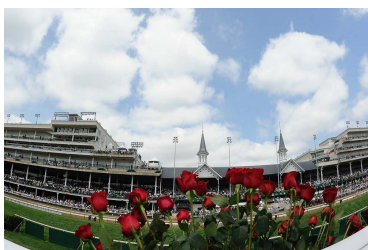

STORY LINES APLENTY FOR DERBY 139

For two minutes and change in the late afternoon hours on the first Saturday in May, even the casual sports fan tunes in to the GI Kentucky Derby, and there should be no shortage of interest, no matter who emerges victorious. Trainer Shug McGaughey, New York-based, but raised down the Interstate in Lexington, does not bring **Orb** (Malibu Moon) to the

Derby so much as the colt brings him. Owned and bred by two of McGaughey's most steadfast clients, the Phippses and the Janneys, Orb is 'the right horse' for the job, he says, and Mike Battaglia and a slew of punters agree, as he is the 7-2 favorite on the morning line. While McGaughey is looking for his first win in the big race, trainer D. Wayne Lukas has four trophies in his case, and, in what many would call the twilight of his Hall of Fame career, shows back up with not one, but two chances. Owner Brad Kelley has poured a bunch of resources into the game and has helped, to some extent, to resurrect the Lukas barn, and he will be represented by **Oxbow** (Awesome Again). The GIII Lecomte S. winner will be partnered by two-time Derby-winning jockey Gary Stevens, who was atop the Lukas-trained Winning Colors in 1988. Lukas will also send out Willis Horton's **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song), who last raced 49 days ago, defeating his barnmate in the GII Rebel S. **Cont. p3**

PLETCHER GOES 1-3-4 IN OAKS

The betting public thought Todd Pletcher would saddle the winner in Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks. After all, he was sending out the 3-2 favorite in **Dreaming of Julia** (A.P. Indy), but that one was off to a troubled start, and in the end, it was 38-1 longshot **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior) who made steady progress from the back of the pack and ran down an ultra-game **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) for the victory. **Unlimited Budget** (Street Sense) loomed boldly with every chance at the quarter pole, but settled for third ahead of **Dreaming of Julia** in fourth. **Princess of Sylmar** nearly didn't gain a start in the Oaks after turning in a sub-par work over the track Apr. 20. But she was green-lighted for the race following an improved move Apr. 29 and made that decision look good Friday afternoon. **Cont. p4**

1000 Guineas Lures 15

In the aftermath of Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby and G1 English 2000 Guineas comes the G1 English 1000 Guineas Sunday afternoon. A field of 15 sophomore fillies was drawn yesterday, and three of the race's main threats, What a Name (Ire) (Mr. Greeley), Just the Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) and Hot Snap (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) will have wide draws to deal with in the one-mile test.

There is the story of Calvin Borel, who won this race three times in the span of four years from 2007 to 2010, and partners **Revolutionary**, one of two in the race for his late sire War Pass. An \$80,000 KEESEP yearling, he was purchased for \$235,000 as an OBSMAR 2-year-old, and races for WinStar Farm, whose Super Saver won the 2010 Derby for Borel and trainer Todd Pletcher. The conditioner sends out a

record-equaling (one Pletcher co-owns) five runners in this year's race, including **Verrazano** (More Than Ready), the 4-1 second choice on the morning line. Then there is the story of Doug O'Neill, a seemingly unlikely candidate to become the first trainer to put Derby wins back-to-back since Bob Baffert accomplished the feat with **Real Quiet** and **Silver Charm** in 1997 and 1998. Yet, here he is with **Goldencents** (Into Mischief), another colt who has earned his way into the race via the same

GI Santa Anita Derby route used by I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) last season. Just 26 days after guiding his Louisville Cardinal to a NCAA Division I basketball championship, coach Rick Pitino, a 5% owner of Goldencents, will be amongst the loudest fans. O'Neill sticks with Kevin Krigger for his first Derby ride. Into Mischief is also represented by **Vyjack**, who must overcome the 20 hole. Trainer Rudy Rodriguez knows a little something about having to deal with that adversity. He was with Rick Dutrow Jr. when the stable's Big Brown (Boundary) bounded home victoriously from that stall in 2008. **Normandy Invasion** (Tapit) exits a runner-up effort in the GI Wood Memorial to Verrazano and races for Fox Hill Farms, and maybe--just maybe--it'll be owner Rick Porter's day. Only a barnstorming performance by Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) denied Hard Spun (Danzig) in 2007, and he finished second with Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song) the following year before tragedy struck a couple furlongs past the wire. There is **Itsmyluckyday** (Lawyer Ron), who shot to the head of the class with a big-figure win from then-unbeaten champion Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) in the GIII Holy Bull S. in January, but lost some of the luster when an alibi-free second to Orb in the GI Florida Derby. He could give noted 2-year-old consignors Barry and Shari Eisaman an unprecedented second Derby winner in two years. Chuck Fipke isn't the most likely to have one runner in the Derby, let alone two, but yet here *he* is, with the far-from-hopeless GI Toyota Blue Grass S. hero **Java's War** (War Pass) and 11th-hour addition **Golden Soul** (Perfect Soul {Ire}). And what would any major race run in the Commonwealth of Kentucky be without the presence of the effervescent Ken Ramsey? His **Charming Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) will be a fringe player at best, but win, lose or draw, he's sure to leave with a smile, if only for the experience. Post time for Kentucky Derby 139 is set for 6:24 p.m. ET on NBC.

Down to the wire...

Well, Happy Derby Day. Let's hope the skies don't drown us. As always, it's been fun this week watching the Derby (and Oaks) runners put in their final preparations at Churchill. Got a chance to see everyone at least once, I think. Unlike in normal years, however, laying eyes on each horse hasn't done a whole lot to clear the picture for me. In general, the horses I liked, I still like, and vice versa. With a few exceptions. Good luck!

1) **VYJACK** (c, 3, [Into Mischief](#)--Life Happened, by Stravinsky) regains the top spot. I love the way he looked this week--he's a relatively tall horse, but not too long. Most impressive to me was his attitude. A gelding with a well-documented history of bad manners before he was cut, he's cruised around the Churchill oval with ears pricked, and he didn't turn a hair Thursday as people swirled around him back at the barn, shortly after he blew out three furlongs under trainer Rudy Rodriguez (who has also been his hot walker most of the week). I talked with Sobhy Sonbol, who purchased him as a juvenile, and he said the change in demeanor since he arrived in Louisville has been striking. Distance a big question, as is the 20, but if he leaves well, he should be able to secure a good trip. Moreover, he was a whopping 46-1 in the early betting yesterday afternoon. **Last week ranked #2** [▶](#).

2) **VERRAZANO** (c, 3, [More Than Ready](#)--Enchanted Rock, by Giant's Causeway) sure doesn't look like your average More Than Ready. He's a grand-looking horse with a lot of mass. I can't say I have a strong opinion about how he's getting over the track here--he looks fine, but hasn't wowed. In any case, I'm more confident he can get 10 furlongs after seeing him. **Last week ranked #1** [▶](#) [Get Andrew Caulfield's Take](#).

3) **REVOLUTIONARY** (c, 3, War Pass--Runup the Colors, by A.P. Indy) is a much different horse than his stablemate Verrazano. He's lighter-framed and a bit immature-looking. But I don't mean this as a knock. He still looks athletic, just more a wiry wide receiver versus a big halfback. I'm confident 10 furlongs is within his reach, and I think he could be the one horse that really jumps up on an off track. Big chance. **Last week ranked #3** [▶](#).

4) **ORB** (c, [Malibu Moon](#)--Lady Liberty, by Unbridled) hasn't wowed me the same way he has others, but Shug definitely has him looking great, and his professionalism is my biggest takeaway this week. He comes across as a horse with poise. Frankly, I've been betting against him all spring and will probably continue to today--I can't make the case he's a more likely winner than some horses who will be three times his price--but Shug's confidence makes me think I'm about to get burned. **Last week ranked #5** [▶](#) [Get Andrew Caulfield's Take](#).

5) **NORMANDY INVASION** (c, 3, [Tapit](#)--Boston Lady, by Boston Harbor), like many by his sire, isn't a giant, strapping horse, and is pretty lightly made behind. He's been looking very good in the mornings, and his spirited gallop (the phrase 'run-off' would not be accurate, I don't think) on Thursday--he came whizzing past me at one of the gaps--might actually have served as a good pipe-opener, as they say. Like Orb, I think he's one with a good chance, but he's been the wise-guy horse for weeks and is just going to be too short for me to use on top. **Last week ranked #6** [▶](#).

6) **GOLDENCENTS** (c, 3, [Into Mischief](#)--Golden Works, by Banker's Gold) gave mixed signals this week. At points, I thought he looked very aggressive in his gallops, leaving me to worry that when the gates open and the roar goes up today, he would be flying early. But I really liked his gallop on Thursday--he was reaching out and looked much more poised. He's a medium-sized horse who physically actually reminds me a bit of I'll Have Another--but with less mass. Tough call. **Last week ranked #7** [▶](#) [Get Andrew Caulfield's Take](#).

7) **ITSMYLUCKYDAY** (c, 3, Lawyer Ron--Viva La Slew, by Doneraile Court) has looked very well in the mornings. There's a lot to him, and his muscle definition is terrific. If he's able to repeat some of those early-season figures, he'll be awfully tough here, but just don't think he's at the level he was and will use under only. **Last week ranked #9** [▶](#) [Get Andrew Caulfield's Take](#).

8) **OXBOW** (c, 3, [Awesome Again](#)--Tizamazing, by Cee's Tizzy) drops a few notches, as he was the one horse all week that gave me pause due to appearance. He's been very aggressive--nearly fractious--on the track, and has been pulling hard in his gallops. Considering he didn't run well from off the pace last time in the GI Arkansas Derby and connections were probably planning to send him anyway, it's easy to imagine him setting a faster pace than is realistic. Physically, he doesn't look at all like his uncle Tiznow--he's a much smaller, type-y horse. **Last week ranked #5** [▶](#).

9) **JAVA'S WAR** (c, 3, War Pass--Java {GB}, by Rainbow Quest) will be at a serious disadvantage if a hot pace doesn't develop, made worse by the fact he's breaking from the 19. Runs late to complete super? **Last week #9** [▶](#) [Get Andrew Caulfield's Take](#).

10) **MYLUTE** (c, 3, [Midnight Lute](#)--Stage Stop, by Valid Expectations) is the lone late addition to the Top 10. I thought he's handled this track as good as anyone and looks great. Being out of a daughter of Valid Expectations, he doesn't have a pedigree that screams 10 furlongs, but the Midnight Lutes are showing they can route, and he was running well enough at end of Louisiana Derby. With nine starts, he's also one of the most seasoned members of the field. The presence of Rosie has murdered his price, however--his 14-1 quote yesterday was half what it should be. **Last week unranked**.

Bred in Pennsylvania by Ed Stanco, Princess of Sylmar was set for the easiest-possible debut, but could do no better than fourth in a state-bred maiden sprint at Penn National Oct. 12. Sent back to Grantville for a two-turn test against open rivals Nov. 8, she aired by a Dreaming of Julia-esque 19 lengths before adding a two-turn allowance over the Aqueduct inner Dec. 13. The chestnut made a smooth transition into stakes company, taking the Jan. 5 Busanda S. by 7 1/2 lengths and the Busher S. by seven lengths Feb. 2, but what was she beating? She was truly tested for class when narrowly second choice in the Gil Gazelle S. Apr. 6, but couldn't quite get to the front-running favorite Close Hatches (First Defence) and settled for second. While that Juddmonte runner would have plenty of supporters yesterday, Princess of Sylmar was friendless in the betting and made those who jumped ship pay dearly.

Champion Beholder, who unseated Garrett Gomez in the few minutes before the start, broke outward a bit and led for a stride or two, but was soon overtaken by Midnight Lucky (Midnight Lute), and the two set off at a fast pace, with Silsita (Macho Uno) saving ground and Unlimited Budget fairly handy from fourth. Dreaming of Julia, bothered badly at the start by Rose to Gold (Friends Lake) to her outside, found herself in the latter third of the field, with Princess of Sylmar tracking her through the early exchanges.

Hall of Famer Mike Smith, still in search of a first Oaks win, made a key decision turning up the backside, going inside Close Hatches instead of around her, and the eventual winner was able to make steady mid-race progress in the two path. As the pacemakers were doing their thing on the sharp end, Princess of Sylmar was slithering into contention and had worked her way into a threatening fourth approaching the lane. Inexperience caught up with Midnight Lucky, as she called it a day in the stretch, and Beholder, a 9-1 gamble off a perceived inability to stay this trip, went for home. The big-bodied filly was plugging on gamely, and while Unlimited Budget never could get to the champ, Princess of Sylmar reeled her in close home for the upset.

"We're pleasantly surprised with her effort and her win. We didn't much like her first breeze here [:48.60 Apr. 20], but her second one [:49.20 Apr. 29] was much better," Pletcher commented. "She's a good filly; we knew that all along. And we took her out of her natural running style last time. This time she made that good run and got it done."

Dreaming of Julia made a middle move on the backstretch, but appeared to be struggling with the surface at times and did well to be fourth.

She got pinched out of there and the race was over. She still ran a great race. I saved all the ground I could and try to give myself a chance to win the race. She made a nice run but it was too much ground to make up.

Anniversary Gift...

On Monday, Ed and Ina Stanco will celebrate their 40th wedding anniversary. Their present came Friday, however, when the first horse they ever bred, Princess of Sylmar, chased down champion Beholder to win the GI Kentucky Oaks. "It's a dream" said Ed, who continued to answer questions from reporters well after the official press conference was over last night. "What we've done with our first homebred filly, to come this far, I don't know how to describe that."

Ed, the CEO of White Mountain Insurance Company in Pennsylvania, has been a lifelong fan of racing. He grew up in Schenectady, NY, and used to attend the flat and harness races at Saratoga. "That's when I fell in love with handicapping, and then of course fell in love with the horses," he said.

While Princess of Sylmar is their first homebred, the Stancos have owned horses for a while. They've had success before, too, most notably with Capeside Lady, a MGSW of over \$800,000. Todd Pletcher trained that one, as well, and Ed was full of praise for his conditioner.

"You know, we don't have the millions and billions of dollars that some of his owner's have--we're just the little guy," he said. "But Todd, and everyone on his team, treats us like we are the big guy. That guy is just a class act."

Sitting next to Ed in the media center was a beaming Ina. "I couldn't be happier," she said. "I can't believe this has happened, to be honest."

Horse racing and the Stancos have gone together since the day they were married. "We got Kentucky Derby Saturday, and I remember my father kept leaving to go watch the race coverage!" she laughed.

Secretariat won that Derby, and Ina remembered, as newlyweds, seeing the great champion run at Saratoga that year. "We had no money, but we'd gone up to Saratoga to watch him race," said Ina. While at the track, she instructed Ed to put some money on Onion, the 6-1 second choice to Secretariat's 1-10 in the Whitney S. "But Ed had seen Secretariat's last race [the Belmont], and thought, 'She's nuts, and is never going to know if I don't place the bet.'" He didn't, of course, and of course Onion upset Secretariat, "And Ed's never lived it down in the 40 years since--I don't forget! And since the, he always listens." -L Marquardt

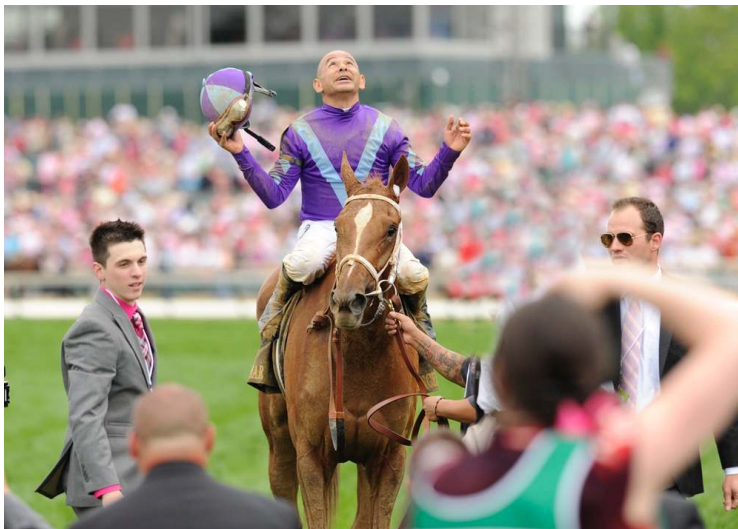

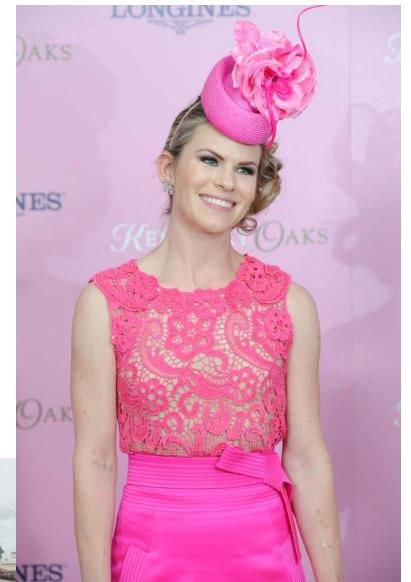

With a G2 Coventry S., G1 National S. and G1 Dewhurst S. already under his belt, the flashy chestnut described by the Coolcullen trainer as “awesome” gives the impression there is much more to come with his ideal combination of speed and lazy racing style. Victory for Dawn Approach would go some way to make up for the disappointment of losing out on a first 2000 Guineas as a result of the injury to Teofilo (Ire) in 2007 and a near-miss with this colt’s sire in 2008. “He’s rated a couple of pounds less than New Approach was, but I think that was due to him doing only what he had to do in the Dewhurst,” Bolger said recently. “I’d have to think that he’s right up there with the other two. Ability-wise, I wouldn’t see much difference between him and New Approach, but he has a much better temperament and is very straightforward and easy to manage. He’s a way stronger horse this year, so I’m hoping for a nice bit of improvement.”

Some Engine...

It has been 23 years since Richard Hannon enjoyed success in this Classic with Tirol (Ire), but in Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani’s **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) the East Everleigh trainer has something potentially special. Also unbeaten like his Irish peer, he demonstrated the above-average ability that he flashed at two on his sophomore bow in the G3 Craven S. over this track and trip Apr. 18.

Making the running there as he had in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster in September, he dominated over his smart stable companion Havana Gold (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), stamping him as a serious rival to Dawn Approach. Stable confidence, which is never at a premium, is at fever

pitch this time. “Toronado did his last proper piece of work last Sunday and goes to Newmarket in the form of his life,” Hannon commented. “We always felt that he was more one for the Derby than the Guineas, but this spring he has been showing so much more speed in the mornings than he did last year, so, while Dawn Approach is obviously a very good horse, we feel that we have a solid chance of beating him. You had to be impressed with Toronado’s dress-rehearsal in the Craven, as he did it the hard way and it takes a good horse to win like that from the front, repeatedly quickening.”

Jockey Richard Hughes affirmed the trainer’s bullishness as he looks forward to a potential long-overdue first British Classic win. “I have been so impressed with Toronado this season and put him right up there with Canford Cliffs--and maybe even in front,” Hughes said. “He is much more the straightforward of the two, you can ride him any way in a race and I think he will handle the dips and ridges at Newmarket better than did Canford Cliffs. Dawn Approach is a very good horse, but he invariably hits a flat spot. I think we will win.”

Hannon also saddles Saeed Manana's **Van Der Neer (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}), who was runner-up to Kingsbarns (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in October and returned to annex the Apr. 6 Listed International Trial S. on Lingfield's Polytrack. "Van der Neer would not have the speed of Tornado and may eventually prove a 10-furlong horse, but his form is solid--he was second to Kingsbarns in the Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster, where he hated the soft ground--and his preparation this spring could not have gone better," Hannon said. "Lingfield would not have been his track, but he won his trial there in spectacular fashion considering that he was only 80% straight and he did not take the home turn well and was still last straightening up." One of the outsiders is Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's **Moohaajim (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), who was third behind another Hannon heavyweight in Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in Newbury's G3 Greenham S. He appeared to travel like a sprinter in that Apr. 20 seven-furlong contest and it may be that he eventually reverts to the six-furlong trip over which he won the G2 Mill Reef S. and finished runner-up in the G1 Middle Park S. last term. "We were very happy with his run at Newbury, as he settled very well and he has come out of the race very well and it is a case of so far so good," confirmed trainer Marco Botti. "Based on his pedigree, he should get the trip and I think he has a much stronger chance of getting it on better ground. If he does not get the mile on Saturday, we will drop Moohaajim in trip. If we do decide to do that, a nice target to go for could be the July Cup."

JUDGE AND JURY

Tomorrow's G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas has attracted a field of 15 fillies, with three of the main protagonists **What a Name (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley), **Just the Judge (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}) and **Hot Snap (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) drawn in the wide posts. Just the Judge, who represents the Sangster Family and Qatar Racing, has an unbeaten record to defend after sauntering through her juveniles tests in the Listed Washington Singer S. at Newbury in August and Newmarket's G2 Rockfel S. in October. "She's been very clean-winded in her work this year and is a very straightforward filly," trainer Charlie Hills explained. "She hasn't missed a day all winter. She's quite masculine and has great hindquarters on her, and

also has a great temperament. Everybody's pleased and she has done her prep pretty much the same as [Barry Hills' 2009 winner] Ghanaati, with a racecourse gallop."

Michael Hills rode her in all three starts and, despite having to hand over the reins to the owners' retained jockey Jamie Spencer, is exuding confidence.

"I have won the Rockfel a few times and this is the nicest filly I've ridden," Hills said. "She's got a huge stride and is very much like a colt to ride--she's beautifully-balanced and has plenty of strength behind her. She's not complicated to ride and you can out her anywhere in a race. She'll stay every inch of the trip and should stay a mile and a quarter."

Aidan O'Brien launched Homecoming Queen (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) on an unsuspecting public 12 months ago and it is significant that the Coolmore team have opted to supplement **Moth (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) this year. Her success in a seven-furlong maiden at The Curragh Apr. 7 was visually impressive and Joseph O'Brien has chosen her over the proven **Snow Queen (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}).

"She's a lovely filly--I really fancied her first time out last year, but she only finished fifth and I was terribly disappointed," O'Brien explained. "She came back and ran over six in a maiden and I got to the front too soon and she got a bit tired and was nailed by horses late on. She went to the Curragh and she showed on the track for the first time what she had been showing at home and she goes there with a live chance in an open-enough Guineas. Her pedigree suggests she will stay much further, at least a mile and a half. To do that over seven was very special and we're hoping she will progress with racing."

Another maiden scorer from Ireland who has abundant potential is Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Rasmeyaa (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}). She scored with authority in a strong seven-furlong maiden at Leopardstown at the end of October which has thrown up winners, including the G3 Park Express S. scorer Rehn's Nest (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}).

"I think trainer [Dermot Weld] and jockey both feel in a perfect world they'd have another 10 days just to get her to blossom, but we don't have that perfect world," Angus Gold, the owner's racing manager, told *PA Sport*. "She worked well on Tuesday and they are perfectly happy to let her take her chance. She's got her whole season in front of her and I'm sure she'll be better for the run. We don't have the benefit of time on our side, but we'll give it a go."

The Derby is set to load around 6:25 local time, but some 100 minutes earlier, this country's top two turf horses are set to meet for the first time in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill. Reigning Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) backs up reasonably quickly off his one-length victory when seemingly below his best in the GI Maker's 46 Mile S. at Keeneland Apr. 12 as he goes for his sixth consecutive victory. The chestnut rarely makes starts this close together--his shortest gap between races during his championship season last year was 20 days--and that Charlie LoPresti wheels him back at a distance perhaps slightly longer than his best and that Wise Dan has trained forwardly since must be taken as positives.

Those two runners should own the market, but if both were to stub their toes, **Jeranimo** (Congaree) could be there to pick up the pieces. The third millionaire in this field, the 7-year-old won last year's G1 Shoemaker Mile, but is equally adept at this longer trip. The bay entire made a successful seasonal debut in the GII San Gabriel S. Jan. 13, taking that nine-furlong heat by a widening 2 3/4 lengths.

NINE VIE FOR GRADE I IN HUMANA DISTAFF

While this year's GI Humana Distaff S. doesn't appear to feature the likes of last year's 7 1/2-length romper and eventual champion Groupie Doll (Bowman's Doll), it does offer the opportunity for one of nine fillies to become a Grade I winner. A pair of ☆ **"TDN Rising Stars"** ☆ lead the charge as the top two choices on the morning line. California invader **Rumor** (Indian Charlie) gets the nod from linemaker Mike Battaglia off a victory in Santa Anita's GIII Las Flores S. Mar. 10. James Spence's **Aubby K** (Street Sense) also justified the publication's stamp of approval last time with a three-length victory over **Emma's Encore** (Congrats) in Gulfstream's GIII Inside Information S. at this distance Mar. 17. The Ralph Nicks trainee showed some affinity for this course in 2011 when she set hot splits before settling for fourth behind On Fire Baby (Smoke Glacken) in the 8 1/2-furlong GIII Pocahontas S. in October of 2011. Eventual GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Believe You Can (Proud Citizen) was sixth in that heat. The filly with the most upside of this bunch could be Brereton Jones homebred **Same Cross** (Proud Citizen). The 4-year-old was a facile winner of her first three tries at Fair Grounds this winter, but failed to take to the turf last time when fifth as the favorite in the Mar. 16 Happy Ticket S. This is a relatively paceless affair for a Grade I, and rail-drawn **Jamaican Smoke** (Smoke Glacken) seems likely to get as clear as she wants. The bay earned a 96 Beyer Speed Figure in a track-and-trip allowance win last May, and hit the bench after setting impossible splits and settling for second to Emma's Encore in Belmont's GIII Victory Ride S. in July. Third in a Gulfstream optional claimer Mar. 8, she dug in gamely to finish a close third in Keeneland's GI Madison S. last time Apr. 13. **Byrama (GB)** (Byron {GB}) finished one spot better.

MELTDOWN IN CHURCHILL DOWNS

With Sherry Parbhoo's lightning-quick champion sprinter **Trinniberg** (Teuflesberg) and Maggi Moss's red-hot and equally fast **Delaunay** (Smoke Glacken) lined up next to each other in today's GII Churchill Downs S., the seven-furlong event has the look of a real barnburner. The former capped off his 3-year-old campaign with an upset victory in November's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but failed to fire when 11th over the Tapeta in Meydan's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen Mar. 30. Making a fairly quick return since that long journey, the dark bay shows two upbeat works at his Calder base in preparation for this. Delaunay was claimed by trainer Tom Amoss from PTK LLC and Dane Kobiskie, and has since won six of seven starts. His two starts this season at Fair Grounds have been excellent--he earned a 110 Beyer Speed Figure for annexing the Jan. 26 F. W. Gaudin Memorial S. by 4 1/4 lengths, and a 111 Beyer when annexing the Mar. 9 Duncan F. Kenner S. by a similar margin. He stretches out an additional furlong, but the old warhorse does sport a 10-5-3-0 record at seven panels. Among those who could pick up the pieces is Stonestreet Farm's **Hierro** (Hard Spun), who beat eventual GI Haskell winner Paynter (Awesome Again) in this venue's GIII Derby Trial S. just over a year ago while in the hands of Steve Asmussen. Sixth behind Trinniberg in Belmont's GII Woody Stephens S. June 9, the chestnut resurfaced for Todd Pletcher at Gulfstream Feb. 18 to take a seven-furlong allowance by daylight. He was third last time behind **Pass the Dice** (Lemon Drop Kid) going a mile back in Hallandale Mar. 28.

'HUNGRY' FOR A REPEAT?

Emory Hamilton homebred **Hungry Island** (More Than Ready) will look to defend her GII Distaff Turf Mile victory today against a solid field of nine foes. Twice Grade I-placed subsequently, the bay returned to winning ways in her seasonal debut last time over **Karlovy Vary** (Dynaformer) in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 7. **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro) was fourth as the 3-2 choice here a year ago, but took a pair of Grade IIs up at Woodbine in her next two tries before falling a head short in Arlington's prestigious GI Beverly D. S. Aug. 18. She justified favoritism in Santa Anita's 10-furlong GI Rodeo Drive S. Sept. 29, and came up one spot short in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf Nov. 2. This is the Ontario-bred's first start of 2013. James Miller's speedy **Daisy Devine** (Kafwain), fifth 12 months ago, figures to be winging it up front as she usually does. Last year's GI Jenny Wiley S. winner was second last time in her title defense at Keeneland Apr. 13. Another who merits consideration is **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), who carries the colors of red-hot Ken and Sarah Ramsey. The Wayne Catalano pupil bested **Stopshoppingmaria** (More Than Ready) in the 2011 GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies over course and distance, and annexed the Edgewood S. locally a year ago. She bested recent Jenny Wiley victoress Centre Court (Smart Strike) in Saratoga's GII Lake Placid S. in August, and is making her first afternoon appearance since settling for sixth as the chalk in Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Oct. 13. Stopshoppingmaria stretches out beyond 5 1/2 furlongs for the first time since that Breeders' Cup performance.

PASS GO

Saint-Cloud plays host to a handful of Classic hopefuls today, with the on-fire Andre Fabre yard responsible for the exciting **Ocovango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) in the G2 Prix Greffulhe. Already successful a total of 10 times in this prep, the master of Chantilly also unleashed Peintre Celebre and Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) en route to their impressive Derby victories and in Prince Faisal's colorbearer he could have another to join that duo. "He's very well-entered everywhere and as far as Epsom is concerned, we'd all discuss it in light of how he performs," Ted Voute, bloodstock advisor to Prince Faisal, told the *Racing Post*. "Ultimately, it will depend on whether Andre Fabre wants to go that route with him. I know they like Bravodino and he's a pretty big threat." Having beaten the re-opposing **Bravodino** (Dynaformer) by 2 1/2 lengths in a mile maiden here in November, the dark bay dealt with his rivals with disdain in the Listed Prix Francois Mathet over 1 5/16 mile back at this venue last time Mar. 31. Jean-Claude Rouget relies on Ecurie Fares' **Wire To Wire (Fr)** (Observatory), who captured the Mar. 26 Listed Prix Omnium II over a mile at this track, while the aforementioned Bravodino also came back here to register a fluent conditions score over 1 5/16 miles Apr. 3. Third in that race was Ocovango's barn mate Tableaux (Giant's Causeway), who has since won the G2 Prix Noailles and, being a half-brother to his owner-breeder's 2003 Epsom Derby hero Kris Kin (Kris S.), Bravodino has the pedigree to make rapid strides forward.

On Fire Baby, last-start winner of the Apr. 12 GI Apple Blossom H., won the break, but was quickly joined to her inside by Authenticity, as even-money favorite and reigning GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Believe You Can was wrangled back off those two into the clubhouse turn and resisted the restraint from Rosie Napravnik rounding the bend. The two front-runners enjoyed a leisurely time of it, covering the opening quarter-mile in :24.80 and matched strides through a half in :48.45. More Chocolate (Candy Ride {Arg}) tried to join in three wide, but was soon off the bridle and Believe You Can was poised in behind as they reached the head of the stretch. The favorite was pulled out to the three path and looked to have aim, but Authenticity and On Fire Baby dueled heads apart the length of the stretch, with the Pletcher runner doing just the better under a sharp left-handed stick. "This is a huge win for us on a number of fronts," the winning conditioner suggested. "This mare has been working in company with Verrazano. That goes a long way toward solidifying what he's been doing. It is also Johnny's first win back in only his second ride. And we're winning a good race against a good mare. So it was good, good, good."

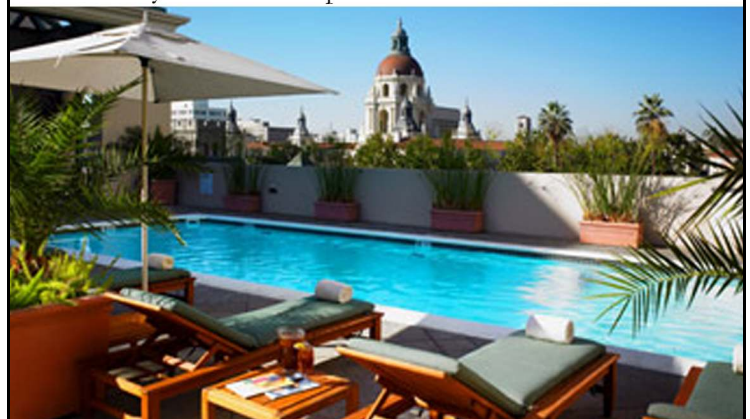

Victorious in the GI Florida Derby ahead of last year's Run for the Roses, Take Charge Indy was shelved off his Derby effort and returned with a third in the GII Fayette S. at Keeneland Oct. 27. Second to Shackleford (Forestry) in this track's GI Clark H. Nov. 23, he was a distant third in the GI Donn H. Feb. 9 and a pacesetter second behind

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Cigar Street (Street Sense) in the GIII Skip Away S. Mar. 30. Take Charge Indy was first under the wire the first time, but was content to allow longshot Right to Vote (Political Force) to take up the running as they raced around the clubhouse turn as several rivals encountered trouble a bit further back. The second favorite settled in a stalking second, one off the inside, and pulled Rosie Napravnik to the lead nearing the stretch. Favored Cyber Secret tried the eventual winner once heads were pointed for home, but it was in total vain, as Take Charge Indy quickened away to an impressive win. "We were looking for a big race and we got it this year," winning trainer Pat Byrne commented. "We beat some nice horses today and I just love the way he did it. He did it with authority. That's key. 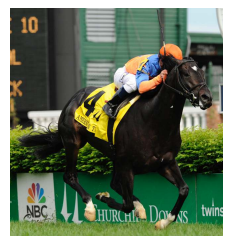

He briefly considered trying to tip out for a clear run, but quickly thought better of it and dove back to the hedge. Tiring pacesetter Anyriderill Do (Street Her) provided the assist as he drifted out, and Noble Tune charged up the inside and held off a late bid from Ramsey runner Admiral Kitten. The winner is a great granddaughter of Hall of Famer Serena's Song.

Having her first run for the Tom Amoss barn, So Many Ways dropped back in trip and stormed home to her first victory since last year's GI Spinaway S. Trained through her 2-year-old campaign by Tony Dutrow, the Pennsylvania-bred filly debuted with an eight-length victory over 4 1/2 furlongs at Parx June 9, then overcame a four-wide run on the turn to prove 1 1/2 lengths superior in the opening-day GII Schulerville S. at Saratoga July 20. She was let go at a juicy 7-2 for the Spinaway Sept. 2, but kept her perfect record in tact, but connections opted against stretching out for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and called it a year. The bay kicked off 2013 inauspiciously when never a factor when third to Fusaichiswonderful at 70 cents on the dollar in the Mar. 1 Primal Force S. at Gulfstream, and she most recently set the pace for six furlongs in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 30 before giving way readily to finish fifth. Instead of heading back to the Midlantic, she walked over to the Tom Amoss barn and turned in three strong works over this track, but was lightly regarded nevertheless. Midfield and between rivals in the run to the far turn, So Many Ways was ridden along leaving the three-eighths as favored

She was outsprinted by the chalk into the lane, but was steered off her heels in upper stretch and worked home best of all to take it in a blanket finish. "We knew the style she likes to run, which is to come from off the pace and come around horses," said Amoss, who gave credit for the victory to Dutrow. "Garrett [Gomez] was trapped for a long time. When he got outside, she did some running. It worked to our advantage."



BLACK ONYX SCRATCHED FROM THE DERBY

Black Onyx (Rock Hard Ten) was scratched from today's GI Kentucky Derby due to a non-displaced chip in his left front ankle. "We noticed a little swelling in the ankle this morning, previous to training," trainer Kelly Breen said. "It brought major concern right away. He went out, he trained, he did gallop. He came back and was, say, a one out of five lameness." The Sterling Racing colorbearer was x-rayed after his workout and the decision was made to scratch him, but that announcement came too late for also eligible **Fear the Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) to draw in. "He [Black Onyx] actually looked pretty good training this morning," Breen said. "But he was, just like anyone else, having a bad day, whether he wrenched his ankle or slept on it wrong, just like we all do. But the filling after he was done training warranted the X-rays that resulted in the finding of a non-displaced chip." Breen is not sure whether the chip will require surgery, but will keep Black Onyx in Kentucky for the foreseeable future. Jockey Joe Bravo didn't notice anything was off in the colt's last two works. "I'm just very thankful that the horse is going to be OK," Bravo said. "Maybe it's a blessing in disguise." Churchill Down stewards announced that that first stall in the starting gate will remain open and all runners will break from the spots they originally drew.

Scollay to Stand in for Bramlage...

Dr. Mary Scollay, longtime American Association for Equine Practitioners on-call veterinarian, will step in for Dr. Larry Bramlage as the spokesperson for equine health during NBC Sports racing coverage at Churchill Downs. Dr. Bramlage was hospitalized Thursday after sustaining a head injury in a golf cart accident on Churchill's backside. He remains at University Hospital in Louisville for continued observation.

BHA TEAM SWITCH TO BIN SUROOR YARD

The British Horseracing Authority's team of drug testers has completed its sweep of former trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni's Moulton Paddocks stable, and has now switched attention to include Godolphin's Stanley House stables of Saeed bin Suroor. While the testing procedures have finished, interviews with Al Zarooni's staff are ongoing. Confirming the new focus of testing, the BHA's Robin Mounsey told *Racing Post*, "We can confirm that, for the sake of completeness, we are conducting testing in training at the yard of Saeed Bin Suroor. Although there was no reason to link the two yards because of the common ownership by Godolphin."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Peter Pan Field Begins to Take Shape...

Team Valor's **Infinite Magic** (More Than Ready) is expected to make his first start for trainer Bobby Ribaudó in the GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont May 11. This 1 1/8-mile, 3-year-old stakes is often used as a prep for the GI Belmont S. June 8.

Infinite Magic started his career in England before he was purchased by Team Valor. He made his American debut for trainer H. Graham Motion, rallying from last to win a Keeneland turf allowance Apr. 14.

"It'd be easy to keep him on the grass--there's a grass overnight stakes [on the day of the Peter Pan]--but when people invest money and take shots with 3-year-olds they're hoping they can do something they haven't done yet," said Ribaudó. "It'd be nice to see if he can handle the dirt, and then there'd be a lot of options for him. You don't want to compare him to Animal Kingdom, but [Barry Irwin of Team Valor] did the same thing with Animal Kingdom, and everyone thought he was nuts. He ran on the synthetic, and the next thing you know he's in the [2011] Derby on the dirt and he wins."

Infinite Magic has been working well at Belmont and already has a 1 1/4-mile win under his belt, which Ribaudó expects will give him an edge against his Peter Pan rivals.

"A mile and an eighth at Belmont is tough for a 3-year-old," said Ribaudó. "It's five-eighths of a mile before you get to a turn. You turn for home, and lot of those 3-year-olds, will be done. At least he's been a mile and a quarter. It was on synthetic in Europe, so it may not be as grueling, but it was a mile and a quarter, so at least he's probably going to be the only horse who has gone that far."

Trainer Kieran McLaughlin will send two Darley colts, **Incognito** (A.P. Indy) and **Transparent** (Bernardini), to the Peter Pan. Incognito has back-to-back wins at Aqueduct where he followed up his maiden win with an optional claimer victory Apr. 13.

"He had a crazy race last time where he was in tight and clipped heels and came on to win," said McLaughlin. "A really nice horse, but he has to keep stepping up."

Transparent was sixth in the GIII Gotham S. Mar. 2, but rebounded to win an allowance by 10 3/4 lengths Apr. 4.

"It seems like he was laying there in good position on the first turn [of the Gotham], and then he flattened out," said McLaughlin. "I think the next start [jockey] Irad [Ortiz] took him back a little bit and settled in fourth, and maybe if we can ride him that way and be patient it will be helpful. We felt like we learned something about him."

The Peter Pan will be a Belmont prep for Incognito, but not for Transparent.

"We know Incognito wants [1 1/2 miles]," said McLaughlin. "We're not sure with Transparent. It's a great tune up for an important race, and we think Incognito could go on to the Belmont if he runs well."

Though unable to divulge the name of his new client, Brown stated that the colt would remain in the town to be trained by William Haggas.

“Not that I’d dream of telling William Haggas how to train, he looks like a horse who will benefit from a bit of time and is

more of a prospect for next year rather than a whizz-bang 2-year-old,” said Brown.

“I looked at him last year and thought he was big and raw, but horses can change quickly and, while he hasn’t grown in height, he has really filled out. I love the sire--I think he could really be about to explode.”

The colt’s dam Caraiyma (Ire) (Shahrastani) raced for her breeder the Aga Khan, winning as a 3-year-old when trained by John Oxx. She has thus far produced five winners, headed by G1 Prix de la Foret winner Caradak (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) and including the listed-placed filly Carallia (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}). The family also includes a Group 1-winning graduate of the Guineas Sale, the sprinter Margot Did (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}). Caraiyma’s Teofilo colt was picked up by AC Bloodstock for €25,000 at the Goffs Orby Sale and turned a nice profit when consigned through Clenagh Castle Stud. The same operation, run by Adrian Costello, enjoyed success at the Craven Sale last month when selling two juveniles for a total of 445,000gns.

Red Puts Arculli in the Black...

Hong Kong-based owner Ronald Arculli has been involved with plenty of good racehorses over the years, but there can be none so game as Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), winner of the G1 Hong Kong Vase last December. The admirable gelding has amassed £3,260,782 (approximately \$5,073,000) from his globe-trotting exploits, which include being beaten a nose by Dunaden in the 2011 G1 Melbourne Cup and finishing second to Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in the Dubai World Cup in March.

Such profitable outings prompted the purchase of [lot 197](#), a Tally-Ho Stud-consigned son of Dubawi (Ire), for 105,000gns via agent Charlie Gordon-Watson. The German-bred colt out of a Groom Dancer, who is a half-sister to Sky Classic S. winner Lauro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) and from the family of German champion Lando, will join Ed Dunlop’s La Grange Stables in Newmarket, the home of Red Cadeaux between his bouts of international travel.

“This is a bit of Red Cadeaux reinvestment,” said Gordon-Watson. “Every time he runs, Mr. Arculli buys another horse. He’s now bought two by Dubawi this year.”

The colt had been bought as a yearling by Anthony Stroud Bloodstock for €32,000 at the BBAG Sale last August. **Cont. p20**

Abandon's Hope...

David Redvers signed for the top lot at last year's Guineas Breeze-up Sale, but he had to settle for minor honours this time around when swooping for a good-looking son of Pivotal (GB) ([lot 130](#)) with a single bid of 100,000gns.

Consigned by Thomas Whitehead of Powerstown Stud, who picked him up at Tattersalls last October for 48,000gns, the chestnut was an eye-catching

professional in his breeze on Thursday when stretching out on Newmarket's Watered Gallop. The colt is out of multiple winner Abandon (Rahy), who is a half-sister to G1 Caulfield Cup winner Tawqeet (Kingmambo).

"He was by far and away the stand-out horse here," said Redvers, who is still to decide on a trainer for the Cheveley

Park Stud-bred youngster.

"He would have made twice that amount if he'd been in the Craven Sale a fortnight ago," said Redvers. "This sale always throws up some nice horses though."

Redvers added that last year's sales-topper at 115,000gns, now named Robot Boy (Ire) (Shamardal), runs in today's Harbour Watch Timeform 'European Champion Two-Year-Old' Handicap at Newmarket following his sprint victory last month at Doncaster.

Having signed for seven 2-year-olds at the Craven Breeze-up Sale on behalf of Sheikh Fahad Al-Thani, Redvers bought another four on Friday, including a colt and a filly by Exceed And Excel (Aus) for 45,000gns and 48,000gns, respectively. The filly ([lot 95](#)), already named Prairie Excellent (Ger) is to join Olly Stevens, who has recently started training at Sheikh Fahad's Robins Farm in Surrey.

With a big weekend ahead of him through the Al-Thani family's sponsorship of the QIPCO Guineas meeting, Redvers ensured he is in tip-top condition for the challenge by competing in the six-kilometer Newmarket Heath Run Thursday evening and finishing 11th of the 173 runners in a time of 20.73--not bad for a veteran. The race, an annual event run in aid of various charities, was won by Newmarket's star runner, Paul Holley, the former Cheltenham Festival-winning jockey who is now assistant trainer to David Elsworth.

Have Passport, will Travel...

An American-bred son of Exchange Rate ([lot 161](#)) will have notched plenty of air miles by the time he reaches his new home in Norway after being bought by agent Lars Kelp for owner Wibecke Nagell-Erichsen of Stall Zuccini, who punched the air in delight as the colt was knocked down for 100,000gns.

Originally sold as a yearling in Kentucky last September, the colt out of Deputie's Notebook (Notebook) was bought by regular Keeneland shopper Jim McCartan of Gaybrook Lodge Stud in County Westmeath, Ireland. He missed his original 2-year-old sale date having been withdrawn from the Goffs Kempton Sale in March with "a touch of a sore shin" but it was clearly worth waiting the extra five weeks as the racy colt turned his \$40,000 yearling price tag into a 100,000gns breeze-up transaction.

"This was the one we really wanted," said Lars Kelp. Kelp added that he hoped the colt, who is to be trained by leading Norwegian handler Niels Pedersen, will be a Classic prospect for his new owners, who also stand stallions.

"I looked at all the breezes and, in my opinion, this horse was the best of them all. I've seen horses by Exchange Rate on my trips to Keeneland and they perform well on both turf and dirt, which is important for us in Scandinavia as we race on both."

Dual winner Deputie's Notebook, who has already produced two winners, is a half-sister to Ohio Derby winner Delightful Kiss (Kissin Kris) and champion Canadian juvenile filly Delightful Mary (Limehouse).

Gaybrook Lodge Stud ended the sale as leading vendor with five juveniles sold for 274,000gns and McCartan, who consigns between 30 and 40 2-year-olds each year, was quick to praise his team at home, including head girl Anna Cranley and Cian Hughes, who breaks in the youngsters.

Another Gaybrook Lodge graduate to reach the top ten on Friday was [lot 129](#), a colt by Haatef out of French 3-year-old winner Zuniga's Date (Diesis {GB}). He was the selection of Italian agent Alberto Panetta - buying on behalf of Giuliano Manfredini--who signed the docket at 70,000gns.

"To buy a horse is easy, winning a race is the hard part," said Manfredini who has nevertheless enjoyed much success as a long-term owner with Marco Botti. He owns Botti's first winner, Ceremonial Jade (UAE) (Jade Robbery), and the duo also combined in Group 1 winner Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}), who was later sold to Coolmore.

"I've had some success with this sire [Haatef, sire of his recent listed-placed gelding Hasopop] and this horse looks like he has plenty of ability," said Manfredini. "He did a really good breeze and you have to fall a love a little bit with a horse." **Cont. p21**



Leading Lady...

Hawthorn Villa Stud's daughter of Dubawi (Ire) ([lot 116](#)) out of the winning Grand Lodge mare Summer Sunset (Ire) was the most expensive of the breeze-up fillies catalogued. She caught the eye of bloodstock agent Bobby O'Ryan, who went to 70,000gns to secure her on behalf of Grand National-winning jockey-turned-trainer Brendan Powell.

"Bobby took me to see her yesterday," said Powell, who trains a mixed string of Flat horses and jumpers in Upper Lambourn. "She has a beautiful pedigree and she's been bought for an owner who has a few horses with me, but she may end up racing for a couple of guys. She looks forward enough, but I always take them home and give them a three-week break first. She's a long-term project. The owner hopes she can win and then he plans to keep her as a broodmare."

Summer Sunset's half-sister Elegant Ridge (Ire) is the dam of last season's smart juvenile, the Group 3-placed Montiridge (Ire) (Ramonti {Fr}), who remains in training with Richard Hannon.

"There's plenty happening in the pedigree," O'Ryan added. "I went to see her two weeks ago at Paddy's [Twomey, who consigned the filly] and I loved her."

The filly almost doubled in value from her yearling price of 36,000gns when sold in the same ring last October.

With 14 lots more than last year changing hands, the sale's turnover increased by 9% to 2,364,800gns, but the median and average both dipped, the former to 16,000gns (from 21,000gns, a decline of 21%) and the average to 25,428gns (from 27,606gns, down 7%). The clearance rate was 81%, a small improvement on 2012.

"Middle Eastern buyers, in particular from Qatar and UAE, have made a major contribution to both parts of today's Guineas Sale and, similar to the 2012 renewal, the clearance rate of around 80% has not only been a huge positive, but also particularly welcome after the more selective demand that has been typical of the breeze-up market this year," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony at the sale's conclusion. "To have sold four six-figure breeze-up lots today has demonstrated the continued demand at the top of the market, but the depth and diversity to today's trade has been the real feature and we look forward to continuing to build on the success of this year's renewal."

Horses-in-training Topper to Australia...

The day's trade started with a 37-strong horses-in-training section, from which the final offering, Kingsdesire (Ire) (King's Best) ([lot 65](#)), failed to find a buyer in the ring but was later sold privately through Alberto Panetta for 85,000gns.

The 4-year-old, a winner at two and three for Giuliano Manfredini, will remain with his existing trainer Marco Botti for the short term before being shipped to race in Australia. Out of the Key Of Luck mare Lucky Clio, Kingsdesire is a half-brother to Lucky Beggar (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}), a dual winner as a juvenile last season who was also third in the Listed Rockingham S.

Best of those knocked down in the ring was Line Of Reason (Ire) ([lot 34](#)), a 3-year-old colt by Kheleyf, who is to be switched from the Newmarket stable of David Simcock to the North Yorkshire yard of Paul Midgley after selling for 80,000gns to Andy Turner.

The near-black colt won on his sole start at two and consolidated that victory with another six-furlong win at Kempton in March. He's finished second on both his other starts to earn an official rating of 86.

"He's the nicest horse here and, hopefully, there's a decent prize in him," said Midgley. "He could be a horse for York. He looks progressive and, hopefully, he's better than his handicap mark."

While only two more horses were sold in this session than in the corresponding session last year, those 28 horses brought about a boost in aggregate of 57% to 411,200gns. The median figure doubled to 7,000gns while the average also improved, by 46% to 14,686, and the clearance rate rose to 76% (from 72%).

"Last year's decision to reintroduce the Tattersalls Guineas Breeze-up Sale and to add a horses in training section proved to be a success and this year has further cemented the fixture as a valuable addition to the Tattersalls sales calendar," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The horses in training section achieved significant rises across the board with the 85,000gns session-topper heading to Australia and international buyers prominent at all levels of the market. As last year the horses in training attracted participation from throughout the world and the international buyers continued to make their presence felt at the Breeze-up Sale which followed."

"He's in the zone. He's making all the right decisions and riding with a lot of confidence. I am glad he is on our team. 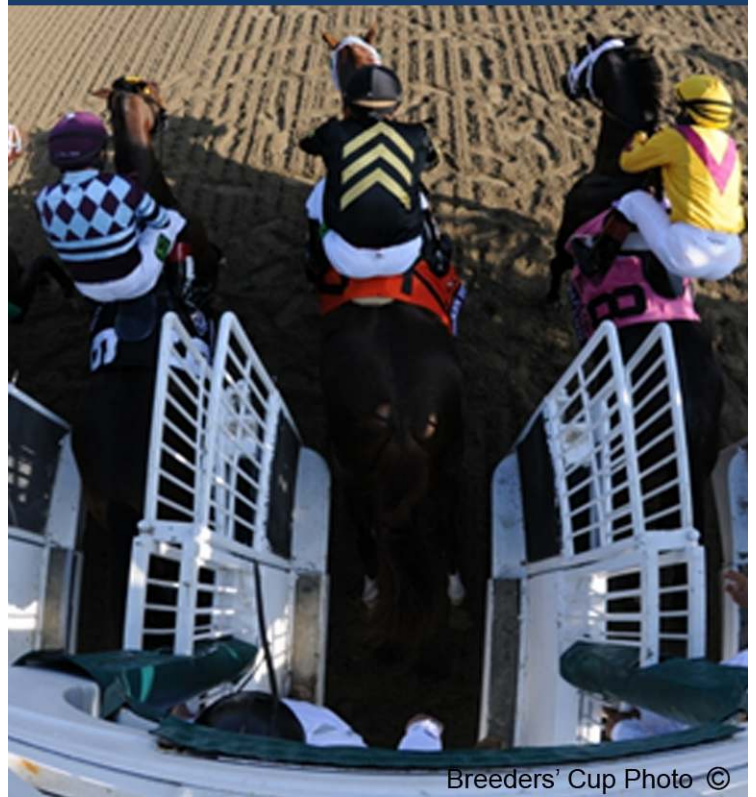
