger Brew S. at Gulfstream Jan. 1. Also exiting that race is fourth place finisher **Mariel N Kathy** (Corinthian). The MeB Racing Stables and Brooklyn Boyz Stables colorbearer has been a consistent performer on the turf, and she won the Chelsea Flower S. at Belmont Oct. 28. She adds blinkers for the first time here.

## Bourbon Courage Arrives at Gulfstream...

Bourbon Lane Stable and Wayne Lynn's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Bourbon Courage** (Lion Heart) arrived at Gulfstream Park yesterday ahead of an expected tilt at the GI Donn H. Feb. 9.

"He got his first tour of the track yesterday morning," said trainer Kellyn Gorder of the 4-year-old, who was last seen finishing third in the GI Clark H. Nov. 23. "We're in Jonathan Sheppard's barn. I'm going to stay and watch him breeze Sunday morning. After the Clark we gave him a couple weeks off, and he's done well training at Fair Grounds. Javier Castellano will ride."

Bourbon Courage has made eight starts--all last year as a sophomore--for three wins, including the GII Super Derby. He finished second in the GII West Virginia Derby, and the GII Indiana Derby. Among those expected to oppose in his seasonal debut are Grade I winners **Flat Out** (Flatter), **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy), and **Ultimate Eagle** (Mizzen Mast); Grade II winner **El Padrino** (Pulpit), and graded stakes-placed **Citrus Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid). **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) is listed as a possible starter.

## HAWTHORNE INCREASES IL DERBY PURSE

Hawthorne Racecourse yesterday unveiled its 2013 spring stakes schedule, highlighted by the Gill Illinois Derby Apr. 20, which has been pushed back two weeks from its traditional place on the calendar, and will see a purse increase to \$750,000.

"The Illinois Derby has been and will continue to be the most important dirt race in Illinois," said Tim Carey, President and General Manager of Hawthorne Racecourse.

In a controversial move last June, Churchill Downs excluded the Illinois Derby from its list of official GI Kentucky Derby prep races, where participants can earn points towards competing on the first Saturday in May.

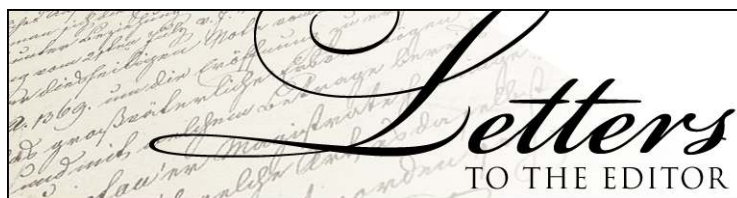
"No one really knows what will happen with the new Kentucky Derby points system, and there are likely going to be some great horses who find their paths to Louisville closed off," said John Walsh, Hawthorne's Assistant General Racing Manager. "I think a lot of owners are going to be looking closely at our purse, and a lot of trainers with an eye on the [GI] Preakness S. [May 18] are going to be looking for a final prep that fits well on their calendars."

The Hawthorne spring meet, which runs Feb. 15 through the end of April, also includes Illinois Champions Days Apr. 27, which will feature six races for horses conceived or foaled in Illinois.

### STALLION'S FIRST FOAL

Foal born Jan. 31, a filly by **HERE COMES BEN** (Street Cry {Ire}), winner of the GI Forego S. and an earner of over \$400,000. Bred by McMahon Thoroughbreds, she is the second foal out of **WINDSONG** (11, Unbridled--Falconese, by Imperial Falcon).



Much of the focus currently is on drugs and race-day medication. I agree that cleaning up our sport, so that horses run on pure heart instead of some new drug, is very important. However, I would like to start a movement in a different light.

I am not sure that cleaning up the sport, in and of itself, will be the sole source of getting us new fans. Fans are the ones that gamble, gamblers fuel the tracks, tracks fuel the breeding game, the breeding game fuels ownership/end value.

What I do know is that the fan and the gambler are interested in the star players, especially when the horse they backed or supported gets beat.

Since our horses can't speak, it's up to the human connections to represent them. Horseracing is the only major sport I watch where the losers are not routinely interviewed right after the game is over.

I understand losing can be frustrating. As racing manager for Zayat Stables and now COO at Team Valor International, I have had my share of major disappointments. No one gets more upset than me when my horses lose.

That said, I am all for speaking to the media afterwards, and answering any questions that may be asked. That is one of the main reasons I opened up a Twitter account (@BradWeisbord), and I try to answer as many of the fans as possible.

The bettors and the fans have the right to have a voice. When speaking to Marcus Hersh in an article he wrote this week for the DRF titled "Horsemen on Twitter Find Faster, Better Way to Engage," our U.S.A.-based trainer Graham Motion was quoted as saying, "What a great idea for people to see what you're actually doing. To make ourselves more available makes us a little better known. In racing, we tend to be more secretive, and I think it's a shame." Cont. p10

I think this is an easy fix. Well...nothing in racing is easy, but easier than many of the battles going on today. This should be racetrack-run. The racetracks should oblige the losing connections to speak to the media within 30 minutes of the race. If they have another horse to saddle, they could come later.

I understand the trainers may not have the "answer" as to why their horse did not perform. I envision the jockey describing their trip, the trainer describing how the race unfolded from their expert eyes, and the owner giving light into what may be next. Things can obviously change, but the goal here is to give the fan "closure" into what he just witnessed.

Let's not take for granted how confusing our game is, especially to beginners! These connections can make our job easier in educating the masses. Could you imagine what Roger Goodell would do to the losing Harbaugh this weekend if he refused to speak after the game? The Super Bowl is a much bigger venue than the graded stakes at your favorite racetrack. Why can't we get this right?

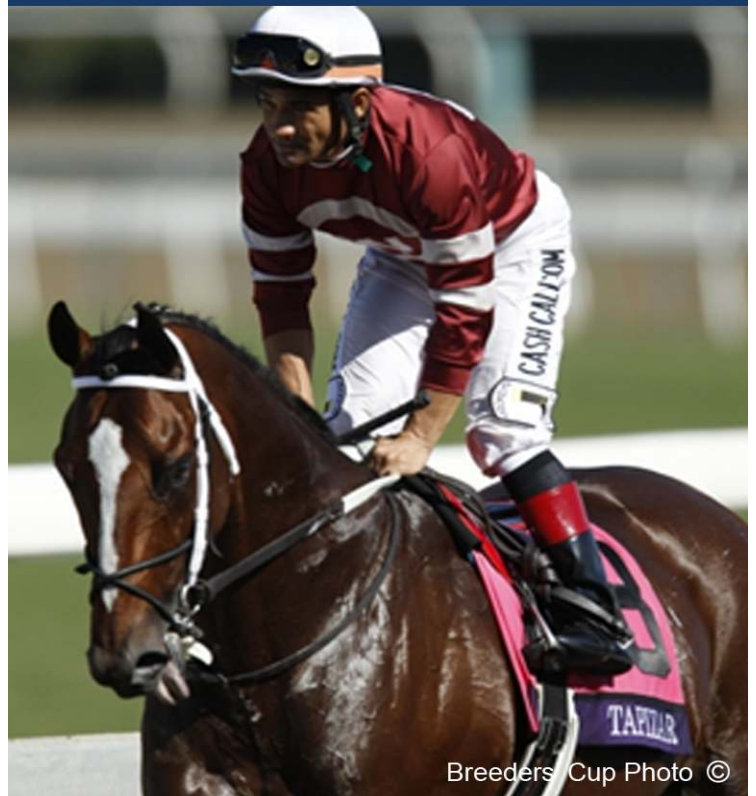

**‘RYDING’ HIGH**

Rydilluc (Medaglia d'Oro), a visually impressive winner of two in a row since switching to the infield, fired his second straight bullet workout at Palm Meadows Friday in preparation of a grassy allowance optional claimer next week at Gulfstream.

If all goes according to plan in that engagement, it will be time to start thinking about the first Saturday in May, according to Team Stallion Racing Stable's Jeffrey Massaro.

"The timing of this race fits perfectly, and if

we get what we expect from him, then it's on to the Kentucky Derby trail," Massaro commented. "With Rydilluc's talent and his breeding, there could be a lot ahead of him. Right now, we are simply focused on keeping him at the top of his game. Of course, when you have a horse like this in the barn and the calendar turns, you start dreaming a little bit. But again, we want to take things one step at a time, one race at a time, and hope that he continues to draw away from his opponents under a hand ride."

In his lone try on dirt in his unveiling, Rydilluc chased early before tiring to finish fifth, beaten 22 1/4 lengths behind subsequent GII Remsen S. third Delhomme (Dixie Union). The New Jersey native is confident that it wasn't the surface to blame for that dismal performance at Belmont last October.

"Quite frankly, we believe that this horse can turf, dirt, or Poly for that matter," Massaro commented. "Since we purchased him in May [\$150,000 EASMAY graduate], [trainer] Gary [Contessa] has alluded to his grass potential, but he trains equally well on dirt. I think people view him as a turf horse because he is two-for-two on the surface, and his lone try on the dirt was unimpressive."

Massaro continued, "What most people don't know is that he reared up in the paddock that day, unseated the rider, and handled the gate quite greenly, too. While he proved to definitely like the turf in his second start, he was also much more comfortable with race day. He was a pro in the paddock, as well as in the post parade and warm-up, and broke perfectly from the gate. We will eventually return to dirt, maybe in April or May, but for now, why mess with sweet success?"

Overlooked at 17-1 while making his grass debut going a mile in his second try at the Big A Nov. 23 (VIDEO), Rydilluc was prominently placed by Edgar Prado through an opening quarter in :23.96 and a half in :48.44. He took over while under a tight hold on the turn for home and opened daylight down the stretch to graduate by 4 1/2 lengths. The bay, produced by the stakes-winning Clever Trick mare Swift and Classy, was far less of a secret at 9-2 next time, stalking and pouncing to win in similar fashion at Gulfstream Jan. 5 (VIDEO).

"Everyone is very excited, how could you not be?" Massaro concluded. "This is the fun part of the game. When you get to talk to your trainer about things like the path Animal Kingdom took to the Derby [turf to synthetic to Derby]...well, then things are going pretty good."

## PENN NATIONAL RESPONDS TO JOCKS GUILD

Earlier this week, the Jockeys' Guild released its list of "worst deadbeats"--the racetracks it says are most insensitive to jockey health and safety issues.

According to Terry Meyocks, the National Manager for the Jockeys' Guild, "none of these deadbeats currently contributes to the Guild for members' temporary disability benefits, life insurance, AD&D insurance and health-care subsidies for qualifying active riders, as well as supplemental assistance for the Guild's permanently disabled riders."

Topping the list was Penn National Gaming, which owns Charles Town, Penn National, Beulah Park, Zia Park, and a half-interest in Sam Houston Park.

"PNGI leads the list because it has the most tracks and, in my opinion, has made it clear that it cares about only one thing--casino gaming," said Meyocks. "Various news reports over the years have documented serious safety issues both for riders and horses at PNGI tracks."

Chris McErlean, Vice President of Penn National, responded to the accusations yesterday.

"We were disappointed with the release, and the language they used," McErlean said. "We thought it was just for shock value, and very unprofessional."

McErlean pointed out that Penn National pays \$1.2 million annually for insurance premiums at each of its tracks that provide \$1 million in coverage per incident for injured jockeys.

"Our position is they're not our employees, and we do provide insurance in the event of an accident at the track to pay for their health benefits," McErlean said. "It is not our responsibility. Jockeys are independent contractors. They don't work for the racetracks, they're not hired by the racetracks. They have fought in court to be independent contractors. There is no other independent contractor that Penn National hires that we provide health benefits for. That's the whole purpose of being an independent contractor. Obviously, the horsemen are not contributing in any way, and it's curious that horsemen were not singled out in addition to the racetracks for providing benefits, since they're the ones who employ the riders."

McErlean noted that Penn National does make contributions to the Jockeys' Guild.

"I know at least the last five years, we've contributed over \$30,000 a year directly to the fund, and we've supported the fund in other efforts," he said.

In response to accusations that the company is only concerned with gaming revenue, McErlean pointed out that the jockeys at its Pennsylvania tracks receive cuts from casino funds.

"In the state of Pennsylvania, the jockeys receive \$250,000 a year from gaming revenue to have their own health benefits program," he explained. "They have their own group and administer their own benefits program. We've had discussions in other jurisdictions advocating for something similar and, unfortunately, it hasn't really gained much traction, or the horsemen have basically said, 'just give us the money for purses.'"

McErlean said this is a more effective method for Penn National to assist its jockeys, as many of its regular riders aren't Guild members.

"I don't have the exact numbers, but the number of Guild members at our racetracks vary," he explained. "At Beulah Park, maybe 15% of the riders are members. At Charles Town it might be in the mid 50s, and that's the highest. Guild membership at our tracks isn't a majority, so paying for benefits for riders that aren't even at your racetracks is an issue as well."

McErlean noted that Penn National Gaming executives discussed these matters with the Guild last year, and are open to further discussion.

"We had discussions with them last year, and we indicated to them what our position was on these benefits," he said. "Obviously they didn't like our position. We're disappointed they're using these types of tactics, and we think they're misleading and don't tell the whole story. If they want to have a discussion about how to gain funding for these types of programs, press releases like this or tactics like they're attempting to utilize certainly aren't productive in helping that process." --Kelsey Riley

## Germany

### THREE SHORTLISTED FOR GERMAN HOTY

Germany's Tote and Thoroughbred Breeders' Association (Besitzervereinigung für Vollblutzucht und Rennen) have shortlisted three Group 1 winners for the 2012 Horse of the Year title. To facilitate this year's voting process, a special website, [galopper-des-jahres.com](http://galopper-des-jahres.com), has been launched. The award, which is the oldest publicly decided title in German domestic sport, is now in its 57th season, with poll results slated to be announced Apr. 1. It rests between Teruya Yoshida and Gestut Burg Eberstein's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden victress **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}); Dr Christoph Berglar's homebred **Novellist (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), who annexed last term's G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club Italiano, as well as running second in the G1 Deutsches Derby; and Stall Antanando's **Pastorius (Ger)** (Soldier Hollow {GB}), who added to his defeat of Novellist in the German Derby with victory in Munich's G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis. Traditionally, a prize is also awarded to a member of the voting public, and this year's winner will receive a trip for two to Longchamp's 2013 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe meet.

## Australasia

### SWISS ACE COLT TOPS NZ SELECT FINALE

A colt from the first crop of 2009 G1 Oakleigh Plate hero Swiss Ace (Secret Savings) brought a bid of NZ\$160,000 from Tony Pike Bloodstock to top Friday's third and final session of the New Zealand Bloodstock Select Yearling Sale at Karaka. Overall figures for the three-day auction were slightly down from 2012, with the gross dipping to NZ\$17,256,500 from NZ\$19,114,500. A total of 399 yearlings sold for an average of NZ\$43,249 this year, compared to 415 for NZ\$46,059 12 months ago. The average was unchanged at NZ\$35,000.

Friday's topper, offered by Westbury Stud as lot 1007, is the first foal from listed-placed Ugly Betty (Aus) (High Yield).

"He's an early foal and looked a mature, running sort of horse, and I thought he would make a nice 2-year-old," commented Pike. "He'll be entered for the Karaka Million and the intention is certainly to get him to the race, but the horse will tell us if he's ready."

"It's been tough enough to buy the good colts at the sale and there's been plenty of competition on the nice horses," Pike summed up.

Go Racing, a syndicate that won last Sunday's NZ\$1-million Karaka Million with Ruud Awakening (NZ) (Bernardini), went to NZ\$120,000 to secure a Pins (Aus) colt. Albert Basma heads Go Racing. Together with business partner Pat Vinaccia and trainers Bruce and Stephen Marsh, Basma purchased 10 head at this sale in hopes of securing another Karaka Million next year.

"We have bought 10 horses so far and I would say that 50% of the shares in them are sold already," commented Bosma. "We had a lot of clients ready to buy this year, and the Karaka Million win meant we've had enquiries in addition to that and we have bought about four more horses than we had planned to."

Waikato Stud consigned Friday's topper, lot 894, a son of the Centaine (Aus) mare Rich Return (NZ). His dam is a half-sister to Group 2 winner Megapins (NZ) (Pins).

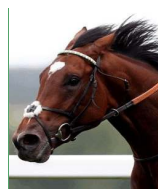
"I thought he had a bit more size to him than most Pins and he had a really good stretch to him when he walked," Bosma added. "He's a classic 3-year-old, an ideal kiwi horse for an Australian Derby, and we're leaving him in New Zealand for his 2-year-old season with Stephen Marsh before he goes to Chris Waller in Sydney as a 3-year-old."
