SAHARA SKY STOPS 'TRAFFIC' IN MET MILE

Their trips were polar opposites, but there was nothing separating **Sahara Sky** (Pleasant Tap) and **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song) at the end of eight furlongs in Monday's GI Metropolitan H. It looked like the prestigious event may have had two winners after the former flew home from dead last to hit the wire in concert with the game front runner Cross Traffic, but the placing judges flashed

the number seven atop the board and it was cheers for the Sahara Sky crowd and heartache for Cross Traffic, whose performance could only be described as "running too well to lose." Patience Pays off for Hollendorfer...

Purchased privately from trainer Jeff Hebert after scoring in a \$20,000 maiden claimer on debut at Delta Downs in 2010, Sahara Sky was brought along patiently by Hall of Fame conditioner Jerry Hollendorfer despite a very consistent record of on-the-board finishes in 2011 and 2012, mostly at the optional claiming level. The veteran finally decided to toss his charge into the deep end in Santa Anita's Jan. 29 six-furlong GII Palos Verdes S., and he belied 21-1 odds to get the job done and earn a career-best 102 Beyer Speed Figure. Sahara Sky proved that effort was no fluke when turning in a nearly identical effort in the GII San Carlos S. going an additional panel a month later, and was probably left with too much to do when finishing second to **Swagger Jack** (Smart Strike) and in front of **Discreet Dancer** (Discreet Cat) and **Fort Loudon** (Awesome of Course) in the seven-furlong GI Carter H. at the Big A Apr. 6.

"My partner [Kim Lloyd, General Manager of Barretts Equine Limited and Fairplex Park Racing] and I talked it over, and one of our goals was to win the Metropolitan Mile," explained Hollendorfer, whose past success with private purchases out of maiden claimers includes champion Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision). "I'd never won it, and I wanted a chance to win it, and Kim did, also. We had a little added confidence because we thought our horse ran good in New York over at Aqueduct, and with a little bit better trip we might have even won that race."

Of his pre-race instructions to Joel Rosario, who also piloted Blind Luck for much of her career, Hollendorfer said, "I told Joel to watch his pace. We knew there was some speed to set that up, and I told him the horse likes left-handed whipping, so I told to hit both left- and right-handed, and he came running and got up the last jump."

Hollendorfer said he had no immediate plans for Sahara Sky, but would consider longer races.

How the Race was Won...

Cross Traffic, lightly raced with just three previous efforts under his belt, was impeded ever-so-slightly by stablemate Discreet Dancer coming in on him at the start, but quickly recovered to take command. Sahara Sky, meanwhile, dropped right out to the back as expected. Attempting to reverse the bad beat he received from Flat Out in the track-and-trip GIII Westchester S. Apr. 27, Cross Traffic posted ambitious opening splits of :22.40 and :44.88. The pacesetter looked as if he would lose a confrontation with **Mark Valeski** (Proud Citizen) as that foe ranged up at the top of the stretch, but he found another gear after switching leads and began to claw back his advantage. Sahara Sky was winding up down the center of the course, however, and he gobbled up ground despite a brief bobble for a finish reminiscent of last year's between Shackleford (Forestry) and Caleb's Posse (Posse).

"I was thinking I won, but it was so close and I was so far to the outside, sometimes it's hard to tell," said Rosario, winner of the GI Kentucky Derby and G1 Dubai World Cup in a year where he can seemingly do no wrong in big races. "I thought we

had a head in front, but the angle was different and I didn't know." He added, "[Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer] always gave me opportunities. In California, when I was doing good, he gave me a lot of opportunities on his horses, and I appreciate that.

Cross Traffic's trainer Todd Pletcher and rider John Velazquez were understandably reeling from a brutal beat. "He ran a great race," said the former, who also finished second in the Phipps and third in the Acorn. Velazquez added, "He ran good and got nailed at the wire. There's not much else to say."

Sahara Sky's dam won the GIII Interborough H. at Aqueduct in 2000, and his second dam took the GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga in 1994.

Tiz Miz Sue finished third in the 2011 GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga and filled out the trifecta in last year's GI Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn. She stretched eventual 2012 champion older mare Royal Delta (Empire Maker) to a neck in last July's GII Delaware H., but was fourth back in the Personal Ensign and fifth in Keeneland's GI Juddmonte Spinster S. in October. Third behind a slow pace in Oaklawn's Bayakoa S. to kick off her 6-year-old season, the dark bay turned the tables on Don't Tell Sophia (Congaree) and My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike) when defending her GIII Azeri S. title back in Hot Springs Mar. 16. Again the victim of pace dynamics in this year's Apple Blossom, Tiz Miz Sue was a fast-closing second behind On Fire Baby (Smoke Glacken), who was subsequently second to Authenticity in the GII La Troienne S. May 3.

Tiz Miz Sue, who opened short on the board before drifting up to 4-1 at the off, took up a perfect rail-skimming spot off the pace as Joyful Victory carved out honest fractions with Authenticity in tow. She inched her way into third while traveling well on the turn, and tipped out into the three path to confront Authenticity, who had already disposed of the favorite. Tiz Miz Sue took over with relative ease with a furlong to run, but Authenticity stuck by her to keep the winning margin closer than it might have been.

"It's wonderful when it works," said winning trainer Steve Hobby. "I was loving the fractions and [rider] Joe [Rocco, Jr.] looked like he had an armful of horse all the way sitting back there. He just waited. He knows her very well. She was within range, that was the big thing. Sometimes she gets too far behind and can't quite make up the distance, but she was within range and they were cooking. She deserved [a Grade I] so bad and I was really going to be upset if she didn't get one before she retired."

Rocco added, "When I saw Rosie [Napravnik] have to lean forward [aboard Joyful Victory] on the turn and I was following Mike [Smith, jockey aboard Authenticity], I got pretty confident, but this mare has fooled me a couple of times where I thought I was going to get past them. Once she ran by them, then I was confident." He continued, "I'm friends with the trainer, and I've ridden this mare long enough that I've gotten to be friends with the owners. [This win] means a lot to everyone."

CresRan Farm is operated by Carol Ricks. Carol and late husband Ran Ricks campaigned millionaire MGSW Chindi (El Prado {Ire}), who was also trained by Steve Hobby.

Luck seemed to have little to do with Midnight Lucky's victory in yesterday's Acorn, as the lightly raced grey had already proven herself among the best of her generation earlier this year. Breaking her maiden in devastating wire-to-wire fashion and earning a 100 Beyer Speed Figure status going 6 1/2 furlongs at Santa Anita Feb. 16, she proved equally impressive stretching out to 1 1/16-miles for the Mar. 24 Sunland Oaks, once again leading at every call to win by eight lengths. The Pegram colorbearer finished fifth after setting a hot pace in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 3, and signaled she was no worse for the wear when working a bullet six furlongs in 1:10 4/5 at Churchill Downs May 20, and was sent off the even money favorite here. Tracking freewheeling longshot Momentary Magic (Indian Charlie) through the early stages here, Midnight Lucky and Rosie Napravnik drew alongside and past that rival at the quarter pole and was never challenged, drawing clear to win by seven lengths. "I wanted to be sitting anywhere from two to 2 1/2 lengths off the pace, which we were," said Jim Barnes, assistant trainer to Bob Baffert. "They were moving right along, and at no point did it look like she was struggling with the racetrack. She's just a really nice filly and we're so happy to train her. The plan right now is day by day. We'll go back to Churchill and go from there."

A multiple graded stakes winner and Grade I-placed at three, Marketing Mix continued her upward trajectory last season at four, taking a pair of Grade IIs on the Woodbine sod over the summer before falling a head short in Arlington's GI Beverly D. S. in August. She'd get her Grade I in Santa Anita's Rodeo Drive S. in September, but would again fall ever-so-short in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf back in Arcadia Nov. 2. Originally prepping for her seasonal bow in Kentucky, the dark bay was subsequently shipped out to California when the weather didn't cooperate and recorded a trio of easy local drills for this.

Away alertly, Marketing Mix found a comfortable rhythm in third as Miss Ellany (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) set out to ensure a solid pace for her stablemate Lady of Shamrock. She inched closer on the turn for home, and asserted three-wide while joined by Tiz Flirtatious to her outside. The pair quickly disposed of Halo Dolly (Popular) in upper stretch, and while Marketing Mix seemed poised to pull clear at the sixteenth pole, Tiz Flirtatious dug in to cut it close at the line. Lady of Shamrock flew home to just get up for third, but never threatened the top two.

"She's a good mare," said winning conditioner Tom Proctor. "She makes me look good, that's how good she is... You never know how fit they are until they run. If they aren't they get beat, if they are they don't. She's always run well off a layoff. I told Gary [Stevens] at Keeneland, 'You might ride this filly, you ought to come over and work her.' So he did and everything worked out well."

WATERHOUSE FOUND GUILTY

Trainer Gai Waterhouse has been found guilty and fined A\$5,500 for failure to inform stewards of the condition of **More Joyous (NZ)** (More Than Ready) in the lead up to the Apr. 27 G1 All Aged S., and failure to provide up-to-date treatment records to stewards, according to published reports. More Joyous, a 6-year-old mare, finished a disappointing seventh of eight in the All Aged, after which owner John Singleton publicly fired Waterhouse at Randwick Racecourse, citing evidence that Waterhouse's bookmaker son, Tom Waterhouse, had told friends of Singleton's that More Joyous would not win the race. An inquiry ensued, with Singleton receiving fines and Tom Waterhouse found not guilty of any wrongdoing.

Waterhouse admitted after the race that More Joyous had heat in her neck in the week before the race that was treated, but not reported to stewards. She had pleaded not guilty, and said she would consider an appeal. The trainer could face additional charges surrounding More Joyous, as stewards found the mare had suffered an unreported setback in the week leading up to her fifth-place finish in the G1 Queen of the Turf S. Apr. 6.

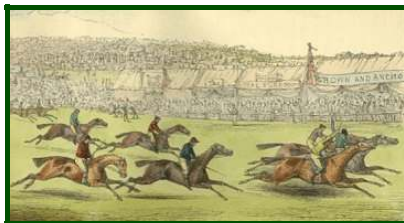

Andre Fabre is readying Prince Faisal's May 4 G2 Prix Greffulhe scorer **Ocovango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) for the race, while Elaine Burke will saddle the only serious home-trained contender in Hubert John Strecker's May 16 G2 Dante S. winner **Libertarian (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}). As expected, the scratchings included the Niarchos Family's Prix Greffulhe runner-up **Bravodino** (Dynaformer), who heads to Chantilly for the G1 Prix du Jockey Club a day later and Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Telescope (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Yesterday's going description was good, good-to-firm in places and the track's Head of Racing and Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper said, "There is rain forecast for tomorrow, but the exact amount we will see is hard to predict--most forecasts suggest at least six millimetres. It would not take much rain to bring the going description back to good. Unsettled weather is forecast for Wednesday, with drier conditions prevailing for the Investec Derby Festival on Friday and Saturday. 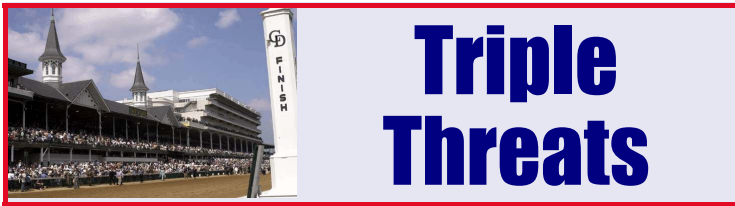

Pletcher Power at Belmont...

Trainer Todd Pletcher had a very busy morning at Belmont Park yesterday, sending out several of his runners after heavy rains early in the weekend pushed things back a day for the squad. Making his appearance shortly after 6:00 a.m., GII Louisiana Derby victor

Revolutionary (War Pass), who was working in company with debut winner Oldwick (Street Boss), covered four furlongs in :48 2/5 before galloping out five panels in 1:00.77. In his latest start, Revolutionary finished third under jockey Calvin Borel in the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby.

Javier Castellano, who was onboard for the WinStar runner's score in the Feb. 2 GIII Withers S. in addition to his win at Fair Grounds, was in the irons for yesterday's work.

"[With Revolutionary] right after the Derby, we talked to Elliott [Walden of WinStar Farm] and we decided to skip the Preakness and go to the Belmont," explained Pletcher. "My gut reaction was this horse doesn't need a lot of training, we'll give him two half-miles and run. Last week, he was doing so well, I contemplated giving him three breezes, but I decided to stick to my original plan. I'm really happy with the way he went this morning. I think he's maintained his fitness really, really well."

Also on Monday's worktab was **Palace Malice** (Curlin), runner-up in the GI Blue Grass S. before finishing 12th in the Kentucky Derby, and **Micromanage** (Medaglia d'Oro), victorious last time out in the slop at Monmouth Park May 11. Working in tandem, the pair went five furlongs over the main track, with the former getting the trip in 1:00.24, galloping out six panels in 1:12.26 and seven-eighths in 1:24.60.

"I think Palace Malice worked unbelievably well," said Pletcher. "It was a monstrous gallop out."

Not as visually impressive as his stablemate, Micromanage required 1:01.17 to complete the task. Shortly following the move, the colt's owner, Mike Repole, indicated that he would not go on to the June 8 GI Belmont S. and would instead be targeted at the Easy Goer S. on the Belmont undercard. Also from the Repole string, GI Arkansas Derby winner **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union), 11th last time out in the Kentucky Derby, worked in company with GSW Caixa Electronica (Arromanches). The duo negotiated the trip in 1:00.77, the 12th fastest of 28 at the distance.

"I thought it was a typical work from Overanalyze [in company with Caixa Electronica]," said Pletcher. "He's not an overzealous work horse. You kind of have to encourage him a little bit. I think when Johnny [Velazquez] encouraged him, he responded well."

Repole's **Midnight Taboo** (Langfuhr), runner up in the mud at Belmont May 8, and GII Fair Grounds Oaks winner and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Unlimited Budget** (Street Sense) went out together, going five furlongs in 1:00.68. It was the ninth-fastest of 28 at the distance yesterday.

Repole, who was on hand to watch his team work yesterday morning, offered a clearer picture of who might return for the third jewel in the Triple Crown.

"Right now I'd say Overanalyze is 100%, if everything stays right, Unlimited Budget is 75% and Midnight Taboo 60%," said Repole. "It's a tough decision. Midnight Taboo (who broke his maiden at Aqueduct Apr. 6) has done nothing to say not to run. With Unlimited Budget, do you run against Dreaming of Julia [in the GI Mother Goose S. June 22] or do you run against the boys? We'll do what's right for the horse."

Regarding the jockey situation for his Belmont troupe, Pletcher added, "We're still in the process of firming it up. We've got Mike Smith to ride Palace Malice, Johnny [Velazquez] is holding the race for [a Pletcher horse]. We have Javier on Revolutionary and Garrett Gomez is riding one."

Another top runner from the Pletcher barn sent out for a morning tightener was Let's Go Stable's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Verrazano** (More Than Ready), who was preparing for the June 16 GIII Pegasus S. at Monmouth Park. Targeting Monmouth's July 28 GI Haskell Invitational, the handsome bay worked four furlongs over the Belmont training track in :48.06. Under John Velazquez, the handsome bay galloped out five panels in 1:00 flat.

Freedom Child Works at Belmont...

Freedom Child (Malibu Moon), an impressive winner of Belmont's GII Peter Pan S. May 11, breezed five panels in :57.87 under exercise rider John Mason on Monday in preparation for the June 8 Belmont S. "I thought he went super," said trainer Tom Albertrani. "The rider sat there with a nice hold of him and he looked like he was just galloping down the lane. We just wanted to let him go in hand. Typically, he can get aggressive when he's feeling good, so the rider had a nice hold of him early on. It looked like he was just running through the bridle the first three-eighths, and he just gave him a little slack down the lane. He responded well and did it all nice and easy. This week he'll just do some light galloping and maybe a real easy work next time or a good strong gallop out. I just don't want him to do too much on top of the race. Today was a pretty strong work, so we'll just kind of let him get there."

Incognito Possible for Belmont...

Incognito (A.P. Indy), fifth in the GII Peter Pan S., worked four furlongs in :50.01 Monday. Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said that the Darley colorbearer is possible for the GI Belmont S. "He worked well, and Jimmy Bell [President of Darley America] was here, so we're going to talk about it in the next day or two and see if we give it a shot," said McLaughlin. "The main reason we're even talking about it is that he truly wants a mile and a half and you don't get many opportunities."

Saint Vigeur Doubtful for Belmont...

Peter Pan runner-up **Saint Vigeur** (Smart Strike) is unlikely to run in the Belmont S., according to trainer Chad Brown. "Number one, he popped a quarter crack, so first and foremost I have to get that addressed," explained Brown. "Number two, we were always kind of on the fence anyway. We like the horse, we think he's a nice horse and he ran good in the Peter Pan, but I don't know if he's quite ready for a Grade I. Those factors and the quarter crack kind of made our decision for us. I'd say I'm 90% sure I'm not going to run."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Pool Play Pointing to Stephen Foster...

Mark Casse confirmed yesterday that 2011 GI Stephen Foster H. victor **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy) will contest this year's renewal of the race at Churchill Downs June 15. "We know he likes the distance and he likes Churchill," Casse said of the 8-year-old, winless in four tries since taking last October's GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. "We also want to keep him safe. That's our number one concern. We pick our spots with him. He's our old guy in the barn." Casse added of the Farish colorbearer, who was 36-1 in his Foster win, "His recent form hasn't been great, but we're going to give it a shot. We know we'll be a longshot again, but with the perfect storm and perfect trip, we may have a chance."

In other Stephen Foster news, trainer Charlie LoPresti said that he may send Morton Fink homebred **Successful Dan** (Successful Appeal) for his first work since taking the Apr. 21 GIII Ben Ali S. next Saturday under the Twin Spires. Successful Dan's Horse of the Year half-brother **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) is not, however, being pointed to the Foster. "We toyed with the idea, but if he runs anywhere [at the Churchill Spring Meet], he'll run in the [GII] Firecracker [S. on the turf June 29]," LoPresti said of the latter.

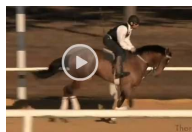

STREET CRY FILLY TOPS NATIONAL OPENER

A trio of fillies led the bidding during the opening session of the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale on the Gold Coast yesterday, headed by a Street Cry (Ire) filly who was hammered down for A\$280,000

(US\$269,555) to Bill Mitchell on behalf of Segenhoe Thoroughbreds. From the family of multiple Group 1 winner Forensics (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}) and sires Snippets (Aus) (Lunchtime) and Not A Single Doubt (Aus) (Redoute's Choice

{Aus}), [lot 198](#) is out of the winning Lonhro (Aus) mare Munhro (Aus), and was from the Sledmere Stud draft.

"She's really a lovely individual and looks a great prospect," Mitchell said. "We're very happy to be able to buy her from her breeder Michael Sissian. The family is one well known with Segenhoe and it is great she will get the chance to continue that tradition."

About five minutes later a Fastnet Rock (Aus) filly passed through the ring to earn the second highest price of the day of A\$260,000 (US\$250,301) from the bid of Tony Williams for BC3 Thoroughbreds. The daughter of graded stakes winner Native Song (Aus) (Mellifont {Aus}) is from a prolific family that includes A Little Kiss (NZ) (Sackford), Able One (NZ) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and Rebel Raider (Aus) (Reset {Aus}). [Lot 201](#) was consigned by Coolmore Stud. Another daughter of Fastnet Rock provided the third highest price of the session, when [Lot 188](#) brought A\$200,000 (US\$192,539) from South Africa's World Wide Bloodstock. From the draft of Tyreel Stud, the bay is out of stakes winner Mohegan Sky (Straight Man) and from the family of Group 1 winner Absolut Glam (Aus) (Snowland {Aus}).

The highest-priced colt of the day was [lot 65](#), a son of Exceed and Excel (Aus), who brought A\$180,000 (US\$173,285) from Bruce and Maureen Harvey's New Zealand-based Ascot Farm. He was offered by Rosari Farm.

Figures were up across the board, with an increased gross of A\$4,781,850 for 138 horses sold from last year's figure of A\$4,767,000 from 146 sold. The average of A\$34,651 climbed 6%, and the number of RNA's dropped to 17% from 24%. The sale continues today with a second weanling session, followed by broodmares Wednesday through Friday.

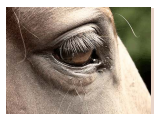

In terms of make and shape, Dubawi may not be everyone's idea of the ideal Thoroughbred. He's medium sized, compact and muscular, without the size and scope which plenty of breeders look for. But here is a case of handsome is as handsome does.

Dubawi would be very high on my list of favorite stallions, part of his appeal being that he can sire quality winners over a wide range of distances and at any age, including at two. He also has the major

attraction of having a pedigree free of such ubiquitous European influences as Sadler's Wells, Danehill and Green Desert. As a son of Dubai Millennium, a superstar who possessed all the size Dubawi lacks, Dubawi can sire individuals with plenty of scope, such as Al Kazeem.

In early April, this conqueror of Camelot in Sunday's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup was described by his trainer Roger Charlton as "a stunning-looking horse with a great record and pedigree."

The 5-year-old has vindicated this assessment by winning Group races on each of his subsequent appearances, improving his record to five wins and four seconds in his last nine appearances. One can only wonder how good his record would look had he not been sidelined by a stress fracture to his pelvis after his impressive victory in last year's G2 Jockey Club S.

Al Kazeem is a member of Dubawi's second crop. His first, numbering 118 foals, has achieved the remarkable feat of producing 11 group winners, including five at Group 1 level. It would have been fair to expect that his 115-strong second crop would struggle to match those exceptional figures, but it actually registered its 12th group winner when Prince Adepto scored in Italy two days ago. Al Kazeem follows Waldpark and Hunter's Light as its third Group 1 scorer. **Cont. p15**

Dubawi's popularity took a hit in 2008, when he was moved from England to Ireland for his third season. Consequently there were 78 foals in this crop, which has so far produced four group winners. Dubawi's fee was then cut substantially in his fourth season, to only £15,000. Even this reduction didn't work, as his fourth crop numbers just 61 (including Fort Knox, a runner in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas).

Happily, a pair of first-crop 2-year-old Group 2 winners in 2009 helped steady the ship. With his fee increased to £20,000, Dubawi has a 120-strong 2011 crop, which is already producing winners. He covered 139 mares at a fee of £55,000 in 2011, followed by 145 mares at £75,000 in 2012. In other words, there is the exciting prospect that the best is yet to come from this 11-year-old stallion.

The comment that Al Kazeem has a great pedigree is reflected in the fact that his second dam, Kanz, was the top-priced yearling filly of 1982, when \$2,100,000 was paid at Saratoga for this daughter of The Minstrel. A product of Keswick Stables in Virginia, Kanz went some way towards justifying her price, carrying Sheikh Mohammed's colors to victory in the G3 Princess Elizabeth S. over 1 1/16 miles. She was also second in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, earning a Timeform rating of 115.

Of course there was every expectation that Kanz would go much further towards justifying her price as a broodmare. She was, after all, a daughter of Rough'n Tumble's celebrated daughter Treasure Chest, who had enjoyed considerable success as a producer. As many as 10 of Treasure Chest's foals were fillies and they did so well that her last daughter, foaled when she was 22, still sold for \$1,600,000.

The stars of the Treasure Chest show included Diomedia, Crown Treasure, Frontonian and Carefully Hidden, her daughters by Sea-Bird, Graustark, Buckpasser and Caro. All four became the dam of at least one European group winner, the most successful being Crown Treasure's Group 1-winning Mill Reef colts Glint of Gold and Diamond Shoal and Carefully Hidden's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Ensconse.

Several of Treasure Chest's granddaughters have also enjoyed group success as broodmares and Al Kazeem is their fifth Group 1 winner. Their predecessors include Armiger (Racing Post Trophy), Zanzibar (Oaks d'Italia), Catella (third in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf) and Floral Pegasus (a top performer in Hong Kong). Other distinguished members of the Treasure Chest female line are Shining Energy (G1 Gamely H.) and Law Enforcement (last year's G1 Gran Criterium). Incidentally, Law Enforcement represents the same Lawman-Rainbow Quest cross as Sunday's Irish 1000 Guineas winner Just The Judge, as I pointed out in this column on [Oct. 16](#) last year.

Rather unexpectedly, Kanz didn't play a significant part in Treasure Chest's success story until Al Kazeem came along. Kanz started out as a member of the Darley broodmare band and her mates included Mill Reef, his sons Shirley Heights and Reference Point and Shirley Heights's son Darshaan. This route had been signposted by the considerable success that Paul Mellon's Crown Treasure had enjoyed with Mill Reef.

Kanz's Darshaan colt Treasurer showed very useful form as a 3-year-old in the U.S. in 1995, but Kanz had been sold by then, for only \$80,000 at Keeneland in 1994. Although Kanz remained in Kentucky for a couple of years, she was returned to Europe for a return visit to Treasurer's sire Darshaan in 1997, the result being Al Kazeem's dam Kazeem. After shaping like a potentially useful middle-distance performer in a pair of juvenile starts, Kazeem managed only one subsequent start.

Kazeem, like her son, was bred by Mr and Mrs John Deer. The mare is one of an increasingly rare breed in Europe in that she has no inbreeding in the first five generations. However, Kazeem's mating with Dubawi produced 4x3 inbreeding to Shirley Heights (as well as 5x4 to Northern Dancer). Inbreeding to Shirley Heights is a feature in the pedigrees of quite a few good winners by Dubawi. Others inbred 4x3 to the 1978 Derby and Irish Derby winner include the G1 Premio Roma and G1 Al Maktoum Challenge winner Hunter's Light and the surprisingly speedy Group 3 winner Astrophysical Jet. Then there's the 2011 2000 Guineas second Dubawi Gold, who is inbred 4x4. **Cont. p16**

Al Kazeem is easily his dam's most successful foal so far. The list of stallions visited by Kazeem act as a reminder of the level that Dubawi was at when Al Kazeem was conceived in 2007. Her 2005 mate, Royal Applause, was priced at £20,000, as was her next mate, Motivator. After foaling Al Kazeem, she visited Authorized (£25,000) before going back to Royal Applause (£9,000). With Dubawi's early success effectively putting him out of this sort of price range, Kazeem visited his 2000 Guineas-winning son Makfi in 2011 and 2012.

If you look at Darshaan's career as a broodmare sire, it quickly becomes obvious that the Sadler's Wells male line is considered the surest path to success. The stallions with the highest number of foals out of daughters of Darshaan are Sadler's Wells and his sons Galileo, Barathea and Montjeu, with another son, Refuse To Bend, in sixth place. Then come four Danzig line stallions.

This year is acting as a reminder, though, that Darshaan mares can work with other bloodlines. Sajjhaa, who did so well in Dubai, is by King's Best and there are also group winners by Monsun and Dubawi. Al Kazeem is Dubawi's only horse aged three or over with a Darshaan dam but there is also a 2-year-old in training with Saeed bin Suroor. No doubt there will be more Darshaan mares heading Dubawi's way in the future, though it must be remembered that the youngest of them will be 12 in 2014.
