



INGLIS EASTER BROODMARE SALE BEGINS

The Inglis Australian Easter Broodmare Sale begins today in Sydney with a “super select” session featuring just over 200 premier offerings. Group 1 winners in the catalogue include: **Cinque Cento (Aus)** (Nothin’ Leica Dane {Aus}) (lot 40), winner of the G1 BTC Doomben Cup, who sells in foal to Gio Ponti; and **Juice (NZ)** (Bertolini) (lot 93), who sells in foal to Duke Of Marmalade (Ire). Among the Group 1 producers scheduled to sell are **Dol (Aus)** (Dolphin Street {Fr}) (lot 56), the dam of Mirjulisa Lass (Aus) (Danasinga {Aus}), who is in foal to Fastnet Rock (Aus); and **Tangerine Dream (Fr)** (Sadler’s Wells) (lot 191), dam of Pear Tart (Aus) (Dehere), and in foal to Northern Meteor (Aus).

“Last year’s Super Select Session established itself as the place to offer young stakes winning mares straight off the track or broodmares in foal to the hot sires, and vendor support has again been overwhelming this year,” said Inglis Director Jonathan D’Arcy.

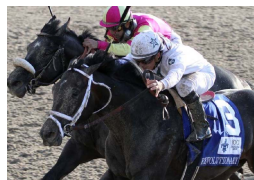
During the 2012 super select session of the Easter Broodmare sale, 138 horses sold for A\$18,822,00. The average was A\$136,391 and the median was A\$67,500. Top price of A\$1,050,000 was paid by Badgers Bloodstock for American graded stakes winner Sharp Susan (Touch Gold).

BOREL TO RIDE REVOLUTIONARY

WinStar Farm yesterday announced that three-time G1 Kentucky Derby-winning jockey Calvin Borel will ride G1 Louisiana Derby winner **Revolutionary** (War Pass) in the May 4 Derby. Borel rode WinStar’s Super Saver (Maria’s Mon) to victory in the 2010 renewal.

“Calvin’s Kentucky Derby experience and affinity for Churchill Downs makes him a perfect fit for most Derby contenders, and we’re thrilled to have him aboard Revolutionary to once again carry the WinStar colors in horse racing’s biggest race,” said Elliott Walden, President and CEO of WinStar. “Obviously, Calvin did a masterful job guiding Super Saver to WinStar’s first ever Kentucky Derby victory a few years ago, which is something we’ll be forever thankful for. So we’ve had good fortune together, and hopefully, history can repeat itself on May 4.” Javier Castellano, who rode Revolutionary to wins in the Louisiana Derby and GIII Withers S., has committed to ride **Normandy Invasion** (Tapit) in Louisville.

VERRAZANO GALLOPS AT CHURCHILL

G1 Wood Memorial winner **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) arrived at Churchill Downs Sunday evening and was out for his first gallop under the Twin Spires Monday morning.

“Everything went perfectly,” trainer Todd Pletcher said yesterday. “He seemed to settle in really well overnight and I thought he galloped very nicely over the track today.” The **“TDN Rising Star”** has already started at three different tracks in his four-race career. In addition to his Apr. 6 victory in the Wood, he also won the Mar. 9 GII Tampa Bay Derby. “We’ve gotten to this point with him as well as we could have hoped,” Pletcher added. “He’s maintained his condition really well and looks phenomenal. His appetite is good and he’s moving well. We’re really pleased and we’re hoping for another 19 days of what we’re seeing right now.”

Pletcher said, contingent on the weather, Verrazano and GII Louisiana Derby winner **Revolutionary** (War Pass) would both work at Churchill Apr. 21 and 28. Pletcher’s other Derby contenders **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union), **Palice Malice** (Curlin) and **Charming Kitten** (Kitten’s Joy) are scheduled to work just once on Apr. 28.

Also arriving at Churchill Sunday was Wood runner-up **Normandy Invasion** (Tapit). “He came out of the Wood OK and arrived fine,” trainer Chad Brown reported. “I just walked him this morning, but I’ll send him to the track [Tuesday] for the first time.”

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

BRING IN THE BARONESS

Gestut Ammerland's colors are becoming increasingly prominent in France thanks to its link with Andre Fabre, and the combination are represented in today's G3 Prix Penelope at Saint-Cloud by **Baltic Baroness (Ger)** (Shamardal). Only fourth when favorite for a mile conditions event at this venue last time Mar. 31, that form was made to look better on Sunday when the winner Kenhope (Fr) (Kendargent {Fr}) went on to capture the G3 Prix de la Grotte, and she is bred to show significant progress for this rise in distance. If she steps up to take this G1 Prix de Diane trial, the homebred will be providing her trainer with an eighth edition, meaning Fabre will surpass Geoffroy Watson, with whom he shares the record with at present. Setting the form standard is Ecurie la Vallee Martigny's Listed Prix Rose de Mai scorer **Childa (Ire)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}), while one of the least exposed is **Ferevia (Ire)** (Motivator {GB}). From the Carlos Laffon-Parias barn currently replete with above-average 3-year-olds, Leonidas Marinopoulos' homebred needs to show marked improvement on her maiden score over 11 furlongs at Amiens Mar. 27, but her trainer has some serious markers to measure her against at home.

COOLMORE, CHINA HORSE CLUB BUSY AT

INGLIS Coolmore Stud, in partnership with the China Horse Club, were active buyers at last week's Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale in Sydney. The partnership's purchases included a pair of colts by Fastnet Rock (Aus); John Warren signed for [lot 123](#) on behalf of the partnership for A\$2.4 million, while Coolmore's Tom Magnier signed the ticket at A\$1.5 million for [lot 82](#). All the yearlings are expected to be trained in Australia, according to a release from Coolmore.

Last year, it was announced that Coolmore was partnering with the Chinese government-owned Tianjin State Farms Agribusiness Group and Desert Star Holdings, an affiliate of the China Horse Club, to establish the breeding operation for China's Tianjin Equine Culture City (TECC) project. The Tianjin facility is expected to begin a phased opening later this year.

Under the partnership, Coolmore is expected to establish a stud farm, stocked with Irish broodmares, as well as acquire stallions. Magnier, speaking at the yearling sales last week, said: "This week's partnership with the China Horse Club, which included the purchase of two yearling colts by our champion sire Fastnet Rock, was an extension of our relationship announced last April. This major new Chinese project is great news for the world horse racing and breeding industry. It opens up a huge new market internationally, with great potential. We are very excited by the continued growth in this relationship."

Teo Ah Khing, Chairman of Desert Star, added, "Coolmore has been a meaningful partner for Desert Star. We are excited about the venture we share together, as well as additional ventures in other parts of China where we have been invited."

ITALY'S CRISIS DEEPENS

Italy's racing and breeding industry has been dealt a serious blow after the Ministry of Agriculture decided not to hand out withheld prize money from September to December last year. As a result of the severe economic and political issues dogging the country, racing's lost funds could be kept back until next year. "We are in a grave situation," Guido Melzi d'Eril, President of Federippodromi, told the *Racing Post*. "I have written to [the Director General of the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Forestry] Dr. Stefano Vaccari, asking that they respect their responsibility for the entire racing sector, to the individual companies and to the workers. However, racing has been denied by decisions that go against all reasonable and fair working relationships. Words must be followed by deeds. Last year, racing in Italy carried on thanks to the determination of the people employed in the industry even though many were not being paid their salaries. Without that commitment, the industry would not have kept going against the constant reduction of its income and a 50% cut in revenue. But at some point, without payment of the money owed to it, racing will not be able to continue. The companies that run the sport will need to close due to an inability to run an industry worthy of the name."

With a power vacuum in government, Germany's Direktorium are calling for a boycott of Italian racing by the European Pattern Committee and the ruling body's Head of Business Services Robert Engels told the *Post* yesterday, "We can confirm that the prize money for German owners has not been paid for the period August to December 2012. We received several promises from the Italian racecourses that the prize money would be paid on 31 March 2013, but this did not happen. We have informed the German owners about the situation in Italy and they are upset about these circumstances. We support all efforts from other international racing boards, especially the European Pattern Committee, to clear this situation and to put pressure on the responsible parties."

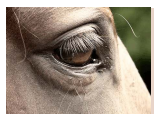

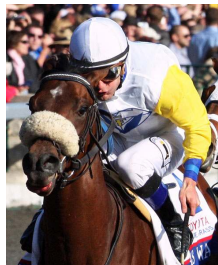

As Rydilluc started to fade entering the final eighth of the Blue Grass S., it looked pretty certain that the Keeneland Grade I would fall to a son of one of the stallions which joined the Lane's End Farm roster for the 2009 season. Would it be Curlin, whose son Palace Malice was the first to pass Rydilluc, or would it be War Pass, whose son Java's War was now in top gear after still being last of the 14 with only three eighths left to run?

I guess Lane's End would have preferred it if Palace Malice had held on, but he was caught on the line by Java's War. After all, Curlin is still a member of the Lane's End team, whereas War Pass died at the end of 2010, soon after his return from a second Southern Hemisphere season in Australia.

Sod's Law dictates that it has been War Pass who has made by far the more impressive start to his stallion career. Curlin, as a dual Horse of the Year, started out at \$75,000, but has yet to be represented by his first

graded stakes winner. War Pass, on the other hand, started out at a comparatively modest \$30,000 after 2007's champion juvenile had endured an anti-climactic second season. However, War Pass has now sired winners of two of the significant GI Kentucky Derby trials, the other, of course, being Revolutionary, winner of the GII Louisiana Derby. That amounts to a considerable achievement, in view of the fact that War Pass's first crop numbered only 65 named foals (with 61 live foals in his second, when his fee fell to \$20,000).

When I reviewed War Pass's prospects following his victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, I was dismissive of his chances of winning the Kentucky Derby--and not just because winners of the Juvenile have a notoriously bad record in the Derby. I simply didn't think he would stay well enough. **Cont. p6**

In the end, we didn't firmly establish the limits of War Pass's stamina, because he was injured before he could tackle a distance longer than a mile and an eighth. He failed by half a length to hold off Tale of Ekati after setting fast early fractions in the GI Wood Memorial on his only attempt beyond 1 1/16 miles. The Derby was said to be still the plan, but two weeks later came an announcement that the champion 2-year-old had suffered a sesamoid injury.

My concerns about the colt's stamina potential were based on his parentage. In addition to being by Cherokee Run, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint as a 4-year-old in 1994, he had a speedy dam by Mr. Prospector.

I pointed out that Cherokee Run was no one-dimensional speedster, and didn't have the pedigree of one. His sire Runaway Groom had won two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown, both over 1 1/2 miles, before heading south to take the GI Travers S., so Cherokee Run was clearly worth trying around two turns. He justified the opportunity when beaten only half a length in the GI Preakness S. and later won the GII Dwyer S. over a mile and an eighth.

His connections must ultimately have come to the conclusion that there were greater opportunities for him at up to a mile, rather than beyond it, as he never tackled more than a mile in nine starts as a 4-year-old. He showed his appreciation by gaining Grade II and Grade I victories over six furlongs.

"With a background like this," I wrote, "I should be able to report that Cherokee Run has proved similarly versatile as a stallion, with a wide mix of winners to his credit, but his strong suit has proved to be speed--and precocious speed at that. War Pass was his fifth challenger for Breeders' Cup honors and the previous four all contested either the Juvenile or the Juvenile Fillies. He came closest to success with Chilukki, runner-up to Cash Run in the 1999 Fillies, and Kafwain, who chased home Vindication in 2002."

So, if War Pass was going to sire live contenders for the Kentucky Derby, he was likely to need some help from his mares, and this is what has happened with Revolutionary and Java's War. **Cont. p7**

Revolutionary is out of Runup the Colors, an A.P. Indy mare who triumphed in the GI Alabama S. Java's War, for his part, is out of a sister to Fiji, the champion turf female of 1998 whose victories included the GI Yellow Ribbon S. and Santa Barbara H. over a mile and a quarter.

The way Java's War finished at Keeneland, he too should have no trouble with the extra furlong at Churchill Downs, and the extra distance could help him finish much closer to Verrazano, his conqueror in the GI Tampa Bay Derby. It is also encouraging that Java's War is a May 4 foal, so was still short of his actual third birthday when he triumphed in the Blue Grass. The potential drawback--apart from the poor record of past Blue Grass winners--is that he has yet to prove that he is at his most effective on dirt.

His broodmare sire, the Arc-winning Rainbow Quest, has proved highly effective in this role, with his daughters producing two winners of the Epsom Derby, plus winners of the Oaks and 2,000 Guineas. Although Rainbow Quest's progeny didn't always have the best forelegs, they did well in the U.S., with the likes of Fiji, Quest For Fame, Raintrap, Rainbow Dancer and Urgent Request all winning at the highest level. Urgent Request, with his victory in the Santa Anita H., proved the exception to the rule that Rainbow Quest's American winners were generally turf performers.

Java's War's dam wasn't in that class, but her relationship to Fiji was enough for her to sell for \$350,000, while carrying her subsequent Blue Grass winner. Java has now beaten Fiji to the distinction of having produced a Grade I winner, though Fiji didn't miss by much with her Danehill colt Marcus Andronicus, as he was beaten only half a length in the 2006 Poule d'Essai des Poulains.

Java's War is inbred to the brilliant French colt Blushing Groom--4x3 in his case--and he also has two lines of Raise a Native. Giant's Causeway's Grade I-winning sons Footstepsinthesand and Heatseeker are others inbred 4x3 to Blushing Groom, with Footstepsinthesand also having a dam by Rainbow Quest.

I've been reading the articles regarding Dreaming Of Julia (maybe Beholder and Unlimited Budget) deserving a place in the gate for this year's Derby. After the stagger-fest of the final 'Qualifying Points' preps, it is painfully obvious how ordinary the colts are this year. All three of those fillies were nominated to the Triple Crown at the first closing (plus four others). Why did their connections nominate them if they knew they would have to earn points to get in by running against the colts? Did the list of 'Qualifying' races come out *after* the first nomination deadline? I think the owners of these fillies have been defrauded and, since they all have run Beyer figures in 2013 higher than most of the colts that have qualified, they should be allowed to 'bump' a colt with a figure lower than their figures if they wish to run. What do you think? Can we start a petition to rectify this injustice and get the best 3-year-olds in training into the gate on Derby Day?
