BARRETT'S OPENS JUVENILE SALES

The juvenile sales' season begins this afternoon in Pomona, California with the Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training. The first of 138 catalogued juveniles goes through the Barretts sales ring at 3 p.m. local time.

Optimism was high on the sales grounds over the weekend after a strong and well-attended breeze show on Friday which saw nine 2-year-olds turn in furlong works of :9 4/5 and two share the bullet of :9 3/5.



"I think it is going to be a good sales year," said consignor Becky Thomas. "I think there is a demand for horses. There are certainly a lot fewer horses. Yes, there are a lot fewer buyers, but I

think there is a demand for good horses. I think Barretts has done a very good job, as evidenced by the breeze show, with a lot of nice horses. I look forward to a good sale here, but I really look forward to it starting our season--I am feeling pretty optimistic."

Ciaran Dunne, whose Wavertree Stables has the largest Barretts consignment, agreed the continuing trend of smaller foal crops tips the scales in favor of sellers.

"We've had a lot of traffic at the farm, a lot of interest, some new faces showing up that normally don't come to the farm looking at horses," Dunne commented. "Obviously there are less out there in terms of numbers, so supply and demand should work in our favor."

Dunne is also looking forward to a good sales' season.

"I think we have a solid group of horses," he added. "We might be stronger in depth than we've been in quite some time."

Consignor Eddie Woods, who sold the Barretts March sales topper two years ago, said traffic at the barn area over the weekend had been steady and he expected a strong sale.

"It is looking pretty good around here," Woods said. "Like always, the better end will always be great. Two-year-old sales were great last year, and I don't see why it shouldn't continue."

During last year's Barretts March sale, 77 juveniles sold for \$8,426,000. The average was \$109,429 and the median was \$85,000. Those figures were up on 2011, when 55 horses brought \$5,539,000 for an average of \$100,709 and a median of \$70,000.

TAIT RESIGNS FROM BREEDERS' CUP BOARD

Darley Chief Operating Officer Oliver Tait announced his resignation from the Breeders' Cup Board yesterday following the Board's decision Friday to only prohibit the use of Lasix in 2013 Breeders' Cup races for juveniles. The 2013 medication policy is identical to last year's, but the Breeders' Cup had previously announced that it would ban Lasix for all competitors this year. "The Breeders' Cup has reversed its previously agreed and stated position that the 2013 Breeders' Cup World Championships will be conducted without Lasix. As a consequence, I have resigned from the Board of the Breeders' Cup," Tait said in a statement. "Sheikh Mohammed, Darley's Principal, has been one of the biggest players in American racing for the last 30 years. His vision for the sport in America is a future where racing is enjoyed and admired by a new generation of participants and enthusiasts. A true world championship, to be enjoyed and admired by all, needs to be medication free. Progress is being made in all sports around the world in relation to drugs. This is not progress. The Breeders' Cup is a leader of this sport and I was extremely proud to serve on its Board. Having rightly and boldly chosen to lead the way on the issue of drugs in racing in 2011, it has now stepped back in time. I hope that in the near future it can lead again."

With an almost identical trip to his last two victories, Rydilluc stalked and pounced for a first graded score. Not a factor when fifth sprinting on the Belmont main track first out Oct. 13, the bay drew off to a 4 1/2-length graduation tally going a mile over the Big A turf Nov. 23. He went eight panels again in an optional claimer here Jan. 5, and the result was the same--a 5 3/4-length success ([TDN In Sharper Focus](#)).

Rydilluc had been working quickly over the Palm Meadows sod in the interim, and he handled this step up in class and an extra furlong with aplomb.

Taken a strong hold of by Edgar Prado to allow longshot Dad'z Laugh (Black Mambo) to take the lead, the narrow second choice tracked that foe through sensible early splits of :24.91 and :49.59. The field began bunching up entering the home bend, and that's when Prado made his move. Rydilluc took command while traveling well within himself, continued moving comfortably into the lane and bounded home with good-looking strides while never seriously threatened. Favored Charming Kitten, who took the local Kitten's Joy S. Jan. 20, had to settle for second. The winner covered his final furlong in :11.40.

"You see what he looks like turning for home with the stride he's got," winning conditioner Gary Contessa said of Rydilluc. "He's an amazing horse. I think we have to go to the [GIII] Spiral [S. at Turfway Mar. 23] or [GI] Blue Grass [S. at Keeneland Apr. 13] and take a shot. He's nominated for the Spiral and he's nominated for the Blue Grass and I've seen a lot of horses that did this--turf to Poly--and showed up in the [GI Kentucky] Derby. So we're not ruling it out."

In reference to Rydilluc's debut effort on the dirt, Contessa added, "As good as he runs on turf he runs on dirt. I just got to toss that first race... he's a handful. Maybe he just blew his race that day and just wasn't mentally prepared."

Prado offered, "The way he ran last time was very impressive and I was very happy how he ran and came out of the race. He has been working great. Charming Kitten is a nice horse, but today was Rydilluc's day and he passed the test. He came back fresh and happy, he's such a nice horse."

Rydilluc's dam Swift and Classy was three-for-three on the track, and took the 1994 What a Summer S. sprinting on the dirt here by 2 1/2 lengths from MGISW and subsequent champion 3-year-old filly Heavenly Prize. His second dam is GI Spinaway S. runner-up Sociable Duck, who also produced the dam of Grade I winners Roman Ruler (Fusaichi Pegasus) and El Corredor (Mr. Greeley). Swift and Classy has a 2-year-old filly by Roman Ruler, a filly thus inbred 2x3 to Social Duck.

Wavertree's Barretts Formula...

Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables consigned last year's Barretts March sales topper, a filly by Empire Maker who sold to Danox Company Ltd. for \$435,000. The Ocala-based operation also sold the auction's top-priced lot in 2009 and 2010.

Asked what type of horses sell well at Barretts, Dunne said, "The key to this sale is the individual, probably more so than anywhere else we sell. Pedigree plays a lesser role. The buyers out here seem to be focused on performance and what is standing in front of them on the end of the shank. So when we pick horses to come here, we start with the individual."

The consignment also features horses with pedigrees designed to appeal to the California market. Dunne pointed out a Harlan's Holiday filly who sells today as hip 116 (see *hip happenings*). The filly is out of a half-sister to Tasha's Miracle (Harlan's Holiday), a two-time graded stakes winner and Grade I placed on the California circuit, as well as to the dam of Concord Point (Tapit), who was second in Hollywood Park's GIII Lazaro Barrera Memorial S. The 2-year-old has been pointed towards the Barretts sale since she was purchased for \$150,000 out of last year's Fasig-Tipton July sale.

"She was bought specifically with this sale in mind because, obviously Tasha's Miracle and Concord Point ran out here," Dunne confirmed. "Obviously, there are some legitimate California horses in the pedigree that makes this a logical place to come." **BESMAR Cont. p5**

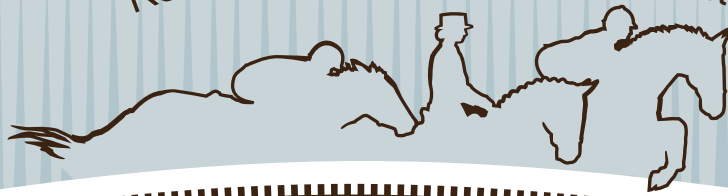

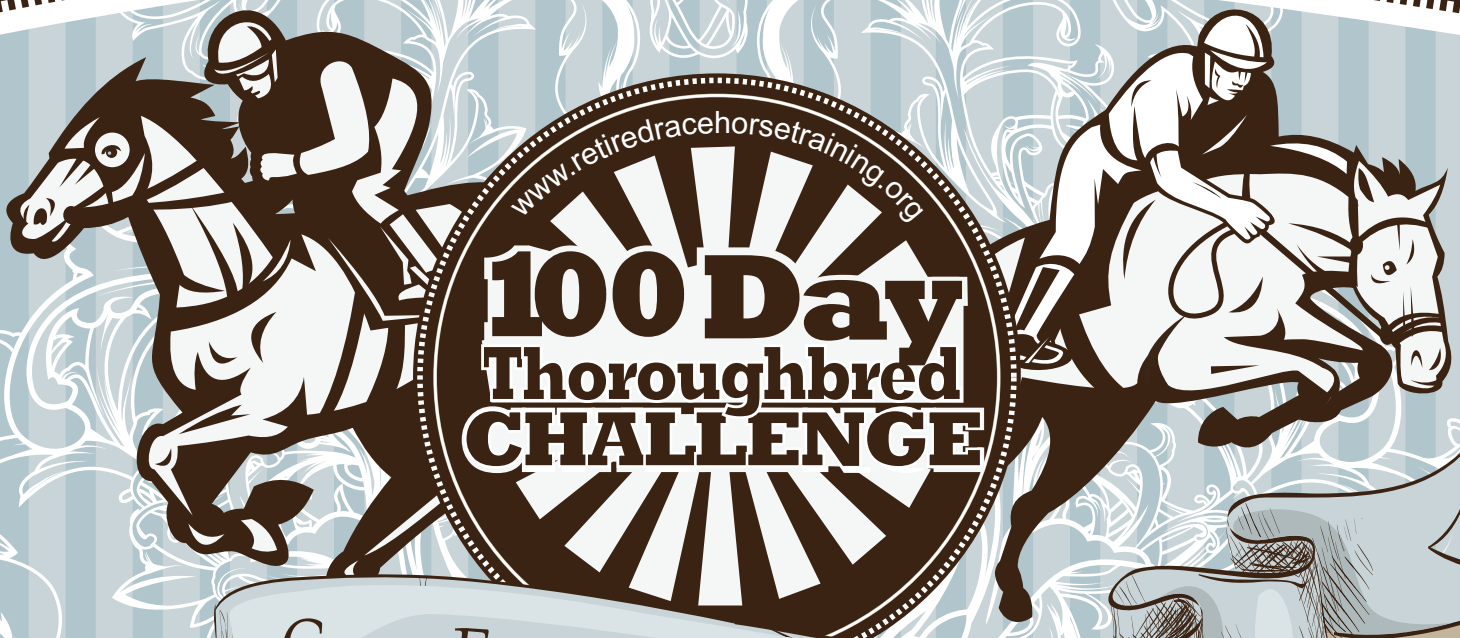

“This horse is a gift from heaven, and we are all very proud and happy,” his doting conditioner said. “He has made so many people around him so happy, and I want to dedicate this award to his breeder Yvon Lelimoizin, who named the horse after the Les Aigles gallop he works on at Chantilly. Cirrus des Aigles is a little bit fresh at the moment, and he has started work with the G1 Prix Ganay [at Longchamp Apr. 28] as a possible first target--we'll make a program after that.”

Also honored at the awards was the G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero **Saonois (Fr)** (Chichicastenango {Fr}), who was named champion 3-year-old colt, and His Highness The Aga Khan's ill-fated G1 Prix de Diane winner **Valyra (GB)** (Azamour {Ire}) who topped the votes for the leading 3-year-old filly. Euthanized after fracturing a leg in training, the Jean-Claude Rouget trainee beat compatriot Beauty Parlour (GB) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) to pole position as she had in the Chantilly Classic last June. Her owner/breeder's racing manager Georges Rimaud said, “We are very happy and proud to receive this great honor, especially as she is still very close to our hearts. We have sent the dam back to Azamour to try and reproduce the same class of horse, but as we all know, there are no certainties in breeding.”

With no home-trained juvenile able to get close to the exploits of the 2012 Horse of the Year **Dabirsim (Fr)** (Hat Trick {Jpn}), the 2-year-old award was presented to the owners of the British raider **Reckless Abandon (GB)** (Exchange Rate). Part-owner Julie Deadman was delighted that the unbeaten colt had been officially recognized after his successes in the country's G2 Prix Robert Papin and G1 Prix Morny. “I want to thank France Galop and *Courses et Elevage* for this award, which is an honor for us. We are very happy for ourselves, but also for his trainer Clive Cox.”

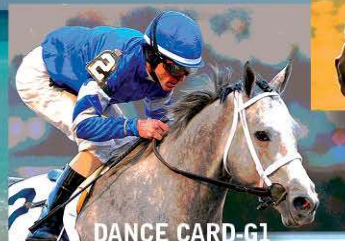

TEOFILO COLT TOPS PREMIER OPENER

The Inglis Premier Yearling Sale opened at Oaklands north of Melbourne on Sunday to a packed auditorium and a first session of 120 lots. With the best-regarded yearlings of the sale still to come, including many in

today's new "Blue Riband Session," the sale opener nonetheless realized solid results. The average of A\$72,722 was down less than a percentage point from a year ago, while the median of A\$60,000 was 7.7%. The RNA rate was 25.7%.

Leading the way was a son of Teofilo (Ire)--San Cristobel (NZ) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) who made A\$250,000. Selling from the draft of Tyrell Stud, [lot 43](#) elicited a precise opening bid of A\$155,000 from bloodstock agent James Bester. Auctioneer Jonathan D'Arcy reminded the ring not to be distracted by the strength of the bid, and buyers took D'Arcy at his word, and A\$10,000 bids followed to A\$180,000. D'Arcy then upped the ante, taking three A\$20,000 bids before one further A\$10,000 salvo settled the matter at A\$250,000. Cranbourne trainer Mick Kent signed for the colt on behalf of stable clients.

"Pedigree and type, and out of a Fastnet Rock mare," Kent said of the colt's attributes. "It is going to be hard to buy the Fastnet Rocks, so maybe buying out of his daughters is the way to go."

This is the second foal from San Cristobel, a winner at two over 900 meters. It's the family of six-time winner Procrastinate (Aus) (Jade Hunter), whose tally included the G3 VATV Tristarc S. Procrastinate was the dam of eight winners, including Laisserfaire (Aus), the champion older female sprinter in South Africa in 2000-01, and fellow black-type winners Foreplay (Aus), Time Thief (Aus) and Personify (Aus).

The price was the highest of an opening session not considered to have the choicest lots. This gave Inglis reason to hope the following two sessions, on Monday and Tuesday, will be considerably stronger.

"The colt who made A\$250,000 was excellent, and we thought that was a good price," said Mark Webster, managing director of Inglis. "[But] this afternoon, the horses were not going to be the strongest start to the sale, and in the first 120 lots we really did not have any superstars. To give you an example, I have my list of the top fillies for the sale, and there are none in the first 120. So it is not surprising, and it is actually quite a good start. Also, with the Blue Riband Session, we did put our best 50 to that session, so yes they will be Classic and staying types, but also they are yearlings who are the better types. So we have a lot to look forward to."

It took about an hour for the sale to get into stride, and not surprisingly, it was a Lonhro (Aus) youngster that brought out the buyers. [Lot 22](#), a colt out of

G1 Australian Oaks winner Republic Lass (Aus) (Canny Lad {Aus}) from the draft of Tyreel Stud, set off a flurry that saw bidding commence at A\$50,000 and move swiftly in A\$10,000 bids through A\$100,000 and onward. At A\$160,000 the hammer fell, and two from a large South African contingent at the sale stepped forward to claim the purchase. Derek Brugman, racing manager for prominent owner Marcus Jooste, signed for the colt under the Global Bloodstock banner. Cape Town conditioner Joey Ramsden, standing alongside Brugman, will train.

The colt, like most of Lonhro's progeny, is officially listed as a brown, but to the eye, he is black. He is the fifth foal of Republic Lass, who won six times, including the Oaks and G1 STC Ranvet S. and the G3 Adrian Knox S. in a stellar racing career. She has three winners from four to race, including Republic Lad (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), who has won four races this season from 1400-2200 meters. The family has strong American connections, as her second dam Swift Seasons (Cox's Ridge) is a half-sister to graded winners Glacial Stream and Cascading Gold, and to In Hopes, dam of Big Jag. The colt's third dam Cascapedia was the champion older mare in the States in 1977.

"He is a colt that we think for South African purposes will be ideal," said Brugman. "We love Lonhro, he walks beautifully, is well-balanced and we just thought he was a fantastic colt."

Brugman commented that while they had opened their buying with a son of Lonhro, they were also interested in the progeny of the young sire sons of Galileo (Ire) and Montjeu (Ire) that were not available back in South Africa.

"Overall, we are always impressed by shuttle stallions that you get out here, such as New Approach (Ire) and Teofilo (Ire), these Northern Hemisphere stallions that we do not get access to where we are," added Brugman. "We have seen some very nice horses."

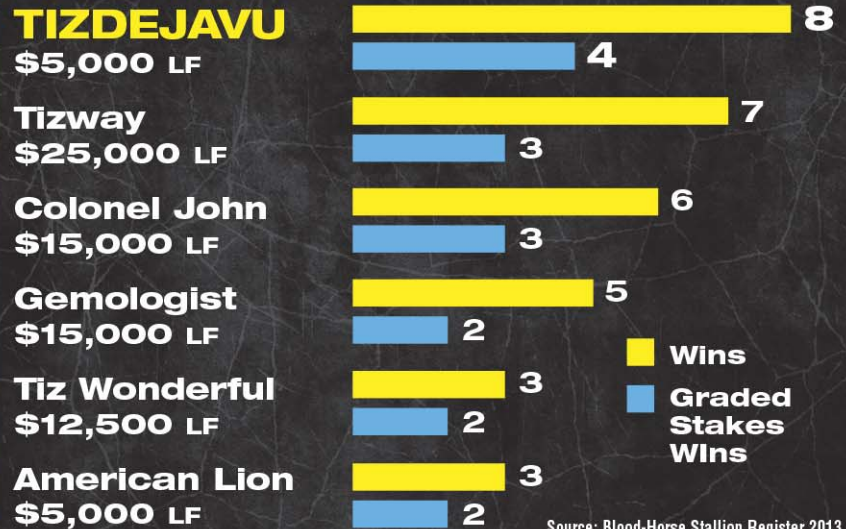
