LOVELY GROUP IN UAE OAKS

Godolphin provided the trifecta three weeks ago in the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas, led by **Lovely Pass (Ire)** (Raven's Pass), and will attempt to do the same tonight in the G3 UAE Oaks at Meydan. Lovely Pass handled the Tapeta well in the Guineas to take the event from **Shuruq** (Elusive Quality) and stablemate **Music Chart** (Exchange Rate), and trainer Mahmoud Al Zarooni expects his charges to handle the added ground here.

"They are two nice fillies," said Al Zarooni. "They have both come out of the Guineas well and shown they handle the all-weather. Hopefully, they will stay the trip and be very competitive."

The Godolphin trio will be in receipt of 10 pounds from **Emotif (Arg)** (Giant's Causeway), who will be saddled by Mike de Kock. A sharp debut winner at Greyville last May, the September-born miss met with some setbacks during her arduous journey from South Africa, but did well to be fifth, beaten just 2 3/4 lengths, in the Guineas.

"She is still short of full fitness," explained de Kock. "She was a month behind our other horses, having been very ill and missing a lot of work. She is fitter now and will stay the trip no problem, but she will again improve from this run." **Full field p10**

DUDE FAVORED IN 'BIG CAP

Game on Dude (Awesome Again) was installed the 6-5 morning-line favorite yesterday after drawing post nine in the 10-horse field for Saturday's G1 Santa Anita H. The 5-year-old gelding, who won the Big 'Cap in 2011, skipped the race last year in favor of the G1 Dubai World Cup where he was unplaced. He is coming off a dominant victory in the Feb. 3 GII San Antonio S. Trainer Bob Baffert, who called the nine hole "the perfect draw," thinks the veteran runner is still at the top of his game. "I

think he's better than he was two years ago," Baffert said. "His sheet numbers are better and he's doing good. He's here at Santa Anita, so we'll just walk him over and take a shot. He'll be running late and I feel he'll be very competitive."

BREEDERS' CUP, CEO COMPENSATION MAJOR TOPICS AT NYRA BOARD MEETING

The Breeders' Cup could be on its way back to New York as soon as 2014 and, if it does, the event will be overseen by a NYRA CEO who could be making as much as \$550,000 per year.

The NYRA Reorganization Board tackled numerous subjects at yesterday's meeting in midtown Manhattan, none more important than the long-delayed process of hiring a CEO. The position has been vacant since Charles Hayward was dismissed in early May.

The new NYRA Board opted to decide the issue of compensation for its yet-to-be-named CEO before hiring an individual. Board member Vincent Tese revealed that the new CEO will be paid \$300,000 a year plus a possible bonus of \$250,000. Those numbers were devised by a search firm and Tese said he was not aware of what the the bonus would be tied to.

The potential salary of \$550,000 was a compromise after the search firm advised NYRA that in order to attract a quality candidate, it needed to pay the individual between \$600,000 and \$1.1 million annually. Tese said it would be difficult for an agency tied to state government to pay a big salary.

"We need an attractive package, but we also have to be sensitive to the fact that we are a quasi-public agency," Tese said. "We will get criticism from people saying we didn't pay this person enough and criticism from people saying it should be less."

Hayward was paid \$460,000 a year, a number that many criticized as excessive.

Tese said that no candidates for the job have been interviewed yet, but Ellen McClain, the top-ranking executive currently at NYRA, has resigned and is set to leave before the Belmont meet begins.

It was NYRA Board member Bobby Flay who brought up the issue of the Breeders' Cup finally returning to New York. Flay, also a member of the Breeders' Cup Board, said that organization wants to seriously explore the possibility of Belmont holding the championship races in 2014.

"They want to see what the appetite is for NYRA hosting the Breeders' Cup in 2014," Flay said. "It's up for grabs. They're also negotiating with Santa Anita and Churchill. NYRA has not had the Breeders' Cup in a long time (since 2005) and that's to the dismay of a lot of people in New York and in the industry."

Steven Duncker, the former NYRA Chairman and now a Board member, cautioned against anyone getting too enthusiastic about Belmont holding the Breeders' Cup. Duncker said that previous negotiations between the Breeders' Cup and NYRA hit numerous snags.

"I have probably spent 1,000 hours in talks with the Breeders' Cup over the last five years," he said. "The first problem is the date. If they insist on having it the weekend of the New York City Marathon that disqualifies us because 98 percent of the hotel rooms are taken. The second problem is the TV window. NBC tells us it will start after Notre Dame football is over and if that's going to be the case we have to put in lights."

Flay said he believed the time and date of the races would not be a "deal breaker."

Though ready to leave NYRA, McClain is still working on several important projects, among them NYRA possibly going into the off-track betting business in New York. There has been no OTB in New York City since OTB closed about two years ago. She said the goal was for NYRA to open self-betting terminals throughout the city at existing bars and restaurants.

"We see the opportunity to get into that market, introduce the product to new fans and do so profitably," she said. "We're not going to open 57 branches, but a number that works at bars and restaurants."


She estimated that NYRA could take in \$200 a million a year in handle with the off-track wagering outlets. McClain admitted that it is not clear whether or not NYRA can legally accept bets in New York City.

In other developments, Flay and Michael Dubb, who butted heads at the January Board meeting about their visions of NYRA's future, have been assigned to work together to form a plan for what direction the organization should go in. Flay has been an advocate of less racing with an accentuation on improving the product.

Rick Violette, a non-voting member of the Board, said that horsemen's groups in several states in the Mid-Atlantic region are ready to adopt the strict medication rules now in place in New York. Because competing states have more lenient drug rules than New York does, shippers at Aqueduct have become a rarity, which has cost NYRA an average of one starter per race. Should the other states adopt the new rules, horsemen would obviously have no reason not to want to run in New York.

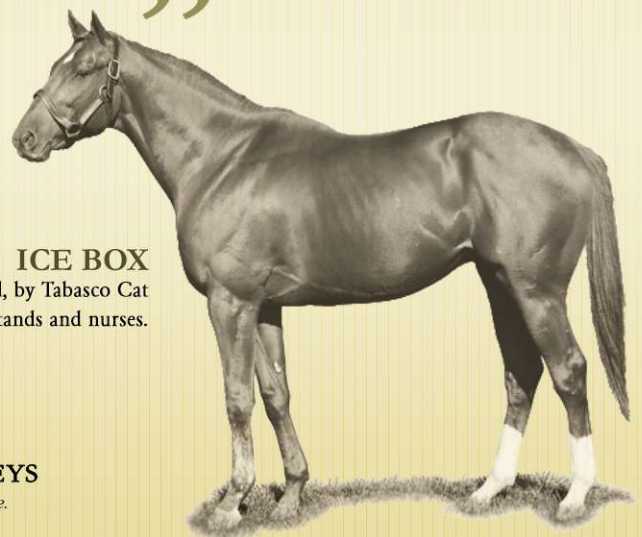

THE CASE FOR AI GOES AROUND AGAIN: AN APPEAL IN OCTOBER

The controversial, but defeated case to allow artificial insemination when breeding Australian Thoroughbreds is set to intrigue the international horse world again with hobby breeder Bruce McHugh planning an appeal in October.

Last December, Federal Court judge Alan Robertson ruled against the application by McHugh to remove the restrictions against AI, finding that Australian rules of racing that disallow it are neither anti-competitive nor a restriction of trade.

McHugh, once one of the world's biggest on-course bookmakers, said in Sydney yesterday that he was 100% sure he would go ahead with an appeal.

"I cannot see any reason why not, but I will finally be advised by my lawyers shortly," he said.

Since studying Judge Robertson's exhaustive 368-page judgment, McHugh has hired a new legal team and been bolstered by the opinions of several academic lawyers who found large holes in the judge's arguments.

One said, "It was a very timid judgment based very much on the status quo and believing the opinion that Australian racing and breeding would forever be ruined if it took independent action. That is not necessarily the case and was, after all, put forward as speculation by establishment players who were set to lose money if AI was adopted. What if the rest of the world accepted the advantages of AI for small breeders etc., if it came in here?"

The appeal also makes sense in money terms, with McHugh facing crippling costs by the defeat in December. He has already spent around A\$3.5 million on his personal crusade to change the AI laws and now is facing a further payout of 50 or 60% of racing costs believed to be around A\$5 million.

One lawyer asked to comment on the situation said yesterday, "An appeal will cost all three parties, the Australian Racing board, the Australian Stud Book and McHugh, A\$150,000 each. That is cheap when you consider that McHugh faces paying his opponents' costs of say A\$3 million and he may yet win on appeal."

During last year's seven-week trial, more than 30 witnesses from Australia, France, Ireland, United Kingdom and Hong Kong argued that damage would be done to Australia's A\$200 million trade to the rest of the world if it allowed AI in horses.

This evidence was crucial in the findings of Judge Robertson, who mentioned several times he was mindful of international standards and Australia's role in it. In the judgment, the Judge was overwhelmingly supportive of the dangers of changing it.


McHugh said yesterday that no racing or breeding jurisdiction in the world had a law that said Australian AI bred horses would contaminate their industry. "In France hurdlers that are not registered with the stud book can run in races against registered horses. That would be the case here if this judgment is overturned."

In reply, Peter McGauran, chief executive of the Australian Racing Board said Article 12 of international racing law was adamant against allowing AI bred horses to race. He said the ARB was not surprised McHugh would appeal and said he remained confident Judge Robertson's findings had settled the matter once and for all.

McGauran said he believed the appeal would go ahead in October and last just two days.

The Chairman of the ARB, Michael Duffy, welcomed the December decision as "upholding the validity of the Australian rules of racing in respect of the definition of a Thoroughbred. We have always maintained the naturally bred Thoroughbred was the basis of the domestic and international sport of racing, and AI proponents were free to establish their own industry as they wished."

Suave Jazz showed intelligence, trainability, and nerves of steel all weekend long. He negotiated the "hockey rink" Large Arena and noisy Equine Arena, navigated the maze of corridors and stalls behind the scenes, handled the large crowd on Saturday, and played the role of lead pony in all the sessions.

More than once, I heard riders say, "Where's Suave Jazz?" and "Bring him over to Suave Jazz," and "Suave Jazz will help them settle."

Gunport, Alluring Punch, and Declan's Moon all relaxed in the company of their cool, calm, collected friend, Suave Jazz. But when it was time to perform, he was all heart, nimbly cantering through grids and showing off his lovely flatwork. Rider Katie Klenk handled her role as leader with style, and they were always the first team to enter an arena, jump a line, or meet a new challenge.

Knees up, neck arched, pretty little Gunport overcame her jitters and settled into her routine on Friday during a jumping session hosted by Steuart Pittman. Michelle Warro handled the mare with surgical precision and her instincts were perfect; she knew just when to encourage her to go forward and when to let her relax. Most importantly, Warro kept the mare moving and helped her focus on tasks, from flatwork to jumping.

On Saturday, Gunport was more nervous than she was in her Friday session. None of the horses had been in the Equine Arena before, and they did their first-ever warmups in that ring in front of 2,500 people. Before she had a rider in the saddle, Gunport jiggled and sweated.

Her pal Suave Jazz and her excellent rider helped her to focus. The tempo of her gaits slowed as she settled, she remembered all her stretching exercises, and reached for the bit. At the end of the session, she was still hot and keyed up, but she was focused and forward. She attacked every jump with enthusiasm and style. And that canter of hers! It's lovely... round, light, and rhythmic.

Gunport got my vote for her suitability as an eventer. With a trainer like Warro, she will learn how to handle her jitters and slow down her feet, and I really like how she jumps. She is a generous horse, and her catlike agility could easily get her out of a tight spot to a fence.

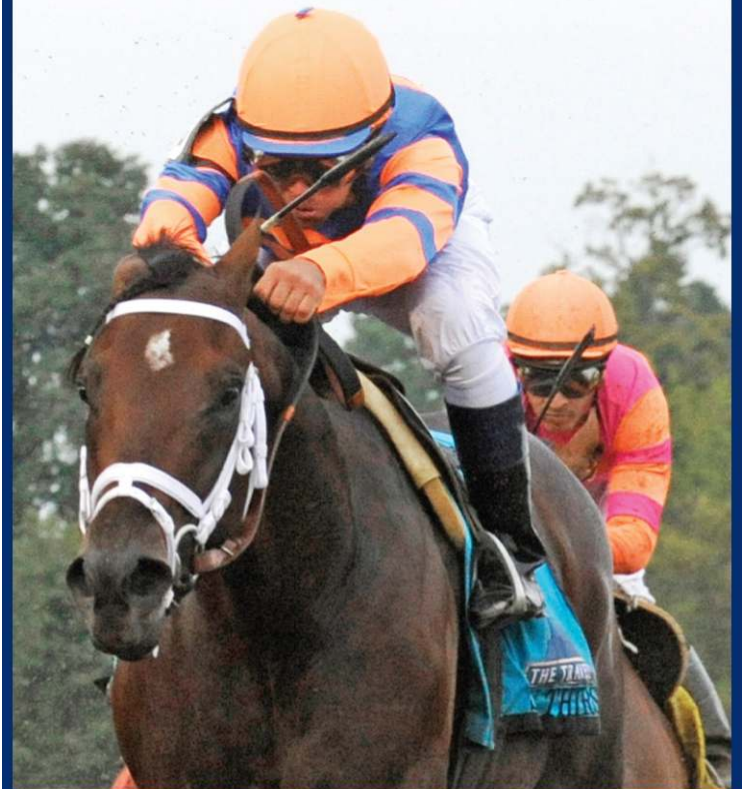

Like Gunport, Declan's Moon was visibly rattled by Saturday's atmosphere. In their former careers on the track, Gunport and Alluring Punch never raced at tracks with huge crowds, but Suave Jazz and Declan's Moon both raced in front of thousands on their biggest days.



In his braids and white polo wraps, Declan's Moon looked every bit the part of a dressage horse. As he warmed up and listened to his rider, Stuart Pittman, he lost the nervous edge and began to show off his spectacular gaits for the audience. Pittman also rode with calculated brilliance, and was able to engage the crowd with insightful training details while handling a powerful and opinionated horse at the same time.

I should change Alluring Punch's *TDN* nickname from "The Kid" to "Mr. Popularity." He won three voting categories, and had an enthusiastic fan club and cheering section during Saturday's session. Each time I visited this year's RRTP class of horses, I ended up with a new favorite, and I saw Alluring Punch's appeal at the Maryland Horse World Expo, when he was unsure of what to do, but gamely listened to his rider and handlers. And the way he handled his free jumping made me like him even more.



I saw some uncertainty this weekend, and "Punchy's" outstanding support team helped him figure things out. Chiantel Beaumont gave him confidence when she worked with him in the arenas and in the barn- his concern changed to curiosity and relaxation. When Alluring Punch got to work, I saw a new focus in him, and he was more sure of his abilities. Under saddle, Stuart Pittman showed him how to use that lofty canter and powerful hind end to jump a line of fences. The tall chestnut blossomed in just a few months, and the sky is the limit with him.

On Saturday evening, I got to see Solidify, an RRTP (and MidAtlantic Horse Rescue) graduate of last year's Trainer Challenge. I recognized his beautiful canter and jump, which has only improved with the quality training and riding he has received for the past year. He and his talented rider have a bright future ahead of them.

THE JOCKEY CLUB ISSUES PROGRESS REPORT

REPORT The Jockey Club yesterday issued its fourth progress report on growth initiatives recommended by McKinsey & Company in August 2011. Among the initiatives mentioned in the 10-page report was America's Best Racing Tour (ABRV). Announced in November, the tour features six ambassadors traveling around the country to promote the sport of racing. The group's first foray will be held the week of Mar. 11 at the South by Southwest Festival in Austin, Texas.

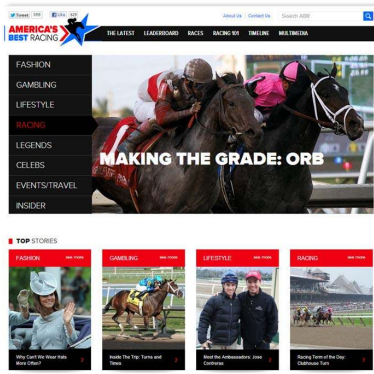
The Jockey Club also launched a second version of followhorseracing.com Feb. 11. The website showcases racing's major events and, according to progress report, "features a new look and feel, focusing on fashion, lifestyle, racing, gambling, travel, celebrities and legends." Among the bloggers for the site are former jockeys Julie Krone and Frank Lovato, Jr. Rosie Napravnik, David Flores and several high-profile trainers have agreed to write blogs for the site in the coming year. In addition, a new fan fiction serial, "Out of Luck," written by John Perrotta, has proven popular.

The Jockey Club's fourth progress report also includes updates on the 2013 "Road to the Kentucky Derby" televised series of races; the sports fantasy game Major League Horse Racing; the public and media relations strategy of NTRA Communications; and the website ownerview.com, which attempts to reduce the barriers to racehorse ownership.

THE JOCKEY CLUB ADDS RETIRED FROM RACING CLAUSE

The Jockey Club has added the option of selling a horse "retired from racing" to its Rule 18, thus allowing the horse to still be used for breeding purposes. Previously a horse could be sold "without pedigree," making the horse no longer considered a Thoroughbred for breeding or racing purposes. "For myriad reasons, owners may not want their Thoroughbred to race again, but they do want the horse's offspring to be eligible for registration with The Jockey Club," explained Matt Iuliano, executive vice president and executive director, The Jockey Club. "We developed the Sold as Retired from Racing rule with that in mind." To sell a horse as retired from racing, the owner must send a signed and notarized Sold as Retired from Racing form, a set of photographs of the horse, and the horse's Certificate of Foal Registration to The Jockey Club within 60 days of the sale. The Jockey Club will stamp the certificate "Retired from Racing" and forward it to the purchaser. A copy of such stamped certificates will be made available at registry.jockeyclub.com for interested industry stakeholders.



NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



SEQUESTRATION SCHEDULED TO BEGIN FRIDAY

The massive federal spending cuts that face almost every U.S. government agency are set to begin Friday, March 1, 2013. These automatic across-the-board cuts, referred to as "sequestration," will total \$1.2 trillion over 10 years. Of this total, \$85 billion in military and domestic discretionary spending reductions are scheduled for the remainder of the current fiscal year that ends September 30.

Sequestration is the result of attempts by Congress and the Obama administration to gain control of the growth in national debt. It has been scheduled to begin for more than a year but Congress and the President delayed the start until March 1 as part of the fiscal cliff negotiations that ended on New Year's Day. What impact sequestration will have on the overall U.S. economy and government services/programs is unclear and it may take several months to become evident.

The NTRA's federal legislative team maintains a daily presence in Washington, D.C. to closely monitor and act on those issues that impact horse racing. We will update the industry with relevant impacts of sequestration in this space.

Rick Violette, Jr., president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, was among those praising the new rule. "This is a valuable tool to protect the future of retired racehorses," said Violette. "It will simplify the transfer process and give owners the peace of mind of knowing the horses they retire will not race again."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.
