MAKING HIS POINT

Phipps Stable's **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer), a three-time Grade I winner, runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and a finalist for an Eclipse Award last season, was forced to give 2011 GI Kentucky Derby winner **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) two pounds as they made their respective 5-year-old debuts in Saturday's GI Kitten's Joy Gulfstream Park Turf H. in Hallandale. Despite an enterprising ride by Joel Rosario aboard the 4-5 chalk, Point of Entry did slightly the better of the two when the real running started, and proved just more than a length best. Animal Kingdom settled for second, 1 1/4 lengths ahead of a game **Unbridled Command** (Master Command). Both the winner and runner-up are candidates for races on Dubai World Cup night Mar. 30, Point of Entry for the \$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and Animal Kingdom for the big race. Trainer Shug McGaughey was taking a wait-and-see stance post-race. "I'll get my folks together and get the people to talk to me, and we'll go from there," he commented. Point of Entry does not hold an entry for the World Cup. **Cont. p4**

A May foal, Graydar turned in a smashing career debut going this track's one-turn mile last Apr. 8, drawing off to score by 8 1/2 lengths (Beyer 100) in a race that produced four next-out winners from its five also-rans. He did not face the starter again until a Sept. 15 Belmont allowance, but he could do no better than third as the chalk to the talented Saratoga Snacks (Tale of the Cat). The gray was away nearly three months off that effort, returning to best subsequent allowance winner Tiz Yankee (Tiznow) by 4 1/4 lengths Dec. 6. Other than the in-form **Csaba** (Kitten's Joy), the big guns that were being pointed to this race were having their first starts of the year; connections opted to roll the dice and the gamble paid off.

The instructions to Edgar Prado were pretty straightforward, and Grayday showed the way into the first turn while pressed along by California raider **Ultimate Eagle** (Mizzen Mast) and a three-wide Take Charge Indy as Csaba saved ground not far behind. Bourbon Courage and Flat Out raced in mid-division and made a move in tandem midway up the backstretch. But up front, Graydar was cruising right along, covering a half-mile in :46.87 and six panels in a demanding 1:10.59. As the quarter pole loomed, Graydar had his two closest pursuers hard at it, and Bourbon Courage emerged as the only real danger. But, belying his inexperience and displaying more than a modicum of talent, Graydar kept finding and proved a convincing winner.

"We figured we'd be stalking [Ultimate Eagle]," winning trainer Todd Pletcher admitted. "Edgar [Prado] and I talked about it and figured that was Plan A. But the last thing I said leaving the paddock was, 'If it works about and you're there...don't take it away.' He beat Ultimate Eagle to the turn and he sat off of us. He was laying down serious racehorse fractions. It wasn't like he was walking the dog. He got into a nice comfortable rhythm.

Pletcher added, "I'd say it's extremely rare for a horse in his fourth lifetime start against seasoned horses like this to be able to do it. It's a real tribute to the horse. It was fun for us. For these connections we lost a tough head-bob with Mission Impazible in this race. It's sweet to get one for them the next year."

Point of Entry registered a breakthrough graded win in the GII Elkhorn S. at Keeneland Apr. 27, then returned from a freshening to post a 3 1/2-length victory in Belmont's GI Man O'War S. July 14. A four-length winner of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. at Saratoga Aug. 18, the homebred overcame a slow pace and a yielding underfoot conditions to best Treasure Beach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) by 1 3/4 lengths in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Sept. 29, and closed the season with an outstanding runner-up effort behind Little Mike (Spanish Steps) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Nov. 3. Adena Springs recently purchased a 50% interest in Point of Entry and he was having his first run since that deal was struck.

Salto (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) showed the way early on as expected, with Point of Entry handy and Animal Kingdom back in fifth. Sensing that lack of pace, Joel Rosario sent Animal Kingdom from fifth up to make a line of three into the second turn. Point of Entry, three wide around the bend, matched strides, and the two brushed nearing the final furlong, but Point of Entry did slightly the better of the two for the remainder and edged away late.

The winner's dam Matlacha Pass has a 2-year-old Giant's Causeway colt named Survival. After producing a Medaglia d'Oro colt last April, she was bred to Bernardini.

Ridden to perfection by Gary Stevens, Slim Shadey led past every pole to successfully defend his title in this event.

Following his victory 12 months back, the dark bay was runner-up to Little Mike (Spanish Steps) in the GI Turf Classic at Churchill May 5 and to Acclamation (Unusual Heat) in the GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. June 9 ahead of fifth-place efforts in the GI United Nations S. July 7 and in the GI Eddie Read S. July 21. He came off a two-length freshening to wire the field in the GI John Henry Turf Championship over this course and distance, but could do no better than eighth to Little Mike in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Nov. 3. He had no excuses when only fourth after being loose on the lead in the Dec. 15 GI Hollywood Turf Cup and was most recently a disappointing sixth of seven in the GI San Gabriel S. at this venue Jan. 13.

Allowed to drift up to 5-1, Slim Shadey was a bit reluctant to load, but was first out of the stalls and across the dirt to lead passing the stands for the first

time. The veteran gelding loped along through even fractions of :24.19 and :48.20, ears pricked, as a trio, including All Squared Away chased from behind. Allowed to throw in another moderate quarter-mile in :24.27, he mostly hand-ridden by Stevens and remained safely clear as Interaction tried to make a race of it late.

"It was a very comfortable pace," the rider admitted. I was just telling Christina [Olivares for HRTV] that when we

came under the wire the first time if they left me alone mid-way down the backside, the race was over with; he was very happy. When I worked him the other morning, it seemed like the horse was happy. I just wanted to stay out of his way and let him be his own man, and that's exactly what he is. He wants to be his own man and have you stay out of his way. I haven't had a lot of horses sprint home like he did in the last 30 years going a mile and a quarter, so it was a sweet feeling."

It was the first stakes win for Stevens since his return to the saddle a handful of weeks ago.

"It's an unbelievable feeling," he stated. "Thanks to Simon [Callaghan] and the whole team over there for giving me the opportunity on this horse. I've had a bad case of the second-itises. I knew things would turn around and this is a good race to have them turn around in."

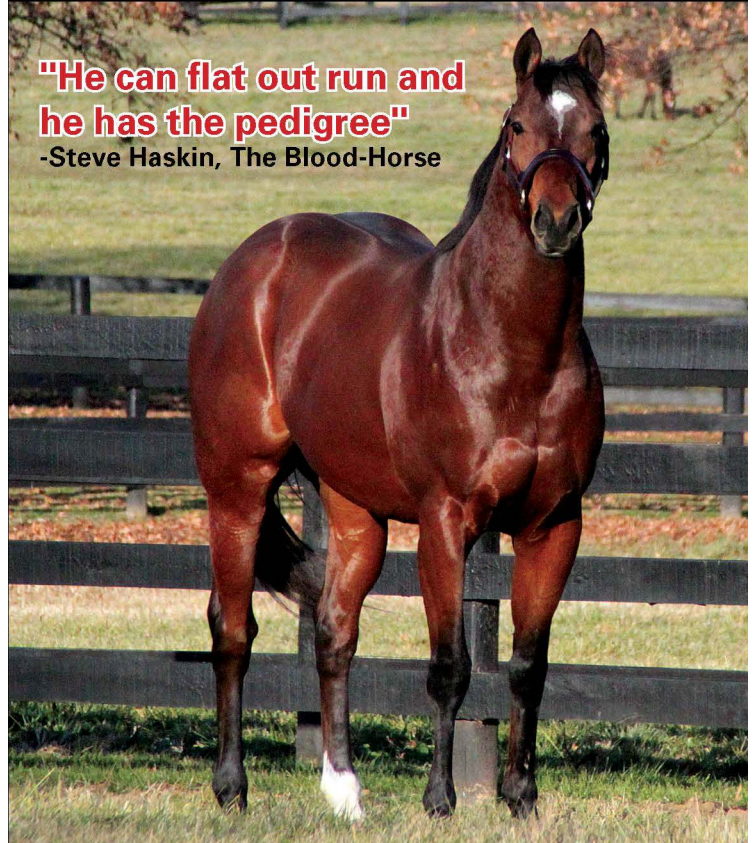

Winner of a half-dozen stakes while under the care of Stanley Gold, including a defeat of Eclipse Award winner Trinniberg (Teufflesberg) in the GIII Carry Back S. July 7, Fort Loudon was transferred to this barn and was fifth in the GII Amsterdam S. July 29 ahead of a close runner-up effort in the GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 25. Never a factor when seventh to The Lumber Guy (Grand Slam) in the GI Vosburgh S. Sept. 29, the homebred was an improved second to Neck n' Neck (Flower Alley) in Churchill's GIII Ack Ack S. Nov. 2. Bahamian Squall handed Fort Loudon a 3 1/2-length beating when they faced off in the Sunshine State S. over this track and distance Dec. 2, and he was most recently a distant third to Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) when making a rare appearance at nine furlongs in the Sunshine Millions Classic Jan. 19.

Rousted along to lead as they left the chute behind, Fort Loudon was overhauled to his outside by Big Grandpa (Medallist), and Bahamian Squall fueled the fire from between horses. Travelin Man, four-for-five at this track, was outsprinted and lay fourth through the opening exchanges. Bahamian Squall poked his head in front on the turn and took them into the stretch, but Fort Loudon wouldn't go away, and, despite refusing to switch leads, boxed on gamely to get home first. Swagger Jack raced in hand behind horses on the turn and loomed a threat outside Bahamian Squall in deep stretch before settling for second.

"Stan [Gold] deserves a lot of credit for developing him," trainer Nick Zito said of the winner. I told Jose (Lezcano) to do whatever he had to do to keep him out of trouble even if it meant going to the lead, and he did." Fort Loudon is expected to make his next start in the GII Gulfstream Park H. going the one-turn mile Mar. 9.

Castellano hadn't really asked his mount to do much of anything, but began to feel for her following six furlongs in a pedestrian 1:14.42. Abaco was the first to make any sort of impact and circled four wide into the stretch, but the plane had already left the runway, and Channel Lady had her first graded stakes success. Inglorious was well-held at the back of the pack by Joel Rosario and unleashed a furious turn of foot once let loose, but was too late on the scene.

He began to find his best stride turning for home, came off the heels of Wall Street

(NZ) (Montjeu {Ire}) and won comfortably in the finish. "It was good effort and he did a good job because the ways the races have been run today it's been pretty leader biased and there hasn't been much coming from behind," offered co-trainer Wayne Hawkes. "The last thing I said [to Dwayne] was 'You're on the best horse so ride him like it.'" Team Hawkes, led by father John, have enjoyed past success in this event, winning with Yell (Anabaa) in 2003 and Lonhro (Aus) (Octagonal {Aus}) in 2004. "We'll just do a little something with her early in the week. Everything has gone on schedule for her so far this winter."

Mucho Mas Macho Plans on Pan American...

Mucho Mas Macho (Macho Uno), upset winner of the GII Ft. Lauderdale S. in his most recent effort Jan. 12, will make his next start in the 1 1/2 mile GII Pan American S. Mar. 23. "He's a little horse and I think more time will do him good," said conditioner Henry Collazo, who originally intended on sending the gray to the GIII Mac Diarmida S. Feb. 16. "We'll wait for the Pan American. "After he ran so well in the [GII W.L.] McKnight [H. Nov. 24] at Calder going a mile-and-a-half, it gave us a lot more options knowing that he'll go that distance. I plan to bring him over here [Gulfstream] to work on turf on Sunday [Feb. 16] and maybe one more time after that before the Pan Am."

A NEW DIRECTION FOR MELNYK

Eugene Melnyk has accomplished what few in Thoroughbred racing have. A Sovereign Award winner as Canada's Outstanding Breeder and a two-time winner in the Outstanding Owner category, and perennially a leading owner/breeder in the States,

Melnyk has campaigned a Horse of the Year in Canadian Triple Tiara heroine **Sealy Hill** (Point Given). He has campaigned a Breeders' Cup winner and Eclipse champion in **Speightstown**, a trio of Classic winners in champions **Archers Bay** (Silver Deputy) and **Marchfield** (A.P. Indy) and **Lodge Hill** (Cozzene), and not one but six New York Grade I winners--

Flower Alley (Distorted Humor) (Travers), **Pool Land** (Silver Deputy) (Ruffian), **Marley Vale** (Forty Niner) (Test), **Tweedside** (Thunder Gulch) (CCA Oaks), **Bishop Court Hill** (Holy Bull) (Carter) and **Harmony Lodge** (Hennessy) (Ballerina).

In recent years, Melnyk's has been primarily a breed-to-race operation, helped in part by a handful of successful stallions that wore his blue and gold colors, especially Speightstown and Flower Alley, the sire of last year's dual Classic winner I'll Have Another. But a few weeks ago, the Canadian businessman announced he is, by and large, exiting the breeding game and selling the majority of his broodmares from his Florida-based Winding Oaks Farm.

Now, breeders will have a chance to access some of that Melnik magic when 28 of those mares are offered tomorrow at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale in Lexington. The mares were part of an addendum to the catalog and sell toward the end of the session. Taylor Made Sales consigns the group. To view the virtual catalog, which includes a pedigree analysis for each horse by Alan Porter and Virtual Inspection videos, click [here](#).

"I think it's fair to say that we are effectively out of the breeding game, for now," Melnik told the *TDN* yesterday. "But saying that, we may continue to breed the odd mare that has a wonderful page and is a graded winner off the track. So we may still breed four or five mares a year, just to maintain the family and then sell."

He continued, "The decision to do this was purely the result of a changing market over the last 15 years. We knew this day could eventually come, as you simply can't continue a purely breed-to-race program unless you get 'the big horse' every three out of five years--a top stallion. You have a better chance of rounding out your stable by buying yearlings or 2-year-olds, which is where we started."

Indeed, Melnik has been a heavy hitter at the yearling markets in the past, and has done well with some of his pricier buys. Speightstown was a \$2 million purchase at the 1999 Keeneland July Sale. Harlington (Unbridled), a Grade II-winning son of Serena's Song (Rahy), cost Melnik \$2.8 million at the 2003 September Sale, while fellow Grade II winner Strong Hope (Grand Slam) was a \$1.7 million buy at Fasig's 2001 Saratoga sale.

Melnik said he does expect to be more active buying commercially in coming years. "This year, we have over 65 yearlings, so I don't see a need to buy any more, but next year that will change," he said. "Maybe not to the levels I was buying when we were starting, since we still have so many weanlings, yearlings, 2-year-olds, and older horses coming back to the track."

This year, Melnik expects to have up to 80 horses in training by summer. "In winter, it's closer to 25-30," he said. "That's enough action and can be very profitable under our new model."

Melnik, of course, has plenty going on elsewhere, too. The founder and former CEO of the pharmaceutical company Biovail Corporation owns the NHL's Ottawa Senators, and maintains several business interests in both Canada and Barbados, where he resides. He's also a noted philanthropist. He gave \$1 million for the construction of Anna House, the child care center at Belmont Park, and has donated millions more to various hospitals, youth centers, research organizations and education centers.

Melnik said that he expects to retain Winding Oaks Farm in Ocala as a breaking and training facility. "Unless something unforeseen happens at a government level, I can see us staying in Marion County for some time," he said. "Winding Oaks is a beautiful 1,000-acre farm with a first-class group of people operating in a first-class training facility. I want to stay there unless either zoning or taxation changes to the detriment of the operation--then we'd be gone in less time than a Breeder Cup Sprint."

Government matters in Ontario, meanwhile, threaten to affect Melnik's racing operation at Woodbine, where he's coming off a big 2012, thanks to horses like Sovereign candidate **Roxy Gap** (Indian Charlie), Grade II winner **James Street** (El Prado {Ire}), stakes winner **Dene Court** (City Zip), and the Classic-placed **Black Bird Rock** (Flower Alley). In 2012, the Ontario provincial government voted to end the Slots-at-Racetracks program that boosted purse levels at Woodbine, though it was later announced the program would continue for two more years.

"There was some bizarre legislation that was proposed in Ontario that would have set back the industry 20 years and depleted purses," said Melnik. "There is now a two-year moratorium, and I hope that everyone takes a hard look at not messing up a thing that is finally fixed. If they do, we would certainly just focus on [racing in] Kentucky and New York."

In the near term, meanwhile, Melnyk will focus on *selling* in Kentucky. His farm manager at Winding Oaks, the 2005 Florida Farm Manager of the Year Phil Hronec, said the decision to disperse their mares at Fasig-Tipton came about quite quickly.

"It was really a last-minute decision," Hronec said yesterday. "The idea was to sell three or four mares before the breeding season, and we were going to wait til next November to sell the rest. But we called the Taylor boys [at Taylor Made Farm], and they said, 'Hey look, if you want to get in his sale, Fasig-Tipton will make room for you.' So I talked to Mr. Melnyk, he said, 'Let's go for it--what the heck.' The interest has been outstanding, and Fasig-Tipton and [CEO] Boyd Browning have been great."

The mares shipped up from Florida without incident on Thursday, and there should be a number of cute-overload moments Monday, as four of the mares have already foaled and will sell with their babies alongside. That includes the Storm Cat mare Mosaic ([hip 323](#)), a daughter of Melnyk's Grade I winner Tweedside, who had a Graeme Hall baby Friday night at the sales grounds.

"They're going to stamp her an F-T bred," Hronec chuckled.

We asked Hronec about the Melnyk mares, and below are some standouts he tabbed as ones to watch.

299, Sealy Hill, 9, Point Given--Boston Twist, by Boston Harbor

Sealy Hill swept Canada's Triple Tiara--the Woodbine Oaks, Bison City S. and Wonder Where S--in 2007, and was second in the GI E.P. Taylor S. in a year that saw her named the country's Horse of the Year, champion 3-year-old filly and champion turf filly/mare. A year later

at four, she just missed Breeders' Cup glory when a late-rallying second to Forever Together (Belong to Me) in the GI F/M Turf. "She's turned out to be an excellent-looking mare," said Hronec. "I tell you, as a young one, she was an ugly duckling. But she turned out to be the real thing. She's a nice,

tall mare, and she's put together very well. She might not have the deepest pedigree, but she's the kind of mare I'd buy--she was a real racehorse, and 8 out of 10 times those mares pass that on. And the good thing is that her first foal has some talent." Sealy Hill's first foal is the 3-year-old Hillaby (Distored Humor), who ran third as the 9-5 pick at Woodbine in December, the came back to be second at the same price over a muddy Gulfstream strip Jan. 19 ([video](#)). Added Hronec, "And the 2-year-old out of the mare, a Flower Alley filly named Paradise Alley, has worked twice now, and worked quite well."

314, Roxy Gap, 5, Indian Charlie--Harts Gap, by Saint Ballado
