## CAMELOT VICTORIOUS IN RETURN

Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) returned to the races with a solid 1 3/4-length victory in Monday's G3 Mooresbridge S. at the Curragh. Despite completing the difficult feat of winning the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Epsom and G1 Irish Derbies last term, Camelot stayed in the shadow of the peerless Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), and by the time he had finished his sophomore campaign on a sour note by losing out on a Triple Crown in the G1 St. Leger and making no impact in Paris in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, there was a definite feeling of anti-climax. With the Juddmonte giant at stud, it is safe to say that, aside from Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}), Camelot is the most high-profile older horse in training this year in Europe, and he stayed true to the early part of the script with a straightforward score yesterday.

Switched off in last early as stable companion **Triumphant (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) was sent into a clear lead, the handsome bay was angled wide for his closing effort by Joseph O'Brien in early stretch. Showing all the speed he had demonstrated on his finest days last term, Camelot was able to make up four lengths in the space of a furlong and get to the lead approaching the eighth pole before asserting under a hand ride.

Trainer Aidan O'Brien was understandably delighted with the result. "He had colic surgery over the winter and it was a very worrying time, so you are never sure first time back," O'Brien said. "He came back to us in super shape and you couldn't believe he had had such major surgery. He retains his speed and Joseph said he will improve a

lot fitness-wise. The plan is to come back here for the [May 26] G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and then the G1 Prince of Wales's S. [at Royal Ascot June 19] if all is well, but we'll take it one at a time."

## NORMANDY, VYJACK LIKELY PREAKNESS BOUND

Kentucky Derby also-rans **Normandy Invasion** (Tapit) and **Vyjack** (Into Mischief), originally expected to skip the May 18 GI Preakness S., are now likely to join the line-up for the second leg of the Triple Crown. Fox Hill Farms' Normandy Invasion loomed a threat at the top of the Churchill Downs stretch Saturday, but tired to fourth. "Originally, I threw the Preakness out," trainer Chad Brown said Monday. "But he's come out of the race so well that I'm at least going to remain neutral on the topic until I can see the horse go back to the track and get a gauge on his energy level and his soundness." Normandy Invasion shipped from Kentucky to New York Monday. Vyjack, who ran 18th in the Derby, is expected back at the Aqueduct barn of trainer Rudy Rodriguez Tuesday.

Trainer Al Stall, Jr. whose **Departing** (War Front) sat on the sidelines Saturday, is looking forward to having a fresh horse in the Preakness. "With those conditions, I was happy that the horse was sitting back in a nice comfortable stall instead of in a mile-and-a-quarter war on a tough racetrack," Stall said. "I didn't think about that. We were committed to what we were going to do and we don't look back." Departing, owned by Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider, was taken off the Derby trail after a third-place effort in the GII Louisiana Derby. He returned to take the Apr. 20 GIII Illinois Derby. "The Louisiana Derby was only his fourth race," Stall explained. "He ran well, but we just thought that he was lacking in seasoning. He might have gotten in a little bit of trouble and it looked like the holes were moving a little bit faster than he was."

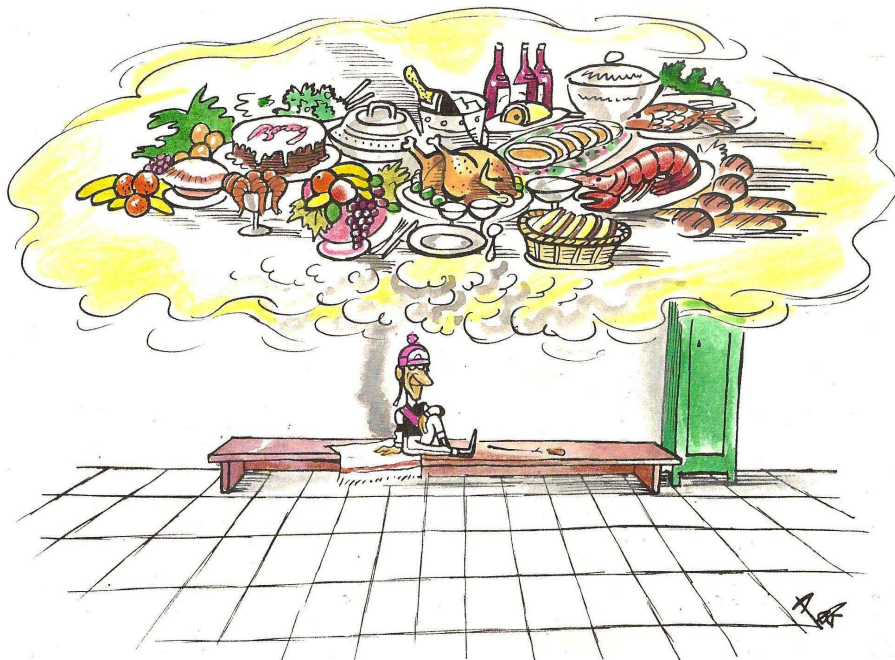

So impressive over six furlongs when winning a Naas maiden in July and this track's Listed Blenheim S. in September by a cumulative margin of 15 lengths, Viztoria lost her perfect record when sent to France to contest the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte in

November. Headed late on by Penny's Picnic (Ire) (Kheleyf) on that occasion, the bay headed back to Kildare for this first attempt at a seventh panel and duly regained the winning thread. Steadied in fifth early by Johnny Murtagh, she was pushed alongside Bunairgead with 150 yards remaining and

quickly settled the issue. "Today was about if she had trained on and whether she would get seven furlongs and she has and she did, and she is good enough to take her chance in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas [at The Curragh May 26]," trainer Eddie Lynam said. "If you look at her pedigree and the way she works at home you would have no doubt about her getting a mile and Johnny [Murtagh] is adamant she would get the seven and now thinks she'll get a mile. I think that her ace in the pack is soft ground, which she handles well and it will always play in her favor."

## It's the Derby for Dawn...

Godolphin's **Dawn Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) will run in the G1 Epsom Derby, it was confirmed yesterday. Following his impressive success in Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, the

unbeaten colt will have his stamina tested in the June 1 Classic. "Dawn Approach has come out of the 2,000 Guineas in excellent shape and I couldn't be more pleased with him," trainer Jim Bolger said. "I am now looking forward to running him in the Investec Derby at Epsom."

Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, "It has been agreed that Dawn Approach should run in the Investec Derby on June 1. His temperament and demeanor are excellent and he relaxes in his races which means he has a better chance of seeing out the mile and a half."

## Van Der Neer is Curragh Bound...

Saeed Manana's **Van Der Neer (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) is due to run in the May 25 G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas, connections announced yesterday. Third behind Dawn Approach in Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas, the Richard Hannon trainee had been due to step up in trip, but the conditioner's son Richard Hannon, Jr. outlined the change of plans yesterday.

"He goes to Ireland," Hannon said. "We were really pleased with him, as his work has been quite lazy. I think he'll want a mile and a quarter in time to be at his best, as he hits a flat spot in a race and if we stretch him out stamina-wise he'll have an even better turn of foot."

## No Derby for Toronado...

Connections of **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) will forego a tilt at the June 1 G1 Epsom Derby and wait for Royal Ascot, it was revealed yesterday. Following the disappointing effort of the impressive G3 Craven S. winner when fading into fourth in Saturday's 2000 Guineas, Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's recent acquisition will not step up in trip. "Plans are on hold and I'd say the Derby is unlikely," Richard Hannon Jr explained yesterday. "We'll probably have to wait for Royal Ascot, but whether that's the [June 19] G3 Jersey S. or the [June 18] G1 St James's Palace S. we'll have to wait and see." Reflecting on his tame finishing effort, the trainer's son added, "His work had been absolutely top-class and we all thought he was going to run extremely well, but in the last 100 yards he was legless. Fifty yards more and he'd have finished nearly last. Clearly there was something wrong with him. He traveled with the revs a bit high through the race and didn't finish it, but we'll look at him over today and tomorrow and see if we find something amiss and in a strange way I hope we do. I know he's capable of much better than that from the way he works at home. The way he finished his race in the Craven he should have stayed the trip on Saturday better than he did. We just need to find out why he didn't."

**Hot Snap Set for Break...**

Khalid Abdullah's **Hot Snap (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) will not be rushed after her flop in Sunday's G1 1,000 Guineas at Newmarket, connections stated yesterday. Sent off the 5-2 favorite for the mile Classic on the back of her impressive success in the G3 Nell Gwyn S., the Sir Henry Cecil-trained homebred could manage only ninth behind the filly she had beaten so comprehensively, Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}). Teddy Grimthorpe, the owner-breeder's racing manager, told *PA Sport*, "She seems fine this morning and nothing untoward has come to light at the moment. Perhaps it just wasn't her day. I can't blame the ground, even if a bit more rain would have been preferable, but she was in trouble from a long way out. It might just have been an off-day and we'll give her a bit of time and see how she is."

**O'Brien Outlines Targets...**

Aidan O'Brien was reflecting yesterday on his weekend Classic runners, while admitting that **Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) would probably not make the G1 Epsom Derby. Having suffered a setback ahead of the G1 2,000 Guineas, Susan Magnier's unbeaten G1 Racing Post Trophy winner will not run in any of the recognized trials for the June 1 blue riband. "We are struggling," he admitted. "He is sound, but he's done so little he's like a sprinter and is 20 kilos above his racing weight." As for the Guineas contingent, of which **Moth (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) fared best when third in the fillies' Classic on Sunday, he said, "It would have suited them if the ground had stayed fast and **Cristoforo Colombo** (Henrythenavigator) was just spinning a little bit on it. **Mars (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) stayed on well and got tired in the last 50 yards and **George Vancouver** (Henrythenavigator) will probably go back sprinting. He has a lot of speed and the two fillies ran very well. **Snow Queen (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was a little slowly away and Ryan [Moore] was delighted with her and Joseph was with his filly [Moth]. She swapped and changed a little bit early and was green enough. Joseph felt if he had stayed out he would have done better, but he went in for company which was not the wrong thing. When the gap came running down the hill, she was a little bit slow taking it but ran very well." Regarding the upcoming Derby trials, he added, "**Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will probably run in the G3 Dee S. at Chester on Friday and **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will probably run in the G3 Chester Vase [at Chester on Thursday], with **Nevis (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) in [Saturday's] Listed Lingfield Derby Trial. The plan is for **Battle of Marengo (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) to run in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial [at Leopardstown on Sunday]."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races.

**Mile Options for Just the Judge...**

Qatar Racing Ltd. and the Sangster Family's **Just the Judge (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}) will stay at a mile for the immediate future, with a tilt at the G1 Epsom Oaks seeming unlikely. Beaten a half-length by Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 1,000 Guineas at Newmarket, the previously unbeaten G2 Rockfel S. winner will probably run in either the G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas at The Curragh May 26 or G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 21. "She's very good this morning," trainer Charlie Hills told *PA Sport* yesterday. "She lost little weight, she ate up and seems well and bright in herself. She ran a massive race. She did all the hard work, she was always up there and has just got caught very late. The winner has come the other side of her and she didn't have time to respond, but we were delighted with her performance and she showed she is well capable of competing at the highest level. It's only the start of the year for her, there are lots of big races to go for and hopefully she'll win at least one, if not more, of them. We'll see how she is in the next week or 10 days. If she's absolutely bouncing, bucking and kicking, then we'll consider going to Ireland with her. If we feel she wants a bit more time, we can wait for the [G1] Coronation S. at Royal Ascot [June 21]. All options are open at the moment."

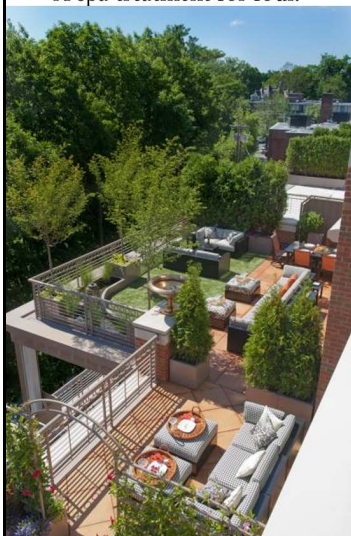

Jim Bolger's outstanding record as a trainer has shown time after time that he is not hidebound by convention. If a horse appears to be ready to run, he is happy to run it, even if other trainers would hesitate because of the animal's bloodlines.

This has been highlighted by the records of the five colts which have taken the G1 Dewhurst S. for Bolger over the last seven years, as none of them made his debut later than July 16. Parish Hall was out as early as Apr. 10, despite being inbred 3x3 to Sadler's Wells, and Saturday's admirable 2000 Guineas winner Dawn Approach started his career even earlier, on Mar. 25. These early starts also allowed Bolger to give his colts the wealth of experience which often proves so valuable in the top events, with all five racing at least five times at two.

I guess that ungenerous observers might say that some of these colts paid the price for their early exploits, as neither Teofilo (Galileo) nor Parish Hall (Teofilo) was able to race at three and Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway) ran only twice after his busy first season. However, New Approach proved to be a model Thoroughbred and is now a highly exciting sire, with the unbeaten Dawn Approach leading the way.

Of course the excitement about New Approach started last year, when Dawn Approach's Coventry S. win was part of an unprecedented stakes treble for a first-crop sire at Royal Ascot, the other victories coming via Tha'ir and the short-lived Newfangled.

While these three proved that New Approach is perfectly capable of siring precocious juveniles, I suspect that they may be exceptions to the rule. No other stakes winners emerged from New Approach's subsequent 2-year-old runners in 2012, but he notched up his fourth stakes winner when the stoutly bred Talent took the Pretty Polly S. two days ago.

As with many a winner of the 2,000 Guineas, the question now is whether Dawn Approach has the necessary stamina for the Derby. I might as well admit now that I have my doubts, but I am delighted that Dawn Approach's connections apparently intend to let him take his chance.

Bolger has been an advocate of Equinome's genetic testing system, designed to evaluate a racehorse's stamina potential. It seems, though, that he is still prepared to go along with the old trial-and-error process which has stood racing in good stead for hundreds of years.

When Brough Scott interviewed Bolger for *Racing Post Sunday* in March, Scott explained that the system categorizes a horse's stamina capabilities, from a TT for middle-distance to a CC for sheer speed.

"Galileo was a TT, but he had class," Bolger explained. "The ideal for a Classic horse is CT. New Approach was a CT, while Dawn Approach is a CC. I trained his dam who had talent, although she got injured, but she was by a sprinter, so the Derby distance is unlikely. But as he settles so well, I would not rule it out entirely."

It is essential to remember that stamina cannot be accurately assessed without taking temperament into account. A hard-puller is never going to stay as far as expected. Equally, a phlegmatic temperament and a willingness to settle can sometimes allow a horse to stay further than anyone might have predicted.

One of the most extreme examples that I can recall was Lord Helpus, a horse trained by Barry Hills nearly 40 years ago. This colt was by Green God, a high-class performer who did all his winning over five or six furlongs. Golden Cloud, the broodmare sire of Lord Helpus, was another specialist sprinter and so were Golden Cloud's sire Gold Bridge and Vilmorin, sire of Lord Helpus' very speedy second dam, Poplin. Lord Helpus seemed to be fulfilling his destiny when he showed consistently useful form over sprint distances at two. However, an amenable temperament encouraged Hills to move the colt up in distance at three, when Lord Helpus achieved a Timeform rating of 111 in scoring twice over a mile. The 4-year-old Lord Helpus then showed even further progress, when he achieved his finest victory in the G3 Princess of Wales's S. over a mile and a half.

Of course the stamina had to come from somewhere, the most obvious sources being Green God's grandsires Nasrullah and Guersant, both of whom just about stayed a mile and a half. **Cont. p10**



Clearly this latent stamina eventually proved more potent than the fast blood in Lord Helpus' pedigree. So will the presence of one very fast horse in Dawn Approach's pedigree--his broodmare sire Phone Trick--prove more influential than the fact that his next three dams are daughters of Pleasant Colony, Alydar and Sea-Bird II?

In case you've forgotten, Pleasant Colony won the Kentucky Derby and Preakness before siring several high-class performers over a mile and a half, including Colonial Affair (GI Belmont S.), Denon (GI Turf Classic) and St Jovite (winner of the G1 Irish Derby and King George for Jim Bolger). Alydar was a fine second in each of Affirmed's Triple Crown wins, running him to a head in the Belmont S. And the majestic Sea-Bird still has strong claims to being the finest mile-and-a-half horse in living memory.

To get back to Phone Trick, fast horses inevitably predominate among the good winners produced by his daughters, good examples being Zensational, Old Topper and Universal Form. Fortunately for Dawn Approach's admirers, there are exceptions to the rule, the finest being Unbridled's daughter Exogenous. With a GI Kentucky Derby and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner as her sire, Exogenous stayed well enough to triumph in a pair of Grade I's over a mile and an eighth and she was also runner-up in Grade I's over a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half (appearing not to stay the latter distance). Then there's Eye of the Tiger, a Grade II winner over 1 3/16 miles, and Connected, a Grade III scorer over 1 1/8 miles.

Therefore, there is good reason for thinking that Dawn Approach will not be troubled by a mile and a quarter, but only the racecourse test will tell us whether he can also excel over the Derby distance. It is worth pointing out that the late great Vincent O'Brien was of the opinion that a mile and a quarter was the optimum distance for some of his English and Irish Derby winners. Sheer class can help eke out a colt's stamina, and Dawn Approach certainly has that, so I think the idea of putting him to the test in the Derby is the right one, no matter what the result.

Dawn Approach's dam Hymn of the Dawn cost no more than \$18,000 as a weanling. She failed to win in five attempts and her dam Colonial Debut also retired winless after eight starts. Even his third dam Kittihawk Miss won only once in seven starts.

Don't get the wrong idea, though. The 2,000 Guineas hero comes from a female line which has achieved a great deal. Colonial Debut's best effort was her Tale of the Cat colt Galantas, a smart miler who earned the equivalent of over \$300,000.

Dawn Approach's fifth dam is Ole Liz, a winner of six of her 12 juvenile starts back in 1965. As a daughter of Double Jay and Islay Mist, Ole Liz was a sister to Bourbon Mist, and both these sisters proved very influential producers.

The Newstead Farm Dispersal in 1985 provided abundant evidence as to Ole Liz's talents. Her daughter Kittiwake--now the fourth dam of Dawn Approach--realized \$3.8 million at the age of 17.

Kittiwake's daughters Larida and Miss Oceana sold for \$4 million and \$7 million, respectively. Dawn Approach's third dam, Kittihawk Miss, was a sister to Miss Oceana, whose record stood at an impressive 11 wins and six seconds from 19 starts. Good enough to win five of her six juvenile starts, Miss Oceana progressed to boost her total of Grade I wins to five, including one over a mile and an eighth. She also finished third in the CCA Oaks over a mile and a half.

Kittiwake was 21 when she foaled the last of her four stakes winners, the Group 1-winning Nureyev colt Kitwood, who stayed a mile and a quarter in France. Kittiwake is also the second dam of Magic of Life, winner of the G1 Coronation S.

Ole Liz is also the third dam of Film Maker, a high-class turf filly who scored at up to a mile and a half. Dawn Approach isn't the only proof that this female line is still flourishing; other recent Grade I winners being Aruna (a Mr. Greeley filly descending from Kittiwake who scored at up to 1 3/8 miles) and Love Theway Youare (2012 Vanity H.).

Beaconaire, another of Ole Liz's daughters, produced the high-class filly Sabin, who collected Grade I wins in the Yellow Ribbon S. and Gamely H. Bourbon Mist's daughter Fire Water bred the champion filly Life's Magic, whose wins included the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, and Bourbon Mist is also the third dam of two very different types in Europe, namely Nuclear Debate, a top sprinter, and the stamina-packed Amilyn, twice a winner of the G1 Prix Royal-Oak.

**FL COURT STRIKES DOWN PARI-MUTUEL**

**BARREL RACING** Florida Administrative Law Judge John G. Van Laningham yesterday issued an 85-page order ruling that the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering's licensing of pari-mutuel barrel racing violated Florida statutes. The judgement called the policy an "unadopted rule."

Florida horsemen challenged the rule which treated barrel racing as a legal equivalent of traditional Quarter Horse racing and which provided a shortcut to other forms of gambling.

"Literally, as the 'Gretna Pari-Mutuel Barrel Racing' model and its proliferating hybrids are substituted for legitimate horse racing by pari-mutuel permitholders as an end-run around Florida's statutory requirements for slot machines and card rooms, thousands of horse racing and breeding jobs and businesses that would have otherwise been created have never had a chance to materialize," Florida Quarter Horse Racing Association President Dr. Steve Fisch said in a statement.

Also in the statement, Fisch said, "As this audacious case has dragged on, our policymakers have come to realize what we horsemen knew all along--that Gretna Racing LLC's 'pari-mutuel barrel racing' was simply the pilot project to bypass state and federal laws that protect and ensure integrity in the wagering and racing product throughout America. But by virtually eliminating the need for horses, independent horsemen and legitimate racing, the 'Gretna Model' creates nothing but an economic black hole."

### MORE JOYOUS INQUIRY POSTPONED

The inquiry into the performance of More Joyous (NZ) (More Than Ready) in the Apr. 27 G1 All Aged S. at Randwick has been adjourned until further notice, according to published reports. Owned by John Singleton, More Joyous finished seventh of eight in the All Aged, prompting Singleton to publicly fire trainer Gai Waterhouse after the race. The owner claimed that Waterhouse's bookmaker son Tom Waterhouse had told friends of Singleton's before the race that the mare was off, and would not win. Tom Waterhouse denied those claims, and it has been established that both he and his father, bookmaker Robbie Waterhouse, recorded losses on the race. Gai Waterhouse admitted that the mare was treated for heat in her neck in the week leading up to the race, but she didn't consider it serious enough to report to stewards.

Racing New South Wales stewards yesterday met with key persons in the case, including Singleton and all three members of the Waterhouse family, in Sydney. However, the three men who allegedly had conversations with Tom Waterhouse--Andrew Johns, Allan Robinson and Eddie Hayson--failed to show and give evidence, causing stewards to stall the inquiry. The three men will be given one more chance to appear before the stewards, after which they risk being banned from racecourses.

"Racing New South Wales wishes to thank all those that attended today's inquiry, but we are disappointed with the three failings to cooperate," Chief Steward Ray Murrphy told *Racing and Sports*. "These three people are in a chain of information that is central to the issue. We will contact these three people one more time in order to afford them the opportunity to appear. Should the three people once again fail to appear, recommendations will be made to initiate proper sanctions. We will be giving consideration to the large volume of evidence at hand and whether charges will be laid, and we hope to bring this inquiry to a swift and satisfactory conclusion."

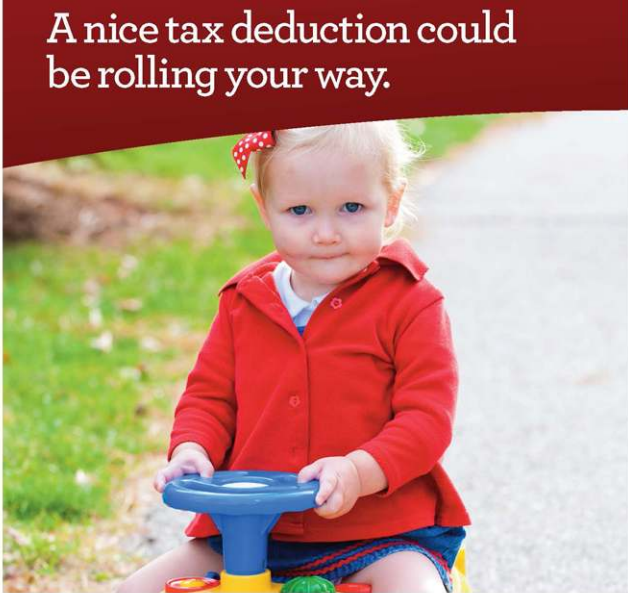
