TELESCOPE FAILS TO IMPRESS IN WORK

Britain's biggest talking horse **Telescope (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) failed to produce any fireworks in his public gallop at Lingfield yesterday, with connections now waiting on a further exercise on Saturday before committing to the G1 Epsom Derby. Watched by a clutch of syndicate members, including the recently retired Manchester United manager Sir Alex Ferguson, Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ was partnered by Ryan Moore in the hastily scheduled spin following his last-minute defection from Thursday's G2 Dante S. at York. Taking a lead from stable companions Commend (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and Opinion (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), the Newmarket maiden winner passed the post three lengths ahead of the latter, but not in the style connections have reported to see at home. Trainer Sir Michael Stoute, who believed the below-par display was at least partly result of the tongue getting over the bit, will work him again on Saturday on the Newmarket gallops. "We felt it was more of workmanlike display," Stoute said. "He's worked with these horses this spring and has been more impressive than that. I felt that he didn't really switch off--even cantering down he was just taking a bit of a tug, so hopefully it will do him the power of good to get back to the racecourse as it's been a long time. We will see what today has done for him, mentally more than anything else. We'll work him on Saturday and then I will speak to Harry [Herbert]." Highclere's Manager Harry Herbert echoed those downbeat sentiments. "Anyone watching that, especially those who have seen the horse work in the spring, would say he lacked that usual zip," he commented. "He hasn't put in a performance that was as good as had been hoped, but I suspect this is a combination of tongue over the bit and freshness. The final piece of work on Saturday is obviously going to be critical, as the clock is ticking. Then we'll decide whether to go all out for Epsom or not. Hopefully, we'll see the real Telescope on Saturday and the dream will still be alive."

THE MIDAS MAN

It would be a monumental understatement to say that Ken Ramsey has had a good run in the racing game so far this year. With his vast team of horses campaigned in tandem with his wife Sarah, Ramsey established a

new Keeneland standard when rounding out the 2013 meet with a record 25 wins, including Dark Cove (Medaglia d'Oro), who won the closing day feature, the GII Elkhorn S. Apr. 26.

"If you look back and see that the record was set [at Keeneland spring meet] in 1941 by Calumet Farm, in the days when Ben Jones

was their trainer, Eddie Arcaro was their jockey and they won the Triple Crown with Whirlaway and the record was later equaled in 1968 [fall meet] by Mr. & Mrs. [Robert F.] Roberts, so I am in very good company," said Ken Ramsey.

As if that feat weren't impressive enough, the Kentucky native also dominated the standings in South Florida earlier this season, wrapping up the owner's title at Gulfstream Park with a total of 43 wins--16 more than Frank Calabrese--and earnings of \$1,334,188.

Only days removed from the Ramseys' domination at Keeneland, the team kicked off another sparkling run at Churchill Downs, winning a total of eight races over the course of four days through Kentucky Derby week, including a trio on Derby day itself. Chief among those was a pair of stakes victories in the GII Churchill Downs Distaff Turf Mile S. with Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy) and the Edgewood S. with Kitten's Dumplings (Kitten's Joy). The former is trained by Wayne Catalano and the latter is under the care of Mike Maker. **Cont. p3**

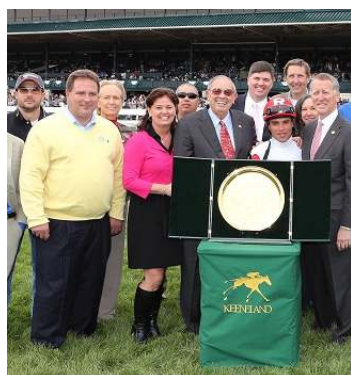

"Last fall [at Keeneland], we tried to break the record and had 12 wins going into closing day, but I did not [get it]," said Ramsey. "I decided this winter at Gulfstream that I'm going to try to [break the Keeneland record] this season. I had all these Kitten's Joys working and racing well, so we had them all lined up. I decided to claim horses down at Gulfstream, so I could win the title at Keeneland and Churchill Downs. We're here to win it. I claimed five horses at Churchill Downs [May 10] alone. I'm determined. I will be a force to be reckoned with."

Proving just as effective on the road, Ramsey landed a pair of stakes wins at Pimlico on Preakness weekend; last Friday's Hilltop S. with Emotional Kitten (Kitten's Joy) and the James W. Murphy S. with Redwood Kitten (Kitten's Joy).

King of Keeneland..

Fresh off the heels of yet another owner's title at Gulfstream Park, Ramsey and Co. continued the assault in Lexington, amassing 25 victories through 21 days.

Leading the fray in number of victories was trainer Mike Maker, who garnered 20 of those wins for the Ramseys. In addition to Elkhorn winner Dark Cove, Maker also saddled a pair of allowance winners at the Keeneland meeting, Bernie the Maestro (Bernstein), winner of the Claiming Crown Rapid Transit S. and Claiming Crown Tiara S. victress Starsilhouette (Orientate), both winners on Gulfstream's opening day card Dec. 1. During the

Keeneland meet, Maker also sent out 4-year-old Prissy (Unbridled's Song) to take a 1 1/16-mile allowance on the grass Apr. 25. Prissy is out of Last Kitten (Catenus), who is a half-sister to Ramsey's turf champion Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}) and a full-sister to Precious Kitten, victorious in the GI Matriarch S., GI John C. Mabee H. and GI Gamely Breeders' Cup S. Prissy followed up with a win in her latest start, a nine-furlong optional claiming event at Churchill Downs May 19.

"Prissy is a very nice horse," commented Ramsey Farm Manager Mark Partridge. "She'll probably be pointed toward the Breeders' Cup this year." **Cont. p4**

In addition to this season's Keeneland winners overseen by Maker, Ramsey was also represented by Wayne Catalano, who collected a pair of victories, and Wesley Ward, who saddled three winners for the operation, including impressive maiden winner Hollywood Talent (Talent Search).

While it may seem to many that Ramsey's record-setting season at Keeneland could be attributed to old fashioned good luck, those in the know understand that a heavy dose of planning went into collecting the title.

"We claimed a lot of horses in the fall at Churchill to run in Florida and we collected more at Gulfstream to race back there and to bring to Keeneland," explained

Partridge. "Mr. Ramsey wanted to win the [owner's] title at Gulfstream and Keeneland. But, primarily, the goal was Keeneland."

Ramsey's commitment to taking down the owner's title is unwavering and, if the task can't be accomplished with the outfit's bullets already

in the holster, Ramsey is all too willing to bring in reinforcements.

"Mr. Ramsey is the one who chooses what we're going to claim," confirmed Partridge. "He looks at the [Daily Racing] Form every day and he likes to use the Rag[ozin] sheets. He is primarily the claimer."

Ramsey admitted that he was never raised in a racing family, nor did he grow up around horses, but learned the basics of the business the old fashioned way--by betting horses at the racetrack.

"I was down at Keeneland years ago, and a friend of mine marked out my program and I placed a bet and won \$40 and from then on, I was hooked," recalled Ramsey. "I bought every book I could get my hands on and went to handicapping school. I became pretty good at it and I later taught an adult education class called, 'Racing 101' at Transylvania University, which was very popular."

Following a brief stint as a trainer in the 1960s, Ramsey continued to study many aspects of the sport, including breeding and husbandry.

"My operation has gone through an evolutionary process, it's mature now," said Ramsey. "I have it to the point where the results are pretty much predictable. When I'm gambling, I actually like to call it investing, I just know I'm going to cash four of them."

And based on Ramsey's recent success, it is hard to argue that his formula isn't working.

"I'm at the point now where I'm good, and I know I'm good and that makes me very dangerous," said Ramsey.

All The King's Men...

Sprawling over 1,215 acres in Nicholasville, Kentucky, Ramsey Farm serves as home to approximately 130 mares with an additional 160 horses--including unraced juveniles--in training. To accommodate such a large racing team, Ramsey has enlisted several of the nation's leading trainers, in addition to Maker, Ward and Catalano. The roster includes Chad Brown, Christophe Clement and Todd Pletcher, who trains Ramsey's sole Kentucky Derby starter this term, multiple stakes winner Charming Kitten (Kitten's Joy). Ramsey also is represented by Tom Voss, who oversees his steeplechase string, and a pair of international conditioners, Dermot Weld in Ireland and Gianluca Bietolini in Italy. Armed with such a strong roster of trainers, Ramsey often turns to basics to decide where a particular horse or group of horses might go.

"A huge process goes into deciding which trainers get which 2-year-old," revealed Partridge. "Chad Brown probably does better with the Kitten's Joys and he does very well with turf fillies, so he gets a lot of the turf Kitten's Joys from us. Mike Maker and Todd Pletcher can pretty much train anything, and we try and give Wesley Ward the ones that are more precocious. Wayne Catalano, even though he has [graded stakes winning turf filly] Stephanie's Kitten for us, he seems to fit in a little more in the Wesley Ward scenario. We also try to spread them around, because we don't want all of them in the same place, excluding each other from races.

That's generally how we go about choosing our trainers. The only exception might be Saratoga and Gulfstream, because that is where all of them want to be in the summer and winter, so there is overlap there."

Ramsey's Foreign Invasion...

Few would argue that Ramsey's greatest success abroad was realized with Roses in May. In 2004, the striking black colt won Saratoga's GI Whitney H. prior to capping off the season with a second-place effort behind eventual Horse of the Year Ghostzapper in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The following year, the Dale Romans trainee was second behind Saint Liam in the GI Donn H. before heading to Dubai for the World Cup. Partnered by John Velazquez that day, the favorite broke slowly, but showed an impressive turn of foot late to score by a convincing three lengths. Crowned that season's highweight older route horse in the UAE, Roses in May sustained a tendon injury later that summer and was retired with eight wins from 13 starts and just under \$5.5 million in earnings. He was sold for stud duty to Big Red Farm on the Japanese island of Hokkaido. **Cont. p6**

Not restricting himself to any one region, Ramsey also enjoyed success in Europe, among his most notable representative was G3 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial winner Port Bayou (Ghazi), a half-brother to Ramsey's young sire Talent Search. Conditioned by Weld, the colt rounded out the 1999 as the highweighted 3-year-old at 9.5-11 furlongs.

"We had a half-brother to Talent Search named Port Bayou, who went on to be champion in Ireland and from there, it just progressed to Royal Ascot," explained Partridge.

Admittedly high on his international agenda, Ramsey has attended Royal Ascot for over a decade and has sent over a starter in each of the past five years.

The first horse representing Ramsey at Ascot was the Irish stakes winner Steaming Home (Salt Lake), who finished second for Ramsey in allowance company 2001.

On May 12, the 14-year-old mare's son Backseat Memories (Johar) won the Mambo Meister S. at Calder. Bred by the Ramseys, the 4-year-old colt was claimed away from Ramsey for \$25,000 at Gulfstream Feb. 13.

"About four years ago, Wesley Ward called me about taking some of my 2-year-olds to Royal Ascot," recalled Ramsey. "We had a couple of fast 2-year-olds and they had been training well at Churchill Downs. He felt they might have an edge over the horses in England because they had a cold winter and they wouldn't be ready. We took over two of them--one of them got sick and the other was Holiday for Kitten [Kitten's Joy], who acted up at the start and got her head under the gate and didn't get off to a good start. She didn't run that well, but Wesley won with one of his other horses [Jealous Again

{Trippi}, won the G2 Queen Mary S.), so that was good."

However, the following season proved a much more fortuitous renewal for Ramsey. Armed with the aptly-named gelding Cannonball (Catenus), Ramsey watched as the dual stakes winner ran the race of his life to finish a close-up second in the G1 Golden Jubilee S.

“The highlight of that trip was when The Queen’s representative came down to our box to invite us up to have high tea with The Queen at four O’clock,” recalled Ramsey. “I asked, ‘So, if I win the race I get to have tea with The Queen?’ ‘No, it doesn’t matter where you finish in the race, you have been invited up.’ She knew we had the good turf horse Kitten’s Joy and had won the Dubai World Cup, so she thought I’d be an interesting guy to talk to. We had a great time. And then she invited me to stay in her box and watch a race with her. That was a memorable day.”

Looking down the road to this year’s Royal meeting, Ramsey indicated that he might be represented by as many as three in 2013, including Hollywood Talent (Talent Search), impressive winner of his debut at Keeneland Apr. 19.

“He’s the fastest 2-year-old that’s run so far this year,” opined Ramsey. “He got an 8 1/2 Rag sheet number, which is very good. He’s been invited over.”

Another possibility to make the trip is 2-year-old Big Blue Talent (Talent Search), who finished fourth after a slow start at Churchill Downs May 17.

“So, I may take one of them to Royal Ascot and try and win the [GII] Sanford S. at Saratoga with the other,” Ramsey confirmed.

Also likely to join the team is Shirley’s Kitten (Kitten’s Joy), winner of her first two starts in Rome before finishing third in the Oct. 21 G3 Premio Dormello in Milan. Back on top in an eight-furlong test in Rome Mar. 10, she was sixth over heavy ground Apr. 28. Rounding out the possible candidates is Charming Kitten (Kitten’s Joy), trained by Todd Pletcher. Winner of the Jan. 20 Kitten’s Joy S. at Gulfstream, he was second in the Mar. 3 GIII Palm Beach S. and third in the Apr. 13 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. In his most recent start, the dark bay was ninth in the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby.

“I’ve talked to Todd about the possibility of running Charming Kitten,” offered Ramsey. “The colt is by Kitten’s Joy, and they can handle the turf over there. He’s been nominated to the [G1] St James’s Palace S.”

While it is unclear exactly who will go to the Royal meeting at this point, one thing that is clear is that Ramsey will be represented at Ascot come this June.

“I was second with Steaming Home and Cannonball, and I don’t want to be the first loser twice over there,” laughed Ramsey. “So I’d sure like to go back with a horse that can win.”

MOSS HAS HIGH HOPES

Despite growing up in Hot Springs, Arkansas, Joe Moss has never been to Oaklawn Park, but the former Marine, turned commercial pilot, turned financial advisor, turned racehorse owner thinks it would be a dream come true to return to his hometown with a horse in the track's signature GI Arkansas Derby. Trainer Nick Zito was busy at the recently concluded Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training sale in Timonium, hoping to make that dream a reality.

On behalf of Moss, Zito signed for eight juveniles during the two-day sale, including a son of Malibu Moon ([hip 364](#)) for \$360,000, an Unbridled's Song colt ([hip 128](#)) for \$330,000, and a Harlan's Holiday colt ([hip 293](#)) for \$300,000.

"Racing has always been my favorite sport," Moss said from his home in Austin, Texas, Tuesday. "I love it and the people that are in it are much higher class than the individuals that you'll find at the average football or baseball game. There are such rarefied people in horse racing, at all levels, they are horse lovers, they tend to be courteous and they are just nice people to work with."

Moss left Arkansas to attend the University of Texas, where he discovered a love of flying. He then joined the Marines Corp and ended up in California.

"We went to Santa Anita and the mountains are so beautiful and the horses were so beautiful and so graceful," Moss explained. "It was an easy sport to fall in love with."

After serving as pilot for four years in World War II, Moss returned home and began a 37-year career as a commercial pilot with Delta Airlines. He always maintained his love of racing.

"I went years and years wanting to be something more than a bettor," he said. "I wanted to be an owner, but was discouraged by what I read and was told. My wife Nena and I were in New York years ago and we rode the train out to Belmont and, seated right next to us was the president of Delaware Park, and we got to talking and he said, 'For gosh sakes, don't ever become an owner, you'll lose everything you have, you'll end up broke.'"

So Moss continued on as a pilot, while also developing his interest in finance. Both eventually led him, despite all the dire warnings, to racehorse ownership.

"I had an interest in economics and finance," he explained. "Airline pilots are given a lot of time off and, while others were playing golf or going fishing, I was studying at the brokerage houses or at the public library or books that I bought and I actually learned a lot about the stock market. I guess you might say these horses are the end result of that. Being a pilot pays well and I used the unused portion of my income to invest and made some good investments and still have them. I can use that now to buy horses."

Moss decided to take the plunge four years ago.

"A couple of years ago, I figured my age is such now that if I don't do it, I never will," Moss said. "And I just jumped in."

Moss's first horse was \$110,000 a son of Dixie Union purchased at the 2009 Keeneland April sale.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



OKLAHOMA HORSEMEN ELIGIBLE FOR DISASTER RELIEF

The death and destruction caused by Monday's EF-5 tornado that struck near Oklahoma City, OK are staggering. According to news reports, several horse farms were damaged and many horses stabled at Celestial Acres in Moore, OK were killed. The NTRA has contacted local horsemen and officials at Remington Park to offer assistance.

One potential source of relief for horse breeders under these circumstances is the USDA Emergency Conservation Program administered by the USDA's Farm Service Agency. The [USDA Conservation Program site](#) provides guidance to agricultural producers such as horse breeders concerning assistance that is available in the event of tornados and other natural disasters. Unfortunately, this program does not extend to stables or racetracks. The NTRA will work with local breeders to assist them in receiving any disaster relief to which they may be entitled.

After Hurricane Katrina in 2006, the NTRA and the American Horse Council successfully lobbied Congress to include horses in USDA disaster assistance programs. USDA emergency relief was already available to most other livestock at that time.

He named the horse P.L. Henry, in honor of his grandfather. Also in the Moss stable is Noble Doss (Mr. Greeley), named for the University of Texas football player, who won a \$20,000 claiming race at Belmont last week.

This past winter, Moss called Zito and told him he was ready to upgrade his stock. The two were shut out at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale in March, but found what they were looking for in Timonium.

While he remained at home in Texas, Moss was able to participate in the bidding via phone with his trainer. "He was on the phone with me and we had a very good time--that was a lot of fun," Moss said.

Still, for Moss, it always comes back to a love of the horses.

"There is nothing as elating as a win by your horse," Moss said. "It is just beautiful. And I love those horses. To stand down at the starting gate and watch them come out of there, it is poetry in motion. They are such agile creatures."

Moss said he has attended 11 runnings of the Kentucky Derby, starting with Tim Tam in 1958 and continuing through to Pleasant Colony in 1981. He admitted a 12th trip to Louisville would be a special family affair, should one of his new juvenile acquisitions be good and lucky enough to earn a berth in next year's Run for the Roses.

"My wife would love it," he chuckled. "I would love it. We would take our grandchildren and children and just have a tremendous time."

"There are so many opportunities for dreaming in this business," he added. "And that kind of keeps you going." -*Jessica Martini*

Team Valor Ladies Introduce New Acquisition...

Nearly a year after acquiring subsequent stakes winner Tuttipaesi (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}), Megan Jones, the director of customer relations for Team Valor, has reached out for the undefeated French-based 2-year-old filly **Nisharora (Ire)** (Excellent Art {GB}--Art Fair {GB}, by Alzao). Previously trained by Jean Heloury for owner Jacques Heloury, she raced greenly in her Apr. 28 debut going over five furlongs at Lyon-Parilly, but was able to overcome her inexperience to score by 3/4 of a length. The attractive chestnut returned on 15 days' rest in a six-furlong conditions test at Maisons-Laffitte May 13 and she accelerated away impressively to take it by about two lengths ([VIDEO](#)). "I like her, because she is winning impressively in spite of her obvious physical immaturity and rosier prospects over longer distances," commented Team Valor's Barry Irwin. "I always like it when horses do things they're not supposed to. That is usually a good tip off." Despite wins at short-track distances to begin her career, the Team Valor brass believe there is better to come when she stretches out in trip. "We would not have bought her if we thought she could not run a middle distance," Irwin explained. "She is not built or muscled like a sprinter. From a pedigree perspective, her sire was a prototypical miler, her dam stayed a mile and three-quarters, her broodmare sire regularly produced stamina and the second and third dams produced deep stayers." Nisharora is a candidate for Listed stakes events in Milan June 16 or June 30. She is scheduled to complete all pre-export testing prior to vanning from France to Italy and is scheduled to depart for the United States in early July. She will be stabled at Fair Hill with Team Valor trainer Rick Mettee. She is tentatively penciled in to make her stateside debut in the P. G. Johnson S. at Saratoga Aug. 28 and will have one additional prep with an eye on the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf. Under special conditions instituted recently by the Breeders' Cup, Nisharora has been made fully eligible for the program, a fact learned only Tuesday by Team Valor.

AHERN BANNED FOR TEN YEARS

Jockey Eddie Ahern was yesterday handed a 10-year suspension by the British Horseracing Authority as a result of the latest corruption investigation. Found guilty of conspiring to commit a corrupt or fraudulent practice alongside former soccer player Neil Clement, communicating inside information for reward and

intentionally failing to ensure a horse ran on its merits, the 35-year-old was not present at the disciplinary hearing. A former Irish champion apprentice who was successful in last year's G1 Irish St Leger on the dead-heater Duncan (GB), Ahern's penalty results from five races between Sept. 10, 2010 and Feb. 11 the following year. Clement has been disqualified for 15 years and three months and fined £3,000. Adam Brickell, director of integrity, legal and risk for the BHA, commented,

"Today's findings have confirmed that another network of corruption has been successfully prosecuted by the BHA. The clear message from this, and other cases heard in the last 18 months, should be that the BHA is better equipped than ever at pinpointing and prosecuting malpractice. The penalties imposed as a result of these cases being heard should serve as a deterrent to others. This investigation was another landmark in terms of our intelligence and evidence gathering capabilities, as it was the first occasion on which we have received assistance from a spread betting company to bring a successful prosecution."

NO SIGN OF END TO DETTORI HOLD-UP

Frankie Dettori continues to wait on the decision of France Galop's medical committee regarding his return to the saddle. As a result of the finding of irregularities in a recent test, the ruling body are delaying their verdict until the outcome of a "B sample" is known. A statement from the BHA read yesterday, "We have today again spoken to France Galop regarding Frankie Dettori. They have confirmed to us that the issue sits with the medical committee, and that the specifics of the case have to remain confidential between that committee and Mr. Dettori. They are unable to provide us with any further information at this stage." Dettori's solicitor Christopher Stewart-Moore responded to the delay by saying, "I am awaiting a response from the BHA. I'm going to ask them to reconvene the licensing committee, so they can hear the submission from us to see if Frankie can get his licence back. That might include us handing over the documentation to the tests which he has carried out. What we are looking for is a further hearing with the licensing committee. The licensing committee has already decided he is fit and ready to race, and there should be nothing to stop him. Frankie is very willing to pay for, and subject himself to, further tests in the first six months of his return.
