## WORLD CUP DRAWS 13

The \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup attracted an international field of 13, led by American raiders **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) and **Royal Delta**

(Empire Maker). America's reigning champion older female Royal Delta, a lackluster ninth in this event last year, will break from post eight. The Besilu Stables' colorbearer enters riding a three-race winning streak, including a dominating five-length victory in the GIII Sabin S. at Gulfstream Feb. 17. "I just decided to take one outside

of seven, last year we were seven," trainer Bill Mott commented. "The filly did well coming into the race last year, but we didn't have the easiest of trips, so we decided to come back right then and there. She is bigger and stronger this year." Team Valor's Animal Kingdom, meanwhile, has drawn post 12. The 2011 GI Kentucky Derby hero reported home second-best in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 9. "To tell the truth I was glad one, two and three were already taken, I talked to Ramon Dominguez and he said that we wouldn't want to see him caught on the inside," trainer Graham Motion commented. "Hopefully Joel Rosario will have him in a good spot. Our tactics won't change, and he's capable of coming from off of it if he has to. After all we won the Derby from post 16." Godolphin will be well-represented here, including defending champ **Monterosso** (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Hunter's Light** (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), hero of Meydan's G1 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 3 Mar. 9. **Cont. p3**

### Royal Delta Shows Speed at Meydan

The final major questionmarks of the 2013 Dubai World Cup pre-race festivities came to a close at Meydan when the connections of 13 runners selected

their post positions after an hour-long ceremonial draw. From a full room in the IMAX theatre lobby, **Hunter's Light (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire})'s Godolphin connections selected post four and were installed as the 7-2 morning-line favorite on the U.S. tote for the world's richest race.

The only major surprise was the placing of **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in gate 12, but there just does not seem to be any huge concern about it. **Capponi (Ire)** (Medicean {GB}), the second placer in 2012 and unseen since that performance, ran on from gate 11. Main speed horses in the Dubai World Cup, **Planteur (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), are both drawn inside of Animal Kingdom, so there should be some room to secure a not-terribly wide trip.

Back on Wednesday morning, it seemed a busy day for horses that were asked to do likely final speed work on course. **Mr. Big (Aus)** (Elusive Quality), Singapore's only hope for the meeting, will start on the stand-side rail in that event and worked up against that same spot yesterday. The consistent galloper ran through progressive final splits of :15.78, :14.14, and :13.72 when asked for very little. Royal Delta blew out 600 meters for Bill Mott, who positioned himself well clear of the media throng to watch the gallop before graciously answering a host of questions from reporters representing six continents. The two-time GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic winner was caught by the Dubai Racing Club's Jim Cornes with sectionals of :12.25, :11.99, and :11.40, all in hand under Rodolphe Brisset.

**Ocean Park (NZ)** (Thorn Park {Aus}), the four-time Australian Group 1 winner from 2012, got three taps of the whip on his flank in his only speed work since being in the UAE, blowing out a quarter in :23.52 seconds on grass. Earlier, old mare **Invincible Ash (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) put forth a progressive effort over 800 meters in :51.03 seconds, with final 200-meter sectionals in :11.22 and :11.34 seconds.

A cadre of runners visited the training track at Meydan, but distance limitations prevented coverage of those works. As we mentioned previously in our trackwork reports, no Godolphin runners are seen by the media, which does often yield significant more coverage on the same types of international shippers. Still, it makes sense that these horses who have been in the UAE for so long do not endure the same focus considering their lack of travel or routine changes.

The Japanese media flocked to **Gentildonna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who did a light gallop on grass, recorded by Cornes in incremental sectionals of :14.45, :13.06, and :12.18. She was equipped with a full ear-covering hood. The G1 Japan Cup winner visited the starting gate for schooling, which included an approximate 10-minute circling and two-minute

standing when locked away. The latch was sprung and she hopped briefly and trotted out for all of five seconds. While youth is on her side, she behaved like a consummate professional beyond her years and experience.

Do 600-meter gallops matter when you are running a horse in a race over two miles? If so, **Saddler's Rock (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) caught Cornes's eye in fine fashion, working in :14.13, :12.19, and :11.82.

The highly-rumored sale of Dubai World Cup starter **Meandre (Fr)** (Slickly {Fr}) was confirmed via French media reports just after the post-position draw. It is believed that the total sum was approximately \$7-million for the three-time Group 1 winning entire. Maxime Guyon is due to ride for new owner Ramzan Kadyrov, whose **Zazou (Ger)** (Shamardal) was fifth in last year's Dubai World Cup.

Belmont S. and Breeders' Cup winning jockey Rene Douglas made his first appearance trackside since his 2009 spill at Arlington Park when he came to see his **Private Zone** (Macho Uno) jog the wrong way at Meydan. A G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen choice, Douglas was flanked by co-owners from Good Friends Stable, including NHL Hall of Famer Denis Savard. Needless to say, dry eyes will be tough to find if the Panamanian-cum-California-based Canadian-bred wins the Shaheen.

Thursday at Meydan, the annual Breakfast With the Stars event will lead the docket early for invited guests and ticketholders. Advance weather forecasts for Saturday's races project plenty of sunshine and a high temperature of 90F/32C.

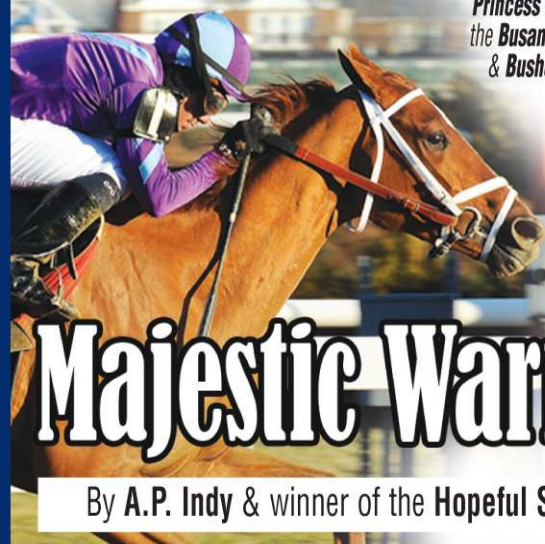

An early favorite for the G1 Dubai World Cup, **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) was dealt a cruel blow on Wednesday when he drew barrier 12 in the 13-horse field. Since his arrival in the desert, Animal

Kingdom, who unfortunately suffered an injury just days prior to the 2012 World Cup, impressed trackwork watchers with his speedy early morning workouts and many felt that his favoritism was justified.

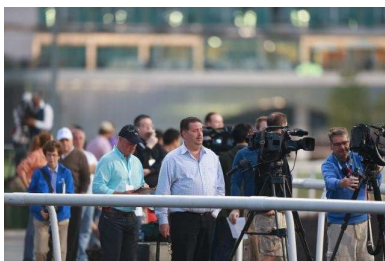
During a press conference earlier in the day, trainer Graham

Motion had commented that his preference would be barriers four to 10, as the extreme outside and the extreme inside barriers did not suit the horse. Animal Kingdom is not a quick horse from the gate, he went on to explain. This may count in his favor if the pace is muddled early on, giving the entire time to catch up, but equally from a wide draw, it could mean that he is shunted to the back of the field or forced to race wide.

When asked whether a wide draw would be detrimental, Motion explained that while Animal Kingdom won the Kentucky Derby from stall 16, he prefers to sit handy and is not really a closer. He did, however, point out that the horse is extremely versatile and the long run into the first corner could provide plenty of room to manoeuvre. Motion went on to add that this was the first trouble-free run that they had enjoyed with Animal Kingdom.

Unfortunately, the plans of mice and men all came to naught at the afternoon barrier draw, where the horses names were randomly drawn and once drawn, their connections were given the chance to select the barrier of their choice. With Animal Kingdom the second last horse to be drawn, Team Valor's Barry Irwin was left with a choice between

barriers 12 or 13 and opted for 12. Animal Kingdom will face a strong challenge from his fellow Americans in classy mare **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), who probably got the pick of the barriers in eight and **Dullahan** (Even the Score) with barrier three. As

## RECORD OVERNIGHT PURSES AT DEL MAR

Del Mar will hold 43 stakes races worth \$7.8 million during its 2013 summer race meeting, as well as record overnight purses of \$650,000 per day. The seaside track's 74th summer season will get underway Wednesday, July 17 and run through Wednesday, Sept. 4 for a total of 37 racing days. As usual, the meet will be headlined by the \$1-million GI TVG Pacific Classic Aug. 25. "Good racing makes for good business which makes for good purses," Del Mar Thoroughbred Club's president and CEO Joe Harper said. "We had such a wonderful meet in 2012, I don't know how we're going to be able to better it this time around. But with the purses we've got as a starting point, I give us a better than average chance to swing for the fences again." Del Mar will offer seven Grade I stakes, including the Eddie Read S. July 20; Bing Crosby S. July 28; Clement L. Hirsch S. Aug. 3; Del Mar Oaks Aug. 17; Del Mar Debutante Aug. 31; and the Del Mar Futurity closing day. "It's special to win a race at Del Mar," Thoroughbred Owners of California Board Chairman Mike Pegram said. "And with the notably lucrative overnight purse structure now in place at the track, we're delighted to work in partnership with the folks at DMTC to put on one of the best shows in all of the sport." ## FRANKEL SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE FEE SET

Juddmonte Farms yesterday announced a £110,000 southern hemisphere fee for Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}-Kind {Ire}, by Danehill), who will also cover a limited book of mares. While the covering fee will be non-refundable at 45 days gestation, Khalid Abdullah's operation will provide a maximum of £10,000 towards the owner's travelling, boarding and other ancillary costs with the application process concluding at the end of May. Back in Europe, the peerless triple champion has been visited by the stellar mares Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) and Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) in a successful start to his new career. Juddmonte's General Manager Philip Mitchell said yesterday, "We are very pleased with the start Frankel has made at stud and with the great interest being shown from the southern hemisphere this decision is a natural progression. However it is our full intention to limit the number of mares to be covered, which can only be of benefit to those breeders who wish to support the horse."

Grove Stud's hip [31](#), an April-foaled bay by the latter, was the first to hit the benchmark when selling to agent Stephen Hillen.

He is a half-brother to the 2000 G2 Gimcrack S. hero Bannister (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) from the family of 1989 G1 Cheveley Park S. victress Dead Certain (GB) (Absalom {GB}), and provided a tidy profit on the 23,000gns he cost at Book 2 of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale. He previously realised €45,000 as a Goffs November foal. "He was one of the most imposing horses here and has been bought on spec to join [trainer] Kevin [Ryan]," Hillen told *Racing Post*. "I'd seen him twice before today at Grove Stud and liked him, and he breezed in a very quick time. You have to pay for the good horses and everyone seemed to like him. We had four on our list and he was one of them." Hillen struck again for Church Farm Stables' hip [67](#), a son of Holy Roman Emperor, who maintained a pattern of improving his worth with each visit to the ring. Sold for 11,000gns as a Tattersalls December foal, his most recent outing yielded £21,000 at last year's DBS St Leger Yearling Sale. Another April-foaled bay, he is a grandson of 1994 G1 Prix Morny and G1 Moyglare Stud S. placegetter Tereshkova (Mr. Prospector), herself a full-sister to the Group 1-winning and dual Classic-placed sire Lycius. "Kevin [Ryan] and I saw him at Roger Marley's [Church Farm Stables] and really liked him," Hillen told *Racing Post*. "He did one of the fastest breezes of the day, is by a very good stallion and I thought he was good value. We had four on our list, bid on two and got two. It's not often you get what you want." Bronze medal position was secured by Kilminfoyle House Stud's hip [60](#), a son of Exceed and Excel (Aus), who was knocked down to Co. Waterford conditioner Pat Flynn for £60,000. The March-foaled bay is out of a half-sister to dual European Champion distaffer Divine Proportions (Kingmambo) and Haras du Mezeray sire Whipper (Miesque's Son), and is another to have enjoyed two prior visits to the auction ring, but had failed to reach his reserve on each occasion. He RNA'd at 30,000gns as a TATDEC foal and at 26,000gns as a TATOCT yearling. "He's been bought on behalf of an owner in Hong Kong," Flynn told *Racing Post*. "I trained a horse, [G1 National S. runner-up] Designs on Rome, who was sold to Hong Kong last year and I've been out there, hence the contacts. Exceed and Excel is popular in Hong Kong, and this horse is a great mover." Despite an inferior clearance rate and a reduced aggregate, the average and median markers both witnessed upturns, rising by over 2% and 11%, respectively. At the end of trade, Chief Executive Henry Beeby commented, "We welcomed a huge crowd of buyers to Kempton today dominated by British trainers. The average and median have both advanced, with the latter jumping by 11%, which points to a strong sale, although it was certainly more selective than last year, as evidenced by the 73% clearance rate. The unique atmosphere and facilities at Kempton, especially the consistent Polytrack surface, set this sale apart.
