OXBOW CONFIRMED FOR BELMONT

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas headed back to Churchill Downs early Sunday morning with his nine-horse contingent that included G1 Preakness S. winner **Oxbow** (Awesome Again), who will train at Churchill for the next few weeks before vanning up to contest the G1 Belmont S. June 8. "I was trying to be politically correct all week, but I

thought [Oxbow] was the toughest horse," the Hall of Famer said of the 15-1 shot's run in the Classic. "I thought if there was some adversity or something went wrong, he had the best chance to overcome." **Cont. p3**

ATTACK IN SINGAPORE

For all that he has achieved in his many years at the track, the one glaring omission for trainer John Moore was the lack of a Group 1 on foreign soil. Not only was he able to cross that off his bucket list with **Military Attack (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire})'s emphatic score in Sunday's SAI Cup, but he also saddled G1 Champions Mile hero **Dan Excel (Ire)** (Shamardal) to an outstanding runner-up effort. "I've finally got the icing on the cake! I've been trying to win this race for years and I've finally done it," said the 63-year-old, nearing compulsory retirement in Hong Kong and who saddled the two most recent runners-up in this event Irian (Ger) (Tertullian) in 2011 and Zaidan (Street Cry {Ire}) last year. Formerly trained in Europe as Rave, Military Attack has really come to hand this year, with a breakthrough win in the January Cup at Happy Valley and a defeat of two-time G1 Hong Kong Cup hero California Memory (Highest Honor {Fr}) in the Hong Kong Gold Cup the following month. After proving narrowly best under top weight of 133 pounds in the Premier Plate H. Mar. 24, he completed his ascent to the top with a 10-1 upset in the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup Apr. 28. While winners of that event like Presvis (GB) (Sakhee) have pressed on to this, Military Attack was looking to become the first to complete the double and did so with complete authority. **Cont. p5**

F-T MIDLANTIC SALE STARTS TODAY

The juvenile sales have been setting records all season long and the show moves to Maryland Monday when the two-day Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale kicks off at 10 a.m. in Timonium. "I am very optimistic that we'll have a very good marketplace," commented Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "The market has been very strong all spring and all indications from pre-sale activity, in terms of the breeze show and the crowd here [at the barns] looking at horses the last three days, have all been positive."

The Midlantic sale sits on a geographic crossroads that makes it an ideal location to attract horsemen from several racing districts, many of them with regional programs bolstered by slots-infused purses.

"Within a four-hour drive from Timonium, Maryland, you feed a number of racing jurisdictions and the diversity of buyers has always been an important component of this sale," Browning said. "We see faces here from New York, from California, from Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia and Kentucky. And there are several Korean groups here ready to buy horses, so we'll have an international flavor, too."

Consignor Nick de Meric has participated in juvenile sales this spring in California, Florida and Kentucky, but he admitted the Maryland market will bring new faces to the buying bench.

"It does have a good geographical lure because it is within reach of so many racetracks, and of course, New York, and as the focus shifts more to the northeast, this sale is right in the right spot for it," de Meric said. **Cont. p 11**

OXBOW CONFIRMED FOR BELMONT (cont from p1)

Another poignant moment occurred after the Preakness between Lukas and fellow trainer Bob Baffert, who sent out eight-place finisher **Governor Charlie** (Midnight Lute).

"Over the years a lot of people thought that Baffert and I had a rivalry, when actually we come from pretty similar backgrounds and we're pretty good friends," Lukas said. "It was really significant yesterday when he came down and congratulated me right after the race. A mutual friend of ours said that when his horse didn't look like he was getting it done at the half-mile pole, Bob and a friend were jumping up and down and saying: 'Go get 'em, Lukey.'"

GI Kentucky Derby hero **Orb** (Malibu Moon), who finished a disappointing fourth Saturday, boarded a van bound for New York Sunday morning.

"He came out of it fine," trainer Shug McGaughey said of the Janney and Phipps colorbearer. "He's sound. Physically, everything is fine. We'll get him up the road and evaluate the situation to see where we'll go. I want to see him bounce back and see his soundness level and his energy level. I think there are a lot of good wins down the road for him."

Although the race didn't turn out as McGaughey had hoped, he has no excuses for the performance. "The racetrack was probably deep down the inside there," he stated. "There was a lot of throwback. We couldn't get to the outside. I thought he was in good position and [jockey Joel Rosario] took him to the right position, and all of a sudden he had no horse. Why that was, I don't know. I think it wasn't our day and it was Oxbow's day."


McGaughey isn't letting Orb's lackluster Preakness take any shine away from his Derby victory.

"Winning the Derby was my lifelong dream," McGaughey explained. "We won it. I would have loved to win [Saturday] to take it to the next level, so I do appreciate how tough it is. If I have the opportunity again [to compete in the Derby], I may cherish it even more, because I've seen how tough it is to get it done. Maybe, I do appreciate how tough it is to win more. As brilliant as we were two weeks ago, we weren't as brilliant yesterday."

Preakness runner-up **Itsmyluckyday** (Lawyer Ron) exited the race "on a 1-to-10 scale [as a] 10 plus," according to trainer Eddie Plesa, Jr. "I wouldn't take anything away from Wayne's horse, but they went the half in 48-and-change," he said of the trip. "That's pretty much walking. Did that help his horse? Absolutely. Did it hurt my horse? Absolutely. I won't say anything other than: 'I wish the pace would have been quicker.' Everybody was throwing him out [in the Preakness] because he couldn't get the distance and he ran a lousy race [in the Derby]. I hate to use slop as an excuse, but it was a valid excuse. We all knew that. Not for us, but for other people, [his effort Saturday] validates his ability." As for the Belmont S., "It's 50-50 at best. The [GI] Haskell [S. July 28] is on my list. God willing, that's a certainty."

Mylute (Midnight Lute)'s rallying third-place effort pleased trainer Tom Amoss. "Upon reflection, I think my horse ran the best race of his career," Amoss said. "The slow pace was impossible for us to overcome and yet he still ran a very good race. I don't know where the rest of the speed went in yesterday's Preakness. It looked like there was quite a bit on paper, but it just didn't materialize." Amoss said of Oxbow's performance, "It was a masterful job. As far as Wayne is concerned, you've got to tip your hat to him. Over the last year he's made a remarkable comeback and put himself where he used to be, which is at the top of the trainers' charts." Future plans for Mylute are undecided. "Nothing is on the board right now," Amoss explained. "I'll get together with the owners at the beginning of the week and we'll discuss what to do. He's had two races close together and I think that's going to be taken into account when we have that conversation." **cont. p4**

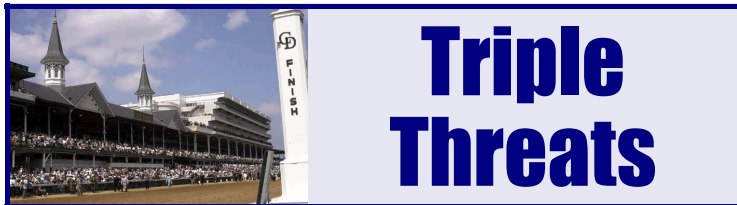




Preakness Wrap-Up cont.

Although trainer Doug O'Neill had been considering sending GI Santa Anita Derby winner **Goldencents** (Into Mischief) to the Belmont, after his fifth-place effort in the Preakness, plans have changed. "It doesn't make sense to go on to the Belmont," O'Neill said. "We had talked prior [to the race] that if we didn't run huge and came out of it great, we wouldn't come back in three weeks. Even though I'm very proud of him and the way [jockey] Kevin [Kriger] rode him, I just don't think coming back in three weeks off that effort is the right move. We'll relax and see what's in the cards five, six, seven weeks down the road. You've got the 3-year-old series on the turf down at Del Mar, so we could possibly try a different surface with him or we could go over him good, train him out there and then look for races like the Haskell or [GI] Travers [S. Aug. 24] somewhere down the road. We'll huddle up with the owners and put together a game plan. He's a good horse. You'll be hearing from him."

Departing (War Front), who finished sixth, will not be heading to the Belmont, according to trainer Al Stall, Jr. "He's fine," said stall. "But he cooled out very tired."




Pletcher Outlines Belmont Candidates...

After sitting out Saturday's GI Preakness S., trainer Todd Pletcher has a strong arsenal of possible contenders for the GI Belmont S. June 8. The list includes **Palace Malice** (Curlin), 12th after setting the pace in the GI Kentucky Derby; GI Louisiana Derby hero and Derby third **Revolutionary** (War Pass), and Mike Repole's trio of GI Arkansas Derby winner and Derby 11th **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union); multiple graded stakes winner and GI Kentucky Oaks third **Unlimited Budget** (Street Sense); and **Micromanage** (Medaglia d'Oro).

"We have a few candidates, but we haven't firmed up the lineup just yet," Pletcher said Sunday. "Overanalyze breezed this morning (four furlongs in :47.50 over the Belmont training track) and breezed well. We are planning to run him. Revolutionary will have two breezes starting next Sunday. We plan to run him. Mike Repole is going to be the key to how many other horses we run. He has several possibilities. Unlimited Budget breezed this morning (four furlongs in :49.07 over the Belmont training track), and she is possible. Micromanage is here and will breeze next Sunday, and we'll make a decision after that."

- Neatly drawn here in four, the 5-year-old was close up early, but then eased back to a share of fifth, three back on the fence. Flax (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}) led into the backstretch, but was soon confronted by favored Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}), last-out winner of the G1 Prix Ganay, who circled rivals and went forward to apply some pressure. Dan Excel was also never far away, but Military Attack was always traveling for Zac Purton, and as they approached the stretch, it was really just a question of when and where the running room would materialize. The seas parted, and, as has become his trademark, he exploded away from his rivals and was very much in hand in the final 50 yards. Dan Excel held for second from Mawingo, while Pastorius finished ahead of only Flax. And there may be bigger and better ahead for the winner. "I would now love to send him to the 2040-meter G1 Cox Plate [2040m] in October in Australia," said Moore. "I know it's tough with the two weeks [quarantine] at Werribee, but he has shown he could travel. And the Cox Plate would be nice as I would love nothing more than to win a group race in my own country." The other disappointment of the race was Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who was well back early and could do no better than eighth.

In three previous trips to Japan and another to Dubai, Lucky Nine hadn't met with the greatest fortune, each time encountering trouble to dash his chances. The 2011 G1 Hong Kong Sprint hero finally got that monkey off his back with a dominating victory to get the night off on a high note for Hong Kong. Fifth in the G1 Sprinters' S. at Nakayama Sept. 30, the Darley-bred bounced back to win the G2 Jockey Club Sprint at Sha Tin Nov. 18, but was only fifth to Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) in defense of his Hong Kong Sprint crown Dec. 9. He filled that same spot behind 1000-meter specialist Eagle Regiment (Aus) (El Moxie) in the Centenary Sprint Cup Jan. 27, but was back to his best with a strong win in the Chairman's Sprint Prize over 1200 meters Feb. 17. Fourth to Horse of the Year Ambitious Dragon (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) in a salty renewal of the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup going seven panels Mar. 17, he was exiting a seventh in the Sprint Cup Apr. 28, but was found to have bled significantly. Trainer Caspar Fownes decided to set him for this race in spite of the climate and he was sent off the third choice behind local Horse of the Year Super Easy.

One of the first to leave, Lucky Nine was gathered up to race in third behind dueling pacesetters early on, as Super Easy was further back in midfield. Brett Prebble, successful in this with Sacred Kingdom (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) in 2009, pulled his mount out into the clear leaving the quarter pole, but soon had a race on his hands, as Super Easy laid it down entering the final furlong. But the favorite couldn't get to Lucky Nine, who pulled well clear, as Australia's Bel Sprinter grabbed second on the line. "The pressure on me after his last run where he had blood in his trachea was quite heavy," said Fownes. "Having to travel him here and then get him to perform at his top, the pressure was right on. This means a lot to us to come here and win on international soil. We'll put him away now and we'll look forward to the next season." Emerald Hill (Sharp Humor), who argued the early pace, dropped jockey Jose Verenzuela nearing the 200-meter mark and was diagnosed with ruptured distal sesamoidian ligaments on his near-fore, according to the stewards' post-race report. It was the third win in five years for Hong Kong, which was represented by Green Birdie (NZ) (Catbird {Aus}) in 2010.

DRAGONS, BELLES & TWO SUPERB VICTORIES

The Singapore International Raceday promised much and delivered even more. With one of the strongest fields ever assembled for the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup and a cocktail of well-performed international sprinters for the G1 KrisFlyer International

Club once again did not disappoint. A colorful dragon with beguiling eyes and a mouth that breathed fire led the parade to the sound of drumbeats. With the drums increasing in tempo, sweeping the crowd into a frenzy, the Turf Belles came out carrying the flags of the KrisFlyer International Sprint and the Singapore Airlines International Cup.

Maybe it was the heat, the crowd or the noise, but inexplicably several of the runners decided that loading was definitely not on the cards. **Dasher Go Go (Jpn)** (Sakura Bakushin O {Jpn}) unceremoniously deposited jockey Umberto Rispoli on the ground, and it took a couple of attempts to get the big bay loaded. Several of the horses also needed hoods in order to coax them into the barriers and with the field waiting patiently, it came as no surprise that **Bel Sprinter (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) did not jump on terms when the gates finally opened.

Kranji is a course with a short run in, and lagging at the rear of the field Bel Sprinter was soon in trouble. Turning for home it was the seasoned Hong Kong sprinter **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) who stormed into the lead from barrier four. Yet all was not smooth sailing as **Emerald Hill** (Sharp Humor), caught midfield on the rail, broke down, catapulting Jose Verenzuela onto the turf and under the feet of the closest horses.

Up front, however, there was no stopping Lucky Nine, and Brett Prebble stood tall in the stirrups as he started celebrating well before the line. Bel Sprinter made all in the run in and was certainly not disgraced in second, with the crowd favorite, the Singapore sprinter **Super Easy (NZ)** (Darci Brahma{NZ}) in third.

It may not have been the year of the dragon, but could the colorful dragon have been the lucky omen that the Hong Kong horses needed? Could either **Military Attack (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) or Dan Excel (Ire) (Shamardal) win the Cup? G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup winner Military Attack was on a three-race winning

streak, and his morning antics that had so entertained the track watchers was also an indication that he was fresh and raring to go. After Military Attack's final trackwork Saturday, trainer John Moore had quietly admitted

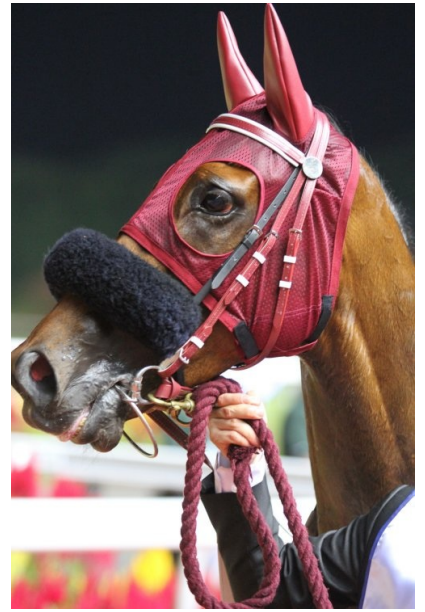
that the gelding was ready and that he truly believed Military Attack could win. The punters disagreed, with the Prix Ganay winner Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) being all the rage. As the field turned for home, however, it was the emerald green colors of Military Attack that burst out of the pack. Thundering up the straight under Zac Purton, there was no stopping Military Attack. The gap widened, surprising even Purton, who threw a glance over his shoulder in disbelief. In the end, the official margin was 3 1/4 lengths, with stable companion Dan Excel in second and Mawingo (Ger) (Tertullian) a short head in third. Moore, celebrating his first international Group 1, was fittingly given the honors of popping the cork on the celebratory bottle of champagne. It is unlikely that here was a happier man on course as the spray flew over the crowd.

It may have been the Singapore Turf Club's biggest raceday, but it completely belonged to Hong Kong. Their stars came, they saw and they conquered in devastating style, leaving the dreams of many an international contender in tatters. Tomorrow life carries on--another race, another country--but just for tonight, time will stand still in celebration of two great horses and two glorious victories.

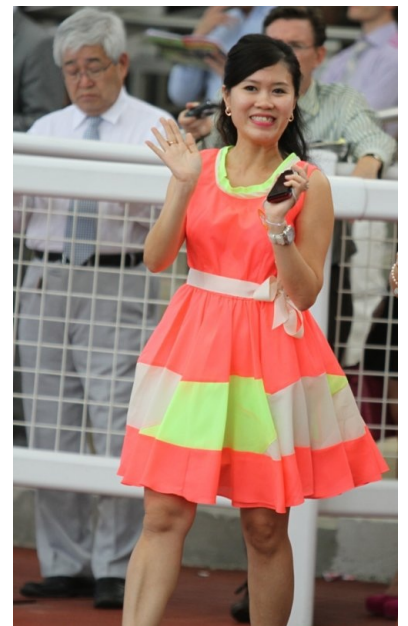
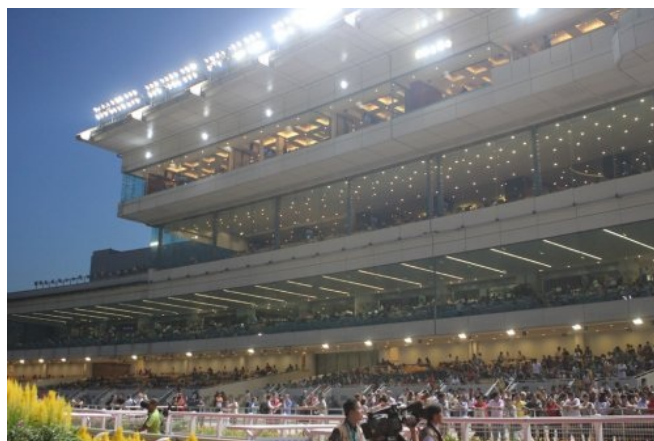


Military Attack and Jockey Zac Purton

Meisho Mambo failed to fire in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) in her last outing Apr. 7, finishing a flat 10th behind the re-opposing Ayusan (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), but she appeared to relish the added distance of this contest, storming down the middle of the track to collect her first victory at the highest level. Debuting in a lofty spot in the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies S. Dec. 9, Meisho Mambo finished 10th behind Robe Tissage (Jpn) (War Emblem). Returning in the Kobai S. at Kyoto Jan. 14, she was a much-improved second, and put it all together to graduate next out in allowance company Feb. 16. She recorded her first black-type victory three weeks later in the G2 Hoshi Hai Fillies' Revue S. at Hanshin prior to contesting the Oka Sho. Let go at 27-1 for this step up in distance, Meisho Mambo established a ground-saving position on the fence while traveling midpack through the opening stages. Swinging out to the middle of the track for running room at the top of the stretch, the winner came with a strong rally when she saw daylight, hitting the lead inside the final 200 meters and holding off a stubborn Ever Blossom.

31, she finished third, but was promoted to second. The second choice broke widest here and rated towards the back of the pack down through the opening exchanges. She steadily moved up to the outside of the field exiting the backstretch, caught up to free wheeling leader Leigh Court (Grand Slam) at the top of the lane and pulled away to finish under a hand ride. "She's a great little filly, very honest," said winning trainer Brian Lynch. "[Jockey] Luis [Contreras] got to work her during the week as she's not long up from Keeneland. I think he was very confident after that work and rode her very nicely today. She's very versatile, looks like the Poly and the turf...that's her number."

Trainer Stefano Botti saddled a quintet in this Classic and three of them managed to fill the trifecta and complete a memorable achievement for the son and nephew of the legendary Alduino and Giuseppe. Biz the Nurse had flopped when tried in Pattern company at two, finishing fifth after a slow start in the G3 Premio Guido Berardelli over nine furlongs here at the start of November, but had looked a different proposition on his successful return in the Listed Premio Botticelli over 1 5/16 miles here Apr. 28. Settled in mid-division throughout the early stages, the bay was sent to the lead with over two furlongs to race by the visiting Andrea Atzeni and drew clear of his barnmates Wish Come True and Ancient King with the field strung out behind.

Altano's staying power was advertised with wins in the San Siro's G3 St Leger Italiano in 2011, in this race 12 months ago and in the G3 Deutsches St Leger at Dortmund in September. Last seen finishing a short-head second in the latest renewal of the St Leger Italiano in September, the bay showed he retained his ability despite his advancing years to book a possible ticket to the June 20 G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot. Anchored in the rear early, he was angled out from the rail at the end of the back straight and gradually wore down his stable companion and the long-time leader Earl of Tinsdal and Supersonic Flight in the final 50 yards.

Coming to the fore on his latest start when registering a first black-type success in this venue's Listed Premio Signorio over nine furlongs Apr. 28, Romantic Wave showed that this trip holds no fears with a convincing follow-up. In front initially before taking a lead, the dark bay was sent back to the front approaching the quarter pole and dominated proceedings from there.

Taking on the older sprinters at this early stage of the season is often difficult for the sophomore brigade and Victory Laurel had not looked an obvious candidate for these type of honors when beaten on his first five starts at two. Campaigned exclusively at this track so far, the bay registered a breakthrough win on the all-weather at the end of the year and followed that with a third placing and a win in conditions events over this trip Apr. 5 and Apr. 19, respectively. Held up early, he met traffic as Salvatore Sulas searched for an escape route, but swamped Rosendhal when in the clear in the final 100 yards.

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

THE BLUE TRAIN TO COLOGNE

Godolphin may have endured a testing period of late, but their representatives are making waves on the track and **Tawhid (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) bids to continue the racing offensive in today's G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen at Cologne. While he was never a factor when last of four in a strong renewal of the G3 Craven S. on his seasonal bow over this trip at Newmarket Apr. 18, he is better judged by his prior performance when scoring by four lengths in heavy ground in Newbury's G3 Horris Hill S. over seven furlongs in October. "Tawhid needs soft ground to be at his best," trainer Saed bin Suroor commented. "He showed at Newbury last year that he is a different horse with some cut underfoot. He worked very well on Wednesday and I am very happy with him, but the ground is the key for him." If the ground is not in his favor, there are several who will seek to take advantage including last year's G1 Gran Criterium winner **Law Enforcement (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}). He was not disgraced when fifth attempting to make all in the Mar. 30 G2 UAE Derby on Tapeta and switched back to turf. This renewal looks booked for export to Britain and another due respect from that country is Prince Faisal's impressive Kempton maiden winner **String Theory (Ire)** (Medicean {GB}). Trainer Marco Botti has taken the significant step of sending him straight into Pattern company on the back of that six-length score over this trip on the Polytrack at the start of the month.

"And it does give us a chance to get some horses in front of a slightly different crowd," continued de Meric. "Although, of course we see a lot of the same faces, but there are still some local people that we don't see at other sales."

Niall Brennan is another consignor looking forward to a diverse buying bench.

"Quite often you'll see people buy here who aren't at the other sales," Brennan explained. "They wait for this sale in this area, so there is new money. And it gets spread out pretty well here, but I think the better horses always sell very well in this market."

Consignor Eddie Woods agreed.

"This is a place where we see guys who go to no other 2-year-old sales," he explained. "The pros are here, too, the guys that go to every 2-year-old sale. And there is a lot of racing up here and a great cross-section of racing. From the very good, to the people just making a living with horses, and they come here to find their stock. This will be a very healthy sale."

Healthy has been a good way to describe results from the juvenile sales so far this year. The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's April sale proved a resounding success, with the average up 39% and the median up 29%. Action moved back to California last week for the Barretts May Sale, which saw the average up 28% and the median up 30%. Woods looks for similar results in Timonium.

"The select sales were a little tricky because they are only top end and that's the only money that shows up," he said. "But then, when we went to the open sales--OBS April was the most amazing sale I've ever participated in--it was amazing. The Barretts sale last week was a very good sale. It took a few hips to warm up, and then it got going and it was very good."

Woods has seen plenty of action at his Timonium barn.

"We've been very busy here," he said Sunday. "The amount of shows we did on Friday and Saturday was pretty impressive, compared to what we've done in other years."

Al Pike was another consignor who has been kept busy at the Maryland State Fairgrounds this past weekend.

"I've had more shows and more vet work earlier than ever before, so I'm thinking, not only do we have a good group, but there is a real hunger for horses," Pike said. "I think a good horse is good property right now and everybody wants one."

Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, which topped both the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale and OBS April sale with sons of Bernardini, makes its final stop of the 2013 juvenile sales season in Timonium. The sale's later date on the calendar is a major plus, according to Randy Hartley.

"A lot of horses that we buy are later foals and kind of have to get pushed back because you don't want to hurt them just to try to get them sold," Hartley explained. "So this is a nice spot to come that you can sell a horse for good money and you can bring a horse here that you gave good money for and feel like you're ok. We've always done really well here. There aren't as many horses here as in prior years and I think that could help the sale, because there are less horses and there seems to be a lot of nice horses here, so supply and demand will kick in."

A total of 425 juveniles were catalogued for the two-day auction, but 119 had already been scratched as of Sunday afternoon. During last year's Midlantic sale, 313 head sold for \$16,871,000. The average of \$53,901 was up 14% from 2011 figures, while the median rose 12% to \$28,000.

EISAMAN IN A MARYLAND STATE OF MIND

Graduates of Shari and Barry Eisaman's Eisaman Equine enjoyed a standout few days at Pimlico. In addition to GI Preakness S. runner-up **Itsmyluckyday** (Lawyer Ron), the Florida operation saw graduates win three stakes races at Old Hilltop. The weekend started off Friday with **Fiftyshadesofhay** (Pulpit)'s win in the GI Black-Eyed Susan S. and **I'm Mom's Favorite** (Indian Charlie)'s victory in the Miss Preakness S. It continued Saturday with **Zee Bros** (Brother Derek) win in the Chick Lang S.

"Pimlico was very good to us this weekend," confirmed Barry Eisaman. "We were at the races, I took a lot of our crew over, we went to the stakes barn and walked over with Itsmyluckyday. And of course, we had **Governor Charlie** (Midnight Lute), who we broke. He didn't have his best day, but we had two interests in the Preakness."

Back to work on Sunday at the Timonium sales grounds, Eisaman admitted it was gratifying to watch graduates of his program have success.

"It is really satisfying," he said. "Of course, we want the horses that we handle to do well for the people that own them or buy them from us. We don't have a lot of weekends like that, but we have lots of high-quality stakes horses that come through and we're really happy for our customers."

Eisaman hopes the Maryland mojo continues with the farm's 24-horse Fasig-Tipton Midlantic consignment.

"I think it is going to be a really good sale," he said. "The market is good right now. We have a nice load of horses. We've been extremely busy showing horses, so I look forward to a good couple days."

The Timonium sale is the only out-of-town engagement for Eisaman Equine, which was the leading consignor at the OBS April sale.

"At this sale, there are the professional buyers who go to all the sales, but you also have here a lot of regional, Midlantic trainers and owners that come here and we don't see them come to Florida," Eisaman explained. **cont. p12**

"We try to bring some of the regional state-bred horses that we have to this sale, the New York-breds, the Pennsylvania and Jersey-breds and they are pretty popular. We even have a West Virginia-bred in this group. It's all really close and [horsemen] can get in their car and drive here."

Eisaman added the sale's late date is another enticement.

"With this sale's placement in the calendar in late May, people are getting in the mood to restock their racing stable," he said. "Green grass is growing, the birds are singing, the Preakness is here, you might as well buy some horses."

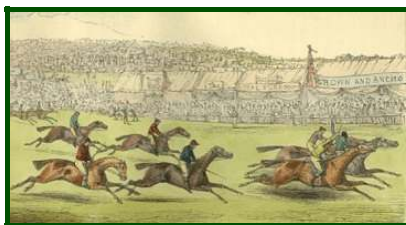

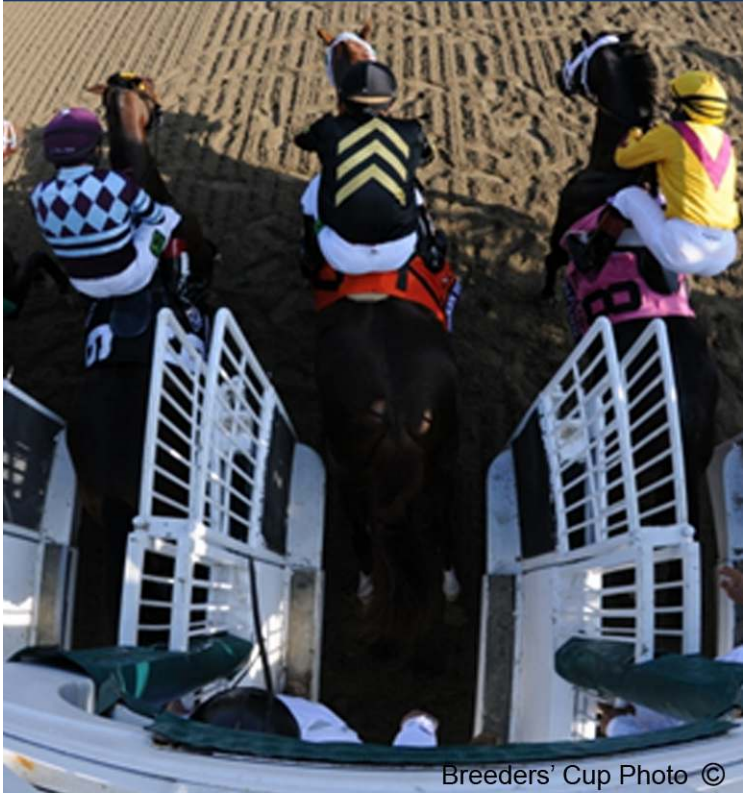
