A LANTERN IN THE GLOOM

Bitterly disappointed by the flop of Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) 24 hours earlier in the G1 2000 Guineas, Team Hannon rebounded in style yesterday as Ben Keswick's **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}) swooped late to win Newmarket's G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas. Runner-up while giving **Hot Snap (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) three pounds in the G3 Nell Gwyn S. over seven furlongs here 18 days ago, last year's G1 Moyglare Stud S. heroine turned that form on its head to provide Richard Hughes with a belated first British Classic victory. Switched off in rear early, the 9-1 shot was delivered with a

rattle to wear down **Just the Judge (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}) in the final 25 yards and score by a half length, with Ballydoyle's **Moth (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) putting in an eye-catching Oaks trial 1 1/2 lengths away in third. Hot Snap, the 5-2 favorite, was in trouble a long way from home and finished a disappointing ninth. **Cont. p3**

Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby winner **Orb** (Malibu Moon) boarded a van to Belmont Park Sunday morning, where he will prepare for a start in the GI Preakness S. May 18. "I'm looking forward to getting the process going again and running in the Preakness," trainer Shug McGaughey said. Orb is slated to arrive at Pimlico Race Course on Tuesday, May 14. "We are tickled to death with the way he ran yesterday and he seemed to come out of the race well," added the Hall of Fame conditioner from Kentucky. "I am looking forward to getting there. We had a great two weeks down here and I am sure our time at Pimlico will be every bit as good."

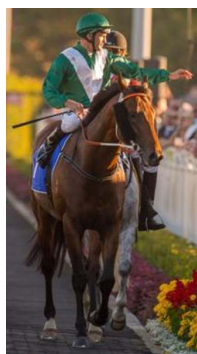

1000 Guineas cont.

Always highly regarded and the subject of chatter, Sky Lantern was introduced over six furlongs and after a Goodwood maiden win in May followed up over that trip in the Listed Coolmore Stud Sprint S. at Naas 11 days later. Upped to seven to take on Certify (Elusive Quality) in the G3 Sweet Solera S. on the July Course here, the grey was no match for that rival and was the bridesmaid again in the G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood a fortnight later. Putting those reversals behind her at The Curragh, she was dominant in the Moyglare Stud S. in September before meeting all kinds of trouble in running when eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Santa Anita in November. Despite her weight turnaround with Hot Snap from the Nell Gwyn, the manner in which she was brushed aside by that rival in that prep suggested she would struggle to reverse the placings, but the Juddmonte homebred was a notable flop this time and the door was left open. Breaking well, she was anchored towards the back of the main group early as the favorite and Just the Judge tried to work into contention from their outside posts. While Just the Judge was traveling with elan throughout under Jamie Spencer, Hot Snap was being niggled at and when the whip was drawn before the quarter pole the distress signals were being sent out by Tom Queally. It was left to **Winning Express (Ire)** (Camacho {GB}) and Just the Judge to do battle running down into the "dip" and the race looking in the clutches of the latter as they began to scale the rising ground. Sky Lantern, who had darted between rivals after handing a three-length headstart to the leading duo, appeared wide to change the complexion and she gave a final thrust to subdue the previously-unbeaten Charlie Hills trainee.

"It's about time!," Hughes said of reaching his personal landmark. "I knew I gave her a bad ride last time, but I believed in this filly and she loves that fast ground. They didn't get over-fast, but it was all about getting her plenty of cover and into a smooth rhythm. On the last day, I stopped her from running--when she wanted to go I disappointed her, because I didn't want to be kicking two and a half out with a penalty and leave her Guineas behind there. I let her go today and she was tough to stick her head out at the line."

Hughes continued, "I got off her in America and said to enter her in the Oaks, as she felt she'd get a mile and a half then, but whether she will or not is another thing--I think she might go for the G1 Prix de Diane [at Chantilly June 16]. She's hardy nut and goes on the

road--she canters to the start like a old chaser with her head between her knees--but you have to get her flowing, that's the one thing about her. There is nothing wrong with her--she just needs to run her way. We have good horses and Richard's team has got very strong over the

years, buying better-quality horses. Aidan O'Brien has dominated the Classics in recent years and if you are not on them, you don't win. Our stable has gone up a notch, it's a team effort and Richard's an amazing trainer." Richard Hannon Jr. added, "We were very low after yesterday, but this filly deserves a bit of luck. She didn't get any in America and bumped into a very good filly last time who probably didn't run her race today. I'm delighted for Hughesie, he's one of the great riders."

Reserving Judgement...

Connections of Just the Judge are keen to re-oppose the winner on another day, with her part-owner Sheikh Fahad Al Thani telling *PA Sport*, "I believe that if she had seen the other filly and had time to respond, she would have fought back. She is still backward in her coat and the other filly had a run, so I would be confident we can turn the form around. We'll discuss future plans, but she is entered in everything."

Joseph O'Brien was also expecting more in the future for Moth, who stayed on strongly to snatch third from Winning Express. "She's run a blinder, as she was still green," he said. "It was her first run on a track like that and it took longer for her to pick up than it usually does."

The Champ's Long Wait for Classic Success...

"About bloody time," was Richard Hughes's response to his first British classic win aboard Sky Lantern in the 1000 Guineas after 25 years with a jockey's licence.

It was very much a family affair for the reigning champion jockey, who turned 40 in January. His wife Lizzie, on hand to greet him with a hug as he was led back into the winner's enclosure, is the daughter of Sky Lantern's trainer Richard Hannon, while Hughes's father Dessie, who trains in Ireland on the Curragh, had travelled to Newmarket to witness his son's milestone

victory. Hughes first tasted success in the professional jockey ranks when winning aboard Scath Na Greine for his father at Naas in 1988.


"I just went out there today feeling happy-go-lucky and it worked. It's a super day," said Hughes. "Things didn't go right the last day I rode her and I should have won on her in America. But I always believed in this filly and she came good. They didn't go over fast, but it was about getting her plenty of cover and then just trying to arrive there. They just got away from us in the dip but you have to come through horses on this filly."

Richard Hannon Jr., assistant trainer to his father and the brother-in-law of Hughes, added, "I am delighted for 'Hughesie'--he deserves it. It is great for him and we are just delighted that he is one of ours.

"She has done it really well," Hannon Jr. added of Sky Lantern. "We might go further with her, maybe a mile and a quarter. Or there's the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas or the G1 Coronation S."

For Hannon Sr., overseeing his runners at Salisbury while his son took charge at Newmarket, it marked a fourth British classic victory. He has won the 2000 Guineas on three occasions with Mon Fils (1973), Don't Forget Me (1987) and Tirol (1990), but this was a first in the fillies' version. Don't Forget Me and Tirol both doubled up to win the Irish 2000 Guineas, a race Hannon has also claimed with Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}), ridden by Hughes.

For several strides of the final furlong in the 1000 Guineas it looked as though the race would fall to Qatar Bloodstock's Just The Judge, who would have been a fitting winner being owned by the Al-Thani brothers, who sponsor the British Champions' Series through QIPCO. Success would also have gone some way towards compensating the filly's young trainer Charles Hills, whose first classic entrant in the same race last year, Gray Pearl (GB), was fatally injured in the starting stalls prior to the race. **cont. p5**

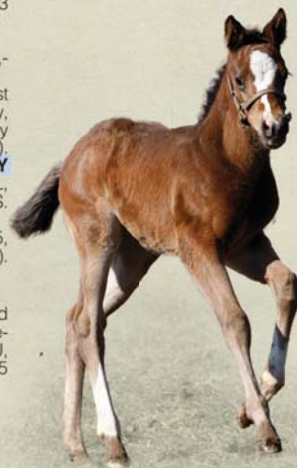

Despite holding the advantage temporarily, Just The Judge could not repel the determined charge of the statuesque grey Sky Lantern, finishing half a length adrift. Her jockey Jamie Spencer incurred a three-day riding ban for excessive use of the whip.

While Sheikhs Fahad and Hamad were out of luck in the main event, their racing manager David Redvers fared better in the following 2-year-old maiden, which was won by his colt Green Door (Ire) (Camacho {GB}), a £19,000 purchase at the DBS Premier Yearling Sale last August. Modesty presumably prevented Redvers from taking to the winner's rostrum after the race and his trophy was collected by his mother Mary.

Dank Makes Moore's Flying Return Worthwhile...

Sir Michael Stoute was not at Newmarket to saddle his G3 Dahlia S. winner Dank (GB), as the trainer is currently recovering from a gall bladder infection, but Ryan Moore, who rode Lines Of Battle (War Front) to finish seventh in the GI Kentucky Derby on Saturday, made it back to his home town of Newmarket to partner the daughter of Dansili (GB).

Despite the Derby having been run past 11:00 p.m. by British time, Moore's trans-Atlantic return was speedy enough to allow him to take a full book of rides

1000 Guineas day. The 29-year-old lives only a short stroll from the track, yet despite his proximity to the Rowley Mile, Moore was delighted to be at Churchill Downs on the opening day of the British classic season. Interviewed recently for Thoroughbred Owner & Breeder magazine, he confided that the Kentucky Derby was one of four big races around the world that he was desperate to win alongside the Melbourne Cup, Japan Cup and Dubai World Cup.

"Racing is a global game and the four races I mentioned are the most important in their countries," he said. "The Melbourne Cup is arguably becoming the biggest race in the world these days; rightly or wrongly I'm not sure.

"You feel the buzz when you go there, but I'd be more of a purist. If I could only win one, I'd like it to be the Kentucky Derby. It's a really amazing race."

James Wigan bred Dank at his West Blagdon Stud in Dorset and while she races in his colors, Wigan had two runners to keep an eye on during the Dahlia S. as he is also the racing manager to Lady Rothschild, whose homebred Thistle Bird (GB) (Selkirk) finished third.

"Lady Rothschild had a nice winner here yesterday with Glean (GB) (Raven's Pass), so we've all had a good weekend," said Wigan's wife Anita, who runs her own breeding operation, Rushbrooke Stud, where the 2012 Melbourne Cup winner Green Moon (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) was raised.

Referring to Dank, a half-sister to the Group 1 winners Eagle Mountain (GB) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) and Sulk (GB) (Selkirk) out of the 25-year-old Darshaan mare Masskana (Ire), James Wigan said: "I am very pleased for her. She is out of an old mare of ours and it is nice to continue the line. The [G2] Windsor Forest [at Royal Ascot] is a possibility for her and Ryan said she does stay well. I think she would get a mile and a quarter well, but we will see what Sir Michael says."

Ryan Moore again teamed up with Lines Of Battle's trainer Aidan O'Brien for the 1000 Guineas, finishing fifth on Snow Queen (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}).

Rod's Race Makers...

Rod Street, the chief executive of the QIPCO British Champions' Series (BCS), who fulfills the same role for Great British Racing (formerly known as Racing For Change), launched a new initiative at Newmarket known as 'Race Makers,' which is to run throughout the series.

An idea inspired by the success of the raft of volunteers known as 'Games Makers' during the London 2012 Olympics, a team of ten Race Makers will be on hand at each BCS meeting to assist new and inexperienced racegoers by offering relevant advice and information and leading racecourse tours.

"We've had a terrific response since launching Race Makers last week via social media," said Street. "It's all voluntary and we've had a great range of ages sign up with quite a number of the volunteers being in their 50s and 60s."

The Race Makers are split into three groups--betting experts, paddock experts and general--with those on duty during the Guineas meeting including a breeder and the widow of a trainer. Volunteers are rewarded with free race badges for a BCS meeting of their choice.

"I admit that the idea is shamelessly stolen from the London Olympics, but the Games Makers really proved that when people volunteer for something, the level of service is much better. The window of opportunity is quite narrow--essentially the Race Makers are most useful between arrival at the races and the start of the first race." **cont. p6**

After a couple of weeks of negative headlines for British horseracing, Street was delighted with the start of the third QIPCO British Champions' Series. "We could not have asked for more yesterday with two unbeaten colts, Dawn Approach and Toronado, going head-to-head in the opening race of the series," he said. Dank raced only once at two, but showed promise when second in a Newbury conditions event that has been used to introduce smart types down the years and re-emerged last term with a mile maiden win on Kempton's Polytrack in April. Given time to mature, the homebred made her black-type debut three starts later in Haydock's Listed Dick Hern S. over that trip in August and followed with a breakthrough Pattern-race success in Sandown's G3 Atalanta S. in September. Only fifth behind Chigun and Thistle Bird on her final outing in the Listed Rosemary S. here in September, the bay lined up against those rivals with a three-pound penalty trying further than a mile for the first time.

Positioned in behind the leading duo early by Ryan Moore, she was sent after Chigun when that filly was committed inside the final quarter and wore her down in the final yards before prevailing in the bobber.

In doing so, she was providing Sir Michael Stoute with a fifth renewal. "I didn't really expect her to win, but she was very brave and saw the trip out very well," said Moore after making the trans-atlantic dash having ridden Lines of Battle (War Front) to a seventh-place finish in yesterday's GI Kentucky Derby. Owner-breeder James Wigan added, "I am very proud of her and she is out of an old mare, but I kept her because she was the last filly foal and I wanted to continue the line. She will get a mile and a quarter and we'll see what Sir Michael [Stoute] says about where she goes."

Champions Mile and pounced in the lane for just his second local victory in 16 tries. A top juvenile in Ireland when trained by Kevin Prendergast as Dunboyne Express, the bay won the G3 Anglesey S. at second asking, but was only fifth to Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal) when 4-1 in the 2010 G1

Racing Post Trophy. First-up winner of the G3 Leopardstown Derby Trial S. in 2011, he was fifth in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish Derby, posted minor placings in the G3 Meld S. and G2 Royal Whip S. and closed out that portion of his career with a fourth to So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Irish Champion S. It took him seven tries to break his local maiden last July 15, and while he hadn't scored since, he had been competitive in domestic stakes company, with a second to Glorious Days (Aus) (Hussonet) in the Stewards Cup Jan. 20 and to Packing Whiz in the Chairman's Trophy Apr. 7.

Settled in third on the rail as Helene Spirit dictated terms from 10-time Group 1 winner King Mufhasa (NZ) (Pentire {GB}), Dan Excel peeled off the inside at the final corner. Helene Spirit proved a stubborn rival after setting a relatively easy pace, and Dan Excel required the length of the stretch to peg him back. Packing Whiz ran with credit in third, while favored Glorious Days couldn't quicken late and was disappointing in fourth. Trainer John Moore, who saddled Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) to win the G1 QE II Cup last weekend, was winning this race for the fourth straight year. "Drawing gate one won the race for us," Moore summarized, adding that he is hoping to get Dan Excel to join Military Attack for the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup in two weeks. "He kicked really well and we know he's a fighter--he doesn't give up. He's delivered on the day." King Mufhasa was said to be making noise around the halfway mark and was essentially eased home. The 8-year-old gelding recently underwent a procedure for an entrapped epiglottis.

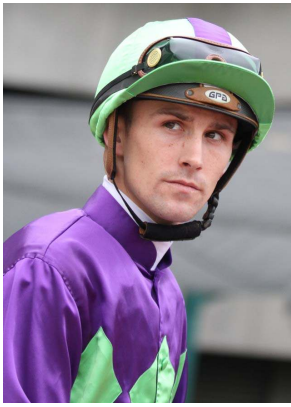

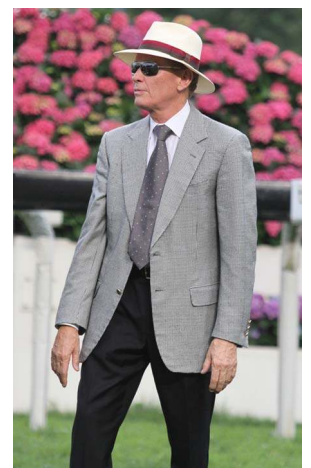

Triple Crown bid and flop in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) has in part a reputation to restore this

year. He begins that process in today's G3 High Chaparral EBF Mooresbridge S. at The Curragh and Aidan O'Brien is in a positive mood ahead of

his return. "He's in good form and we're hoping the ground will be nice for him," he said. "We're very happy with him and he's had a nice break. He obviously had a little setback at the backend, but he's been in Coolmore all winter and came back in great shape and I've been delighted with him since. We'll take it one race at a time but if everything went well, the three races would be the Curragh on Monday, the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup [at The Curragh May 26] and then the G1 Prince of Wales's S. [at Royal Ascot June 19]." Another on the comeback trail is Jim Bolger's 2011 G1 Dewhurst S. hero **Parish Hall (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}), who was racing for the first time subsequently when taking the Listed Alleged S. over this course and distance last time Apr. 7.

"He got away good," McGaughey said of the race. "I might have been a little surprised that he was back where he was. Then, they threw the 22-and-change up there and I knew why he was where he was. He [jockey Joel Rosario] got him over where he didn't lose a lot of ground around the first turn and then he had him in a great position going down the backside to where anything foreseeable won't get in my way. The only other thing I said [to Rosario] was: 'When the time comes try to be in position to give him someplace to go,' and he did that. When he started making that move, you always wonder, 'Is he too far back?' When he got to the quarter pole I knew he was going to finish and he was going to be running at the end. At that time I was feeling pretty confident that we were in a good spot and had a good chance."

Pilot Johnny Velazquez had ridden Orb to victories in the GI Florida Derby and GII Fountain of Youth S., but opted to ride Verrazano (More Than Ready) in the Derby. McGaughey offered Rosario, who had previously ridden Orb, the mount. "Joel was the one I wanted and then he gets off to that amazing start at Keeneland and comes over here on opening night and wins five races," said McGaughey. "After winning five, I knew he wasn't intimidated by Churchill Downs. The more I'm around him, the more I'm amazed at what kind of kid he is. He's just happy with what he does. Trainer Chad Brown

Normandy Invasion (4th): "I looked like a winner at the top of the lane. I'd say about the eighth pole to the sixteenth pole he got rubber-legged on me. I thought he was courageous in defeat. He fought to the end; he just missed third. And he galloped out a little bit; it's not like he stopped. He fought on. I don't know what our next move would be. Despite Wet Weather, Strong Derby Day Figures...

Handle and television ratings for the 2013 Kentucky Derby came back very strong. All-sources handle on Derby day was \$184.6 million, a 1% decrease from last year, but still good for second-highest of all time behind last year. All-sources wagering on the Derby itself was down 2% to \$133.1 million, and was also lower than only 2012's figure. Heavy rain at Churchill Downs Saturday forced on-track wagering lower, with a 7% year-over-year decline on the Derby down to \$11.5 million and an 11% drop on the whole card to \$21.1 million. "Our preliminary and still subject to change estimate of \$4.5 to \$6.5 million growth in EBITDA (earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortization) despite exceptionally dismal weather on both Opening Night and Kentucky Derby Day demonstrates the economic growth potential of this iconic American spectacle," Robert Evans, Chairman and CEO of Churchill Downs Incorporated, said.

NBC Sports' coverage of racing at Churchill Downs Saturday earned a 10.4 Nielsen overnight rating and a 23 share during the Derby portion (from 6:00-7:00 p.m.) of the event, tying the 2010 renewal for the highest ratings since 1992.



DAWN APPROACH A DERBY PROBABLE

Trainer Jim Bolger has indicated Godolphin's unbeaten G1 2000 Guineas hero **Dawn Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) is more than likely to have a crack at the June 1 G1 Epsom Derby in his next start. The chestnut ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ extended his unbeaten record to seven when plundering the one-mile Classic's 205th running by five lengths at Newmarket Saturday, and also retains the option of tackling the May 25 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh.

"I said that if he ran up to his best form, I thought he'd win and he excelled in that area," said Bolger. "It was his best performance to date. [Jockey] Kevin [Manning] wound him up a bit sooner as he wanted to hit the top of the hill in full flight. That's exactly what he did and it worked out very well. [Owner] Sheikh Mohammed and I have agreed that we'll both sleep on it, ponder the situation and then talk. On his breeding you would expect that he would not get the [12-furlong] Derby trip, but because he's so relaxed, and he has so much class, there is a reasonable chance that he will get it. For that reason, it probably will be decided that he'll go there. It will more than likely be Epsom. He wouldn't have the stamina influence [sire] New Approach had in his pedigree, but that doesn't mean he will not stay."

OCOVANGO HAS DERBY OPTIONS

Prince Faisal's unbeaten sophomore **Ocovango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}), who stamped his class on the G2 Prix Greffulhe at Saint-Cloud Saturday evening, has a choice of Classic engagements with connections of the Andre Fabre trainee yet to commit to either the June 1 G1 Epsom Derby or the June 2 G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly.

"We were delighted with his performance, he's still unbeaten and we're all very excited," owner's advisor Ted Voute told *PA Sport*. "He had to make his own running and it was a hard race, but he won very easily and with plenty in hand. The Prince was there, which is what it's all about, and we're now just waiting for the maestro Mr Fabre to decide what we're going to do next. We said we'd wait a few days and watch the other Derby trials, and see what happens in those before we throw our hat into the ring. He's entered at Epsom and in the Jockey Club, and we're completely neutral at the moment."

RETIRED

ALL TOO HARD RETIRED

All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}--Helsingie {Aus}, by Desert Sun {GB}), who followed brilliantly in the footsteps of his undefeated half-sister Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), has been retired from racing and will enter stud for the 2013 breeding season at Vinery Australia for a fee of A\$66,000. Bred by Rick Jamieson's Gilgai Farm, All Too Hard fetched a sales-topping bid of A\$1.025 million from Nathan Tinkler's Patinack Farm at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale in 2011, the first of three straight produce of his mare to lead the way at that premier auction. The striking colt debuted Feb. 18, 2012, with a win in the Listed Talindert S. at Flemington, a handful of races before Black Caviar won the second of her three G1 Lightning S. on the same program. He quickly added a pair of wins at the Group 2 level and gave an excellent account of himself when runner-up to the more seasoned Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) in the G1 Sires' Produce S., the second leg of the juvenile Triple Crown. He was able to turn the tables on that rival in the G1 Caulfield Guineas in October and was ahead of him when a highly creditable second in the G1 Cox Plate in his lone attempt at 2000 meters. Tinkler's well-documented financial difficulties were behind a decision last December to strike a deal to sell All Too Hard to a group headed by Vinery Stud, and the colt came back for one final preparation, more brilliant than ever. First-up winner of the G1 C. F. Orr S. at weight-for-age Feb. 9, he was something of a surprise acceptor for the G1 Futurity S. Feb. 23, but proved 3 ½ lengths too tough. Sideline two months by illness, he came with a stinging late rally to win the G1 All Aged S. by a half-length Apr. 27, and it was all but a certainty that he'd follow in Black Caviar's footsteps with a trip to Royal Ascot for the G1 Queen Anne S. "We are obviously very disappointed to see All Too Hard retire, but we understand the owners' decision to do so", said his trainer John Hawkes.

"You don't see too many colts as good as this horse come along," he continued. "He is a super horse, he has shown just what he is capable of doing and would have potentially gone on to win many more top class races and in doing so establishing himself as one of the greats. We are proud to have been part of the colt's career on the track; he will get the best of opportunity at stud, he will make a great stallion and we look forward to training his stock in the future." Added Vinery's Peter Orton, "He possesses an outstanding pedigree being out of Helsingie and a half- brother to world champion sprinter Black Caviar, but offers the blood of champion sires such as Danehill, Snippets, Last Tycoon, Flying Spur and Vain. All Too Hard retires as a lightly raced stallion who since being announced as standing this season, we have been inundated with bookings which will see his 2013 book being finalized shortly". All Too Hard retires with seven wins from 12 starts and earnings of A\$2,283,200.

NEHRO DIES OF COLIC

Zayat Stables' **Nehro** (Mineshaft--The Administrator, by Afleet), runner-up in the 2011 GI Kentucky Derby, died suddenly Saturday after being stricken with colic. The 5-year-old had been in training with Steve Asmussen at the time, but appeared uncomfortable in his stall that morning and passed away en route to a local clinic. "I can't put into words how much respect I have for Nehro," said Asmussen, who also sent out the bay to second-place finishes in the GI Arkansas Derby and GI Louisiana Derby at three and the GI Pimlico Special S. last year at four. "He was loved by everyone around the barn. What a cool horse. Quality animal. Just a horrible, horrible deal." Owner Ahmed Zayat added, "I am deeply saddened. Nehro was my favorite horse whom I had a deep bond with. Everyone who came in contact with this horse loved him. He cannot be replaced, and I'm devastated." Racing Manager Justin Zayat offered, "I was very sad to get the news from Steve first-thing this morning. We're extremely heartbroken and stunned. For him to run so great and be second in the Derby, and now for this to happen on Derby Day, it's just very emotional." A \$170,000 KEESep yearling, Nehro earned \$978,381 on the track with a 12-2-4-0 record.

Jackson Bend Out of Retirement, Works...

Bob LaPenta and Fred Brei's **Jackson Bend** (Hear No Evil) has been put back in training, and worked five panels at Calder Sunday morning in 1:03.40 for trainer Stanley Gold. The 6-year-old was a multiple stakes winner in Florida early in his career for Gold before annexing the 2011 GI Forego S. and 2012 GI Carter H. under the care of Nick Zito. He was retired to Journeyman Stud after

a failed defense of his Forego title and subsequent collision with another horse during training at Saratoga, but skipped the 2013 breeding season and instead went to a rehabilitation center after showing signs of discomfort with test mares. "It was a first work back, but it really wasn't a first work back because he's been galloping and breezing on the farm," explained Gold. "This wasn't something to see if he was ready to come back. He already showed that he was ready on the farm." The GII Smile Sprint S. is Jackson Bend's first objective. "Obviously he's got to show that he's up to that, but he'll get a chance to do that in the Ponche H. [June 8], and if anything were to go amiss, or if at any point it doesn't look like this is the best thing for him, he'll leave and wait for the 2014 breeding season to begin," Gold added.



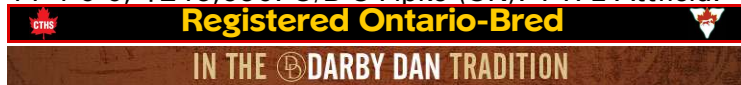
