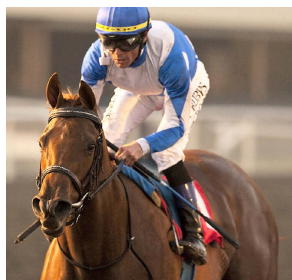

With 20 points on the line, today's GIII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland may have some GI Kentucky Derby implications after all. **Pure Fun** (Pure Prize), a

visually impressive heroine of last term's GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 8, takes on the boys following a flat third as the 4-5 chalk in Turfway's GIII Fathead Bourbonette Oaks Mar. 23. "Pure Fun is doing better than ever," trainer Kenny McPeck tweeted Apr. 16. "Bring on the boys. Unconventional move, but we need a good race before the [GI] Kentucky Oaks." Garrett Gomez,

aboard Pure Fun in her last two starts, winds up aboard California shipper **Examen** (Giant's Causeway). Trained by Tom Proctor, the chestnut graduated over the Santa Anita lawn Feb. 9, then annexed an off-the-turf \$80,000 optional tagger in Arcadia Mar. 7. **Winning Cause** (Giant's Causeway), a perfect two-for-two over the Keeneland Polytrack, returns on short notice after landing a local seven-furlong first-level allowance Apr. 6. **Field p3**

**HEFTY PURSE LURES 14 TO ILLINOIS**

Boosted by a purse of \$750,000, today's GIII Illinois Derby at Hawthorne has attracted a full field of 14 despite being excluded from the official GI Kentucky Derby prep schedule. Claiborne Farm and Adele B. Dilschneider's **Departing** (War Front), an impressive winner of his first three starts, including the Texas Heritage S. at Sam Houston Mar. 2, encountered some traffic woes in the stretch when a good third in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 30. He adds Lasix for this. **Ground Transport** (Big Brown), a good-looking winner of two straight at Fair Grounds, also exits the Louisiana Derby, finishing fifth, beaten five lengths. The ultra-consistent **Siete de Oros** (A.P. Warrior) makes his first start since finishing fourth behind Vyjack (Into Mischief) in the GIII Gotham S. Mar. 2. **Field p4**

**IT'S GAME TIME AT CHARLES TOWN**


Hollywood Casino at Charles Town will be offering a purse of \$1.5 million for its flagship race, the GII Charles Town Classic, and a pair of Grade I winners, as well as the race's defending champion will line up to try to grab the lion's share of the hefty pot. Four-time Grade I-winner and multi-millionaire **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again) seeks his fourth consecutive victory after posting Beyers of 116 in the GII San Antonio Feb. 3, and 117 in the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 2. The 6-year-old gelding will carry highweight of 123, and will exit from post three as the 4-5 morning-line choice. The Craig Lewis-trained **Clubhouse Ride** (Candy Ride {Arg}) finished second to Game on Dude in both the San Antonio and the Big 'Cap, and looks for his first stakes victory here. Brous Stable and Jack T. Hammer's **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate) won a pair of Grade I's last year, taking the Santa Anita H. in March before adding the GI Stephen Foster H. over subsequent Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) at Churchill in June. The 6-year-old rounded out that campaign with a fourth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and opened this year's account with an emphatic 11 1/4-length victory in the Sunshine Millions Classic over a sloppy Gulfstream strip Jan. 19. The Bill Mott charge most recently finished fourth behind Game on Dude in an attempt to defend his title in the Big 'Cap. **Cont. p4**

The well-traveled **Caixa Eletronica** (Arromanches) was victorious in this event last year, and he will make his 62nd career start while looking for a title defense here. The 8-year-old Mike Repole colorbearer, haltered for \$62,500 by his connections two years ago and now an earner of more than \$1.6-million, has done most of his running at a mile or less, but he has proven equally effective at this distance. The chestnut opened his 2013 account with a victory in the Uncle Mo S. at Aqueduct Mar. 14. He will once again be ridden by Javier Castellano, who has partnered him in his last 10 starts. "I don't think it takes a normal 1 1/8-mile horse to win this," said Repole. "This is not a typical 1 1/8-mile race. It's three turns. It takes a horse that is very versatile to win this race. Whether its mud, a dry track, the inner track at Aqueduct, or the 1 1/2-mile track at Belmont, Caixa Eletronica can win on any surface. I don't think there was any doubt in my mind going around that second turn last year. Once Javier [Castellano] said 'Go', he won by 3 1/2. If they went around another time, he might have won by 20."

## SADLER LOOKS FOR LADY LUCK

Trainer John Sadler is always a force to be reckoned with on the Southern California circuit, and the conditioner looks extra tough in today's GII Santa Barbara S. at Santa Anita, where he sends out the top two betting choices. **Lady of Shamrock** (Scat Daddy), a two-time Grade I winner last year, is the even-money favorite on the morning line, and towers over this bunch on paper. A close-up fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Santa Anita to round out her sophomore campaign last year, the Hronis Racing colorbearer opened her 2013 account with a second-place finish in the GII Santa Ana S. here Mar. 24, where she got off to a slow start before running the winner Tiz Flirtatious (Tizbud) to a length. Sadler assistant Larry Benavidez noted that the Breeders' Cup is again the goal for Lady of Shamrock this year. "John has five races on her agenda this year, and this is one of them," Benavidez said. Stablemate **Moone's My Name (GB)** (Intikhab) finished an encouraging second in her stateside debut going a mile over this strip in the American Beauty S. Apr. 7, and tries this distance for the first time. She is pegged at 3-1 on the morning line. George Krikorian's **Double Ante** (Purim) tested graded company in last October's GIII Autumn Miss S. over this strip, finishing 10th, but the 4-year-old has shown marked improvement since that occasion. She has recorded back-to-back Beyer Speed Figures of 88 heading into this event, most recently winning an allowance on this course Mar. 16. **Cont. p5**

**PIERRO A WINNER? WEIGHT JUST A MINUTE**

"Weight stops a train, will it stop **Pierro (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus})," trainer Gai Waterhouse pondered rhetorically to the *Australian Associated Press* ahead of Saturday's G1 Doncaster Mile H. at Randwick. Last year's 2-year-old Triple Crown winner has been asked to carry 126 pounds, two fewer than top-weighted **Shoot Out (Aus)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), and deservedly so, as he rides a three-race winning streak into today's test. That includes a last-out victory over the Hong Kong-bound King Mufhasa (NZ) (Pentire {GB}) and Shoot Out in the G1 George Ryder S. at Rosehill Apr. 6. "Fifty seven kilograms. I can't think of a 3-year-old in recent history who has been asked to lumber such a big weight," Waterhouse continued. "It's a massive weight but he's earned it." Shoot Out posted a first-up win in the G1 Chipping Norton S. Mar. 9 prior to his George Ryder run, where he was beaten a little more than a length. Pierro trades at about even-money favoritism, but will have to give market rival **Norzita (NZ)** (Thorn Park {Aus}) nine pounds. The 3-year-old filly was third to the re-opposing **Appearance (Aus)** (Commands {Aus}) in a blanket finish in the G1 Coolmore Stud S. at Rosehill Mar. 23, but bounced back to validate 6-5 favoritism in the G1 Storm Queen S. at that venue Apr. 6. Appearance holds excellent form coming into this and added a half-length victory in the G1 Queen of the Turf S. Apr. 6, with defending Doncaster winner More Joyous (NZ) (More Than Ready) a troubled fifth.

She exits a third to Norzita (NZ) (Thorn Park {Aus}) in the Queen of the Turf S., but should go better here, according to trainer Donna Logan. "She is going into the Oaks very much like she went into the Derby," Logan told AAP. "She'd been off for five weeks before the Vinery [Storm Queen S.] and will have improved with that run. She didn't cope with the turning track at Rosehill, and she will be much better suited at Randwick." **More Than Sacred (Aus)** (More Than Ready) is in equally good form ahead of this test, having won the G3 Sunline Vase at Ellerslie Mar. 1 and the G1 New Zealand Oaks Mar. 16. **Dear Demi (Aus)** (Dehere) gets blinkers off as she looks to rediscover her better form. ### FURTHER GLORY AWAITS

Following the emphatic success of Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in Thursday's G3 Craven S., the Richard Hannon stable--which enjoyed a one-two in that event--take to Newbury with another hot favorite in **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) for today's G3 Aon Greenham S. Beaten only by Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in the G2 Coventry S. so far, Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, G2 Superlative S. and G2 Vintage S. hero was the subject of a positive update from jockey Richard Hughes. "When I look at him in the yard, I think 'he looks too fat,' but that is just him," he said. "He is a bull of a horse and he has been working real well. The ground will definitely be softer at Newbury than it was at Newmarket earlier in the week, but that won't worry Olympic Glory." If successful, Olympic Glory will be bidding to emulate the 1998 Greenham winner Victory Note (Fairy King) in following up in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp May 12. "He did not enjoy coming down hill at Goodwood last year and only started to run on when the ground leveled out, so why would we risk him on those ridges in the dip when he can go back to France, where he has already won a Group 1?" Hughes added. Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's **Moohaajim (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) was not tried beyond six furlongs last term, winning this track's G2 Mill Reef S. in September before finishing runner-up to Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) in Newmarket's G1 Middle Park S. the following month. He looks as if the step up in trip will help him, while trainer Brian Meehan is nervous about the rain-softened ground for Poilin Good's **Correspondent (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). Despite having won twice over this distance in a Polytrack maiden and conditions race at Lingfield and Wolverhampton in the fall, his stamina will be tested by the ground. "Correspondent makes a big step up in class to contest this acknowledged 2000 Guineas trial," his trainer said. "He is speedy and would probably hold his best chance if the ground were to dry out a little from the forecast good-to-soft."

**STRETCHING THE ELASTIC**

Year after year, the spring trials offer the opportunity for last term's sprinting juveniles to stretch out in trip, but very few are able to pass muster, with the unbeaten **Roshdu Queen (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) the latest to try in today's G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury. Having ruled the roost over six furlongs when annexing the G2 Lowther S. at York in August and G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket the next month, Clipper Logistics' flag-bearer is asked to extend that dominance over an extra furlong here. "She was a very fast 2-year-old," Johnny Murtagh told *PA Sport*. "William Haggas is very happy with her. He said she's done really well. If she can perform well, hopefully she can make up into a Guineas filly." Ahmad Alkhalafi's **Maureen (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) was only ninth in the Cheveley Park, having won the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot in July, and rider Richard Hughes is in the dark over her staying power.

"She's not over-big, but she's moving very well," he said. "We still don't know whether she'll stay or not. Her last run was a little bit disappointing, but she wasn't quite right, so you can put a line through that run. If she stays, she'll take all the beating." Khalid Abdullah's **Desert Image (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}) is one who has no stamina questions to answer, having ran second in the Listed Montrose S. over a mile at Newmarket in November. "Desert Image is a nice filly who tries very hard," trainer Charlie Hills commented. "She has wintered well and I don't think it will matter what the ground is like for her."

The half-brother to the now-retired Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) was held up towards the back of the pack and was pocketed to the 200-meter mark, then burst through three off the fence and went on to a soft half-length victory from Darley's **Academus (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}). "He didn't

have to go out there and win the trial by six lengths, he did what he had to do and he is coming along nicely," jockey Dwayne Dunn said. The A\$1.025-million Inglis Easter sales-topper in 2011, All Too Hard defeated **Pierro (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}) in the G1 Caulfield Guineas last October and was spelled off his runner-up effort in the G1 Cox Plate later that month. He returned with weight-for-age scores in the G1 C. F. Orr S. Feb. 9 and the G1 Futurity S. Feb. 23, but was sidelined with a virus and has slowly worked himself back into race shape. "He has a solid base so we are not worried," Hawkes said of the colt's conditioning. "Even though he hasn't raced for close to two months he has been in the stables and doing enough to keep him ticking over. He looks super, he is very well in himself." Earlier in the day, it was announced that All Too Hard would enter stud at a fee of A\$66,000 for the 2013 breeding season. "We have been fortunate enough to have assembled an exceptionally strong group of young stallions, and we believe All Too Hard will take it to another level," Vinery's Peter Orton commented. The 3-year-old is under consideration for a run in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot following next weekend's All-Aged S., a race that is expected to attract **More Joyous (NZ)** (More Than Ready) and **Epaulette (Aus)** (Commands {Aus}), runner-up to Black Caviar in the G1 T. J. Smith S. Apr. 13.

Trainer Ed Dunlop yesterday issued a positive update on **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab), who is back at the yard and in work as she steadily builds towards her seasonal return. Cristina Patino's six-time Group 1 winner was out of action after her G1 Irish Champion S. victory with heat in her foreleg, but is giving all the right signals once again. "She's come in and everything looks good--she did her first canter yesterday and another one today and that went well, so we'll just gently progress," her conditioner explained. "Realistically, I don't think she'll be ready in time for Royal Ascot, but she'll have an entry there and we'll see what happens."

### Westchester S. Field Beginning to Take Shape...

An interesting field is beginning to form for the opening stakes of the Belmont Park spring/summer meet, the \$150,000 GIII Westchester S. Apr. 27.

It will be the stakes debut for the unbeaten 4-year-old ♂ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♂ **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song). The Todd Pletcher trainee broke his maiden in his debut at Gulfstream Jan. 24 and returned there Mar. 10 for an impressive 7 1/2-length victory going a mile in optional claimer company.

"He's an exciting kind of a horse," said Michael McCarthy, Pletcher's assistant trainer. "He had a great work the other day [5 furlongs in 1:00.45] on the training track."

Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin is pointing **Rattlesnake Bridge** (Tapit) at the Westchester as well. The 2011 GI Travers S. runner-up was laid-up for 16 months after taking ninth in the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The 5-year-old was a winner in his first and only start since then, an optional claimer at Gulfstream Mar. 20.

"We tried to give him time off, he bruised a cannon bone, we brought him back, he bruised a cannon bone, we brought him back," McLaughlin said. "It's nice that they were patient, and he's doing great."

McLaughlin plans to use this race as a prep for the GI Metropolitan H. at Belmont May 27.

"We're pointing for the Met Mile. It's a Grade I and is an important race to win to become a valuable stallion," McLaughlin said. "This has worked out well, four weeks and four weeks. This will only help him, considering the 16 months off."

Another possible in the Westchester field is the Shug McGaughey-trained **Hymn Book** (Arch). The GI Donn H. victor hasn't raced since placing fifth in the GI Cigar Mile H. Nov. 24.

"He's an honest, hard-trying horse, 7-years-old now," said Buzz Tenney, assistant to Shug McGaughey. "If we get a little of an off track, that will help him some. It will be a place to get him started."

Other Westchester probables include: two-time GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner **Flat Out** (Flatter); **Big Screen** (Speightstown); **Pants on Fire** (Jump Start); **Winslow Homer** (Unbridled's Song); and **Private Tale** (Tale of the Cat).

Iowa Oaks June 30, she resurfaced to finish a well-beaten seventh in Gulfstream's seven-furlong GII Inside Information S. Mar. 17. Sent to the front by Rosie Napravnik here, she enjoyed a narrow lead over Sisterhood through fractions of :24.43 and :49.20. Ice Cream Silence was headed by Lotta

Lovin at the top of the stretch as Sisterhood appeared to back out of it. Ice Cream Silence fought back gamely along the inside to shake clear in midstretch and held off a late rally from the resurgent Sisterhood to win narrowly. "Last year, we thought she was our best filly," trainer Rusty Arnold said. "She went out to Prairie Meadows and got injured and missed the entire fall. We brought her back, and nothing went right in Florida. We didn't get her the right way. She had a disastrous kind of day. We brought her in here early and she did everything right. We had decided that we were going to run her in here after we ran her in Florida. It was one of those plans that went the right way." Napravnik added, "I knew it was an easy pace. Rusty gave me the liberty to just do whatever felt right and ride the race how it came up. She's a great filly and just very responsive, did whatever I asked and obviously showed her class. She's a very talented filly."

**Last Week** - West Hills Giant ran like a 38-1 shot in the Blue Grass, but **Overanalyze** helped get me back into this thing with a convincing victory at 7-2 in the Arkansas Derby. Looks like the stage is set for another exciting stretch duel between Sherack and DiDonato. Wouldn't want it any other way.

**GIII Lexington S.** - Really don't like any of the horses expected to take the bulk of the money here--**Winning Cause** (5-1); **Pick of the Litter** (6-1); **Sunbean** (4-1); **Cerro** (5-1); and **Pure Fun** (7-2) (listed from the rail out)--and will be shopping for value in this wide-open affair. Always prefer picking something with early speed and was tempted to land on either **River Rocks**, **Examen**, or **Wings of Fortune**, but with the way that the track has been playing in routes throughout the meet, I decided to stick with a horse that will be coming from the back of the pack that I've been following since his debut. The inconsistent **General Election** doesn't always show up, but he has certainly hinted at ability in a pair of visually impressive victories in his unveiling at Churchill Downs last November and Turfway's John Battaglia Memorial S. Mar. 2. The half-brother to MGISP Ready's Echo (More Than Ready) bounced back from a well-beaten sixth behind the talented Departing in a Fair Grounds optional claimer with a career-high 85 Beyer after making a smart sweeping move on the far turn in the aforementioned Battaglia. Thought he was live at 24-1 returning three weeks later in the GIII Spiral, but just never got involved and reported home a well-beaten 10th. He's had a full month to get back on track, cuts back to 1 1/16 miles, and worked a smart four furlongs in :48 2/5 at Keeneland Apr. 14. Live at a price.

## BRIAN DIDONATO:

**Last Week** - Well, looks like this one is coming right down to the wire. Totally off last week--**Footbridge** made no impact (last of 14) in the Blue Grass at what I thought was a very generous 23-1, and **War Academy** was pulled up down the backstretch as 9-5 chalk in the Arkansas Derby. Glad to hear the latter is okay. Nice job by Steve to land on **Overanalyze**, who neither of us had been particularly big fans of previously. I must say, I'm a bit lost at this point as we head towards the Derby. I have plenty of strong negative opinions on runners, but not many positive ones. Somebody's going to win, so I guess I better start studying.

**GIII Lexington S.** - This is a tricky race that seems pretty wide open, so I started by looking back at trends from past renewals of the Lexington since Keeneland switched to Polytrack and also included the seven synthetic runnings of the Blue Grass to increase my sample size. Of the 13 winners, every single one had either a prior turf win or a second-place finish or better on synthetic--"dirt horses" clearly have not fared well. The average winner was 20-1, 16-1 if we take out a few extra-big longshots (All Squared Away, Slew's Tizzy and Stately Victor) and 12.7-1 if we just count the four shorter-priced winners of the Lex. It might be some sort of fallacy to expect a higher probability of a longshot because winners of past races were longshots, but the stats are interesting nonetheless. I'll try **Wings of Fortune**, whose conditioner Mike Maker was responsible for 2011 Lexington winner Derby Kitten (9-1) and 2010 Blue Grass upsetter Stately Victor (40-1). He also took last October's GI Breeders' Futurity with 8-1 shot Joha. Seeming to need the race when fourth behind Ground Transport in his off-the-turf debut at Fair Grounds Jan. 19, Wings of Fortune chased hot splits, but dug in gamely to repel several bids and graduate second out going this distance over the New Orleans main track the following month. He was switched to the turf last time, and tracked from second through slow splits while unnecessarily wide. The pacesetter simply had too much left after an easy time of it, and Wings of Fortune had to settle for second. Wings of Fortune still proved he could handle turf, which tends to be a predictor for synthetic success, and his half-sister Runfor Ro was multiple stakes-placed on Polytrack. At upwards of 15-1, and with some angles in his corner, the chestnut figures to offer solid value.

**THE RISE OF AMERICAN THOROUGHBREDS**  
**'Never Say Die: A Kentucky Colt, the Epsom Derby, and the Rise of the Modern Thoroughbred Industry' by James C. Nicholson**

*Reviewed by Michael Illiano*

The title of James Nicholson's book is misleading. It seems to indicate a biography of a horse, when it is really a story of shifting capital. Never Say Die was the American-bred 3-year-old colt who won the 1954 Epsom Derby, which, at the time, was the most prestigious horse race in the world. Indeed, the influential Italian breeder Federico Tesio once proclaimed that "the Thoroughbred exists not because its selection has depended on experts, technicians or zoologists but one piece of wood: the winning post of the Epsom Derby." Never Say Die became only the second American-bred colt to win the Epsom Derby, but, more significantly, signaled a shift in power from British to American-bred horses. In the wake of Never Say Die's victory, American thoroughbreds would come to dominate the Epsom Derby, and the sport of thoroughbred racing.

Nicholson tells Never Say Die's story by placing him at the center of a sprawling web of connections. By tracing that web, Nicholson is able to explain not only how the heart of the Thoroughbred racing industry moved from England to Kentucky, but also charts the evolution of the post-war world; American industrialists, Saudi sheikhs and The Beatles all factor in to Nicholson's narrative. So when the book strays from the titular horse by, for instance, detailing the origins of a "sewing machine fortune," it's in service of a larger narrative. And there is a familiar underdog story here that Nicholson probably would have had a much easier time telling: a sick foal, revived by a shot of bourbon, goes on to win the premier horse race as a 33-1 underdog. Instead, Nicholson uses Never Say Die's career to tell a much more ambitious story about how the thoroughbred industry was reshaped by fluctuating wealth and power. It's no accident American racehorses started to dominate Thoroughbred racing just as America was becoming a global power after World War II. Owning successful Thoroughbreds requires tremendous wealth and, therefore, the Thoroughbred industry tends to go where the money is. Nicholson establishes this trend with the story of Never Say Die and follows it through to the present day, where multinational operations are once again decentralizing Thoroughbred breeding.

Nicholson's book is not, however, an accounting of economic trends. Never Say Die's career was paved and attended to by a vivid cast of characters, and Nicholson delves into each of them.

Aside from providing the book with intriguing sub-plots, these stories add context to Never Say Die's career. They illustrate the innovations and strategies that facilitated Never Say Die's success and explain the cultural changes taking place alongside the economic changes. A bet placed on Never Say Die by Mona Best allows Nicholson to explore the early career of The Beatles (and Mona's son Pete, who provides the forward for the book, and was kicked out of The Beatles as they were on the brink of stardom). And the teenage jockey who rode Never Say Die in the Epsom Derby, Lester Piggott, would go on to win eight more Epsom Derbies and retire as the greatest English rider of the twentieth century. Nicholson explores this material thoroughly and concisely, never straying far from his central narrative, but never limiting his focus.

**HALL OF FAMER T. J. KELLY GONE AT 93**

Thomas J. Kelly, a retired Hall of Fame trainer, died yesterday morning in Florida. He was 93 and suffered from a brief illness.

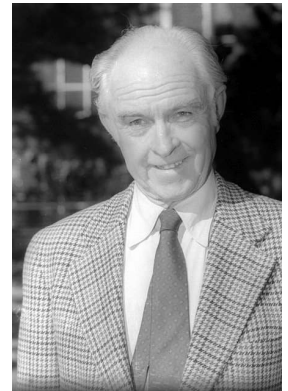
Kelly was born in Maryland and worked at the track with his brother as a teenager. He served in the U.S. Army in World War II, where he earned two Purple Hearts. He then returned to the track and got his trainer's license in 1945. In his 54-year career, Kelly trained 65 stakes winners.

He conditioned 1980 champion sprinter and GI Wood Memorial winner Plugged Nickle (Key to the Mint) and 1972 Canadian International and Washington, D.C. International winner Droll Role (Tom Rolfe). Some of Kelly's other top horses include: inaugural Wood Memorial winner Pet Bully (Petrose); 1975 GI Manhattan H. winner Salt Marsh (Tom Rolfe); Topsider (Northern Dancer); Small Raja (Raja Baba); and Far Out East (Raja Baba).

Kelly launched the career of Hall of Fame jockey Bill Hartack after he purchased Hartack's contract from another trainer in 1954. It turned out to be the beginning of a successful relationship for the pair who had many graded stakes wins together.

Kelly was inducted into racing's Hall of Fame in 1993, just five years before his retirement. He was also very successful as a breeder and owner. Just before retiring, Kelly and Joseph Grant bred Evening Attire (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), a 10-time graded stakes winner and earner of over \$2.9 million in an eight-year career, trained by Kelly's son Patrick.

"He was a quintessential horseman who lived for the game," said Timothy Kelly, another of Thomas Kelly's sons. "In addition to being a great horseman, he was a great husband and a great father and grandfather."

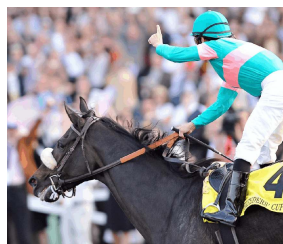
