FASIG-TIPTON FLORIDA SALE TODAY

The juvenile sales season, which has already produced impressive results at Barretts and OBS March, stops at Palm Meadows Training Center in Boynton Beach today for the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale.

Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. is going into today's sale with guarded optimism.

"I am going to go in with a lot of confidence, but with the understanding that it is a 2-year-old sale," Browning said. "It is going to be extremely competitive for the quality horses. The buyers are going to tend to congregate on

similar horses and, at the end of the day, we're going to say it was really good for a lot of horses, it was really thin for a lot of horses, and there was no market for others. It is the nature of the 2-year-old sales. But I think it will be very, very competitive for quality horses and I think we have a lot of quality horses, which is a good sign."

From limited numbers, the Fasig-Tipton sale produced its sixth Grade I winner of 2012-2013 when Joyful Victory (Tapit) strode home first in the GI Santa Margarita S. last weekend. The 5-year-old mare, a \$400,000 purchase by Fox Hill Farm out of the 2010 Florida sale, followed in the footsteps of fellow graduates and Grade I winners Graydar (Unbridled's Song), Stay Thirsty (Bernardini), Dance Card (Tapit), Eden's Moon (Malibu Moon) and Union Rags (Dixie Union).

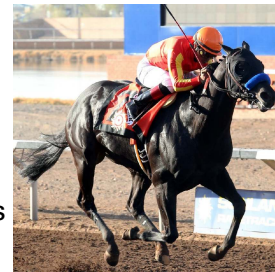
"It's not like we're selling several thousand 2-year-olds at this sale, it is a couple hundred horses going through the ring and to achieve that kind of success, I think it speaks to the quality that our consignors have brought us on a year-to-year basis," Browning said of the Grade I-winning sextet.

Both Barretts and OBS March sales showed increases in average and median and consignor Dean DeRenzo thinks those results are signs of an improving industry.

"I think the buzz has carried over from the yearling sales last year to OBS," DeRenzo commented. "I think the whole industry is moving forward. I don't think it is any one sale that is doing it, I think we're seeing a whole trend of just the industry coming back to where it was before." **cont. p3**

PEGRAM HITS THE DOUBLE IN A BIG WAY

Just some 30 minutes after his stablemate **Midnight Lucky** (Midnight Lute) stamped her ticket to the GI Kentucky Oaks, Michael Pegram's **Governor Charlie** (Midnight Lute) blazed his trail to the GI Kentucky Derby in a pace-setting five-length victory over local representative **Show Some Magic** (Any Given Saturday) in track-record time. The win was especially meaningful for Pegram, who campaigned Governor Charlie's GI Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. winning grandsire Real Quiet; two-time Grade I Breeders' Cup Sprint winning sire Midnight Lute and champion granddam Silverbulletday. "I've always told people my biggest regret was never breeding Real Quiet to Silverbulletday," Pegram commented. "Now it's just kind of ironic that I've got the daughter and the son giving me the success. I just had to wait a little longer." **cont. p5**

Consignor Eddie Woods said action was busy in the barn area Saturday and all the right people were shopping.

"We've been very active, we've had some vet work already, we expect that to pick up," Woods explained. "All the usual characters, plus one new one [Nat Rea of Regis Farm], are walking around here. I can't think of anyone who is missing."

Still Woods remained realistic. "When you have what they want, they give you it all, but there is no one home for the others. This is a top-end sale, it has been for years and it's not changing, you just hope you have something that fits in with the top end."

Consignor Nick de Meric agreed the buy-back rate would be a key factor in the sale's success.

"There are some good strong indicators going into the sale with the earlier sales we've had this year," de Meric explained. "But, while I'm sure there are horses that sell very well in this market, what we'd all love to see is a little bit more depth to the market and a higher percentage of horses getting sold. That would be how I would define a successful market."

There were 136 juveniles catalogued for the one-session auction, but that number was whittled down to just over 100 hips, with 35 outs by Sunday afternoon.

With a limited number of offerings, de Meric had a message for would-be buyers.

"There is definitely a supply-and-demand factor that is having an impact on people's thinking going into this," he said. "There isn't an inexhaustible supply of these quality offerings. So step up boys and get into the fray." Consignor Ciaran Dunne was more forceful.

"What we need now is someone out on Boynton Beach Blvd with a bull whip to round them up and bring them in," he said.

Bidding at the Florida sale begins today at noon.

Governor Charlie was off slow at first asking and rallied to finish a well-beaten second to **"TDN Rising Star"** **Let Em Shine** (Songandaprayer) going six panels at Santa Anita Jan. 19. He returned a month later to graduate by a neck and earn a 94 Beyer Speed Figure going a mile there Feb. 17. Favored at 6-5 here, Governor Charlie broke well and chased the pace set by Saint Prado (Kitten's Joy) as Abraham pressed from the rail. That trio went through splits of :22.74 and :46.22 before Abraham moved up to bid on the turn, but Governor Charlie struck the lead first as Show Some Magic moved up to his outside in a drive. The local didn't have enough to overpower the favorite, though, as Governor Charlie pulled clear by midstretch to finish under a hand ride. "The best thing was that I was outside," said winning rider Martin Garcia. "I was pretty comfortable."

Pegram added, "I've been around long enough to know you don't get Derby fever. This horse couldn't have ran any better. I sure hope we go there, but that's up to Bobby [Baffert] and the horse and I'm just a passenger. I hooked my wagon to the right star."

Midnight Lucky couldn't have been any more impressive in her unveiling going 6 1/2 furlongs in Arcadia Feb. 16. Backed down to 4-5, the imposing filly attended the pace and drew off to score by 7 1/4 lengths, earning a 100 Beyer Speed Figure. Distance was the question here, but not for long.

Away a half-step slow, Midnight Lucky quickly recovered to press second choice *Majestic River* (A.P. Indy) through a posted first split in a likely incorrect :21.03 and a half in :46.44. The chalk put a head in front of that rival midway on the turn while showing no signs of slowing, and she didn't. Midnight

Lucky cantered to the wire with little encouragement from pilot Rafael Bejarano, stamping herself as one of the favorites for the GI Kentucky Oaks May 3 while lowering the track record by .85 seconds on a surface that had been yielding fast times all day. The grey was given a 16-1 chance in the Oaks future wager that closed Mar. 1.

"You're always scared when you go around two turns for the first time, and when I saw that :21 flat [first fraction] go up I said, 'I hope the clock's broken,'" said co-owner Mike Pegram. "But she did it easily and within herself. We like her future."

This was trainer Bob Baffert's fifth Sunland Oaks win in the past seven runnings and third in a row. He has taken those races by a combined 57 3/4 lengths, due largely in part to the aforementioned Plum Pretty's 25-length drubbing two years ago. Princess Arabella (Any Given Saturday) was the Baffert representative to score last year, but celebrations were cut short when her trainer, who watched the race from Dubai, suffered a heart attack. "A year ago I woke up having a heart attack after [the] Sunland Oaks," Baffert tweeted yesterday evening. "Last year, lucky at midnight. This year, Midnight Lucky."

Midnight in the Garden of Baffert & Pegram...

"He took us to a lot of places, and now that he's at stud, maybe he'll take us to even better places--if that's possible." That's what owner Mike Pegram said yesterday about Midnight Lute, the horse he owned in partnership with Karl Watson and Paul Weitman who won consecutive renewals of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint for trainer Bob Baffert. Indeed, it takes a special sire to eclipse his own achievements on the track, and while it's early days yet for Midnight Lute, he has undoubtedly emerged as one of the leading lights of his sire crop with a string of recent successes punctuated by his big stakes double yesterday for Pegram and company.

But the pedigrees of the undefeated Sunland Park Oaks winner Midnight Lucky and Sunland Derby hero Governor Charlie are infused with more Pegram/Baffert magic than Midnight Lute alone.

Governor Charlie is a grandson of the Hall of Famer Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), who wore Pegram's red and yellow colors to victory in the 1998 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and the following year's GI Kentucky Oaks. On behalf of Pegram, Baffert had purchased Silverbulletday at the 1997 FTKJUL yearling sale for \$155,000. She retired with 15 wins and earnings of over \$3 million.

Up until recently, Silverbulletday could have been viewed as a disappointing broodmare, as only one of her first eight foals has even won. But thanks to her daughters--and Midnight Lute--things have taken a marked turn in 2013, and she is now the granddam of two graded winners.

Silverbuletday's unraced 11-year-old daughter Silverbulletway (Storm Cat) is the dam of Governor Charlie, while another unraced daughter, Silver Bullet Moon (Vindication), produced this year's GII San Vicente S. winner (and Sunland Derby fourth) Shakin It Up, another son of Midnight Lute.

Silverbuletday herself is the dam of the Midnight Lute sophomore filly Illicit Affair, who tired to fourth on debut at 5-2 odds at Santa Anita Mar. 16, and she had foals by Midnight Lute in 2011 (a filly) and 2012 (a colt).

Pegram and Baffert's involvement with Midnight Lucky's family is a bit more round-about, but is nonetheless prominent. Midnight Lucky, purchased as a 2011 FTSAUG yearling by Pegram for \$220,000, was produced by Citiview, a full-sister to Hookedonthefeelin. That filly was a Grade I winner for Pegram and Baffert, who also campaigned Hookedonthefeelin's Grade I-winning daughter Pussycat Doll (who, just to add another Pegram/Baffert layer, was sired by their dual Classic winner Real Quiet).

Tiz Flirtatious, however, with Lady of Shamrock hot on her heels, chased down the pacesetter and was able to hit the wire before the rapidly gaining favorite could catch her. "Julien rode a great race," said winning trainer Marty Jones. "She looked like she wanted to get a little keen and Julien's just got a great way of getting a horse to relax. I think he fit her real well. I think this was long overdue. She's been close in graded stakes, and finally things went her way. We'll have to talk with [owner] Pam [Ziebarth] and see what she wants to do, but I think the [GI] Gamely [S. at Betfair Hollywood Park May 27] might be a race we're looking at if everything goes well."

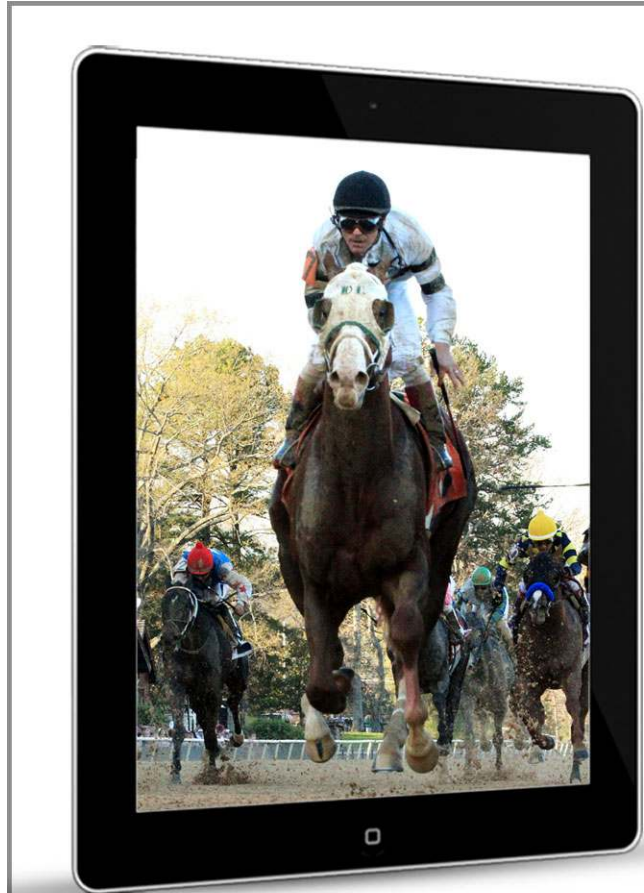
Gulfstream Park Confirms World Record...

Gulfstream Park officially announced yesterday that **Twilight Eclipse** (Purim) set the 1 1/2 mile world record in Saturday's GII Pan American S. Twilight Eclipse covered the distance in 2:22.63, which bested the previous record of 2:22.80 set last week by Bright Thought (Hat Trick {Jpn}) in Santa Anita's GII San Luis Rey S. "As with all track, stakes or world records, we always check the time to make sure there's no questions," said Gulfstream President Tim Ritvo. "In this case, we still have Teleview timing our races and we also checked by timing it by hand."



Pletcher 3-Year-Olds Hit the Palm Meadows Tab...

Juvenile Champion **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday) worked five panels in 1:00.82 at Palm Meadows Training Center Sunday morning in his final piece of work before Saturday's GI Besilu Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. "I thought he worked well, consistent with what he normally does," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "He's not an overzealous work horse, but I think we got a good tightener and everything has gone according to plan." With the quick **Merit Man** (With Distinction) among the list of probables for Saturday's contest, Shanghai Bobby could find himself uncharacteristically off the pace early. "I think it's fine," the conditioner said of that scenario. "We'd actually prefer a target. If [Merit Man] goes to the lead, fine." The dark bay colt currently has 24 points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby from his juvenile exploits and second-place finish in the GIII Holy Bull S. He will have to finish well on Saturday for a berth in the Kentucky Derby and is expected to face a field of 10 or more competitors. "I'm not worried about the points," Pletcher said. **cont. p10**

"I figure if he runs good enough, it won't be a problem. None of these fields come up short with Derby points on the line. I expected it to be a big field and post position won't be a big deal for me."

The Eclipse Award-winning colt worked in company with stablemate **Palace Malice** (Curlin) who was clocked in the same time. The Dogwood Stable colorbearer finished third last out in the GII Risen Star S. Feb. 23 and will head back to Fair Grounds for the GII Louisiana Derby on Saturday. "I thought Palace Malice worked super, finished up great and galloped out strong," Pletcher commented. "It seems like he's been doing really well since the Risen Star. I'd say he's improving, but he's always trained really well and we've had really high hopes for him and he has performed."

GII Tampa Bay Derby winner and early Derby favorite **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) went four furlongs in :49.79 in company with **Discreet Dancer** (Discreet Cat), winner of the GII Gulfstream Park H. Feb. 9. "You could say 'maintenance' except that the gallop-out was pretty awesome," Pletcher said of his work. "It was pretty impressive." Verrazano is scheduled for a start in the GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct Apr. 6.

Revolutionary (War Pass), winner of the GI Withers S. at Aqueduct Feb. 2, went four panels in :48.20 in company with GII Remsen S. victor **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union). "I thought he went super," said Pletcher of the former. "He was well in hand. He's coming up to the [Louisiana Derby] in good order."

Dreaming of Julia (A.P. Indy) breezed a half mile in :50.90 in preparation for a start in Saturday's GII Gulfstream Park Oaks. "It was a good steady work," Pletcher noted. "The half-mile time doesn't look impressive, but I clocked the last three-eighths afterwards and it was impressive. She galloped out great and she's coming up to this race well."

Merit Man Works from the Gate...

Merit Man (With Distinction), who most recently finished fourth in the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 2, went an easy five furlongs in 1:04 from the gate at Gulfstream Park with jockey Kent Desormeaux in the irons as he prepares to stretch out in the Florida Derby. "I put him in the gate to sharpen him up a little," said trainer Bob Hess, Jr. "He can get a little lazy. We weren't looking for a lot of speed and he galloped out strong."

Live Lively Works at Palm Meadows...

Lewis Lee's **Live Lively** (Medaglia d'Oro), who rolled to three consecutive wins when taking the GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream Feb. 23, went four panels in :49.78 at Palm Meadows Training Center Sunday morning in anticipation of Saturday's GII Gulfstream Park Oaks. "She went nice and easy, really easy," said trainer Mark Hennig. "It's all we needed. She had a strong work last week. We didn't want to do too much with her this week. She was nice and relaxed. She's an outstanding-looking individual. To run two turns in a graded stakes is a lot to ask, because she didn't really get a lot of experience out of that first race at Gulfstream." He added, "She was never around any other horses. I think she's adapting and got a lot out of that last race. It should move her forward."

Hear the Ghost Breezes for SA Derby...

Halo Farm and trainer Jerry Hollendorfer's **Hear the Ghost** (Ghostzapper) yesterday turned in his penultimate work for the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 6. Breezing over the Cushion Track at Betfair Hollywood Park, the gelding went six furlongs in 1:13 3/5 under Corey Nakatani, who piloted him to a slight upset win in the GII San Felipe S. in his most recent at Santa Anita Mar. 9. "Very nice," said Hollendorfer. "He galloped out strong, as usual. He'll have a little blowout, and we'll be all set for the Santa Anita Derby." Hear the Ghost is still something of an unknown quantity, despite his breakout win in the San Felipe. He won off by daylight in his debut going six furlongs at Hollywood last December, then rallied for second in the six-furlong San Pedro S. over Santa Anita's dirt Jan. 21. Making his two-turn bow in the San Felipe, he was able to sit off a hot pace as favored Flashback (Tapit) got to the three-quarters in 1:09 4/5, and came along to defeat that rival by a half-length. Naysayers wonder if he'll be able to replicate the effort with a less-favorable pace set-up, and Hollendorfer is taking a philosophical approach. "All the horses that are on the 3-year-old trail have to prove themselves every single race," Hollendorfer said. "Those races are more under the microscope, so everybody's going to look closer at those. If you don't do something right, they criticize you. I've been down that road before, so hopefully I won't give them anything to criticize Hear the Ghost." The Hall of Fame conditioner is looking for his first victory in the Santa Anita Derby. With 50 points to date under the GI Kentucky Derby's new qualifying system, Hear the Ghost will seemingly have enough to make the Run for the Roses. "We'll see," Hollendorfer said. "If our horse takes us to the Derby, we'll go, but if he doesn't, we'll go somewhere else."

Departing, Mylute Tune Up for LA Derby...

Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider's untested and unbeaten sophomore **Departing** (War Front) breezed a bullet four furlongs yesterday at Fair Grounds as he prepares for his biggest test to date in Saturday's \$1 million GII Louisiana Derby. Departing, to the outside of a workmate, stopped the clock in :47.20--the fastest of 65 moves at the distance. He finished up a length ahead of his workmate, and Fair Grounds clocker Mike Diliberto caught him galloping out five-eighths in 1:00.20.

"Departing was well in hand," said Diliberto. Departing won his six-furlong debut at Fair Grounds Dec. 22 ([video](#)), made it two straight in a two-turn optional claimer Feb. 1 ([video](#)), then shipped to Sam Houston to easily win the one-mile Texas Heritage S. at 3-5 odds.

Also working Sunday was Louisiana Derby hopeful **Mylute** (Midnight Lute), owned by Goldmark Farm and Whisper Hill Farm and trained by Tom Amoss. Seventh, beaten 5 3/4 lengths, in the GII Risen Star S. in his latest Feb. 23, he breezed four furlongs in :50 flat. "Mylute's move was just an easy maintenance work," said Diliberto. "They weren't asking him for anything."

Animal Kingdom a Handful at Meydan...

Let the message not be confused, we don't know what any of this actually means. Good? Bad? Indifferent? Keen? Overworking? Impossible? If you are looking for some dramatic interpretation of body language and what it all means, you will not get that from us, but rather, a simple reporting of the facts. **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) is simply a handful in Dubai. For the second consecutive day, the 2011 GI Kentucky Derby winner was looking all about at Meydan.

It took two outriders to get Animal Kingdom to progress through the 1,600-meter chute (from where the horses enter the track) and then onto the main course. Once there, he broke off and galloped more than a lap, and rider Alice Clapham had her hands full yet again. Coming through the first turn

at Meydan (which was the end of the lap), Animal Kingdom galloped with his head focused on anything but what was in front him, looking about to the right. We don't recall seeing this in his final Breeders' Cup gallops in 2012, and again, we are not deeming this a positive or a negative. We don't know what to make of him--he could be in top condition and incredibly playful and happy or it could be the opposite. This much is certain, he makes an impression solely as a result of his antics, however it may go.

As for more on the American shippers, **Dullahan** (Even the Score) worked 1,000 meters in 1:01.38, running the fourth 200-meter segment in :11.44 according to the Dubai Racing Club's Jim Cornes. **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) worked 1,000 meters on grass, getting the distance in a progressive 1:03.94 (through sectionals of :13.50, :13.25, :12.60, :12.66, and :11.93).

Varsity (Indian Charlie), the AI Quoz Sprint chance, was well-lathered after a lap at 5:45 a.m, while his partner of the previous day, **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), came out at sunrise and was quite playful and keen in her gallop. It's worth noting that Royal Delta has looked as good as she did last year in her trackwork appearance. She was completely shuffled around in-running and just faded, obviously coming back to her best soon thereafter.

Private Zone (Macho Uno) galloped another lap in exactly the same form as Saturday, while O'Neill stablemate **He's Had Enough** (Tapit) seemed quite professional in a later morning gallop. **cont. p13**

Dice Flavor (Scat Daddy) made his first appearance on the main track at 6:40 a.m. and wheeled a circuit in fine fettle.

Trinniberg (Teuflesburg), sent to the course earlier by trainer Shivananda Parbhoo, was back on schedule Sunday after a miscommunication kept him relegated to the training track. He cantered through two laps of Meydan and took a gander at the starting gate.

A cadre of international Al Quoz Sprint runners made appearances, including **Russian Soul (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), **Great Attack** (Greatness), **Joy and Fun (NZ)** (Cullen {Aus}) (2010 Al Quoz winner, when the race was run over 1,200 meters), **Eagle Regiment (Aus)** (El Moxie), and **Monsieur Joe (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}). None left an overwhelming impression and ticked over as most would expect. New Zealand's **Ocean Park (NZ)** (Thorn Park {Aus}) hacked over the Tapeta again with part-owner and trainer Gary Hennessy looking on in earnest. **Elleval (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) took a lap of Meydan early in the session. **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) was proficient in another circuit of Meydan.

A quartet of Mike de Kock runners galloped around Meydan when local runners were permitted on course, with Patrick Cosgrave partnering G1 Dubai Sheema Classic contender--and Meydan course record holder at 2,000 meters on grass--**Await The Dawn** (Giant's Causeway), along with troubled filly **Emotif (Arg)** (Giant's Causeway) (G2 UAE Derby). Separately, Derby contender **Zahee (NZ)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) and G1 Dubai Duty Free chance, and G2 Al Fahidi Fort winner **Mushreq (Aus)** (Flying Spur {Aus}) took a spin.

Many are still to make their first debut with the Japanese runners and many of the Europeans still to clear quarantine. While the field will be known for the Dubai World Cup, the post position will occur in a ceremony at Meydan at 3:00 p.m. local time on Wednesday.

Kingsbarns Doubt for Guineas...

Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner **Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) looks unlikely to bid to emulate Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) in winning the G1 Qipco 2000 Guineas after suffering a setback, it was announced yesterday. Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's unbeaten colt, who followed in the steps of his triple Classic-winning stable companion when taking the Doncaster contest on only his second start in October, was not in attendance at Ballydoyle's annual Curragh post-race gallops, which his trainer warned does not bode well for his prospects of making the May 4 Newmarket Classic.

"A couple of weeks ago, he pulled a shoe off and after three days he went lame and had an infection in the foot," Aidan O'Brien explained.

"He didn't do anything for seven to 10 days, which was bad timing and he lost too much ground to be here (for the workouts). It's a bit of a concern for the Guineas, as if they are going straight there they would need to be here." Of Camelot, who was put through his paces after racing, the Ballydoyle conditioner commented, "He might have a run here before the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup in May."

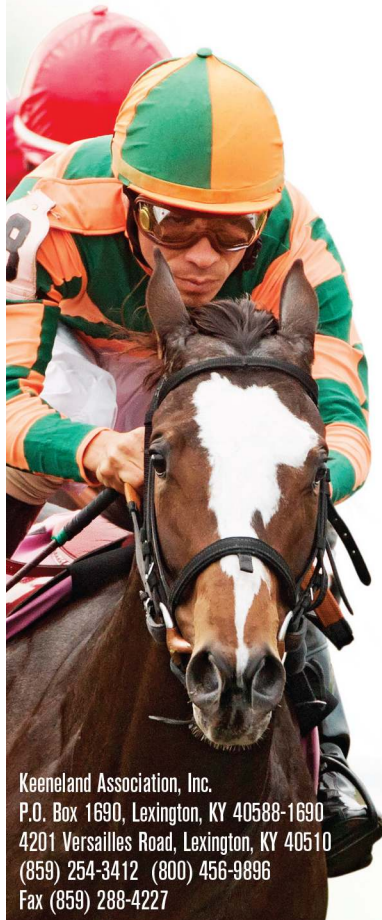

Japan's champion sprinter/miler in 2012 after giving the country its first-ever win in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint last December, Lord Kanaloea was the prohibitive favorite facing 16 rivals here, and came through with a track-record performance while annexing his third Group 1 win. The progressive 5-year-old, who prefaced his successful Sha Tin raid with a victory in the six-furlong G1 Sprinters S. at Nakayama in September, opened 2013 with a 3/4-length tally in the seven-furlong G3 Hankyu Hai at Hanshin Feb. 24. Turning back a panel here and breaking from post 11, he sat a mid-pack trip while racing under cover. Still locked behind horses as they turned for home, he finally extricated himself in midstretch, but for a brief moment, it looked as if he was spinning his wheels a bit and might be in danger of the upset. But in the final furlong, he unleashed a dazzling turn of foot and got up in plenty of time. The son of King Kamehameha gave trainer Takayuki Yasuda a second consecutive Takamatsunomiya Kinen title, as Yasuda won the race with Curren Chan (Jpn) (Kurofune) last year. Jockey Yasunari Iwata was winning his first Takamatsunomiya. Lord Kanaloea is a grandson of U.S. champion Saratoga Dew, heroine of the GI Gazelle H. and GI Beldame S. in 1992. Saratoga Dew sold carrying Lord Kanaloea's dam, the Storm Cat mare Lady Blossom, for \$850,000 at the 1995 Keeneland November Sale.
