## UNCHARTED WATERS FOR VERRAZANO

Budding superstar **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) faces eight foes today as he looks to navigate uncharted waters, trying two turns and stakes

company for the first time in the GII Tampa Bay Derby. The half-brother to fellow Lets Go Stables colorbearer El Padrino (Pulpit) garnered the **"TDN Rising Star"** distinction when he aired by 7 3/4 lengths on debut going 6 1/2 furlongs at Gulfstream Jan. 1, and was somehow even more impressive when he

reported home 16 1/4 lengths in front of runner-up **Eton Blue** (Giant's Causeway) going that venue's one-turn mile Feb. 2. The bay earned a 105 Beyer Speed Figure for that performance--the fastest for a 3-year-old so far in 2013--and was made the 9-1 favorite in Pool 2 of the GI Kentucky Derby Future Wager last week. The Coolmore contingent purchased an interest Verrazano after his last start, and the Todd Pletcher trainee signaled his continued sharpness with a five-furlong bullet drill in :59.21 alongside older stablemate and fellow **"Rising Star"** Discreet Dancer (Discreet Cat) at Palm Meadows Feb. 25. **Cont. p3**

## SOPHOMORES LOOK TO SHINE IN SAN FELIPE

Gary and Mary West's unbeaten **Flashback** (Tapit) faces his toughest foe to date in the form of two-time graded stakes winner **Goldencents** (Into Mischief) in today's GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita. The full-brother to local MGISW Zazu was a 3 1/2-length debut graduate at Betfair Hollywood Park Dec. 8, and had no trouble with just three opponents last time in the track-and-trip GII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 2. "[Flashback is] going to get tested this week," trainer Bob Baffert admitted to *Daily Racing Form*. "He's going to have to run. It's a tough field. It's going to be fun to watch." **Cont. p4**

## 'MIKE' ON TRIAL IN MAKTOUM CHALLENGE

Priscilla Vaccarezza's **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) did everything in 2012 just about as well as he could, bar winning an Eclipse Award. The 6-year-old gelding makes his seasonal debut halfway around the world in tonight's G1 Maktoum Challenge-R3 going 2000 meters over the Meydan Tapeta, and his performance will dictate whether he presses on to the World Cup over the course and distance or whether he takes in one of the turf races on the undercard. The Florida-bred put together a season for the ages last year, winning the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at nine furlongs, the GI Arlington Million going a mile and a quarter and the GI Breeders' Cup Turf over 12 panels. Though he has never raced over a synthetic track, the Florida-bred reportedly trained well at Betfair Hollywood Park while preparing for last year's GI Shoemaker Mile and, by all accounts, has sparkled since his arrival in the desert earlier this month. **Meydan Super Saturday previews cont. p7**

"If Verrazano breaks clean and can carry his speed two turns, we probably can't beat him," admitted Mark Casse, trainer of last year's winner Prospective (Malibu Moon) and last month's GIII Sam F. Davis runner-up **Dynamic Sky** (Sky Mesa). "He may be the next Secretariat, but we all know we've seen similar types, and when you go around two turns, it can change things sometimes."

**Falling Sky** (Lion Heart) and **Dynamic Sky** proved close in more than just name last time, as the former set the pace before holding on to a neck advantage on the latter under the line in the track-and-trip Sam Davis. **Falling Sky** was making his first start for trainer John Terranova and owners Newtown Anner Stud, James Covello and Joseph Bulger last time, having been previously conditioned by Antonio Sano for Armachan Stable and Off the Hook LLC. The bay bested a pair of next-out winners in his final start for his old connections--a 6 1/2-furlong optional claimer in Hallandale Dec. 15. John Oxley's **Dynamic Sky**, second in last year's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland ahead of **Java's War** (War Pass), annexed the seven-furlong Pasco S. here Jan. 2. According to Trakus data, he covered 51 feet more than **Falling Sky** in the Sam Davis, which equates to some six lengths.

Verrazano isn't the only undefeated Todd Pletcher trainee in the Tampa Bay Derby, as Starlight Racing's **Park City** (Harlan's Holiday) travels beyond 6 1/2 panels for the first time and puts his two-for-two record on the line. The bay was a debut winner in the Saratoga slop in July, and returned at Gulfstream Feb. 9 to annex an allowance/optional claimer by a neck.

Joseph Bucci's **Honorable Dillon** (Tapit) is another who stretches out, but he's already got the graded stakes part down. The grey came from off the pace to annex Gulfstream's seven-furlong GII Hutcheson S. last time Feb. 2 with a second-best last-out Beyer of 94.

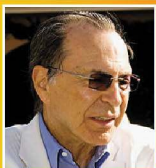

Goldencents earned the **"TDN Rising Star"** tag when he aired by 7 1/4 lengths at Del Mar in September, and subsequently finished second to eventual juvenile champion Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) in Belmont's GI Champagne S. Oct. 6. His connections opted to bypass the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but were rewarded two weeks later when the bay took home the winner's share of \$1-million GIII Delta Downs Jackpot Nov. 17. That heat's sixth-place finisher Itsmyluckyday (Lawyer Ron) has since flattered the form of that race with impressive tallies in the Gulfstream Park Derby and GIII Holy Bull S. Goldencents was last seen annexing the one-mile GIII Sham S. with a field-best 98 Beyer Speed Figure. Both of the favorites were on the lead in their most recent efforts, but they'll most likely have to concede early command to Southern Equine Stable and Mike Smith's **Salutos Amigos** (Salute the Sarge). He was purchased privately from trainer Kathy Walsh after surviving taxing splits to be second in a key five-furlong heat on the Betfair Hollywood Park lawn. The bay chased free-wheeling Let Em Shine (Songandaprayer) before fading to fourth in his first start for Eric Guillot Jan. 19, but survived a duel to break through last time Feb. 9. His sire was a two-time graded stakes winner going short for Southern Equine/Guillot, but did finish second in the 2007 GI Norfolk S. at this trip. Salutos Amigos's dam Sarasota (Arg) (Luhuk) was a MGSW sprinting in her native country, but she did drop Sarah's Secret (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), winner of the nine-furlong GII Honeymoon H. on the turf in Inglewood.

## CLASSIC WINNER BACK FOR MORE AT FIVE

Janis Whitham's homebred **Fort Larned** (E Dubai) makes his first start since a game victory from Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) in the Nov. 3 GI Breeders' Cup Classic in today's GII Gulfstream Park H. Just over a year ago, the unsung then-4-year-old appeared to turn a corner when he annexed Tampa's Challenger S. He'd grab the local GIII Skip Away S. with a 108 Beyer Speed Figure next out, and later in the season became a Grade I winner when he bested a tough group in Saratoga's Whitney Invitational H. in August. An even third in Belmont's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in September, the Ian Wilkes trainee was sharp as a tack in the Classic at Santa Anita, grabbing the early lead and refusing to let go en route to earning a gaudy 117 Beyer Speed Figure. The bay has been working regularly at Palm Meadows since last month, but could need a start off the bench for a conditioner who tends to take his time. "We've freshened him quite a bit since the Breeders' Cup," Wilkes noted. "We've been in a nice work pattern. For me and my style, I thought [this] was the perfect race back for him." E Paul Robsham Stables's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Discreet Dancer** (Discreet Cat) could pose major problems for the favorite second off a lay off of his own. The homebred won his first two starts here last meet by a combined 15 1/4 lengths, but finished third at odds-on in the GII Fountain of Youth S. last February behind Union Rags (Dixie Union). Shelved nearly a year until a Feb. 6 allowance, the chestnut out gamed stakes winner Candyman E (Candy Ride {Arg}) to score by a neck. He now stretches out to the same trip at which he beat fellow Wilkes trainee and subsequent MGSW Neck 'n Neck (Flower Alley) by 5 1/2 lengths in an allowance last January. **Fort Loudon** (Awesome of Course) was second to the aforementioned Neck 'n Neck going this distance at Churchill in the Nov. 2 GIII Ack Ack H., but is probably best at a sprint distance. He turned back off a distant third behind Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) to annex this venue's GIII Gulfstream Park Sprint Championship by a half-length over **Swagger Jack** (Smart Strike) last month.

West Point Thoroughbreds and Tom Keithley’s **Flashy Gray** (Flashy Bull) takes another step towards the GI Kentucky Oaks today as she makes her black-type bow in Oaklawn’s GIII Honeybee S. The grey kicked off her career for trainer Lon Wiggins, donning cap and

gown by 10 1/4 lengths sprinting second out at Churchill Nov. 8, and made some more noise across the state five days later when she sold for \$775,000 at Keeneland November as part of the Dolphus Morrison

dispersal. Subsequently transferred to the well-stocked Bill Mott barn, Flash Gray was a no-brainer ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ when she easily bested Gulfstream allowance foes by 4 3/4 lengths with a stand-out 95 Beyer Feb. 10. The expected chalk makes her first try around two turns, but the wagering public doesn't seem concerned with her ability to go long--she was made the 6-1 favorite in last week's Kentucky Oaks Future Wager over the likes of champion Beholder (Henny Hughes) and unbeaten multiple graded stakes winner Unlimited Budget (Street Sense).

Also stretching out is WinStar Farm’s **Awesome Mama** (Awesome Again), a debut winner at Turfway Dec. 8 who cleared her first-level allowance condition going six panels here Jan. 27. The Shannon Ritter pupil is out of Mama Nadine (A.P. Indy), a stakes winner at an extended mile who herself is out of champion 2-year-old filly Countess Diana (Deerhound), so more distance should pose no problem. **Sister Ginger** (Student Council) upset GIII Delta Downs Princess S. heroine **Rose to Gold** (Friends Lake) in the Feb. 9 Martha Washington S. here. **Broken Spell** (Broken Vow), **American Sugar** (Harlan’s Holiday) and **Liberty Girl** (A. P. Warrior) were third, fourth and fifth in that heat, respectively.

He is in great form and he has done very well over the winter so we are very pleased with him - we always thought he would make a lovely 3-year-old.”

### ALTERNATION BACK AT FAVORITE TRACK

**Alternation** (Distorted Humor) returns to his favorite strip--Oaklawn Park--to defend his GIII Razorback H. title today. A winner of last year's Essex H. as a prep for the 2012 renewal of this event, Alternation bested eventual GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile hero Tapizar (Tapit) a year ago before defeating last-out GI Santa Anita H. hero Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) in the GII Oaklawn H. a month later, improving his race record in Hot Springs to 6-5-0-0. A subsequent winner of the GIII Pimlico Special S. in May and Remington's Governor's Cup S. in August, Alternation has been sidelined since finishing sixth at 4-5 in Hawthorne's GII Hollywood Gold Cup H. Oct. 6. He breezed five furlongs locally in 1:03 3/5 a week ago in preparation for this. "I thought it went well," trainer Donnie K. Von Hemel said after the drill. "Things have gone well this winter. With any horse you always are a bit apprehensive, asking yourself 'have I done enough?' But, at some point you have to have faith in your horse and lead him over there." Among Alternation's challengers are **Cyber Secret** (Broken Vow), **Golden Ron** (Golden Missile) and **Atigun** (Istan), one-two-three respectively in a track-and-trip allowance Feb. 15; and **Donoharm** (Lemon Drop Kid) and **San Pablo** (Jump Start), who completed the exacta in the Feb. 2 Essex.

Little Mike faces a stiff challenge from several in-form horses. With the scratch of Saint Baudolino (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), Godolphin will send out three runners, including **Hunter's Light (Ire)**. The homebred chestnut, trained for Sheikh Mohammed by Saeed bin Suroor, has won three of his four starts on synthetics, and enters this test off a handy 3 1/4-length defeat of Surfer (Distorted Humor) in Round 2 of the Maktoum Challenge at 1900 meters Feb. 7. He retains the services of Silvestre de Sousa. Drawn alongside is defending World Cup champion **Monterosso (Ire)**, who faces the starter for the first time since a distant eighth in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown last July 7. "Ever since he won the Dubai World Cup last year, it has been the plan to run here on Super Saturday, as he has in each of the last two seasons, before defending his crown in the Dubai World Cup," trainer Mahmood al Zarooni explained. "He did not fire in the Eclipse, so we have freshened him up, and we are pleased with him at home, but it is likely he will need this run." **Kassiano (Ger)** makes his fifth Carnival appearance this season, having won his last three outings. He actually cuts back in trip off a 6 1/2-length tour-de-force going a mile and three furlongs Feb. 28.

## DE KOCK LOOKS THE MAD 'HATTA'

Trainer Mike de Kock, a three-time winner of the G1 Jebel Hatta, looks to have the race surrounded, as he saddles up three of the top contenders. Ipi Tombe (Zim) (Manshood) defeated the boys back in 2003, and **Igugu (Aus)** (Galileo {Ire}) flies the flag for the fairer sex this time around. Sensational in besting males in the G1 Durban July in 2011 and in last year's G1 J & B Met, she was programmed for this season's Carnival, and therefore had to endure months of quarantine. She returned to action in the G2 Balanchine S. Feb. 21 and led into the final 400 meters before understandably tiring to finish third behind **Sajjhaa (GB)** (King's Best). Anthony Delpech, who guided Vengeance of Rain (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) to win the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in 2007, flies in to be reacquainted with the mare. "It is brilliant to be back aboard--I was hoping to get the call and it is great that I have," the rider commented. "I know just how good she is and hopefully she can prove that on this world stage. It is very exciting." **Master of Hounds** (Kingmambo) is this race's defending champ, having defeated **City Style** (City Zip) by 3/4 of a length 12 months ago. Owned like Igugu by Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum, the 5-year-old returned from a December layoff to be second in the G2 Al Fahidi Fort S. going a mile Feb. 21. De Kock's third entrant is **The Apache (SAf)** (Mogok). Sixth to Igugu in the 2012 Met, the bay upset City Style and **Sharestan (Ire)** (Shamardal) in the Al Rashidiya S. Jan. 31.

### AWAIT THE DAWN GOES FOR THE GOLD

Today's G2 Dubai City of Gold at Meydan, the traditional local prep for the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic on the Dubai World Cup card Mar. 30, appears on paper to be a showdown between two runners: the Mike de Kock-trained **Await the Dawn** (Giant's Causeway), and Godolphin's **Masterstroke** (Monsun {Ger}). Multiple group stakes placed and Group 1 placed for Coolmore in 2010 and 2011, Await the Dawn was distanced in last year's G1 Dubai Duty Free in his lone start as a 5-year-old. Acquired privately thereafter by a group including de Kock, Await the Dawn showed little in his 6-year-old bow, finishing ninth in the Al Maktoum Challenge Round 2 here Feb. 7. De Kock has had little success with his first-up runners at this carnival, however, and Await the Dawn showed a complete turnaround two weeks later, winning a 2000-meter handicap in course-record time. Masterstroke makes his first start since finishing a distant third over very soft going in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in October. Out of a half-sister to Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), Masterstroke performed with consistency over similar trips in France last season, winning the G2 Lucien Barriere Grand Prix de Deauville prior to his Arc bid. **Jakkalberry (Ire)** (Storming Home {GB}) completed a global campaign last year, recording his lone victory in the American St. Leger S. at Arlington in August. His best performances have come against softer opposition, although he did record placings here last year in the G3 Nad Al Sheba Trophy and the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic.

### DULLAHAN AT HOME ON THE SYNTH

Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score) has won just three of his 14 career trips to the post. The common denominator? An artificial surface. The striking chestnut broke his maiden in style in the 2011 GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland before adding that track's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. He shipped to California for last August's GI Pacific Classic, where he took down the colors of Game On Dude (Awesome Again) with a career-best 111 Beyer. He tries the Tapeta track for this World Cup prep off unplaced efforts in the GI Jamaica H. and GI Breeders' Cup Turf, but trained well at Gulfstream prior to his departure, and, like his stablemate Little Mike, seems to be thriving at Meydan. Today's Burj Nahaar will be anything but a walkover. Godolphin's **African Story (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) parlayed a four-length success in this event into victory by a similar margin in the G2 Godolphin Mile last year and will be looking to complete that double again this term. **Barbecue Eddie** (Stormy Atlantic) is going strong at the age of nine and opened the Carnival with a 1 1/2-length success in Round 1 of the G3 Maktoum Challenge Jan. 10. The dark bay couldn't quite repeat the dose in the G3 Firebreak S. Feb. 14, finishing 2 1/4 lengths adrift of the victorious **Moonwalk in Paris (Fr)** (Oratorio {Ire}). Besilu Stables' **Unbridled Ocean** (Unbridled's Song) made an immediate impression in his lone appearance this season in a 1600-meter handicap Feb. 21, scoring by 3/4 of a length, and is not without his chances, though he will need to improve to be a factor. **Field p9**

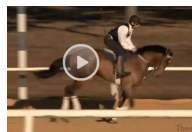

**NASS LOOKS FOR REPEAT FACTOR**

**Krypton Factor (GB)** (Kyllachy) won last year's G3 Mahab Al Shimaal en route to victory in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen over the same track and trip on the Dubai World Cup card, and the 5-year-old dark bay is back to defend his title in the 1200m Tapeta sprint at Meydan today. Owned and trained by Bahrain native Fawzi Nass, Krypton Factor is the highest rated runner in the field at 123, and he looms large over the opposition. He rounded out a globe-trotting 2012 campaign with a sixth-place finish--beaten 1 3/4 lengths--behind Australian sprinting superstar Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot in June, and resumed with a strong third-place effort behind another top Australian sprinter in Mental (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) over this course and distance in the G3 Al Shindagha Sprint Feb. 14. Mental will bypass this event and wait for the Golden Shaheen, and Nass noted that he expects a strong run from Krypton Factor. "We were delighted with his return, a good third in the Al Shindagha Sprint when we knew he would need the run," Nass said. "This has always been the plan, and he has a good draw so we expect him to go well." Irish import **Balmont Mast (Ire)** (Balmont) will have to improve drastically to head the favorite, but given his consistency and affinity for these conditions, it would be no surprise to see him hit the board. The 5-year-old gelding did beat the well regarded Nocturnal Affair (SAf) (Victory Moon {SAf})--a winner here last season--in back-to-back victories at Dundalk in October, and he finished well to grab fourth in the Al Shindagha Sprint last out. **August Rush (SAf)** (Var) was competitive with the best sprinters in South Africa--including Meydan Sprint favorite Shea Shea (SAf) (National Emblem {SAf})--before leaving his native country in 2011, and he made a respectable showing in two starts here last season, finishing third in this event and a close up fifth in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint on the Dubai World Cup card. Off since September, he will likely need the run, but has run well fresh in the past. He makes his first start for trainer Seth Benzel and secures the services of jockey Ryan Moore.

He tallied three wins over the Kempton synthetic before shipping to Meydan, where he was third in an allowance Jan. 17. **Zahee (NZ)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), the highweight at 130 pounds, won two handicaps last fall before making the ship to Dubai where he was fourth in an allowance Jan. 17 and third in the 2000 Guineas. **Elleval (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) is the only starter with a win at Meydan this season, having taken a seven-panel allowance on the turf Feb. 7. ## GOTHAM BOYS RAMPS UP

By Lucas Marquardt

Gotham Boys, a yearling-to-juvenile pinhooking partnership led by Rob LaPenta--son of prominent owner Bob LaPenta--didn't waste much time last year in acquiring prospects for its second season of operation. In concert with 2-year-old consignor Dave Scanlon, who selects prospects as yearlings and readies them for the juvenile sales, Gotham Boys purchased the very first yearling to sell in 2012, a striking filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Colonel John (Tiznow) who sold as hip 1 at Fasig-Tipton July for \$200,000.

"We've been having fun with it," said Rob LaPenta. "We had some success last year with a limited budget, and we stepped it up at the yearling sales. We've got a good group of horses."

In all, Gotham Boys purchased 15 prospects for the current 2-year-old sales, including a handful of horses that will sell Tuesday and Wednesday at the OBS March Selected Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training in Ocala. The two-day sale kicks off Tuesday at 11 a.m.

For years, Bob LaPenta operated his Whitehorse stables as a quasi-pinhooking venture. That is, he offered the vast majority of his yearling purchases at auction as 2-year-olds, but was known for setting aggressive reserves and certainly didn't mind racing buybacks. LaPenta offered and/or sold horses like Grade I winners Stay Thirsty (Bernardini) and The Cliff's Edge (Gulch), the \$4.5 million FTFFEB topper Fusaichi Samurai (Fusaichi Pegasus), Classic-placed Andromeda's Hero (Fusaichi Pegasus), Grade II winner Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft), and others.

"In the last few years, however, Mr. LaPenta decided he wanted to concentrate more on racing, so he kind of divided the stable," said Dave Scanlon. "Bob turned Whitehorse more into a conventional racing stable, and Rob started up Gotham Boys."

Added Rob, "I always had friends that wanted to do something, but it was really my dad's operation, and I didn't want to bring anyone else in. But we had such a good team set up, and we decided to take a shot and buy some horses." **Cont. p11**

## JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES NEW FATALITY DATA

The Jockey Club released an updated North American racing fatality rate for Thoroughbreds yesterday. The updated rate is based on an analysis of 1,532,418 races from Jan. 1, 2009 to Dec. 31, 2012 collected in the Equine Injury Database. During that time period, the frequency of a race-related fatality was 1.92 per 1,000 starts.

"The causes of racing injuries are often very complex and involve multiple factors interacting together over time," said Dr. Tim Parkin, a veterinarian and epidemiologist from the University of Glasgow, and consultant on the Equine Injury Database. "While the fatality rate has remained fairly static over the course of the past four years, the real significance today is that, with 1.5 million starts in the database, we have now established a baseline and we can begin to analyze the relationships between each of the individual factors. In the future, we will be able to design interventions based on these data and recommend actions that will reduce injuries and fatalities."

Parkin's analysis also found that there is a reduction of risk in grass races compared to dirt races and that there is additional reduction of risk on synthetic surfaces compared to both dirt and turf. He also found that moving a race off the turf onto dirt or synthetic surfaces does not increase the risk of fatality and 2-year-olds were at significantly reduced risk of fatality compared to older horses when racing on dirt. Rob said his temperament is suited to the pinhooking game. "My dad's more of a longer-term investor," he said. "He likes building companies. I'm a Wall St. guy--a trader type--and I like the action of buying and selling."

While Rob is the principal of Gotham Boys, the group includes some friends and business partners. Among them is high school buddy Mike Annicelli, who as a former Manhattanite--Rob still lives in the borough--helped give the operation its moniker. Scanlon also has a small stake.

Gotham Boys got off to a good start at the 2012 juvenile sales. Together with Scanlon, Gotham Boys sold the \$435,000 Tactical Moment (Tale of the Cat--Ellie's Moment, by Kris S.) at the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale. Mark Casse purchased the colt and recently sent him out to a solid debut fifth on the Gulfstream sod Feb. 14. Gotham Boys had purchased Tactical Moment, in its first season of operation, for \$150,000 at 2011 Keeneland September Sale.

"We typically buy in the \$75,000 to \$200,000 range--\$200,000 is our ceiling," Scanlon said, adding, "We are looking for horses we think will be early horses, and horses that have a little sire power."

The description fits a Tapit filly that Gotham Boys sold at Barretts March last week. Gotham Boys had purchased the filly, a daughter of the talented five-time juvenile stakes winner Punch Appeal (Successful Appeal), in partnership with Bruno DeBerdt's Excel Bloodstock for \$140,000 last year at September. At Barretts, Excel resold the filly to West Point Thoroughbreds for \$320,000.

Gotham Boys and DeBerdt have joined together on a few prospects, including, at OBS March, [Hip 262](#), a filly by City Zip--Glitter Time (Glitterman) who breezed an eighth in [:10 1/5](#) at yesterday's under-tack show.

"She worked fast and is out of a Glitterman mare," said Scanlon. "She's a real well-balanced and very pretty filly."

The City Zip filly was a \$110,000 KEESEP yearling.

By itself, Gotham Boys is also represented by [Hip 179](#), a Tale of the Cat--Big Bambu (Salt Lake) colt. The colt's dam won the GIII Honorable Miss H. at Belmont and was runner-up in Saratoga's GI Test S. in 2000. The colt, a \$60,000 Fasig-Tipton October grad, breezed an eighth yesterday in [:10 flat](#).

"He's a really nice colt and he's been working fast, and he's out of a mare who made quite a lot of money," said Scanlon. "He's just a real solid individual."

Scanlon said [Hip 222](#), a Dixie Union--Delicate Affair (Langfuhr) filly who hails from a deep Phipps family, is another to watch. She worked an eighth yesterday in [:10 2/5](#).

"She's really nice--she's real powerful and looks very quick," said Scanlon. "She's got a nice body and has some pedigree to her, as well."

Rob LaPenta said Gotham Boys will be much less aggressive in setting reserves than Whitehorse. "Obviously we'll put reserves on the horses, and we're not going to give them away, but they're all going to be sold, unless there's an injury or some sort of mitigating circumstance and we have to take them out of the sale," he said. "Even last year, if there was a horse we had to pull out of an early sale, we put them in Timonium later in the season. We're all prepared to see some good horses hit the track that we've sold, and to think, 'Aw man, that could have been us.' But we'll have sold the horse, and so we are part of it, and we're okay with that. Plus I still feel part of all my dad's horses--the whole family and even my friends feel involved."

LaPenta said he's expecting a big spring for Gotham Boys. "We've got some really nice horses going to Palm Meadows," he said, noting the aforementioned Colonel John filly is headed there.

LaPenta also said he expects Gotham Boys to be a long-term project. "It's still forming--we're only in our second year doing it," he reasoned. "We'll continue to tweak it as we go along. The economy isn't great, but there are still people interested in doing things of this nature. We'll refine the methods and get better. But so far, so good. We're excited to be part of it."

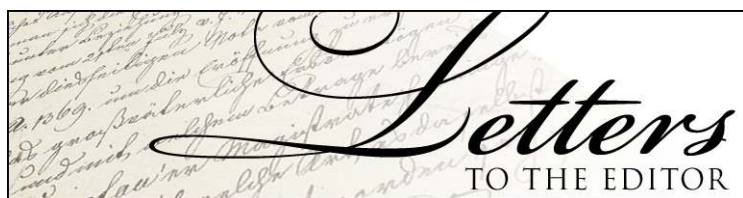

# op/ed feedback

In response to [The Real Problem With Lasix?](#) (3/8/13):

Bill Finley hits the nail on the head. Our horses race less and less and it's killing the sport economically. It's hard to prove causation, but the proliferation of legal medication almost certainly is a factor. Lasix is supposed to prolong horses' careers and make them run more, but the opposite appears to be true. The American trainers and vets, together with the owners who they can persuade, stand virtually alone against the rest of the international racing world with their fixation that the only way Thoroughbreds can compete humanely is with Lasix. Why is this?

In addition to Lasix, the other obvious change over the last 30 years is trainer discretion. One reason trainers don't mind the negative effects of Lasix is they are not that much interested in running them back in two weeks anyway.

There are 2 reasons for this in my opinion:

1) There has been a tremendous consolidation of trainers over the last 40 years. When I rubbed horses for John Nerud and Woody Stephens in the 1970s a big stable was 40 horses. Now the major trainers oversee 100-400 horses. In order to keep them from running against each other they need to space the races out and they have convinced everybody that this is the way racing has to work. Racing secretaries have accommodated this.

2) Trainer competition for horses has focused attention on win percentages. If you run them more often, your win percentage mathematically goes down. So everybody tries to more or less "peak" their horse every time instead of running the horse through his normal form cycles. There is no doubt in my mind that if horses did not race and train on Lasix that they could run more often.

The owners own the horses, but are usually involved in other businesses. They tend to listen to their trainers and that's the way it should be. But on this divisive medication issue which so negatively affects the economics, image, credibility and integrity of the game, the owners need to take a stand. They are paying the bills. This is the only business I know where the business owners take direction from the employees.

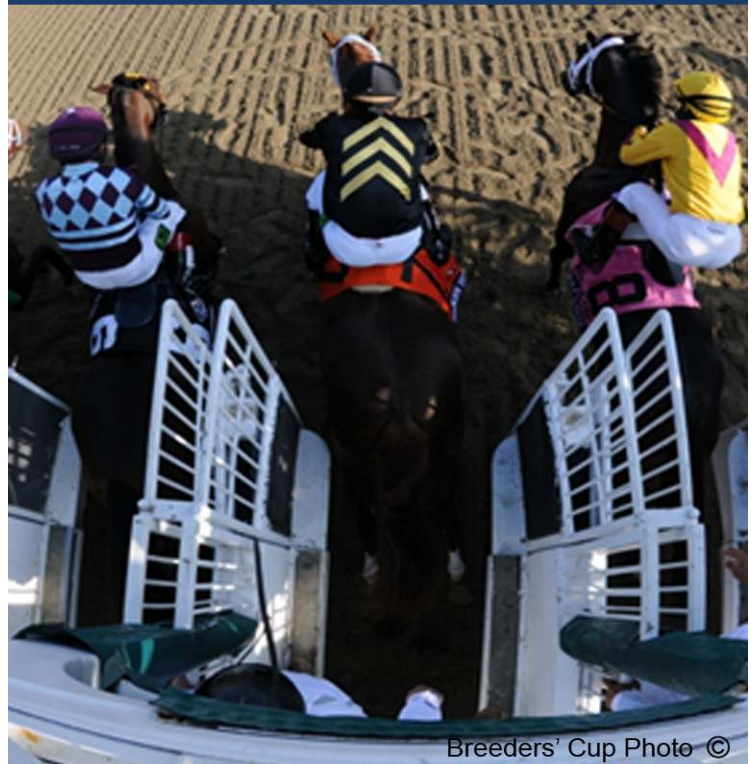
This is one decision the owners should make.

**GII Tampa Bay Derby** - Weird things are known to happen over the quirky Tampa main oval, but I just can't come up with a better reason than that to go against heavily favored **Verrazano**. His running style and pedigree don't exactly scream First Saturday in May, but that's a discussion for another day. Hard to imagine the very talented son of More Than Ready not remaining perfect, or failing to hit the board, after a pair of brilliant performances going one turn at Gulfstream earlier this year. **Java's War**, training up a storm at Gulfstream for his sophomore debut, looks sneaky enough for me to want to include in the gimmicks at the right price. Can he atone for his ill-fated sire's flop at .05 cents on the dollar in this race in 2008? **Selection: #6 Verrazano (4-5)**

**GII San Felipe** - Not quite in love with either **Flashback** or **Goldencents** at this stage yet, and the presence of the speedy sprinter **Salutos Amigos** makes for a very interesting pace scenario for the aforementioned duo here. Do horses really win from 17 lengths out of it going a mile at Santa Anita? That's what Cal-bred **Tiz a Minister** did while making his dirt debut over a wet fast surface in the California Breeders Champion S. last time. He received a very respectable 88 Beyer that day, and should get plenty of pace to run at this time, too. Well-seasoned runner (already has nine starts under his belt) can only benefit from the services of Garrett Gomez for the second straight race. Live at a price in his graded stakes debut. **Selection: #6 Tiz a Minister (12-1)**

## STAYING ALIVE

## BRIAN DIDONATO:

**Last Week** - **Sky Captain** didn't run a step in the Gotham, and checked in 10th. I was way off on the dynamics of that race as well, as **Elnaawi**, who I was tempted to pick and who my opponent landed on, was not on the lead, but still managed to finish third. **Vyjack** was very impressive, but I'm still not sure he's a Derby horse. We'll see.

**GII Tampa Bay Derby - Verrazano** has given every indication so far that he's just a monster, and I'm sort of rooting for him to continue to impress here because I'm not entirely sure he's a 10-furlong type. Since there's no value in taking the chalk to show, I'll make a bit of a stab with **Java's War**. A stakes winner on the turf at Louisiana Downs last September, the Fipke homebred endured some traffic trouble in the stretch when third--one spot behind **Dynamic Sky**--in Keeneland's GI Breeders' Futurity Oct. 6. He came with an eye-catching six-wide move last time in the Nov. 24 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. before flattening out to sixth, but appears to be working very well in the interim for trainer Ken McPeck, who nearly won this event last year with Golden Ticket. **Selection: #4 Java's War (12-1)**

**GII San Felipe S. - Flashback** has an awful lot of hype surrounding him considering what he's accomplished so far. His winning debut going seven panels at Betfair Hollywood Park Dec. 8 came with a fairly easy trip, and we learned absolutely nothing about him in his GII Robert B. Lewis S. score. The full-brother to MGISW Zazu enjoyed an easy lead against just three overmatched opponents. Considering he was 12-1 compared to 24-1 on **Goldencents** and 17-1 on his much-quicker stablemate Super Ninety Nine in the second round of Derby futures, it seems very likely that Flashback will again take more than his fair share of money. Goldencents is obviously the most likely upsetter. He enters off back-to-back stakes wins that were more impressive considering pace dynamics than Flashback's last, and five straight bullet six-furlong works over the strip since his GIII Sham S. win signal readiness. I'll use the likely second choice in my wagers, but for this contest, I'll go with **Hear the Ghost** (Ghostzapper). His pedigree could go either way in terms of sprinting or routing, but he runs to me like a horse who wants more ground. He's a big horse who takes a long time to get going, and you could see last time when he was second in the six-furlong San Pedro S. here Jan. 21 that he was just getting started in the final furlong or so. If he can relax and make one run, look out. **Selection: #5 Hear the Ghost (6-1)**

**ONTARIO PREMIER VOICES SUPPORT FOR RACING** Ontario Premier Kathleen Wynne voiced her support for the province's horse racing industry yesterday, stating at a press conference at Grand River Raceway that her government will work with the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation to incorporate racing into the province's gaming strategy.

The OLG announced the cancellation of the Slots at Racetracks program last March. As part of that agreement, 20% of slots revenue--about \$345 million annually--went to horsemen and purse accounts in exchange for the use of racetrack facilities for racinos.

Wynne also announced that Grand River Raceway and three other standardbred tracks--Western Fair, Hanover Raceway and Clinton Raceway--have signed lease agreements with the OLG to host slots machines at their facilities. This comes after Woodbine and Mohawk Racetracks reached deals at the end of January. Details of the agreements will not be revealed until the province's eight remaining tracks sign on, but the deals are known to be far less lucrative than the previous revenue-sharing agreement set to expire Mar. 31. This was highlighted by WEG's recent termination of more than 100 employees, and a nearly 15% reduction in racedays for Woodbine for 2013.

"The reality is that the amount of money that was part of that agreement is going to change," Wynne said. "We've been clear about that. Having said that, we need a horse racing industry as well as strong healthcare and education."

It is reported that the government has reached agreements-in-principle with the eight remaining tracks.

**Cal Expo Shooting for May Debut of Exchange Wagering:**  
by Bill Finley

The debut of exchange wagering in California hit a minor snag, but officials at Cal Expo remain confident the form of wagering that is popular in England will be up and running sometime in May.

The California Horse Racing Board has already adopted rules allowing exchange wagering, but those same rules must be reviewed by the California Office of Administrative Law before going into effect. Cal Expo management was hopeful that OAL would adopt the rules quickly, but instead decided to make a few tweaks. The process was delayed about 40 days.

Chris Schick, the general manager of Cal Expo, said he doesn't anticipate any further problems and believes the OAL will approve the Racing Board's regulation any day now. If that happens he said exchange wagering should start in May.

"Assuming the Office of Administrative Law accepts the Racing Board rules, which is usually the case, the path will clear for the Racing Board to accept applications to conduct exchange wagering in California."

Cal Expo has aligned itself with Betfair, which will run its betting exchange.

The Cal Expo betting exchange can only accept wagering on harness races and only California residents can take part. In addition to taking wagering on Cal Expo, Schick is hopeful to add races from other North American harness tracks. He said he has yet to have any concrete talks with other tracks but said that in informal talks Meadowlands management has expressed an interest in exchange betting.

"We would be the California host for other harness tracks on the exchange," Schick explained. "For instance, we would need a three-way agreement among ourselves, Betfair and the Meadowlands in order to take Meadowlands racing. All three parties would get a cut."
