REPOLE SENDING THREE TO BELMONT

Mike Repole revealed Monday evening that he will send **"TDN Rising Star"** **Unlimited Budget** (Street Sense) as well as **Midnight Taboo** (Langfuhr) to Saturday's GI Belmont S. along with the previously confirmed **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union). Unlimited Budget, a MGSW and third last time in the GI Kentucky Oaks, will try to become the first filly to win the Classic since fellow Todd Pletcher trainee Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) snapped a more than 100-year drought for members of the fairer sex in the 2007 Belmont. "I really think that this year the fillies are just as good as the colts," Repole said of his decision to run Unlimited Budget.

"She's been training great. She's a very big filly--in fact, when you see her in the race you'll think she's a colt." Fittingly, Rosie Napravnik will ride Unlimited Budget, while Garret Gomez will pilot Midnight Taboo. Of what it would mean to win the most prestigious race run in his backyard, Repole added, "Growing up a kid from Queens, I've been watching this race since Woody Stephens won five in a row when I was 13-year-old... I love New York, I love racing at Belmont, Aqueduct and Saratoga and I'm never going to make it a secret how bad I want to win this race."

FRAC DADDY CONFIRMED FOR BELMONT

Trainer Ken McPeck confirmed Monday that Magic City Thoroughbred Partners' **Frac Daddy** (Scat Daddy) will run in Saturday's GI Belmont S. "Talking to Carter Stewart, the principal partner for Magic City, he's game," said McPeck, who sent out Sarava (Wild Again) to a 70-1 upset in the 2002 Belmont and Atigun (Istan) to a third-place finish here last year. "We still believe this is a really, really good horse, but for whatever reason it hasn't happened for him. Sometimes you throw deep and it goes incomplete, but you can't score if you don't throw. [Stewart] is the ideal client to throw deep and we won the [GI] Travers for him last year [with 33-1 dead-heat winner Golden Ticket {Speightstown}]." **Cont. p3**

SAINT-CLOUD RETURN FOR CIRRUS

Corine Barande-Barbe has set the June 23 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud as the comeback target for **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}), ruling out a tilt at the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot four days earlier. Off the track since finishing runner-up to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Champion S. in October, the 7-year-old strained a ligament while preparing for the G1 Hong Kong Vase in December. "We're now thinking that Saint-Cloud is the better option due to timing," his trainer told the *Racing Post*, "He's in extremely good form and, although he's done no serious work, I'm very pleased with him."

ROYAL DATE FOR AL KAZEEM

John Deer's **Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) will take in the June 19 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, trainer Roger Charlton announced yesterday. After beating Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 26, the 5-year-old will cross swords with that rival again in the 10-furlong contest. "He's a magnificent horse and patience has been rewarded," Charlton told *PA Sport*. "At the moment, he's in great form and is lightly raced. He was impressive in Ireland and I see no reason why he wouldn't have a great chance in the Prince of Wales's. The Arc is the ultimate goal and it's the greatest test of the season. He's adaptable, stays a mile and a half and goes on soft ground, which he might have to do at that time of year."

Frac Daddy finished second behind Belmont contender Overanalyze (Dixie Union) in the GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 13, but could only manage a 16th-place run in the GI Kentucky Derby. "I do believe the horse will run well," McPeck said of competing in the Belmont. "I think the pace in the Belmont will suit him well, too. He drew outside in the Derby and couldn't get position, and I don't think he handled the slop. He's worked on a dry track a couple times recently and worked freaky good. I think he's got a big shot at it." Frac Daddy fired a four-furlong bullet in :47.80 at Churchill Downs May 31. He will be ridden by Alan Garcia for the first time since finishing second on debut going a mile in the Belmont mud last October.

Orb Doing Fine after Sunday's Work...

Trainer Shug McGaughey said that Stuart Janney III and Phipps Stable's GI Kentucky Derby hero **Orb** (Malibu Moon) was doing well following a :48.30 four-furlong breeze at Big Sandy Sunday. "He came out of his work good, ate up good, walked this morning, seems to be fine," the Hall of Famer said Monday. With as many as 15 sophomores expected to contest the Classic, McGaughey admitted that he was concerned about traffic trouble for the late-running Orb, who figures to go favored Saturday. "[The large field is] more concerning than anything else because not all of them in there belong, but they have as much right to run as anybody else, so I do think the race will be pretty spread out," said McGaughey. "He ran with 18 in the Derby." Orb is looking to bounce back from a fourth-place finish in the GI Preakness S. three weeks ago.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

PARIS AIM FOR OCOVANGO

Prince Faisal's **Ocovango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) will run next in the July 13 G1 Grand Prix de Paris, trainer Andre Fabre announced yesterday. Fifth with trouble in Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby, the previously unbeaten G2 Prix Greffulhe winner will stick at a mile and a half for the Longchamp feature. "Ocovango could have finished a bit closer, but he met two bits of trouble--only what happens at Epsom all the time," Fabre told *PA Sport*. "I'm not complaining, he had his chance, and he may have been second or third at best with a clear run." Fabre also reiterated that Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero **Intello (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) will revert to a mile for the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 11. "He has various options, but his next race is likely to be the Prix Jacques le Marois," he added. "I think he'll stay 12 furlongs if we want to run him in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe."

Although Galileo's daughters Secret Gesture and Moth could do no better than second and fourth, respectively, in Friday's G1 Oaks, there was some reflected glory for Galileo from the victory of Talent, the second Classic winner to emerge from the first crop of his Derby-winning son New Approach.

Saturday's Derby saw sons of Galileo finish first, third, fourth and sixth, with a grandson by New Approach taking second. Then Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club was won in most convincing style by Intello, another son of Galileo. Of course, these Classic successes came only a matter of days after yet another of Galileo's sons, Magician, had taken the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas by more than three lengths. **Cont. p6**

It was only three weeks ago that I looked at Magician's pedigree and Galileo's stallion career in this [column](#). I mentioned that there is a perception that Galileo needs speed in his mares, adding that it would perhaps be more accurate to say that Galileo often needs speed to help him sire major winners over the more fashionable distances of a mile and a mile and a quarter.

Sure enough, the mile winner Magician is out of a speedy daughter of a top sprinter and Intello also has speed on the dam's side of his pedigree. His second dam Occupandiste raced creditably at up to a mile and an eighth during the first part of her career. However, she didn't blossom fully until she was tried over distances short of a mile as a 4-year-old, when she became a dual Group 1 winner in the Prix Maurice de Gheest and Prix de la Foret.

This fast daughter of Kaldoun went on to produce group winners to two sons of Danzig. Her Green Desert filly Only Answer gained her group victories over five furlongs, but her Danehill filly, Intello's dam Impressionnante, was a smart miler. She won the G2 Prix de Sandringham after being placed in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches.

Intello follows Frankel (2000 Guineas), Golden Lilac (Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and Prix de Diane), Roderic O'Connor (Irish 2000 Guineas) and Cima de Triomphe (Derby Italiano) as the fifth Classic winner to represent the burgeoning Galileo-Danehill cross. There might well have been another had Teofilo been able to race at three.

Predictably, there is also an element of speed in Ruler of the World's pedigree, as his dam is by Mr. Prospector's son Kingmambo. This Classic-winning miler had a Classic-winning miler--the magnificent Miesque--as his dam. And it was over a mile that Ruler of the World's dam Love Me True gained her only win during her 15-race career. **Cont. p7**

Before I look any further into Ruler of the World's female line, I need to point out that this unbeaten colt shares the same grandsires, Sadler's Wells and Kingmambo, as last year's Derby hero Camelot (Montjeu {Ire}). Workforce, the 2010 Derby winner, had Kingmambo and Sadler's Wells as his grandsires, so this pairing can take credit for three of the last four Derby winners, which is a remarkable sequence.

That said, we should never be too surprised when the names of Kingmambo and Sadler's Wells crop up together in the pedigree of a high-class winner. Kingmambo himself built a striking record with daughters of Sadler's Wells, siring seven Group 1 winners from a total of 106 foals, this nick having an AEI of 3.78. For the record, the seven Group 1 winners included the dual Classic winners Henrythenavigator and Divine Proportions, the 1000 Guineas winner Virginia Waters, the Japanese champion El Condor Pasa and the four-time Group 1 winner Campanologist, with Thewayyouare and Master of Hounds completing the septet.

It has always been tempting to ascribe some of this cross's success to the presence of Sadler's Wells's three-parts-brother Nureyev as Kingmambo's broodmare sire. The duplication of Northern Dancer and Special makes for considerable appeal, especially as this alliance created another top stallion in Sadler's Wells's brother Fairy King. All three of these close relatives sired winners of one of Europe's major Derbies and all three sired an Arc winner.

It must be said, though, that Kingmambo mares have produced top-class performers to several stallions who don't create this duplication--not least Danehill, sire of Ruler of the World's outstanding half-brother Duke of Marmalade. Then there's Oasis Dream, who sired that excellent mare Midday, Dynaformer, who gave us Gozzip Girl and Wiener Walzer, and Giant's Causeway, who owes two of his Group 1 winners to Kingmambo mares.

Perhaps the combined success of Sadler's Wells and Kingmambo is no more complicated than the fact that both of them rank among the most prolific sires of Classic winners in Britain, Ireland and France in recent history. Sadler's Wells's contribution was more than 20 individual Classic winners, including multiple scorers such as Salsabil, Old Vic, Dream Well, Montjeu, Galileo, Imagine, High Chaparral and Alexandrova.

Kingmambo also did remarkably well, especially considering that he was based in Kentucky. He supplied two winners of each of the 2000 Guineas, 1000 Guineas and the St. Leger, plus one of the Oaks. The Derby may have escaped Kingmambo's grasp, but his son King's Best was responsible for the record-breaking 2010 winner Workforce. Kingmambo also enjoyed Classic success in the U.S. (Lemon Drop Kid in the Belmont S.), Ireland, France and Japan (the Derby-winning King Kamehameha, who now ranks as one of Japan's most consistently successful stallions).

Mention of Lemon Drop Kid brings us neatly back to Ruler of the World's dam Love Me True, as she shares the same sire and her dam is a half-sister to Lemon Drop Kid's dam Charming Lassie. Bred by the Farish-Kilroy partnership, she was offered for sale at Saratoga just months after Lemon Drop Kid's Belmont S. victory. Demi O'Byrne had to go to \$1,350,000 to secure her--a price which placed her among the year's top 10 yearling fillies.

Despite her value, Love Me True was once used as a pacemaker. Starting at 100-1, she led for nearly six furlongs in the 2001 Irish 1,000 Guineas, paving the way for the victory of her stablemate Imagine.

Love Me True probably stayed a mile and a quarter, which no doubt helped her son Duke of Marmalade develop into a champion over a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half. Her dam, the Alydar mare Lassie's Lady, was not only a half-sister to the dam of Lemon Drop Kid, but also to Weekend Surprise, dam of the GI Preakness S. winner Summer Squall and the GI Belmont S. winner A.P. Indy. It is worth repeating that five stallions from this Lassie Dear family have succeeded in siring a Breeders' Cup winner.

Stamina is clearly no problem for Ruler of the World, who was quickly stepped up to a mile and a half after appearing to need every yard of the mile and a quarter when he made a winning debut in April. Clearly he has inherited a full measure of Galileo's stamina, despite being inbred 4x3 to Mr. Prospector. Galileo's other leading winners with 4x3 inbreeding to Mr. Prospector include Red Rocks, the GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner whose dam was a fast daughter of Machiavellian; Misty For Me, whose stamina stretched to 1 3/8 miles; and Battle of Marengo, who appeared to run out of stamina close home when fourth behind Ruler of the World at Epsom.

Ruler of the World's success will have been very welcome news for breeders who have invested heavily in Love Me True's daughters. Ruler of the World's winning three-parts-sister Soinlovewithyou, by Sadler's Wells, sold for 950,000gns in December 2010. She produced a Sea The Stars filly, now named Psiloveyou, for Lady Bamford in 2011, followed by a 2012 filly by Oasis Dream. Love Me True's listed-placed Storm Cat filly Countess Lemonade made 700,000gns at the same sale, before going on to be graded placed at four for Bobby Flay. Her first foal is a 2013 filly by Tiznow.

Looking Lovely, a winning sister to Countess Lemonade, is arguably the most interesting of the Love Me True daughters, as she started her career with two visits to Galileo. The first produced a 2012 colt with the same chestnut coloring as Ruler of the World. Aidan O'Brien has Love Me True's 2-year-old colt by Montjeu, which is bred along similar lines to Camelot, and the mare also has a 2012 chestnut son by Galileo. Surely another hugely ambitious name will be required for this youngster.

EXPANDED GAMING BILL FALLS SHORT IN ILLINOIS

A bill that would have added five more casinos in Illinois as well as allow for VLTs at the state's racetracks, failed to make it to a vote in the House of Representatives at the end of their spring session late last week. State Representative Bob Rita, sponsor of the bill known as [SB1739](#), did not call for a vote after it became clear that Governor Pat Quinn would veto it, according to published reports. Quinn is on record saying that he would not approve any expanding gambling bill that did not also include significant reforms for the state's underfunded public pension system. Rita said the bill would be reworked and reintroduced during the autumn session. While SB1739 fell short, a separate bill renewing the licenses for approved account deposit wagering companies has passed through the House and Senate. Quinn has 60 days to decide its fate. Online wagering in Illinois has been unavailable since January.

WOODBINE TO RECEIVE \$26 MILLION FROM OLG

Woodbine Entertainment Group will receive more than \$26 million from the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Commission as compensation for the cancellation of the slots-at-racetracks program in March, reports *The Globe and Mail*. The OLG will pay a total of \$80.6 million to Ontario tracks that spent money in order to expand to accommodate more slot machines before the program was scrapped. In addition to WEG, which operates Woodbine and Mohawk Racetracks, Georgian Downs operator Great Canadian Gaming will receive \$31.5 million, with an additional \$23 million being divided among unidentified provincial tracks. The slots-at-racetracks program allotted 20% of slots revenue to the horse racing industry--10% to horsemen and 10% to tracks--before the OLG announced the cancellation of the program in March of 2012 as part of an overhaul of the province's gaming landscape. According to *The Globe and Mail* story, WEG had tapped into a line of credit for \$30 million in expansion costs after reaching a deal with the OLG to add more slot machines before the slots-at-racetracks program was halted.

Never far off the speed in midfield, he was traveling conspicuously well passing the quarter pole and, when Seb Sanders galvanized him and the gap opened, they were able to get there with 40 yards to race. "This is a good horse who's been very unlucky," Sanders said. "A lot of races have not been run to suit, with steady pace or the ground going against him. He ideally wants a good early pace that he can relax off. He has an excellent turn of foot and is more than capable in this company. As a 2-year-old, I thought that if he stayed a mile he was a genuine Guineas horse and his run in the Greenham suggested that." Trainer John Hills added, "He's been the bridesmaid twice in good races, the Norfolk and the Greenham, and last season was curtailed with a silly injury. Everything unfolded well tonight, including the gap opening which he needed. He's a useful horse on his day. He's in the Wokingham [H. at Royal Ascot June 22], but he would have to carry a penalty there and he may go traveling to Germany and places like that instead."
