THE WORST-KEPT SECRET

She may have been under the radar prior to her seasonal bow at Lingfield, but **Secret Gesture (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) was on everyone's lips after surging to prominence in that venue's Listed Oaks Trial May 11, and holds pole position in today's G1 Investec Oaks. Such was the dominance of Newsells Park Stud's

homebred in that 11-furlong prep, Sheikh Fahad has stepped in for a half share, and it may be that European racing's newest heavyweight has acquired instant Classic glory. Trainer Ralph Beckett, who won this five years ago with Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) and also saddles another trial-winning contender in **Talent (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}), finds it hard to keep a lid on his enthusiasm for the favorite. "I hope she's special, but I'm not brave enough to say that just yet," he explained. "She's quite a narrow, light-framed filly, but she's been straightforward all of her life. She beat them convincingly at Lingfield and came out of the race very well. The way she travels, I don't think the track will be a big issue and while Look Here got into a flap in the paddock before she won the Oaks, this filly should be fine." **Investec Oaks cont. p3**

CORNERSTONE GETS DETTORI

Jockey Frankie Dettori was cleared yesterday by France Galop to resume his riding career, and it was announced by Team Valor that the champion jockey would partner **First Cornerstone (Ire)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly.

"We are very pleased to have Frankie ride First Cornerstone," said Barry Irwin, CEO of Team Valor. "He's a world-class rider, and he knows how to win this race." Dettori looks to claim his third edition of the French Classic, which he most recently won aboard Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) in 2005. A Group 2 winner in Ireland last season, First Cornerstone was held up by a respiratory ailment earlier this year and made a belated seasonal debut in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas on Saturday, finishing fifth. The colt had initially been under consideration for tomorrow's G1 Investec Derby, but it was decided France's feature was in his best interest. "Coming back in a week, we think the shorter distance will be better for First Cornerstone," Irwin said.

APPROACH HEADS DERBY DOZEN

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) will defend his unbeaten record against 11 rivals in tomorrow's G1 Investec Derby, with a draw in seven placing him in an ideal spot in the middle of the pack. Trainer Jim Bolger has reported Godolphin's G1 2000 Guineas winner to have enjoyed a perfect preparation for the coveted Classic double which has been achieved by the last two colts to try, Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). As expected, Aidan O'Brien declared five with only the G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas winner **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) scratched from his initial team, and the unbeaten May 9 G3 Chester Vase winner **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) has landed the "lucky" stall 10 which has held seven winners since 1986. More rain fell at Epsom yesterday and Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper said, "We've had nearly an inch of rain this week and after walking it this morning, I'd have to call it good-to-soft, soft in places. The year High Chaparral won was undoubtedly the softest Derby I've had and this year will be similar. I can't see the Derby now being run on anything appreciably better than good-to-soft." **Cont. p4**

By Name and By Nature...

Talent, who has this Classic in her blood with her third dam being Dick Hollingsworth's 1980 Oaks heroine Bireme (GB), is a serious second-string for Beckett and she beat some promising types including the re-opposing **Madame Defarge (Ire)** (Motivator {GB}) in the Listed Pretty Polly S. over 10 furlongs at Newmarket last time May 5. Like Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), who took that contest en route to Oaks glory in 2004, she is unexposed and open to much improvement. "She has done very well since the Pretty Polly S., both physically and in her work, and if she was my only runner I'd be looking forward to the race," her trainer said. "She was very keen early there and won despite doing things all the wrong way. She's well-balanced, will handle the whole day, the track and her pedigree says she will stay. She's different to Secret Gesture in that she's a very tough, robust filly mentally. She has a genuine chance." The last winner of this to have contested the G1 1000 Guineas was Casual Look (Red Ransom) 10 years ago, but it was impossible to ignore the promise that Ballydoyle's **Moth (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) showed when third in the latest edition May 5. Staying on strongly at the end, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's blueblood is bred much more for this trip than that mile and can only improve for the rise in distance. **Cont. p4**

It is interesting that her stable companion **Say (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who is a daughter of Riskaverse (Dynaformer), is the only other from that stable chosen for this line-up and she was visually impressive when winning a minor event by nine lengths at Cork May 10. One of two unbeaten fillies in the start list is the supplemented **Banoffee (Ire)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}), who annexed the Listed Cheshire Oaks last time May 8. Michael Kerr-Dineen and Lord Hambleton's bay had a lot against her in that prep around Chester's tight and unforgiving circuit, but still came out comfortably on top of **Gertrude Versed (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}). "She looked in trouble from the start at Chester and will have learnt a lot there," trainer Hughie Morrison commented of the filly, who also debuted in the same Newbury maiden won by past Oaks heroines Eswarah (GB) (Unfuwain) and Dancing Rain (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}). "The way she did it at Chester showed she can travel, quicken and stay." Gertrude Versed, who is bred and owned by trainer John Gosden's wife Rachel Hood, is an outsider who has the potential to improve off her latest trial second as her half-sister Gertrude Bell (GB) (Sinndar {Ire}) did when fourth here three years ago. "Gertrude Versed has been in good form since Chester and I think the winner of that race was rightly supplemented for the Oaks--it is not a decision they would have made lightly," Gosden said. "It looks to be solid form. There are some high-quality fillies in the race and I think the track should be no problem for our filly--there is only one way to find out and that is by running."

The Softer the Better?...

The prevailing underfoot conditions may benefit the sole British-trained contender of real merit in **Libertarian (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}), who hails not from the powerhouses of Stoute, Cecil or Gosden but Elaine Burke in Middleham, North Yorkshire. The North of England has not sent an Epsom Derby winner down since Dante (GB) in 1945 and it was in the race named after that horse that its latest flagbearer entered the picture for the blue riband. Jumping up markedly from a distant fourth in the Apr. 26 G3 Sandown Classic Trial, the chestnut, who was added into this contest at the second stage in April, beat Trading Leather (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and Indian Chief (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) from the Bolger and O'Brien stables, respectively, in the all-important York prep last time May 16. Elaine's husband Karl Burke is hopeful of a bold show.

“He’s come out of the Dante as well as could be hoped,” Burke said of Libertarian. “He lost seven kilos at York, but has put that on quickly and we’re very happy with him. The Investec Derby meeting has been lucky for us, I think we’ve had seven or eight winners over the years, but I don’t think I’ve had an entry in the Investec Derby, let alone a runner. It has created a buzz in the yard, but we’re not doing anything differently. He’ll have another blow on Tuesday next week and that will be it. Like a lot of people, I think we’d like the race to be a bit later on as he’s not the finished article yet. He’s a high-class horse, he’s guaranteed to stay the trip and, if handles the track, I can see him running into a place.” Libertarian was well adrift of another Irish raider in **Galileo Rock (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the Sandown Classic Trial and that colt is open to improvement on that third placing on only his third start. Michael O’Flynn’s colt relished the rain-softened ground on which he scored by seven lengths over a mile on debut at Leopardstown in August, and trainer David Wachman is hopeful that he can make an impact. “The plan was always to go to Sandown and then the Derby,” Wachman told the *Irish Times*. “The favorite has the best form from the Guineas, but Epsom is a one-off place and we think our horse will run well.”

CHOPIN CARRIES HOPES OF GERMANY

Trainer Andreas Wohler never even considered Chopin (Ger) as a G1 Investec Derby horse. The German trainer knew that the son of Santiago (Ger) was good, but his sights were set on the G1 German Derby before Sheikh Fahad Al Thani stepped in.

After taking a Group 3 at Krefeld in April by eight lengths, there was significant international interest in buying Chopin, but the impressive winner was snapped up by Sheikh Fahad's team.

Even after that success, there were quotes of 40-1 about Chopin for the Derby, but the colt, who will be ridden in tomorrow's Epsom showpiece by Jamie Spencer, now trades at as

short as 8-1 for the Investec-sponsored extravaganza.

Wohler has never been to Derby day, but the 51-year-old trainer has ridden around Epsom before, and was recreating the buzz in his mind at Breakfast With The Stars this week.

"The Derby is the Derby of Derbies, the race of races and the original," he said. "I have never been here for the race but I always watch it at home. On the day itself it will be a special day with a big crowd. If you don't feel pressure on a day like this you are in the wrong place. I've never been here on Derby day, but I can just imagine it. German Derby day is the biggest day in our racing calendar, but this is another step up on that."

Wohler rode in the Amateur Rider's Derby 30 years ago at Epsom, and coming into Tattenham Corner leading the field he knew he had gone off too fast and was simply waiting for the chance to get back to the weighing room and back on the ferry to Germany.

"It was a great feeling and very exciting," Wohler said. "I had to make the running but kept pole position to Tattenham Corner. I was probably going a bit too quick as there were four or five of us in a line. I think in terms of giving advice to Jamie Spencer he has more experience than I have."

Chopin will be Germany's first runner in the Derby. Foreign challengers are hardly new, but it took 85 years before a French-bred horse struck in the 12-furlong contest when Gladiateur (Fr) earned himself the sobriquet of the "Avenger of Waterloo" with his victory in 1865. Kisber (Hun) was the first horse foaled in Hungary to win in 1876, while Iroquois, owned by tobacco millionaire Pierre Lorillard, was the first horse bred in America to triumph in 1881.

Winners trained abroad took a lot longer to hit the mark with Orby (GB) striking first for Ireland in 1907 for Frederick McCabe and Dunbar, owned and trained in France by American Herman Duryea, becoming the first of nine French horses to win in 1914.

The stoutness of German breeding would seem to be tailor-made for the demands of Epsom. Wohler's Lomitas (GB) (Niniski) was a multiple Group 1 winner over 12 furlongs in 1991, while his Paolini (Ger) (Lando {Ger}) was also a winner at the highest level a decade later. Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) showed it was more than a trend when she won the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in 2011. With Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger})--also trained by Wohler--and the Coral Eclipse-bound Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) two of the few 3-year-olds worldwide last season to beat their elders in open Group 1 races it is clear that German horses are extremely competitive.

"In Germany he is outstanding, but compared to Irish and English horses we just don't know yet," said Wohler, who trains a string of over 100 in Bremen. "It is very exciting thing, not only for me but for the German racing industry. German breeding is doing really well and our top-class horses are doing well internationally, but we have to step up as a whole." **Cont. p7**

German horses may have the genes, but those genes are not steeled on undulating tracks such as Epsom. Only Dusseldorf can boast anything like the up and down nature of Epsom, which has a sweeping left-hand rise of 134 feet before a descent of 34 feet around Tottenham Corner leading into a cambered straight. Wohler took Chopin to Dusseldorf when the Derby plan was initiated with a view to giving him experience. Spencer flew to Germany to partner the horse in a spin going the wrong way around the course over five furlongs. As an effort it was noble, but as a preparation for one of the most idiosyncratic tests in world racing it falls woefully short.

"We were thinking about coming to Epsom [for Breakfast With the Stars] with the horse, but it is a long way, which is why we went to Dusseldorf, which has the biggest ups and downs in Germany," Wohler continued. "He handled it really well and Jamie was happy with him. As a 2-year-old his first race involved an overnight stay and it was easy. So I wouldn't worry about this. We will be coming on Friday."

The process of supplementing a horse to the Derby was introduced in 1998 and Kris Kin (Kris S.) was the first to succeed in 2003 after connections stumped up £90,000 at the five-day stage. As evidenced by what happened to Telescope this week, even the best-laid plans can go astray at any time. River Proud was supplemented in 2008, but never made it to the Surrey track.

Unlike Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}), Jim Bolger's overwhelming odds-on favorite, Chopin is almost guaranteed to the stay the Derby distance. Wohler only ran him in the nine-furlong event at Krefeld because it sat well with the horse's proposed program. Chopin's sire Santiago may have been a miler with his first Classic crop this season, but his dam is Caucasienne (Fr), a 13-furlong Galileo (Ire) filly who raced for John Hills.

"There are a lot of doubts about other horses staying. I think the horse has a proper chance of finishing in the first four, although it's a different thing to say that he could win," Sheikh Fahad said. "The Derby is the number one race in the world--the race you want to have a runner in. A race too that you want to have a runner with a proper chance, which is why we have not been represented until now."

Third in the G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg at the start of July, Girolamo was tried in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood later that month and followed a fourth there with a fifth in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in early September. Three weeks later, the homebred took advantage of a weak renewal of the G1 Preis Von Europa over this track and trip to register a first win at the top level and was out of his depth on his seasonal return when eighth behind St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. Fourth back in his native land in the 11-furlong G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Unternehmer at Baden-Baden last time May 12, the chestnut came to the fore in this simpler task to regain the winning thread. Settled in mid-pack early, he wore down Runaway and Wilddrossel passing the furlong marker and stayed on strongly for a convincing score.

Educated initially in the provinces, Gloomy Sunday was tried in black-type company for the first time in the G3 Prix des Reservoirs over a mile at Deauville in October 2011 and was a respectable fourth there before reverting to conditions races at the start of her sophomore year. Runner-up in the Listed Prix de Thiberville over 12 furlongs upped in class again on Longchamp's Bastille Day card, the bay was unable to match the pace of the middle-distance fillies and mares when seventh in the G2 Prix de Pomone back at Deauville the following month. Third in the 12-furlong Listed Prix Panacee in September and ninth in the G3 Prix Fille de l'Air over 1 5/16 miles at Toulouse in September and November, she was sent over just short of two miles for the first time on her seasonal bow and rewarded the enterprise with a second to last year's G1 Prix Royal-Oak winner Les Beaufs (Fr) (Apsis {GB}) in the Listed Prix Right Royal at Saint-Cloud last time Apr. 9. Settled in mid-division from the outset by Olivier Peslier, Gloomy Sunday was moved closer to the tepid pace before halfway and entered the home straight in prime position in a stalking third. Let go approaching the quarter pole as her fancied rivals floundered at the back, she opened up a decisive advantage and only needed to be kept up to her work to register a comfortable first pattern-race success. "It's very hard for the three-year-olds against the older horses over these distances, but now she's very mature," commented trainer Christophe Ferland after making an impact with his first runner in Britain. "She traveled very easily and he made the right decision to move up as the race had no pace. She's not entered in the G1 Gold Cup [at Royal Ascot June 20], so we'll talk to [owner] Mr. Springer and see what he wants to do but the ultimate target is the G1 Prix du Cadran [at Longchamp Oct. 6]."

Runner-up in Newmarket's Wood Ditton S. last April, Mukhadram was later awarded that mile debutantes affair after the Al Zarooni runner Mariner's Cross (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) provided a contaminated sample that was to prove the tip of an almighty iceberg. Returning to that track and trip to win a maiden the following month, the bay was sent to Royal Ascot to contest the G3 Tercentenary S. over this trip and appeared to run out of stamina when fourth. Keeping on in game fashion despite feeling the pinch up Sandown's grinding ascent, he was able to hold off the runner-up, who ran around and flashed his tail as the whip was applied. "He was supposed to run at Newmarket in the Earl of Sefton, but he had a problem a couple of days before that so it has taken longer to get him on the track than we hoped." trainer William Haggas' wife Maureen explained. "He's a big, gross horse who takes a lot of work and he doesn't need a week off, so we took him to Great Leighs a couple of weeks ago and that brought him on a lot. His pedigree says he might get further, but he's quite forward-going. He was weak and unbalanced last year but is much more mature this year and so he might be able to do what we always expected of him. If he's okay, I expect William would like to take him to [Royal] Ascot and I would think we'll stick to a mile and a quarter. He would be better on faster ground and we've always loved him."

PENN MAKES HISTORY WITH PENN MILE DAY

Penn National's stakes program received a face lift this year with the addition of the \$500,000 Penn Mile S. The stakes program was reorganized to take place on two big days: Penn Mile day June 1 and Fabulous Strike day Nov. 27.

"We changed our stakes schedule so that instead of a number of \$100,000 and \$150,000 stakes over the course of the year, we now have these two big days," said Dan Silver, Director of Racing Operations at Penn National.

Saturday's main attraction, the \$500,000 Penn Mile, is a one mile turf race for 3-year-olds. This is the largest purse that has ever been offered at Penn National.

"We have a great turf course here and in looking at the stakes schedule, there was a real gap between the GII American Turf at Churchill on Oaks day and the GII Virginia Derby in late July at Colonial," Silver said. "We thought if we put a big purse 3-year-old turf race in between those races, that we not only would have a good shot of getting some of those top horses that ran at Churchill, or even in the GIII Transylvania at Keeneland, but we also thought we might even get some horses out of the Kentucky Derby that wanted to go back to the turf."

The eight-horse Penn Mile field will feature top turf runners, such as **Noble Tune** (Unbridled's Song), **Rydliluc** (Medaglia d'Oro), **Jack Milton** (War Front) and **Charming Kitten** (Kitten's Joy).

"When we created the race, these are the types of horses we wanted to get and if you told me we would get all of these horses I would have been thrilled," Silver said.

The date for the Penn Mile was chosen partly based on fitting in the 10 to 11 week gap between the American Turf and Virginia Derby and partly to take advantage of the Triple Crown limelight

"We thought maybe by putting it during the Triple Crown races we could take advantage of some of the added interest around the country in racing during that time period," Silver said. "There are so many people that follow the Triple Crown. If we have a nice race for 3-year-olds during that time span, we can capitalize on that." **Cont. p10**

There will be seven stakes races on the card for Penn Mile day, including the \$250,000 Mountainview H. and the \$150,000 Pennsylvania Governor's Cup. The Mountainview features the likes of **Pants on Fire** (Jump Start) and 2011 GI Travers S. runner-up **Rattlesnake Bridge** (Tapit). The Governor's Cup drew multiple stakes winners, such as **Kyma** (Belong to Me), winner of this race last year; Pletcher trainee **Bridgetown** (Speightstown); popular veteran **Ben's Cat** (Parker's Storm Cat), and **Chamberlain Bridge** (War Chant), victor of the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

"We are thrilled with the way these races came up," Silver said. "The most exciting component for me for the on-track fans is that they are going to have a chance to see jockeys like John Velazquez, Joel Rosario, and Javier Castellano for the first time because none of those guys have ever ridden at Penn National. It is a big deal for our fans to see guys like that live."

Another large part of Penn Mile day will be the focus on equine aftercare. Penn National will be splitting a \$10,000 donation among three equine aftercare groups: New Vocations, ReRun, and CANTER. Metro Meteor, a retired racehorse well-known for his painting abilities, will be on-site helping to promote the equine aftercare cause. The gelding, whose last start was at Penn, has produced over \$50,000 in earnings from his paintings to New Vocations.

"It is something that is going to be fun, exciting, and also important for raising money for equine aftercare," Silver said. "I think being involved with stuff like that is something we want to do more and more of."

Penn Mile day was designed to attract some of the racing industry's best to the track and it seems to have been accomplished.

"This is the biggest day in the history of Penn National," Silver concluded. "We have never had a day like this with these purses, and the jockeys coming in, and the trainers, and these top horses. It is just going to be exciting for everyone associated with Penn National."



FREEDOM CHILD BRINGS IN OWNERS FROM ALL OVER As GI Peter Pan S. romper **Freedom Child** (Malibu Moon) revs up for next Saturday's GI Belmont S., West Point Thoroughbreds founder and president Terry Finley appeared on the NTRA's "Road to the Triple Crown" teleconference Thursday to provide more background on the up-and-coming star and his ownership group.

Bred by B. Wayne Hughes' Spendthrift Farm, the Tom Albertrani trainee is owned in thirds by Hughes, West Point and St. Elias Stable. He caught the eye of Finley at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling sale and, thanks to a longstanding relationship with Hughes, Finley was able to set up an ownership arrangement before the chestnut ever stepped into the ring. He would sell to West Point for \$350,000, with bloodstock agent Buzz Chace signing the ticket.

"We've been friends with Wayne Hughes for about 15 years and every year we'd go to the yearling sales and he and I would say that if either one of us found a really top colt we'd go partners on him," recalled Finley. "[Hughes is] looking for stallion prospects, and we're looking for really good colts and fillies. So two years ago I ran into this colt and I really loved him."

Finley continued, "He knocked our socks off at Fasig-Tipton and I noticed that Wayne had bred this horse. That night, I ran across him at a cocktail party and we started talking about this colt and he loved him, but he's in a position where he's got to sell across the board. He can't just sell the bad ones. But he loved this colt, so after our conversation, we put a partnership together and Wayne said he'd keep a part of this horse."

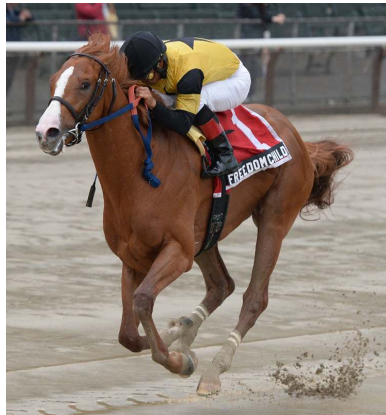
It was a much newer relationship that would lead to hip 81's name, as Cleveland-based rock singer Misty Gonzalez and media mogul Tom Wilson had ventured to the same sale and were interested in joining up with West Point. Their business partnership is called Freedom Child Entertainment.

"Two years ago, they wanted to come to a sale and they ended up at Saratoga for the weekend," offered Finley. "This was the first sale they had ever been to and we bought this colt. He was the first hip in the ring on Day Two of the Fasig-Tipton sale in 2011. [Tom and Misty] had just had dinner and they were having a wonderful time and they were the first ones to invest and buy an interest, so right there we decided that this colt's name was going to be Freedom Child. We think it worked out very well and I really like the name."

A pair of couples with more previous racing experience also make up West Point's piece.

"There are several really good partners," Finley said. "I have a young Wall Streeter, Rob Masiello, and his wife Skye--they've been longtime partners of ours; and Herb and Ellen Moelis, they're from Delaware, and they've really done great things for the industry--they started the Thoroughbred Charities of America and they ran the organization for about 20 years and that organization has given well over \$1 million back to a number of different charities. It's really a good partnership and we all get along. We own a really nice colt and that's the power of the partnership."

St. Elias Stable, the third entity with a stake in Freedom Child, is the nom de course of New York-based financier Vincent Viola--a West Point graduate like Finley--and his wife Teresa.

"St. Elias--Vinny and Teresa Viola--are new owners in the game," explained Finley. "At that time, I think this was their second horse that they had bought. Now they have about 35 in their racing stable, so they really kind of jumped in with both feet, but they're great partners. They're from Brooklyn and they used to come to the Belmont as kids, so there's good karma around here."

With a sharp drill in :59 4/5 at Big Sandy Monday, trainer Tom Albertrani thinks Freedom Child is ready for "The Test of the Champion."

Finley noted, "Tom Albertrani is not a guy to really tout his barn, but I know that Tom is very optimistic and his confidence level is very high. As a result, all the partners' confidence levels are very high as well."

If the veteran conditioner is right, look for this diverse cast of characters in the Belmont winner's circle come next Saturday.

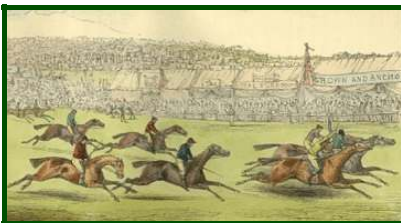

Ward said the last time there was that much excitement in the barn was when Dakota Phone (Zavata) registered a major upset in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Churchill Downs in 2010. "It was the same rider [Joel Rosario], the same distance and a big race," he said. Though he successfully stretched out to eight furlongs Monday, Sahara Sky will be kept around one turn and will be pointed for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita Nov. 2, Ward indicated.

FIGURES RISE AT MM BROODMARE SALE

The final select session of the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale at the Gold Coast Thursday was without the leading prices from Wednesday's first session--with no black-type performers off the track to sell--but it was remarkable nevertheless, with a final clearance rate of 89.3% over the two day sale. Figures across the board were up with the gross increasing 50% over last year's select sale to almost A\$29,847,500 (US\$28,895,203).

Experienced observers of broodmare sales could not recall both such a high clearance rate and the strength of a sale throughout the two sessions. Buybacks were the exception, and selling progressed at a very strong rate. The Patinack Farm Reduction Sale continued with prices that were measurably up on what they would have been last year; mares carrying to Exceed And Excel (Aus) were in demand and the market reached a new level. Ironically, Racing New South Wales released news during the session of the latest increases in stakes for Sydney metropolitan racing for midweek and Sunday prizemoney to A\$40,000 per race (from A\$35,000), and public holiday prize money to A\$50,000 per race (from A\$42,250), all of which underpins the market strength. **Cont. p13**

Lord Lloyd-Webber Leaves His Mark...

The sale topper on Thursday was [lot 859](#), Our Pride And Joy (Aus) (Canny Lad {Aus}--Mica's Pride {Aus}, by Bite The Bullet), with BBA Ireland's Adrian Nicoll signing at A\$600,000 (US\$580,662). The four-time winning mare was from the draft of Tyrell Stud, as agent, and is in foal to freshman sire Foxwedge (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). Nicoll purchased her for Breeding Capital Partnership--a partnership between Sir Andrew and Lady Lloyd Webber's Watership Down Stud in England and Yarraman Farm in New South Wales. He confirmed that Kneeling (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), signed for on Wednesday for A\$380,000, was also for the Breeding Capital Partnership.

Stakes-winning juvenile Paprika (Aus) (General Nediym {Aus}), [lot 865](#) in foal to Sepoy (Aus) in her maiden season at stud, was the second top seller when she was signed for by bloodstock agent James Harron for A\$550,000 (US\$531,746). Harron indicated that the mare was for Coolmore, with Pierro (Aus) her likely mating in the spring. Group 1-winning mare Universal Queen (NZ) (Scenic {Ire}), [lot 1011](#), is also headed to Coolmore after being purchased by Tom Magnier for A\$480,000 (US\$464,044) from the Strawberry Hill Stud draft.

Typical of the strength of the sale was Brett Howard's signing through his Randwick Bloodstock Agency of [lot 848](#), Munhro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}--Regrowth {Aus}, by Unbridled's Song), for A\$385,000 (US\$372,202). Howard, buying on behalf of Bylong Park Thoroughbreds, was out in front of sale ring and he fended off the strong opposition of Vinery Stud's Adam White, who was bidding by telephone outside the parade ring.

The bids went back and forth with little pause, but eventually White finished the call, signaling Howard's success in securing the mare. Howard was on Monday the underbidder on Munhro's weanling filly by Street Cry (Ire), which was picked up by Segenhoe Stud for A\$280,000 (US\$270,705). Her first foal is a Fastnet Rock (Aus) colt and she is in foal to freshman sire Hinchinbrook (Aus). Munhro's dam Regrowth, a stakes winner and the half-sister to Prove It--the dam of G1 Golden Slipper winner Forensics (Aus)--has had four foals to race and all are winners, including Group 3 winner Colour (Aus) (More Than Ready).

"I love this family and it gets better all the time," said Howard. "She is a winner and she is leaving great progeny,"

Peter Molony, representing David Redvers Bloodstock, was active throughout the sale with five purchases for a total of A\$876,000. His purchase of [lot 883](#), Positive Dream (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}--Fayfa {Ire}, by Slip Anchor {GB}) was typical of the demand for mares in foal to Darley's current champion Australian sire Exeed And Excel. Fayfa has had 11 foals to race with eight winners, including stakes winner Hillfa (Aus) (Danehill), dam of current stakes winner Walk With Attitude (Aus) (Hussonet), and winners and black-type placed Impulsive Dream (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) and Love Jeddah (Aus) (Danehill). Other mares sold in foal to the sire included [lot 878](#), Pleasantsundaygirl (NZ) (Cape Cross {Ire}), for A\$210,000 and [lot 879](#), Plucky Lady (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), for A\$210,000 (US\$203,028).

Patinack's Reduction benefitted from the strength of the market. A further 53 Patinack lots were sold, with a top price of A\$240,000 (US\$232,016) for [lot 818](#), Maha Chakri (Aus) (Beautiful Crown) and the lowest price A\$1,000 for [lot 1025](#), Washingtonsymphony (Jpn) (Stravinsky). In total, the Patinack Reduction of 107 fillies and mares and 23 weanlings at the National Sale grossed A\$10,712,500. Patinack Farm still retains a further 150 mares and 150 weanlings, and eight stallions. Those mares are generally considered to be best of the operation and include Group 1 winners Devil Moon (Aus), Heavenly Glow (Aus), Linky Dink (NZ), Ocean Bridge (Aus), Sun Classique (Aus) and Victory Vein (Aus).

The two day select National Broodmare Sale rounded out with A\$29,847,500 traded on 416 lots sold at an average price of A\$71,749 over the past two days. The clearance rate soared from almost 74% last year to over 89% this year. The leading buyer of the sale by total spent was the Vieira Group, with 22 lots purchased for over A\$2 million. Victoria's Rosemont Stud was the biggest buyer by numbers with 25 lots at a spend of over A\$1.4 million.

"What a spectacular sale from start to finish," Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox reported. "It's been a tremendously rewarding result for vendors, buyers and also Magic Millions. The statistics tell the story of the sale. To follow on from a successful weanling sale and to sell nine out of 10 horses through the ring is a clear indicator to the success of the sale."

Congressman Barr Introduces Racing-Friendly Bill:

Congressman Andy Barr of Kentucky's Sixth District has introduced [legislation](#) which would make permanent for all racehorses the three-year depreciation schedule that is set to expire this year. "Providing the certainty of a three-year depreciation schedule is critical to the health of Kentucky's signature horse racing industry, as well as job growth in other horse-related industries," said Barr. "That's why I am proud to introduce H.R. 2212, the Race Horse Cost Recovery Act, a bill to make permanent the three-year depreciation schedule, which will encourage more job creation and investment in Kentucky's signature equine industry, and end the uncertainty of the current, temporary depreciation schedule for race horses." He continued, "Kentucky's horse industry contributes \$4 billion annually to our economy and provides over 80,000 direct and indirect jobs to Americans. We must protect this investment and these jobs for the sake of Kentucky's hard-working families."
