### BLACK CAVIAR RETIRED

**Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}--Helsing {Aus}, by Desert Sun {GB}), who earned legions of fans and a devoted following the world over with 25 victories from as many trips to the races, has been retired to the breeding shed, managing owner Neil Werrett and trainer Peter Moody announced during an emotional press conference Wednesday afternoon at Caulfield.

"Twenty-five's a great number, and we thought she did us all proud on Saturday," Moody explained, voice wavering, referring to the 6-year-old's victory in the G1 T. J. Smith S. Once composed, he started again. "The mare's in great shape, we thought long and hard about racing on for another season, we thought about [Royal] Ascot, we thought about Brisbane, we thought about Adelaide, but at the end of the day, we believe she's done everything we've asked her to do and she couldn't have possibly done any more. It's the right time to call it a day on what's been a wonderful career of maybe one of the finest horses we've ever seen."

Victory number 25 came in front of a packed house at Royal Randwick Racecourse in Sydney, and was her 15th overall at the top level, surpassing the 30-year-old record held by the legendary Kingston Town (Aus). It was her eighth straight score in Group 1 company, also a record. Nine of her top-level victories came at the three major tracks in Melbourne, two in Sydney and Adelaide, one in Brisbane and her dramatic victory in last year's G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot. Werrett, who put together a group of friends to race Black Caviar, was one of many who thought she'd run her final race at Ascot.

"To get three more runs out of her and three more wins was a positive for the whole team and for Australian racing," Werrett said. "It was always going to be a hard decision, but it would have been a worse decision if you ran on and something happened. Now she can retire and we can look forward to racing her progeny." **Cont. p3**

Khalid Abdullah's **Hot Snap (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), making just her second career start, took major strides forward to provide Sir Henry Cecil with an eighth renewal of Newmarket's G3 Nell Gwyn S. yesterday. The half-sister to Middy (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) was hand ridden to take the lead with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and just one flick with the whip was enough to secure a comfortable 2 1/4-length success. "Provided Henry and the Prince are happy, I see no reason why she wouldn't go for the G1 1000 Guineas and a mile will be her right trip, I would think," said Abdullah's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe. "She is more likely to be a miler than her half-sister and, although they are both by sprinting stallions, they have different physical make-ups. She is more likely to go to Royal Ascot after the Guineas than the Oaks." **Cont. p6**

**From Humble Beginnings...**

Black Caviar was foaled Aug. 18, 2006, on Rick Jamieson's Gilgai Farm some 90 minutes north of Melbourne and a little more than 18 months later, the brown filly was consigned to the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale by Swettenham Stud. She was knocked down to Peter Moody for A\$210,000.

"Think of the residual value at the end of her racing days, that's after she's won a Group 1 for

you," quipped Inglis's Peter Heagney in 2008. How prescient that comment would prove.

Moody was ultimately able to get Werrett involved, and, after reportedly hosting friends for a weekend on a houseboat on the Murray River, the filly was split up into nine pieces.

"We've had a lot of lunches together and I'm glad we're all still together today as better friends than when we started out," Werrett told *AAP* Wednesday.

Black Caviar was the talking horse in a field of 12 for her debut Apr. 18, 2009 up the Flemington straight,

and was sent off the 2-1 favorite. The first of her quarter centuries of wins came at the longest odds of her career, as she cantered in by five lengths. She was ridden in her first two starts by Jarrad Noske, but was replaced thereafter by Luke Nolen, who was aboard for all but one of the mare's subsequent 23 starts. By

October 2010, she'd proven herself with four Group 2 wins, and the Patinack Farm Classic the following month represented the first chance at a Group 1. Her four-length success in 1:07.96 came at the expense of Ortensia (Aus) (Testa Rossa {Aus}), who later would frank the form with victories in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint in Dubai and in the G1 Nunthorpe S. in England.

Hay List (Aus) (Statue of Liberty), one of the top sprinters in Australia, saw enough of Black Caviar in 2011, but never could quite solve her, finishing runner-up in the G1 Lightning S. and G1 T. J. Smith S. With the mare staying in the barn, Hay List got his Group 1 in the All Aged S., but Black Caviar proved two lengths too good in the G1 B T C Cup to conclude that preparation.

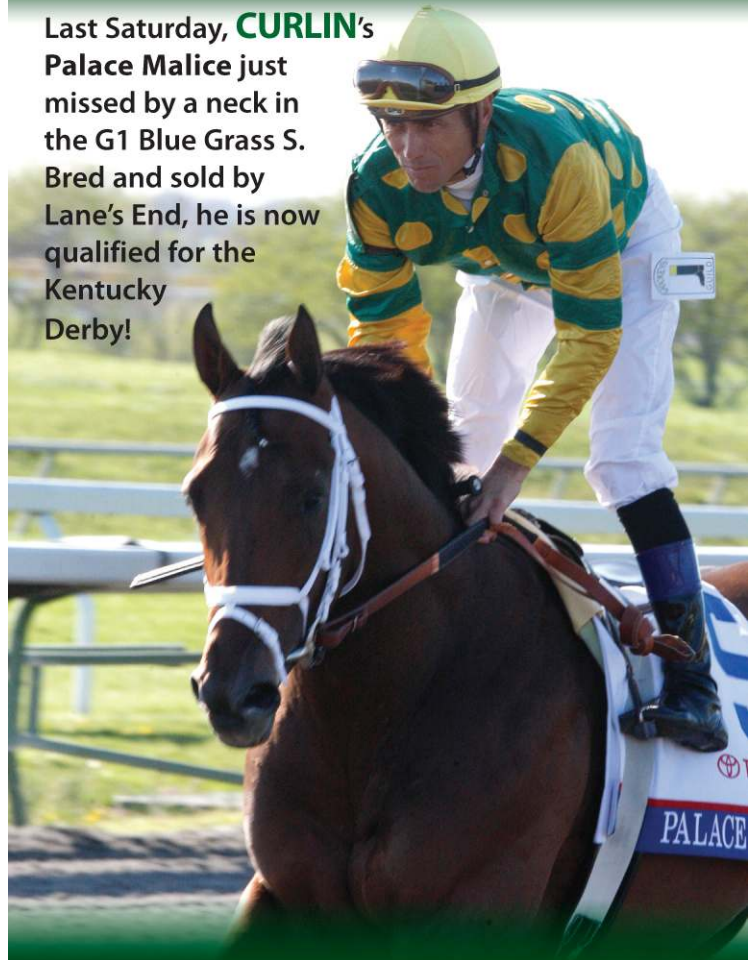

She successfully defended her title in the Patinack Farm Classic in November 2011, then--in the span of 22 days--won the G2 Australia S., the G1 C.F. Orr S. and the Lightning for a second time in early 2012. She made two successful appearances in Adelaide that winter, winning the G1 Robert Sangster S. and G1 The Goodwood before setting out to conquer the world at Royal Ascot.

Sent off the prohibitive 1-6 favorite against a world-class field, Black Caviar traveled on the bridle in the straight six-furlong test over the demanding course at Ascot. She struck the front in the final furlong, but didn't have that same brilliant burst of acceleration she always produced on the faster and flatter tracks Down Under. She began to labor a bit as the winning post loomed, and Nolen famously

stopped riding 50 meters out, thinking the job was done. Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) came at her up the inside and Nolen got back to work, shoving the mare across the line for the 22nd and narrowest victory of her storied career.

But the race exacted its toll on Black Caviar, as she was diagnosed with torn muscles, and connections seriously considered calling it a day. They opted to give her plenty of time and let her tell them whether to press on. In late 2012, it was announced that she would indeed remain in training.

Brought along slowly by Team Moody, Black Caviar resumed for a third try at the Lightning S. at Flemington, a race named in her honor for 2013, and, if anything, she looked better than ever in scoring by 2 1/2 lengths and covering the 1000 meters in :55.42, a new course record. She was the star attraction under the Friday night lights at Moonee Valley Mar. 22, leading home a stable 1-2-3 in the G1 William Reid S. For all her brilliance heretofore, there were questions surrounding her run in the Smith last weekend in Sydney. Rains early in the week had softened the ground and the field assembled was reported to be the most talented to take on Black Caviar. She was even a drifter in ante-post wagering at one point, but received a brilliant ride from Nolen, who steered her off the inside and stormed home to score by three lengths, with her old rival Hay List well-beaten in 10th. The post-race discussions focused on possible starts back in Adelaide, Brisbane or Royal Ascot, but Moody always suggested that any race could be her last, and so it proved. **Cont. p5**

Black Caviar retires with two Australian Horse of the Year and champion sprinter titles and was named England's highweight older mare at 5-7 furlongs off her Diamond Jubilee win. She accumulated earnings of US\$7,497,754. While there was much discussion of a possible mating to fellow unbeaten Frankel (GB), particularly had another trip to Royal Ascot come about, Black Caviar will likely visit a yet-to-be determined stallion in Australia for the 2013 breeding season. The mare is scheduled for one final public appearance when she parades Saturday at Caulfield.

In addition to Black Caviar, Helsing is the dam of MG1SW All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}). Half-siblings to Black Caviar by Redoute's Choice (Aus) have topped the last two renewals of the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, with the now 2-year-old filly Belle Couture (Aus) fetching A\$2.6 million in 2012. The mare's colt of 2011 made a record A\$5 million at last week's Easter sale. Rick Jamieson retains a weanling full-sister to Black Caviar.

### Hot Snap Wins Nells Gwyn (cont. from p1)

Hot Snap was off the mark on debut with a taking performance over average rivals at a mile on the Polytrack at Kempton in September. Sent off at 10-1 while making just her second start in the Nell Gwyn, the Juddmonte homebred was niggled at early by Tom Queally in last. She was still being cajoled at halfway, with **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}) just in front. She followed that rival up the rail and strode clear.

Among Cecil’s past winners of this 1000 Guineas trial are the subsequent Classic scorers One In a Million (Ire), Fairy Footsteps (Ire) and Oh So Sharp (Ire). Hot Snap occupies prime position to follow suit after this impressive score.

“We were pleasantly surprised, although Henry always had a high opinion of her,” Grimthorpe commented. “She had had quite a slow winter and had not really been on the grass for much work. For the first part of the race, I thought it was not looking very promising, but when she came back on the bridle about three furlongs out she clocked the idea of things and came through them very well. We were hoping for a good run, but if you’d said she would win, I would have been quite surprised. This was solid form and she’s going to need to be on a learning curve fairly quickly, but I can’t see why she wouldn’t, as this was only her second start and she’s come through horses, which is nice. You’d have to hope there is more improvement, both physically and mentally.”

## DABIRSIM RETIRED

Connections of **Dabirsim (Fr)** (Hat Trick {Jpn}--Rumoured, by Royal Academy) have called time on the career of the former champion juvenile, it was announced yesterday. Owned by Simon Springer and trained by Christophe Ferland, the 2011 G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner who was named France's Horse of the Year, had not been seen since finishing a close-up sixth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains last May. "The horse is not as well as I had hoped, so we decided with the owner that we would stop his career and send him to stud," Ferland told *PA Sport*. "We don't know which stud yet. Things did not go right last year. Christophe Soumillon did not get on with the horse. It's a shame he did not run again, but it is the best for the horse. He has had a foot problem. He was the best 2-year-old in Europe and he proved he can stay a mile, because he did that in the French Guineas." Dabirsim, who cost a mere €30,000 as a yearling at Arqana in August 2010, enjoyed his finest hours when registering a three-length success in Deauville's Prix Morny and when unleashing a telling surge from an unpromising position in the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere on Arc day before problems beset him. "In the Jean-Luc Lagardere, 200 meters from the line he was fifth and then in three strides he'd won," Ferland added. "To do that and, on such an exceptional day as that of the Arc de Triomphe, I'll never forget. He was fine this winter and I could have run him, but I think it would have been difficult to fly him to race somewhere in the world. The horse is still with me at the moment, he goes out every day and will stay until the owner finds the right place for him to start his new career."

Confirming the colt would go into training in England, Stroud added, "According to our times, he did one of the fastest breezes of the day, if not the fastest. More Than Ready is a good solid stallion and the horse vetted well."

Egan's team ended the day as leading vendor, when a colt by Arch ([lot 82](#)) out of the Moyglare Stud-bred Touch Of Truth (Storm Cat) was knocked down to Richard Frisby for 270,000gns.

"He will be trained in Newmarket and he's a beautifully bred horse," said Frisby of the half-brother to GIII Monrovia H. winner Society Hostess from the family of Moyglare globetrotters Go And Go (Ire) (Be My Guest), winner of the GI Belmont S. and Media Puzzle (Theatrical {Ire}), victorious in the G1 Melbourne Cup. "He has a stallion's pedigree if it happens."

The heady start led to a lively evening's trade, peppered with plenty of pricey 2-year-olds, with 17 lots fetching in excess of 100,000gns by the close of play.

**Back for Another Dose...**

Zoltan Mikoczy bought his star sprinter Overdose (GB) (Starborough {GB}) at Tattersalls for 2,000gns a little over six years ago, but he had to go to a considerably higher price to secure that colt's half-brother by Royal Applause (GB) ([lot 34](#)), who was eventually purchased through agent Oliver Gaisford St Lawrence for 215,000gns (US\$344,129).

"That was a horrible price," said Mikoczy, who plans to take the colt back to Hungary where he will be stabled alongside Overdose in the Budapest yard of trainer Jozef Roszival. "I came here specially to buy this horse. Overdose is a hero in our country and his brother moves like him and looks a bit like him."

Mikoczy was congratulated by the colt's breeders, Graham and Diane Robinson, who reported that his dam, the Warning (GB) mare Our Poppet (Ire), has recently foaled a Paco Boy (Ire) filly and was covered by Juddmonte's first-season sire Bated Breath (GB) a fortnight ago.

The Royal Applause colt represented a significant pinhooking triumph for Con Marnane of Bانشa House Stables, who bought him last October for 35,000gns. With John Egan consigning the top lot of the session, his former weighing-room colleague Philip Robinson, who retired from race riding last year, was at the opposite end of another of the evening's top lots when signing for a son of Invincible Spirit (Ire) ([lot 50](#)) at 210,000gns (US\$336,098).

"He's most likely to go to Hong Kong," said the former rider of such turf greats at Pebbles (GB), Katies (GB) and Rakti (GB).

The colt was consigned by Brendan Holland's Grove Stud, vendor at the 2012 Craven Sale of the unbeaten Rosdhu Queen (Ire), also by Invincible Spirit and the winner of last September's G1 Cheveley Park S. Now trained by William Haggas, she is set to line up for the G3 Dubai Duty Free S. at Newbury on Saturday. Grove Stud also sold a colt by Exceed and Excel (Aus) ([lot 54](#)) for 140,000gns to Stephen Hillen, having purchased him at Goffs last year for €62,000.

**McCormack goes to War...**

[Lot 28](#), one of three colts in the catalogue by boom young sire War Front, was the selection of John McCormack, who bought the grey son of the winning Maria's Mon mare Niceling for 180,000gns (US\$288,073) on behalf of an English client.

"He is a lovely big scopey sort, possibly more of a back end type 2-year-old," said McCormack. "The sire is very good--he's been doing it in the U.S., Hong Kong and Europe, and he's not stopped improving yet."


Abacus Bloodstock purchased the War Front colt for \$50,000 at Keeneland in September and he was consigned for the breeze-up by Eamon Fitzpatrick's Kilminfoyle House Stud.

Another juvenile to show a dramatic improvement on his yearling price was Clenagh Castle Stud's Exceed and Excel colt ([lot 13](#)) out of Johar's sister Mindsharp (Gone West). Sold for 36,000gns to Five Star Bloodstock at Book 2 of Tattersalls' October Sale, the half-brother to juvenile winner Ceelo (GB) (Green Desert) this time raised an offer of 145,000gns from Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock. Sheikh Mohammed bought Johar's dam Windsharp for \$6.1 million at Keeneland in November 2003 and his Darley operation subsequently bred Mindsharp, who was later sold for 80,000gns at Tattersalls in December 2008.

Goff also signed for two Invincible Spirit colts: [lot 47](#), the Malcolm Bastard-consigned son of Persian Punch's half-sister Port Providence (GB) (Red Ransom) was picked up for 150,000gns, while 100,000gns was enough to secure Oak Tree Farm's colt ([lot 16](#)) out of Miss Ghena, a daughter of the GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. winner Dimitrova (Swain {Ire}).

**Hoping to Excel Again...**

Marco Botti is understandably keen on the offspring of Exceed and Excel (Aus) having trained one of his best sons, Excelebration (Ire). He plumped for another colt ([lot 30](#)) by the Darley sire, a son of Music Show's sister Norfolk Broads (Ire) (Noverre), for whom he had to go to 100,000gns (US\$160,000).

"Obviously I like the sire," said Botti. "This colt takes after Excelebration quite a bit and has a real Exceed And Excel stamp about him. I thought he did a pretty good breeze considering he got loose the day before and cantered for two miles around Newmarket Heath!"

Botti added that the colt is likely to be for Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum, the owner of Moohaajim (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), bought for 200,000gns at this sale last year and an entrant in Saturday's G2 Greenham S.

"I just hope the ground dries out a bit more before then," added the trainer.

Having been a vendor buy-back at 65,000gns in the same ring six months ago, [lot 9](#), a son of Lawman (Fr) out of listed winner Mayonga (Ire) (Dr Fong) made a greater impression this time around when selling to Peter Doyle on behalf of Palace House Racing for 110,000gns (US\$176,077). The new operation also went to 120,000gns (US\$192,083) for [lot 51](#), Wonderful Utopia (Fr), a filly by Dubawi (Ire) out of the stakes-winning Queen Of Norway (Woodman). She proved to be the top-priced filly of the day and provided a decent return for Jim McCartan of Gaybrook Lodge Stud who bought her in Book 2 of Tattersalls' October Sale for 28,000gns.

With 51 of the 78 lots offered on the opening night changing hands, the clearance rate of 65% was down by eight points on last year's tally, but the aggregate was up by a healthy 17%, to 4,007,000gns (from 3,430,000gns) and the average rose even higher, settling at 78,569gns (from 63,519gns), an improvement of 24%. The median price was 52,000gns, a drop of 5%.

The sale concludes today with the final session commencing at 6 p.m. local time.

**NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL**



**PRESIDENT'S PROPOSED BUDGET MAKES EXPENSE ALLOWANCE PERMANENT**

Last week, President Obama released his Fiscal Year 2014 Budget request which included a provision that would make permanent the current \$500,000 expense allowance found in Section 179 of the Internal Revenue Code. This advantageous provision has benefited horse racing and breeding since 2010, but it is set to expire at the end of 2013. The President's 200+ page budget also provides that the Section 179 expense allowance should be indexed for inflation in future years.

The Section 179 expense allowance provides an incentive for businesses to invest in qualified new or used depreciable property, including horses and farm equipment. By permitting the deduction of additional depreciation in the year that horses are purchased and placed into service, Section 179 has helped the Thoroughbred sales market to recover.

Whether the \$500,000 expense allowance will extend beyond December 31, 2013, as outlined in the President's FY 2014 budget, is yet to be decided. The President's responsibility is to propose a budget to Congress every year but the President's proposal only frames the administration's priorities. Congress will ultimately decide the fate of the Section 179 expense allowance beyond 2013. The NTRA will urge Congress to make the current expense allowance permanent.

# BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

## HERE HE BLOWS

Unbeaten and as yet unbowed, **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) enters today's G3 Novae Bloodstock Insurance Craven S. at Newmarket with a reputation to defend and enhance. Purchased recently by Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani, the Richard Hannon trainee was not stressed after his half-length defeat of the re-opposing **Dundonnell** (First Defence) in Doncaster's G2 Champagne S. over seven furlongs in September and his conditioner has made no secret of the regard in which he is held. "We had an inch of rain last weekend, so we delayed the major dress-rehearsals until Monday morning and Toronado moved real well up at Everleigh in his final gallop," Hannon said. "He is unbeaten and we have always thought the world of him, but he only beat Dundonnell half a length in the Champagne S. at Doncaster in September and is now three pounds worse off, so he has to show us that he has improved through the winter. We think he has, but we need to see it on the track." Dundonnell, who carries the Khalid Abdullah silks, looked every inch a Classic prospect last term when winning the G3 Acomb S. over seven furlongs at York in August and did little to undermine that impression when runner-up in the Champagne and fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Santa Anita in November. Jockey James Doyle told *PA Sport*, "I sat on him last Saturday and was delighted. He was highly strung last year, but has really matured between two and three. He has physically filled out. Obviously, it is a tough race. Toronado had the run of the race last time when he beat me, but now carries a penalty, so I am hopeful. Dundonnell is a good mover and the ground drying out will be in our favour. Quick ground would really suit." Richard Hannon has won this five times and aside from Toronado, also puts forward Qatar Racing Limited & CSH's **Havana Gold (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}). He annexed the G3 Somerville Tattersall S. over seven furlongs here in September before finding only Ghurair (Elusive Quality) a head too strong in the £500,000 Tattersalls Millions 2-Y-O Trophy over the same track and trip days later. "Havana Gold may not have attracted the same publicity as Toronado, but he is a decent horse in his own right," his trainer said. "He is only rated four pounds inferior anyway and he won the Tattersalls Somerville S. at Newmarket last year and then ran Ghurair to a head in the big sales race up there, and that is solid form."

Eclipse Award champion sprinter and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner **Trinniberg** (Teufflesberg) worked five furlongs in 1:02.40 at Calder yesterday. This was his first recorded workout since his return from Dubai, where he was 11th in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen.

"After the race in Dubai, he was going crazy in his stall, he was feeling so good," trainer Shivananda Parbhoo said. "And when we got him back to Calder, he was doing so well, that we decided to take him out to gallop. Once he got on the track, he was all business; it's like he was telling us that he wanted to get back to work."

Parbhoo is now focusing on planning out a series of races that will prepare Trinniberg to defend his Breeders' Cup title in November.

"I've got two races I'm looking at between now and July," Parbhoo said. "The first is the GI Churchill Downs S. on Derby Day, and the second is the GI Smile Sprint the first weekend in July. The plan is to breeze him again next week, either Wednesday or Thursday, depending on the weather. And if everything goes according to plan, we'll go to Kentucky."

We'll have a chat when we get home, as he has a lot of speed. You could take him hunting in the mornings, he's so laid-back and today woke him up a bit. I really don't know how good he is." They include Ecurie Wildenstein's homebred **Saskatchewan (GB) (Peintre Celebre)**, a full-brother to the 2007 G1 Gran Premio di Milano victor Sudan (Ire), who has been transferred from Elie Lellouche's yard and represents Luca Cumani's local base for this unveiling.

### GENERATION GALOP LAUNCHED

Lady Chrissy O'Reilly and Herve Morin have announced the formation of Generation Galop, with an ambitious motto "for the revival of French racing". O'Reilly, who enjoys a reputation as one of the country's leading owners and breeders at Haras de la Louviere, has joined forces with Morin, former co-owner of Literato (Fr) who he stands at his Ecurie de la Vallee Martigny with a full-time Secretary General in Alix Choppin. "The current situation about French racing is very paradoxical: on the one hand, the major sources of funding for the industry, which are the betting and auction markets, are holding strong against the general crisis, with gains approaching 30% over the past 10 years; on the other hand, more and more professionals are finding it hard to make ends meet and our customer base is dwindling," a statement read yesterday. "The number of owners with horses in training has fallen by 10% since 2002, and when you look at owners of 3 to 20 horses the drop is 30%. For owners of 20+ horses it is as much as 50%. The same trend can be found in the breeding ranks: the overall number of breeders is down 7% since 2007, but breeders with 5+ mares are down 16%. Only one stallion is claiming a fee in excess of €15,000 in 2013, as opposed to 6 a decade ago. And the number of nominations sold in a year to French-based stallions has been cut by almost a third since 2007. Moreover, our very privileged funding scheme is reaching a critical stage, as the growth of the betting turnover is now only supported by the steady increase in "Premium" races (races on which bets can be placed on a national scale, as opposed to races restricted to on-course betting), which cannot go on forever. Finally, we all notice day after day that horseracing is unfortunately under the radar of most people in France. Our sport blatantly lacks profile and appeal to the general public, which makes it all the more difficult to attract new owners into the game. Our aim with the launch of Generation Galop is to all get together and re-invent a model that can take French racing towards the future. This model needs to be modern, open, and to create added-value for all economic stakeholders in the industry, from the punter to the owner. We also want to allow professionals to have their say, as they are enough listened to today. We have chosen to start our work by addressing two priority topics: ownership and the racing program. A research phase will first be carried out in order to identify the main stumbling blocks. There is undeniably a lot to be done, notably to improve the way overseas owners are welcomed in our country. We encourage all owners, including foreign owners with horses in training in France, to get in touch with us and tell us about their experience of ownership in France. Then we will form work groups on each issue that will have come out and try to come up with innovative proposals to solve these problems."

### 'DRAGON' PENCILED IN FOR CHAMPIONS MILE

Two-time Hong Kong Horse of the Year **Ambitious Dragon (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}) looks to join the field for the HK\$12 million G1 Champions Mile May 5. He is scheduled to run the G1 Audemars Piguet QEII Cup just one week prior, in what would be an unprecedented double. "We will focus on the APOEII as our first hurdle and, as long as he comes out of it in good shape, we intend to give the Champions Mile a go," said Tony Millard, Ambitious Dragon's trainer. Ambitious Dragon was a disappointing fourth in last year's Champions Mile, but was impressive in his most recent start, winning the 1400-meter Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup Mar. 17. The bay gelding will have plenty of competition in this 14-horse field. Last year's winner **Xtension (Ire)** (Xaar {GB}), will return in hopes of an unprecedented third straight Champions Mile victory. **Glorious Days (Aus)** (Hussonet), runner-up by a half-length in 2012, looks to go one better this year and enters the race off a third in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup. Australasia is well represented in this race in the form of **King Mufhasa (NZ)** (Pentire {GB}) and **Shoot Out (Aus)** (High Chaparral {Ire}). King Mufhasa (NZ) is already a proven champion in Australia and New Zealand with 10 Group 1 wins, while Shoot Out (Aus) has five Group 1 wins, including back-to-back successes in the G1 Chipping Norton S. He is scheduled to run in Saturday's G1 Doncaster Mile H. at Randwick and it is not yet confirmed whether he will head to Head Kong afterwards.
