It would appear that very little stands between **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) and victory number 24 from as many visits to the races, as she figures something around four cents on the dollar in tonight's G1 William Reid S., an event she also took in 2011. A win, which has been effectively conceded to her by fans and many of the connections of her six rivals, would give her 14 at the top level, equaling the Australian mark set over 30 years ago by Kingston Town (Aus) and breaking a tie with her fellow legendary distaffer Sunline (NZ) and Tie the Knot (Aus). Trainer Peter Moody, who was recently hospitalized for six days with blood poisoning in a leg, brings his typical confidence into the mare's seventh appearance at Moonee Valley, but says the 5-week gap between this and her first-up win in the G1 Black Caviar Lightning S. Feb. 16, was necessary. "She felt the Lightning run," Moody told *Australian Associated Press*. "It was a hot day and she ran that record time and was a bit jaded." After laying low for a week and a half, Black Caviar resumed steady training, and a trio of racecourse gallops has her ready for what *could* be her final appearance in Melbourne. "The option is there that she could be going to the breeding barn this year, but the owners haven't signed off on that, so the option is maybe this isn't the last opportunity Victoria gets to see of her," Moody cautioned.

The featured \$10-million Dubai World Cup has attracted 13 runners, 10 of whom have succeeded at the top level. Godolphin's **Monterosso (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) will be looking to become the first to post back-to-back wins in the event, but will have to defeat a field including champions **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) and **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), **Dullahan** (Even the Score) and G1 Maktoum Challenge hero **Hunter's Light (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}).

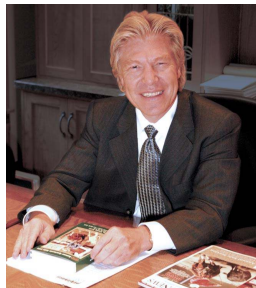

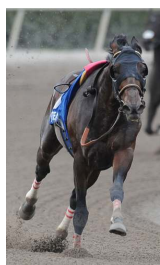

Surprise, Surprise...

There were a handful of unexpected developments when the fields were published Thursday, chief among those the presence in the World Cup field of **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}). The 7-year-old, trained by Ed Dunlop, has made a name for himself over staying distances in the last few seasons,

and lost a head bob to G1 Sheema Classic hopeful Dunaden (Fr) (Red Cadeaux {GB}) in the 2011 G1 Melbourne Cup. He most recently gave his owner, former Hong Kong Jockey Club Chairman Ron Arculli, a memorable victory in the G1 Hong Kong Vase last December, but switches to the all-weather for his

seasonal debut. The chestnut won his maiden at Wolverhampton back in 2009 and was runner-up in the G3 Sagaro S. over a two-mile trip at Kempton last May.

African Story (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) returned from a 10-month absence with an impressive victory in the G3 Burj Nahaar S. on Super Saturday Mar. 9, a race he used en route to a score in the G2 Godolphin Mile in 2012. But connections have called an audible and have rerouted the lightly raced 6-year-old to the World Cup. He has never gone beyond a mile in his 14-race career. After failing to prove he could handle the Tapeta, it was announced that Priscilla Vaccarezza's **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) would go back to the turf on World Cup night. After mulling over which of the two \$5 million races to take in, connections have landed on the G1 Duty Free S., where he will face stiff competition in the form of G1 Cox Plate hero **Ocean Park (NZ)** (Thorn Park {Aus}) and G1 Jebel Hatta heroine **Sajjhaa (Ire)** (King's Best).

Familiar Faces...

If at first you do succeed, why not try again, and those who have met with good fortune at Meydan are happy to take another crack. **Krypton Factor (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) is back to defend his title in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, but doesn't seem to be in quite the same form as he was last March. He was third to **Mental (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}) in the G3 Al Shindagha Sprint Feb. 14 and runner-up to outsider **Reynaldothewizard** (Speightstown) in the G3 Mahab Al Shimaal Mar. 9. **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will make his first start since a solid third to Little Mike in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and will try to improve on his narrow defeat at the hands of Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic.

The 12-furlong heat has also attracted the aforementioned **Dunaden (Fr)** as well as G1 Japan Cup victress **Gentildonna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and her compatriot **Trailblazer (Jpn)** (Zenno Rob Roy {Jpn}), fourth in the BC Turf. Hong Kong's **Joy and Fun (NZ)** (Cullen {Aus}) registered the upset in the 2010 Al Quoz Sprint and makes his third trip to the desert in the last four years after finishing a good third in last year's running. He was joined on the flight by 1000-meter specialist **Eagle Regiment (Aus)** (El Moxie), but they'll both have **Shea Shea (SAf)** (National Emblem {SAf}) to catch this time around.

A total of 107 horses from 10 racing jurisdictions have been nominated to the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup and G1 Champions Mile, to be held at Hong Kong's Sha Tin Racecourse Apr. 28 and May 5, respectively. Reigning Hong Kong Horse of the Year **Ambitious Dragon (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}) holds entries to both events, but is currently more likely to take in the 2000-meter QE II Cup, a race he won in 2011. Ambitious Dragon returned from a minor injury to post a scintillating victory in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup over seven furlongs Mar. 17. The 6-year-old is one of 23 engaged from the host nation, which could also be represented by two-time G1 Hong Kong Cup hero **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}) and recent Hong Kong Derby winner **Akeed Mofeed (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}). Leading Kiwi galloper **Sangster (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}) heads a list of 49 overseas nominations, which also includes G1 Melbourne Cup winner **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}), defending G1 Hong Kong Vase hero **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Geneueux {GB}) and recent G1 Maktoum Challenge winner **Hunter's Light (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}). **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) was also given an entry to both the QE II Cup and the Champions Mile. While defending champion **Xtension (Ire)** (Xaar {GB}) and **Glorious Days (Aus)** (Hussonet) feature alongside Ambitious Dragon for Hong Kong-based horses, the name of **All Too Hard (Aus)** (Casino Prince {Aus}) stands out among the foreign entries.

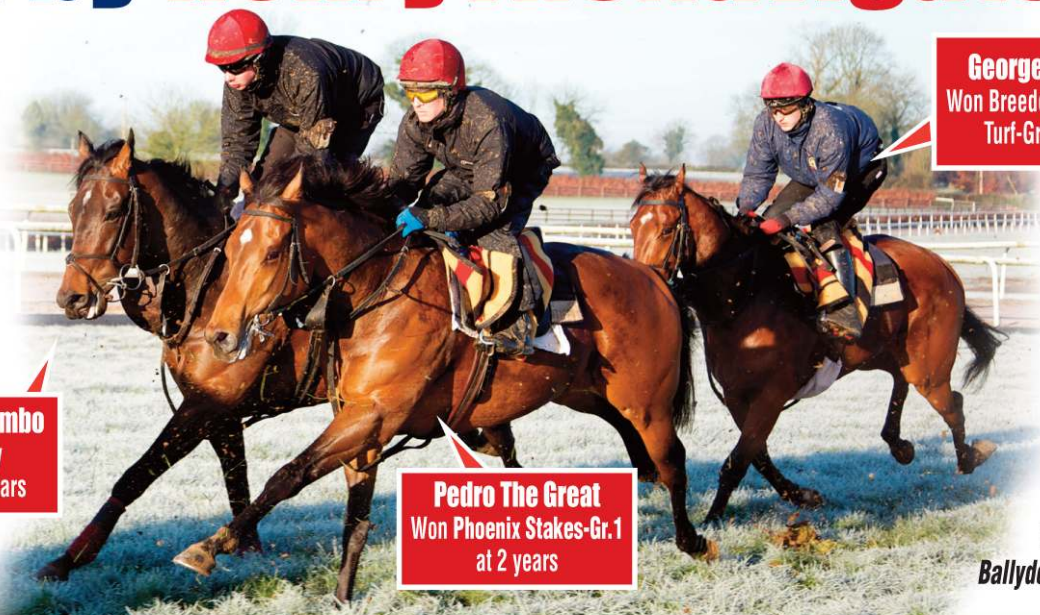

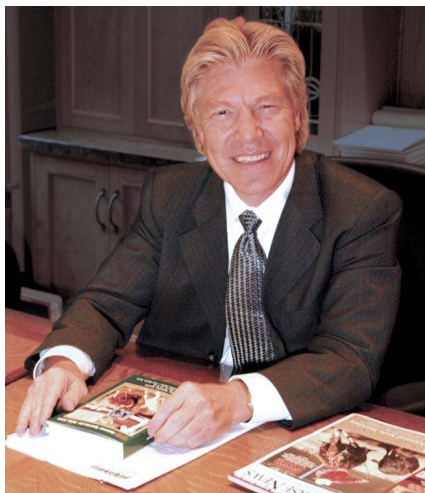

BREWSTER LOOKS FOR FASIG VERDICT

Oklahoma trial attorney Clark Brewster, who first got involved with racehorse ownership when Remington Park was built in the late 1980s, has been pinhooking horses on and off since 1992. Over the last four years, he has become more involved in yearling-to-juvenile pinhooking and, in partnership with consignor Cary Frommer, will send four 2-year-olds through the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale next Monday.

"We've always been pretty involved in buying at 2-year-olds in training sales," Brewster explained. "And I just thought, it gives you a little bit of a hedge on your bet, if you buy yearlings that are going to the 2-year-old sales that you like a lot that you can protect and, at the same time, may choose to have in your stable. So we decided to buy really nice yearlings and go to the 2-year-old sales with an eye towards either selling them or racing them. It just gave us a little more of a head start."

A conversation with Frommer last summer led to a partnership in five yearlings slated for this year's juvenile sales.

"Over the years, I've bought a few horses and I've had a great relationship with Cary," Brewster said. "Cary and I had a good talk--we have a home in Saratoga, as well, and we were up there this summer at the sales and decided to partner with Cary and took out some very nice yearlings."

Brewster thinks the timing is perfect to buy racehorses.

"I think we have a purse structure across the United States that is better than ever--particularly in New York racing, which we are very interested in. I think it is a good opportunity to be an owner--a good financially sound opportunity--maybe the best that it has been since I've been in the business."

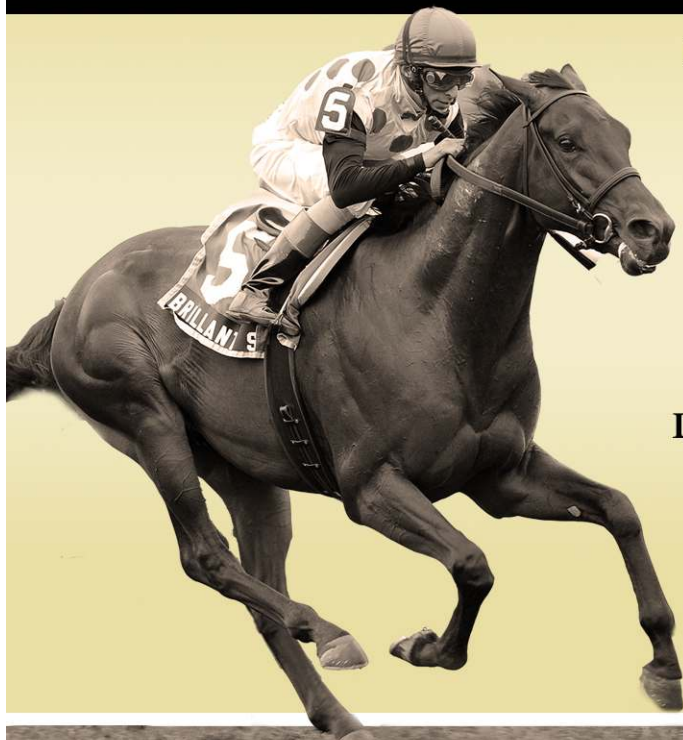
With that in mind, Brewster and Frommer didn't waste any time after deciding to join forces.

"We felt that there was a good opportunity at the Saratoga Sale, at the New York-bred session, to pick up some nice horses and we thought, if we ended up with them after the sales, we would be pleased either way," said Brewster. "So that was the strategy."

The partnership's first yearling, a colt by War Pass, failed to sell at OBS March, but Brewster is going into the Fasig-Tipton auction with plenty of confidence with the remaining four youngsters.

"I am optimistic, I think we have very nice individuals," Brewster said. "I don't think there is any dispute about that, and they are in great hands with Cary, who is just an outstanding horsewoman. And I think we've got a great venue, so I think we are all coalescing to a great sale down there."

All four Fasig 2-year-olds are fillies and were purchased in Brewster's targeted price range.

"They were anywhere in the \$60,000-\$130,000 range--in that range for yearlings you can get a good horse and not overspend," Brewster said. He added the fact that all four are fillies was coincidental. "If the individual is what we are looking for, it really, to me, didn't make a difference whether it be a filly or a colt. It was just the kind of individual that we wanted."

First up for the partners at Fasig-Tipton is [hip 23](#), a daughter of Bluegrass Cat out of Oatka Idas Destiny (A.P Jet), who sold for \$60,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York Sale. Also selling is: [hip 26](#), a filly by Henny Hughes and a full-sister to stakes winner Midnight Visit, who brought \$70,000 at the New York sale; [hip 80](#), a Tapit filly out of graded stakes-placed Unobstructed View (Yes It's True) who RNA'd at Keeneland September; and [hip 101](#), a filly by Dixie Union out of Blue Sky High (Unbridled) who sold for \$110,000 at the New York sale.

In addition to his law practice, Brewster and his wife Deborah own Brewster Ranch in Bristow, Oklahoma.

"We acquired the ranch almost 15 years ago," Brewster said. "We do keep Thoroughbred broodmares and young horses there, but it is primarily a cattle operation. We also having cutting horses that we compete on, and we have a show arena at the ranch where we have cuttings."

The Brewsters have 17 Thoroughbred broodmares. The band is split between Oklahoma, Kentucky and New York. The couple also has some 25 horses in training, racing in Kentucky, New York, Florida and New Orleans. **Cont. p8**

Asked to name his best horse to date, Brewster said, "It is always the most recent one, so I guess it would be Cherokee Queen. We had a lot of fun with her and I would have to rate her up at the top."

Cherokee Queen was a seven-time stakes winner for Brewster, including a victory in the 2011 Gill Suwannee River S. She sold for \$365,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale.

Brewster is involved in all aspects of the industry, but admits racing is his passion.

"I have had a lot of thrills in my life," he said. "I've had an incredible life, but I don't know that there is much that matches up with sitting close to the finish line and seeing your horse finish in front. I think that always eclipses everything else. Obviously, to have a horse well-sold, that feels good, too, but being at the track and seeing your horse, that you may have a lot of emotion invested in, from either raising it or selecting it, always makes you feel good and you never get tired of that."

Clark and Deborah Brewster will be in Florida next week, first to watch one of their horses run at Gulfstream and then to see their four juveniles go through the sales ring at Palm Meadows. Brewster won't admit to any nerves before either race or auction.

"When you've been in the court room as much as I've been in front of juries, the nerves of a horse race don't really get to you," he laughed. "It doesn't move my meter. I get excited, but I don't get too nervous about it."

The under-tack preview for the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale begins this morning at 9:00.

RMTC ANNOUNCES WITHDRAWAL TIME RECS

The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) yesterday released its recommendations for thresholds and withdrawal times for the therapeutic medications procaine penicillin, lidocaine, detomidine and xylazine. The recommendations were adopted at the RMTC's board meeting in Baltimore Mar. 19. The four medications were recently identified by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (RCI) as therapeutic, and the adoption of thresholds and withdrawal times will allow RCI to provide members with a comprehensive list of the 24 therapeutic medications identified by RMTC, RCI and the American Association of Equine Practitioners. Some of the recommendations are considered interim. "The RMTC's approval of these last few thresholds and withdrawal times from the set of 24 therapeutic substances identified by the industry represents a significant investment of resources by the RMTC and its stakeholders," RMTC Chairman Dr. Robert Lewis said. "These guidelines will pave the way for uniform adoption of medication regulations across the country." The list coincides with recent initiatives aimed at uniformity in the Mid-Atlantic and Northeastern states. "The adoption of these final thresholds is a key step that will enable RCI to enact the Controlled Therapeutic Substances List, which will then enable the participating states to begin the adoption and implementation process," explained RMTC Vice Chairman and Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association Chairman Alan Foreman. The RMTC board also established secondary thresholds for the non-steroidal anti-inflammatories (NSAIDs) phenylbutazone and flunixin meglumine at its meeting. A secondary threshold is the lower permissible level of a medication when there is the presence of two medications of the same type. The adoption of secondary thresholds was established to curb the practice of "stacking." Dr. Rick Arthur, RMTC Scientific Advisory Committee Chair and California's Equine Medical Director, said, "The administration of multiple NSAIDs is a welfare and safety concern for our equine and human athletes. The adoption of secondary thresholds will avoid the administration of phenylbutazone and flunixin in combination within 48 hours of racing."

Racing Industry Comes to Aid of Injured Jockey:

The Southern California racing industry is rallying around jockey Joy Scott who was injured Mar. 12 in a training accident at Santa Anita. A fund has been set up through the Winners Foundation to help Scott with her medical expenses.

Scott, 53, was on a horse trained by Eric Guillot when it reared and threw her. She suffered a compound fracture to her right femur, and a subsequent infection has delayed surgery at Huntington Memorial Hospital in nearby Pasadena. The horse was not injured.

Trainer Howard Zucker is spearheading the fundraising effort, with the help of Bob Fletcher of the Winners Foundation, Candace Coder-Chew, director of print and graphics at Santa Anita, Rosie Ybarra, and Chris Aplin. The Winners Foundation not only helps those in the industry with substance abuse problems, it also frequently aids backstretch workers in a variety of ways.

"Joy is going to need help paying her medical bills, which is why this fund has been set up," said Fletcher.

Coder-Chew created a giant card that was signed at Santa Anita's Clockers' Corner. John Shear, the 90-year-old paddock guard who threw himself in front of a young girl to save her when a horse got loose in the paddock a couple years ago, took the card to Scott.

"People have really stepped up," said Zucker. "It has been absolutely great. Joy is such a hard worker--she's been doing three jobs and is a single mother. She exercises horses in the morning, rides occasionally at Santa Anita, and then goes to Los Alamitos to ride at night."

Ybarra, who runs Santa Anita's concession stand at Clockers' Corner, has been collecting there, while Aplin has gone through the barn area.

"People have been wonderful," said Aplin, a good friend of Scott's. "One groom told me yesterday to come back today because he had to go to the bank. He gave me \$100."

Fletcher said that anyone wanting to donate money to Scott's medical expenses can make a check out to the Winners Foundation and specify that it go to help Scott. Harman added, "I am extremely excited about this opportunity, and the chance to play a central role in what I consider to be one of the world's great sports. My love of horse racing has been with me throughout my adult life, and I have a firm belief that we can make British racing even greater, building on its international reputation for quality and integrity and using its assets to take an increased share of the growing leisure market. I am positive about the sport's future and cannot wait to get started in the role. However, existing commitments over the coming months will preclude me from being able to devote sufficient time and energy to the role, so the BHA Board have kindly allowed me to wait until July before formally taking on the chairmanship. In the meantime, I will immediately seek to develop constructive relationships right across British racing, and look forward to supporting the work of the BHA Board, and its executive led by Paul Bittar."

**DWYER DRAWS RIDING BAN IN INDIA**

Jockey Martin Dwyer has been hit with a riding ban in India, from Apr. 6 through May 31, following a disciplinary hearing of the Royal Western India Turf Club yesterday. Dwyer, who has been given leave to appeal the decision, was found to have not allowed favorite Ice Age to run on her merits at the Mahalaxmi meeting Feb. 17. Security guards and local police intervened to quell the situation after punters at the Mumbai track reacted angrily to Dwyer's performance, demanding the race be declared void. RWITC officials did not void the race, but deemed Ice Age a non-runner and ordered all bets on the filly to be refunded. Fellow jockey Richard Hughes incurred a similar sanction in 2012, and if Dwyer's ban is ratified on appeal, it will likely be reciprocated worldwide. He will miss Britain's first two Classics of the season, but will be free to return in time for the June 1 G1 Epsom Oaks. "I'm still in a state of shock to be honest and I'm a bit numb," Dwyer told *PA Sport*. "I'm very disappointed with the decision, and I'm still trying to get my head around it. I'm going to file an appeal against the decision, and I will go through every possible course of action to lift the ban before I come home. The suspension starts Apr. 6, and I can ride until the appeal is heard, which could take anything up to 15 days. The vets report confirmed that the horse broke a blood vessel, and I dismounted as soon as we passed the post. I even had blood on me in the inquiry on the day. This was all confirmed today, but they decided that I didn't let the horse run on its merits. I can't say any more at this stage, as it could hurt my appeal, but, before I even think about the BHA maybe reciprocating it, I'm going to try to do everything I can over here."

Joe Keeling, who was appointed chairman designate of Horse Racing Ireland at the HRI Annual Awards ceremony Dec. 10, was yesterday confirmed as the organisation's chairman, replacing Denis Brosnan, by government minister Simon Coveney. 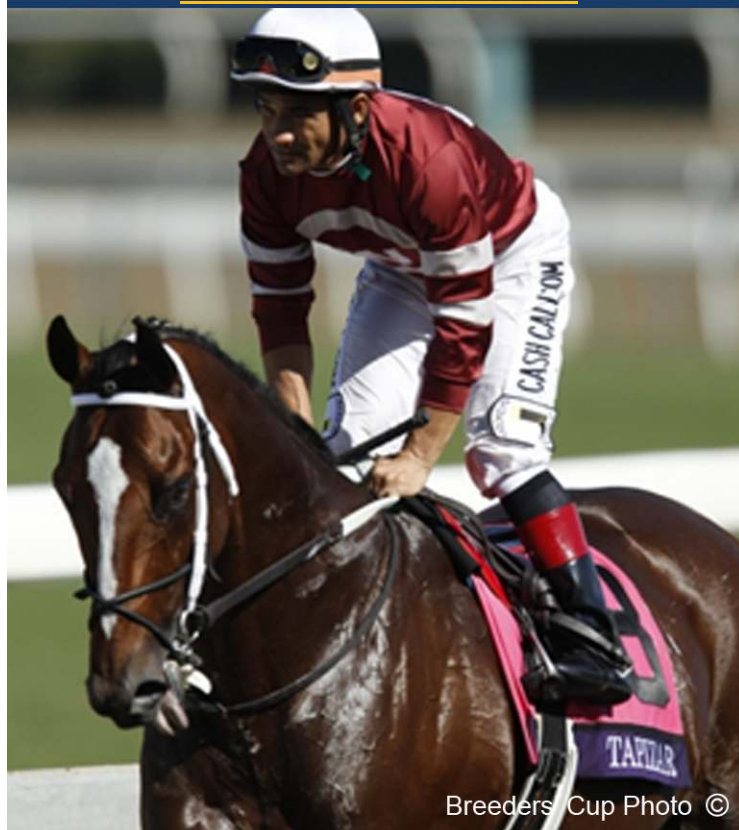

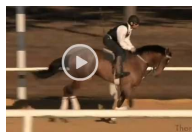
