KING OF THE WORLD

Sometimes, things *do* go according to plan. A little more than a year ago, Arrowfield Stud and Team Valor International's **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) was forced to abandon an assault on the G1 Dubai World Cup due to injury, at which time trainer Graham Motion thought Team Valor principle Barry Irwin was "crazy" for suggesting they point their G1 Kentucky Derby winner towards the 2013 World Cup. Crazy like a fox, as it turns out. The handsome chestnut got a textbook ride from Joel Rosario, took over from market rival **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) travelling ominously well at the 400-meter pole and staved off a late bid from **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) to become the first American-based winner of the World Cup since its transfer to Meydan in 2010.

Joel Rosario, much-maligned when he guided Animal Kingdom to a runner-up effort behind Point of Entry (Dynaformer) in the G1 Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 9, atoned for what Irwin deemed a "bonehead" ride with one that was beyond any sort of reproach Saturday.

"I knew we had a chance," the Dominican explained. "I've never been here before. This is my first time. I watched a lot of races. I had an idea where I needed to go from. I listened to my trainer and to my horse. He's a very good horse. He did it. He's very quick. It seemed like a long way home in the stretch."

Irwin, who said that Animal Kingdom was fitter for this than any other race in his career, was taken by the performance.

"That was shocking," he exclaimed. "I thought he could win but I didn't think he could win like that. He proved that not only is he a top horse, but that he is one of the top horses in the world."

Colt That Handles All Surfaces...

Before Team Valor consolidated all its runners with Graham Motion, Animal Kingdom raced for the Wayne Catalano barn, finishing runner-up to subsequent MGSW Willcox Inn (Harlan's Holiday) on his Arlington debut before graduating over the Keeneland Poly in October 2010. He turned in a promising run in his first start for this barn over the Gulfstream turf the following March and was an impressive winner of the GIII Spiral S. back on

a synthetic track before belying odds of 20-1 in the GI Kentucky Derby. He couldn't quite catch loose-on-the-lead Shackleford (Forestry) when the Derby fourth turned the tables in the GI Preakness S., and a nightmarish break in the GI Belmont S. effectively cost Animal Kingdom any shot--he checked in sixth.

A slab fracture diagnosed in late June marked the end of his 3-year-old campaign, and connections regrouped with an eye on the 2012 World Cup. Part one of that plan came together nicely when Animal Kingdom raced away to a Gulfstream turf allowance victory, but the colt suffered another fracture in the same leg and was shelved eight months.

Much to the surprise of many, it was announced that Animal Kingdom was to make his return in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, a Graham Motion initiative also labeled at first blush by Irwin as "crazy," but a troubled runner-up effort to Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) confirmed he was back with a vengeance.

In the days leading up to the Breeders' Cup, Arrowfield Stud's John Messara paid a visit to the barn to inspect Animal Kingdom, and several weeks later, Irwin announced that he and his partners had decided to sell a majority interest to Arrowfield to take up stud duties for the 2013 Southern Hemisphere breeding season. Motion and Irwin landed on the Gulfstream Park Turf H. as a steppingstone to the World Cup, and Rosario's mid-race roll of the dice failed to pay dividends and the result was a disappointing, if useful, runner-up effort.

Heady Ride, Talented Horse Get It Done...

With the raceday scratching of defending race champion Monterosso (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), Animal Kingdom moved down into the 11 hole and left there running, but so did a few of the others to his inside, and he was four deep out of the stretch for the first time as Royal Delta (Empire Maker) was committed to a front-running try by jockey Mike Smith. Though nothing along the lines of the last-to-first move used by Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}) to win the 2011 World Cup, Rosario allowed Animal Kingdom to slide up outside of G1

Maktoum Challenge R3 hero **Hunter's Light (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Side Glance (GB)** (Passing Glance {GB}) around the first turn to target Royal Delta from second. The two-time Eclipse Award winner went along at a decent clip, covering

the opening half-mile in a relatively quick :50 flat over the holding surface, but Rosario had Animal Kingdom in perfect striking position and looked to have Royal Delta at his mercy. He pushed the button exiting the final turn and in a flash, Royal Delta was gone and Animal Kingdom soon had a winning break on the field. He crossed into the final 200 meters under a full head of steam, and it was only Red Cadeaux who made any late noise. **Planteur (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), recently acquired by Sheikh Joann bin Hamad, dove home late to snag third for the second year in a row, earning back a cool \$1 million of his owner's investment. **Cont. p5**

The Ups and Downs of Racing...

So jubilant were the connections of Red Cadeaux-- after all, he did take home second prize of \$2-million-- that track camera crews mistook trainer Ed Dunlop for the winner.

"If you're not in the race you have no chance," said owner Ronald Arculli, former executive of the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "We debated between the [G1] Sheema Classic and the World Cup but how often do you have the chance to run a horse in this race? I keep saying to Ed [Dunlop], don't underestimate this horse."

Royal Delta dropped out tamely at the quarter pole and struggled with the surface, said Smith.

"My trip was good," he explained. "She just didn't seem to care for it. Every time she had to pick it up, she struggled. After four or five passed her, we were pretty much done--then we just got home safe."

The Dale Romans barn was looking for some redemption following the down-the-field finish of Little Mike (Spanish Steps) in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S., but Dullahan (Even the Score) also offered little stretch punch, finishing 11th.

"He was traveling sweet," jockey Gary Stevens offered. "Jumped out good. I was a bit closer than I thought I was going to be. He was doing it under his own power. I got him out down the backside. I loved where he was at. Three furlongs out, for whatever reason, he just shut it down. He pulled up great underneath me but he was really struggling the last two furlongs."

A Work in Progress...

A debut third behind future GISW Violence (Medaglia d'Oro) in a seven-furlong Saratoga maiden Aug. 18, Orb was not on his best behavior when a distant fourth in a mile maiden at Belmont Sept. 8. Fourth behind Vyjack (Into Mischief) and Clawback (Put It Back) sprinting at Aqueduct Nov. 10, the homebred put it all together in

career start number four, defeating Revolutionary (War Pass) into third Nov. 24, then headed south for the winter.

The attractive bay got his sophomore season off on a positive note, annexing a first-

level Gulfstream allowance Jan. 26, and would have run back in another allowance spot had something been available. There was nothing for him in allowance company, so he was entered instead in the Fountain of Youth Feb. 23 and capitalized on a fast pace to sweep past the now-retired Violence for a half-length success. Another Extra-Ordinary Performance...

With the Derby berth already in the bag, it awaited to be seen just how much would be asked of Orb in a race he did not need to win. As it turned out, he proved too tough for his foes. Noticeably warm in the preliminaries, Orb broke well, but settled in midfield, considerably closer to the pace than he has been, as Merit Man (With Distinction) cleared and crossed the field from the eight hole. Narvaez (Holy Bull) pressed from the outside, while Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) fired up at the fence with Itsmyluckyday lapped to his outside. All riders were happy with their positions down the backstretch, though Orb was niggled at just a bit by John Velazquez and began to find his best stride rounding the turn. Elvis Trujillo sense company rolling up to his outside and gave Itsmylucky day some more rein and they led going reasonably well into the lane. But Orb would not go away, grabbed the chalk at the furlong grounds and edged clear. Merit Man ran meritoriously in third. "He trained fairly sharp and I told my son in the paddock, 'I wouldn't be surprised if he breaks OK and he won't be as far back,'" McGaughey explained. "Now I didn't know they were going to go 24 and change either. So I wasn't too surprised where he was. The one thing you don't know is if it will take away from the run or not and, obviously, it didn't." Shanghai Bobby was buried on the inside for the opening seven furlongs. "He seemed to be in a tough spot all the way around," trainer Todd Pletcher said.

A remarkable third after getting broad-sided just out of the stalls at Saratoga Sept. 3, the \$235,000 OBS March graduate had the misfortune of running into Little Distorted (Distorted Humor) going six furlongs at Belmont Oct. 28 and had to settle for a big-figure (95 Beyer) second. He was 30 cents on the dollar in the aforementioned Nov. 24 heat won by Orb, but was stuck down on the fence and chugged in third. Stretched to two turns for the first time over the Aqueduct inner track Dec. 28, the dark bay turned in a visually impressive performance, besting next-out winner Transparent (Bernardini) by 8 1/2 lengths. Revolutionary faced all kinds of adversity when making his stakes debut in the GIII Withers S. last time Feb. 2. Not only was he slightly slow to begin, but he had all his rivals to pass in the final half-mile. That he was able to weave his way in and out of traffic and get up for a neck victory was a testament to his will and he would go favored in this event, which offered a \$1-million purse for the first time in its 100-year history.

A bit flat-footed to begin, as has become his custom, Revolutionary had only one rival beaten as they turned out of the stretch and was trapped down at the fence as Titledown Five (Tiznow) and Hip Four Sixtynine (Southern Image) scrimmaged up front. But faced with another perilous inside journey, jockey Javier Castellano made a key decision to steer his mount out to the three or four path passing the seven-eighths marker and was even further out into the track when he launched an eye-catching middle move to within striking distance four furlongs from the money. He zoomed past Mylute while about six deep on the final turn and had the leaders in the crosshairs as they straightened, providing

he could sustain his momentum. Still five off the inside in upper stretch, he lugged in a bit and was overtaken momentarily by Mylute at the eighth pole, but dug in with uncommon courage and boxed on determinedly for the victory, then galloped out well clear of his rivals. "He broke a little slow, which he's been known to do in the past," commented Whit Beckman, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher. "Javier just recovered from there, got him out, took him wide down the backside, just steadily picking off horses and making up ground. He continued his move around the turn and came down to the end for the stretch and had to get down and ride him pretty hard but was able to get him there. He galloped out pretty well after the wire too so that shows a little extra distance shouldn't bother him."

An expensive 2-year-old purchase for Mike Repole, Unlimited Budget drifted up to 7-1 for her Nov. 9 debut at the Big A, owing to the presence of Brilliant Jewel (A.P. Indy), who had run a mid-90s Beyer in her previous appearance. But the latter flopped in fourth at 1-2 and Unlimited Budget raced away to score by 9 1/2 lengths. Back on 15 days' rest, she bested Emollient (Empire Maker) in front-running fashion in the GII Demoiselle S. and called it a season. The Florida-bred was sent to this venue for her sophomore unveiling, and she showed a new and potentially very positive dimension, coming from well off a very strong pace to win the Feb. 23 GIII Rachel Alexandra S. by 3 3/4 lengths. Drawn outside in this field of seven, Unlimited Budget was three wide out of the stretch the first time as she chased Grade I winner So Many Ways (Sightseeing) and Flashy Gray into the first turn. "A beautiful trip," said winning jockey Javier Castellano. "That's what I was looking for today. I mean, phenomenal...I really like this horse....a wonderful filly."

Amira's Prince set the pace and dug in gamely here to record his fourth win from as many Stateside tries, setting up a likely start in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S. at Churchill Downs May 3. A decent handicapper in Ireland for trainer David Wachman last season, the bay provided his new connections with an immediate reward for their investment when he got up from far out of it to take a Gulfstream optional claimer Dec. 22. He took another step forward over yielding ground going 12 furlongs in Hallandale Jan. 19, and easily bested MGISW Teaks North (Northern Afleet) in that venue's GII Mac Diarmida S. Feb. 16. With two bullet works at Payson Park on display since that last effort, the bay bounced away from his inside post to vie for early command. He enjoyed a one-length advantage on String King down the backside, and was engaged by that foe entering the home bend.

Amira's Prince seemed to have that rival's measure by midstretch, but Willcox Inn appeared on the outside to make of race of it. The chalk dug deep, however, and clung to his lead as they struck the line. "We were trying to figure out what to do because his first time running a little bit shorter than before," explained pilot Junior Alvarado of his winning tactics. "He just broke good and I mean he did everything pretty much easy. You know, I didn't want to fight with him at all so I just let him do his own thing. When it was time to run, I asked him and he gave me everything he had." Co-owner Adam Wachtel added, "With his tactical speed we thought we'd be alright cutting back and obviously he can handle it so we are very pleased."

New Orleans H. cont.

Graydar may be lightly raced, but he has certainly made up for lost time in his brief-but-accomplished career. Yesterday, the towering gray proved his romp last out in the GI Donn H. was no joke, taking the GII New Orleans H. in convincing fashion. An 8 1/2-length maiden winner first out at Gulfstream last April, Graydar was not seen again until September at Belmont, where he finished third, beaten seven lengths, in a first-level allowance. Put away for three months thereafter, he returned to Gulfstream Dec. 6, wiring an optional claiming field to win by 4 1/4 lengths. Taking a massive class jump for his 4-year-old bow in the Donn Feb. 9, Graydar once again took up his customary position on the lead and was never headed, striding clear to win by three lengths and recording a 109 Beyer Speed Figure. Displaying a change of tactics here, Graydar was content to sit third early just off the pace contested by Mark Valeski and Majestic Harbor (Rockport Harbor). Moving alongside Mark Valeski midway around the turn, Graydar needed the length of the stretch to dispose of that stubborn rival, drawing away inside the final furlong to post his second straight graded stakes victory. "We did expect a big effort out of him," said co-owner Steve Davidson of Louisiana-based Twin Creeks Racing. "It was kind of plan B. We thought we would be on the lead but [instead we came] off the pace and [got] a wide trip. I was real proud the way he dug in there and battled against a really good field."

Ciao Bella extended a big day for Coolmore from Dubai to Hallandale Beach and flattered her **"TDN Rising Star"** moniker with a first black-type success here. The grey was a 7 1/4-length debut graduate going a mile here in December of 2011, and resurfaced to clear her

first allowance condition at Monmouth last July. Ciao Bella suffered her first defeat, however, when going this distance in Saratoga's Summer Guest S., finishing fourth. Put on the turf for four subsequent efforts, the homebred's best finish came when she was second in Calder's GIII La Prevoyante H. Nov. 30. She returned to this main track and to the winner's circle last time, cruising by 5 3/4 lengths and earning a career-best 100 Beyer Speed Figure in a one-mile optional claimer Feb. 18.

Bounding to the lead from her rail draw, the heavy favorite waltzed through splits of :49.20, :24.64 and 1:13.07. She was in front by daylight at the top of the lane, and quickly shut the door on stablemate Authenticity to win for fun. "It's a good start to the day," said trainer Todd Pletcher, who had already annexed the Sir Shackleton S. with Travelin Man (Trippi) two races earlier. "We were also looking at [the GII Ruffian H. at Aqueduct next Saturday] for Ciao Bella. It was a tough call. I talked it over with Mr. Tabor and decided to keep her here. She was two-for-two over the main track." Pletcher continued, "With the slow fractions [rider] Johnny [Velazquez] was able to dictate the race. [Authenticity] ran a good race to be second after getting bottled up behind the slow pace. I haven't got any specific plans for them right now."

Bill Mott had a rough day in Dubai yesterday, as the champion **Royal Delta** tired to third last in the G1 Dubai World Cup, but **Cigar Street** did his best to offer a little salve for Mott with a hard-fought win that kept him unbeaten in the hands of the Hall of Fame trainer.

Produced by a half-sister to another Hall of Famer--the Mott-trained **Cigar--Cigar Street** was tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ after winning off by over 13 lengths in a Fair Grounds maiden special in March of 2012.

Fourth to longshot **Hero of Order** in the GII Louisiana Derby for the Steve Margolis barn, he went missing until December before reappearing for Mott in a Gulfstream optional claimer Dec. 27. He won that one by two lengths over a solid yardstick in **Fast Falcon** (Awesome Again), and enjoyed a similar margin of victory in a nine-furlong optional claimer Feb. 17. Backed as the favorite in his return to stakes action, he raced along in fifth under the red-hot **Johnny Velazquez** as **Take Charge Indy** and **Pants on Fire** led through a half in :48 3/5 and three quarters in 1:12 1/5. **Cigar Street** ranged up three wide at the quarter pole, hooked the staying-on **Take Charge Indy**, and while that foe battled on gamely, **Cigar Street** began to get away in the final stages. "This helps," admitted Mott assistant **Ken McCarthy**. "It was a little rough for us watching Dubai earlier, and then some of our other horses here today didn't perform up to expectations. We've always thought a lot of this horse. I think he'll probably go to Kentucky from here."

A CLASSIC PERFORMANCE FROM ST. NICK

Whatever his limitations going right-handed, **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) is a force to be reckoned with running this way and proved it yet again when upstaging the Japanese star **Gentildonna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. Boasting a near-perfect record when racing over this trip on left-handed tracks, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's 6-year-old had been slightly disappointing when only third attempting to land back-to-back renewals of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf in November, but showed that he remains an international heavyweight here after being freshened up by Team Ballydoyle. Positioned near the pace by Joseph O'Brien early, the bay took control at the top of the stretch and was always holding the filly to score by 2 1/4 lengths. "There didn't seem much pace on paper and (part-owner) Mr. Smith said maybe we should ride him a bit further forward and see what happens," Joseph O'Brien said. "This horse is very tough, very special, gives his best every day, relaxes, and finds plenty. It turns out you can ride him any way you want." **Cont. p16**

St Nicholas Abbey's early career highs and lows have been well-documented, but the one-time Triple Crown aspirant who went initially by the wayside has become a consistent top-level performer to match many of his stable's past luminaries. Despite a game win in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom in June 2011, it was not until Churchill Downs five months later that he hit the heights he had seemed destined for as a swashbuckling juvenile. His impressive first BC Turf score was followed by a highly creditable second to Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) in a tactical running of this event 12 months ago and a display of total authority on his

return to Epsom for a second Coronation Cup. Placed third in Ascot's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. the next month when ridden with exaggerated waiting tactics on ground too testing, he filled that spot on two more occasions when seemingly not quite quick enough for the demanding 10-furlong tests of the G1 Juddmonte International at York in August and G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown in September.

After a slog in the mud in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp in October, the edge may have been taken off him as he failed to reel in Little Mike (Spanish Steps) and Point of Entry (Dynaformer) at Santa Anita, but he was firing on all cylinders on this return. Enjoying a perfect tow from Shareta (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}) as Gentildonna raced with the choke out three-wide, he was committed with 500 meters to race and quickly had the latter in difficulty. Gradually turning the screw as the two class acts dominated the stretch run, St Nicholas Abbey drew the sting from Gentildonna to establish his superiority.

SAJJHAA STREAKS TO FOURTH STRAIGHT

In landing her second-straight Group 1 victory, Godolphin's **Sajjhaa (GB)** (King's Best) proved herself the revelation of the Dubai carnival, capping an unbeaten run that saw her go four-for-four over the Meydan turf. She recorded her first victory at the highest level when taking the local prep for this race, the G1 Jebel Hatta--over course and distance on Super Saturday Mar. 9, stalking the pace before running up the rail to deny South Africa's **The Apache (SAf)** (Mogok) in the final strides. The result was much the same this time. Settling off the pacesetter **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) and alongside The Apache through the early stages, the big mare found herself briefly trapped behind the pacesetter at the top of the lane. Taking advantage of a spot on the fence left open by Little Mike and Gary Stevens, jockey Silvestre de Sousa made a winning move, piloting the mare through the seam and past South African champion **Igugu (Aus)** (Galileo {Ire}) on her way to a 1 3/4-length victory. The Apache got up to be second to the dark bay once again. Little Mike faded to finish 11th. In stopping the clock in 1:47.93, Sajjhaa eclipsed her own track record of 1:48.58, established in the G2 Balanchine S. Feb. 21.

A first-out winner at Sandown as a 3-year-old, Sajjhaa went on to take a listed stakes at Bath three months later, and rounded out her sophomore campaign with a victory in the G3 Premio Sergio Cumani at San Siro in Italy. Resurfacing in the Godolphin blue for trainer Saeed bin Suroor as a 4-year-old, Sajjhaa finished a game second to top filly Middyay

(GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the G2 Middleton S. at York, and returned to that course later in the year to claim the Listed Lyric Fillies S. She kicked off her 5-year-old campaign with another second-place effort in the Middleton--this time to Izzi Top (GB)

(Pivotal {GB}), but failed to find the winner's circle in two subsequent starts on the year. She blossomed, however, when resurfacing at Meydan Jan. 24, winning the G2 Cape Verde S. She kept the streak alive next out in the Balanchine, and rewarded her followers with the landmark win in the Jebel Hatta last out. "It was a great performance," de Sousa said of his win aboard Sajjhaa. "This filly is now four-for-four [in Dubai]; she's just improved and improved since she came here. I had a good position early on and she made her way through on the inside. She's very tough and so genuine. I'm very pleased." Sajjhaa becomes the second filly to win this event, following Ipi Tombe (Zim) (Manshood) 10 years ago. Those rivals began to tire at the head of the straight, and Reynaldothewizard forged to the lead 300 meters out. The closers began to rev up soon after, but Reynaldothewizard kept finding more and was able to hold Balmont Mast safe by a half-length. Shea Shea was backed down into odds-on favoritism for yesterday's G1 Al Quoz Sprint and made relatively light work of the field to be South Africa's second winner on the program. A conditions winner over 5 1/2 grassy furlongs at Vaal last March, the bay gelding bested a field including top local short-tracker **What a Winter (SAf)** (Western Winter) in the G1 Computaform Sprint at Turffontein late the following month.

With this race squarely in mind, Shea Shea endured the long quarantine process required of the South African horses and perhaps felt some of that when making his local debut in a Jan. 31 handicap over this track and distance. He could do no better than an alibi-free seventh to **Medicean Man (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) under 132 pounds, but reversed form comprehensively with that one, winning the Meydan Sprint from **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) by 2 1/2 lengths. Fairly into stride for **Christophe Soumillon**, Shea Shea raced in midfield of the main group of horses, and followed the move of **Joy and Fun**, the 2010 Al Quoz runner-up and last year's third placegetter, as they hooked up with the course proper. He remained in the 9-year-old's slipstream entering the final furlong, and **Soumillon** got to work, shifting his mount off heels before powering home to a clear-cut win. **Eagle Regiment**, who was passed fit to run Saturday morning after going lame mid-week, raced prominently along the far-side rail and stayed on gamely to finish third. Of the American duo, **Varsity (Indian Charlie)**, last-out winner of the **Gulfstream Park Turf Sprint** was sixth, while **Great Attack (Greatness)** was an outpaced 11th.

A LINE TO LOUISVILLE?

The similarities between last year's winner of the G2 UAE Derby **Daddy Long Legs (Scat Daddy)** and **Lines of Battle (War Front)** were striking, and the result was the same. Off since the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf in November, the dark bay colt provided trainer **Aidan O'Brien** and the **Coolmore** partners--along with breeder **Joseph Allen**--with back-to-back renewals of this lucrative test while likely stamping his ticket to another Derby in five weeks' time. Jumping well from stall four, **Lines of Battle** traveled powerfully and with a low head carriage under **Ryan Moore** to press what pace was provided by G1 **Cran Criterium** hero **Law Enforcement (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}).

He seemed to come under a ride as **Snowboarder (Raven's Pass)** ranged up on the outside to take the lead along the home bend, but **Lines of Battle** re-engaged 400 meters from home. He pulled clear at the 300-meter mark and, despite drifting out slightly late, was always doing enough to hold off longshot **Elleval (Ire)** (Kodiak {GB}) while favorite **Secret Number (GB)** (Raven's Pass) arrived too late on the scene to be third. American representatives **Dice Flavor (Scat Daddy)** and **He's Had Enough (Tapit)** never made an impact, finishing eighth and 11th, respectively. "It was a farce of a race," offered **Moore**. "They only cantered to halfway and my horse was only doing what he needed to. I think he was just the best horse in the race." **UAE Derby cont. p19**

A debut winner going six panels over eventual Group 3 winner and multiple Group 1-placed Leitir Mor (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) at The Curragh last May, Lines of Battle could do no better than sixth behind Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. the following month. He just missed when second in Leopardstown's G3 Tyros S. in July and, after a break, returned to winning ways while showing an affinity for all-weather in Dundalk's Oct. 12 Star Appeal S. Stranded out in post 14 at Santa Anita, Lines of Battle was never able to tuck in and had to settle for seventh behind barnmate George Vancouver (Henrythenavigator). These connections finished second in the 2011 UAE Derby with Master of Hounds (Kingmambo) before improving one spot with Daddy Long Legs--who also scored here off a lackluster showing at the Breeders' Cup--and are hoping for a better result with this year's winner in the GI Kentucky Derby. Master of Hounds was a decent fifth subsequently in the "Run for the Roses," but Daddy Long Legs finished last of 20 last season. "We wanted the race to be a true test, but it wasn't because of the slow pace, which made it a good win in the circumstances," said O'Brien of the winner. "We are very pleased with him and we'll go to the Kentucky Derby." Lines of Battle is a grandson of Allen's GI Top Flight H. heroine Andover Way (His Majesty), herself the dam of MGSW and Derby-siring Dynaformer and the dam of GI Suburban H. winner Offlee Wild.

MILE SMILES ON RAIN

Trainer Mike de Kock has won countless feature races at the Dubai International Racing Carnival by putting his horses in winning spots. Some may have characterized the entry of 3-year-old **Soft Falling Rain (SAf)** (National

Assembly) against his elders in Saturday's G2 Godolphin Mile as something of an audacious move, given that there was an opportunity to run against his peers in the following race. But the Shadwell runner got things off to a flying

start for the stable and overcame a difficult trip to maintain his undefeated record. Longshot **Haatheq** (Seeking the Gold) held for a Sheikh Hamdan one-two, while Godolphin's **Moonwalk in Paris (Fr)** (Oratorio {Ire}) ran on well from the tail to round out the minors.

Soft Falling Rain proved victorious in his first two trips to the post and closed out a perfect juvenile season in South Africa with a win in Turffontein's Storm Bird S. Mar. 3 and the G1 South African Nursery S. Apr. 28, a program which also included Shea Shea's Computaform Sprint S. success. Subjected to the same quarantine process, the Shadwell runner was forced to spot his peers as much as 17 pounds, but successfully carried 137 en route to a victory in the UAE 2000 Guineas Trial over 1400 meters Jan. 17. With queries in de Kock's mind as to the colt's ability to carry his speed a bit further, Soft Falling Rain took his place in the G3 2000 Guineas over the metric mile Feb. 14 and answered his trainer's concerns with a dominating 2 1/4-length defeat of Snowboarder (Raven's Pass). It would have been easy for connections to roll the dice in yesterday's G2 UAE Derby at a longer trip and for a fatter purse, but he landed in this spot and did it toughest, but validated favoritism.

Drawn to the far outside in 13 here, Soft Falling Rain raced in the second flight of horses as GI Travers S. dead-heater Alpha (Bernardini) dictated terms over a track playing exceedingly slow in the heat of the late afternoon. The chalk was never able to get in on the track and looked to be in deep water as Haatheq surged past the pacesetter to lead with 400 meters to race. But Soft Falling Rain responded very gamely to the urgings of jockey Paul Hanagan and worked his way past Haatheq close home for a richly deserved victory.

"I always liked this horse," de Kock said. "I thought he could win but in the race, I was worried. I knew he'd won when he crossed the line. He will go to Royal Ascot and we will enter him in the [one-mile G1] Queen Anne S. and the [six-furlong G1] Diamond Jubilee S."

Alpha, 12th in the G3 Burj Nahaar S. Mar. 9, gave way late to finish fifth.

"The run was a bit better than last time but he found the competition tough," jockey Silvestre de Sousa commented.

THIRD TIME LUCKY FOR CAVALRYMAN

Cavalryman (GB) (Halling), making his third appearance on World Cup night, recaptured the form of his sparkling sophomore campaign to lead home a one-two finish for Godolphin in Saturday's G3 Dubai Gold Cup. The 7-year-old raced in mid-pack early as several rivals tugged along behind a slow pace. The field proceeded unhurried in an orderly fashion with **Saddler's Rock (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) setting the pace. The frontrunner came under pressure into the homestretch and was overtaken by a host of runners, but it was Cavalryman, tipped out four wide in upper stretch, who surged to a commanding lead in the final furlongs for a confident victory. "Everything went to plan for me--the pace was a bit slow to halfway and I was happier when it quickened," commented winning rider Silvestre De Sousa. "He travelled well throughout and quickened up well. It is a big night, but the pressure will come later. At least the Godolphin horses are running well."

During his 2009 sophomore campaign, Cavalryman won the G1 Grand Prix de Paris and was third behind Sea the Stars (Ire) in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. He went winless in 2010 and 2011, but kicked off 2012 with a runner-up effort in the G2 Dubai City of Gold before running seventh on the big night in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. He recorded wins at York and Sandown last summer before ending the year with a 12th-place effort in the G1 Melbourne Cup. In his prep for this, the bay was a close-up third in the Mar. 9 City of Gold. "We had tried him over the two miles last year and he got the trip well when winning at Sandown, so we were very happy with the horse," said winning trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "The reason I was confident tonight was that the horse has a very good turn of foot."

A Good, Not Perfect, Day for Hong Kong...

Hong Kong-based sprinters are some of the toughest in the world and prove it again yesterday on one of the biggest stages. **Joy and Fun (NZ)** (Cullen {Aus}), making his third appearance in four years in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint, looked a winner in the final 150 meters before being overhauled late to finish 3/4 of a length adrift of the course record-setting **Shea Shea (SAf)** (National Emblem {SAf}) "So close! I really felt like I would win it," was how jockey Tye Angland summed it up. Eagle Regiment (Aus) (El Moxie) was passed fit by vets to run Saturday morning and gave an excellent account of himself in third. "We'll come back next year," said trainer Manfred Man. "I'm happy the horse has run well after so many accidents. He lost his shoe twice and he got a little bit of an infection, so missing two days work was no help. That has cost him today, that and the one draw was a terrible draw, he's lost a length with that. We'll come again next year." **Frederick Engels (GB)** (Iceman {GB}) was the hard-luck story of the day in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. He was off slowly and buried in traffic in the stretch en route to an eighth-place finish. "That was a disaster," said a disappointed trainer John Moore. "The starter let them go when he was up in the air and then the horse in front of him, Gordon Lord Byron (GB) (Byron {GB}), kept baulking him in the run. It was game over when he missed the start."

A RECORD-SETTING DAY IN THE DESERT

It was a day of records. Records of all kinds really. It started with a clear day, not a grain of sand in the sky and something that is very unusual for a desert city like Dubai. Then Soft Falling Rain (SAf) captured the Group 2 Godolphin Mile after being in trouble early on. Not only did the handsome colt remain unbeaten, he also became the first three-year-old to win the Godolphin Mile.

Mike de Kock had said that it would take a superstar to beat the older horses and that he wasn't sure if Soft Falling Rain was up to the task, de Kock's preference being some six or seven furlong contests at Royal Ascot in June. However, the colt won convincingly and De Kock can now look forward to dusting off his top hat and tails. Jockey Paul Hanagan was equally delighted, ranking it as one of his best wins ever.

Track records also tumbled, with the speedy Shea Shea (SAf) breaking the record that he had set when winning the Listed Meydan Sprint as he scorched to a blistering 56.41 seconds in the first of the Group 1's--the Al Quoz Sprint. Shortly on his heels came Godolphin's new revelation Sajjhaa (GB), who smashed her own course record in the Dubai Duty Free.

The six-year-old mare has dominated the Carnival with three superb wins, and her victory in the Duty Free came as no surprise. Her erstwhile trainer Michael Jarvis thought so highly of her that he had entered her in the Oaks for her second start.

With de Kock collecting two trophies on the night, the Aidan O' Brien show steadied the trophy shipment to South Africa when Lines of Battle scored convincingly in the G2 UAE Derby under Ryan Moore. Not to be outdone, son Joseph rode a copy book race on the magnificent St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) in the G1 Sheema Classic, setting the record straight after finishing second last year. St Nicholas Abbey loves fast ground, something he hasn't seen for a while as the UK suffered one of their wettest summers last year. So the fast Meydan turf was just up his alley and, after toying with the Japanese superstar Gentildonna, he strode away to finish in solitary splendour, casually breaking the third course record of the night.

Yet despite records being broken left right and center, the night really belonged to one horse and one horse only. He had dominated trackwork all week and kept the media busy, so much so that trainer Graham Motion can probably do interviews in his sleep by now. The horse that almost came in 2012, was finally here in 2013. He was at home on any surface and boasted a turn of foot that could get him out of almost any situation. He was the darling of the photographers, the enemy of the other 12 runners and he was here to reclaim a record that had for so long belonged to the USA. He was Animal Kingdom.

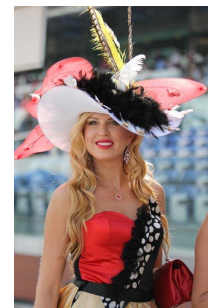
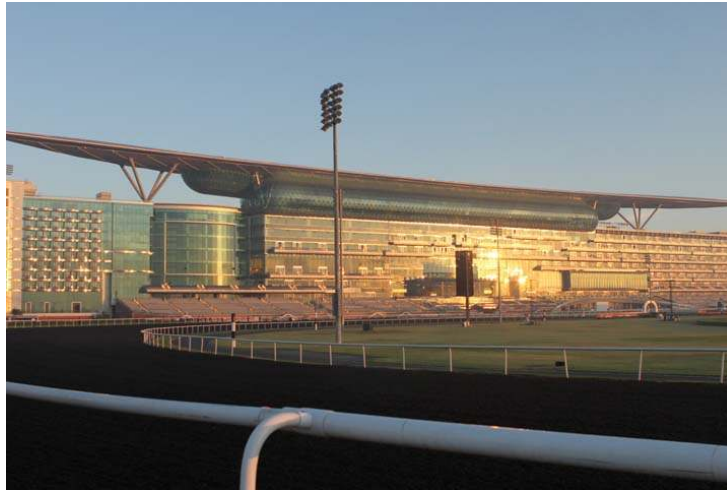
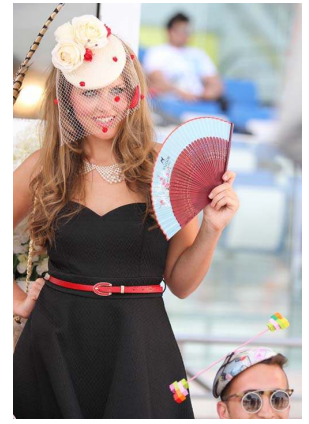
Long before the start of the World Cup, as the horses circled the parade, his calmness impressed. The parade ring was packed to the hilt, making it almost impossible to see the circling horses. Yet high above the melee a chestnut head with pricked ears stood out. Calmly surveying his surroundings, Animal Kingdom was ready for business. His wide barrier draw had caused concern, but as Royal Delta led the field down the back straight, there was Animal Kingdom right at her side. When Royal Delta cried enough, Animal Kingdom simply strode on by. The champion tried her best, but was no match for Animal Kingdom in such devastating form. The only challenge came from the gallant Red Cadeaux who chased hard, but did not have the turn of foot to catch the leader. The official margin was two lengths, but those watching in the stands knew to a man that had anything come at the chestnut powerhouse, he would simply have wound it up another notch. There was going to be no other winner today.

With the world at his feet, there are many options for the colt, even a tilt at Royal Ascot perhaps. But for now lets just savor the moment. The moment when a chestnut colt cruised to victory at Meydan, collecting a cool \$6-million dollars on the way and proving for once and for all that he is one of the greats of racing.
