ORB DRILLS AT PAYSON PARK

GI Besilu Stables Florida Derby winner **Orb** (Malibu Moon) breezed five furlongs at Payson Park Sunday in 1:02.10 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:14 4/5 as he prepares for the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby.

"This was the one we needed to get behind us," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "What I really wanted to see was to see him finish good. I didn't want to see him walking the last part of it."

Orb worked in company with the 5-year-old stakes-placed mare Puzzling (Ghostzapper) and was side-by-side with that stablemate for three furlongs through fractions of :13 3/5, :26 4/5 and :38 2/5 before finishing a neck in front.

"What I liked to see was that he was very settled going to the track, warming up and coming home," McGaughey said. "Walking around here now, he's as calm as can be. That's what we've got to have the next two weeks."

Orb was expected to ship to Churchill Downs yesterday and McGaughey said the colt will likely breeze in Louisville the Monday before the Derby (Apr. 29).

Orb will be McGaughey's seventh Kentucky Derby starter and the Lexington native admitted he was thrilled to have another contender in the Classic.

"I'm really excited," he said. "I hope I stay excited and don't get nervous, but I know that's not going to happen. I had a lot of anticipation about today to get this over with in the right way. We got a good bottom work into him. We'll sharpen him up over there. But I am excited about the opportunity. If everything goes right in the next 13 days, I'll really get excited about maybe having a chance to win."

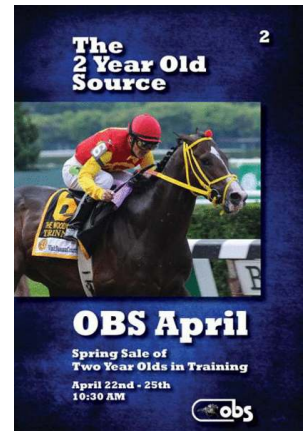
FALLING SKY CONFIRMED FOR DERBY

Newtown Anner Stud, James Covello and Joseph Bulger's **Falling Sky** (Lion Heart) will be entered in the GI Kentucky Derby, trainer John Terranova revealed Sunday. The Gill Sam F. Davis S. winner and GII Tampa Bay Derby third-place finisher behind Verrazano (More Than Ready) and Java's War (War Pass) was fourth last time in the GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 13. "It was up to the owners," his conditioner explained. "Right now, they are happy to point to the Derby as long as everything is going well with the horse and right now he's great." Terranova said Falling Sky will have his final breeze for the Derby next Saturday or Sunday, depending on the weather. **Triple Threats cont. p3**

HIGH HOPES AT OBS APRIL

Boosted by the success of graduates like GI Kentucky Derby winner I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) and some eight other Grade I winners in 2012, the OBS Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training begins its four-day run today in Ocala, Florida, with high expectations. The sale seems to gain added importance each year--recent grads also include champion sprinter Trinniberg (Teuflesberg) and last year's \$650,000 topper and Grade I winner Executiveprivilege (First Samurai)--and comes off a record renewal. The 2012 Spring Sale realized an average of \$43,458, a boost of 38.8%, while the median of \$20,000 was up 35%. Both were new high marks, and there's evidence that those figures have helped the 2013 sale attract a better-quality horse that, in years past, might have been pointed to a select sale instead.

"Obviously March is our select sale, but I do believe that the results of last year's sale gave consignors confidence that, if they did bring a select-type horse here that needed a little extra time or whatever, that they could sell the horse in April, as well," said OBS Director of Sales Tod Wojciechowski. "It always helps when a horse like Executiveprivilege tops the sale and then goes out to California and wins a couple Grade Is." **Cont. p11**

Triple Threats

Pletcher Duo Take to the Track...

Todd Pletcher, who is armed with an unprecedented six-horse squad of possible candidates for the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby, worked two members of the team over the Churchill Downs main track Sunday morning. Sent out shortly after the 8:30 a.m. renovation break, GI Wood Memorial winner **Verrazano** (More Than

Ready), accompanied by the 6-year-old Grade III-placed mare Authenticity (Quiet American), breezed five furlongs in 1:00.20. With Gary Stevens in the saddle, the Let's Go Stable and Coolmore representative, who started one

length behind his stablemate and finished on even terms with her, recorded internal splits of :13, :25.2, :36.80, and galloped out six panels in 1:13.20. "We wanted a good, solid five-furlong breeze and have him sit behind another horse and relax for a little bit," Pletcher explained. "We also wanted to have him finish up well and gallop out strong. He accomplished all that. I thought he went great and he seemed to get over the track well. We liked what we saw." The robust bay is scheduled to work again Sunday.

Appearing on the track only moments later, WinStar Farm's **Revolutionary** (War Pass) worked with another highly regarded sophomore from the Pletcher barn, undefeated Red Rifle (Giant's Causeway). Winner of the GII Louisiana Derby, Revolutionary breezed four furlongs in :48.80, while recording internal splits of :12.60, :24.80 and :37. With Calvin Borel in the irons, he galloped out five panels in 1:01.20 and six furlongs in 1:15.20. The move was the 22nd fastest of 81 at the distance. "We wanted to get Calvin familiar with him, because it's the first time he's been on him," offered Pletcher. "We were looking for a little less from him. He went a good half

and finished up well. I love the way he galloped out and Calvin was really happy with him. So, we accomplished what we wanted to do with him as well." Borel, who was aboard Pletcher and WinStar's 2010 Kentucky Derby hero Super Saver (Maria's Mon), will be astride Revolutionary on the First Saturday in May. "He did everything right and worked really well," Borel said. "I think this colt has the potential [to win the Derby]. He's a nice horse and he's been through everything you want a Derby horse to go through." Revolutionary is also expected to breeze again Sunday as are GI Arkansas Derby winner **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union) and GI Toyota Blue Grass S. runner-up and third-place finisher **Palace Malice** (Curlin) and **Charming Kitten** (Kitten's Joy). Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S. winner **Winning Cause** (Giant's Causeway) earned 20 points with that score and remains a possibility to make it into the Derby lineup, according to Pletcher yesterday. Only three trainers have previously saddled a record five starters in the Kentucky Derby: D. Wayne Lukas (1996), Nick Zito (2005) and Pletcher (2007). Triple Threats cont. p4

Lukas Derby Hopeful Takes Charge...

Willis Horton's **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) continued his preparations for the Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs Sunday, working a mile in 1:41.60 after the morning renovation break. Under jockey Jon Court, the winner of the GII Rebel S. was joined by stablemate Channel Isle (English Channel) at the

5 1/2-furlong marker before finishing well in front of that horse. He posted intermediate fractions of :13.60, :26, :38.60, :51, 1:03.80, 1:16.80 and 1:29.40, with a 1:56.20 gallop-out time for 1 1/8 miles.

"The work went very well, it was good," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "I was pleased. I told Jon coming off the track that this horse could cost me a lot of sleepless nights, because I am getting excited. He wasn't blowing at all when he came off the track." Out of the Grade I-winning mare Take Charge Lady (Dehere), the chestnut will head to the Derby off a seven-week layoff. "I worked him a mile the last time and I might do six or seven [furlongs] next week," Lukas confirmed. "He is 17 hands, like a big, gangly kid. I gave him a light month to give him some time to fill out." Calumet Farm's **Oxbow** (Awesome Again), who is scheduled to work this morning with Gary Stevens aboard, galloped 1 1/2 miles under exercise rider Rudy Quevedo when the track opened for training. "Oxbow is entirely different from Will Take Charge," Lukas said of the GIII LeComte S. winner. "He shows up every day and [today] will probably do more than we like as he does every morning."

Normandy Invasion Works at Churchill...

Fox Hill Farm's **Normandy Invasion** (Tapit) was sent out over Churchill Downs' main strip Sunday, as he continues preparations for the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby. Accompanied by Javier Herrera, the Chad Brown trainee negotiated a half-mile in :48.40 over a fast track. Working on his own after the renovation break, Normandy Invasion posted fractions of :11.80, :23.40 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:01.60. The move was the seventh fastest of 81 at the distance yesterday. "I am very happy with the work," Brown said. "I wanted him to go in about :48. It was basically a maintenance move. He has had a nice week of gallops here and is plenty fit. I just want to maintain what we have." Runner-up to Verrazano (More Than Ready) in the Apr. 6 GI Wood Memorial in his most recent start, Normandy Invasion is scheduled to work one more time Sunday prior to the Derby. Brown has not made a final decision whether Herrera or jockey Javier Castellano--who is commissioned to partner the bay in the Derby--would be aboard for that move. "I like that he is fresh coming into the race and he has proven he can overcome difficult trips," Brown said of his charge. "He has gotten sharper as the year has gone on and [Sunday] you saw part of that when he broke off a little sharper than he has been."

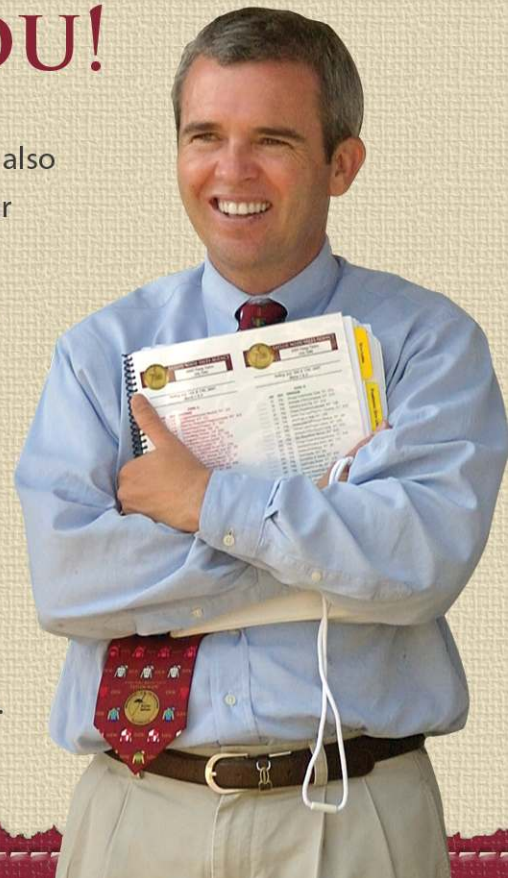

A winner of the prestigious G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini in his native Argentina in 2009, Interaction finally earned his first Stateside stakes win in a tight one here. He was third in Meydan's G3 Maktoum Challenge (Round 2) in 2011 for conditioner Pascal Bary, but disappointed in his first two tries in the U.S. for trainer Christophe Clement. Interaction took a BetFair Hollywood Park optional claimer last June after being transferred to Hall of Famer Ron McAnally, and finished second to Acclamation (Unusual Heat) in Del Mar's GI Eddie Read S. the following month. He would add a third-place finish in this venue's GII John Henry Turf Championship S. and a second in the GII Hollywood Turf Cup before the season was over. A late-on-the-scene second in the GII San Marcos S. here Feb. 9, the bay was fourth as the favorite last time in the 12-furlong GII San Luis Rey S. Mar. 16. Moseying out of the gate at the start of his long journey, Interaction settled at the back of the pack early as favorite **Sky Kingdom** (Empire Maker) set what pace there was. **Smart Ellis** turned up the pressure on the favorite down the backside, and Interaction moved closer into the pocket on the turn for home. He tipped out to avoid the tiring favorite nearing the lane, split **Smart Ellis** and the leading **All Squared away** in midstretch, and put his head down at the right time. "It was a slow pace, but he's still got that kick the last part of it," said McAnally of the winner. "Joe [Talamo] rode a terrific race, saved a lot of ground on the rail and managed to get through." This was the conditioner's third win in the San Juan Capistrano--he took the 1980 renewal with **John Henry** and 1998 running with **Amerique**.

Successful Dan's younger half-brother Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) used this race as a springboard to Horse of the Year honors a year ago and, while this win might not have been as impressive at that runner's 10 1/2-length romp in 2012, he got the job done. A winner of the 2009 GIII Northern Dancer S., the injury-plagued Mort Fink homebred took the GII Fayette S. over this track and trip the following season. He subsequently crossed the wire first in Churchill's GI Clark H. in November of 2010, but was placed third by the stewards for interference. The bay resurfaced some year and a half later to take a seven-panel allowance here Apr. 6 before defeating eventual GI Breeders' Cup Classic one-two finishers Fort Larned (E Dubai) and Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) in the GII Alysheba S. on the GI Kentucky Oaks undercard May 4. He earned a 110 Beyer Speed Figure for that effort while lowering Churchill's 8 1/2-furlong track record to 1:41.04. Upset by Fort Larned at 1-2 in the GIII Cornhusker H. at Prairie Meadows in June, Successful Dan was relegated to the sidelines for the rest of the season due to a pastern injury. Working steadily over this strip for his return, Successful Dan was unhurried by Julien Leparoux from the gate, but found himself on the lead entering the first turn. He enjoyed an easy lead through splits of :25.03, :50.18 and 1:16.05 and, while Boisterous gave game chase in the lane, he was never getting to the fresh-legged favorite. "He has tremendous heart," said trainer Charlie LoPresti, who also sent out Wise Dan to a victorious seasonal debut here in the Apr. 12 GI Maker's 46 Mile. "It wasn't that hard to get him back to this race. Julien has breezed him these past two times, and he's told me he was as good as ever. And Dr. Larry Bramlage checked him and gave him a clean bill of health." LoPresti was planning to run Wise Dan in Churchill's June 15 GI Stephen Foster H., but said he might instead send Successful Dan to that race. If not, the latter could be freshened until Saratoga.

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

THE PATH TO CHANTILLY

Seven G1 Prix du Jockey Club hopefuls line up in today's G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp, with Anabaa Blue (GB) the last to succeed here and go on to glory in that Chantilly Classic. Whether any of today's protagonists will emulate that feat remains to be seen, but few trainers understand what it takes to win that highlight more than Pascal Bary, who saddles an intriguing prospect in **Art Contemporain** (Smart Strike). Once-raced and once a winner, Jean-Louis Bouchard's representative gave indication in his Polytrack maiden over 1 3/16-mile at Chantilly Apr. 1 that he has a lot to offer.

Andre Fabre holds records in a clutch of the country's Pattern races and this is no exception, with nine renewals to his name between 1983 and 2011. The year's do not seem to diminish his capacity to unearth talent from a variety of sources and the lack of substance to the form of the maiden **Tableaux** (Giant's Causeway) could be a distraction. Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor's colt was no match for Bravodino (Dynaformer) when third in a conditions event over 1 5/16 mile at Saint-Cloud last time Apr. 3 and he needs to up a gear to book a Classic ticket.

Away from the dark horses, one who is already proven in black-type company is Haras de Saint Pair's **Kapour (Ire)** (Toylsome {GB}), who stretched his unbeaten tally to three in the Mar. 16 Listed Prix Maurice Caillault over 10 furlongs at Saint-Cloud.

With 1,195 horses cataloged, buyers are sure to find attractive offerings no matter their budget, said Wojciechowski. "That's the one thing about the April Sale--there's something for everyone," he said. "I think that we'll have some buyers here that, for whatever reason, didn't come to our select sale. A lot people that I've talked to said there's a lot of interest from their clients in April specifically, and I think we'll see a good turnout. We had a really good crowd before the breeze shows, not only domestically, but we've seen, for instance, a number of Korean groups returning, as well as some Japanese groups."

April also has momentum going for it. So far, every major juvenile auction in the U.S. in 2013 has realized double-digit gains in average: Barretts March (+31%), OBS March (+15.4%), F-T Florida (+20%) and Keeneland April (+19%).

The former reinsman will be represented by a quartet of Empire-breds during the four-day Spring sale, which gets underway today in Ocala at 10:30 a.m.

[Hip 437](#), a good-looking daughter of Posse produced by the multiple stakes-winning Gold Legend mare Gold Ginny, covered an eighth in [:10 3/5](#) during the second breeze show. The May 2 foal ([ThoroStride video](#)), a \$50,000 FTNAUG

graduate, is a half-sister to the undefeated New York-bred Sus Annmaries Gold (Frost Giant). Trained by Tony Dutrow, the promising dark bay opened her account with a sharp debut win at Belmont Oct. 7 ([video](#)), then added a seven-furlong allowance in style versus state-breds at the Big A most recently Nov. 9 ([video](#)). Sus Annmaries Gold returned to the worktab with a three-furlong breeze in [:37 3/5](#) at Fair Hill Apr. 15.

"Posse is having a great year and is really stamping himself as a pretty damn good sire," said Miranda, who booted home just under 500 winners during his career in the saddle. "I've had a lot of luck with him. The Gold Ginny filly is showing herself really well and had a very good work. She is a beautifully bodied filly."

Miranda is also upbeat on [hip 69](#), a gelded son of the aforementioned Vinery New York sire out of multiple graded stakes heroine Avie's Fancy (Lord Avie). The half-brother to St Averil (Saint Ballado), GSW & GISP, \$328,742, zipped through an eighth in [:10 1/5](#) at the first under-tack show.

"He breezed tremendous," Miranda commented. "It's not as big of a consignment that I normally I have, but I like what I have here."

Nonnie Connie (Frost Giant), an \$82,000 OBSAPR graduate from Miranda's 2012 OBSAPR draft, broke her maiden impressively in the Belmont mud Oct. 20 before placing third in the \$125,000 New York Stallion Series S. at Aqueduct in November. Blue Sunday (A. P Jet), a 15-length debut winner at Saratoga and also the third-place finisher in the restricted Mike Lee S., has been Miranda's most financially rewarding transaction to date. He realized \$350,000 from John Ferguson at the 2004 OBS April Sale through the Nick de Meric consignment.

"I was a jockey for almost 10 years, and I received a nice foundation learning how to ride on plenty of well-bred Genter Stable babies at Tartan Farms," Miranda said. "When I retired from riding, my daughter was three and my son was one, and I looked down here to Ocala and began working again at Tartan as an assistant trainer for a couple of years until they dispersed in 1987. I used to ride for former trainer Doug Worswick in New York and also worked for him in Florida until his father [Ronald] dispersed their operation. They sold their farm to a gentleman named Charles Givens, who had written a lot of books on investing, and I ran the farm for him for five years until he passed away from cancer. My wife and I then came back up to Ocala, and we've been on our own since."

Along with his other half, the 57-year-old currently owns and operates Rapid Run Farm and its private training center, both located near Ocala. Between the two properties, Rapid Run boasts a three-quarter mile track, 60 stalls, 10 large turnout fields, 17 round pens, a six-horse European walker and an outdoor equine swimming pool.

“A lot of my clients from New York send me weanlings and we’ll go ahead and start our program with them,” Miranda commented. “I don’t get too many of them ready for yearling sales--usually when they come down here we either get them prepared to race or for the 2-year-old sales.”

He continued, “I do all the groundwork myself and we go through a slow and steady process with a lot of jogging in the roundpen and in our small fields. Once we get them to the track and get them galloping steady, I’ll start putting them in the pool every other day ([video](#)), train on the track every other day, etc. I like the idea of putting them into the pool--I love the cardio they receive, and it’s so good for their body that you don’t have to put them on that track and just pound on them every day. I’ve seen the conditioning that the pool gives them, too. You could really notice a difference.”

It’s not all about posting bullet workouts at the juvenile breeze shows, according to Miranda.

“I’m not now, never have been and probably will never be the guy to have the horses with the three fastest works,” he explained. “I don’t believe in that. I had a prospective buyer say to me a while back, ‘I like buying from you, because I know that the horses aren’t beaten up.’ That’s the reputation that I have, and I can certainly live with that.” --*Steve Sherack*

Celticus took five starts to break his maiden, but came good in a mile handicap at Pisa in December before adding a nine-furlong conditions event to his tally at the Capannelle last time Mar. 7. Breaking well to dispute the lead initially, the bay was restrained to take a lead and, after being steered away from the remainder towards the far side in early stretch, took control with three furlongs remaining and kept galloping through the extreme going.
