## ORB WORK PLEASURES CONNECTIONS

GI Kentucky Derby winner **Orb** (Malibu Moon) tuned up for Saturday's GI Preakness S. with an effortless-looking four-furlong work in :47.18 Monday at Belmont Park. Orb completed his first quarter in :24.47 and galloped out five furlongs in :59.54.

Afterwards, trainer Shug McGaughey said he was thrilled with the work. "I thought it was nothing short of magnificent," McGaughey said. "He broke off very relaxed and finished up unbelievably, just on his own. I was shocked when I looked down at my watch and saw he worked from the eighth-pole to the wire in :11-and-change. He was covering the ground as good as a horse could cover it. He galloped out fine, dropped his head and walked home."

Orb's Derby week breeze drew plenty of rave reviews and yesterday's work drew favorable comparisons from McGaughey.

"All in all, I was just as impressed with this work as I was with the one in Louisville," the trainer commented. "It was a cool morning here and the track had a little bounce to it, because it had a little moisture in it from the rains over the weekend, and it was in terrific shape. But the way he went and the way he finished, well in hand, and came back, it was very, very visually impressive to me, and I couldn't be happier with what I saw."

Orb worked shortly after 6 a.m. He shipped out of Belmont at 10:20 and arrived at Pimlico shortly after 3 p.m. After grazing for 40 minutes, he was bedded down in Stall 40. Seeing his charge in the stall annually reserved for the Kentucky Derby winner, McGaughey said, "You can't believe how proud I am. I'm thrilled to be standing here right now. ## GOVERNOR CHARLIE SHARP

While minor physical issues kept **Governor Charlie** (Midnight Lute) out of the GI Kentucky Derby, the colt may have shown trainer Bob Baffert enough during a six-furlong work at Churchill Downs Monday to make it into Saturday's GI Preakness S. Working in company with graded-stakes winner Fed Biz (Giant's Causeway), Governor Charlie recorded splits of :11 4/5, :23 4/5, :35 and :58 1/5 and completed the six furlongs in 1:10 4/5 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:24 4/5. "He worked good enough to run," Baffert said. "I think today we caught up for the little time that we lost." The GIII Sunland Derby winner suffered a bruised hind foot in April and missed two works. Yesterday's work was his third since being sidelined. Baffert said a decision on Governor Charlie's participation in the Preakness would be made today. "I have to see how he comes out of it," Baffert said. "He went very, very well. That's a call that I have to make."

**LUKAS DUO WORK**

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas sent GI Kentucky Derby graduates **Oxbow** (Awesome Again) and **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) out to work four furlongs at Churchill Downs yesterday in advance of Saturday's GI Preakness S. Oxbow, sixth in the Derby, covered the distance in :49 4/5 with jockey Gary Stevens in the irons. The colt posted fractions of :12 3/5, :24 3/5 and :37 3/5 before galloping out five furlongs in 1:03 3/5.

"Time was not a factor and this was more about his mind and keeping him relaxed for the trip [to Maryland Tuesday]," Stevens explained. "The main thing is to keep him happy. I think I am sitting on the right horse with the right style."

Derby eighth-place finisher Will Take Charge went the same distance in :48 2/5, ticking off fractions of :12 3/5, :24 1/5 and :36. Jockey Mike Smith was aboard. Lukas's third Preakness contender **Titelown Five** (Tiznow) open galloped 1 1/4 miles with a blowout down the stretch.

"We varied them a bit, but it was pretty much what I wanted," Lukas said of Oxbow and Will Take Charge. "Coming off a tough race in the mud, the tendency sometimes is to do too much."

Stevens is expecting the Preakness to be a much different race than the Derby.

"I do not think the pace will be the same," Stevens said. "You may want to forgive some of the horses for their races in the Derby. I thought Goldencents [Into Mischief] would be with us on the lead and he was outside of us and getting all the kickback. At the five-eighths pole, I could see that Kevin [Kriger] was not comfortable and he could not go inside, because that is where I was, and he had two horses on his outside. I think you can throw that race out and I respect all of the opposition."

Lukas's trio is expected to ship to Pimlico early Tuesday morning.

**MYLUTE ON TRACK**

**Mylute** (Midnight Lute) worked a half-mile Monday at Churchill Downs in :49 3/5. Rosie Napravnik was in the irons as the colt worked through fractions of :12 4/5 and :24 4/5 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:04 2/5. "It was a good breeze and the track was in excellent shape," trainer Tom Amoss said. "This was similar to what he did before the GI Kentucky Derby, but just a bit faster, and I hope that is a product of him being ready to roll." Mylute will look to improve on a fifth-place Derby effort in Saturday's GI Preakness S.

## OBITUARIES

### NOEL O'CALLAGHAN DIES

One of the Irish bloodstock industry's leading lights, Noel O'Callaghan died Sunday night, aged 77, at his home in Shankill, County Dublin. A founding member of BBA Ireland, alongside the late Tom Cooper in the early 1960s, O'Callaghan served as chairman of that organization, and was instrumental in setting up its transport and insurance departments. Following Cooper's death in 1990, O'Callaghan took on a more prominent role as a bloodstock agent. He made an immediate impact when buying A.P. Indy for \$2.9 million at the 1990 Keeneland July Yearling Sale on behalf of the Japanese businessman Tomonori Tsurumaki. Hall of Fame trainer Neil Drysdale, who conditioned A.P. Indy, got to know O'Callaghan during the horse's career.

"Noel was a pleasure to work with during A.P. Indy's campaign, always being very supportive and lots of fun," Drysdale commented. "He was a delightful man, full of life and enthusiasm. Our thoughts are with his family at the moment. He will be sorely missed."

Bill Harrigan of Miacomet Farm, who broke and pre-trained A.P. Indy, as well as fellow O'Callaghan purchases A.P. Jet (Fappiano) and Japanese Champion Lindo Shaver (Alydar) for Tsurumaki, echoed Drysdale's sentiments.

"If you were lucky enough to have Noel as your friend, he was a man of very strong character, incredible loyalty and integrity, and he loved life and was a very fun man to be around," Harrigan said. He also praised O'Callaghan's horsemanship skills: "Noel was probably one of the best judges of racehorses ever," he said. "He not only had an incredibly keen eye for conformation, but Noel also had an instinct for a horse's personality and class."

Drysdale recognized O'Callaghan as a "pioneer" in developing relationships with the Japanese. Among his other accomplishments, O'Callaghan developed Green Gates Farm in Lexington, Kentucky for Japanese businessman Mitsuo Haga, and purchased G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Eclipse S. winner Kooyonga (Ire) (Persian Bold {Ire}) for Haga. O'Callaghan put Noel Murphy, now manager of Castle Park Farm, in charge of Green Gates at the farm's inception.

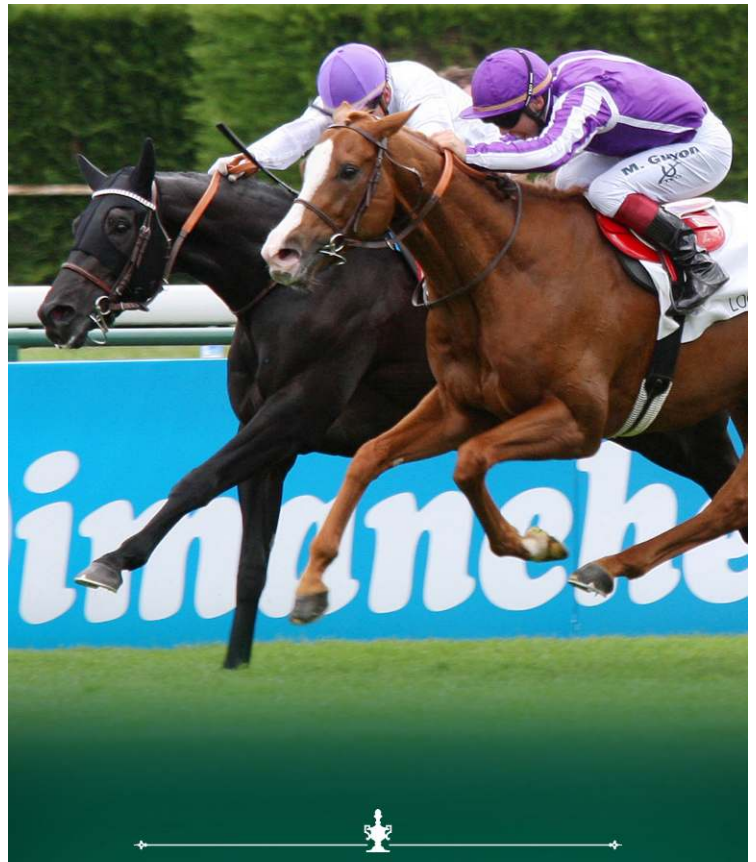
"Noel O'Callaghan put me into a managerial job at a very young age, and I respected it very much," said Murphy. "I had a great working relationship with him, and learned an awful lot from him."

O'Callaghan is survived by his wife Yvonne and daughters Elva, Annabelle and Nicola.

# BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS


## PERSISTENT THREAT

With his embarrassment of riches among his middle-distance sophomores, Andre Fabre seems only to have to saddle something in a Classic trial at present to collect and it is up to **Triple Threat (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}) to continue the streak in today's G3 Prix de Guiche at Chantilly. Since it was moved to this venue eight years ago, this race has become an ideal G1 Prix du Jockey Club prep and produced the winner of that 1 5/16-mile Classic in Lawman (Fr) in 2007. Team Valor's representative has already garnered one Derby trial for the stable, when ending the unbeaten run of the smart Sefri (Jazil) in the G3 Prix la Force over 10 furlongs at Longchamp last time Apr. 7. That performance was even more impressive due to the fact that he broke badly and lost vital ground and he sets a high standard here. Two unexposed types who could have the potential to challenge are His Highness The Aga Khan's **Dalwari** (More Than Ready) and Jean-Michel Hegeippe's **Spiritjim (Fr)** (Galileo {Ire}). The former has to improve off a latest third behind the useful Superplex (Fr) (Multiplex {GB}) in a 10-furlong conditions event at Longchamp Apr. 18, while the Pascal Bary-trained Spiritjim created an instant impression when taking a maiden over that same track and trip four days earlier. He veered left late on that day, but still won with plenty in hand and his conditioner is hoping he can build on that effort.

"He's a very nice horse who has no temperament, but when he saw the screen he went left," Bary explained. "He's a big colt and a baby. He is a very good mover and has a good character. He will eventually stay a mile and a half."

## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### CITYSCAPE HEADS LOCKINGE ENTRIES

Khalid Abdullah's **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk) yesterday featured among the 13 remaining entries for Saturday's G1 JLT Lockinge S. at Newbury. Trainer Roger Charlton is looking to revive the fortunes of the 7-year-old, who was so impressive when winning the G1 Dubai Duty Free last March. "It is challenging training a 7-year-old entire, as some can get idle and lazy at home and he's had his difficulties and issues along the way," Charlton told *PA Sport*. "It's been well documented that it hasn't been easy this winter, but he seems to have come to hand in the last few weeks. He certainly went exceptionally well fresh last year and he's been a remarkably consistent horse. He's run in seven countries and run up to form in each of them, with the odd exception. He has been frustratingly beaten on occasions, but he's always maintained his level of form. There is a chance now in the mile division." Godolphin is set to run **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}). "Any rain will help him," Saeed bin Suroor told *PA Sport*. "Good ground is safe for him, but he needs to run. Silvestre de Sousa will ride him, he rides him in the morning, so knows him well." Aidan O'Brien has left in a duo headed by G3 Diamond S. winner **Declaration of War** (War Front), while Sir Henry Cecil is set to saddle Ecurie Wildenstein's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Beauty Parlour (GB)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who won last year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches.

## Classic Corner

### Ocovango to Epsom...

Trainer Andre Fabre yesterday confirmed that **Ocovango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) will head to Epsom for the G1 Investec Derby June 1. Prince Faisal's unbeaten G2 Prix Greffulhe winner will be sent to the venue to cover the same ground as the stable's 2011 blue riband hero Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) at the "Breakfast with the Stars" press event next week. "He'll go to England and Pierre-Charles Boudot will ride him," Fabre told the *Racing Post*. "We'll do the same thing again with Ocovango and the jockey will come over, too. The race will tell us if he stays, but he's earned the right to run, so we're taking our chance."

### No Oaks for Hot Snap...

Khalid Abdullah's **Hot Snap (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) has been taken out of the May 31 G1 Epsom Oaks, connections announced yesterday. Following her disappointing effort when only ninth in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket last Sunday, the Sir Henry Cecil-trained G3 Nell Gwyn S. scorer will be given a break and has no immediate target. "Hot Snap's been taken out of the Oaks," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "We will give her a bit of time and try to get her back to speed. We will get her back working and see how she is before making any plans."

Having won his first sires' championship in 1990, Sadler's Wells had to give best to Caerleon the following year, but then the extraordinary Coolmore stallion reeled off an unprecedented sequence of 13 titles.

I was firmly of the opinion that it was highly unlikely that we would ever see such dominance again, but Sadler's Wells's son Galileo is making me wonder whether history could possibly be repeating itself. Having gained his first sires' championship in 2008, Galileo couldn't repeat the feat in 2009, but he has been champion sire in each of the last three seasons and last week's action suggests he has every chance of maintaining the sizeable lead he already holds on this year's Anglo-Irish list.

Of course the main threat to him could come from his own son New Approach, if Dawn Approach can add the G1 Derby to his G1 2000 Guineas victory.

Dawn Approach's position as hot favorite for the Derby could come under threat later this week if Galileo's son Telescope can justify his tall reputation in the main Derby trial, the G2 Dante S. Even now, it seems that Dawn Approach has only the Galileo squad to fear at Epsom. Opinions differ as to whether the position of second favorite for the Derby belongs to Telescope or to Battle of Marengo, who followed in Galileo's footsteps in winning Sunday's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial. **Cont. p8**

Next in the pecking order come two more Galileo colts in Mars, a respectable sixth in the 2000 Guineas on only his second appearance, and Ruler of the World, the half-brother to Duke of Marmalade who took the G3 Chester Vase by six lengths. Another Derby possible for Galileo is Magician, who is quoted at between 14-1 and 20-1 following his visually impressive victory in the G3 Dee S.

They weren't Galileo's only Classic contenders to draw attention to themselves last week. His previously unbeaten son Intello was the colt who put up the most eye-catching performance in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, when he managed to finish a close third despite a wide draw and plenty of trouble in running. Intello is therefore likely to take a lot of beating in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club. Galileo's daughter Secret Gesture also looked a potential Classic winner when she strolled home in the Lingfield Oaks Trial. Her display was so good that she is now challenging Galileo's G1 1000 Guineas third Moth for the position of favorite for the G1 Oaks.

It makes an enlightening exercise to see how Galileo's career has evolved over the years since his first 3-year-olds began to shine in 2006. That was the year Galileo's sons Sixties Icon, The Last Drop and Red Rocks completed the trifecta in the St Leger, with Red Rocks going on to win the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Galileo also enjoyed Classic success with Nighttime in the Irish 1000 Guineas and this crop also enjoyed notable success with the staying filly Allegretto, winner of the Goodwood Cup and Prix Royal-Oak as a 4-year-old.

Galileo's dominance in the St Leger, coupled with the fact that the dams of Red Rocks and Nighttime were talented sprinters, sowed the seeds that Galileo needs speed. This is patently untrue, as the broodmare sires of his highest-rated progeny include Caerleon, Silver Hawk, Erins Isle, Top Ville, Shirley Heights, Belmez, Darshaan, Slip Anchor, Rainbow Quest and Bering. Perhaps a more accurate statement would be to say that Galileo often needs speed to help him sire major winners over the more fashionable distances of a mile and a mile and a quarter.

The perception that Galileo does indeed need speed has seen a change in emphasis in the mares he covers.

When he covered his first mares in 2002, breeders clearly had no strong views as to which broodmare sires would bring out the best in him. The 126 foals in that crop had 96 different broodmare sires and the ones with multiple representatives included several top mile-and-a-half performers, such as Shirley Heights, Dancing Brave, Darshaan, Nashwan and Rainbow Quest.

Move on to 2009, when his current 3-year-olds were conceived, and markedly fewer individual broodmare sires are involved, even though the crop is a fair bit larger than its 2003 predecessor. I make it that the 153 foals have 74 different broodmare sires. You will still find the likes of Rainbow Quest, Shirley Heights and Nashwan among them, and there are no fewer than 13 members of this crop with dams by Darshaan, no doubt because Sadler's Wells had enjoyed such success with daughters of this Prix du Jockey-Club winner. The stakes winners from this cross, including the Irish St Leger and Prix du Cadran winner Alandi, the St Leger second Midas Touch and the St Leger third Michelangelo, have generally stayed well. The Dante S. favorite Telescope is one of the latest representatives of this cross, so, whatever he achieves at York, there is every chance that he will do even better over the Derby distance.

Despite the popularity of the Darshaan cross, the emphasis in the 2010 crop has moved much further down the distance scale. Out on his own with 24 members of this crop is Danehill, whose daughters had highlighted their potential by producing such as Teofilo, Cima de Triomphe and Cuis Ghaire. Needless to say, the Galileo--Danehill cross has since added the likes of Frankel, Golden Lilac, Roderic O'Connor, Maybe, Romantica and Noble Mission to their impressive tally. It is hardly surprising, therefore, that the 24 3-year-olds with Danehill dams include Secret Gesture and Intello.

Danehill Dancer's daughters have seven representatives, just one fewer than Storm Cat. The sprinter Indian Ridge has four, while Mr. Prospector has three (creating 4x2 inbreeding).

All three of Galileo's Derby trial winners last week represent the search for some speed. Ruler of the World is out of Love Me True, a mile winner by the Classic-winning miler Kingmambo. **Cont. p9**

Battle of Marengo, who had to do it the hard way at Leopardstown, is out of Anna Karenina, a representative of the same Green Desert--Mr. Prospector cross as those speedy performers Desert Lord, Bint Allayl and Kheleyf. Galileo's record with Green Desert mares confirms his excellence with granddaughters of Danzig. This cross's 15 foals also include Was, winner of the 2012 Oaks, and Lay Time, a Group 3 winner over a mile and a quarter.

An interesting aspect of Magician's pedigree is that he is out of a mare by Mozart, a short-lived son of Danehill. Magician's win makes Mozart the fourth son of Danehill to appear as broodmare sire of a group winner by Galileo, following Danewin (in Australia), Danehill Dancer and Desert King.

Although Mozart stayed a mile well enough to be second in the 2001 Irish 2000 Guineas, he proved much better suited by shorter distances, as he showed with his excellent victories in the G1 July Cup and G1 Nunthorpe S. Speed was also the main asset of his best progeny, such as the G1 Middle Park S. winner Amadeus Wolf and the durable Dandy Man (who has made a fast start as a stallion, with four early juvenile winners this year).

Magician's dam Absolutelyfabulous was bred to be a sprinter, as her dam was by the top sprinter Lake Coniston. Surprisingly she was tried over a mile and a quarter early in her career, but a drop back to sprint distances resulted in three victories and some useful form. Magician's second dam, Lady Windermere, is a half-sister to the dam of Henrythenavigator.

Theoretically there have to be some questions about whether Battle of Marengo and Magician will be as effective at a mile and a half as they are over a mile and a quarter--especially as Magician showed a bright turn of foot at Chester. There's some reassurance to be found in the fact that we have seen the likes of Red Rocks and Cape Blanco scotch similar doubts. We have also seen Galileo's considerable stamina help him sire Group 1 mile-and-a-half winners from daughters of the top sprinters Ahonoora and Anabaa, in addition to Danehill and Green Desert.

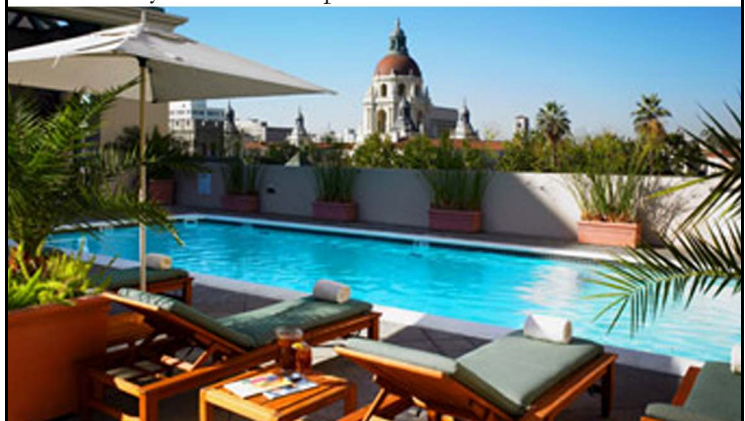

Mazameer has failed to sparkle since garnering the July 29 G3 Prix de Cabourg at Deauville and brought his juvenile career to a premature close with a sixth in the G1 Prix Morny back at the Normandy track three weeks later. He opened this term with a seventh to subsequent G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero Style Vendome (Fr) (Anabaa) going seven panels here in the Apr. 4 G3 Prix Djebel, and dropped to eighth when taking on the older generation in the Listed Prix Servanne going six furlongs here once more last time Apr. 23. Mazameer was sharp from the gate and raced on the front end after the initial strides of this task. Assuming outright command at halfway, he was stoked up when threatened with 350 meters remaining and was driven out late to hold the closing pack.

Campaigned as a homebred for Eduardo Cojuancgo's Gooree Stud, Your Song finished second to champion Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) in last year's G3 Run to the Rose S., defeating subsequent Group 1 winners All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}) and Epaulette (Aus) (Commands {Aus}). "He was an outstanding foal, probably the pick of all our foals, so we had always hoped he might develop into a sire prospect," said Gooree Stud Racing Manager Monica Barrera. "We are primarily breeders and the boss likes his stallions to be lightly raced when they go to stud, so now that Your Song has proved himself at Group 1 level against top class opposition, it's time to move on with the next phase of his career." Your Song will have two more starts, the G1 BRC Doomben 10,000 May 25 and the G1 BRC Stradbroke H. June 8.

### WATERHOUSE TO FIGHT CHARGES

The Racing New South Wales More Joyous Inquiry drew to a close yesterday, with owner John Singleton pleading guilty to two charges, and trainer Gai Waterhouse opting to fight her charges, according to published reports. Singleton publicly fired Waterhouse after his mare More Joyous (NZ) (More Than Ready) finished seventh of eight in the G1 All Aged S. at Randwick Apr. 27. He claimed that Waterhouse's bookmaker son Tom Waterhouse had told friends of his that Singleton's horse was "off" and would not win the All Aged. Tom Waterhouse denied the accusation, and an investigation deemed that he had received no privileged or inside information from his mother.

According to *Racenet.com.au*, Singleton's A\$15,000 fine was issued for "conduct prejudicial to the image, or interests, or welfare of racing," in relation to his public outburst at Randwick. Waterhouse pleaded not guilty to charges relating to her failure to inform Racing NSW stewards that More Joyous was sore in the neck in the lead up to the race, or that she had administered treatment to the mare.
