



GLORY DRAWS WIDE IN POULAINS

Tomorrow's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains has attracted a field of 18 and leading contender **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) was not done any favors in stall 12 as he bids to add another mile Classic to Richard Hannon's resume. Last seen winning the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury Apr. 20, Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner will have to defy the statistics to prevail, with only Lope de Vega (Ire) (Shamardal) able to overcome a double-figure draw in recent times. Like that high-class performer, **Intello (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) hails from the Andre Fabre stable successful five times and he will also break from wide out in 17. The Wertheimer brothers' unbeaten Listed Feilden S. scorer has only Apr. 14 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau winner **Gengis (Fr)** (King's Best) on his outside. The Wertheimers are also represented by **Anodin (Ire)** (Anabaa), a full-brother to Goldikova (Ire) who will bid to go one better than his illustrious sibling after she was second to Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) in the Pouliches five years ago. While the owner-breeders' Racing Manager Pierre-Yves Bureau was pleased with stall eight for Anodin, he was bemoaning the misfortune of Intello yesterday. "As you can imagine, we would have preferred a lower draw for Intello but that's the game and we have to deal with it," he told *PA Sport*. "It could have been worse, so we will see what happens on Sunday. It's hard to know what will happen, but we would have preferred low draws for both of them. I think he had a nice run in Newmarket but the thing with both horses is that they have not been running against the top, top horses and this will be a big step up for them. Intello is dropping back in trip but I think there's enough speed in his pedigree as his dam was a miler and his granddam was a sprinter, so that shouldn't really be a problem. Anodin is a full-brother to the big girl and a half-brother to Galikova and he's a nice horse. He ran a nice race last time, but it's a big step from conditions company to Group 1 level. The ground should be fine for them and we will see how they go on Sunday." **Field p3**

QUEEN ANNE FOR ANIMAL KINGDOM

G1 Dubai World Cup and G1 Kentucky hero **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) has been confirmed for Royal Ascot's G1 Queen Anne S. over a mile June 18. It will be the 5-year-old's final start before he stands the 2013 Southern Hemisphere breeding season at Arrowfield Stud in Australia. "We had discussed the possibility of either the Queen Anne S. or the G1 Prince of Wales's S.," explained trainer Graham Motion. "But after walking the course, I feel the mile in the Queen Anne will afford our horse plenty of ground. We had only considered the other race because it is run over the same mile-and-a-quarter distance as the Kentucky Derby and World Cup." Motion continued, "The owners [Arrowfield Stud, Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum and Team Valor International] prefer a credential for the horse at a mile and I think the uphill nature of the Ascot course will be a stiff-enough test to allow his stamina to come into play. The mile at Ascot is closer to a mile-and-an-eighth race in America because of the layout and if Animal Kingdom were racing in America at this time, we probably would be running him over that distance. The Queen Anne also fits nicely into my training schedule for Animal Kingdom since we freshened him up after his trip to Dubai." John Velazquez will ride Animal Kingdom in the Queen Anne.

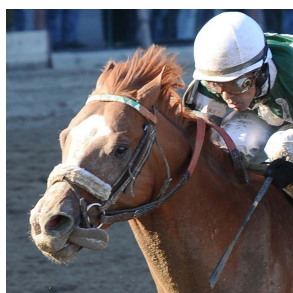

Also faring well with the all-important post position draw is Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf heroine **Flotilla (Fr)** (Mizzen Mast) in five, while the same owner had less luck with last year's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac runner-up **Topaze Blanche (Ire)** (Zamindar) in 11. Along with Guy Pariente's homebred **Kenhope (Fr)** (Kendargent {Fr}) and Godolphin's **Tasaday** (Nayef), who were ahead of her in the G3 Prix de la Grotte over this track and trip last time Apr. 14, she will have to defy a

double-figure draw and potential traffic issues after that duo drew 16 and 14, respectively. Topaze Blanche's jockey Olivier Peslier is at least hoping that a fast pace will help her cause. "She is a very nice filly and was unlucky last time, as the pace of the race was too slow and she was a bit fresh and a little nervous," he said. "I tried to relax her, but she was too keen and she finished well. I think I can beat the winner [Kenhope] this time and the pace will be higher here. She will relax better here and although the draw is important, she is a good starter."

Mount Athos looked the best in the line-up beforehand and he was clearly that way throughout every step as Jamie Spencer opted to put his rivals to the sword from the get-go. Previously a smart prospect, the bay came to the fore last term when beating subsequent group-placed High Jinx (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) by four lengths under top weight in York's Listed Silver Cup over 14 furlongs in July. Following that with an impressive win in the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury the next month, he was geared towards a tilt at the G1 Melbourne Cup and ran with credit there to be fifth despite being caught too far back when the real action began.

Sent straight to the lead here, he shrugged off his market rival Memphis Tennessee (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}) and maintained the crushing momentum all the way to the line, with the steeplechaser Mad Moose the only rival able to stay within hailing distance. "It's all scuffed up towards the rail and he's a real fast-ground horse," his rider commented. "It was a brave decision to run, as the conditions were against him." Despite owner Dr Marwan Koukash's initial soundings that the winner could reappear in Friday's G2 Yorkshire Cup, trainer Luca Cumani was charting another path. "He doesn't go to York, as he's too good a horse to run that often," he said. "Marwan gave me two objectives this year, this race and the Melbourne Cup, so now it's all eyes on the Melbourne Cup. He's a very, very generous horse and puts a lot into what he does. He's always very eager to please and although he looks like he's doing it easily, he does put a lot of effort in. Last year, he won his three races in England nicely spaced out and I think we'll stick with the plan. He will probably have another two, or maybe three races before the Melbourne Cup, but we're not going to abuse him at this stage."

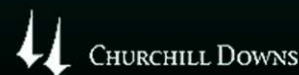

Heavily supported into clear favoritism beforehand, Magician struck in similar fashion to stable companion Ruler of the World (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G3 Chester Vase 24 hours earlier to add another Derby trial to Ballydoyle's record. Looking in need of the experience when unplaced and second in maidens at Leopardstown and Dundalk in September, the bay beat subsequently group-placed Bunairgead (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) by six lengths, with the talented Alive Alive Oh (GB) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) back in third, when stepped up to a mile on heavy ground at The Curragh the following month. Returning to Leopardstown 13 days later for the G3 Killavullan S. back over seven, he was at the tail of a seven-runner field there but was a different proposition on this seasonal bow. Racing in second early charting a wide path, he was taken even further towards the stand's side after the final turn and soon had total command from the well-regarded Contributor trailing in his wake.

"He felt like a very nice horse," commented jockey Ryan Moore, who had piloted Rosegreen's winner the day before. "He was relaxed going round there and like the horse yesterday, when asked he really quickened very well. He's got plenty of pace and is a different type [to Ruler of the World], but they are both good ones." Kevin Buckley, Coolmore's UK representative, added, "Ryan was equally impressed with both horses, but had a smile on his face when he came in today and got a good feel from him. He was really impressed when he pushed the button and he went through the gears very easily. I think on yesterday's evidence and on pedigree, there is no doubt that Ruler of the World is destined for mile-and-a-half races, but this horse handled that mile and two [furlongs] very well and he does have a bit of speed in his pedigree." Contributor's trainer Ed Dunlop told *PA Sport*, "[Jockey] Graham [Lee] blames himself for getting behind in a slowly run race. The winner could be very good, but it was an unsatisfactory race. The vibes we got were that today's winner was better than yesterday's and I suppose we come away from today not having learnt very much."

ELEVEN LINE UP FOR PETER PAN

While Orb (Malibu Moon) awaits his crack at the second leg of the Triple Crown next Saturday, a field of 11 contests today's GII Peter Pan S., a prep for the June 8 GI Belmont S., where a number of these could play potential spoiler should the GI Kentucky Derby winner score in the GI Preakness S. Lucky Shamrock Stables homebred **Declan's Warrior** (Majestic Warrior) looks to stretch out off a narrow upset victory in Aqueduct's GIII Bay Shore S. Apr. 6. He was a debut winner going 5 1/2 panels here Oct. 18 before a close second in a 6 1/2-furlong Gulfstream optional claimer Feb. 9. The chestnut dead-heated with **Narvaez** (Holy Bull) going an additional furlong at that venue Mar. 9, and moved up 10 Beyer points to a career-best 97 when annexing the Bay Shore.

"Obviously, the good thing is, we've always thought he was a terrific horse," said Hall of Fame trainer Nick Zito, conditioner of Triple Crown spoilers Birdstone (2004) and Da' Tara (2008). "He's getting better, and this is a good time to be getting better. It's a good time to stretch him out." Zito was noncommittal about the Belmont should Declan's Warrior handle the added real estate here. He added, "We're not really looking at this as a prep for the Belmont, but as a stakes race in its own right. He's a good horse, and down the road he's got a great future and a great career."

Abraham (Distorted Humor) was a second-out winner at this distance in the Gulfstream slop Feb. 16 before finishing third in the Mar. 24 GIII Sunland Derby and fourth in the Apr. 20 GIII Illinois Derby. The 7-2 morning-line favorite is joined by fellow Todd Pletcher trainee **Battier** (Tale of the Cat), who makes his first start for the top conditioner here. Second behind Mr Palmer (Pulpit) in Laurel's Private Terms S., the bay upended Aqueduct's Fit to Fight S. at the Big A Apr. 7. Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners purchased a majority interest in Battier from previous owner Ivan Barboza, and transferred him from trainer Pablo Andrade. Of his pair of runners, Pletcher offered, "Abraham ran a very good race in the Illinois Derby; he had a pretty difficult trip through no one's fault. He's an improving horse. Battier, whom we've had for a couple of weeks, is coming off a good race. He breezed well (five furlongs in 1:01.19 on May 5) and we'll see how he fits in." **Cont. p9**

The regally bred **Incognito** (A.P. Indy) broke through in start number five two back in Ozone Park Mar. 16 before overcoming a world of trouble in an optional claimer there Apr. 13. The Darley homebred is a son of Octave (Unbridled's Song), winner of the 2007 GI Coaching Club American Oaks at 10 furlongs. "We know Incognito wants [the Belmont distance of 1 1/2 miles]," said 2006 Belmont-winning trainer Kieran McLaughlin. "It's a great tune up for an important race, and we think Incognito could go on to the Belmont if he runs well."

LOOKING TO 'STRIKE' TWICE IN SENORITA

Carver, Hollendorfer and Smith's **Scarlet Strike** (Smart Strike) eyes her second-straight graded stakes score in Betfair Hollywood Park's GIII Seniorita S. today. Third behind Beholder (Henny Hughes) in the GI Las Virgenes S. on the Santa Anita main track Mar. 2, the bay took that venue's GIII Providencia S. over nine furlongs of turf Apr. 6. **Sweet Red Cat** (Bluegrass Cat) was third that day. A number of former European runners are among Scarlet Strike's challengers. **Lilbourne Eliza** (Ire) (Elusive City) was third for trainer Richard Hannon behind **Need You Now** (Ire) (Kheleyf) in Newbury's Radley S. in October before just missing in an Arcadia optional claimer Apr. 18. She figures to show speed in a race without much of it. Need You Now, meanwhile, was fifth down the hill in the Apr. 13 Runway S.--one spot behind **Disko Dasko** (Fr) (Country Reel), a French stakes winner for Elaine Burke who annexed her Stateside debut over that same course for James Cassidy Apr. 13. The formerly British-trained **Charlie Em** (GB) (Kheleyf), third against German stakes company for Brendan Powell in November, makes her first U.S. start for Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and James Cassidy.

"He stayed relaxed and that's basically what I'm focusing on, letting him achieve the workouts that he needs, not be rank doing it and be comfortable and relaxed. I got that out of him this morning." O'Neill's assistant Jack Sisterson was very pleased with the colt as well. "He's one horse that gets a lot out of his training," Sisterson said. "We wanted to see how he would come out of the Kentucky Derby and he's bounced out of it with high energy. He moved over the track well and Kevin was really happy with him this morning." Goldencents will gallop over the weekend and breeze on Monday morning.

1) **ORB** (c, [Malibu Moon--Lady Liberty, by Unbridled](#)) handled the track, the crowd, the weather and 18 rivals like a champ last weekend, and is now the undisputed leader of this division. A number of people whom I respect have assured me this is our next Triple Crown winner. It does seem like a distinct possibility. You know that Shug didn't strip his gears to get him the Derby, and with his pedigree (o/o Unbridled mare who won at 1 1/2 miles), the Belmont might always have been the leg he was most suited for (in this crop, at least). But the Preakness is next, and it's nice to see a number of legitimate contenders re-opposing, including the likes of Normandy Invasion, who initially was a no go for the race. From strictly a numbers standpoint, Orb's Derby was impressive. He received a 111 BRIS fig--tops on the year for a 3yo, alongside the fig Itsmyluckyday got in the GP Derby, though his 104 Beyer is less eye-catching. Orb's pace lines are interesting. Like he did in the Fountain of Youth, he ran (on BRIS PPs) a big E2 pace fig--a 121 (!) in the Derby (111 in FOY)--while his late-pace fig was simply good (91). If you're looking to take a shot against him in the Preakness, you could argue the pace scenario (like in FOY) couldn't have set up for him better, and he wasn't bothered by the off going--something you couldn't say about several other horses. **Last week ranked #4** [▶](#) [Get Andrew Caulfield's Take.](#)

2) **VERRAZANO** (c, 3, [More Than Ready--Enchanted Rock, by Giant's Causeway](#)), 14th in Derby, either didn't handle the distance or the track, and to be fair, was close to one of the fastest paces in Derby history. Would loved to seen him come back for the Preakness, but obviously can't fault Todd for wanting to regroup. Have to assume the Haskell becomes the next major goal for a colt with some New Jersey connections, unless they opt to shorten him and target the King's Bishop. **Last week ranked #2** [▶](#) [Get Andrew Caulfield's Take.](#)

3) **REVOLUTIONARY** (c, 3, [War Pass--Runup the Colors, by A.P. Indy](#)) gave WinStar its third on-the-board Derby finish in eight years (won with Super Saver '10, Bluegrass Cat 3rd '06). He got the trip everyone thought he'd get under Calvin Borel, especially leaving from post three: he saved ground and rallied up the rail. How patented a Borel ride was this? There are 6,600 feet in 1 1/4 miles. According to the Trakus stats, Revolutionary traveled 6,637 feet. No one in the race ran shorter, and by way of comparison, Orb went 6,721 feet (second-longest; only Vyjack went farther). One could make the argument that he probably should have outfinished Golden Soul for runner-up honors, though I have no idea how dead the rail was or wasn't. But a fine effort nonetheless. **Last week ranked #3** [▶](#)

4) **NORMANDY INVASION** (c, 3, [Tapit--Boston Lady, by Boston Harbor](#)) looked like your most likely Derby winner two furlongs out at Churchill before getting "rubber legged"--a term used by his trainer Chad Brown--down the stretch. Love the fact that Brown's considering bringing him back off two weeks' rest for the Preakness, a thoroughly un-Brown-like move. I don't have the stats for him returning horses off two weeks, but I can tell you that, in the last seven years, from 1,769 starts, he has returned horses off 10 days' rest or less just four times (winning once). It's even exceedingly rare that he brings them back in under three weeks. Off 21 days or less, he's run horses just 119 times (6.7% of all starts), winning at a 27.7% clip. (All these stats via BRIS.) **Last week ranked #5** [▶](#)

5) **OXBOW** (c, 3, [Awesome Again--Tizamazing, by Cee's Tizzy](#)) probably ran the best race of those horses that were close to the early pace. After running the opening six furlongs in 1:10.01 (according to Trakus), he maybe put a nose in front a quarter mile out, but then tired in the lane to finish sixth, beaten 9 3/4 lengths. This might be breaking it down too much, but after the initial quarter, he was 1 3/4L off the leaders, whereas the five horses that beat him were back 10L, 9L, 11.5L, 6.5L, and 12L. **Last week ranked #8** [▶](#)

6) **VYJACK** (g, 3, [Into Mischief--Life Happened, by Stravinsky](#)), buddy, bring it in here. Let's huddle up and figure out what happened last weekend. I mean, we all have off days--I remember this one time, I was writing an article, and I kept using double negatives all over the place (what was *that* about?)--but 18th in the Derby? I know, I know. Let's just put a line through that race and pretend it didn't happen, ok? Bad track, bad post, aggressive early--you know what to tell the press. But amigo, if your connections decided to run in the Preakness, you're going to really step it up. Do whatever it takes. Watch 'Rudy' a few times or something. What's that? Yeah, I know it's your trainer's name. But it's also a great film. **Last week ranked #1** [▶](#).

7) **GOLDENCENTS** (c, 3, [Into Mischief--Golden Works, by Banker's Gold](#)) was another who just didn't run his race in the Derby. Was it the track, the distance, the pace? Expecting much more in the Preakness. **Last week ranked #6** [▶](#) [Get Andrew Caulfield's Take.](#)

8) **MYLUTE** (c, 3, [Midnight Lute--Stage Stop, by Valid Expectations](#)) obviously was aided by the fast pace, but ran a nice one under Rosie. Last but not one early, he made smart headway into the lane and, moving widest, must have had connections thinking roses at the 3/16ths pole. But he flattened just a bit and lost a three-horse photo for third, running fifth. Returns for Preakness. **Last week ranked #10** [▶](#)

BILL COULD IMPOSE CHRB MED DIRECTOR TERM LIMITS

A bill currently in front of the California Assembly's Committee on Appropriations would impose a limit of two consecutive two-year terms for the California Horse Racing Board's Equine Medical Director. Introduced by freshman Assemblyman Adam Gray, AB 1154 will be voted on by the committee May 24 and head to the Assembly floor should it be passed. If the bill is enacted, it will remove current medical director Dr. Rick Arthur from his position on Jan. 1, 2018. Arthur, who previously operated a successful private veterinary practice for more than 30 years, was appointed equine medical director by the CHRB in May of 2006. During his tenure, Arthur, an ardent advocate of medication reform and the banning of raceday furosemide (Lasix), has been at odds with the pro-furosemide Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC).

Arthur was quick to note Gray's connection to TOC Board Member and retired Congressman Dennis Cardoza Friday.

"There's very little doubt in my mind that it was introduced because I've been a very proactive equine medical director and have ruffled a lot of feathers," Arthur said. "In spite of all the protestations otherwise, that is in fact the basis for the regulation. I don't think it's coincidence that Dennis Cardoza sits on the TOC Board and that Adam Gray is a former staff member of Cardoza's when he was [an Assemblyman]."

While the proposed bill does call for a limit on consecutive terms, there would be no limit on total terms served by an equine medical director.

"The unfortunate situation is that I certainly don't intend--even without this regulation--to be in this position for more than a couple more years," revealed Arthur. "The real problem is going forward. You're not going to get anybody to leave a successful practice for a four-year job. That's just the reality of it. I think it's really a disservice to the racing industry."

The equine medical director serves as a drug testing advisor to and is considered a faculty member of the Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Laboratory at University of California-Davis.

"Ironically, Sen. Ken Maddy put this position in the School of Veterinary Medicine at UC Davis specifically to insulate the equine medical director from the politics of horse racing, which we all know can be treacherous at times," said Arthur. He added, "Actually, if the bill does go through, it might actually be to my advantage. I can go back to taking care of horses, which is what I love doing."

NZB NATIONAL SALE DRAWS TO A CLOSE

The broodmare session of New Zealand Bloodstock's National Weanling, Broodmare and Mixed Bloodstock Sale brought the three-day proceedings to a conclusion today, with two broodmares sharing top billing of NZ\$90,000 (US\$74,448).

The first through the ring was [lot 462](#), Centrefold Angel (NZ) (Centaine {Aus}--Our Kathleen {NZ}, by Decies), in foal to Darci Brahma (NZ) (Danehill) from the draft of Little Avondale Stud. The dam of multiple stakes winner and multiple graded stakes placed Marquardt (NZ) (Shamardal) was hammered down to Jeff Dimery's Uluru Stud, and was purchased as a future mating prospect to that operation's Group 1-winning Shamexpress (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}).

Just three lots later, listed winner Chickens (Aus) (Danehill--C'Yaontheotherside, by Hermitage) matched the session-topping price. Consigned by Haunui Farm, the dam of Group 3 winner Do You Think (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}) was purchased by Gordon Cunningham's Curraghmore Stud for a client of Coolmore Stud, and is set to be bred to Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) this year. She went through the ring as [lot 465](#).


The co-topper contributed to an aggregate of NZ\$1,026,900 for broodmares, for an average of NZ\$6,339 and a median of NZ\$1,600. The clearance rate for broodmares was 81%, with 36 (18%) RNAs.

In total over three days of selling, 458 horses grossed NZ\$3,873,000, for an average of NZ\$8,456 and a median of NZ\$2,250. The clearance rate was 79%, and the top price was NZ\$115,000, paid for a weanling colt by Savabeel (Aus) during the auction's second session. Last year's top price was NZ\$150,000, paid for a weanling by High Chaparral (Ire). The sale's overall leading buyer by aggregate was NZB as agent, which signed for 97 horses for NZ\$653,150, while Curraghmore Stud came out as top vendor, selling 20 head for NZ\$617,400.

"There was some good competition this week, particularly at the weanling session where buyers were reporting that it was hard enough to buy the ones they liked," said Petrea Vela, co-managing director of NZB. "As is usual with this sale, the quality and selection was wide and varied, but overall it has been encouraging to see good demand throughout, with the 79% clearance rate across the whole sale particularly pleasing."

WEANLING AND BLOODSTOCK SALE DATE MOVED

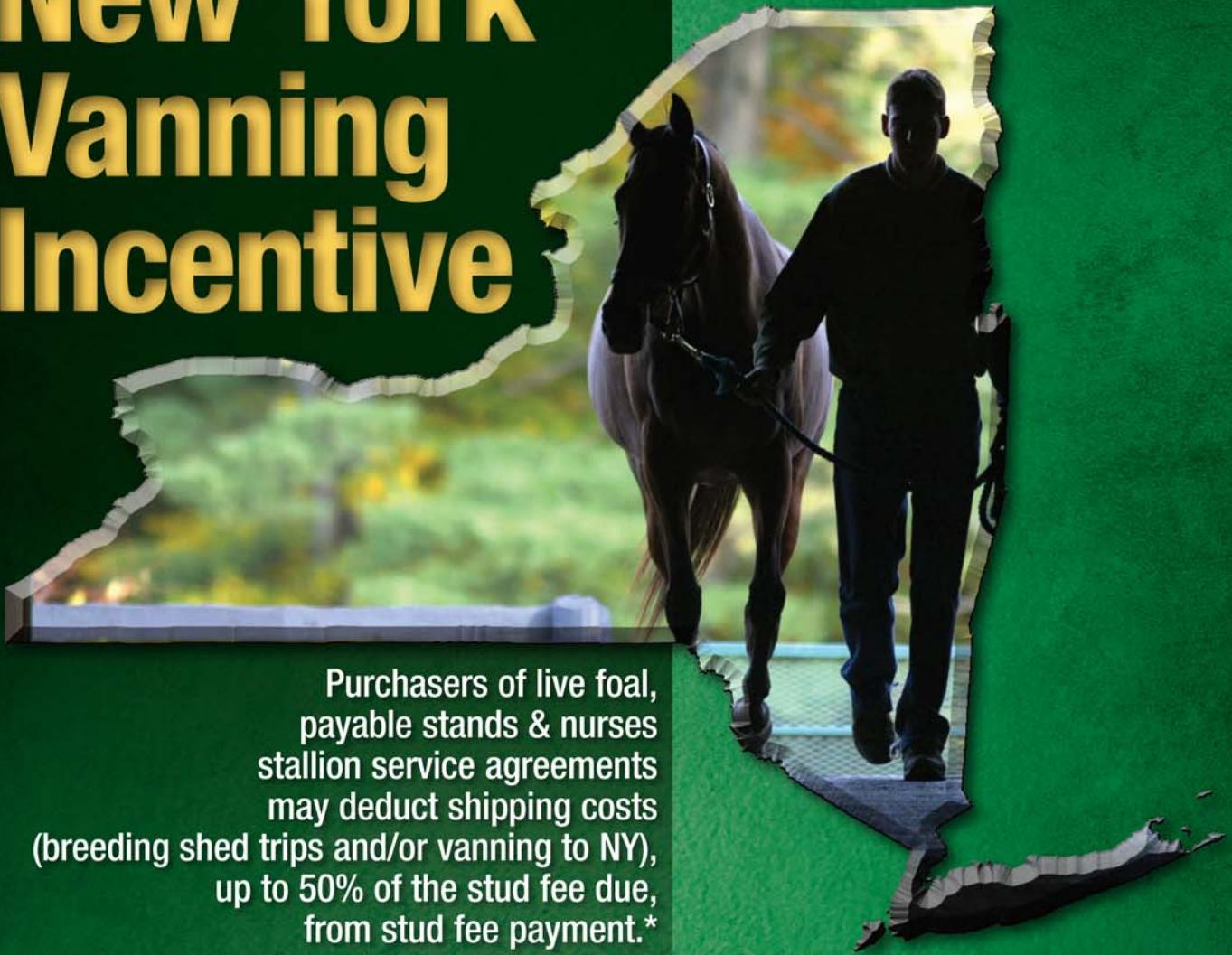
