## NUMBERS UP AT FASIG MIDLANTIC OPENER

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale got off to a solid start Monday in Timonium, with figures up across the board as compared to last year's opening session. A total of 121 juveniles sold for \$7,235,000. The average was \$59,793--up 27% from 2012 when 156 horses sold for \$7,342,500 and averaged \$47,067. The median rose 18.5% to \$32,000 from \$27,000 last year.

"We are thrilled with the results," said Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sales Director Paget Bennett. "We had great turnout. We had good activity at the barns, we had two good breeze shows and we had positive feedback on what was here."

The buy-back rate was 17.7%, down from 25.7% during last year's opening session. And action was solid

across the board, according to Bennett. "There is something here for everybody," she said.

Six horses topped the \$200,000 mark, with trainer Nick Zito securing the session-topping Unbridled's Song colt for \$330,000 on behalf of Joe Moss. At the sale's 2012 opening session, only three horses sold for \$200,000 or more, with top price of \$575,000.

The Midlantic sale continues Tuesday at 10 a.m.

## KENNY NOE JR. DIES AT 84

Kenny Noe, Jr., former New York Racing Association president, CEO, and chairman, died Sunday night after a long illness. He was 84. A Hamilton, Ohio native, Noe worked as a racing secretary and steward at NYRA in the 1970s before serving as Calder Race Course's president and general manager from 1979 to 1990. He left Calder to become NYRA's president and general manager in 1994 at a time in which the association was involved in a struggle with New York Governor Mario Cuomo over the State's racing structure and revenue distribution. Noe was elevated to chairman of the NYRA board of trustees in 1995 and was named chairman and CEO in 1996. He resigned from his post at NYRA in October of 2000. Noe, who hailed from a racing family, worked in various positions at more than a dozen tracks during his career, including Hialeah, Garden State Park, Arlington Park and Washington Park. He also previously served as a director at the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, Thoroughbred Racing Associations, Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau and the Miami Heart Institute. He is survived by son Jeff, Gulfstream Park's racing secretary, and daughter Holly. Funeral arrangements have not yet been announced.

## MORE POSITIVES FROM AL ZAROONI TESTS

The British Horseracing Authority yesterday released the details of their investigation into the horses in the care of Godolphin trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni, with last year's G1 St Leger hero **Encke** (Kingmambo) the main name among seven further positive tests for anabolic steroids.

Following the round of stringent testing carried out at Moulton Paddocks, the banned substance stanozolol was discovered in the high-profile group headed by that Doncaster Classic winner and which also includes the Pattern-race

performers **Genius Beast** (Kingmambo), **Energizer** (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), **Steeler** (Ire) (Raven's Pass) and **Zip Top** (Ire) (Smart Strike). All seven, who now bring the total horses in the scandal to 22, are barred with immediate effect from racing until Oct. 29. The ruling body also stated that despite the findings, Encke had not tested positive for any prohibited substances in his post-race test at Doncaster, where he denied Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) the coveted Triple Crown. The BHA also announced that testing at the other Godolphin yard of Saeed bin Suroor returned no positive results for banned substances. Cont. p3

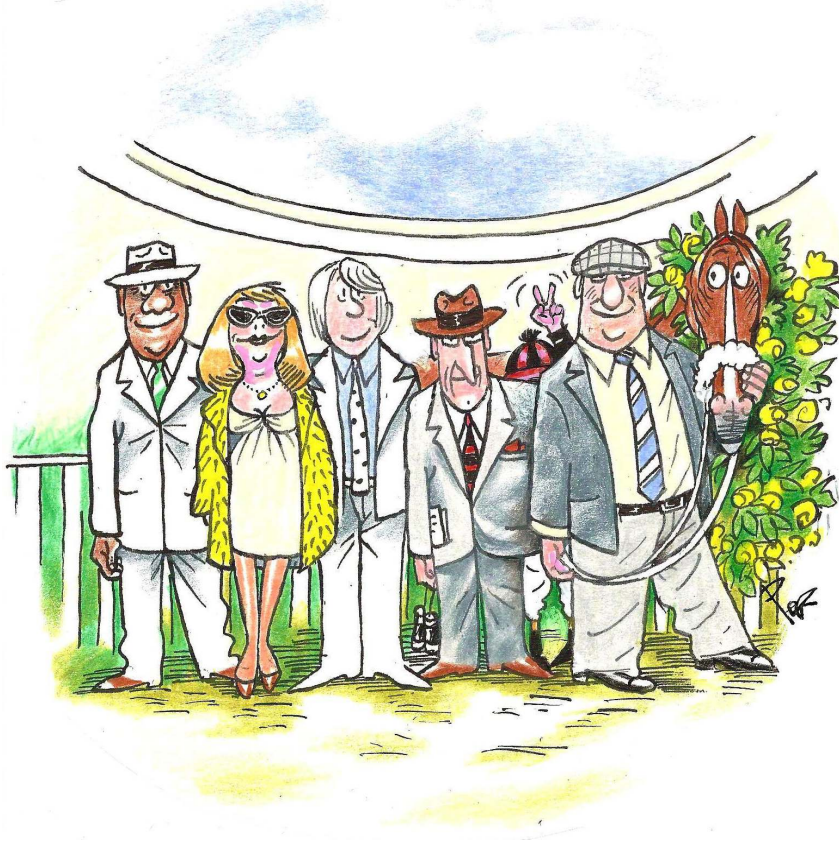

**AL ZAROONI cont. from p1**

“These test results endorse the swift action and measures taken by the BHA in this matter,” Paul Bittar, chief executive of the BHA, said. “Whatever the outcome of his appeal before the independent Appeal Board, the gravity and scale of the infringements warranted Mahmood Al Zarooni being removed from control of the yard as quickly as possible. We welcome the news that Saeed bin Suroor’s horses tested negative and this clears the way for him to now take charge of Moulton Paddocks.”

Following the handing out of his eight-year suspension, Al Zarooni announced that he is to appeal the length of the ban and that is expected to be heard in late June.

Adam Brickell, director of integrity, legal and risk for the BHA, added, “We will not be taking any separate action in respect of these additional positive results whilst Mr. Al Zarooni’s appeal process is on-going. In the meantime, the latest findings from HFL Sport Science will form the subject of

further interviews as part of the BHA’s continuing investigation. From the outset, one of the aims of the investigation, in addition to trying to understand the environment within which such serious breaches came to be committed, has been to identify what measures are needed to ensure the yard operates in accordance with the rules in future. The findings will be shared with Godolphin and will also assist the BHA with regard to the future licensing of the yard.”

Bin Suroor, whose Farhh (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) provided the boys in blue with a welcome boost when winning Saturday’s G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury, commented, “I’m happy that my stable is clear. I said before, the BHA can come any time they like, I’ve got absolutely nothing to hide. Ever since we started, everything has gone in the books. I knew 100% that they wouldn’t find anything and now everybody else knows the same.” Bin Suroor will take over the training of the remainder of the Moulton Paddocks horses who are clear to continue racing. “It will be very busy, but it will only be temporary,” he said. “It will be just for a few weeks until we get somebody else in.”

Godolphin’s Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, “It is obviously very disappointing that seven further horses have tested positive for stanozolol. These results highlight why H. H. Sheikh Mohammed took the decision to lock down the stables at Moulton Paddocks until every Godolphin horse in training at Newmarket had been tested. All of Saeed bin Suroor’s horses have tested clear and we are working with the BHA to put everything back in order at Moulton Paddocks.”

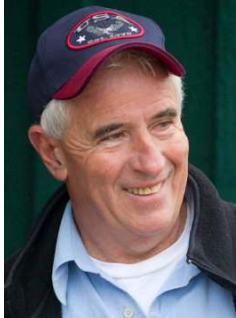

### Unbridled's Song Colt Tops Fasig Opener...

Trainer Nick Zito was busy during Monday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale, buying four juveniles on behalf of Joe Moss. Leading the way was a colt by Unbridled's Song purchased for a session-topping \$330,000 from the de Meric Sales

consignment. Moss, a former pilot and financial advisor, is from Austin, Texas. He has been a client of Zito's for a few years now, but is looking to get more involved in the sport, according to the trainer.

"He's a great gentleman," Zito said of Moss. "He and his wife Nena are special people and they love horses. He's been a fan of the game for a long, long time and the last couple of years, he's gotten involved. He is a historian of pedigrees and he's

looking to get more involved. They are terrific people. Now we've got to get some luck. We've won some races for them, but now we're trying to get some horses that will at least run in some decent races. This is the kind you look for."

The juvenile ([hip 128](#)) is out of the unraced Winning Bet (Dixie Union), who is a daughter of Grade I winner Fantastic Find (Mr. Prospector) and a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Finder's Fee (Storm Cat). The bay colt was purchased by Nick de Meric for \$250,000 out of last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. He worked a furlong last week in :10 3/5.

As de Meric congratulated Zito on the purchase, he assured him, "You'll have a lot of fun with him." Zito admitted the Florida horseman was one of the colt's major selling points.

"He looked like he had some good handlers," Zito said. "Nick de Meric does a good job and I always look at that--who has the horse. Hopefully, he'll be a 2-year-old."

Zito put off signing the ticket on the Unbridled's Song colt as he bid on the very next lot. He was able to secure [hip 129](#) for \$130,000. The colt is by Malibu Moon out of graded stakes placed Wishful Splendor (Smart Strike).

"I trained the mother and that is the family of [Zito's GI Belmont S. winner] Da'Tara, so we're trying that again," said Zito

The chestnut colt was consigned by Cary Frommer, agent, and was purchased for \$180,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale before RNA'ing for \$285,000 at Fasig's Florida sale in March.

Also for Moss, Zito purchased [hip 45](#), a colt by Street Boss, for \$92,000, and [hip 104](#), a son of Spring at Last, for \$30,000.

"I think we're done for today, but we'll try again tomorrow," Zito said after signing his fourth ticket of the day. Of Moss, he concluded, "The game is really lucky now to have him." **Cont. p5**

Asked what he liked about the colt, who worked a quarter-mile in :21 3/5 at last week's under tack preview, Lanni said, "He's bred by Helen Alexander and the family has bred a lot of good horses. The page is phenomenal--I love the female family, I love the dam."

The juvenile is out of Alittlebitearly (Thunder Gulch) and is from the family of Bertolini, He's Had Enough and Kindergarden Kid.

Of the individual, Lanni added, "He was just a cool horse. He's a two-turn horse, he performed right and did everything right and he's very athletic." F-T Cont. p6

**Contessa Secures Distorted Humor Colt...**

Bidding on behalf of Chip McEwen's Wounded Warrior Stable, trainer Gary Contessa purchased a son of Distorted Humor for \$240,000. The colt, who was consigned by Eddie Woods, worked a furlong in :10 2/5 last week. "I just liked his action," Contessa said of the dark bay. "He's kind of a plain brown wrapper, but I liked the way he ran and I liked the way he carried on after the work and I loved his pedigree. If you get a Distorted Humor in the barn, you can get any kind of horse."

The juvenile is the first foal out of English group winner African Skies (GB) (Johannesburg). He was purchased by Bradley Thoroughbreds for \$180,000 out of last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale.

After signing the ticket, Contessa admitted he was prepared to bid higher for the youngster.

"We spent about half of what we would have spent for him, so we had a lot of ammunition left," Contessa said. "We're very pleased to have gotten him."

McEwen donates 10% of all his stable's earnings to the Wounded Warrior Project, which assists veterans and their families.

Also yesterday, Contessa purchased a son of Indian Charlie from the Eisaman Equine consignment for \$150,000 on behalf of Sean Shay. The juvenile was originally led out unsold, but was purchased privately after he left the ring.

The trainer admitted he was finding the market competitive in Timonium.

"I think it is strong," he said. "I think it is really strong at the top, which it has been all year long, but it is reasonable. I think it has been a little more reasonable than the previous sales, so I am very happy. Obviously, I'm holding a ticket, so it's reasonable." **Cont. p7**

**Northwest Stud Makes Winning Debut...**

The ladisernia family's Ocala-based Northwest Stud had its initial consignment at the Midlantic sale and enjoyed quick success with a son of Big Brown. The colt, [hip 121](#), sold for \$200,000 to the bid of Carlos Hostios of Passion Stable.

Northwest Stud was founded by Guiseppe ladisernia, who trains the family's horses. His son Joseph handles the sales duties. The farm stands the stallions Gone Astray, United States and Flashstorm. Flashstorm, whose first crop figures prominently in the Northwest consignment, was third in the 2007 GII Indiana Derby, and the stallion is one of the main reasons the farm decided to come to Timonium.

"We have a lot homebreds, we have a lot of Flashstorms coming, and we wanted to have all those horses as fit as they could be," explained Joseph ladisernia. "So, this being one of the later sales, we figured they would be more developed by now."

The Big Brown colt was a \$90,000 Keeneland September yearling. Asked what had attracted them to the youngster at Keeneland last fall, ladisernia said, "He was just a big strong horse."

ladisernia admitted the operation was a little disappointed by the colt's :10 3/5 breeze.

"We thought he was going to put a better number up on the board, but we've been happy with how he had been training and he just keeps developing," he said. "I think they've bought a racehorse."

Early on in the two-day sale, ladisernia admitted he was finding the market spotty.

"We've had six go through the ring so far today," he said. "The good horses sell well, the rest have been a struggle."

This renewal looked almost certain to head overseas beforehand, but arguably would have gone the way of the chief domestic hope Global Bang if he had not blown the start and gifted the race to the sole French raider Peace at Last. Having made his racecourse bow when third behind yesterday's Listed Prix de Pontarme scorer Mutin (Fr) (Kentucky Dynamite) in a seven-furlong debutantes event at Chantilly in July, the Henri-Alex Pantall trainee was slow to make an impact in the better races and signed off at two with just a seven-furlong conditions win at Compiègne, albeit in impressive fashion. Returning to be second to the useful Etalondes (Fr) (Royal Applause {GB}) over 7 1/2 furlongs at Deauville Mar. 8, the bay was again behind Mutin when fifth over this trip at Saint-Cloud at the end of that month before filling fourth spot behind another highly-regarded sophomore in Saint Thomas (Fr) (Dansili {GB}) back over that same track and trip last time May 4. Held up early with only the detached Global Bang behind, he followed the move of Godolphin's Tawhid as that rival struck the front 1 1/2 furlongs from home and the eventual runner-up made a dramatic move out wide. Mastering that duo with 100 yards remaining, the outsider was driven out to assert as Global Bang's earlier exertions took their toll. This was the second high-profile success in Germany for the Pantall stable after Beatrice (GB) (Dr Fong), another who was seemingly exposed in her native France beforehand, took Cologne's G3 Schwarzgold-Rennen earlier this month, and owner Guy Heald was also surprised by the outcome. "I am overjoyed, but I did not expect him to win," he said. Global Bang's trainer Mario Hofer commented, "I am really pleased with his performance, but he left it a little too late."



*Verrazano to Pegasus, then Haskell...*

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Verrazano (More Than Ready), 14th last time in the GI Kentucky Derby, will be pointed to Monmouth's GIII Pegasus S. June 16 as a prep for that venue's GI Haskell Invitational S. July 28. "He came out of the [Kentucky] Derby in real good shape and will breeze this weekend," tweeted co-owner Let's Go Stables of the GI Wood Memorial S. winner.

*Palace Malice Confirmed for Belmont...*

Dogwood Stables has confirmed that GI Kentucky Derby pacesetter and 12th-place finisher **Palace Malice** (Curlin) will contest the GI Belmont S. June 8. "The decision is based on the outcome of the [GI] Preakness, and the fact that, on Sunday at Belmont Park, our horse worked a very snappy half in [:47.49], indicating good energy and enthusiasm," said Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "The blinkers that jazzed him up in the Derby come off and we anticipate no problem with pace or distance. He has always rated kindly in previous races, and he will be in good hands with [jockey] Mike Smith." Campbell continued, "We are keen to give him another chance, his trainer Todd Pletcher included. Who knows which horses will relish a mile and a half; but his pedigree and his disposition--sans blinkers--would give Palace Malice as good a shot as any of them."

*Dreaming of Julia to Mother Goose...*

Beaten GI Kentucky Oaks favorite **Dreaming of Julia** (A.P. Indy) is likely to resurface in the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont June 22, trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. The daughter of multiple Grade I winner Dream Rush (Wild Rush) was once considered a contender for the GI Belmont S. June 8.

"She's a filly that doesn't carry a tremendous amount of weight--never has--so we're always aware of that," Pletcher told *DRF*. "The Belmont's a demanding race; the mile and a half can be a little bit risky if one doesn't handle it."

Winner of the GI Frizette S. as a juvenile, the Stonestreet Farm colorbearer won the GII Gulfstream Park Oaks by 21 3/4 lengths Mar. 30. She got up late to finish fourth in the Kentucky Oaks after being jostled and squeezed back at the start.

## MURTAGH DOUBLE-HANDED IN GUINEAS

Johnny Murtagh is set to be represented by two runners in Saturday's G1 Tattersalls Irish 2,000 Guineas after **Ask Dad (GB)** (Intikhab) was supplemented to the Curragh Classic at yesterday's six-day stage. Already due to saddle Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's recent purchase **Fort Knox (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the multiple Group 1-winning jockey will be doubled up after owner Andrew Tinkler opted to add the former Richard Hannon trainee into the mix. Only 11th in a six-furlong handicap at Naas on Wednesday, Ask Dad does not boast the credentials of his G3 Leopardstown 2,000 Guineas trial-winning stable companion, and Murtagh told *PA Sport* yesterday, "Andrew [Tinkler] was keen to have a runner in the race, which is why he's supplemented Ask Dad. It's a race that's been lucky for him in the past and he's been placed in it before, so he said we may as well try to pick up some placed money. Fort Knox has come out of his last race well and he's been doing everything nicely. Crucially, he's had no hiccups since then. He's going nicely at home and I'm really looking forward to it. Sheikh Mohammed's team were obviously impressed with Fort Knox and I think a lot of it is to do with him being by Dubawi, who is the stallion of the moment. It's a big confidence boost that they left him with us. They saw he was being aimed at the Guineas and we train just down the road so they probably thought it was for the best." Heading a competitive list of 19 colts are eight from Ballydoyle including the May 4 G1 2,000 Guineas also-ran **Cristoforo Colombo** (Henrythenavigator), **George Vancouver** (Henrythenavigator) and **"TDN Rising Star" Mars (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), as well as the May 12 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains fourth **Gale Force Ten (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) and May 10 G3 Dee S. winner **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Jim Bolger also has a strong hand both numerically and in terms of class, with his quintet headed by last year's G1 Criterium International scorer **Loch Garman (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}), who was runner-up in the May 12 G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial S. runner-up at Leopardstown. "He has come out of the Leopardstown race and the plan is to run him in Saturday's race," Bolger told *PA Sport*. Richard Hannon also has a considerable presence in the race, with his trio being Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}), Saeed Manana's 2,000 Guineas third **Van Der Neer (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) and Qatar Racing Limited & CSH's **Havana Gold (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}), who performed better than Olympic Glory when fifth in the Poulains. "You can put a line through Olympic Glory's French excursion," Hannon said. "He was drawn in the cheap seats and could never get competitive, but at least he came back without having had a hard race so we have decided to take him to Ireland, where the stiff mile should suit him well. The Curragh's uphill finish should also play to the strengths of Van der Neer, who was staying on better than anything when third to Dawn Approach in our Guineas." Other than Bolger, Hannon, O'Brien and Murtagh, the only other trainer represented is Andrew Oliver, who has left in team Valor's G2 Futurity S. winner **First Cornerstone (Ire)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}).

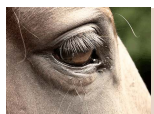

Three days ago, we saw a legendary trainer record his 14th Triple Crown success after a 13-year hiatus with a colt partnered by a comeback jockey whose last Triple Crown successes came in 2001. In such extraordinary circumstances, there's every chance that the personalities will steal the show from the actual horse. Fortunately the colt in question--Preakness hero Oxbow--also has a colorful back story, even if it pales a little alongside those of his legendary trainer D. Wayne Lukas and veteran rider Gary Stevens.

The fascinating part of Oxbow's story dates back to the late 1980s, when the late Cecilia Straub-Rubens bought a couple of yearlings, paying \$50,000 for a Seattle Song filly in 1987 and \$72,000 a year later for a son of Relaunch. The story goes that Straub-Rubens was so excited after the purchase of the well-connected Relaunch colt that it threw her into a tizzy, hence the colt's name.

Cee's Tizzy was bred to be pretty good. With a tally of 86 stakes winners, including Breeders' Cup winners Skywalker and One Dreamer, Relaunch proved himself one of the best stallion sons of In Reality. Then there was Cee's Tizzy's second dam Tizna, a Chilean import who landed three Grade I races during a highly distinguished American career.

There was no shortage of stamina in Cee's Tizzy's pedigree, as Relaunch's exploits included a close second to John Henry in the GI San Luis Rey S. over a mile and a half and the versatile Tizna included the Ladies H. over a mile and a quarter among her major successes. **Cont. p12**

It was therefore no surprise to see Cee's Tizzy tackle a mile and a quarter in the 1990 GI Super Derby. By that time he had won three minor races in very fast time in California and he justified his shot at the big time. After leading for a mile at Louisiana Downs, he lost second place to Unbridled by only a neck, even though it transpired that he had suffered a career-ending knee fracture in the process. Although Cee's Tizzy managed only six starts, his four grandparents collectively notched a total of 130 starts, so he was qualified to sire progeny more durable than himself.

Straub-Rubens' other yearling, Cee's Song, proved more durable, but less talented. She won only once, on dirt, during an 18-race career, and was also second eight times on the turf. However, she was a granddaughter of the great Seattle Slew. Although her sire Seattle Song wasn't a great success as a stallion, with only one Grade I winner to his credit, he had been good enough to win at the highest level in France (Prix de la Salamandre) and the U.S. (Washington D.C. International).

As a non-graded winner, Cee's Tizzy started his stallion career in 1991 at a bargain-basement level and he was to spend his first nine seasons at fees ranging from \$1,500 to \$2,500. His crops during this time averaged little over 30 foals, but he had one fairly constant companion in Cee's Song. Over an 11-year period, the mare produced nine foals to Cee's Tizzy and she was carrying the last of the nine, Oxbow's dam Tizamazing, when she was sold for \$2.6 million at Keeneland's 2001 November Sale.

Of course Tizamazing--who was sold for \$1 million as a yearling--was by no means the only celebrity among the nine siblings. Her immediate predecessor, Tizdubai, justified her \$950,000 price tag by taking the GI Sorrento S. Another full sister, Tizso, failed to win in two attempts, but has made ample amends by becoming the dam of Paynter (Awesome Again), the colt who looked a threat to the best of his generation when he landed last year's GI Haskell Invitational S. Of course, severe illness then threatened to end the colt's life, not just his career, before Paynter staged a truly remarkable recovery.

Cee's Song's daughters had a lot to live up to. Budroyale, the second of her foals, had been claimed on his debut, but went on to build earnings of over \$2.8 million, with a fair slice of that coming from his second to Cat Thief in the 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Then Budroyale's younger brother Tiznow went one better in the 2000 Classic, before following up in 2001. Tizbud, the last of the partnership's four colts, also became a stakes winner.

In trying to unearth the source of Cee's Song's success, I delved through her female line. Her fourth dam Blue Canary, born in 1952, had the attention-grabbing record of having raced 127 times over a seven-year period, for an average of 18 starts per year. Perhaps she would have been retired earlier had her connections known that her younger half-brother, Crimson Satan, was to become 1961's champion 2-year-old. Incidentally, the progeny of their dam, the Chilean-bred Papila, provide a reminder of a totally different era. Despite his class, Crimson Satan packed 58 starts into four seasons, while his half-brothers Red Red Robin, Cardinal Sin and Sports Reporter respectively raced 72, 89 and 92 times.

To get back to Oxbow, it is remarkable that he and Paynter are both by Awesome Again. With sisters as their dams, they are brothers-in-blood. The incentive for pairing these sisters of Tiznow with Awesome Again surely stems from the fact that their grandsire, Relaunch, figured as the broodmare sire of Ghostzapper, Awesome Again's most outstanding winner.

Ghostzapper's arrival to stand alongside his sire at Adena Springs in 2006 can't have made things any easier for the 1998 Breeders' Cup Classic winner. By that time Awesome Again's fee stood at \$125,000 and it was to rise to \$150,000 in 2008, on the strength of his having sired four winners on Breeders' Cup day (Ghostzapper, Wilko, Round Pond and Ginger Punch).

Awesome Again was originally slated to cover the 2009 season at the same fee but, with the start of the economic downturn, his fee was lowered to \$125,000. Even so, he attracted only 67 mares, for 57 live foals. His owners responded by slashing his fee to \$50,000 for the next three seasons and the ploy worked, at least numerically.

It will be fascinating to see whether these cheaper crops can boost Awesome Again's stash of Grade I winners, which now stands at 13 from his first 11 crops. There is absolutely no reason why they shouldn't, as he spent his first five years at \$50,000 and it was those first five crops which produced 10 of his Grade I winners, the exceptions being Game On Dude, Paynter and Oxbow.

The next difficult question facing Oxbow is whether he has enough stamina for the mile and a half of the GI Belmont S. Although his penchant for racing in the front rank won't make his task any easier, he is in with a chance. Paynter attempted to lead throughout in last year's Belmont and failed by only a neck to withstand Union Rags' challenge. Then there's the fact that Tiznow, a brother to Oxbow's dam, sired Belmont winner Da' Tara, while Deputy Minister, sire of Awesome Again, also had a Belmont winner, Touch Gold, among his best representatives.

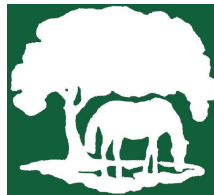
